Leap To Fame joins pantheon of Down Under greats, wins his second Inter Dominion

The 6-year-old pacer also surpassed Blacks A Fake as the richest Down Under standardbred of all time.

A chorus of Down Under legends has anointed Leap To Fame equal to the all-time greats after another record-breaking Inter Dominion win at Albion Park Saturday night (July 20).

key rival Luke McCarthy headlined the greats that spoke in awe of Leap To Fame, Grant Dixon's 6-year-old.

Leap To Fame's 56th win from just 69 starts made him the richest all-time Down Under harness horse with \$4,630,884 – surpassing Blacks A Fake's \$4,575,438.

Gath, who has driven a long list of superstars and won the Inter Dominion pacing final on Markovina, said Leap To Fame's manners and versatility put him on a pedestal.

"He's better than most of the greats because he's everything, except brilliant gate speed," he said. "I'd have to say he's as good as we've seen. He reminds me of Cardigan Bay, all-round superstar... manners, speed and strength.

"The amazing thing is he's 6 but still seems to be getting better. He's better now than he was last year. The way he's going and with how well he's been looked after, he could dominate for another two years yet."

Butt, winner of four Inter Dominion finals, declared: "He's the top of the list for me now. It was always Blacks A Fake and Lazarus from a New Zealand viewpoint, but he's passed them both now. He's just so strong and does it all so easily."

McCarthy said: "He's not just the greatest stayer we've seen, he's the best horse full stop."

Hancock won five Inter Dominion titles, including three in succession with Our Sir Vancelot (1997, '98 and '99).

"Although it's hard to compare horses from different eras, Leap To Fame has got it all," Hancock said. "He's special. You can see all the best traits of the Bettors Delight's come through and Grant [Dixon] has done such a wonderful job with him."

Hall, Sr., who trained the brilliant Im Themightyquinn to win three successive Inter Dominion finals, declared: "He's the best. Simple, the best I've seen."

Perhaps the most humbling of all recognition came from Purdon, who holds the record with seven Inter Dominion wins and has been involved with many of New Zealand's greatest pacers, most notably Lazarus.

"I've been lucky with the stars I've had and Lazarus is the benchmark, but Leap To Fame is the best I've seen," Purdon said. "He is just so dominant and doesn't seem to get tired."

Leap To Fame became only the eighth horse to win multiple Inter Dominion finals, following his success in the 2023 Brisbane final. He missed last year's Sydney final due to illness.

Despite being a stallion with huge breeding potential, owners Kevin and Kay Seymour will likely race him on to chase a third crown back at Albion Park next July.

Leap To Fame already has the longevity of greatness to match his astonishing strength and talent.

Although he didn't win a feature race at 2, he raced 11 times for eight wins, two seconds and a fourth.

It was as an early 3-year-old when he romped home in the Group 1 NSW Derby at Menangle March 5, 2022 that first signalled his greatness.

That win moved the media shy and ultra conservative trainer/driver Grant Dixon to say Leap To Fame was already the best he had trained.

Then came two more Derby wins in Queensland and Victoria, then, at 4, Leap To Fame followed huge placings in the TAB Eureka, Blacks A Fake and Victoria Cup with his first Inter Dominion title at Albion Park on Dec. 16, 2023.


At 5, he won a Hunter Cup, Miracle Mile, Blacks A Fake and Sunshine Sprint before he got sick and missed the Victoria and New Zealand Cups and the Sydney Inter Dominion.

There were some doubters early this year when he was beaten into second spot in the Hunter Cup and Miracle Mile, but he silenced them as champions do — first by producing the best performance of his career so far at his first race in New Zealand in the Race by Betcha at Cambridge in April, then his clean sweep of this Inter Dominion series.

What's next?

Another trip to New Zealand, this time for the country's most iconic race of any code – the famed New Zealand Trotting Cup (actually for pacers) at Addington in Christchurch on Nov. 11.

"He'll have a break now," Kevin Seymour said. "We're going to skip the Victoria Cup this year and focus everything on New Zealand. It's amazing the difference going to New Zealand and winning that Cambridge race has done for Grant [Dixon's] mindset. He's gone from trepidation to asking me all the time when we're locking in the New Zealand Cup plans.

"It's because the horse not only raced so well over there, but he thrived during the trip and when he got back home. There's also a great love and passion for harness racing and its stars in New Zealand, even bigger than in Australia.

"There's no parochialism or frustration if an Aussie is winning their big races, rather than just enjoy a great horse for what he is and they appreciate us taking him over so they can see him race in the flesh."

For all of the great moments Leap To Fame has delivered so far, Dixon says a New Zealand Cup win would rival any of them.

"There's just something really special about it," Dixon said. "It's like the Melbourne Cup to them [New Zealanders]. It's one of the great races, one of the great race days.

"It would mean even more after we were just days from taking him over last year when he got sick and we had to pull the pin."

Leap To Fame will likely return home to finish the year back at Albion Park for the Group 1 Sunshine Sprint on Nov. 29 and the Group 1 Blacks A Fake on Dec. 6.

ARCEE PHOENIX TAKES INTER DOMINION TROTTING FINAL

Arcee Phoenix stamped himself as the new trotting king when he blasted past \$1 million in prize money with an all-the-way win in Saturday's (July 19) \$500,000 Inter Dominion trotting final.

He became just the fifth Aussie-trained trotter to do so, following Just Believe, Sundons Gift, Keystone Del and Tornado Valley.

And Arcee Phoenix, who is just now hitting his straps as a 6-year-old, looks to have so much ahead. He's won 17 of his 53 starts.

"The ability has always been there, but we've had to be patient and he's rewarding us," trainer/driver Chris Svanosio said. "I have to thank my late father-in-law, Dr. Alistair McLean, for his guidance. This horse may not have even made it to the races without him.

"There's lots of emotions tonight... excitement and relief are two... it's been a big build-up. We did it."

Arcee Phoenix's win followed his triumph in New Zealand's richest trotting race back in April, the \$600,000 TAB Trot.

"It's been the year we always dreamed he might give us," Svanosio said.

Arcee Phoenix used barrier 1 to lead easily, dictated terms and ripped home in :55.4 and 27.7 seconds to win by 8.5 meters.

Young Kiwi star Bet N Win ran second after trailing the winner, but lost a shoe in the early stages and driver Bob Butt said he never trotted well afterwards.

Remarkable 9-year-old Kiwi Oscar Bonavena stormed home from last to grab third.

Like Elista Hanover, trainer Annie Stoebe is ready for a good year

In Spanish, lista means ready, and that's exactly what Elista Hanover was when she notched her first win of the year in the **Grade 1 E.T. Gerry Jr. Hambletonian Maturity** on July 12 at The Meadowlands.

The Annie Stoebe trainee was the 7-5 favorite from post 6 in the bulky 13-horse field of 4-year-old open trotters going one-and-one-eighth-miles.

Following a snappy first quarter of :25.1, driver David Miller put Elista Hanover — one of six mares in the field — on the lead just before the three-eighths.

In her prior two starts — the third leg of the Graduate (June 21) and Graduate final (July 5) — Elista Hanover had been beaten by a half-length and a neck, respectively, when she raced in come-from-behind fashion.

"Well, she won a ton of races on the front-end last year," Stoebe said. "The 4-year-old transition is really tough, so we were a little bit more conservative with her the first couple of starts this year.

"Last week [July 5], when David went out with her, he looked at me and he said, 'Annie, we're in a tough spot [post 10]. And I looked at him, and I said, 'David, I know, do what you can do.' Even going out for the Maturity, I just told him, 'David, have fun.' Because as a trainer, I'm not the one out there making split-second decisions. And I trust David, I left it in his hands, and he felt that's where he needed to be to win, and it worked out.

"They're not motorcycles. You can't say, 'Okay, I'm going to be on the front every week,' because in two or three starts, you're not going to have a horse. Yeah, it would have been nice to win those other races, but she was perfectly prepped. Her ego was through the roof. She's sound, and she was so ready that I think last Saturday, no matter the trip David gave her, she was going to win because she was so ready."

Not only did the daughter of International Moni–Evermore easily win by $2\frac{1}{2}$ lengths, she did so in a stakes-record time of 2:03.

"It was a stakes record, but she also went sub-1:50 [1:49.3 for the mile]," Stoebe said. "So honestly, that was the most confident

I've ever been going into a race, just because of how she felt the week leading up. She was a fire-breathing dragon, not in a bad way, but she had a great week, and honestly, we drew really well and I thought this is her week to get it."

Last weekend was a busy one for the Stoebe Stable that consists of eight racehorses, which are looked after in the barn by Stoebe's boyfriend, Jeremy Morrison, alongside her and caretaker Martha Palafox.

"Well, we did the math, in a 68-hour period we were home for 10 hours," Stoebe said. "When you have a weekend like that, honestly, we didn't even feel tired until driving home on Sunday. The adrenaline, the excitement, it keeps you going and you just power through it."

In addition to Elista Hanover's victory, they also had one with 2-year-old trotting colt Diabolic Hill in the first leg of the New Jersey Sire Stakes at The Meadowlands. Palafox cares for both "Elista" and "Diabolic."

"I raced five horses last weekend, and every single horse got a check," Stoebe said. "Every horse made money."

Elista Hanover, who did not race this week, will make her next start on Saturday (July 26) at The Meadowlands in a leg of the Miss Versatility.

"Well, the problem is, she's only raced in one [leg], and they have to race in three to make the final, so there's one on the 26th

and then one on Sept. 5," Stoebe said. "I mean, it worked out well, because this week was a really good week to give her a break after that effort, and then she'll tighten back up on the 26th and be ready for Hambo Day [Aug. 2]."

Elista Hanover will be competing against just mares on Hambletonian Day in the Dr. John Steele Memorial, a route also

taken by other top mares, like Manchego, in their 4-year-old season.

"So, I did that, not knowing the statistics, but it seems like that's kind of a pattern that people chose to do with their top mares," Stoebe said.

