# Intrigue abounds throughout *Hambletonian Day card*

*In addition to the 100<sup>th</sup> running of the \$1 million Hambletonian trotting classic, new and renewed rivalries take center stage throughout the 16-race card bonanza.*

## **BETWEEN THE LINES**

with **BRETT STURMAN**

Jumping right into it with the main event, which goes as race 12, nearly all the pre-race Hambletonian talk this week was which Marcus Melander-trained colt – Maryland or Super Chapter – would Dexter Dunn select to drive for Saturday's (Aug. 2) final. In a post on X Wednesday morning by Maryland co-owner Courant, it was confirmed that Dunn had made his choice to drive Maryland.

If you're looking at the decision based on each horse's record this year or any of the contender lists or rankings, then Dunn's decision may seem curious. But if you read between the lines, the signs were mostly always there that Maryland is where Dunn would have ended up.

For starters, this identical scenario played out in the Empire Breeders Classic at Vernon in mid-June. In that race where Dunn had the choice of the two, he elected for Maryland. Now granted, that race was just Maryland's first race of the year and Super Chapter's second, though at that time Maryland was entering the season of a couple shakier qualifiers and Dunn still stayed, as expected since Maryland was coming off a 2-year-old divisional-winning campaign.

The question then is, what has changed since that race that would have altered Dunn's decision to be any different this time? Yes, Super Chapter has continued to win as Maryland has continued to be second-best including that Empire Breeders Classic and in each race since, but during that time there hasn't been any single moment where you could say definitively that Super Chapter has become that much better – if better at all – than Maryland.

From a handicapping perspective, Dunn's decision doesn't really change anything. Super Chapter was installed as the 5-2 morning line favorite the day before Dunn's decision was announced, but even if the decision had been known at that time, Super Chapter would still have been made the programmed favorite – as he should be and has to be. Personally, if you liked Super Chapter before, then you should still like him now as Dunn's choice may inflate his odds ever so slightly. Similarly, if you liked Maryland, then I suppose there's some comfort in knowing that Dunn's pick validates your preference. Of course, this year's Hambletonian is far more than a two-horse race.

Last week's fastest elimination was won by Nordic Catcher S by a nose over Maryland in 1:50.3 where he had it his way unchallenged on the lead for most of the mile. The fascinating note here is that he's out of the pacing mare That Woman Hanover, by Somebeachsomewhere. That Woman Hanover was a winner of stakes in Pennsylvania at 2, tested the stakes waters at 3, and took a mark at 4 of 1:50. From four prior foals bred to pacing sires, Nordic Catcher S is the result of the first breeding to a trotter (Six Pack). That Woman Hanover was also bred the following year to Six Pack. The resulting 2-year-old, Nordic Dancer S, raced last week at The Meadowlands in an New Jersey Sires Stakes (NJSS) division, well beaten but still race-timed in 1:55.4.

In the span of one week, Go Dog Go has gone from one of the top contenders in the race to seemingly an afterthought for the final. He definitely did not have the same punch last week in his elimination while tracking the ideal cover of Maryland and now lands post 10 for the final. He'll come into the race with a morning line of 10-1 and I'd think his final odds will be well higher than that; winning doesn't seem impossible if he brings his best. Similarly, maybe because he prevailed in his elimination but just narrowly over a couple of longer chances, Emoticon Legacy looks to offer an inflated price now as well.

My pick? I feel like it's going to be a trendy one, but it'll be Maximus Mearas S. I was looking forward to his season following his try in last year's Breeders Crown when he was lunging late to the inside of Maryland. He has closed extremely well in both races this year, thus far. That one from his elimination last week was a real eye-catcher when closing in :26 to make up a ton of ground when wide and well back

and couldn't look any better heading into the final. He may need a favorable setup to help his cause but my sense is that he'll be able to win if reasonably positioned turning for home.

The \$500,000 Hambletonian Oaks looks much different than first suspected it would have looked at this time last week. Already missing top-rated filly Yo Tillie as she wasn't nominated to the race, two other high-quality fillies in What A Bid Hanover and Lady Landia failed to make the final. Last year's Goldsmith Maid champion What A Bid Hanover broke on separate occasions in her elimination, while the 2-year-old Breeders Crown winner Lady Landia wasn't raced into contention in her elimination.

As a result, favoritism in the Oaks will likely go to Miss Belmar who up until June 13, had never won a race in nine career starts. But things change fast, and she's since won three out of her next four including her elimination last week when two-moving to the lead to win by a safe enough but diminishing late margin. Starting next to Miss Belmar from post 2 will be Deja Blu who came through with a big turnaround in her elimination last week when closing in :26.1 to be making up ground fast against Miss Belmar. Deja Blu is out of Atlanta, who beat the boys on this day in the Hambletonian in 2018.

My selection in the race will be with Delaney Hanover. I felt last year she flashed potential as a 2-year-old and went overlooked in her elimination following a difficult trip second out this year in the Del Miller. Tracking down Champagne Problems last week, who lands post 9 for this race, Delaney Hanover came off cover from at least a few lengths down to erase the separation and to win going away nicely. Similar to the Hambletonian pick, it's going to be Scott Zeron from post 5, hoping for a little bit of luck with the pace scenarios.

Some other thoughts going down the rest of the card in race order starting with race 5. Following the trend of stakes not being what they once were, this year's Cane Pace drew only a field of six. Will The Meadowlands faithful give Madden Oaks more respect this time around after he was let go at almost 7-1 in the Pace? The recent Tioga race where he prevailed narrowly in only a time of 1:52 doesn't seem exciting to get behind off that, but how much stock is that one race worth when we've all seen what he's done at Woodbine Mohawk Park and The Meadowlands since June. Captain Optimistic who bypassed the Adios following the Meadowlands Pace, returned to winning ways last week in a race where it would have been more shocking if he did not win; gets a third crack now at Madden Oaks. Papis Pistol was well supported in the Pace and then didn't seem at his best when being swarmed late in his Adios elimination.

Manolete looked like a sure-fire winner mid-stretch last week when engaging the nine-for-nine in 2025 Smooth Dream, but was somehow repelled and came up a nose short.

In the John Steele Memorial (race 6), the sharpest horse at the track right now, Elista Hanover, moves on from the Graduate and Hambletonian Maturity and gets a shot at the very best older trotting mares including Call Me Goo. Fellow rival and 4-year-old to Elista Hanover, Warrawee Michelle has been trading punches with that rival over the last few and she isn't without a chance either and starts from the second tier. Another one to note is Bravo Angel S who followed up that unbelievable close two back with another super rally from nowhere last week; we'll see if she can carry those late theatrics from the Miss Versatility races into this one.

In the 2-year-old trotting New Jersey Sire Stakes finals, Southwind Chaska is an easy one to root for in the \$225,000 fillies' event (race 7). Overachieving as just a \$15,000 yearling with a relatively non-descript pedigree, she's started her career off two-for-two against far pricier ones and has been convincing late in both of those wins. The 2-year-old colts go later in the card as race 13 and all eyes there will be on potential star in the making Diabolic Hill. Unbeaten, he looked in a world of his own when winning last week and now moves from post 10 all the way down to the rail. Among those trying to spring the upset will be Apex, a \$525,000 yearling out of Mission Brief, who was second against the colts in the 2015 Hambletonian.

