

### **Harness Racing Update**

The pageantry that is Old Home Week and the beauty of the Island is great, but PEI will forever be in our hearts because it's where our extended family is from.

On that first trip nearly 30 years ago, we met Kevin "Boomer" Gallant and Lloyd MacDonald.

Gallant was the local weatherman on the CBC for nearly 31 years, and for 16 of those years, he was the voice of the Charlottetown Driving Park (CDP).

Dave and I have pretty high standards when it comes to judging race callers, since we know several of the best in the business. To us, Gallant is right there with the top bunch. He also does a mean impression of Elvis.

MacDonald is the eldest son of the PEI MacDonald harness racing dynasty that includes Anthony, Mark, Curtis and James.

When we met Lloyd, he was 10 years into his 15-year run as video production manager at CDP. He also co-hosted Stretch Drive, a local cable network show, with Greg Blanchard.

Our trip to PEI this year was more about seeing Gallant and Lloyd than the Gold Cup.

We booked a place called Silver Heron House in Cornwall through Vrbo (Vacation rentals by owner), less than 20 minutes from the track. We had never booked this way before and were so amazingly happy with how it turned out.

Since our flights were delayed — we had two connections in Ontario — we didn't arrive on PEI until after midnight. We got lost trying to find the house the first time since it was at the end of a private road that we just missed in the dark. Dave was ready to throw in the towel and rent a hotel room for the night — if that was even possible during Old Home Week — but we gave it one last try and found it.

Just like Motel Six, the caretaker Cody MacDonald, no relation to Lloyd, left the light on for us.

I think the TV was tuned to Amazon Prime, so for the first two days all we watched was reruns of Hell's Kitchen until Cody showed us how to work the other remote. I hope the next tenants know how to use the remotes, because we left it on Hell's Kitchen.

We had lunch with Gallant at Pier 15 at Fisherman's Wharf, home of the 60-ft. salad bar, all-you-can-eat mussels and seafood chowder.

We got there too early to take part in the salad bar — which wasn't a bad thing, since people were lined up out the door by the time we left — but Dave did have a two-pound lobster. I'm allergic to seafood, but enjoyed one of the best burgers and potato salad I've ever had at a restaurant.

We also got to have breakfast with Gallant and his significant other, Karen Smith, at the Prince Edward Island Preserve Company. Eating at 9:30 a.m. fit best into their schedule and we told them they should know how much we care about them since we normally don't even get up before 11 a.m.

Rather than go to the Gold Cup Parade on Friday (Aug. 16), which is a holiday so all the children don't have to skip school, we hung out with Lloyd and his daughter, Elizabeth, who we met for the first time when she was a year old. She's now 28 and a registered nurse.

In 2015, Elizabeth was chosen to be a Gold Gup Ambassador. Each horse in the Gold Cup has an Ambassador that is responsible for promoting that horse and the race and increasing engagement/ interest.

"Some people have negative opinions on the role, but I think it's such a great opportunity for people who have the passion for racing but maybe not the investment abilities of an owner or the skills of a trainer or driver, and the age demographic is usually university students, so their studies are often supported by the job," Elizabeth said. "Personally, my professional life is outside of racing, so I felt it was so special to be able to be a part of and contribute to my family's harness racing legacy and it was an honor to momentarily be a part of an industry I care so much about."


Lloyd is a grill master, so he prepared dinner for us on the Sunday after the Gold Cup. Unfortunately, there were only four of us and he had us buy enough food to feed the Island, so his mom and dad got leftovers and groceries.

His mom, Gail, is the long-time track photographer at CDP and his dad, Fred, writes for *Atlantic Post Calls* and is a columnist for *The Guardian* newspaper. Fred recently wrote A Tale of Two Fiddlers, a book about the early days of sports and life in Charlottetown. It's a must-read for anyone interested in the history of sports on PEI and he was gracious enough to give us an autographed copy.

Even though the focus of our trip was more about seeing people than watching racing, I would be remiss in not at least mentioning something about the Gold Cup.

On our flight from Ottawa to Charlottetown, the gentleman in the seat in front of us heard us talking about the Gold Cup. We had not seen the Saturday night (Aug. 10) trials, so he filled us in on who made the final.

I mentioned that I was going to text Jordan Stratton to see if he was coming to drive Covered Bridge.

The response from the guy in front of us was "Is it an act, or is he really that nice?"