Elista Hanover is co-owned by Stoebe along with partners R Lynn Curry and Philomena Curry, who they call "Mimi". In addition to the Steele, the Miss Versatility and Dayton Oaks are pretty much the only opportunities Elista Hanover has to race other mares in the next few months.

As if running her stable doesn't take up enough of her time, Stoebe is quite involved on social media following a comment made by a good friend of hers that most trainers don't have enough of a presence reaching out to the people.

"He said, 'For two weeks, I just want you to post twice a day,' Stoebe said. 'After the first 10 days, Facebook reached out to me and said, 'Hey, we want to verify you and give you a checkmark.' And then about a week after that, they put me in the creator fund, and my Facebook is going viral. An average video has 7,000-to-10,000 views, some of them over 60,000."

Stoebe quickly found out that a lot of those followers wanted merchandise.

"So, I was like, if I'm going to do this, I'm going to do it right, work with a designer, do all that stuff, and that's why my merch drop is such a big thing," she said. "I had to **create a website**, and all the ordering is done on the website... You know, I'm really trying to bring new people into the industry, and Facebook is helping me so much.



I want to be a good face in the sport, and if I'm racing for almost a half-a-million dollars, and I have an amazing horse that's favored in the race, I want to look good, and I want to present myself as a top trainer in the industry. My mom always said, 'Dress for the job you want, not the job you have.'

"So, a lot of the time, I can't respond to every comment, but I try to like every comment I get and interact with some, but it's a little tough. But you know, bringing new people into the sport is priceless."

Last year, Stoebe was part of the autograph session in the FanZone on Hambletonian Day and she hopes she's invited again this year so she can spread the word amongst her followers and hopefully bring a lot of new faces to the event.

"My thing is we should be advertising that like, Dexter Dunn is going to be there signing autographs from this time to this time, come meet him, and Dexter needs to be tweeting this, because it's getting the fans involved," Stoebe said. "And that's why I want to be involved, because I'm the person that three days before this is going to be posting it on social media. Let's get these people out here, because not only do you get to meet me, but there are all of these other top trainers, top drivers, come get the autographs."

This will not be the year when a ton of her followers will show up in Elista Hanover shirts because the merchandise won't be shipped to them by then, but there's always next year.

"I want to do something similar to the Siegelman Stable's model. These shirts will only be for sale for probably a month, and then we're going to do something else," Stoebe said. "So, we'll keep changing it up so that it doesn't get stagnant.

"I mean, it's marketing, but it's also getting people involved and interested in harness racing, and it's a lot easier to do when you have some nice, really cool horses to back you up.

"We have quite a few really nice horses for the size of our stable."

For any that saw Stoebe in the winner's circle following Elista Hanover's Maturity victory, she was dressed to impress.

"I've been watching races from everywhere, and if you turn on races from New Zealand and Australia, everyone is dressed to the nines for those big races," she said. "I want to be a good face in the sport, and if I'm racing for almost a half-a-million dollars, and I have an amazing horse that's favored in the race, I want to look good, and I want to present myself as a top trainer in the industry. My mom always said, 'Dress for the job you want, not the job you have?

"I mean, there's been plenty of times when I go to the winner's circle in my colors, because I have to go back out on the track after the next race. So, you know, in those situations, you can't dress up, but I had the opportunity, and I wasn't going to miss out on that. You know you have a chance to win, and you know those pictures are going to be all over social media. I want to look as good as I can, because I'm a face for the sport, and I want that to be a positive thing."

Stoebe found out that popularity does come with a cost.

"The biggest problem with all that, and the people that notice, it's like, 'Wow, I've got to find something even better for Hambo Day," she said with a laugh.

As for what Elista Hanover will be doing next year, nothing is set in stone.

"Everyone asks me, 'She's red, so she's crazy, right?" Stoebe said. "I cannot stress enough that there's no crazy in that horse. She's iust a love.

"With her breeding, I honestly believe she's going to continue to get better with age. And you know, she's probably the horse of a lifetime for both Lynn, Mimi and I, so, as long as she's game, we're having the time of our life."

What was your very first Hambletonian?

Some industry insiders shared memories of the first time they witnessed the Hambletonian.

Hector Clouthier, Jr.: "I was 7 years old and my father took me and my older brother to Good Time Park in Goshen, NY to see the 1956 Hambletonian. It was a two-day drive from northern Ontario. The winner was The Intruder trained and driven by Ned Bower. Allwood Stables from New Jersey bought The Intruder for \$35,000 but never raced him as a 2-year-old. The Intruder came 11th in the first heat but won the next two to claim victory. He won the final in 2:02. The purse was [almost] \$100,000. Interestingly there were 20 horses lined up behind the starting gate. The highlight of the trip was meeting Ben White who was born in Ontario. Of course, Ben was the man who drove and trained the famous Rosalind. He also won four Hambletonians and seven Kentucky Futurities. It was a spectacular trip for a 7-year-old and solidified my interest in harness racing."

Greg Wright, Jr.: "2011, the Broad Bahn year. My next was the day Jujubee won the Muscle Hill [2021]."

Andrew Filion: "It was the year Jackie [Moiseyev] won it, 1991, Giant Victory. The next year had a great finish too when Alf Palema got up. Of course, it would tough to ever top the 1989 dead heat with Park Avenue Joe and Probe."

Jerry Glantz: "I never made it to DuQuoin. It was the 1996 Continentalvictory year."

Mary Pat Rhodes: "Definitely my first was the year Prakas won [1985]. My favorite was 1996, Continental victory. I was standing on the TV stand by the paddock. I watched Mike Lachance drive like I've never seen before. It was brilliant."

WAS ABC FREIGHT THE FATHER OF THE MODERN DAY HAMBLETONIAN?

The late 1970s precocious Clint Galbraith trainee, ABC Freight, sired the 1984 Hambletonian winner Historic Freight. But, it was ABC Freight's son Garland Lobell that changed everything. Though not a Hambletonian starter himself, Garland Lobell

Don't sell Dan Fisher short, there's more there than meets the eye

A little while ago I was moaning out loud that I'm finding a dearth of people to profile in this column. I've now written nearly 300 weekly columns for over five years in what was supposed to be a part-time gig giving me something to do in retirement. John Rallis, whose acquaintance I had just made, happened

to overhear me and piped up: "Why don't you do a story on Dan Fisher?... Dan's story is a remarkable one that needs to be told."


Yes indeed, Fisher's story is remarkable, except I have doubts that I am able to do it justice.

I've known Fisher ever since he began selling advertising for *TROT Magazine* in 2006, but there was so much about him that I didn't know.

For one, I had no idea that he had been, and still is sometimes a horse trainer, well before he started working at Standardbred Canada.

Let's start at the beginning Dan. How were you introduced to harness racing, more specifically where and how did you start training horses?

"My dad was a doctor, but he was also a part-time horse trainer and driver. My parents built a small farm on 20 acres in north Pickering and put in a small track that was just over a quartermile long — we moved there when I was 4 years old. We always raced a few horses off of it, mostly at the "B" tracks. He'd jog them before going to work in the morning and my mom would put them away after he'd leave. I started jogging them by myself at age 8 or 9, probably. By the time I was in my early teens I was training. Trust me, if you could train a horse beside another one, and get around the turns on that track — fishtailing — then you could get one around any track. We'd go four laps — eight turns - as a mile, and I had the track record with Bio Latka in 2:29. That was flying. Most of our horses were ordinary, but we loved them, and my dad did have a number of driving wins, too. We did have one pretty good trotter that raced mainly on the OJC [Ontario Jockey Club, now Woodbine Entertainment Group]. His name was Coalhoun. I remember he bought him as a weanling for \$800. He took a record of 2:04 at Garden City, when that meant something, and went on to earn \$63,105."

Then you went on to university, as you say, ostensibly to play football.

"I played a lot of sports at a decent level growing up. I played some tier two Jr. A hockey, and on an OFSAA championship rugby team in high school, but football was probably what I was the best at, I guess. At Pickering High, with two years of high school remaining, our assistant football coach, Coach Martini, who had played in the CFL, told me and my good friend Marco — who owns some horses with me all these years later — that if we forgot about playing basketball in the winter and concentrated on working out with weights, he felt certain that we could play football at the university level. We both took his advice. I ended up playing five years as a tight end at the University of Ottawa, and Marco eventually got drafted by the Argos. One of my proudest moments at Ottawa came when, as a senior, my teammates voted me in as a team captain. That still means the world to me. While I was away at school, I still had two horses, my favorite at the time, Bio Latka, and another lower level claimer named Iona Master George. In Ottawa, I had a teammate, Gordie Weber, who also liked harness racing. Gordie had a car, and we would sneak off to the races at Rideau Carleton on the eve of games, when we had a curfew and were supposed to be home resting. Lucky for us, we were never outed, because there was no chance we'd run into anyone there that we knew. Gordie ended up playing in the Canadian Football League (CFL) for four or five years, but my football career ended, in essence,

when I tore my ACL. There wasn't time to have it reconstructed before my senior year, so I used a brace and played without one. I have zero regrets, though. I've had multiple surgeries on many body parts, and my body is generally sore to this day, but the memories are incredible, and playing team sports prepared me more for life than anything else."

After university?

"Once I was out of school, all I wanted to do was train horses, but there was a pressure to use my degree to my advantage, so I got a job as an Ontario sales rep for Umbro Canada — known as 'The Soccer Company'. But my boss at Umbro was also my high school girlfriend's older brother, and we had always wanted to get some horses together. The Umbro job was really only enough to keep me busy part-time anyway, so we also got a few stalls at Greenwood and we claimed a mare named Jillian

D. She was second for us in her first start but we lost her, so the next week we claimed the mare that had beaten us, Daylon Touchdown, and we raced her successfully at Greenwood and Mohawk for the next six or seven months. I was off-and-pacing, so to speak, in both professions.