The \$300,000 John Cashman Memorial (race 11) pits divisional leader Periculum against many of the familiar free-for-all trotting names including Hillexotic. Hillexotic was regarded as a longshot when these two raced in the Crawford at the end of June, but those two races from The Meadows look awfully good. That most recent one in 1:50.3 set an all-age track record and was just a tick off the fastest mile ever trotted anywhere on a five-eighths mile track.

It's not particularly a great wagering price, but it's nice to see the renewed rivalry between Sylvia Hanover and Twin B Joe Fresh. When finishing third last out at Plainridge following the unsustainable pace, it was the first time in over two years that Twin B Joe Fresh finished worse than second. Catching the eye somewhat is Kobe's Gigi while making her second start now for Burke; she was closing well last out following speed and a troubled trip in the Dorothy Haughton.

## Hambletonian 100 numbers

With the number 100 clearly in everyone's minds this weekend, here are some others numbers to think about from Hambletonian Days in the past:

1. Chapter Seven was 2 1-1-0, \$100,000 entering the 2011 Hambletonian for Linda Toscano. He finished a non-threatening fourth. As a stallion, he's a two-time winner he already has gone 1-2 in a Hambletonian final (2022) and recently had all five starters in the Yonkers Trot. He is also trying to do what no other HOY has done on the trotting side, sire a HOY! Super Chapter is off to a good start there.
2. Brian Sears holds the Meadowlands and single day earnings record of \$1,555,674 set in 2009, on Muscle Hill's Hambletonian Day.
3. Eternal Camnation holds the record at \$3,617,458 for the highest ever female pacing bankroll entering a race on Hambletonian Day, the 2004 Golden Girls.
4. The Meadowlands largest ever win price of \$367.20 (6/15/84) cane from a horse who later won a Hambletonian elim, Delvin G Hanover.
5. Ake Svanstedt got the ball rolling on his first ever Hambo Day in 2014 winning the Peter Haughton with Centurion ATM.
6. Dexter Dunn has won both Triple Crowns this year with the Yonkers Trot Super Chapter and the Cane Pace with Twisted Destiny. The latter ineligible for the Cane.
7. The three fastest ever Hambletonian/or Oaks performers ever are one father and his two daughters: Muscle Hill 1:50.1 (2009), Manhego 1:50 (2018) and Ramona Hill 1:50.1 (2021).
8. Marcus Melander was 9 years old attending his first Hambletonian in 2001 when his uncle Stefan Melander won it with Scarlet Knight.
9. Elista Hanover is the best chestnut around. In the 120 checks distributed in the Hambletonian since 2000, zero

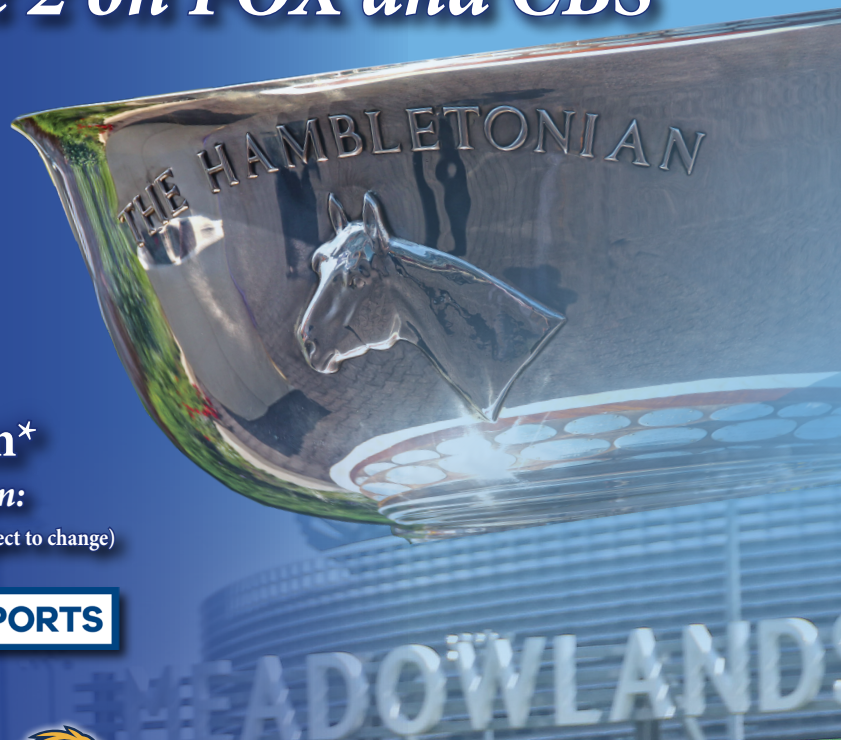

10. Atlanta, Kalamazoo, and Syracuse were the three who bid on the first Hambletonian.

11. 626 were nominated to the initial 1926 Hambletonian.

12. 26 drivers and 25 trainers are still with us who've captured the Hambletonian. Some had doubles.

13. 291 days after the launching of the 1926 Hambletonian, Charles Lindberg took off too.

14. Trond Smedhammer (2004 Windsong's Legacy) is the sports only trainer/driver in the last 45 years to win a Triple Crown. Clint Galbraith won it in 1980 with Niatross.

15. With Nancy Takter not in the Hambletonian, her streak at two-straight Hambletonians ends, and matches her dad's from 2014-2015 (Trixtion and Pinkman).

16. Lucas Wallin had the 2022 Hambletonian fave Rebuff. Marcus Melander had the three favorites in 2019 with Greenshoe, Gimpanzee, and Green Manalishi S.

17. Dave Miller is now within \$5 million of John Campbell. It's \$295 million for "the Buckeye" and \$299.8 for "JC." It's been 37 years since anyone (Herve Filion) was within \$5 million of Campbell in the summer of 1988.

18. Can Yannick Gingras go back-to-back in the Hambletonian? It's not done in 37 years (1987-88), John Campbell, Mack Lobell, and Armbrø Goal.

19. Was Greyhound's sire really a chestnut? Yes, Guy Abbe, himself a Hambo runner-up.

20. Hambletonian Day (2004) was the lone loss of 2004 for HOY Rainbow Blue who went 20-for-21.

# MANE ATTRACTION

## A look at this 100th Hambletonian — but first...

This Mane Attraction will take a close-up look at harness racing's greatest single event – the Hambletonian.

But, first, a tribute.

While the Hambletonian celebrates its historic 100th anniversary, the idea for this – the grandest-of-all events for our sport – took place 103 years ago and Goshen, NY seems to get the credit for being the “cradle” for the idea of the event.

Actually, the Hambletonian was patterned after a very popular sweepstakes event that took place over the old Belmont Driving Club one mile oval, located in Narberth, PA., a suburb of Philadelphia, about 8½ miles north and west of Philly.