I said, "He's really a nice guy. Everything that you saw on the track last year with him interacting with the crowd was totally genuine. It's just who he is."

I think Stratton and Covered Bridge are Islanders at heart and trainer Jeff Gillis agreed.

"I've kind of called [Stratton] a quasi-Canadian," Gillis said. "He's an Ohio boy and he's humble and he's kind and I just can't say enough about him. Jordan is a great ambassador for the sport anywhere and I think PEI has grown to love him and he drove the horse to perfection.

"He's, in my opinion, one of the most underrated drivers out there. He's got a soft set of hands and he's a complete gentleman and a complete professional and a perfect fit for that horse."

As for the Mark Ford-owned Covered Bridge, Gillis said PEI brings out the best in his horse.

"He likes it out here for some reason," Gillis said. "He seems to just enjoy the crowd and the whole experience. My wife [Sarah] commented last year, he won a race at Batavia a week later and he was completely ornery in the winner's circle and just different. But there's something about the crowd and the atmosphere [on PEI that he likes].

"Some of [the horses] stress with the long post parade. You're out there for over 20 minutes from the time they parade until

they go to the gate and it's tough on a lot of horses, nervous types and that, but [Covered Bridge] just seems to soak it all in."

Although mostly raised in Ontario, Gillis is a Maritimer from Nova Scotia's Cape Breton Island.

Someone told me that Cape Breton must have been a ghost town on Saturday night, because they were all in the winner's circle at the Gold Cup to celebrate with Gillis.


In the 14 years that Hall of Fame announcer Ken Warkentin has been doing commentary for the Gold Cup, he's never seen anything like the synergy between Stratton, Covered Bridge and the fans. He referred to it as a "Jordan Stratton thing."

"Last year was the moment of the year when he started doing that," Warkentin said.

In 2022, when Anthony MacDonald won with Sintra, he did drive by the crowd a little bit according to Warkentin, but nothing like what Stratton does.

"Most of them just turn and come back," Warkentin said. "You ask a few questions and go to the winner's circle. But what Jordan Stratton did, no one ever did that.

"I think it's a spontaneous thing that he started doing and he engages the people and he was taken aback by how much these people really appreciate racing and really appreciate him."

I thought about going over to congratulate Stratton on the infield, but he still had such a crowd around him I just sent him a text.

After midnight, when everything died down, we did speak.

"I've always been a fan of the race, like I said, but it doesn't do it any justice from being on TV versus being here," Stratton said. "I remember being that fan in the stands and just wishing a driver would acknowledge me, to say hi or whatever. I would always ask my father, why doesn't anybody say hi or throw me a whip? So, I kind of always remember that."

I will now always remember being there in person to see Stratton interact with the fans on PEI. Props to whoever built the fence around the track just low enough that a driver can give high fives without necessarily getting out of the bike.

Despite the changes that have happened around it since our first visit so long ago, racing at the CDP has remained the same. The track was not just packed because it was Gold Cup night, it was packed every single card leading up to it. And a personal thanks to manager of racing and broadcast at Red Shores, Lee Drake, for taking such good care of us on our visit to the track.



# McGill and Miller partnership paying dividends


At the height of his involvement as an owner, John McGill possessed an equine portfolio that included all or pieces of up to 50 horses. Upon retirement a few years ago, he divested of his racing interests, but recently returned to the game with a much smaller presence. Partnering with Matt Miller on freshman trotting colt Sure Did, the duo find themselves in the thick of the action, recently winning an Indiana Sires Stakes division at Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino.

"I now own half of one," McGill keenly said. "We were in it for about 15 years. At the top we had close to 50. We had good luck with it, but it was a lot of paperwork. We were ready to be done with it."

But the owner was not completely out of the industry. He is a 50-50 partner on roughly a dozen broodmares that he breeds each year and sells yearlings each fall. Despite stepping away

from racing, he jumped back in during the fall of 2022 when talking to Miller.

"I got out of it and then I started hanging around Matt," McGill said of his 25-year-old partner. "But he keeps me on the straight because he only wants one and he doesn't want to spend much. He's a good influence on me. He knows conformation really well. He's grown up in the business, and he does a really nice job picking out a horse. We don't buy the \$40,000 and \$50,000 ones, so we have to try to keep it under \$20,000."

For his part, Miller has a methodical approach to buying yearlings. At age 18 he purchased his first horse, Trump This, who would go on to hit the board in sires stakes competition. He was hooked.

