Undefeated Iowa-bred to take shot at Milstein

Chicken N Dice to put perfect 16-for-16 record on the line on Saturday at MGM Northfield Park

MGM Northfield Park's executive vice president of racing Dave Bianconi has always tried to get the fastest and richest sophomore pacers for his track's Carl Milstein Memorial Invitational. This year, he secured the winningest horse in North America when Chicken N Dice puts his perfect 16-for-16 record on the line in Saturday's (Aug. 12) \$300,000 event.

The Iowa-bred son of Millionaire Cam out of Keystone Ivy is conditioned by Curtis Carey for his father, Thomas Carey and co-owner Jesse DeLong.

As a 2-year-old, the homebred won 13 straight Iowa fair events, making him the winningest freshman pacer in North

America. He has since added three additional wins for the longest current streak on the continent.

Chicken N Dice started his career in a \$500 state bred event at West Liberty scoring a half-length victory in 2:10, followed up with a win at Eldon in 2:06.1. As the season wore on, the competition started to get harder and the purses larger.

His most impressive win as a freshman came on July 30 at Humboldt, a 6 ½ length score in 2:00.

“He’s kinda one of those horses that has never really had to pace a lot,” said the 43-year-old trainer. “We really didn’t know what he could do.”

The gelding’s last 2-year-old start came in the \$18,000 Iowa fair final at Humboldt on Oct. 2. He needed a tough, first-over trip to score by a neck in 2:02.3. It was discovered after the race that Chicken N Dice broke a coffin bone.

“We had plans to take him to Lexington to race but he broke a bone,” said Curtis.

After the injury, Chicken N Dice was sent to John DeLong’s farm in central Indiana to rehab.

With just three sophomore starts, Chicken N Dice has made steady progress.

“We didn’t stake him to anything this year, not knowing what was going to happen,” said Curtis. “We have been racing him very conservatively. He just keeps winning and doing what we want him to do.”

Bianconi reaches out to Curtis every summer to scout for potential contestants for the Milstein.

“I called Curtis last summer and he mentioned that he had a real good 2-year-old that was undefeated,” said Bianconi. “I told him that if he was still undefeated at 3, I would make sure he had a spot in our signature event.”

Bianconi is a man of his word and invited Curtis to bring Chicken N Dice to Cleveland.

Curtis knows how to find the northeast Ohio track as Chicken N Dice will be his third starter in Northfield Park’s biggest event. He finished third in 2018 with Minnie Vinnie and eighth with Slippin The Clutch in 2020.

Curtis is bringing Minnie Vinnie along for this week’s 10-hour trailer ride to Northfield Park. The now 8-year-old is racing in a \$10,000 conditioned event Saturday night (Aug. 12).

Chicken N Dice’s regular pilot, Will Roland, won’t be at Northfield Park, so Curtis is turning to Aaron Merriman, North

America's and Northfield Park's top reinsman.

"Aaron drove my other two [Milstein starters] and has done a nice job with them," said Curtis. "No one knows that track better than him."

Curtis is currently training 19 head at his hometown fairgrounds in Columbus Junction, IA. He is approaching 800 career training wins and has over \$2.6 million in career earnings. Last year, he posted a career best 69 wins and \$244,681 in purses.

A win in this year's Milstein Memorial would bring in an additional \$150,000 and a lifetime of memories for the Iowa connections.

The Milstein undercard will feature legs of the Ohio Sire Stakes for freshman colt pacers and 3-year-old colt trotters and \$100,000 Invitationals for Ohio-breds. It's Academic headlines the Tom Aldrich Trot and Bythemissal, the 2022 Little Brown Jug champ, expects to be the one to beat in the Myron Charna Pace.

The first post is scheduled for 6 p.m.

John Watkins went out a winner

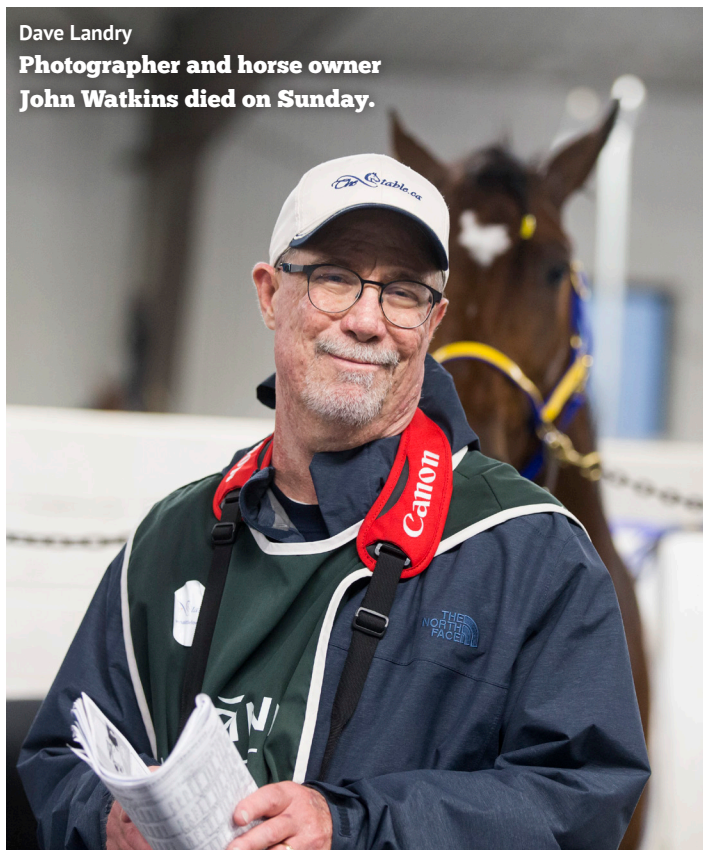
The well-known and well-liked Ontario photographer died this week just before his filly broke her maiden Tuesday at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

John Watkins sported a quiet smile, professional camera and MEDIA vest for major races at Woodbine Mohawk Park. The smile was there when he attended the races at Woodbine and Mohawk without his camera, too. 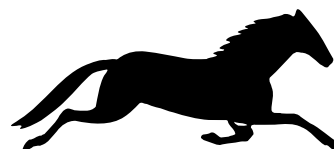

turned 2-year-old pacing filly Pretty Missy May to pose for her picture after she broke her maiden. Watkins, who co-owned the winner of WMP race 2, died Sunday (Aug. 6) at Lakeridge Health in Oshawa.