A live-wire salesman from Chicago, Harry O. Reno, and his relative, William M. Wright, then owner of Calumet Farm, a leading breeder of standardbreds, met up in Philadelphia as Reno wanted to buy a mare to race in his part of the land – the Midwest.

Reno also wanted to search for the best way to create an event on par with that Belmont Sweepstakes and the result was the “foaling” of the H. O. Reno Pacing Derby, which proved so successful that maybe, just maybe, something could become a possibility for 3-year-old trotters.

Reno's idea was passed along to one of harness racing's most iconic journalists, Joseph Markey, well known for his contributions to the *Horse Review*.

Other prominent breeders hopped on the band-wagon – make that sulky – and, after settling many arguments in naming this event, the name “Hambletonian” was chosen as the most appropriate.

The first Hambletonian was held in Syracuse, NY at the New York State Fair, but only after the original winning bidder – the Sesqui Centennial in Philadelphia – was forced to withdraw due to what was described as financial collapse.

The first Hambletonian featured a purse of \$73,451,32; the highest until 1950!

Guy McKinney, a son of Guy Axworthy, won that event for driver/trainer Nat Ray – the first stride of 100 – and here we are.

The Hambletonian is now an iconic part of our sport's grand history, but, personally, I am saddened that, along the way, we have destroyed some of that history, instead of continually building on it.

Harry Reno and the H. O. Reno Pacing Derby are completely erased from history, and, the Nat Ray free-for-all trot, honoring that winning driver of the very first Hambletonian, has also been, sadly, erased from history, as well, as his event was renamed some years ago.

In these eyes, this was a gross injustice to Nat Ray and our history, especially in light of the fact that Nat Ray was inducted into our sport's Hall of Fame as an immortal in 1978.

Can we NOT continue to destroy our grand history from 1788 when Messenger came across the Atlantic, or even further back than that with the Narragansett Pacers a century-and-a-half earlier?

To protect our future, we must care enough to protect our grand history, instead of destroying it.

Now, on to this year's Hambletonian with some observations of the eliminations and my HRU morning line.

Having written quite extensively about the proper way to build a morning line, I take pride in doing an accurate one, not so much in pinpointing what the exact final odds will be, as that is nearly impossible, but, rather, making sure that the odds do not reflect probable payoffs that exceed 100 per cent of the net pari-mutuel pool.

In this case, since the takeout in the win pool is 17 per cent in New Jersey (it can be different in every jurisdiction) the "magic number" in making a correct morning line starts at 120.

When odds are calculated with that number ( $120 \times 0.17$ ), the final number is 99.6, a bit lower than the winner's receiving the entire net pool of 100 per cent; the leftover known as breakage.

My morning line, quite simply, is where I think the BDHC (Broken Down Horseplayer's Club) money will be distributed, not necessarily my belief in what horse will win.

**Note:** Odds make no difference to this handicapper and, remember: Hardly a man is now alive, that paid his mortgage at 3-5!

Here we go!

1. 15-1 – Meshuggah (Bjorn Goop/Marcus Melander) Very lucky to have drawn the rail! Left well off the wings, elected to stay put on the backside, got shuffled to the back of the pack and closed fastest of all as the field fanned out. In his homeland, Sweden, Goop has one of the most successful stables and has competed with much success in France, Spain and Norway, among other countries, as well. Meshuggah has gait speed and will be forwardly placed – maybe even a quarter move – and was used only the last three-sixteenths in his elimination.

2. 4-1 – Super Chapter (Yannick Gingras/Marcus Melander) Overwhelming 1-20 favorite in his elimination and took charge handily seven-sixteenths in and picked up the pace thereafter and used impressive :26.2 finale for handy score. Owns second

fastest winning mark of these at 1:50.3 (Emoticon Legacy went 1:50.2 at Woodbine Mohawk Park).

3. 6-1 – Emoticon Legacy (Louis-Philippe Roy/Luc Blais) Made confident quarter move to the top, cleared a stride or two before the half, was able get a soft breather third panel and was untouched whip-wise at the end to hold off four of his rivals closing in.

4. 7-2 – Maryland (Dexter Dunn/Marcus Melander) Been a bridesmaid in four starts this season but has seemingly improved every start. In his elimination, left alertly but way, way wide around opening turn, smartly found nice spot in fourth, out again halfway through, reached second turning for home and was one stride late at the wire with an impressive :26 finale.

5. 15-1 – Maximus Mearas S (Scott Zeron/Lucas Wallin) Improved a spot early with inside breaker but really lollygagged early on and gapped badly. Followed some live cover-flow when it developed on backside but still gapped final bend. But, once straightened away, showed explosive trot.

6. 12-1 – Nordic Catcher S (Ake Svanstedt/Svanstedt) Been reputable in all starts this season and used post 1 to perfection to out-sprint rivals to opener and opened even more daylight three-eighths in. Looked comfortable turning for home and trotted final panel in :26.2 to hold off Maryland by a nostril. A bit more work here.

7. 30-1 – Gap Kronos S (Tim Tetrick/Ake Svanstedt) Uneventful journey from post 3, made mild bid – very mild – but never threatened winner and out-trotted by Maximus late.

8. 12-1 – Blank (Andrew McCarthy/Marcus Melander) As usual, lollygagged off the wings again from outside post, could still see 'em all turning for home and trotted second fastest final panel in explosive effort late.

9. 12-1 – Greenma (Trond Smedshammer/Smedshammer) Relaxed early on – just like previous three – picked up live cover-flow second over turning for home and needed one more long stride for the tie or the win. That one stride may have cost him several lengths and better post.

10. 10-1 – Go Dog Go (Todd McCarthy/Carter Pinske) Favorite going in last week with unblemished record and off huge lifetime best mile. Again, unhurried early and went into the outer flow three-eighths in to begin churning away, but tough to gain on :26 and change final panel.

# Smedshammer duo set for Hambletonian, Oaks challenges

Trond Smedshammer has won both the Hambletonian and Hambletonian Oaks during his career — one of 12 trainers to accomplish that feat — and he will have the opportunity to add to his trophy collection Saturday (Aug. 2) when he sends out a horse in each of those trotting classics for 3-year-olds at The Meadowlands.

Smedshammer captured the 2004 Hambletonian with Windsong's Legacy, who went on to complete the Trotting Triple Crown by adding the Yonkers Trot and Kentucky Futurity. The colt, who was driven by Smedshammer, was the first horse to collect all three jewels since Super Bowl in 1972 and the seventh trotter overall to accomplish the feat. Glidemaster and Marion Marauder later added their names to the list.

On Saturday, Smedshammer will drive Greenma in the 100th edition of the Hambletonian Stakes at The Big M. The gelding finished second in his Hambletonian elimination last week, missing by a nose against

Emoticon Legacy in 1:51.4. He **drew post 9** for the \$1 million Grade 1 final and was made 25-1 on the morning line.