"I like colt trotters, that's my pick," he said. "Every year I go through the sale and look at every colt trotter. I don't like to spend a lot. I mark the ones that I like and just wait for my price range."

The early returns for the partnership have been strong. Miller purchased Flight Number One at the 2022 Hoosier Classic Yearling Sale for \$13,000. The second foal from a CR Commando mare, the trotter won three times in nine freshman attempts, capturing an Indiana Sires Stakes leg and finishing fifth in the Super Final. Flight Number One earned \$85,415 last season, and was sold earlier this year.

Their latest acquisition, Sure Did, has them back in contention in sires stakes after scoring a division Thursday (Aug. 15) with a 1:56.2 effort in the slop at Hoosier Park.

"There were times I would buy 12 yearlings each year, 15 at the high time, and sometimes none of them get to the track," McGill said. "I think a lot of Matthew; he's a good partner. He's fun to be a partner with, and he sure knows how to pick them out. I tell ya, we're high on this colt. We think they haven't seen the last of him yet. He's good-gaited and he's got some speed."

Purchased last fall for \$19,000 at the Hoosier Classic, Sure Did is the full-brother to top Indiana fair winner Sure Do. The You Know You Do filly out of Challax Hanover won Governor's Cup championships at ages 2 and 3, claiming victory in 13 of 18 sophomore starts. She earned over \$112,000 on the racetrack, and it appears her little brother is equally capable. As Miller worked with the gelding this spring, he liked the progress Sure Did made in training,

"I always liked his gait, and he had a great attitude," Miller said. "In April, I trained him in 2:24. I told dad I think this is the best horse I've ever had. It was just how easy he did it. I felt like he had the talent to do it."

Sure Did was sent to Walter Haynes, Jr., who quickly took note of the trotter's ability.

"They trained him down to 2:15 and they sent him to me to finish him off," Haynes said. "We gate schooled him in 2:01, last quarter in 28 seconds before I even qualified him. That's when I told them he's a nice colt, I don't think he's a fair horse."

Sure Did made his debut on the fair circuit at Converse, where he won in gate-to-wire fashion with Haynes at the lines, trotting the mile in 2:09 with a near three-length margin on the field. Two weeks later he would win again, this time in fair action at Hoosier Park. Steered by Haynes, the freshman tripped the timer in 1:58.3.

"I always try to start at least one or two fairs because you don't have to be on the gate if they're scared of it, you don't have to keep up, you don't have to overdo it with them," he said.

In his next four starts, all at Hoosier Park, Sure Did was guided by Jay Cross, who also piloted his sister during her first two seasons. In a pair of Indiana Sires Stakes legs the gelding finished third and fifth, but just as important as the points earned, the young trotter was educated on how to race.

"I just didn't want to make him hot quick, and that's why I put Jay on him too," the conditioner said. "Jay's about like me, he tries to take care of the horse and teach him first. With this horse, it probably wouldn't have been very hard to make him a little crazy by sending him every start. Now he's kind of got it together."

Competing on Fox Stake Day at the Indiana State Fair, Sure Did finished second in the \$42,695 Ralph Wilfong Memorial. Driven

that day by Marvin Luna, the brown gelding trotted home in :26.1 and finished a half-length back of winner Starlitfranknstein. In his last start he broke through to claim his first sires stakes win, edging Ponda Rocky in a \$67,000 division by a half-length. Luna was in the bike for the 1:56.2 score.

"The other night, that was one of his better races," Haynes said. "He actually showed he had some grit to him. He got to hanging a little bit. When he gets beside a horse, he gets a little lost. Marvin told me, 'I got to those horses and he kind of stalled on me. He couldn't see them anymore so he didn't know what to do."

With a little over \$61,000 on his card, Sure Did has hit the board in six of eight seasonal starts, winning three times for the partnership. He is back in Saturday for the fourth round of sires stakes competition, drawing into the second of two \$66,500 splits. Through three rounds, the John Bontrager, Jr.-bred trotter ranks fourth in divisional points, trailing two-time winners Eugene The Genius and Tarzan, as well as Starlitfranknstein. With three legs left before the Super Final, continued strong showings can solidify him as a threat in the October finale.

"I really think he'll be a contender," McGill said. "He's sound and he wants to do his job. We're looking forward to it."

# Clinton Raceway ends memorable 2024 season with two terrific cards

After the season ends on Labor Day, the track is tentatively planning to begin construction on a new grandstand.