Race caller Ken Middleton, Jr. was also absent from the homebred Big Jim—Little Miss Sporty daughter’s photo. He co-owns Pretty Missy May (p, 2,1:55.2s; \$11,789) with James Grant and David Walls, both of Sarnia, ON, as well as the estate of John Watkins. Middleton is still recovering from a training accident that has him sidelined from regular action on the training track and behind the microphone.

Middleton said that Watkins felt like an old friend, even though he was a more recent one who had initially connected with him via social media.

“That’s what’s funny about John, he can grow a friendship very quickly,” Middleton said. “I learned a lot about him in a short time, because he was a person you wanted to spend time with... He’d be the quietest guy in the room. His photography is what drew me to him. I chimed in one day and said, ‘You’re a magnificent photographer... You take very unique and interesting shots; you go the extra mile.’ We did eventually meet up and have conversations about life and family and horses... He made a lot of friends.”

Middleton said he was somewhat worried about his friend’s health back in June. Watkins had received dialysis treatment for years, prior to a kidney transplant in 2006 with an organ donated by his sister, Nancy.

“We did a lot of talking through Facebook messages,” Middleton said. “He told me he wouldn’t be able to get back to me for a couple of days... Then lo and behold, he was back North America Cup night, taking pictures with his MEDIA bib on. He loved being there on big race dates.”

Recently, the WMP announcer got the feared bad news about Watkins: “His wife [Jane] reached out to me on Facebook and told me he’s not doing well; he’s on a ventilator; on dialysis; he’s got pneumonia... She was going to meet with physicians in about a week’s time. Then she messaged me to say he was going to be taken off life support on Monday [Aug. 7].”

John Watkins died Sunday (Aug. 6). He was 59 years old.

"I think [Woodbine racing analyst] Monique Våg texted me and said that he had passed away, and then [former Mohawk racing analyst/current Grand River Raceway racing manager] Chad Rozema, then I saw it on Woodbine social media," Middleton said.

Watkins was somewhat new to horse ownership, partnering with Middleton's ownership group and adding Pretty Missy May after a conversation last year.

"I met him and his wife either at the Winbak Farms open house or sale," Middleton said. "He'd won a free breeding to Stag Party from a random draw. I said, 'Well, you'd better have a broodmare or figure out something else.' I told him I had two of my own homebreds... So that's what John did: He bought a small percentage of both yearlings."

Middleton said he didn't recall Watkins spending much time around the training center recently, for understandable reasons, although the Ontario-based racing photographer had visited with family in the past.

"I don't think he ever came to the barn to see the filly we have this year, but I'm sure he came to the racetrack to see her or watched her online," Middleton said.

Tuesday night would have brought another smile to Watkins' face, whether he was on track or not.

"I didn't even know if his wife knew [Pretty Missy May] was racing," Middleton said. "So, I sent her some pictures and said, 'You know, we had some divine intervention in that.' I sent her still-shot pictures of the TV. We watched it from home. Some of my family was there... [fill-in race caller Shannon] 'Sugar' Doyle made some nice comments."

Middleton said he was disappointed he couldn't be there for his filly's special win and new lifetime mark.

"I'm convalescing," Middleton said. "I've still got a long way to go. Sleep quality is hit and miss. I've got a follow-up with my surgeon in a week's time. Now it's just rehabilitating and healing. They had to go right down to the bone in the deepest part of [my] body."

Middleton must receive daily intravenous antibiotics as he recovers from complications after his original June 29 accident.

"It got infected," he said. "It's quite a setback. My right arm, where I made impact with my shoulder and my arm, there's some nerve damage I've gotta deal with. They found there was a piece of bone that was impinging on the spine and irritating it. It's marginally better. I get up and go on little walks and stuff like that. The big thing is I can't lift anything of significance."

Fatigue is also a problem.

"There's no consistency... it's frustrating," he said. "If we're having a good day, maybe we can go to Costco and get a few things."

Other days, I have to leave the patio chair to sleep for three or four hours in the afternoon... I let my body tell me what to do."

Middleton is grateful for having support.

"I've got lots of people helping with the work-related, horse-related stuff," he said. "Sarah, my girlfriend, has been a guardian angel... I need help with a lot of things... I needed help feeling half-normal again. She's taking me to appointments. She runs the antibiotics into me every day... She's taken it upon herself. I'm pretty lucky."

Losing Watkins was a tough blow for Middleton as he remains sidelined: "I was in [the hospital] for three weeks... It was just a bad place mentally. I did not want to be there."

Middleton's winning filly did come home to his Cambridge, ON farm the day after her WMP victory, when she raised his spirits with her own game attitude.

"She runs in a little bit, so they opened up on her a little," he said. "It looked like the filly on the front end [4-5 favorite Premier Heiress] got a little bit lost. Halfway down the lane I could see [Pretty Missy May] was gaining. She sprinted hard and just kept going forwards... We'll get her revved up for the next [Ontario] Sires Stakes race."

The filly's co-owner James Grant said he was also saddened by Watkins' passing.

"I met John through Ken Middleton," Grant said. "I was fortunate enough to be invited by Ken to partner on Bob Loblaw [p, 3,1:50.3s; \$202,744] and Dont Poke The Bear [p, 3,1:55.3s; \$75,189] a few years back now. We had a lot of fun. When Ken had his next crop of horses coming up, John joined up with us and he fit right in. Just a great all-around guy."

"John was involved with us on Grammys Girl [p, 3, 2:01.0h; \$9,047] previously and we had some really good times. When Pretty Missy May came along, the group kept moving ahead. John was a positive guy who loved horses. A great partner."

Echoing Middleton's thoughts about divine intervention in the filly's win, Grant said Watkins' camera work will also be missed. He had been runner-up for the O'Brien Media Excellence Outstanding Photography Award for "In The Pocket", a mid-race close-up of driver Doug McNair that was featured on the Ontario Racing website on Oct. 23, 2020.