"Umbro was based in New Westminster, BC, and that's where I met my eventual wife, Patti. She worked at Umbro head office at the time, but I kind of stole her from them. She eventually moved east, to be with me, a few years after we met.

"My stable was having a little success and started getting bigger. Umbro was booming and after about two-and-a-half years of doing both I had to choose one. It was easy — I chose the horses. My mom said, on a few occasions, 'If you were just going to train horses, why did you even bother going to university?' But she always knew it was the horses that I loved, because she loves them just as much, if not more than I do.

"As far as Patti went, she had never been around horses before she moved here, but she began helping around the stable and learning from me, and she fell in love with them immediately, too. Eventually, through the years, she worked, rubbing on horses, for Rick Fife, Kevin Davidson and John Kopas.

"A little over three years after Patti moved here, we had a son, Justin. When he was 2, we bought a house in Cambridge, that a horse I did well with — on a deal — paid the mortgage on for about the first two years. His name was Immaculate Concept.

He was only at the non-winners of two level when I took him on for a promise of 50 per cent of his earnings, but we went all the way up the class ladder with him until we actually beat Western Ideal with him one night at Mohawk.

"Life was pretty good, but when Justin was only 9, the worst thing happened — Patti was diagnosed with leukemia. That's where harness racing and our amazing community of people came in. Everybody, and I mean just about everybody, was beyond helpful. The horses were well taken care of when I couldn't be there. A good friend, Haris Galatsidas, came to the barn every morning and helped me for free, for at least the first three to four weeks, until I was able to start paying him a bit. Patti's illness had imposed a severe financial strain on us, and Patti's good friend and teammate, Joanne Colville, and their softball team made up of horsewomen, spearheaded a big fundraiser at a place near Mohawk we called The Rockpile. It was an incredible night that Patti had been released from hospital in time to attend, but one specific thing from that night still stands out in my memory. A 50/50 raffle took place and about \$800 was won by Rob Fellows. To us that was a lot of money, and Rob, who I had once been stabled beside for a few years, proceeded to hand the money to Justin. The thought still makes me a bit emotional to this day. That was only one of many acts of caring by many members of our community that helped us through that incredibly difficult time. There's that saying that says 'It takes a village' – our village was the harness racing community.

"Patti battled the leukemia valiantly for six months, and we got her into remission. But shortly after a celebratory trip that the three of us took to Florida, she relapsed, and before they could find a match for an imperative bone marrow transplant she succumbed to that horrible illness. Needless to say, both Justin and I were devastated. Here I was, now a single father, responsible for not only providing a living for Justin and myself, but also for raising this precocious and heartbroken child.

"Justin, now at the age of 10, was heavily involved in both competitive baseball and hockey, and I was coaching hockey as well. I usually worked from 6:30 a.m. until 1 or 2 p.m., but school didn't start until 9 a.m. I sometimes raced at night, but he had to be taken to games and practices, and then had to get to bed at a decent time. I had purposely kept a small stable, partly because I was a bit of a perfectionist with how I did things, but mainly because I wanted to be a hands-on father when that day came. Ironically, from reading *TROT* while growing up, it seemed that the one regret most horsepeople had was not being around as much as they'd wished to see their kids grow up. I always knew that would never be me, but now I actually had no choice — I couldn't possibly continue training horses for a living and raise my son the way his mother would have wanted him to be raised.

"I had applied for the position of director of advertising at TROT a few weeks before Patti passed away but I never told her about it. I didn't want her thinking that I was preparing for life after she was gone. They eventually told me that all the other applicants were either professional salespeople with no horse

racing knowledge, or horsepeople with no sales experience. Apparently, I checked all the boxes and they offered me the job."

What was it like being a single father?

"It wasn't easy, especially at first. Looking back at that first summer, I honestly have no idea how we got through it. My first day at TROT was his last day of school for the summer. I had to be in five days a week then — there was no such thing as working from home — and I had a broken-hearted 10-year-old to take care of. My boss, Darryl Kaplan, was a godsend. He told me to do what I had to do for my son at all times, and if my work was completed at 3 a.m. it didn't matter — as long as it was completed. With the help of my new job and some family and friends, we somehow got through that summer. Justin had just made the travel baseball team in Cambridge as well at that time, and the ball schedule wasn't a light one, but a couple by the name of Tim and Cindy Ruf, whose son Travis was Justin's good friend and teammate, came through in a big way for us. Without Tim and Cindy, I'm not sure we would have gotten through that first summer. The world really is full of good people.

"I kept playing beer league hockey, on horseman's teams, and was able to continue coaching hockey as well. And for Justin's final two years of minor hockey, and another eight years afterwards, horseman Nick 'Ralphie' Boyd and I coached Midget AA hockey together here in Cambridge. Those years, working with 16-to-18-year-old young men, were some of the most gratifying years of my life. Ralphie and I built so many great relationships with those kids, some that have lasted to this day. I really loved giving back, after some of my coaches did so much for me while I was growing up. It was much of what I learned from them that helped me get through a number of trying years as much as anything. Ralphie and I stopped the coaching, unfortunately, after the first year of COVID, but after 19 years I'm still going strong at *TROT*."

You are still there, but your position itself has changed somewhat significantly.

"I was hired to be the ad salesman for both the magazine and the SC website, but after a year or so I asked if I could be more involved with editing and content development as well. As a lifelong horseperson it drove me nuts if the terminology in some of the pieces wasn't exactly what it should be, and as far as developing interesting content, I knew so many people in the business that I became more important to the publication in that regard also. In 2019, after we had been without an associate editor for a number of years anyway, Darryl Kaplan was appointed SC's manager of information and innovation. The magazine had consisted of only Darryl, myself and Sue Longley for a number of years at that point, so I was basically the associate editor at that point already — just not in title. They offered me the role of editor but I refused to give up the ad

sales because I just believed that my great relationships with our wonderful clients was too important to the association. I accepted the title of managing director, and for the past six years I've been running the magazine in its entirety. *TROT* recently turned 50-years-old, is doing great, and I'm extremely proud to have played a small role in that."

Let's switch gears and talk some about horses, more specifically those that you've trained and more recently bred and raised. Do you have a single favorite?

"That's a very tough question because I loved many of my horses like they were my children. Bio Latka was the first one I owned part of — when I was 16-years-old — and I learned so much from him before retiring him and finding him a home-for-life through OSAS [the Ontario Standardbred Adoption Society], but if you insisted that I was limited to only one, that one would probably have to be Chris Seelster. We had lost a good claimer we had and we wanted to buy something privately, so I bought him for \$30,000 – all the money we had – when he was racing somewhat uncompetitively in the non-winners of two. He was an incredibly beautiful 4-year-old stud by Threefold, but it turned out that he was a bit crazy. I loved to treat my horses like horses though — not like robots. I was a decent-sized guy and I liked to rough-house with them a little. He would bounce up-and-down on his hind legs right beside me every morning as I'd put him in the crossties. He refused to turn on the racetrack, too. He needed the parade marshal to turn him to go to the gate on race night. If you ever wanted to go a training mile with him you needed to get another horse on either side of you to help you turn — and even that didn't always work. So, I never trained him – no big deal. He had never beaten 1:56 when we bought him though, and in his second start for me he jogged, for Paul MacDonell, in 1:53. I raced him near the top level on the WEG circuit on-and-off for three years and he was the first horse that helped get my name out there. We even reached the free-for-all level at Mohawk and raced in the Labatt Pace at Western Fair. He was an unforgettable animal and there's a huge action shot of him hanging above my bed."

In recent years you are still involved with horses, not in training them, but in owning parts, breeding them and in selling their yearlings.

"I'm still a little involved in jogging and training a few as well, but only with one of my own — Market Banker, who I own in-part with my parents, and my good friends Marco Arbour and Chris and Camilla Christoforou. I really have the best of both worlds now though, as I live only about five minutes from Classy Lane Training Centre. Whenever I get the itch, I can call my friend Chris Christoforou or Tony Beaton, and they always welcome me out to help train or jog. I really get missing being around the



camaraderie of the barn at times, and the horses, and when I do I can just pop over and help. Every time I race bike one though, all the clowns at Classy Lane think they're funny and yell out to us that it must be 'Stifle Day.'

"I got into the breeding business with my friend Tom Grossman of Blue Chip Farms a number of years ago as well. My old owner - Gerry Haggerty - and I had a decent Bettors Delight mare, Peppermint Patti, that we had named after the human Patti. Tom and I own her together now and when she has a foal, Justin and I name them, invariably to have some connection to his late mother. I got a taste of the travails involved in the breeding game early on though. We had a Huntsville colt of her that we had decent expectations for, but that year the sale was held in Timonium because of COVID. He was selling on the third day and it had been cold, wet and miserable. He only brought a disappointing \$10,000, and then, the very next day, her weanling filly by Hes Watching coliced and died. The mare somewhat made up for it in the 2022 Harrisburg Sale though. when her Huntsville colt, Vandiemen Bluechip, brought \$40,000. He's been her best foal, and now has a record of 1:49.3 and has earned \$334,935. He was fifth in the Graduate final the other night, paced his mile in 1:48.1, and we're selling his full brother in Harrisburg this fall — Blackfoot Bluechip. Fingers crossed.

What is your son Justin doing these days?

"It's hard to imagine but Justin is now 29. He still loves sports, including harness racing, but the one he's best at is golf. It took him a number of years to beat me, but now he's a three or a four handicap, so my days of beating him come few and far between. He graduated from the University of Ottawa as well, during COVID unfortunately, and then worked as a groom for Tony Beaton for a while. After working in the Mohawk race office for a few years, now he also works at Standardbred Canada, but in a different department than mine. He has dabbled in horse ownership as well, although it might be hard for him to beat his first experience at it. I had purchased 20 per cent of an Archangel yearling that Shane Arsenault had bought in 2017. His name was Knight Angel. As a Christmas present to Justin, I gave him 5 per cent interest in the colt, and he turned out to be pretty good. He was an Ontario Sires Stakes Gold winner at both 2 and 3, and at 2 he actually beat Forbidden Trade in the Champlain Stakes. Imagine that, the first horse that you've ever owned and he defeated a future Hambletonian winner. Justin was pretty proud of that and he wasn't shy to tell people either. At the end of the day though, my son is just a really good human being. That's what I'm the most proud of, and that's exactly what his mother would have wanted."