Clinton Raceway's 2024 campaign may be deep into the stretch drive, but there's still plenty of horse (and excitement) left ahead of the finish line.

The five-eighth's-mile track will work its small-town magic twice more before rounding out its 15-week season — which has run

every Sunday afternoon (excluding June 2) since May 19 — on Sept. 1.

This year's penultimate program, set for Aug. 25, will feature one of the Ontario harness racing circuit's most unique events in its All Memorial Race Day.

On this day, fans can commemorate the lives of loved ones who have passed with a race named in their honor.

According to Jessica Carnochan, marketing manager at Clinton Raceway, what first began as a part-time offering about 15 years ago has since blossomed into a yearly staple.


"It started with a few races here and there throughout the season — people would want to do a race in memory of someone — and then we kind of thought, 'Why don't we have one day that's solely dedicated to it?" Carnochan said.

Interest and enthusiasm for 2024's edition of All Memorial Race Day certainly hasn't waned per Carnochan, who noted that all 10 races on Sunday's card have already been accounted for.

The list of sponsors, which Clinton's marketing guru said returns familiar faces year-after-year, also contains new signees hoping to honor those closest to them.

Carnochan and her team ensures that each honoree receives a personalized memorial.

"We put a little paragraph about each person in the program, and then a photo of them as well on the tote board," she said.

Past commemorative items have included an engraved halter and a metal Clinton Raceway logo with a plaque attached.


As it became tradition, the impact of a race day devoted to loved ones has stretched far beyond the name on the plaque.

"On this day, the winner's circle is filled with family members and large groups that are there to honor their loved one," said Carnochan. "And the owners, trainers, and drivers are all very happy to be a part of it, and happy to have them all in there with them for photos.

"It's nice to see that full winner's circle and know that they're all there because of somebody who was important to them. They're not always necessarily somebody who was involved in the industry. A lot of them are fans who were always in Clinton and loved coming to the races, and this is how they're honoring them."

The good times at the southwestern Ontario racing venue continue for one final week with the 44th Annual Charity Drivers Challenge on Sept. 1.

Six of Canada's most accomplished reinsmen, along with Clinton's two leading drivers, J Harris and Todd Ratchford, will converge on the Huron County oval to raise money for three local Legion branches (Seaforth, Clinton, and Exeter).



Included in the sixer of superstar drivers is James MacDonald, Travis Henry, Garrett Rooney, Samuel Fillion, Travis Cullen, and defending Charity Drivers Challenge champion Tyler Borth.

The renowned final act to Clinton's 2024 meet exemplifies all that makes the track a special place for even the highest profile of horsepeople.

"Clinton is that community track that is constantly giving back, and we're so happy that these drivers don't think twice about whether they're going to come or not — I think it's in their calendars from the beginning — this is what they do on the last Sunday of our season every year, and we're so lucky to be able to have them come and take part in it," said Carnochan.

"I know the three Legions are super grateful that these very generous drivers do come and donate their fees from the day."

Like local charities, fans in attendance also have an opportunity to earn some extra funds during the drivers' challenge.

Fans who arrive before post time and enter the free Drivers Challenge Challenge will be paired with a driver, and receive a cash payout based on how many points their assigned pilot accumulates throughout the day.

"Every time the driver earns points, the person earns cash," Carnochan said. "They all get paid out at the end of the day. So, even if your driver only gets 45 points, you still get \$45."

# NEW CLINTON GRANDSTAND EXPECTED FOR 2025

Off the track, fans can fuel up at the final barbecue chicken dinner near the current grandstand, which Raceway manager Ian Fleming said is tentatively set to be replaced starting next month.

"We've been working on this for a few years now, but it looks like it's going to take place starting next month," said Fleming. "After monitoring the trends, we knew we needed a grandstand with 400 bucket seats. We currently have a couple hundred bucket seats and a bunch of bench seats.

"It'll be a smaller grandstand, but it will have all bucket seats and be fully accessible, which is the big thing we're excited about."

The renovation was strategically planned to satisfy feedback offered by Clinton's own clientele.

"This is a better fit for the crowds we have," Fleming said. "They want more outdoor patio space, and we're going to expand that. Right now, it's about a foot below track level, so we're going to raise it, expand it, and then have a fully accessible grandstand for patrons and employees."