"I'll miss John's positivity and love for horses," Grant said. "He had a wonderful way of talking about racing while also working in his great photography skills to paint a picture as well. You could really feel the photos he shared. They always told a great story of how he felt towards the animals he was shooting."

Ready Cash has died

Ready Cash, one of the best standardbred sires in the world, died due to colic in his home country of France on Tuesday night (Aug. 8).

He was one of the most prominent sires in the industry in the past 10-12 years and his legacy has been significant for all European harness racing countries and even for the American market.

Ready Cash was syndicated early as a stallion but owner Philippe Allaire continued to race the horse, which resulted in wins in the Prix d'Amérique in 2011 and 2012. Four years after Ready Cash's latest victory in one of the biggest races in the world, it was time for one of his most merited sons to claim the trophy at Vincennes. Bold Eagle won the Prix d'Amérique in 2016 and 2017. In 2018, another Ready Cash son was best in Paris. Ready Express came to Paris and showed the world what he was made of and soon thereafter a new French star showed up at Vincennes. In the 2021 and 2022 Prix d'Amérique, the winner was Face Time Bourbon. What all these trotters have in common is that their results as sires are also strong, so Ready Cash's legacy will live on for a great while in the business.

Here are some of Ready Cash's most well-known offspring: Bold Eagle, Face Time Bourbon, Ready Express, Bird Parker, Django Riff, Back Of The Neck, Traders, Brillantissime, Charly du Noyer, Millindollarrhyme, Gotland, Very Kronos and Ideal du Pommeau.

WILL FRENCH OR AMERICAN BLOOD PROVE STRONGEST AT ÅBY?

Åby racetrack in Sweden plays host to the \$260,000 Åby Stora Pris over 3,140 meters this Saturday (Aug. 12) and the race is a battle between American and French sires. Traditionally, the French horses are favored by the long distance in the race. But in the sixth edition of the Åby Stora Pris over 3,140 meters suggests it will be neither French nor American blood that will prevail. Maharajah (Viking Kronos) counts as Swedish and his offspring have claimed the Åby Stora Pris in three out of the last five years over 3,140 meters.

The favorite should maybe be Italian-bred Bengurion Jet (Maharajah), who has shown great capacity in some big European races this season. Alessandro Gocciadoro's 6-year-old won the Sweden Cup at Solvalla in May and has made two more appearances during the summer. The question mark regarding Bengurion Jet this time is probably the distance. Gocciadoro has raced his horse over the mile most of the time and in last year's Åby Stora Pris, Bengurion Jet showed nothing that will make him the winner this year.

Five-year-old Father Patrick son Kentucky River will probably be some fans' favorite in the race while some will vote for Googoo Gaagaa son Power. Both of these "American" trotters have shown that long distance is more beneficial for them compared to the mile.

\$2.1 million TAB Eureka is uniting Australian harness racing

All six racing states will be represented on Sept. 2.

While Australia's thoroughbred industry is divided and almost at war in some areas, the world's richest harness race has become the glue to unite the country's harness racing industry.

Don't get me wrong, thoroughbred racing still well and truly rules the roost in Australia with about seven times the wagering market share of harness racing, but if the smaller cousin is to make any inroads it needs to work together.

And that's where the \$2.1 million TAB Eureka is doing more than its bit.

Initially launched to some angst from sections of the breeding industry because its largely funded by stallion taxes, most knockers, doubters and critics have been silenced by the publicity the TAB Eureka has created and the way it's strongly touched every harness racing jurisdiction in Australia.

When they line-up behind the mobile gate for the 2400m feature at Menangle on Sept. 2, all six Australian racing states will be strongly represented, and that never happens these days. I mean, never.

While the young stars of the sport will headline the TAB Eureka, there are some rich and passionate stories around some great harness racing families and lesser lights trying to snatch the prize, too.

Let's have a look at them, state-by-state:

VICTORIA

The long-time harness powerhouse is going through a challenging financial time post the COVID-19 wagering spike, but it will lead the way into the TAB Eureka with four of the 10 pacers.

The top seed is the Miracle Mile winner **Catch A Wave**.

Trainer Andy Gath has prepared a long list of stars over a 35-year career, but has been saying for a while that Catch A Wave is the best of the lot.

His huge and rare Chariots Of Fire and Miracle Mile double in February/March showed everyone why Gath has Catch A Wave on a pedestal.

The son of Captaintreacherous has only raced once since that Miracle Mile win on March 4 and suffered a narrow-but-shocking defeat by his half-brother and stablemate, Yambukian, at Melton on July 29.

But Gath, who took Catch A Wave to Geelong for a solid workout between races last Friday night (Aug. 4), isn't panicking.

"He spelled really well and came back bigger, maybe 30kgs heavier than he was last campaign," Gath said. "These good horses can trick you because they're so talented and work so well at home, but that's why you have lead-up races. We've shown we can peak him for the races that really matter before and I'm sure we can do it again. He'll run at Melton on Aug. 19 and then we'll decide if he runs again the week after or goes straight into the Eureka."

The Lost Storm is Australia's standout 3-year-old and made it 10 wins from just 12 starts when he thrashed his rivals in the Group 1 Queensland Derby on July 22.

He's from Australia's top stable of Emma Stewart and Clayton Tonkin and will have his next lead-up run at Ballarat on Friday night (Aug. 11).

"We might give him one more lead-up run after that, but we'll decide after Ballarat," Stewart said. "We're under no illusions how hard it will be for a 3-year-old to beat the top 4-year-olds in a race like this, but we've got a very big opinion of this guy and he'll get the barrier draw advantage."

The TAB Eureka is restricted to Australian-bred 3- and 4-year-old pacers with 3-year-olds (and fillies or mares) getting preferential draws. As it stands, The Lost Storm is the only 3-year-old in the race and will get the pole.

Stewart and Tonkin also snared a second runner this week when their star 4-year-old mare **Encipher** was snapped-up by Aaron Bain Racing and Summit Bloodstock for their slot.

"We're so glad," Tonkin said. "She really deserves a crack at it. Mark my words, if she gets barrier two and can drop straight in behind The Lost Storm and be on the leader's back or three pegs, she'll be very dangerous."