First Turn Stable bounces back with Aeterna's Choice

The business of racing journalism focuses squarely on the winners, and rightly so. That said, as a writer I've had my share of conversations with drivers, trainers and owners that didn't make it to the winner's circle on a given night. Sure, there are some that are severely disappointed. That's to be expected. But there are also moments when the connections are ecstatic to have hit the board. They savor the moment as much as those hoisting the hardware in front of the grandstand.

Wednesday night (July 16) I found myself in a similar situation as a member of Harrah's Hoosier Park's First Turn Stable. Our newest acquisition, Aeterna's Choice, didn't cross the wire first in his debut for trainer Patrizio Ancora, but his on-the-board finish was a satisfying first act as the stable is back in action after a detour this summer.

As a quick recap of how the season has unfolded with First Turn Stable, we began the year campaigning pacer Robertsgladerunner. The gelding had mixed results for the group but sustained a tendon tear that forced him into retirement. His last start for the stable was a 10th place effort on May 16. The decision was

made to send Robertsgladerunner to New Vocations, and he arrived there during the third week in June. For his career, "Bob" as he was known among the First Turn community, finished his career with a 24-24-26 record from 220 starts. He took a mark of 1:52.1 at Hoosier Park in 2022. During his career, which spanned eight seasons, he banked \$215,627.

When I signed on as part of First Turn Stable, I envisioned how some of the experience might play out. Retiring a horse due to injury certainly didn't figure into the equation. But that, as they say, is racing.

With Robertsgladerunner transitioning into his next career via New Vocations, the question became who's next? How long will it take to claim the next horse for the stable? At one point I texted Jacob Rheinheimer, the track's race marketing manager, on the side just to see if First Turn had zeroed in on any potential candidates. A week later, the group was back in business, although with a different horse than I expected.

On Wednesday (July 2), Aeterna's Choice was claimed and became the new face of the stable. The gelded son of Beachtrea—Aeterna Deo came to First Turn with 10 wins to his credit and just over \$60,000 on his card. The 6-year-old had already made seven seasonal starts, winning at Hoosier Park on June 21. In the announcement to stable members, Ancora noted the change in strategy when acquiring Aeterna's Choice.

"Incidentally, the horse we originally wanted to claim was not entered this week, but the more we started to look at Aeterna's Choice, the more we liked him," Patrizio and his wife, Rebecca, noted in the email. "We like that he is a younger horse at age 6 with less wear and tear than most at that level, and think he is a horse that could take a step forward with some TLC. He's a little leaner than we would like for this time of year, and his feet might need a little work, we will get straight to work on those issues and hopefully the results will show on the racetrack!"

Two weeks after being claimed, Aeterna's Choice made his debut for First Turn Stable. In the morning line for Wednesday's third race, our entry was one of three in the event carrying 20-1 odds, the longest in the field. It was hard to know if that was justified or perhaps an underestimation by the oddsmaker. We would find out Wednesday night.

Two months since our last start with Robertsgladerunner, First Turn Stable had a racing interest lining up behind the starting car. With Jordan Ross in the bike, Aeterna's Choice was slotted in post 6 in the field of eight. When the gate folded, Ross settled in along the pylons next to last and sat through fractions of :27 and :56.1 while Persistent Threat A, one of the winningest horses thus far in the Hoosier Park meet, led the field.

As the group raced into the second turn, Ross abandoned the pylons with the 6-year-old, and once in the stretch, the

gelding dashed home in :27.4, the second fastest last quarter in the field. While Persistent Threat A was the clear winner for driver Marcus Miller, Aeterna's Choice fought gamely late and nearly edged second choice Caribbean King at the wire. The gelding was timed in 1:53.4.

It wasn't a win, but that wasn't as important as the bigger picture. It was a gratifying performance. After nine weeks without a horse to cheer on, we had one that finished in the money and even hit the board. With another stride or two he would have finished second. Like those connections that I have interviewed in the past, this was as good as a win because of what it represented.

In the day-after missive from Rheinheimer that summarized Wednesday's contest, the Ancoras were equally excited about the performance.

"We were thrilled with his effort last night," they said, "He finished the mile incredibly well and just missed second. We hope we can keep building on this moving forward!"

And that is the challenge. Can Aeterna's Choice continue to move forward? It will be exciting to see how the next few starts play out. The good news is, we're back in the game.







Does our sport need bowling lessons?

Through years of my misspent youth, I spent quite a bit of time in the bowling alleys throughout Chicagoland.

By the age of 16, I was pretty, darn good, averaging over 200 and competing in some lofty company with the older set -35 to 70 - in pot games and tournaments.

The conditions were tough back then with the wooden lanes serving up an occasional "high board" that would pop up with bowler's having a tough time getting their bowling balls over the high board to the 1-3 pocket, or 1-2 pocket, if you were left-handed.

I had one bowling ball - a new one with the first adjustable thumb hole with a crank - and that was it!

The wooden pins — hard rock maple — were as light as 3 lbs. 2 oz. up to 3 lbs. 8 oz. back then with some tournaments featuring 4 lb. wood, like the Petersen Classic.

Some lanes were so difficult that one prominent bowler back then, Ron Levine, witnessed the demolition of Pla-Mor Lanes and, even after their demolition, he said the "10" pin was still, standing on lane 16.

I had my first perfect 300 game at the age of 17 and was Illinois State Single Champion in 1970, averaging 246 for the tournament with very difficult tournament conditions.

What's all this about?

Well, bowling has come a long, long way since I was earning money as a 10-year-old, sneaking into the back pinsetter area to help my friend Wimpy set pins, at four cents a game.

When I started bowling, the price per game was 25 cents with, roughly, six million keglers participating in the U.S.

Today, there are well over 65 million bowlers in the U.S., and they fork over \$5 or more per game, some places getting as high as \$10 per line.

The bowling balls have changed and become so tech savvy that 150 average bowlers have become 200+ average bowlers with innovations of reactive resin, urethane and high-tech core designs, so, while I had one bowling ball, today's kegler has as many as 12, or more.

The "smart" bowling ball even has sensors that feature feedback on speed, impact and rotation.

Lane surfaces have transitioned from wood to synthetic materials for smoother surfaces and durability.

Even our traditional pinsetters have been replaced with sensors, and the sideboards and back boards are livelier providing more pin action and higher scoring.

And bowling centers have luxurious lounges, video walls and are multi-faceted entertainment centers.

One other thing, back when I started bowling, we watched Championship Bowling at Faetz-Niesen Recreation in Chicago and the Pro-Bowlers Tour on Saturday afternoons on ABC.

Today, they also have their own TV Channel - BOWL TV - with finals on CBS Sports.


Bowl TV covers juniors, collegiate events, the PBA tour, mixed doubles events, PBA 50 and so much more.

Yes, it is a subscription-based channel, but they have almost 100,000 YouTube subscribers.

And when I bowled, my aforementioned first 300 game in 1960, there were so few perfect games per year that you could probably count them on two hands.

In other words, the bowling industry has catered to their audience, their players, their fans.

Our grand sport doesn't do that too much anymore, especially at tracks that are subsidized by casinos and certain State legislators. And those not having the luxury of funds from casinos cannot afford to spend significant sums of capital as they have horsemen and purses and overhead about which to worry just to stay in business.

Oh, the breeders have done their part in our progression as they have — just like the bowling industry has made 150 average bowlers into 200+ keglers — turned the once prestigious 2:10 2-year-old into a ho-hum 2:00 list for those juveniles, and, sadly, we know what a 2:00 earning potential is for a youngster.

Sulky designs have contributed, as well, and so have equipment changes altered our sport and its performers, lighter sulkies, stronger sulkies, safer sulkies.

But we are still losing our fan base, and the bettor is being left at the starting gate.

Past HRU columns have suggested ways to help build a new fan base and fan value, which has declined over the past 40 years as age, and shorter fields, have taken a toll on payoffs and fan shrinkage due to the inevitable.

We have always played second fiddle to the thoroughbreds and, thank goodness for Gabe Prewitt, Jessica Otten, and the others that get a few of our worthy events televised, BUT, we need our own dedicated 24-hour harness racing network covering the harness racing world.

We have to go for the gusto if we are to be considered a major league league, which we are.

Isn't there enough action in North America, Europe, Down Under and, even, South America and Bermuda to propel our sport into the future?

Every industry who reads this better say "YES!"

Yes, we do have the Racetrack Television Network and HRTV (acquired by TVG) but thoroughbred racing remains the king, and we have to do something about that.

Our industry should have a National Pick-8 with all tracks sharing in the takeout profitability.

Modeled after the Powerball or Mega Millions, the wager could be based on a \$.20 cent or \$.50 cent price per combination with the requirement being to pick the first seven winners, followed by a winning trifecta in the last leg (similar to the Powerball number).

It could be seeded with a \$20,000,000 stipend and, quite possibly, grow to several hundred million dollars, a jolt for the industry.

Minor prizes would be awarded for those with four, five, six or seven winners without the final trifecta.

The takeout could be much less than the current lottery system with funds also allocated to horse aftercare, youth programs and, possibly, equine social security.

We've suggested ways to eliminate all whipping penalties by extending the saddle pads out to the horse's rump — the back section padded — so when the driver has the need to try and get another length or two of speed for his owner, trainer and, most important, the guy or gal that has \$2 on the horse to win, there will be just a pop sound and no welts, stripes or discomfort.

IT'S AN EASY FIX!!

We have also proposed putting door-bell cameras every 16th of a mile along the track so there can be no argument as to inquiries or objections after a race.

But even that is not now good enough as Jessica Hallett has experimented with head camera helmets. which is even a better idea.