Fleming believes the new grandstand has the potential to unlock additional revenue streams for the raceway, especially as it relates to purse value.

Alongside contributions from sponsors and donors, including the industry stalwart Hayter family, supplemental income

from specialty events and activities made possible by the new grandstand can go directly into purses.

"We've got some other sponsors now that we are putting strictly into purses," said Fleming. "In the last few years, we've added over \$50,000, and so next year, our goal is \$50,000 for one year.

"With this updated grandstand, we think we can rent it out for some events, and we're going to put that money towards purses. I think the update is going to be good for the horsepeople, too."

Continued support from and for local initiatives such as the Legion branches, high school, and hospital will go a long way in shaping the continued health of a community-centric racetrack like Clinton.

And as Fleming noted, there's a direct correlation between fundraising success and live handle.

"Handle is up 10 per cent on track, and five per cent overall," said Fleming. "What we really noticed, and we've always kind of known this, is when we had a strong group doing the fundraising, we had a very good day.

"The big thing is, if you get a group and they bring a nice following with them, that helps them raise some money, but it helps us too. It makes our crowd a heck of a lot better."

Once the curtain closes on Clinton's latest campaign, Fleming estimates the track will have raised between \$130,000-140,000 for community groups.

As the team at Clinton prepares to put the finishing touches on yet another successful racing season, both Fleming and Carnochan shared their hopes for the final two weekends.

For the former, good weather, a strong turnout, and smiling faces will do the trick.

While the latter wants no different, the days ahead also represent a summation of all the hard work put into a taxing, but more than worthwhile endeavor.

"It's always bittersweet, it really is," said Carnochan. "A lot of time and a lot of effort is put into our season, and I know we only race one day a week, but each day is essentially its own separate event. So, by the end of it, we're a little bit ready to usher in the quieter season.

"But it's also a little sad to see another season go by so quickly — how does 15 weeks fly by? It seems like just last week we were counting down 75 more days to the beginning of the season, and now it's two weeks until the end of this season."

Carnochan is grateful for the special relationship that exists between the racetrack and its devoted racing fans.

"I know our fans love Clinton, which is awesome, because we love them too," she said.







# R Dutchess out to reign in Peaceful Way

After taking her Peaceful Way Stakes elimination with one of the fastest win times ever by a 2-year-old female trotter in Canada — only Special Way, Mission Brief and Manchego have been quicker — R Dutchess will look to duplicate her mother's accomplishment by capturing Saturday's (Aug. 24) \$390,000 final at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

R Dutchess' dam, The Ice Dutchess, won the 2018 Peaceful Way on her way to being named Canada's best 2-year-old female trotter. R Dutchess, by Father Patrick, was The Ice Dutchess' second foal and purchased under the name Shatter Me for \$300,000 by Armitage Farm at the Lexington Selected Sale.

The family includes multiple Grand Circuit winner Ice Attraction as well as Hall of Fame broodmare Southwind Serena, the

mother of the aforementioned Mission Brief and stallion Tactical Landing.

Last week at Mohawk, R Dutchess won her Peaceful Way elim by a neck over Champagne Problems, rallying from fifth at the half and third at three-quarters to score in 1:53.1. Margareta Hanover was third, six lengths back. The clocking equaled the fourth fastest for a 2-year-old female trotter in Canada, trailing only Special Way's 1:52 in 2022, Mission Brief's 1:52.1 in 2014, and Manchego's 1:52.4 in 2017.

R Dutchess, who races for lessee M And L of Delaware, had Jody Jamieson in the sulky for trainer John Butenschoen.

"That was a big mile, and she did it first up a long way," M And L of Delaware's Doug Paul said. "She came her back half in :54 and a piece. John was high on her all winter long. She had some little quirks to get over, but hopefully that's over now and she's ready to do what we think she can do. We're hoping for big things for her, but you know how 2-year-old trotting fillies are.

"She's a big, robust filly; there's a lot to her. She has a lot of talent, she's just green and has to figure it all out. Once she figures it out, she's going to be even better."

R Dutchess has won back-to-back races after opening her career with a second-place finish in a Kindergarten Classic Series division at The Meadowlands, where she missed by a head, and seventh-place finish in a Kentucky Sire Stakes leg at the Red

Mile, where she made a break in the stretch after a four-wide move from the rear of the pack on the last turn.

"She just was coming so fast that she over-trotted herself," Paul said.