"We've virtually never been able to drive her with a sit against her own sex, but she holds her [own] with our very best open-aged pacers at home when she sits on them and not many will enjoy a strong 2400m more than her. She's very tough."

And then there is the one who some call the enigma and others call the X-factor, **Captain Ravishing**.

Back in February, there was no more exciting pacer Down Under, but defeats in the Chariots Of Fire and Miracle Mile and new

trainer Ahmed Taiba's plan to take him first-up into the TAB Eureka without a lead-up race has many guessing and others discounting him.

His talent is freakish, but just what we'll see from him after two or three trials and no lead-up races over what will surely be a grueling 2400m on Australia's biggest and toughest track (the 1400m Menangle circuit) is the big question.

Captain Ravishing's trial at Melton next Monday shapes as going a long way to deciding whether he is still on target to even head to Sydney.

QUEENSLAND

With just one slot still open, the "Sunshine State" has just the two entrants and one of them is the best pacer Down Under and some say the world.

His name is **Leap To Fame** and his only defeat in 10 starts since last September came when he sat outside the leader and carried a flat tire into second spot (in blazing time) behind Swayzee in the Group 1 Blacks A Fake at Albion Park on July 22.

He romped home at Albion Park last Saturday night (Aug. 5) to take his record to 22 wins (and six placings) from just 29 starts.

His mix of strength and speed has rightly earned him comparisons with the recent greats of Down Under harness stars.

Leap To Fame will represent Queensland in the the \$2.1 million TAB Eureka on Sept. 2.



"He felt great the other night," trainer/driver Grant Dixon said. "I'll get one more run into him before we head down to Menangle, probably the Sunday before the Eureka."

Dixon could have a second runner and give Queensland a third flag bearer with the underrated **Tims A Trooper** set to contest Saturday's (Aug. 19) \$50,000 The Singo at Menangle. High-profile Aussie entrepreneur John Singleton will use the race to settle on which pacers fills his TAB Eureka slot, one of just two left available as I write this.

Queensland's other confirmed starter is the exciting **Speak The Truth**.

The son of Bettor's Delight is a star on the rise for trainer Shannon Price with 11 wins (and six placings) from just 19 starts. In any normal year he would be a major player, but this a dream line-up for the first running. He's not without a chance, but will need the right draw.

NEW SOUTH WALES

The proud and strong state will host at least the first three runnings of the TAB Eureka, but will struggle to win it.

The only confirmed NSW runner at this stage is the talented **My Ultimate Ronnie**, who didn't race up to his best during last month's Queensland features, but trainer Jarrod Alchin has been thrilled with him since returning to his Menangle stables.

It looks close to certain the NSW owned-and-trained **Ripp** will also get a start, filling the slot of his owner Wayne Loader under the Western Jewel banner. But Ripp would need to lift on a first-up fifth at Menangle last Saturday night.

"He's in again Saturday night at Menangle," Loader said. "He's drawn better and will be fitter because he's come back from injury. If he pleases us this week, he'll likely run in our slot in the Eureka."

But NSW's best chance to be part of a win comes through the Cordina Racing slot, which is being filled by Catch A Wave.

SOUTH AUSTRALIA

It has been a big few weeks for the long-suffering state with increases to prize money and now a confirmed SA owned-and-bred runner in the TAB Eureka with star mare **Encipher**.

Add that to the fact she will race in the strongly SA-connected slot of Aaron Bain Racing and Summit Bloodstock and the

Encipher package is unmistakably South Australia, despite the fact she's trained in Victoria by Stewart and Tonkin.

Depending on how "The Singo" plays out, Encipher will likely be the only mare in the race and, given the preferential draw, she will get barrier 2. That's a big advantage. She is at least a place chance in a stellar field.

TASMANIA

The Apple Isle, that little island at the south-eastern tip of Australia, has a rich harness racing history and it's great to see them part of the TAB Eureka.

Last Saturday night, they held a new race, the \$80,000 Beautide, specifically created to decide which horse flies the Tasmanian flag in the Tasracing slot of the TAB Eureka.

And, fittingly, it was won by a member of the Rattray clan, arguably Tasmania's most famous harness racing family.

Gareth and James Rattray trained the mighty Beautide, one of the best pacers Tasmania has produced, at different times of his career. His greatest wins included two Inter Dominion finals at Menangle in 2014 and '15.

Their brother Todd trained and drove the emerging 4-year-old **Magician** to a fighting win in the Beautide and earned his ticket into the TAB Eureka.

Despite the enormity of Magician's challenge, he adds a beautiful layer of history and sentiment to the race.

Adding to the Tassie flavor, trainer/driver Matthew Howlett confirmed Mickey Oh, who was a close second to Magician in the Beautide, was still chasing a TAB Eureka start.

"He's going to Sydney to run in The Singo [Aug. 19]," Howlett said. "That's his only way in, it seems. That's the great thing about the Eureka, it gives people like me a chance to chase a dream."

WESTERN AUSTRALIA

Just how strong the WA flavor is will hinge on whether the state's best mare, **Wonderful To Fly**, heads from Perth to Sydney next week and, if so, how well she runs in The Singo a week from Saturday.

A win or eye-catching performance could be enough for John Singleton to grab Wonderful To Fly for his slot in the TAB Eureka.

"You know how much I want to be there, but it's really up to whether we can get the right sort of flights; not just across, but also back home afterwards because she's got so many feature mares' races here before Christmas," Young said.

So, there's a snapshot of where we are at and how, despite its doubters and even plenty of critics, the race has been such a wonderful creation for Australian harness racing.

Now we just need all the stars to turn up at best and the ingredients are there for us to have a race befitting of the tremendous build-up.

Bring on Sept. 2.

Across the river and into the swamp, Part 3

If James A. Michener wrote a novel about New Jersey it would begin in prehistoric times and include speculative prose about life developing in the vast wetlands before human intervention. The next hundred pages would include intricate details about Dutch settlers turning a forest into marshlands and harvesting saltmeadowsalt cordgrass.

A thousand or so pages later it would still not be clear how the area declined into an environmental graveyard in modern times. Nor how a poor boy by the name of Mal Burroughs from Jersey City built a business responsible for constructing on the ancient swamp the foundation of The Meadowlands racetrack.