Smedshammer also will drive Walspea in the \$500,000 Grade 1 final of the Hambletonian Oaks for sophomore female trotters. She finished third in her Oaks elim, one length behind 1:52.3 winner Miss Belmar. Walspea **drew post 8** for the final and was made 12-1 on the morning line. Smedshammer's Oaks triumph came in 2008 with Creamy Mimi, who was driven by Andy Miller, and triumphed at odds of 12-1.

Greenma heads to the Hambletonian final having hit the board in all nine of his races this season, including four wins and four second-place finishes. It was after a second-place effort behind Meshuggah, another Hambletonian finalist, in a June 8 division of the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes Mohegan Pennsylvania's Pocono Downs, that Smedshammer told owner Wanda Polisseni of Purple Haze Stables the son of Greenshoe—Ma Was Right was a Hambletonian prospect.

"He was able to close when he shouldn't have been able to up there, three-wide in :26.4," Smedshammer said. "That's just real difficult. I told Wanda after that start that I think we've got a Hambo horse if he continues to race like he did that day.

"He's still very green. He got real excited up there Saturday night [for the Hambletonian eliminations], he was a real handful, but he almost pulled it off. But we've got an uphill battle this Saturday."

Smedshammer, of course, looks back fondly at his time with Windsong's Legacy in 2004.

"That was something else," Smedshammer said. "I can't believe it was 21 years ago already. He was a cool horse, no doubt.

"He usually got beat in the eliminations, but in the finals, he showed up."

Walspea, whose family includes 1995 Hambletonian Oaks winner Lookout Victory, has won three of seven races this year and added a second and two thirds. In her start prior to the Oaks elim, she finished third behind Yo Tillie and Lady Landia in a division of the Del Miller Memorial at The Meadowlands. The daughter of Walner—Speak To Me is owned by Purple Haze Stables and M3 Racing Stable.

"She's real handy, so quick and so good gaited," Smedshammer said. "It's just a shame that she doesn't try a little bit harder. But she raced good [in the elimination]. We came the last quarter :27 flat, and most of these trotters can't go too much more than that."

Two of the Oaks eliminations were won in 1:52.3 and the other was won in 1:52.4.

"[Walspea] can do that," Smedshammer said.

Racing begins at noon (EDT) on Saturday at The Meadowlands. The Hambletonian Oaks is race 10, with a post time of 3:37 p.m.; the Hambletonian is race 12, with a post time of 4:47 p.m. Coverage of Hambletonian Day will air on FOX Sports from 3-6 p.m.

# How quitting over the Hambletonian led Trevor Ritchie to glory with the race's first Ontario-sired winner

The road to the Hambletonian sometimes requires a crazy route. But it's a safe bet Hall of Fame driver Trevor Ritchie is the only person that got there after quitting over the very same race – dispelling the old adage that quitters never prosper.

Tuesday (Aug. 5) will mark exactly 25 years since Ritchie drove Yankee Paco to victory in the 2000 Hambletonian at The Meadowlands and provided a landmark victory for the Ontario horse racing industry.

Yankee Paco, trained by Doug McIntosh and owned by Americans Harry Ivey and his son, Dr. Tom Ivey, was the first Ontario-sired winner of the Hambletonian, trotting's equivalent of the Kentucky Derby.

But Ritchie's journey to Hambletonian immortality actually began 26 years earlier when Hall of Fame trainer, owner and breeder Bill Herbert sent homebred filly Sing Away Herbert some 1,200 kilometers from Greenwood Raceway in Toronto to Du Quoin, IL to contest the 1974 Hambletonian won by Christopher T.

Ritchie was Sing Away Herbert's caretaker.

"I was never so heartbroken in my life when I loaded her on the trailer at Greenwood Raceway to head to the Hambletonian and I didn't get to go with her," Ritchie said. "It was just devastating to me.

"I actually made a pact with myself that day. Bill Herbert named a horse after me, Trevor Herbert, and he was a 3-year-trotting colt. He was okay, but he wasn't great. And I said to myself, 'As soon as he wins a race, I want to get my picture taken with him and I'm going to quit right after that.' And I did. He finally won

a race at Flamboro... and I gave Bill my notice that night that I was all done. So, I stuck to my word."

More than 50 years later, Ritchie said not getting to go to the Hambletonian with Sing Away Herbert wasn't just one reason he quit, "it was the only reason," he said.

He still has the photo of himself with Trevor Herbert in the winner's circle.

"Looking back on it, Jack Herbert went [to the Hambletonian with Sing Away Herbert] and if they had sent me, they were going to be really short of help [at Greenwood]," Ritchie said. "So, I understand that part of it, but still, at the time, I was just devastated. I made a pact with myself that day when I was

loading her and realized that I wasn't going. I said, 'As soon as Trevor Herbert wins a race, I'm out of here.'

Three years after quitting, Ritchie began a stellar driving career that saw him win most of the sport's biggest races, collect purse earnings exceeding \$70 million and land a berth in the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame.

But winning the Hambletonian with Yankee Paco remains a career highlight.

"It was a dream that you dream about when you're a kid, but you know that it's never going to happen," Ritchie said. "And then when it does happen... I'm not a crier in the first place over almost anything, and I had a tear in my eye when I was pulling that horse up. Now, that tear was long gone by the time I got back to the winner's circle. But when I was pulling up, I literally had a tear in my eye. And I said, 'Man, oh, man. I just won the Hambletonian.'"

But even the route to the winner's circle was anything but ordinary. Ritchie said Yankee Paco was terrible in his elimination the week before, despite winning it.

"If it had not been a Hambletonian elim, I would have said to Doug, 'You've got to scratch this horse,'" Ritchie said. "He's no good. I couldn't hardly get him to trot... I don't know if he trotted for an eighth of a mile in the post parade.

"I don't know what Doug did [between the elim and the final] but he really performed a miracle. The next week [Yankee Paco] was much better."

Still, the winning trip on that hot New Jersey August day was anything but easy. Yankee Paco was parked every step of the way.

"I don't want to pat myself on the back, but I'm going to," Ritchie said. "I think I drove the way I had to drive that horse to win that race that day.

"Going around the first turn, I was just starting to tuck into the hole, and there were about four horses that still hadn't cleared or found a spot... At The Meadowlands, when you get down the backstretch, everybody is protecting their position. They're all half in, half out, and you're not going anywhere. Paco wasn't a real sprinter, so I said, 'If that happens like I think, my chances are not very good. The hell with it, I'm going to move back out. I'm going to get into the flow before we get off the turn. Somebody's going to get parked other than me, and even though I'm going to be two wide, I'm going to have their cover.'

"So that was what went through my mind when I moved... back out around the first turn. As it turns out, Plan A didn't work because the last horse to clear was my cover... I thought, 'Holy s---. There goes my great idea.' But I thought, 'I'm just going to take a nice hold of Paco and just ride it out here and wait until I'm forced to press' and that's what I did. And when somebody tipped off my back fanning off the turn, I said, 'Okay, let's go.' And away we went. And what it ended up being was something else."

But Ritchie dispels the oft-repeated suggestion that he drove that day as if he had ice in his veins.