As one BDHC (Broken Down Horseplayer Club) enthusiast lamented, "Some of us get awfully disgusted when these guys put an extra length between horses by leaning back so much. Halfway through, we know we have no chance 10-15 lengths out of it. Half the field is out of reach, and that doesn't help harness racing!"

We'd better start listening to our remaining few fans.

Sadly, our sport has taken not *one single stride* in re-inventing our sport for our fans.

There's a lot more, but we're running out of time, and space.

Finally, I am often asked, "Why do you even care? You are old."

The answer, "When you love someone or something, you never want that love to go away."

Yes, it is inevitable that life ends for all of us, as it did for our grandparents and parents, and, one moment, will end for us.

Heartbeats don't last forever.

I'm hoping the hoof beats do.

The Hambletonian's keyrace status is a bettor's delightful secret

The superlatives connected to describing the historic relevance of the Hambletonian flow internationally through its century of standardbred reporting. Those of us writing about it over the past few decades made it the center point of racing activity; especially inside the industry. It represents more than a measure of harness racing at its best. It defines the breed as the blood of the species is represented in every trotter competing.

However, it was never an affair exalted in style or character when it came to the professional harness racing bettor. The most serious punters saw it as the finest spectator harness race in the expanse of pari-mutuel scenery. They admired its quality and magnificence. But they did not support it with strong financial investments at the betting windows.

However, the Hambletonian is one of the few types of races essential for any adroit pari-mutuel bettor looking for profitable plays in the future. I learned this in the 1980s when the brilliant horse race handicapper/author Mark Cramer introduced me to a rare and remarkable gambit for use in pari-mutuel wagering.

Although Cramer was a harbinger of gimmicks along with many other particular handicapping elements available to the public it was this maneuver — one that dates decades back with no official author — one that survived through the many wired minds in a spectrum of pari-mutuel bettors at tracks from coast to coast in North America, and one which circulated mostly among thoroughbred wagering circles, that remains a knack not to ignore.

I was never a gimmick bettor but this one has a unique element; it was a sterling "instant play" plan that always manages to produce a profit. And let us face it, doing next to no work at all to make money at the racetrack should get the attention of anyone spending time betting at a racetrack.

It is called 'The Key Race Theory' and it secures a mighty advantage for a bettor as well as it is the simplest handicapping analysis anyone can calculate.

Cramer explained the Key Race Theory with examples of its success before he defined the positively charged dense center

of one. He presented me with horses over the course of many years from various thoroughbred races that hit the board and paid win and win/place and win/place/show prices after their appearances in their previous race.

That previous race is identified as a key race.

A key race is an anomaly; a deviation from the normal or common order or form or rule of a field of racehorses. It includes a group of ultra-superior performers. Whether it is a field of eight or 10 or more. It involves extraordinary talent that we define with imprecise data (call it class) and is not easily put into words.

It does not matter if it is a field of colts or fillies or mares or maidens or an older group competing on dirt or turf that are sprinting or routing or running or jumping for that matter. A key race field is a group that will race better than it may against one another than it may have ever raced. And no matter the finishing order it will assure each loser will present cash-worthy performances next time out. The future of its participants alone are its many gifts.

Coming out of a key race, said Mark, the losers are each instant plays: wagers requiring no handicapping effort. Why? Because no matter where any in a key race finishes, all of them are ultra-strong contenders in their next race. Maybe their next two.

Cramer kept mounds of old *Daily Racing Forms* and extracted billows of information from them, including key races producing across-the-board payoffs from their fields no matter the post and class and track conditions. Some prices were great. Some mediocre. But isn't any price considered value for a "lock?" A sure thing? Absolutely. And key races produce the closest "sure things" to bet than any handicapping method provides.

I pursued searching to find key races in standardbred fields even though considering the natures of the breeds they would be tougher to identify. One day some years after Cramer's influence I discovered harness racing's greatest key race. It is the single most revered event of international harness racing seasons.

It is The Hambletonian.

The top sophomore trotters (with or without a filly or two) in any Hambletonian final field rebound to win and place or show with explosive consistency in their next two races. Especially the losers. They confirm the strength of the key-race theory by returning in their next race with strong performances. And they qualify as overlays at any price offered; some of which reflect the betting public's lack of respect for being a contestant in the world's greatest trotting event.

The 100th Hambletonian is guaranteed to predict profits for the bettor using the key-race theory.





End of the line

Shaking my head, I said, "Different world, pal."

"And getting weirder. But I get a year's severance and some pension money. I won't need to take a lie detector test or pass a political loyalty test, so I'm good. I may not even look for another gig." Rodney stood to reel in his line and check his worm, then asked, "What would happen to harness racing if a chainsaw suddenly came your way?"

"Nothing good. In my experience, when a racing state racing program goes belly up, they don't return."

"Accept what is gone. Don't bother with remnants of what was, the various schedules, classifications, commercial racetracks, and yes, pari-mutuel gambling. Everything is toast. The rebuild will be without everything we are familiar with. The new foundation is for people who enjoy racing a horse pulling a sulky in competition against others. How many people will fill that bill is to be determined."

"That doesn't explain much. What's the structure? What are the economics?"

"The key word in the total rebuild is total focus."

"Those are two words that don't make sense."

"The sport has always been a treadmill of 10 different things that dilute interest. Why not be super focused in the new world and have all eyes looking at the same thing at the same time frame? The new structure would be straightforward: only trotters, a specific season, and horses aged 2 through 4 in state or private horse programs. The game's reboot would be more social."

"But where's the money? You need some cash. Participants need to race for something."

"Whoever is doing this rebuild would knock on doors for funding using agricultural grants, state grants, and private endowments. Without the drag of gambling as our backbone, stressing the benefits of employment, greenspace, recreation, therapy, social interaction, youth opportunities, local fair improvements, and historical grants will all have more clout."

"That won't make much of a purse structure."

"True, players will still pony up out of pocket to participate, probably nominations to five or 10 thousand per horse. You put all the money in a pot and race with a point system to pay a stipend back to the players. Maybe a handful of players will make some money, and many folks may get back a little, but nobody gets rich."

"No gambling money?"

"Doubtful, that barn door will likely be closed."

"That sounds like a long shot, a very long road."

"It's better than no shot or no road. Maybe it would be fun, different, less business."

Rodney sipped his coffee, gazed at the still pond, and said, "Count me in for the small, social, post-apocalyptic harness racing program. I have some cash, like horses, and need a new hobby. I could use the fresh air, and it looks like I won't have anything to do - again."



New winners in PA Stakes action at Philly

There was no sophomore trotting filly adding a second Pennsylvania Sire Stakes credit to her resume when two divisions of the third preliminary round were raced at Harrah's Philadelphia on Friday afternoon (July 18); in fact, both winners had most recently competed in the Stallion Series division of the Pennsylvania program.

The quicker winner was the Greenshoe filly **Dearly Beloved**, who has victories in the PA Stallion Series, the Currier & Ives, and now the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes in her last three starts after lowering her mark to 1:53.1 in this \$51,683 division. Dearly Beloved was moved uncovered at the half by driver David Miller, and the game filly, now six-for-nine on the year, trotted her own back half in :55.4 to go past pacesetting favorite Hangover by 1½ lengths for trainer Jenny Melander and owner Donald Bartling.

The "uncovered horse catching the front stepping chalk by 1½ lengths" scenario was repeated in the second division of the Sire Stake, worth \$52,083; here it was **Highlandstarburst**, a daughter of Father Patrick, overcoming the rough journey under Yannick Gingras' handling to go past leader Payback Moni to win in a lifetime best 1:53.2; her own back numbers were :55.2 - :27.3. Trainer Nancy Takter took trotting hopples off the filly upon her arrival to her new barn, and the filly had no problems winning for Highland Thoroughbred Frm.

In the only \$20,000 division of Stallion Series action for this group, the International Moni filly **Seal The Deal As** dropped down from the Sire Stakes and was much the best in her field, winning in 1:52.4, a new mark, faster than either Sire Stakes division, and only three-fifths-of-a-second off the track record. Tim Tetrick got the winner of two straight to the lead at the quarter, saw favored Tabdone behind him make a break as she started to move forward, and had an easy time of it after that, with only pocket sitter Bay Breeze Hanover within hailing distance, and she was three lengths back at the line. A winner of two straight, Seal The Deal As is trained by Anette Lorentzon for ACL Stuteri AB.

Last Friday trainer Ray Burt sent the longest-priced winner of the meet, Sporty Dragon, who paid \$136.20 for a \$2 ticket.

The crowd will catch on to Burt eventually, but it didn't Friday – just seven days later, Burt was the conditioner behind **A Stud Named Sam**, who came from off a hot pace to win and return \$121.20.

Burt is the only trainer to have two \$50+ "bombers" in the meet, and both of his brought back over \$100. A Stud Named Sam was driven by Patrick Ryder, one of only two horsemen to have a pair of \$50+ winners at Philly in 2025 – the other is Johnathan Ahle, who drove Sporty Dragon! Later on the card, Ahle grabbed the "bomber lead" back when winning with Always Trump at \$54.40. There were five \$50+ horses in the first 37 days of the 2025 season, and now there have been five in the last eight, including Ahle's triple contribution.

The meet's leading driver, Tim Tetrick, led all sulkysitters with three wins on Friday; doubles were put up by David Miller, George Napolitano, Jr., and Åke Svanstedt. Svanstedt also had a pair of winners on the training side, as did Brett Pelling.

The racing week will conclude at Philly today with a 12:40 p.m. card; there will be a carryover of \$3381.32 into the first race Pick 4 pool. Free Philly program pages are or will be available at www.phha.org.

BABY TROTTING FILLIES ABOUND IN PHILLY STAKES ACTION

A total of \$240,752 was on the line Thursday afternoon (July 17) during the second preliminary round of the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes and Stallion Series for 2-year-old trotting fillies. Favorites did not do well in the stakes, coming up only one-for-nine, and there was only one repeat winner, but every equine visitor to Victory Lane either set or equaled her mark.