The first time I saw Mal Burroughs I was covering the 1997 Hambletonian at The Meadowlands. I knew nothing about him at that time other than he was the trainer and (amateur) driver of Malabar Man, an early favorite for the August classic. My assistant editor Joe Samulka and I did not fancy betting on the public choice. We were all over Trond Smedshammer's Bowling For Dollars, offering a better win price, early speed and the skill of a professional driver. It cost Joe Samulka and our bets when Mal Burroughs guided Malabar Man to a victory over the tiring Bowling For Dollars. Impressive.

Five years later, as managing editor of *TIMES: in harness*, I interviewed Mal Burroughs for the August edition. His life before, during and after The Meadowlands stood upon the Jersey marshlands was compelling, certainly compared to any James A. Michener text.

Growing up in urban, rowdy Jersey City, Mal Burroughs said, helped build his character.

"You become mentally and physically tough growing up in that kind of environment," he said. "You're not intimidated as easily as some young boy in the suburbs."

In 1954, he was 14 and was forced to support his mother, brothers and sister when his father died in a car accident. The Burroughs family moved to nearby Rutherford and Mal bought a dump truck, worked in the daytime and "I got a high school equivalency diploma at night," he said. He wanted to get a college degree the same way but "it was taking too much out of me." So, he bought another dump truck. Then another. He hired truck drivers and began booking construction jobs "for some developers that were working in The Meadowlands [area] ... There was a big demand for dirt to fill in the swamps. I just happened to be at the right place at the right time."

In 1961, 21-year-old Mal launched Burroughs and Son.

"I figured when I made deals with older businessmen, they would think I was the son," Mal said. "So, when they tried to squeeze me for money to get a better price I'd say, 'I have to check with my dad.' It worked every time."

That was 36 years before Samulka and I lost the Hambletonian at The Meadowlands to Malabar Man; but in 1961 the guy who drove the trotter that beat us did not know the difference between a trotter and a pacer. It was, as he said, before "I built the racetrack there."

Mal did bigger jobs before building the racetrack. Burroughs and Son worked on the Turnpike and Route 80, for instance. And for the New Jersey Sports and Exposition Authority's (NJSEA) new racetrack Mal and company excavated the landfill, brought fill back to the track for a barn area, dug all the infield lakes and put in all the drainage.

“I did everything except the structure itself,” he said.

Details? Get this, Mr. Michener. The Burroughs crew utilized four cranes, 120 trucks and up to 50 men (while he employed nearly 400) to handle the massive weight of the mechanics responsible for laying the foundation of the site.

“I had that job done in 18 months,” he said.

That was, of course, the original Meadowlands framework, part of the entire NJSEA sports' complex (NJSEA) which included a stadium playing host to the New York Giants. On Sept. 1, 1976, the racetrack opened with a harness racing program. It drew a capacity crowd of 42,133.

Malvern Burroughs attended the first night of racing at The Meadowlands. He was there with the NJSEA's Sonny Werblin and New York Jet's hero, Joe Namath.

“It was quite an exhilarating experience to say the least,” he said and it was not handicapping to win money as a member of the pari-mutuel crowd. “I was more interested in the horses than the betting. I was intrigued the way the play unfolded... To me harness racing looked more interesting than thoroughbred racing. There was obviously more strategy in the ways the drivers moved their horses and get into [winning] positions.”

His construction business began with one truck and after the first night at The Meadowlands, “The idea of being able to own one of those horses and become involved in the planning of the horse's career became attractive.”

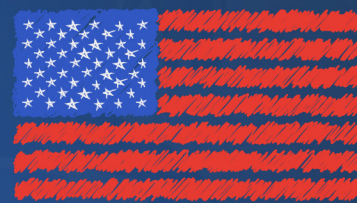

Willys Home Run and MacDonald headlined OSS action at Georgian Downs

Two-year-old trotters invaded Georgian Downs on Tuesday (Aug. 8) with four Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Gold divisions and Archangel filly **Willys Home Run** improved to three-for-three at the top level of the provincial program in the first \$100,400 division of the evening.

In the first two legs of the season, Willys Home Run won from off the pace at Woodbine Mohawk Park, but tonight James MacDonald pressed go on the Kyle Fellows trainee from the moment the wings rolled in race 2.

Leaving from post 3, MacDonald led the field through fractions of :29.3, :59.1, and 1:28 before stopping the clock in 1:56.1, four lengths ahead of her nearest challenger Classy Royale driven by Jody Jamieson.

"It was the two best fillies in the division so far, Jody's filly, and mine," said MacDonald. "Ideally, I wanted to be forwardly placed, or ahead of Jody if I could, and just in a spot where I could get a chance to race her, and let her be great, and it worked out tonight."

Bred by Reg Higgs, the win moves Willys Home Run over \$157,000 in earnings through just four career starts.

"She's a strong filly with a big strong gait," said MacDonald. "Around the last turn Jody inched out off my back and I was confident I had quite a bit of trot left. I just tapped her on the tail, and the second I asked her she just took off. She's developing into a very good filly, and passing every test with flying colors."

Higgs co-owns the filly with Dr. Sara Gatchell, Jake Higgs, and Yolanda Fellows who paid \$3.20 for the win.

MacDonald picked up the OSS double and his fourth win of

the night in the final OSS division of the evening piloting **Soar Higher** to his maiden breaking score in a \$102,200 affair for 2-year-old colts and geldings.

Canada's leading driver was forced to settle his Resolve gelding off the early pace and watch Mrstery Deal and Myretirementdream exchange the lead through the first half-mile.

"I wanted to take advantage of his good gait, he trots really nice, and had good gate speed, so I took him out there as good as I could," said MacDonald. "It didn't work out, so I had to take a hold and I was lucky to get in a spot."

After getting cover from Trevor Henry and Masstercraft, Soar Higher and MacDonald tipped out three wide rounding the final turn, and flew home to win by a neck in 1:57.3.

"I had horses around me, and I thought if I got lucky, I could get out," said MacDonald. "I was able to slide out on Trevor's back and then in the last turn I flipped him out three wide and it turned into a great trip."

A \$120,000 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale purchase, the well-bred gelding had two seconds and a third in his first three career starts.