"I'm not going to pretend I was this cool, calm guy going through the lane, because I wasn't," he said. "I was thinking, 'Please, please come to the wire really quickly,' and 'I can't believe that nobody's going by me' and all these thoughts. I was just holding my breath. The nerves were there."

Yankee Paco, a son of Balanced Image out of Yankee Playgirl, defeated Credit Winner by three-quarters-of-a-length in a season's best 1:53.2.

Ritchie had won America's biggest trotting race in his very first attempt.

"If you look back at my record, I was really good at first times and not as good the second time," Ritchie said. "The first time I was in the Meadowlands Pace, I won it with Frugal Gourmet. The first time I was in the World Trotting Derby, I won it with Andover Hall. I think the first time I was in the North America Cup I won it with Quite A Sensation."

But winning the Hambletonian put him on another level.

"I think [winning the Hambletonian] boosted my career considerably," Ritchie said. "I think people say, 'If somebody can handle the pressure of the Hambletonian and win it, I'm game enough to put them down on other horses.'"

As for Yankee Paco, on Aug. 6 – one day after the 25th anniversary of his greatest, but far from only great triumph – he will officially be inducted into the Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame.

"I was tickled," Ritchie said of hearing the news that Yankee Paco was going to the Hall of Fame. "I've been trying for a few years. I've been nominating him and writing letters... He was the first Canadian-sired horse ever to win the Hambletonian. He was on the front page of The Toronto Star. That tells you something. And it wasn't just the Hambo. He won other stakes races, including the Canadian Trotting Classic and the American-National in Chicago. I thought he was deserving on more than just one race, but, obviously, I am tickled he is going to be inducted."

This Saturday (Aug. 2), the Hambletonian will celebrate its 100th edition a quarter century after Yankee Paco put the Ontario harness racing industry on the sport's equivalent of the moon.

Twenty-five years on, the moment isn't lost on Ritchie.

"I dreamt about just being in [the Hambletonian] as a groom," he said. "That was going to be the pinnacle. Then I ended up getting to drive a horse that won the race."

As he turned Yankee Paco toward the winner's circle, Trevor Ritchie remembers one overriding thought: "Holy Jesus, I just won the Hambletonian."

## Fabulous freshman on display on Grand River's flagship day

After celebrating the first Industry Day on its new five-eighths-mile track last August, Grand River Raceway is teeming with anticipation ahead of round 2.

"We're getting very excited," said Jenna MacDonell before her second Industry Day as raceway manager. "Industry Day is always a favorite around here, and for the horse racing community, especially. We have excellent races lined up and ready to rock and we're looking forward to bringing everybody together."

Set for its usual first Monday in August slot (Aug. 4), the 36th renewal of the Elora, ON oval's signature race date will be headlined by its marquee contest – the Battle of Waterloo presented by Winbak Farm.

"With a 2-year-old race like that, you never really know what you're going to get," said MacDonell. "Everybody's very excited because it's just the beginning of these horses' careers and they can peak at funny times, especially when they're young."

The Battle of Waterloo routinely stirs fond memories for MacDonell, who remembers a neophyte Somebeachsomewhere using the race as a springboard for a Hall of Fame career.

"He had his first start here at Grand River in the eliminations," she said. "It was the very first time that we saw his flash of, 'Oh, wow, there is really something here.'"

"They knew he was a nice horse, but you're not certain until you put them under pressure, and they have to perform."

And that he did.

The famed pacer went on to win the 2007 Battle of Waterloo by 2¼-lengths with Jenna's father – Hall of Fame reinsman Paul MacDonell – at the helm.

"Nothing can beat that year he won the Battle [of Waterloo]," she said. "It was epic. It was the start of a really fun ride for my family, and it all started at Grand River."

"We have a big mural of Somebeachsomewhere here. I get to walk by him every day and remember those fun times."

Come Monday, Jenna and the Grand River faithful will have their eyes on the next crop of youngsters hoping to follow in Somebeachsomewhere's tide-turning footsteps.

With no eliminations this year, the field of Ontario-sired 2-year-old pacers is already set for the \$227,100 Battle of Waterloo.

The cast of eight rookies includes Beau Jangles, Borderline Mobby, D A Lets Dance, Dax Seelster, No Waitlist, Ryder Ross, Speaksoftytome, and Tilthecowscomehome.

Beau Jangles, the Battle of Waterloo’s likely morning-line favorite, has already shown flashes of his immense potential.

Trained by 2024 Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame inductee Dr. Ian Moore, the bay son of Cattlewash—Mrs Major Hill is a perfect two-for-two to begin his career with a pair of impressive Ontario Sires Stakes Gold victories on July 5 and 19 at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

The co-feature on Grand River’s riveting Industry Day card is the Battle of the Belles for Ontario sired 2-year-old pacing fillies.

Eliminations for the pulse-pounding companion race concluded on Monday (July 28), with nine freshman fillies advancing to next week’s \$153,000 final: TH Check Me Out, Malicia Speed, Romantic Beauty, Lavender Seelster, Daya, Talbot Kristen, Horse With A Plan, Jen Tilly, and P N G Shadow.

Daya and Romantic Beauty emerged from their individual eliminations victorious.

The former — a homebred Bulldog Hanover—Beach Of A Time daughter owned and trained by Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Famer Jack Darling — made good on her 4-5 favorite status by a neck over TH Check Me Out.

The latter’s eliminations effort was especially notable, as the Bettors Delight filly crossed the wire in a track record 1:52.2.

Romantic Beauty’s stellar showing also stands as the fastest mile by any freshman pacer over a Canadian five-eighths mile track this year.

“We’ve got some nice horses lining up behind the gate for both races this year,” said Jenna. “We can’t wait to watch them compete.”

Last year’s Battle of the Belles saw a shuffle atop the podium after inquiries involving winner Wicked N Single and second-place finisher Manhattan Mayhem.

The former survived her review while the latter was relegated to third after being ruled to have interfered with third-place finisher Wickedpace, who was elevated to second.

While avoiding another “interesting situation” is part of the goal for this year’s iteration, the true focus lies with what Industry Day means for harness racing in Ontario.

“That’s the exciting thing about it – having a great Ontario-sired product is incredibly important for the industry as a whole,” said Jenna.

As the on-track festivities are doing their part to help grow the game, the off-track buzz won’t be far behind.

Whether it be the NEIGHbourhood kids area equipped with face painting, glitter tattoos, inflatable axe throwing, and patio games or live music and food trucks on-site, there is something for everyone on Industry Day.

“The goal always is to bring in new people and find different ways that are going to attract but also to retain the people who we have brought in over the last couple of years,” said Jenna. “It’s about changing things up a little bit so that it’s fresh but not changing it too much so that the things that keep people coming back are still all there.”

Also on tap is a visit from Equine Guelph, who will be operating their interactive educational booth to teach guests about equine health, safety, and welfare.

In addition to Equine Guelph, Grand River will have its own NEIGHbourhood booth, as well as a virtual reality race bike experience courtesy of the Bill Galvin Racing Alliance.