And on the unusual day of an all-trot 15-race card, it was good to be among this group: Team Orange Crush, Todd Schadel, Dexter Dunn, and sires Bar Hopping and Captain Corey.

Fastest of the three Sire Stakes divisions was the 1:55.1 mile turned in by the Captain Corey—Island Lily filly Islandgirl

Hanover, who moved uncovered against favored Atlantic Summer then left her 2¾ lengths behind. Islandgirl Hanover came her back half in :56 and took a new mark for trainer/driver Trond Smedshammer and Purple Haze Stables LLC.

The sole repeat winner in the stakes action was the Bar Hopping—Perfect Chance miss **Ginger Tree Lex**, who flew home in :56.2 to equal her mark of 1:57.1 while capturing her second Sire Stakes. Andrew McCarthy guided the winner for trainer Steve Cook and owners Samuel Beegle, Ginger Tree Ventures LLC, Knollview Stable 2, and Robert Reber, Jr. The sires of seven of the nine stakes successes were Bar Hopping who had four offspring triumph and Captain Corey who had three, including both of these Sires victories.

The only stakes chalk to triumph the entire day was the third PASS winner, **Next Big Think** (Greenshoe—Iteration), who broke her maiden in 1:57. Dexter Dunn (who won a division of the PASS and the PAStS as well as an overnight) was in the sulky behind the Marcus Melander trainee for Courant Inc.

Trainer Todd Schadel may have had eight freshmen rained out at the Bedford (PA) Fair, but he still harnessed two Stallion Series winners, including the fastest one in **Snow Queen Hanover** (Bar Hopping—Snowflake Hanover), who won in 1:55.3, like all her fellow Stallion Series winners a maiden no more. Schadel co-owns the winner with Jim Simpson, and she was guided by Andy Miller, about whom more in a bit. Schadel and Bar Hopping also came together with another Bar Hopping miss, **Amber Ale Hanover** (dam Abbie Hall), in 2:00.2 for driver David Miller.

Bar Hopping got his third StS winner and fourth stakes winner on the card with **Be Mine Hanover** (dam Birgitta Hanover), who came from the pocket to win in 1:57.2 for trainer/driver Åke Svanstedt.

We mentioned Andy Miller and Team Orange Crunch earlier, and they opened the card with the biggest outsider of the day (\$29.40) and one of the two Captain Corey Stallion Series winners, **Just Teasing** (dam Just Joshing), who came home uncovered in :56.3 to win in 1:56.2. In all, Julie Miller trained three winners for the stable, and Andy won four races, which almost became five in the last race until son Tyler overhauled him with I See A Star.

The other Captain Corey winner was the only one involved in a photo finish, **Handle Station** (dam Harness Am), who won by a neck in 1:58 over Caviart Queen Emma for driver Tim Tetrick and trainer Lucas Wallin. The final Stallion Series winner was making her first purse start, **Pray For A Win** (Father Patrick—Andover The Prize), and she is now one-for-one after tallying in 1:57 for trainer Nancy Takter and driver Dexter Dunn.





Daley trainees star in Thursday's NYSS at Yonkers

Trainer Noel Daley's entrants, **Seismic Step** and Seven Layer, finished first and second in a non-wagering \$162,000 New York Sire Stakes event for 3-year-old male trotters on Thursday (July 17) evening at MGM Yonkers Raceway.

Driven by Jordan Stratton, Seismic Step cut fractions of :27.1, :57 and 1:27 with BJM's Lil Man (Tyler Buter) in the pocket, Seven Layer (Niko Karna) third and Karinchak (Mark MacDonald) distanced after he broke before the start. Karna sent Seven Layer to the outside before three-quarters and loomed on the rim to the wire, but he could never reach Seismic Step, who

wound up the winner by a length. BJM's Lil Man and Karinchak completed the order.

A Chapter Seven gelding bred by Alan and Larry Troyer, Seismic Step is trained by Daley for owners Allister Stables LLC., Sjoblom Racing Inc., Michael Dolan and Harbor Racing Stable LLC. Unraced as a 2-year-old, Seismic Step has two wins, a second and a third from eight starts this year and has now earned \$129,253.

Trainer Jessica Okusko also pulled off the sweep of the top two finishing positions in the one \$20,000 New York Excelsior Series tilt on the pari-mutuel program as her **Banksy Monkey** (George Brennan) was on top at the 28 second quarter-mile station, the :58.2 half and the 1:27.4 three-quarters en route to a 3¾ length triumph over stablemate Logo (MacDonald), who advanced from fifth to third in the final quarter. Doctor Strange (John Stark, Jr.) collected third.

Okusko sent out the victorious colt by Chapter Seven for owner Paul O'Neil. Banksy Monkey, who was bred by Order By Stable Ab, now has a summary of 4-2-0 from nine trips behind the gate, has now pocketed \$40,375 and paid \$4.70 to win as part of a favored entry. He led a \$30.60 exacta and a \$59 trifecta.

MGM Yonkers Raceway is currently operating on a Monday-Tuesday and Thursday through Saturday live racing schedule with post time each night at 6:45 p.m. (EDT). The New York Sire Stakes circuit will return to Yonkers next Thursday with the fourth leg for 2-year-old trotting colts and geldings.





'BG' stays perfect after NJSS win at Big M

Be Perfect BG made good on her name Friday night (July 18) at The Meadowlands, remaining unbeaten in four lifetime starts after taking the lone filly pace when seven \$25,000 divisions of the second leg of the New Jersey Sire Stakes for 2-year-olds were contested for horses of each sex and gait.

The daughter of Perfect Sting—Jk Mardi Says impressed winning last week after leaving from post 11, and driver Dexter Dunn said it was more of the same this time around.

"She felt just as good [as last week]," said Dunn. "The trip was a little better for her tonight [leaving from post 5]. She seems to be learning all the time and she was really good tonight."

Sitting just behind leader Perfect Thought through an opening quarter of :27.1 and half of :56.1, Dunn opted to pop out of the pocket at the five-eighths, made steady progress on the leader while still less than a length behind at three-quarters (which went in 1:25.2), roared to the point at the head of the stretch before going on to a convincing 2½-length win in a snappy lifetime-best of 1:51.4. Perfect Thought held second with Beautiful Memory third.

"She was on the front last week and was good off the helmet tonight," said Dunn. "She came off [her cover] and sprinted home. For sure, at this stage, there are a lot of positive signs [that point to her having a big year]."

A Tony Beaton trainee who is owned by Ecurie CSL, Be Perfect BG, who has gone off as the favorite in each of her career outings, returned \$2.60 to her backers after going off at odds of 1-5.

Tetrick, George sweep sire stakes at Hoosier Park

The leading driver and trainer at Harrah's Hoosier Park each widened their lead atop the standing as Trace Tetrick and Tyler George teamed up for big nights, including sweeping both divisions of the fifth leg of Indiana Sire Stakes for 3-year-old pacing colts on Friday (July 18).

The \$49,000 first division saw the undefeated **Rock Shines Again** extend his win streak to seven on the year as the 1-5 favorite. Leaving from post 3, Tetrick hustled Rock Shines Again to the top around Rockin Mudslinger (Jordan Ross) to cut the quarter in :26.4. Once clear, Tetrick tapped the brakes on the backstretch and the six in pursuit of the favorite showed their respect by remaining single file behind the bettors' choice to the half in :55.4. Avanti (John De Long) was the first to move from third on the final turn, but Rock Shines Again hit the accelerator and opened his lead to 3½ lengths at three-quarters in 1:23.2.

Once in the lane, Rock Shines Again continued to power clear under minimal Tetrick urging, coasting home a four-length winner with the ear plugs still in place to stop the timer in 1:50. Avanti outdueled Book The Fight (Kyle Wilfong) by a quarter-of-a-length to be second.

After going winless through 11 starts at age 2, Rock Shines Again has been perfect since moving to the George barn at age 3. The gelded son of Rockin Image—Bikini Star has banked \$73,000 on the season for owners Ricky Redder and T G Stable.

In the \$49,500 second division, **Rawtn Tale** made his first start in the George stable a winning one as the even-money favorite. Tetrick and Rawtn Tale protected their rail position off the gate, getting away second behind 15-1 shot The Family Man (Marcus Miller) through an opening quarter of :27.3. Tetrick moved Rawtn Tale to the top on the backstretch, continuing leisurely fractions to the half in :56.2. Action picked up moving into the far turn, with Starlit Millertime (Atlee Bender) moving first-over from third while Rawtn Tale brought the field of eight to three-quarters in 1:24.2.

Tetrick began to call on Rawtn Tale for more turning for home with the field beginning to swarm the leader. Starlit Millertime continued to close to his outside while an overloaded The Family Man squeezed inside of Rawtn Tale against the cones. The three would hit the wire together, with Rawtn Tale nosing out Starlit Millertime on the line in 1:51.2 and The Family Man just a quarter-of-a-length back in third. Just two lengths separated the top six on the wire.



The start was also the first of Rawtn Tale's for new owners Thunder Racing Stables and T G Stable. The gelded son of Tellitlikeitis—Raw Diamond has now won five of 10 in 2025, banking \$76,250 on the year after going winless in nine starts a year ago.

In all, Trace Tetrick won five of 13 races on the card, including one more for Tyler George to give him a training hat-trick on the evening.

ON TO NORWAY MATCHES TRACK RECORD, RECORDS 10TH STRAIGHT

On To Norway extended his win streak to double digits emphatically on Thursday (July 17) at Harrah's Hoosier Park, matching the track record for 3-year-old trotting geldings in one of two \$49,000 splits of Indiana Sire Stakes.

Established as the 1-2 favorite from post 4, John De Long guided On To Norway into fourth on the first turn while Operator (Kyle Wilfong) rocketed to the top through a first quarter of :26.4. Operator faced pressure on the backstretch from Eugene The Genius who was unable to find a seat on the first turn in the field of six, before pressing the leader to a half of :55. On To Norway began to close on the dueling lead trio, moving into position second-over from fourth while Operator began to turn away Eugene The Genius at three-quarters in 1:24.1.