He is a half-sister to OSS Super Final winner Up And Ready, and his second dam M Stewart is the mother of Maven, who earned over \$2 million in a globe-trotting career.

Matt Bax trains Soar Higher who moves over \$90,000 in earnings with the victory for owners Bax Stable, Bradley Grant, David Hudson, and Harbor Racing Stable.

He paid \$6.20 for his first career win.

The other OSS divisions were races 3 and 4.

Race 3, a \$103,100 division for colts and geldings, saw several of the freshman make breaks, but **Willowtime** and Bob McClure avoided the trouble and won by 10 lengths for trainer Mark Etsell in a final time of 1:58.

Etsell co-owns the filly with Terry Devos, and Peter Porter, and it was the debut start for the son of Looklikeeachpndale who was sent off at odds of 33-1.

In race 4, Bruce Richardson homebred **No One** led from start to finish and despite several strong challenges Richardson was able to pilot his horse to victory by a nose over MacDonald and a hard charging Evolving.

No One stopped the clock in 1:58.3 and paid \$6.70 for the win.

Twin B Joe Fresh shrugs off rival Strong Poison at Red Mile

On Tuesday (Aug. 8) Red Mile hosted one \$80,000 second round leg of the Kentucky Sire Stakes Series, one \$30,000 second round leg of the Kentucky Commonwealth Series and two \$15,000 second round legs of the Kentucky Goldenrod Series for sophomore filly pacers. Defending Kentucky champion **Twin B Joe Fresh** and pilot Dexter Dunn used a :25.4 last panel to outlast familiar rival Strong Poison and Yannick Gingras in a lifetime best 1:48.2.

The daughter of Roll With Joe and her driver were content to settle in fourth after beginning the mile from post position 7. Always B Naughty (David Miller, Nancy Takter) established fractions of :27.1, :54.4 and 1:22.1 with Strong Poison tracking in second after drawing the rail.

Twin B Joe Fresh, who nearly equaled Warrawee Ubeaut's world record (1:48.3) for a freshman filly pacer over this same surface last year (1:48.4), overhauled Always B Naughty entering the stretch and paced strongly to the wire to hold Strong Poison at bay.

Trained by Chris Ryder, Twin B Joe Fresh is co-owned by her trainer, her driver and Peter Trebotica and Barry Spak. The \$65,000 2021 Standardbred Horse Sale purchase was bred by Brittany Farms.

The filly boosted her bankroll to \$786,748 and improved her lifetime record to 17-12-3-1. Twin B Joe Fresh is also the defending New York State Sire Stakes champion. She was third in the \$319,200 Fan Hanover final on June 17 at Woodbine

Mohawk Park and second in the \$169,000 Mistletoe Shalee this season.

Twin B Joe Fresh paid \$2.70 to win. Strong Poison, trained by Ron Burke, was \$4.84 to place and Cultured (Scott Zeron, Linda Toscano) was \$4.76 to show.

DARBY CREEK UPSETS IN COMMONWEALTH SERIES

It required every inch of the red clay oval for 47-1 shot **Darby Creek** to get her head in front of Diamondspearls (Dunn, Takter), but the daughter of Downbytheseaside and driver Austin Hanners did exactly that to stop the clock in 1:51.3.

Hungry For Love (D. Miller, Ron Burke) was another head back in third for a rousing finish to the line.

Darby Creek, trained by Brian Brown, is owned by Donald Robinson, Michael Robinson, Robert Mondillo and Rich Lombardo racing. The filly is the sixth foal out of Moonlit Dragon who collected \$385,902 on the racetrack. She was a \$35,000 purchase at the 2021 Lexington Selected Sale.

The filly was bred by Steve Stewart and co-owners D. Robinson and M. Robinson.

Darby Creek paid \$97.78 to win with Diamondspearls paying \$6.24 and Hungry For Love rounding out the trifecta at \$3.44.

FAVORED KEEP MY SECRET AND FRESHEN UP TAKE GOLDENROD SERIES DIVISIONS

Keep My Secret and Tony Hall rebounded from a dull fifth place effort at Eldorado Scioto Downs to score in a new lifetime best of 1:50.3 in the first of two divisions of the Goldenrod Series for trainer Anette Lorentzon.

Freshen Up provided Dunn and Ryder with one of two victories on the 13-race card. The daughter of Bettor's Delight paid \$3.98 to for her 1:51.3 triumph.

Midnight Nolan continued to shine in the Buckeye Stallion Series as she won for the third time in the series, taking the third \$20,000 division at MGM Northfield Park on Wednesday (Aug. 9).

Midnight Nolan with Kurt Sugg grabbed the lead just past the opening quarter and fought off a charge from Jurassic Hattie entering the final turn to win by two lengths in a new lifetime mark of 1:56. Trained by Dan Walski and owned by Walski Stables, it was the third win in four starts for the daughter of Uncle Peter. Jurassic Hattie finished second with My Rory third.

In the first division, **Kaminari** with Aaron Merriman charged up the backstretch, took command around the final turn, and

drew away to win by three lengths in a new lifetime mark of 1:59. The daughter of What The Hill is trained by Chris Beaver, who co-owns Kaminari with Sandra Burnett. It was the filly's second win in five starts.

Sedona Hill was second with Tammie Sue third.

Purplepeopleater and Anthony MacDonald fired off the gate and grabbed the lead on the way to a gate-to-wire victory in the other division. The What The Hill filly cruised to the four-length victory in a new lifetime mark of 1:59. It was the second win in five starts for the Jason McGinnis trainee which is owned by Thestable Purplepeopleater and Hutchison Harness.

Lead Off finished second with Madame Pele finishing third.

Buckeye Stallion Series action resumes Sunday (Aug. 13) when 2-year-old colt pacers take the track at MGM Northfield Park.

Sweeney finished second with Solomon Seal third.

Noble recorded his second win with the colt trotters in the next division. **No Nap Nash** surged ahead at the three-quarter pole and cruised to a five-length victory in 2:02.3 for trainer Miles Wollam. It was the first win of the year for the Creatine colt which is owned by Bob Troyer, Martin Wollam, and Norman Rae Racing.

Dew Me A Solid was second with Flash By finishing third.