In her start prior to the Peaceful Way elims, R Dutchess won a conditioned race in 1:55.3 at the Red Mile.

"She trotted her last three quarters in 1:24 under wraps, so we were pretty confident in making the decision to come up here [to Mohawk] instead of staying down there," Butenschoen said after R Dutchess' Peaceful Way elim victory.

"She showed a lot of talent training down. She's just a little dumb, green, and has too much ability for her own good at the moment. She's still a work in progress, but she's progressing the right way."

R Dutchess is one of two Armitage Farm-owned/M And L of Delaware leased fillies in the Peaceful Way final. The other is R Charm, who finished third in the elimination won by Royal Mission in 1:54.3. Trained by Linda Toscano, R Charm has a win, second and third in five starts this season.

"She's a nice filly," Paul said about the daughter of Propulsion—Jewels In Hock. "She's drawn outside a lot. I think she's better than what she shows. We have high hopes for both of them, but we think Dutchess might end up being a special filly."

R Dutchess will start the Peaceful Way final from post 2 and is the 3-1 second choice on the morning line. Jamieson will return to the sulky for Butenschoen. R Charm and driver Scott Zeron will leave from post 4 and is 10-1.


The morning-line favorite in the Peaceful Way is Champagne Problems, at 8-5. The daughter of Tactical Landing — Miss Caviar, purchased under the name Southwind Cupcake for \$35,000 at the Lexington Selected Sale, has three wins and two seconds in five races this year. Her victories include the New Jersey Sire Stakes championship. Dexter Dunn will drive the filly from post 1 for trainer Nancy Takter.


"I thought [Champagne Problems] was maybe a little susceptible because Dex had to use her twice early and then I came at them hard, but his filly really showed some grit there," R Dutchess' driver Jamieson said after their elim. "She was still trotting at the wire. We were lucky to stick a nose ahead."

Stakes action at Mohawk on Saturday also includes the \$575,000 William Wellwood Memorial for 2-year-old trotters. Tactical Dynasty is the 8-5 morning-line favorite for driver Yannick Gingras and trainer Ron Burke. The son of Tactical Landing—Dynasty won his elimination by five lengths in 1:53.4.

The other elim was won by Emoticon Legacy in 1:56. The son of Walner—Emoticon Hanover is the 5-2 second choice and will leave from post 2 with Louis-Philippe Roy in the sulky for trainer Luc Blais.

# Danger, Hail Broadway steal the Show in Indiana Sire Stakes

Round six of Indiana Sire Stakes for 3-year-old trotting fillies highlighted the Wednesday (Aug. 21) card a Harrah's Hoosier Park with a pair of \$48,500 divisions on the 13-race card. The favorites prevailed in each division as **Danger** destroyed her competitors and **Hail Broadway** put on a show to extend her win-streak to four on the year.

Sent off at 3-5 from the rail in the first division with trainer Robert Taylor doing the driving, Danger delivered with a career best effort to take the first division. Taylor settled the bettor's choice into second early while Black Gold (driven by James Yoder) grabbed early command to lead the field of six to the quarter in :27.3. Danger popped the pocket on the backstretch to take the lead to the half in :56.4 before taking the field to three-quarters in 1:26.1 alone on the engine.

Turning for home, Danger opened up by two-lengths while Black Gold tipped from second keeping a 9-1 upset bid alive late in the lane. Trotting home in :28, Danger held the challenge of

Black Gold at bay, crossing the wire 1¼ lengths in front of Black Gold in 1:54.1. Skyway Paige finished third to round out the trifecta.

Danger has begun her career in style, winning five of six in her 3-year-old rookie campaign with the lone defeat being a runner-up finish in leg five of Indiana Sire Stakes. Bred by Steve Stewart and Chris Beaver, the

Hail Broadway and driver Jordan Ross wouldn't let the bettors down either as they teamed up to get the job done at 1-5, cruising to an easy victory in the second sire stakes division. Leaving from post 5, Ross hustled Hail Broadway to the lead entering the first turn before Agent Of Fortune (Robert Taylor) took charge to her outside through a quarter of :28. Agent Of Fortune cleared on the backstretch before Taylor grabbed in the front-stepping filly to the half in :57.4. Watch Miss Tucky (Brandon Bates) charged first-over into the slow middle-half to move into second on the outside of a boxed-in Hail Broadway while Agent Of Fortune led to three-quarters in 1:27.1.