On To Norway ripped off cover turning for home, quickly grabbing a short lead as he and Operator began to separate themselves from the remainder of the field. Trotting home in :26.4, On To Norway outsprinted a game Operator to reach the wire first by three-parts-of-a-length in 1:51.2. Pocket-sitter Bluebird Ladychuck (Dan Shetler) edged out Tarzan (Marcus Miller) for third, 6½ lengths behind the winner.

Since finishing second in his 3-year-old debut, On To Norway has won all 10 starts, and the last eight victories have come in the barn of Ron Burke. The gelded son of Muscle Massive—One Class Act has made \$149,975 on the year for owners Burke Racing Stable, Frank Baldachino, Black And White Stable and Michael Rosenthal. Bred by Bennett Farms Inc of MI, On To Norway has won 14 of 20 lifetime with career earnings just shy of \$175,000.

In the first division, **Ponda Rocky** pulled a mild 3-1 upset when he upended the 1-9 favorite Starlitfranknstein. Driver Atlee Bender found a seat in third early while 21-1 longshot Fruit Snacker (Joey Putnam) hustled to the top through a quarter of :27.1. Starlitfranknstein moved from the pocket to the top on the backstretch, taking the field of six to the half in :55.3. Bender wheeled Ponda Rocky from third around the final turn while Starlitfranknstein tried to give the field the slip, opening up by 3½ lengths at three-quarters in 1:24.1.

Fruit Snacker jumped it off turning for home, giving Ponda Rocky clearance to drop back in the pocket behind Starlitfranknstein for a braving-up tuck midway through the lane. Ponda Rocky closed to the Tetrick helmet before sliding back to the outside for more, getting by Starlitfranknstein by a length in deep stretch to score in 1:53. Fifty Rivers (LeWayne Miller) outbattled Massive Desire (Mike Peterson) for the show spot, six lengths behind the winner.

Trained by Erv Miller, Ponda Rocky has won three of nine on the season for owners Engel Stable of IL, Jerry Graham and Louis Willinger. Bred by Pond-A-Acres, the gelded son of Pastor Stephen—Wildflower has banked \$62,040 on the season and went over six-figures in career earnings following the lifetime best score.





Freshman pacing colt Beau Jangles wins second OSS Gold in two weeks

Just two races into his career, freshman pacing colt **Beau Jangles** is already building an impressive resume in the Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) program.

On Saturday (July 19) at Woodbine Mohawk Park, the 1-2 favored son of Cattlewash out of Mrs Major Hill won his second \$140,000 Gold event in as many weeks, storming to a 1:51.1 victory in a talented field of 10.

The Dr. Ian Moore trainee, bred by Tara Hills Stud of Port Perry, ON, already has earnings of \$140,000 for owners Graham Grace Stables of Clifton, VA, Kiwi Stables LLC of La Plata, MD and Bolton Stables of Clermont, FL, who purchased Beau Jangles for \$65,000 U.S. at the 2024 Standardbred Horse Sales Company's yearling sale in Harrisburg, PA.

In the most recent Gold, Bob McClure settled Beau Jangles fourth off the gate from post 8 as both No Waitlist (Travis Henry) and Tilthecowscomehome (Jody Jamieson) left hard from posts 6 and 10, respectively. Ultimately, it was Windor (Doug McNair) that led the field to the :26.4. McClure had Beau Jangles out and rolling shortly after, and claimed the front before hitting the half-mile marker in :55.4. He took the field through the 1:24.2 third-quarter station and powered home to record a 1½ length victory.

Beau Jangles paid \$3 to win.

Tilthecowscomehome was a strong second despite the outside post. Windor went inside two pylons, but judges ruled he was forced inside the pylons and kept him up for third, followed by Borderline Mobby (James MacDonald) and No Waitlist.

Beau Jangles won the first Gold event in the division on July 5 at Woodbine Mohawk Park in 1:50.1. McClure said the colt was even more impressive in his most recent outing.

"He felt even better tonight," McClure told Woodbine broadcaster John Rallis in the winner's circle on Saturday. "I knew [Tilthecowscomehome having] the outside post, there was going to be a lot of horses leaving to follow him. So, he left, and then I ducked him behind, and [Beau Jangles] worked his way to the front.

"He's just a real pro about everything, and he got stretched pretty good to get there and he just shut down in the third quarter... and then as soon as I called on him to kick home, he just kicked into gear. And, you know, he's just kind of playing around out there. His ears were up and everything. But when they got to him after the wire there, he just wanted to go around again."

Dr. Moore said Beau Jangles already has an impressive array of talents.

"I told Bobby before the race, 'You can do whatever you want, but probably not too far from the front," Dr. Moore said. "He'll sit in a hole, no problem. He'll do it whichever way you want. He doesn't wear any earplugs. So, he's been very good so far, and not like some of them, you know, when they get on the front a bit and they get a little racy, they get a little hard to handle. But this guy's been good. He was good today."

The trainer said Beau Jangles is large for a 2-year-old and his stride appears to be lengthening.

"I was just watching the replay on the big screen behind us and it looks like his hopples might be too tight now, because he's striding out more than he used to," Dr. Moore said. "We set them about 60 inches when we broke him, and then we never touched them. So, I'll check them out tomorrow. The problem is, with 2-year-olds, is that you only race them 10, 11, times, and every race is a big race. Do you let them out an inch or two or what do you do? It's a hard take sometimes, but I think I can let them out. He's very sure-footed and very steady and so it should be no problem."

Dr. Moore said Beau Jangles may race next in the Battle of Waterloo, which has its final on Aug. 4 at Grand River Raceway. But first, he has to discuss the options with the colt's owners. The next Gold Series event for 2-year-old pacing colts is Aug. 14 at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Doug McNair piloted **A Clean Deal** up the inside in deep stretch and out-gunned a four-horse cavalry charge to the wire to win the lone \$140,000 Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Gold event for 2-year-old filly pacers on Thursday (July 17) at Woodbine Mohawk Park in 1:53.1.

The victory kept the daughter of Cattlewash—Ideal Talker undefeated through three lifetime starts and also perfect in OSS action. In the first OSS Gold for 2-year-old pacing fillies, A Clean Deal won in a career-best 1:50.4 on July 4 at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

The most recent Gold was an action-packed seven-horse affair that essentially became a field of six when 3-2 favorite Shes A Bulldog (Yannick Gingras) made a break in the first turn. A Clean Deal took advantage and led the field to the :27 quarter before relinquishing the lead to Jay (Bob McClure) before the :56.2 half. When TH Check Me Out (Tyler Borth) powered toward the front, McNair followed and then got locked in on the rail in third. TH Check Me Out took the field to the 1:23.4 three-quarters with Daya (Jody Jamieson) in second and A Clean Deal third. "In the last turn, I didn't know how much pace [A Clean Deal] had. I left with her and removed her. Also, it's a cold night out here. It's cold and windy, it's not hot like it's been for the last month or so. So, it was a pretty big effort. I never even got the



Ryder happy with Twin B Joe Fresh heading into Clara Barton pace

Twin B Joe Fresh, the 2024 Dan Patch Horse of the Year, will be making her first-ever appearance in Massachusetts today (July 20) when she ships to Plainridge Park to start in the \$100,000 Grade 3 Clara Barton Distaff Pace. And new Hall of Famer, trainer Chris Ryder, who co-owns the champion with her driver Dexter Dunn, Peter Trebotica and Barry Spak, couldn't be happier with his mare as she heads to the Commonwealth.

Twin B Joe Fresh is coming in off an eye-popping 1:48.1 romp that featured a :25.3 final quarter in the \$142,000 Dorothy Haughton at The Meadowlands last week, and her preparation for this race was summed up simply by her trainer.

"Bang-on! Just the way we like it," Ryder said. "No hiccups, and physically she's fine. Right now, everything is good. She's a healthy horse and not that difficult at all. It's her fourth year of racing at a high level and not too many horses do that. Once they have a year or two at the top level they seem to peter-off. But she's been holding her top-line form terrific. She's ready to go."

Over the past four years, Twin B Joe Fresh has put up unbelievable numbers on the strength of her unbelievable performances. She has won 33 times in only 44 lifetime starts with eight seconds and a third while earning \$2,588,647 for her efforts. It takes a special kind of pacer to post stats like that and Ryder said her physical attributes set her apart from the rest.

"I always say good horses do good things, and she's something else," Ryder said. "She's very strong and obviously, she's got speed. But she's a bit of an exception when you look at her. Physically, she's exceptionally strong. She's built like a stud horse and as she's gotten older, I think it's helped her carry her speed more. She doesn't look like a filly at all.

"Her work is fairly light now that she's racing. She obviously jogs every day; she doesn't swim or anything like that. She's prone to tying up, so she goes in the field every morning before she jogs. And most days we'll just let her pace free-legged and not that fast to keep her loose."

The field for the Barton is short, but has five other very capable mares competing including last year's Clara Barton winner, Sylvia Hanover, whose rivalry with Twin B Joe Fresh has become long-running and somewhat legendary.

The United States Trotting Association's media director, Ken Weingartner, pointed out that the two mares have met 16 times during their careers with Twin B Joe Fresh winning 10 and Sylvia Hanover winning five. The only time one of them didn't win a head-to-head event was when Grace Hill won the Breeders Crown Mare Pace elimination last October.

Despite this fierce competition on the track, Ryder said the rivalry is a friendly one.

"We talk freely in the paddock with the Steacy's, they're nice people, and the time is very friendly and competitive," Ryder said. "I'm pleased for them if they beat us and I think it's the same the other way around. Sylvia is a lovely mare and it is a good rivalry the mares have."

When that rivalry gets renewed this week, Ryder feels Twin B Joe Fresh will benefit from the short field that entered.

"Oh, it 100 per cent helps her," he said. "And this was an ideal draw for her too. I think she'll control the race. I don't see how she doesn't control it."