“Encouraging people who are new to racing to come to the racetrack is something we emphasize and having something for the kids to do is an important part of that,” said Jenna.

Through its diverse offerings within and outside the rails, Grand River is gaining momentum heading into its flagship day.

“Tickets are still available on our website, but they are starting to sell out fast, which is exciting,” Jenna said. “Whoever is interested in coming to Industry Day is more than welcome to book their tickets.”

First race post for Industry Day at Grand River is 12:30 p.m. ET.

### Don Fanucci Zet outstanding at Jägersro

Tuesday (July 29) night's \$320,000 Hugo Åbergs Memorial over 1,609 meters became a one-horse show when Daniel Redén's **Don Fanucci Zet** (Hard Livin) defied a bad post (7) and more or less played with his opponents after a pretty tough trip.

According to plan, trotter Mellby Jinx (post 1) kept the lead for Daniel Wäjersten and the really hard opening failed to appear as Decision Maker made an early break and Dancer Brodde's driver Johan Untersteiner never got into the fight for the front position.

A Fair Day and Don Fanucci Zet both got their marching orders from start and when the former landed outside of the leader, Örjan Kihlström could rest Don Fanucci Zet in third over, just for a short while.

With a lap (one kilometer) to go, Don Fanucci Zet had to move three wide, since Staro Mack Crowe attacked from his fourth over-spot, meaning that 9-year-old Don Fanucci Zet had to take another turn three wide, before he landed outside of Mellby Jinx just before the last turn.

By then, Don Fanucci Zet already had the advantage in the race and Kihlström noticed that none of the followers could keep up the same pace as Redén's horse. So, Don Fanucci Zet left the rest of the field and cruised to an outstanding win in 1:51.4.

This was Don Fanucci Zet's second victory in Malmö's big mile race for the older elite, the first was claimed in 2022 and the Hard Livin son has never been in better shape than during this season. After the winter meeting in Paris, where he participated in the Prix d'Amérique and the Prix de France, trainer Redén discovered that Don Fanucci Zet had problems with his throat and an operation was necessary. Since then, the horse has finished second in Elitloppet, second in the Norrbottens Stora Pris, and a second in the Årjängs Stora Sprinterlopp before he claimed the prestigious race at Jägersro on Tuesday night.

His 63 lifetime starts have ended with 31 wins, \$2.2 million in earnings and a mile record of 1:50.2. Don Fanucci Zet must be considered as one of the best Swedish-bred horses ever and even though he's 9 years old, the saga about the pace-bred trotter seems to continue.

Mellby Jinx held strongly as the runner-up ahead of Daim Brodda.

### HAGOORT AND GOCCIADORO IN BREEDERS COURSE

Two final divisions of the \$100,000 Breeders Course for 3-year-olds were held at Jägersro Tuesday night (July 29) and in the colts and geldings event, German-bred **Fragolino Rosso** (Booster Winner) played a big role in the hands of Robin Bakker. The team of Paul Hagoort and Bakker usually shows up when big money is at stake in races across Europe, and behind first choice Fragolino Rosso, Bakker made no mistakes. Fragolino Rosso had to race outside of leader Gaudio, but was still strongest in the stretch. Bakker seemed to have more to use in his reins as Fragolino Rosso hit the wire in a track record of 1:53.2.

Hagoort and Bakker almost got the job done in the fillies' division as well. Their weapon, first over trotter Greta Jet fought bravely from her position and Bakker looked to have succeeded with his tactics as he made sure that Magnus A. Djuse wouldn't get racing room too early behind **Glamour Queen** (Face Time Bourbon). Djuse opted to trust his cover in Greta Jet when horses attacked three wide before the last turn, a situation that Bakker very well noticed, so the latter tried to keep Glamour Queen locked in between horses as long as he could.

But Alessandro Gocciadoro's Glamour Queen found racing room on the inside and Djuse succeeded with his choice of staying on Greta Jet's back as long as he did.

Italian-bred Glamour Queen sprinted to a safe win in 1:54.2.

## ANOTHER BIG WIN FOR GOCCIADORO

Alessandro Gocciadoro sat behind his **Always Ek** (Filipp Roc) when the \$130,000 Gran Premio Due Mari was scheduled in Taranto, Italy on Sunday (July 27) night.

Always Ek hit the lead after 500 meters as he took over from stablemate Dany Capar and thereafter, the race was pretty much over.

Always Ek danced away to a safe win in a track record 1:53 and claimed his second victory in a row in the Gran Premio Due Mari. Dany Capar was second, and Usain Töll third.

## JORMA KONTIO HITS 12,000 WINS

His first win came 59 years ago, when Kontio was 13 years old and his track record includes victories in most of the biggest races there are in the world.

He has driven and won with Varenne, Readly Express, Calgary Games to name a few on the list of well-known trotters he has won with, which would be very, very long.

# Setyoursightshigh, Rani Hanover sizzle at The Red Mile

On yet another evening with extreme temperatures, **Setyoursightshigh** and **Rani Hanover** brought plenty of heat of their own to The Red Mile's 15-race card on Wednesday (July 30). The evening's events focused on freshman filly trotters and they did not disappoint in one \$80,000 first round leg of the Kentucky Championship Series, four \$30,000 first legs of the Kentucky Commonwealth Series, and four \$15,000 first legs of the Kentucky Golden Rod Series.

## SETYOURSIGHTSHIGH SOARS IN CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES

In the 11th race, Setyoursightshigh (Jason Bartlett) bested 11 rivals to improve her record to 4 3-1-0 and lowered her mark to 1:53.1 to serve notice she is a force to be reckoned with for trainer Marcus Melander.

The daughter of In Range—Special Interest was saddled with post position 9 after Country Glide (post position 1) was scratched sick. Setyoursightshigh was in eighth as Ygritte (Mattias Melander) set the first split of :28. The filly advanced to sixth as Jailbird Jog (Tim Tetrick) wrested control to the half in :56.1. By the three-quarter pole Avenzee (Todd McCarthy) decided it was her time to go to the front and trotted the third fraction in 1:25.4 with Setyoursightshigh moving into third.

As the fillies made their final drive to the finish line, favored Madam Cheval (Yannick Gingras) took her turn on the lead but Setyoursightshigh would not be denied. As Madam Cheval retreated, Carve (Andrew McCarthy) came on for second with Victorianas Secret (Scott Zeron) closing from last in the early stages to be third.

Bred by Kentuckiana Farms, Setyoursightshigh is a half sibling to Saywhatimthinkin (Swan For All, \$243,442) and was a \$50,000 2004 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale purchase for Heights Stable, Mantorp LLC, AMG Stable Inc., and K Kjellgren Livs AB Inc. The filly paid \$9.68 to win and boosted her bankroll to \$175,000.

## RANI HANOVER STRUTS HER STUFF IN THE COMMONWEALTH SERIES

Bartlett and trainer Tony Alagna teamed up to win the third division of this series with heavy favorite Rani Hanover. The daughter of Walner—Ramona Hill collected her first victory in her debut. Creator (Dexter Dunn) was a neck behind her in second with Numanthia (Nicholas Roussel) in third.

