Who says you can't go home? Not driver David Miller, who is counting the weeks until he's back in his native Ohio.

"Well, I committed to the season [at The Meadowlands], and I've still got a few horses, not many, but I've got a few horses," said Miller, who thinks the Fall Final Four / FanDuel Championships will be his last night racing regularly in the Garden State.

"My house [in Ohio], I would say it's two-thirds of the way done, and they keep telling me it'll be where I can move into it like late-November. And I was like, 'You know, that'll work out good.' I mean, the stakes are usually over late November.

"I've been talking about going home for the last five years. Two years ago, I bought land, and I had an idea of what I wanted. I wanted a barn-dominium with the barn connected to the house, but I ended up buying in a cul-de-sac, and there were stipulations that I didn't know. So, actually, I'm just building a house. It's a barn-dominium looking house, but there are no stalls attached to it."

Harness Racing Update

As a leading driver in the Buckeye State in the early '90s, Miller received the U.S. Harness Writers Association's Rising Star Award in 1993, the same year he got his first drive at The Meadowlands in a division of the Niatross with Falcons Future. Even though he won that first Big M start, it wasn't until 1999 when he decided to make the move to New Jersey, where he has been a top performer ever since.

According to Miller, back then it was doable to race in Pennsylvania, New Jersey, and on the Grand Circuit.

"Now you throw Kentucky in there for sire stakes, they start in April or May or March or something like that," he said. "I remember Kentucky, I'd be there 10 days, now I'm there for nine months, and it's just too much. That's why as soon as the stakes are over, you see a lot of guys take off because it's a demanding schedule. And, believe it or not, we all get tired of it, you get tired physically and mentally."

At 60, Miller said he is looking for less of a grind and more family time.

"Like I said, I'm not planning on doing [all the traveling] anymore after the end of this year," Miller said. "I've got one more trip to go to Canada [for the Breeders Crown], and that's it."

"Going to Ohio, I basically would just have three tracks to race at, and they're all within range, you know, I wouldn't be having to fly somewhere to drive, or drive six hours to drive a horse. I mean, it would just be a lot easier on me. I would just concentrate on Scioto Downs, Miami Valley, and Dayton. Those tracks are closest to me."

"I talked to my cousin, Brett, because he left [The Meadowlands] and went home and he does that circuit. I think each track races like four days a week, and they're never overlapping; those three tracks never overlap... It's going to be a much easier schedule, and, like you said, I have options [like Northfield, The Red Mile or even Hoosier]."

"But it's not what I'm planning on doing. I'm planning on going there and just basically having a good time, having fun, you know. I'll be with my family; I'll get to see them heaps more. I've got cousins, I've got uncles, my sister lives there, and my daughter, and I'm just ready to slow down, not quit, to slow down."

Thanks to favorable legislation, Ohio racing is in a great condition financially compared to when Miller was last a resident.

"I'm very lucky that I'm able to go home to such a good situation," he said.

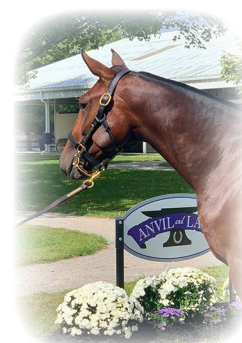

Although not right around the corner, Northfield Park would be less than a three-hour drive, as would Lexington's lucrative Red Mile.

"Oh, from my new place [to The Red Mile], it would be two hours, which is like going to Pocono [now]," he said. "I would be able to do that, but I think it's kind of like out of sight, out of mind. I mean, my one buddy lives there, Carter Pinske, and I know when he'll be in a pinch, he'll be wanting me to come there. But, if I turn a few people down, I'm sure, eventually, they'll just quit calling.

"I would race [in Ohio], and when I don't get drives anymore, which eventually it comes to that, I'll go buy a horse, and I'll train him, and then I'll race him. I mean, I like to fish, I don't hunt, I don't golf, but I love being around horses. I'm pretty simple, you know."

As Miller looks to continue to race, without all the traveling wear and tear, he's closing in on John Campbell's all-time earnings mark of \$299,892,141.

Miller, who currently sits at \$295,967,128, said he is aware that he could pass Campbell sometime this year or next, but he doesn't think much about it.

"It's like wins," he said. "I've got over 14,000 wins, and I'm not going to the track every day and counting down every win I have and how close I'm getting to 15,000.

"When I'm within range [of Campbell], I'm sure it'll be brought up a lot more. And, you know what, I'm very proud of that. I grew up being a huge, huge John Campbell fan, and it's a milestone that I would be very proud of. I talk to John now and again still, and he always tells me, 'Keep winning.' So, he's not rooting against me or anything. He's a good friend of mine now. I mean, we raced with each other for 15-plus years and he's a guy that I idolized all my life."

For a boy who was born with Asthma and would sneeze and wheeze every time he stepped foot in a barn or got near a horse, Miller has come pretty far.

"When I was a kid, I was allergic to horses, hay, dirt, dust, dogs, and cats, you know, everything that I liked I was allergic to," he said. "It was a struggle, especially when I was really young... but as I got older, they said, it'll go away. I don't take any allergy shots or any allergy medicines, but I still take my Advair [Asthma medication], and I have an inhaler in every driving bag that I have.