Ryder has raced at Plainridge Park only one other time in his career in 2013, when he was in a pinch to get a filly trotter qualified for a New York Sire Stake final, and he was very impressed with his experience there.

"The track couldn't have been any better," Ryder said. "They were terrific, I couldn't say enough good things about them."

Twin B Joe Fresh is affectionately known as "Joey" around the barn, because Ryder said they couldn't come up with a better name for her.

"Twinbrook Farm was delighted we didn't change her name," Ryder said. "The official breeder was Brittany Farms, but they sold the mare in foal at Harrisburg and Twinbrook bought her. So Twin B Joe Fresh was actually foaled at Twinbrook in Canada."

Ryder will not be on hand Sunday to watch his mare race due to another commitment, but Joey will definitely be on hand to try and add to her already gaudy career totals and maybe make some history.

The stake and all-time track pacing record is 1:48.1. It was achieved twice in the Barton by Shartin N and her stablemate Lyons Sentinel, and it appears to be a number that could be rewritten this week.

The \$100,000 Clara Barton Distaff Pace is carded as race 7 with an estimated post time of 4 p.m. Post time for the first race is at 2 p.m.

DSBF finals headline Harrington Delaware State Fair Program

Harrington Raceway's richest program of the season was contested on opening night of the Delaware State Fair Thursday (July 17) with an 11-race card.

A total of \$635,000 in purses were contested, including four \$110,000 Delaware Standardbred Breeders Fund finals for 3-year-olds.

Jane Dunavant's **Kat's Fancy** (\$2.40, Cody Poliseno) won the filly trotting final in a nine-length romp over Buttoncandy and Peggys Girl. The Dusty Winner filly notched her fourth straight win for trainer Carlo Poliseno in 1:59.4.

Forrest Bartlett's **Primo Maschio** (\$2.10, Trae Porter) was a 1:53.2 winner in the male pacing final over Shore Not Beach and Wyatt Earp. The Badlands Hanover gelding improved to 16-for-19 lifetime for trainer Walt Callahan and continued his dominance of DSBF events, winning his third final.

Rodney Wyatt and Kevin Peck's **Valentina Station** (\$38.20, Eddie Dennis) was an upset winner in the filly pacing final over Little Miss Peyton and Bella Artiste in 1:56.3. The Badlands Hanover filly set all the fractions in the fourth win of her career.

Stacy Johnson-Stafford's **Yale** (\$2.10, Art Stafford, Jr.) was a 1:59.4 winner over Wolfpack Cheddar and Delaware Xactly in the male trotting final. The EL Platinum colt notched his fourth win in six lifetime starts for trainer/driver Stafford, Jr.

The \$50,000 Governor's Cup highlighted a series of long-standing races for older horses. Tlb Racing's **CaptainCountrystar** (\$7.80, Montrell Teague) was a 1:51.2 winner over Downers Delight and Adam Twelve for trainer Traci Berry.

Breakaway Racing and Yorwollohan Racing Team's **Speed Away** (\$3.80, Corey Callahan) won the \$35,000 Charles Murphy Jr. Memorial Trot in 1:55 over Swan Flyer and Muscle Dynasty. The Nick Callahan-trainees last 13 wins have come at Harrington. The Wiz Kids Stable's **Disturbed Hanover** (\$7, Barton Dalious) was a 1:53.3 winner over Grandeur Seelster and Sweet Molly in the \$35,000 Legislator's Cup. Trained by Bart Dalious, it was her 38th career win.

Live racing will return to Harrington on Aug. 11.

The Red Mile opens its 150th season with a bang

On Sunday (July 20), The Red Mile kicks off the historic red clay oval's 150th season of operation under the lights with eight \$50,000 Kentucky Proud finals for freshman and sophomores of both gaits on a 10-race card.

The road to championships rolls through the Bluegrass as the Kentucky Sire Stakes program produced Dan Patch Award winners Louprint, Miki And Minnie and Allegiant, with Sig Sauer capturing the Kentucky Futurity, the third gem in the Trotting Triple Crown.

Implemented in 2020, the Kentucky Proud Series promotes harness racing on the Commonwealth's fair circuit. Horses must compete in 50 per cent of the seven legs to be eligible for the final.

Although every finals contest appears quite competitive with well-matched fields, several individuals stand out from the crowd.

In the 2-year-old filly trot, Giggity Goo (Marvin Luna) is 8-5 on the morning line. The daughter of Googoo Gaagaa—Devanly possesses a record of 4 3-0-0 and stands atop the points leaderboard standings for conditioner Alexandra Sarkine.

Leaving from post position 3 in the first race, Giggity Goo sports a lifetime mark of 1:58.4, which towers over her nine rivals. The filly has banked \$15,750 in her brief career and is owned by Sarah Boggs.

Cinamontoastcrunch (Kyle Wilfong) leads all 3-year-filly pacers on the circuit in the point standings. The daughter of Captain Crunch—Love At First Bite hails from the barn of Erv Miller and is 3-1 on the morning line.

The filly has yet to finish off the board with a 9 5-2-2 record and has banked \$36,010 in 2025.

Cinamontoastcrunch will leave from post position 5 and faces nine other competitors in the second race. She sports a lifetime mark of 1:53 and is owned by her trainer in conjunction with Douglas Overhiser as well as Levi Bontrager.

In the 3-year-old colt and gelding trot, Whiskey Wow (Pat Curtin) is 8-5 on the morning line but must commence his mile from the 10-hole in the third race. The son of Crazy Wow—Whimzical is the points leader in his division for trainer Burlin Bower.

Whiskey Wow has a record of 8 5-1-2 this season and amassed \$37,610. He has a lifetime mark of 1:55 and is owned by his conditioner.

Driver Andy McCarthy had a big day, winning three of the nine races for 2-year-olds including a couple for trainer Tony Alagna who had three on the day as well.

Colt trotters took to the track first and a pair of Noel Daley trainees traded blows the length of the stretch. After Captainofillusion (McCarthy) had set all the fractions, Niko Karna drew alongside with eventual winner **Yukon Deo**, edging by right at the light in 2:00.2 with a :29.3 final stanza. The Chapter Seven colt was

bred by Deo Volente, sold to Reve Amec Moi Dreamwithme, and Follow Me Stable for \$170,000 (LEX).

The potent combination of trainer Marcus Melander and driver Dexter Dunn connected with **Creator** for a 2:00 win, converting a strong stretch close for her first in three tries over Julies Trix. The Walner filly is a Diamond Creek and Order By Stable homebred, racing under an eponymous stable name.

Rani Hanover, the first foal of 2000 Hambletonian winner Ramona Hill, flashed a little of her mom's brilliance this morning when after two educational "sit and brush" trips, she was sent out to the front by Jason Bartlett and stormed home in :28.3 against the wind for a 1:56.4 win over a willing Ygritte. Ken Jacobs gave \$925,000 (LEX) to get the Walner filly from Hanover Shoe Farms and Crawford Farms Racing. Alagna, who conditioned Ramona, is training Rani Hanover for Jacobs.

Scott Zeron drove **Inexpressable** to a 1:58.3 win for Lucas Wallin in the colt's second appearance. Sitting mid-pack throughout, Zeron moved the son of Walner wide for the drive and he willingly tracked down Nicholson in the shadow of the wire. Bred by Menhammar Stud and SRF Stable, Inexpressable was a \$325,000 (LEX) purchase by the trainer with Karin Walter-Mommert and Eichstadt/Oberkramer of Germany.

When pacing fillies squared off in race 8 it was Caviart vs Caviart with **Caviart Madrid** getting the nod over a stubborn Caviart Amore Mio who had cut the mile, in 1:56. Nancy Takter trains and Yannick Gingras drove the Always B Miki filly, bred by Sergent Stable and sold to Caviart Farms for \$40,000 (LEX) last fall.

On Heir (McCarthy) set all the fractions then moved away from her competition powerfully through a :27 flat end to a 1:55.2 mile in an eye-catching romp over Car Keys. A \$170,000 (HBG) purchase by Patricia Stable, Sipple, Zelin and Gandolfo Stable, the Captaintreacherous filly was bred by Barbara Matthews and is trained in the Daley barn.

McCarthy came right back with another Captain, this time the sharp looking colt **Reckoning**, who fanned wide from third for the drive and just got up to nip Silent Investor in 1:56.4 in his first endeavor. A \$95,000 (LEX) Hanover bred, Reckoning is now owned by Rob Leblanc, Pryde Stables, Joe Sbrocco, John Fodera as JAF Racing and Steve Head. He is trained in the Alagna stable.

Continuing his run McCarthy made it a natural hat trick, scoring with the impressive Bettor's Wish colt **Watchfire** in 1:53.1 for Alagna. Sent right to the lead, Watchfire went along at an honest clip then streaked home in 27 seconds to hold stablemate Drink To That at bay. A \$67,000 (LEX) buy for Brittany Farms, Alagna and Micki Rae Stables, Watchfire is a Brittany bred.

Takter, Gingras and Caviart Farms closed out the day with their second connection, this time with **Caviart Anders**, a homebred Sweet Lou colt, who posted all the fractions and zipped home in :27.3 to hold Treacherous off in 1:53.3.

Exhilarating (\$6.80) held on gamely in 1:59.4 in another Grassroots in race 5 for co-owner/trainer/driver Darryl MacLean and co-owners Gordon MacLean and Stephen Downey, with **All Bets On Leigh** (\$14.90) pulling the mild upset in 1:59.3 with Myles Heffernan, Sr. in the bike for Karine Aucoin of Quebec from the Trevor Hicken stable in race 3, while **Blood Magic** (\$15.70) won race 10 in 2:01 for trainer/driver Mike Downey and owner Dr. Mitchell Downey of Saint John, NB.

Marc Campbell had a driving triple on the program to move into third place in the seasonal driver's standings at 20 wins, behind Corey MacPherson and David Dowling tied in first with 22 victories.