The third division for 2-year-old colt trotters went to **Thispete'sonfire** and Ronnie Gillespie. Gillespie took the son of Uncle Peter to the lead and held on down the stretch to win in 2:02.2 for trainer J H Miller. Owned by Powerline Racing Stable, it was the second win in four starts for Thispete'sonfire.

Tom Swifty finished second with Swan Hilluva Rush third.

Tyler Smith and **Bob Da Bomber** went gate-to-wire to win the fourth division for freshman colt trotters. The Long Tom gelding won by two lengths in 2:01.4 for trainer Ty Loy who owns Bob Da Bomber with David Wills, Richard Coad, and Douglas Gregory. Lion Order finished second with Kamala crossing the line third.

Noble's final win in the Buckeye Stallion Series came with **Unbridled Fury** who is trained by his wife Christi. Noble took the Fear The Dragon filly to the front and never looked back, winning by a length in 1:58.4. Unbridled Fury has hit the board

in all four starts, winning two for the ownership group of Michael Cimaglio, William Richardson, and Norman Rae Racing. Hot Shave was second with Western Time third.

In the final division for the freshman filly pacers, **Naked On A Hill** set a new track record for 2-year-old filly pacers winning easily by eight lengths in 1:57. Field established for 2023 Dan Patch Stakes at Harrah's Hoosier Park

For the first time ever, a field of 11 will be sent postward in the \$300,000 Dan Patch Stakes at Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino tonight (Aug. 11). The 30th installment of Indiana's richest harness race will highlight the evening's 15-race program that is set to begin at 6:15 p.m.

Eleven horses will line-up behind the gate for tonight's Dan Patch race as Line Drive Hanover received an invitation from Harrah's Hoosier Park's racing secretary and director of racing, Scott Peine. As stated in the racing conditions, in the event more than 10 horses properly declare for the Dan Patch, the racing secretary may extend an invitation to a horse that was not amongst the 10 highest lifetime money earners that properly declared. The horse that receives the invitation must be nominated and entered into the Dan Patch. The invited horse will not take the place of one of the 10 highest lifetime money earners that properly declare and the race will become an 11-horse field. The connections of Linedrive Hanover accepted the invitation and have drawn post 6 for tonight's event. Trainer Anthony Beaton has enlisted James MacDonald to drive the 5-year-old son of Betting Line.

With combined career purse earnings of nearly \$12 million, the talented field of 11 includes two world champions and four millionaires. The Hoosier State will have a strong contingent of 'hometown favorites' with the likes of Tellmeaboutit, Little Rocket Man and Ponda Warrior all set to line up behind the gate seeking glory on their home track. Little Rocket Man has been installed as the second choice on the morning line at odds of 7-2 from post 8 for trainer Ken Rucker.

North America's leading money-winning trainer, Ron Burke, will look to score his third Dan Patch victory and become the first trainer to score three Dan Patch victories. As the richest horse in the field with over \$3 million in lifetime purse earnings, This Is The Plan will be one of three entrants in the field for Burke and will start from post 3. The world champion will look

to add to his bankroll and secure his first Dan Patch trophy after finishing fourth in the same event last year.

After an impressive score in the \$100,000 Send It In Pace at Scioto Downs last week, Charlie May will play the role of morning line choice at odds of 3-1 from the trailing post 10. With Brett Miller listed to drive, the 5-year-old son of Mcardle—Stipple Hanover will look to score his first Harrah's Hoosier Park victory in just his second start over the surface for trainer Steve Carter.

The 2022 installment of the Dan Patch Stakes has been slated the 13th race on the program with an estimated post time of 10:31 EDT and will be supported by an all-star undercard of racing action.

Racing fans will have the opportunity to participate in three special wagers offered for the Dan Patch card. A \$30,000 guaranteed Late Pick-4 will be offered in races 12-15, a \$30,000 guaranteed Superfecta pool will be available on the Dan Patch Stakes in Race 13 and a \$30,000 guaranteed Hoosier-High 5 pool on the last race of the program will be available as part of the Strategic Wagering Program. Each wager is available through the cooperative efforts of the United States Trotting Association, Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino and the Indiana Standardbred Association. Harrah's Hoosier Park will offer free past performances of the entire card on their website.

The race will be part of a special weekend tagged as "Dan Patch Festival Weekend." As one of the biggest nights on the racing calendar, Harrah's Hoosier Park will showcase some of the most notable names in harness racing alongside specialty wagers, giveaways, and interactive family-friendly entertainment.

The Dan Patch festivities will also include a driver autograph session, family-friendly activities and special giveaways in the winner's circle throughout the evening. The first 300 fans will receive a free, commemorative 30th edition Dan Patch Stakes t-shirt beginning at 5 p.m. Harrah's Hoosier Park will also have

food trucks, live interactive games, carnival games and food along with roaming entertainment to delight racing guests throughout the evening. Pop-country duo Cook and Bell, local fan favorites in the central Indiana area, will also perform a free show on The Yard.

The Dan Patch race has become a tradition that is close to the hearts of Hoosiers. The Dan Patch not only highlights some of the best athletes in the sport of harness racing but is deeply rooted throughout Indiana history. The Dan Patch race was established at Harrah's Hoosier Park in 1994 with Ready To Rumble and driver Trevor Ritchie winning the inaugural edition 25 years ago. The list of all-star horses that have made their way to Harrah's Hoosier Park over the years includes Jenna's Beach Boy, Sweet Lou and world record holder, Bulldog Hanover.

Will the third time be the charm for Tellmeaboutit in the Dan Patch?

When Tellmeaboutit competes in the \$300,000 Dan Patch Stakes tonight (Aug. 11) at Harrah's Hoosier Park, the gelding will attempt to make history as the first locally based competitor to win the Dan Patch in its 30-year history.

"He didn't do as well last year as he did the first year," said Alvin Miller, the horse's conditioner and co-owner. "He was ninth but the year before he was second from the 9-hole. I never thought he had a chance from that post, but he was right there and lost by neck. Let's see how we do this time."

In this year's Dan Patch, Tellmeaboutit, who is co-owned by Twila Harts, will leave from post position 2 with Michael Oosting holding the lines. The 7-year-old is 15-1 on the morning line in the field of 11, which is the first time this contest has included more than 10 entrants.