Leaving from post position 3 in the field of nine, Rani Hanover and her pilot were positioned in third as Giggity Goo (David Miller) set the tone with a :29.3 first split. Giggity Goo enjoyed her position on top as she continued to lead the field with fractions of :59 and 1:27.4.

As Creator advanced from fifth entering the lane, Rani Hanover was briefly in fourth, but snatched the lead from the tiring pacesetter to launch her own assault to the finish line.

Bred by Hanover Shoe Farms and Crawford Farms Racing, Rani Hanover is owned by Kenneth Jacobs. The first foal out of 2020 Hambletonian victress Ramona Hill, the filly was a record-setting \$925,000 at the 2025 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale. She is the third highest priced yearling ever sold at that venue.

Breaking her maiden in her debut, Rani Hanover paid \$3.24 to those who supported her.

**Lainey W** (Zeron) won the first division of the Commonwealth Series in 1:54.3 for trainer Melander. The daughter of Bar Hopping—The Black Beauty went wire-to-wire over the field of eight with splits of :29.4, :58.4 and 1:27.3. Zaheera (Andrew McCarthy) was second and Degas (Anthony MacDonald) was third.

The filly broke her maiden in her third attempt and is now 3 1-1-0 with \$22,500 in the bank.

Lainey W was bred by Kentuckiana Farms and Perry Soderberg. She was purchased for \$125,000 at last year's Lexington Selected Yearling Sale by Brittany Farms in conjunction with Marvin and Lynn Katz.

The filly is the first foal out of her dam. Her third dam is Canland Hall (Garland Lobell, \$339,143) who was responsible for Hall of Famer Cantab Hall (Self Possessed, \$1.44 million).

Lainey W paid \$7.02 to win.

**Heart For Two** (Todd McCarthy) dispensed of seven rivals to take the second Commonwealth division in 1:55.1 for trainer Andrew Harris. Isotta Bi (Dunn) was the runner-up with The Ice Princess (Tetrick) completing the trifecta.

Bred by Louis Baudron, Heart For Two is a daughter of Gimpanzee—House Music Fr. The filly broke her maiden in her second trip to the gate.

Heart For Two is owned by William Pollock, Bruce Areman and her trainer.

The filly is a half-sister to House Of Love (Trixtion, \$111,325) and is the second foal out of her unraced dam. She was purchased for \$180,000 at last year's Lexington Selected Yearling Sale.

Heart For Two paid \$14.34 to win at odds of 6-1.

**All Fancy Like** (Dunn) wired the field of 10 in the fourth and final division of the Kentucky Golden Series for trainer Chris Ryder in 1:55.1 and odds of 12-1.

Bred by Buckstone Land Livestock, the daughter of Tactical Landing—M And Mms is owned by Country Club Acres, Joe Sbrocco, Hutchison Harness LLC and In The Gym Partners.

All Fancy Like paid \$26.38 to win.

**Meme Queen** (David Miller) led a trio of favorites in the first division of this series for trainer Carter Pinsky. The daughter of Propulsion—S M S Princess tripped the timer in 1:57.1.

The filly was bred by Windsong Stable and is owned by N Fellows, Blair Corbeil and Windermere Stable LLC.

Meme Queen paid \$5.38 to win.

**Kerstin** (Gingras) took the second division in 1:55.3 for trainer Per Engblom. The daughter of Gimpanzee—Exploding Alice Fi was bred by Order By Stable Ab.

The filly paid \$3.88 to win and is owned by her conditioner's stable, R A W Equine Inc., Daniel Sarafian and Evans Nation.

Those that supported her were rewarded with a \$133.88 payout.

## **NEED YOU NOW REMAINS UNDEFEATED, TOPVILLE LUCKY SPRINGS THE UPSET IN COMMONWEALTH SERIES**

The daughter of Sweet Lou—Warrawee Winx commenced her journey from post position 7 in the field of eight as Easy Station (David Miller) established the first quarter-mile fraction of :29.1. Bettor Be A Star, sitting in second, could wait no longer and went to the top in a half of :58.4. On the lead is where the favorite continued through three-quarters in 1:26.1.

**Lets Justin Turtle** (Yannick Gingras) took the third division of this series in 1:54 for trainer Ron Burke. The daughter of Cattlewash—Rose Run Victory was bred by her trainer's racing stable, Weaver Brussemi and Phillip Collura. She competes as a homebred for those individuals.

Like her counterparts, Lets Justin Turtle broke her maiden as the favorite. This was her second trip to the gate with a second in first attempt.

### Trio of Indiana Sire Stakes contested Wednesday at Hoosier

A trio of Indiana Sire Stakes divisions headlined the Wednesday (July 30) card at Harrah's Hoosier Park with a pair of \$66,000 divisions of leg 2 for 2-year-old pacing colts and a lone \$96,000 division of the fifth leg for 3-year-old trotting fillies featured on the 14-race card.

The rookie pacing colts kicked off the stakes festivities, with **What Nooo Waaay** delivering a 6-1 upset with John De Long

in the bike. Leaving from post 2, De Long guided What Nooo Waaay into the pocket while Trace Tetrick hustled 2-5 favorite Mystical Rock It to the lead through a quarter of :27.3. The field of six moved single-file to the half in :57 before Tetrick began to get Mystical Rock It wound up at three-quarters in 1:26 with What Nooo Waaay in hot pursuit. What Nooo Waaay quickly powered alongside the leader before edging by with a :26.2 final quarter to win by a half-length in 1:52.3 over Mystical Rock It. Fire Inside (Kyle Wilfong) rallied home in :26 to finish third, two lengths back.

Trained by Ron Burke, the winning homebred son of Check Six–Tiffany Rocks As has banked \$69,800 while winning two of four for owners Burke Racing Stable, William Switala, James Martin and Weaver Brusceci LLC.

The second division featured a trio of unbeaten colts who went one-two-three, with **Royal Richie Doyle** getting the best of it leading every step of the way. Driver Trace Tetrick hustled Royal Ritchie Doyle out from post 5, quickly grabbing command through a quarter of :27.2 with 1-9 favorite Dancingdreamer (Aaron Stutzman) on his back. The order remained unchanged to the half in :56.4 before Dancingdreamer began to make his move to the outside at three-quarters in 1:25.1. Royal Ritchie Doyle quickly responded to the threat to his outside,

sprinting away with a :25.4 final quarter to get the best of Dancingdreamer by 2½ lengths on the wire in a career best 1:51. Swiss Lights (Ricky Macomber, Jr.) got up for the show spot, 5¼ lengths behind the winner.

Trained by Tyler George, Royal Ritchie Doyle is now three-for-three with earnings of \$45,000 for owners John and Robert Esposito who also bred the gelded son of JK Endofanera—Townes Party Girl.