The sprint for home began at the top of the lane, with Agent Of Fortune leading the charge home as Hail Broadway bumpdrafted the Taylor helmet awaiting the passing lane. As soon as the rail opened up, Hail Broadway powered to the lead within a matter of strides before trotting away by two-lengths on the line with a :27 final quarter to stop the clock in 1:54.3. Agent Of Fortune held for second, Truly Unbelievable (John De Long) rallied for the show spot at 71-1.

Trained by Luis Quevedo, the streaking Hail Broadway has won five of nine thus far in her 3-year-old campaign. John Barnard's homebred daughter of Swan For All—Pray With Me has blossomed at 3 with earnings of \$158,850 on the season following a 2-year-old campaign which saw Hail Broadway bank \$11,245 in 12 starts.

Both sire stakes winning trainers, Taylor and Quevedo, conditioned a pair of winners on the Wednesday card. De Long led all drivers with three wins on the evening.

Dancin Champion (David Miller) defeated favored Nuclear (Dexter Dunn) by a neck with an inside move and :25.4 final quarter mile in 1:50.1 at odds of 21-1. Arson (Scott Zeron) was third in this event for 3-year-old male pacers.

Leaving from post position 5 in the field of six, the son of Sweet Lou—Dancewiththebest, was placed in second right behind Nuclear at the outset. As that rival clicked off fractions of :27.3, :56.1 and 1:24 Miller and Dancin Champion were merely biding their time to make their own bid for victory.

Nuclear proved to be a formidable foe and it took a strong steer from a Hall of Famer to get Dancin Champion to the wire in front.

It was the first win this season and only the second win in Dancin Champion's career. Both of which have come in Lexington. The gelding sports as resume of 19 2-4-2 with \$211,346 in the bank. The final time was a new lifetime mark

Bred by Anvil And Lace Farm, Dancin Champion was purchased for \$90,000 at the 2022 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale by Burke Racing Stable, Knox Services Inc., Weaver Bruscemi and J&T Silva-Purnel & Libby.

He is a half-sibling to the venerable world champion and three-time Ohio champion Dancin Yankee (Yankee Cruiser, \$2.03 million) and Dancin Rebel (Big Bad John, \$215,310). The gelding is a full brother to Dancin Lou (\$991,441) and Dancin Sancho (\$167,984).

Dancin Champion rewarded his supporters with a \$45.28 payout.

Date Night Hanover (Dunn) went on the engine prior to the half-mile marker and cruised home over Pizelle (Andrew McCarthy) in 1:51.2 in the Championship Series event for sophomore filly trotters as the favorite. Allegiant (Zeron) was third.

Demonstrating her affinity for the red clay, the Kentucky champion left from post position five in the field of sixth. Allegiant snatched the lead right off the gate and set the first fraction of :27.4 with Date Night Hanover in fourth.

After the filly took charge, she established splits of :56.3 and 1:24.3 with Allegiant giving chase in second. Pizzelle, who was in third, closed well in the stretch to collect her placing.

Trained by Marcus Melander, Date Night Hanover set a new lifetime best time with her second consecutive victory. The daughter of Chapter Seven—Don't Wait Up was a \$600,000 selection at the 2022 Standardbred Horse Sale for Jeffrey Snyder and ONDA Racing Stable.

Date Night Hanover's record now stands at 22 7-0-5. The filly has amassed \$511,109 in purse money.

Date Night Hanover paid \$2.96 to win and was bred by Hanover Shoe Farms.

# First-round winners repeat in Maryland Sire Stakes

**Ragtime Red** completed a sweep of both her preliminary Maryland Sire Stakes events with a 1:58.1 win in her \$10,000 division for 2-year-old pacing fillies on Wednesday (Aug. 21) at Ocean Downs. The other first-round winners, pacer Lu's Darling and trotter K J The Thirteenth, posted repeat victories as well in their respective events.

With Baby Doll Jordyn and Pawny breaking stride at the start, Ragtime Red and driver Trae Porter had an easy time crossing over from post 6 to secure the early lead over Mygirlmia, who closed off the pocket from the pole. Ragtime Red clicked through splits of :29.1, :59.2 and 1:29.2 before accelerating off the home turn to defeat Mygirlmia by 4½ lengths. Pams For Real was third.

Michael Hall trains Ragtime Red, a Getitoffyourchest-Red High Heels filly with two wins and four second-place finishes in eight starts, for owner/breeder David Banks. As the prohibitive 1-20 favorite, she paid \$2.10 to win.