The son of Tellitlikeitis is also one of a trio of horses who is a Hoosier Park regular including former track record holder Little Rocket Man and Indiana champion Ponda Warrior. Ohio champion Charlie May is the 3-1 favorite.

"It's not an easy race for sure," Miller said. "But he proved he belongs."

He most certainly has.

Tellmeaboutit has earned \$859,805 and has compiled a record of 97-29-25-21. Not bad for a \$25,000 yearling at the 2017 Hoosier Classic Yearling Sale.

"He is from the first crop of Tellitlikeitis so there was that, but I really liked the mare," Miller said. "Whenever I select horses I'm always more attracted to a strong female family and his dam was very strong."

Portia Blue Chip, Tellmeaboutit's dam, is a daughter of Bettor's Delight and a half sibling to world champion Hypnotic Blue Chip (Art Major, \$1.78 million). She made \$80,446 during her racing career but has been a star in the breeding shed. Portia Blue Chip has produced 12 foals 10 of which have won and five progeny that have eclipsed the \$100,000 mark. Tellmeaboutit is her most prolific offspring.

The gelding kicked off his career during his freshman season by banking \$84,500 with a resume of 11-5-2-1. It was as a sophomore, however, Tellmeaboutit began to shine. His record was 16-6-5-5, and he collected his first Indiana championship. He won his second title as a 4-year-old and third as a 6-year-old. He also established his lifetime mark of 1:47.4 over the Anderson oval last year.

"He has always been a sound horse with only the basic maintenance stuff," Miller said. "He still can carry his speed despite being kind of a lazy horse training. He puffs up on the racetrack when he knows it's time to go."

Miller and Harts have also enjoyed success with Midwest standouts Rocket Fuel, who made 198 starts and collected \$784,006 in purse money, and Indiana champion Topville Cadillac. Miller admits he never thought he would have another horse like Rocket Fuel, but Tellmeaboutit comes quite close.

"He's a lot like Rocket Fuel," Miller said. "If you didn't bear down on him training in the morning, he would jog a 20-minute mile. Tellmeaboutit is the same way, and he behaves like Rocket Fuel in so many other ways. They are both very low maintenance horses that are good to be around and when it came time to go on the track, they were ready to go. Topville Cadillac was a bit tough. She was tough to train, tough to get rigged up and just tough. But we've been lucky to have some very nice horses while just sticking around here."

Miller acknowledges the quality of horseflesh Tellmeaboutit is facing Friday evening, but he's confident his horse will acquit himself admirably.

"He maybe doesn't go as hard as he used to every mile, but he still has the speed to be out there," he said. "Also, you never know if you have one that will be good enough to even get into a race like this and when you do have one, you don't know if they will come along again. When you make it in you have to go because you can't win if you are not in."

"Winning the Dan Patch would mean the world to me being here in Indiana. It's your home track, your hometown and a race you dream of winning if you are in this business even if you are not from here. This is a prestigious race."

Miller acknowledges Tellmeaboutit receives plenty of extra attention around the barn, but how much more affection would come his way if he came home first in the Dan Patch?

“Even more than he already has,” Miller said. “That’s for sure.”

The Dan Patch Stakes has long served as Indiana’s richest harness race and is reputed as one of North America’s premier races for older male pacers. Along with a star-studded field, Harrah’s Hoosier Park’s Dan Patch festival weekend will feature guaranteed wagers, handicapping contests, carnival games, food trucks and more. In addition to the family-friendly atmosphere, the first 300 fans in the door will receive a commemorative Dan Patch t-shirt. First post is 6:15 p.m.

Hambletonian Society accepting supplemental yearling nomination payments

This year marks the fifth year in which the Hambletonian Society is accepting supplemental yearling nominations for the races we service that require a yearling nominating payment be made.

This supplemental yearling nomination payment is for those nominators who have missed the regular May 15 payment deadline but are still interested in staking their horses. The amount due for these supplemental payments is five times the May 15 payment for the race in question. For example, the May 15 yearling payment for the Adios is \$10. The supplemental yearling payment would be five times that amount, or \$50, and would be due postmarked to our office by Wednesday (Aug. 16) per USTA rules.

Another year, another successful Clyde Hirt Journalism Workshop

College students from The Ohio State University and Rutgers University visited The Meadowlands Aug. 2-5 for the 21st annual Clyde Hirt Journalism Workshop, presented by the Hambletonian Society in conjunction with the U.S. Harness Writers Association.

Attending the workshop from Ohio State was Madison Kinner, who received a scholarship from the Ohio chapter of USHWA to cover travel expenses (meals, lodging and local transportation are covered by the workshop). Attending from Rutgers were Naaima Abd-Elhameed and Madison Castro.

The focus of the workshop is to enable journalism students to cover the Hambletonian, both writing advance and results stories on deadline, while being mentored by media and industry professionals. The workshop also is an opportunity for students to learn about harness racing. None of this year's students were familiar with the sport prior to arriving at the workshop.

In addition to covering the Hambletonian, students jogged horses at Ray Schnittker's stable in Goshen, NY, and toured the adjacent Harness Racing Museum and Hall of Fame. They also worked with editors at the New York Post and had the opportunity to attend New York Giants' training camp, where they interviewed players Deonte Banks, Tommy Sweeney and Oshane Ximines.

Generous with their time were Lia Eustachewich (workshop graduate; managing editor, news/NY Post), Pat Leonard (NFL columnist/NY Daily News) and Kristin Roberts (education coordinator/Harness Racing Museum).

The students also attended races at The Meadowlands the day before the Hambletonian to prepare to cover the 98th edition of the event. They met with The Meadowlands judges Tom Salerno, Larry Julien and Jim Grow and official timer Joe Joselson, were given a ride in the starter car from starting judge Merle LaFontaine, and toured the paddock.

Stories written by the students were filed to the Boston Globe, Trentonian (N.J.) and Lexington (K.Y.) Herald Leader.

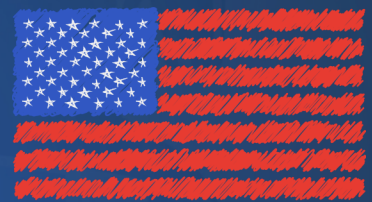