In the sophomore filly trot, **Fifty To Win** extended her win streak to three on the year and handled the step back up to the top level with ease as the 7-5 favorite. The red-hot Marcus Miller floated Fifty To Win out into third off the wings while Better Tak'em (Jordan Ross) trotted around Ponda Fashion (Kyle Wilfong) to reach the quarter first in :27.1. Miracle Maven (John De Long) brushed from fourth on the backstretch to move alongside her Henry Graber, Jr. stablemate at the half in :56.3. Miracle Maven cleared moving into the far turn when Miller tipped Fifty To Win off the cones first-over at three-quarters in 1:25.4.

Fifty To Win went at Miracle Maven at the top of the stretch, who drifted off the cones allowing Better Tak'em an avenue up the cones. Better Tak'em rallied into second but would come up 1¼ lengths short of Fifty To Win who trotted in a career best 1:54. Miracle Maven held for third, with Swan Jewel (Atlee Bender) rallying for fourth at 42-1.

After breaking her maiden at the start of this win streak, Fifty To Win has been a perfect three-for-three since moving to the Erv Miller barn. A winner in three of six on the year, the daughter of Fiftydallarbill—Be Winnin has banked \$63,500 on the season and went over \$125,000 in lifetime earnings for owners Doug Overhiser, Macomber Racing and M&M Racing.

## TELL IT LIKE THIS UPSETS, SOMEMORE BLUE STAYS PERFECT IN INSS

It was a tale of two divisions on Tuesday (July 29) as Harrah's Hoosier Park hosted a pair of splits of Indiana Sire Stakes for 2-year-old pacing fillies with **Tell It Like This** scoring as the longest shot on the board to break her maiden in the first division, and **Somemore Blue** dominating as the 1-9 favorite and staying unbeaten in the second division.

Tell It Like This teamed up with leading driver Trace Tetrick where they left from post 5 in the field of six at 10-1 on the board in the \$66,500 first division. Tell It Like This floated away in fifth early while Cruisen Halle (Mike Oosting) sprinted out to an early lead to grab control through a :26.2 first quarter. The pace began to slow on the backstretch before Miss Alexis (Marcus Miller) charged first-over from third to take over before reaching the half in :56.3. Miss Alexis raced 2½ lengths clear at three-quarters in 1:26 while Tell It Like This still had 6½ lengths to make up from fifth before having to swing wide around Whoomp (John De Long) who jumped it off at the top of the stretch.

The sprint for home began with Miss Alexis looking to steal a victory off a soft middle half and Cruisen Halle now in hot pursuit while Tell It Like This began to find her best stride in the middle of the track. Rocketing home in :25.4, Tell It Like This surged late in the lane to pick off both rivals and score by a length in 1:53. Cruisen Halle got up in the final strides to nail Miss Alexis for the place position.

Trained by Ron Burke, Tell It Like This now has one win and a pair of thirds through three starts in her young career. The daughter of Tellitlikeitis—Atomic Fireball has banked \$43,210 for owners Burke Racing Stable, Beasty LLC., Frank Baldachino and Knox Services.

The \$67,000 second division held much truer to form as Somemore Blue and Marcus Miller led every step of the way to remain undefeated on the season. Somemore Blue quickly asserted herself from post 3, getting to the top to cut the opening quarter in :27.2. The field showed their respect to the 1-9 shot in the middle half, allowing her to go unchallenged to a half of :56.4 before reaching three-quarters in 1:26 and 1½ lengths clear of pocket-sitter Rock The Charm (John De Long).

Rock The Charm took her shot from the pocket at the top of the lane but was quickly rebuffed by Somemore Blue who countered and quickened under minimal Miller urging. Powering home in :26.2, Somemore Blue sped through the wire 2¼ lengths clear in a career best 1:52.2 over Rock The Charm who fended off Milliondollarimage (Jay Cross) for second.

Trained by Erv Miller, Somemore Blue is now three-for-three for owners Doug Overhiser, Kenneth Duffy, Lava Java Stable and Never 2 Late Stable. The winning daughter of Rockin Image—Misssomebeach Blue has banked \$72,100 in her young career.

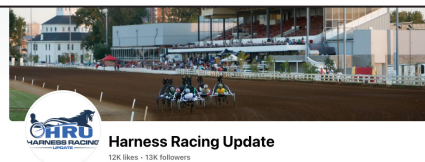

## Crawford Farms bred three Hambletonian Oaks starters

Any breeder would tell you that getting a foal from the ground to the winner's circle on Hambletonian Day is nothing short of a miracle. With that fact in mind, Crawford Farms has plenty to be grateful for.

Having already bred two (Karl, Ramona Hill) of the last seven winners of the million-dollar Hambletonian, while sharing ownership in a third (Atlanta), now the Crawfords are cheering for three entrants in this year's \$500,000 Grade 1 Hambletonian Oaks on Saturday (Aug. 2) at The Meadowlands.

Following last week's elimination races the Crawfords were fortunate enough to have bred a trio of fillies that made the lucrative final, one homebred from previous champion Atlanta (Deja Blu) and another pair (Torrise and R Charm) that were offered at public auction.

"Deja Blu raced super in her Hambo [Oaks] elimination," said back-to-back Hambletonian winning trainer Nancy Takter. "She is unbelievably quick and she's a perfect example of when you breed the best they show up in these major stakes."

While "royally-bred" is a term that is often used to describe racehorses with strong pedigrees, in the case of Deja Blu, the term may be a relative understatement.

From Muscle Hill, arguably the best trotting sire since Speedy Crown, and she the first foal from the multiple world champion mare Atlanta 1:49 (\$3,533,707), Deja Blu was retained by the Crawfords with co-ownership now including Thomas Pontone.

Trained by Nancy Takter, Deja Blue 2, 1:53, 3,1:52-'25 (\$178,052) has post 2 in the Oaks final with Yannick Gingras listed as the driver, who said after her elim, "Very happy with how she raced last week. Had tons of trot finishing and is coming into the final in great form."

Another Takter trainee in the Oaks final is Torrise 2, 1:54.1, 3, 1:54-'25 (\$307,816) who was bred and sold by Crawford Farms for \$110,000 at the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale.

By the hot sire Walner and from the top mare Barn Girl 1:53.2 (\$860,478), the \$135,000 Zweig Filly Stake winner is now owned by Pryde Stables, John Fielding, Caviart Farms and Herb Liverman. Torrise scores from post 10 with driver Tim Tetrick.

Rounding out the Crawford Farms troika is R Charm 2, 1:53.3 (\$244,241) who finished a fast closing second by a nose to Conversano in her Oaks elim, race timed in 1:52.4.

The daughter of Propulsion from the Credit Winner mare Jewels In Hock 4, 1:51.4 (\$533,215) was a \$55,000 yearling purchase by Armitage Farm, whose ownership now includes lessee M&L of Delaware. Trained by Hambletonian-winning trainer Linda Toscano, the filly leaves from post 4 in the Oaks final with David Miller listed to drive.

Fans can watch the 100th Hambletonian (and the Hambletonian Oaks) live on the national television broadcast by FOX Sports, as part of the Saratoga Saturday series from 3-6 p.m. (EDT) live from The Meadowlands.