Jerry Nock's homebred Rusty's For Real—Southern Lulu filly Lu's Darling (\$2.60) won the other split for rookie pacing fillies, rating soft splits of :29.2, 1:00.1 and 1:31.1 in line to Eric Davis before evading late pursuit from Post Jolene by three-quarters-of-a-length in 2:00.2. Post Jolene was demoted to third after interfering with third-place finisher Toys Little Tinker, who was elevated to second, off the turn for home.

The lone event for 2-year-old trotting fillies saw K J The Thirteenth (\$2.80) and trainer/driver John Wagner stroll through fractions of :31,1:03.1 and 1:34.2 before opening a four-length lead at the end of a 2:04.2 mile. Y'all Know Me rallied to narrowly collar Casino Magic for second. Kelsey Wagner and Scott Woogen own the victorious Il Mago-My Kid Sister filly.

Porter and Johnathan Ahle drove three winners apiece on the 12-race card; Russell Foster notched a double.

# Three millionaires entered in \$100,000 Kane Memorial pace at Batavia

The finest group of pacers ever assembled to compete at Batavia Downs will go to post in the \$100,000 Robert J. Kane Memorial Pace on Saturday (Aug. 24). The top-flight field of eight have a combined lifetime earnings of just under \$6.5 million and include millionaires Hellabalou, Covered Bridge and Desperate Man.

Hellabalou (\$1,446,071) won the \$457,000 MGM Borgata final at Yonkers Raceway in April and is coming off a lifetime best 1:48.3 effort at Harrah's Philadelphia on Aug. 4. He is also currently the second richest older male pacer in North America.

Covered Bridge (\$1,344,523) is the defending Kane Memorial Pace champion after winning this race in 1:52 at The Downs last year. He comes into this race — as he did in 2023 — after winning the \$100,000 Gold Cup and Saucer at Red Shores in 1:50.4, making him a two-time champion there as well. Covered Bridge is also the winningest horse in this field with 51 career victories.

Desperate Man (\$1,270,279) was the 2021 \$790,000 North America Cup winner in his lifetime best 1:49.3 at Woodbine Mohawk Park where he defeated Bulldog Hanover, Perfect Sting and Abuckabett Hanover. Earlier this year, he won all four of his legs in the MGM Borgata before finishing third in the \$457,000 final. Since then, he has owned the invitational at Yonkers where he's won his last four starts there, including his last two outings coming into the Kane.

Also in the race is Coaches Corner, who is coming off a 19-win season last year and is currently the highest earning older pacer of either gender in North America (\$435,345). Those earnings were driven by one win and four second place finishes in the MGM Borgata legs and a second-place finish in that final to Hellabalou this spring. He also won the \$250,000 Joe Gerrity Memorial at Saratoga Raceway in a lifetime best-tying 1:49.3 in July.

Rocknroll Runa A has won a total of 20 races and earned just shy of \$500,000 in his two years of racing in North America since being imported from Australia and only three weeks ago, took his lifetime mark of 1:47.3 at The Meadowlands while winning the \$220,000 Sam McKee Memorial pace. He finished seventh in the Kane at Batavia last year, but did win at The Downs in 1:51.2 last September, which was his only Batavia victory in six tries to date.

Buzzsaw Russ is a Hoosier Park invader that has been throwing some very big miles in Indiana. Most recently back-to-back wins in 1:48 and change before finishing second in the \$315,000 Dan Patch at Hoosier in 1:49.2 and second in the \$100,000 #Senditin Invitational that went in 1:48 at Scioto Downs. He did race in the \$300,000 Carl Milstein Memorial at Northfield Park in 2023

and finished third while pacing in 1:49 flat, and that was his only lifetime start over a half mile track.

Natameri comes in off very solid back-to-back wins at Saratoga Raceway and Tioga Downs and took his seasonal mark of 1:49 at Plainridge Park earlier this summer. He is just shy of having a 50 per cent win percentage lifetime as he has won 23 of his 50 career outings.

Typhoon Banner N Strung four-consecutive wins through June and July at Mohegan Sun Pocono and Yonkers and took his lifetime mark of 1:48.4 at Pocono as well this year. Bongiorno is no stranger to Batavia as he won the 2022 edition of the Kane with American Dealer N in 1:50.2, which still stands as the current all-time track pacing record at Batavia Downs.