"That's how much I love [horses]. I love being around them. That's what I love. I've just been drawn to them ever since I can remember."

Although he won't be getting his barn-dominium, he will have some space for his beloved horses.

"So, I'm going to have to build a barn now, maybe in another year or two. It depends on how busy I am; like right now I would have no time for a horse.

"Honestly, I'm kind of glad I wasn't able to put a barn attached to it. I've got six acres and I'm only allowed two horses. That was

another stipulation. I’m allowed to have horses there, but only two, so I won’t have all of my daughter’s horses there... That’s why I’m not even really in a big hurry when I get there to start building the barn, I’m just going to kind of wait and see, because I have a feeling the first horse there would be one of hers.”

The timing for Miller’s move could be viewed as curious since the man in purple, who tied with Luc Ouellette for his first Big M driver title in 2003, just won his second last year.

“I was talking to Yannick [Gingras], a couple of weeks ago, about getting my retirement, and he goes, ‘Well, you can’t touch it for five years, you know?’ and I was like, ‘Dude, I’ll be 61 this year,’ and he goes, ‘I forgot you’re that old,’” Miller said with a laugh.

“People ask me all the time, ‘You’re never coming back to The Meadowlands to drive?’ And I’m like, ‘No. No.’ They were like, ‘What if you got a good horse?’ And I was like, ‘You know, what? He better be 1-9 if I show up there. I’m not going to show up for a horse that’s 15-1.’ I feel like I had my time, I had my chances, and I’m satisfied with it.”

When asked if he’d consider a little traveling if trainer Ron Burke gave him a nice Ohio-bred to drive in some stakes at The Meadowlands, Miller said, “I’m not saying it’s out of the question. Like I said, he better be 1-9 when I show up. When I post parade him, he better be the favorite, that would be the only way. That’s how I went to the North America Cup the first time. It was an Ohio-bred. And, I’m not saying it couldn’t happen or I wouldn’t do it, but it’s not on my bucket list to keep trying to do stuff, I’m satisfied.

The only thing I’m sad about really is Elista Hanover, Ken Hanover, you know, horses that I’m going to give up, because I’m sure them two will race one more year anyways.

“I’ll give you an example. So, Hambo Day, I finished second in the [New Jersey] Sire Stakes final with a 2-year-old trotting filly [Sugar Packet for Blake McIntosh]. And he said, ‘She’s got the Peaceful Way in two weeks in Canada.’ And I was like, ‘I’m not going, Blake, I’m not going to go.’ He says, ‘Okay, no problem.’ And she won the Peaceful Way, and [from home] I watched her do it, and I was like, good for Blake. I was like, good for them. There was not one bit of remorse. So, if ‘Elista’ goes out and wins the International Trot [next year] or goes and wins the Elitlopp, I’ll be rooting for her. I mean, that’s how much I’m ready to go home.”

Canadian Pacing Derby finalist Coaches Corner overachieving for Fought-Carsey partnership

When partners Jeff Fought and Brian Carsey spent \$65,000 to acquire Coaches Corner out of the 2023 Blooded Horse Sale's summer mixed event, they did so hoping for a good conditioned pacer. Saturday (Aug. 29), the 5-year-old gelding, recently minted one of the sport's newest millionaires, squares off against a stellar field in the \$690,000 Canadian Pacing Derby (G1) at Woodbine Mohawk Park. To say he has exceeded expectations is, to put it mildly, an understatement.

"He's been a fun one," Fought said. "I mean, he's an overachiever. He was a no-sale yearling at the Hoosier Classic sale."

Before Fought and Carsey took ownership of the son of Always A Virgin—Caribbean Pacetry, Indiana-based owner/trainer Byron Hooley campaigned the gelding. When the yearling didn't sell at the Hoosier Classic, Hooley bought him privately and raced the pacer at 2 and 3. As a freshman, Coaches Corner managed one win in 12 attempts racing primarily at Harrah's Hoosier Park. He would take his 1:53.1 mark at the Anderson oval, but he missed checks in half of his starts.

Returning at 3, the veteran horseman pointed his charge to the Indiana fair circuit after starting the season at Hoosier Park to mixed results. Coaches Corner would collect 10 wins on the circuit, including the \$25,000 Governor's Cup Championship, before Hooley entered him in the Blooded Horse Sale.

“I called him before the sale and talked to him a couple of times, and he said he's the real deal,” Fought said. “To imagine he would be what he is would be almost impossible. He raced primarily at fairs, and the times that he raced at Hoosier Park, he was competitive but not a superstar.”

The gelding topped the sale, bringing slightly less than he had earned at the time, and the new owners had what they believed were reasonable expectations for the then-sophomore.

“I mean, really, we kind of thought he would fit well at Yonkers, and we figured he could probably run through some conditions there because he fit so well there,” Fought said. “But I figured after he ran through some conditions, he would probably end up being either a mid-level condition horse or maybe even a high-dollar claimer. That's really what we thought going into it.”

Sent to Per Engblom to campaign, Coaches Corner reeled off eight consecutive wins to close out 2023, banking just over \$74,000 for his new connections. What began as a pleasant surprise to close out one season continued throughout the 2024 campaign. At 4, Coaches Corner was not heavily staked, and that

was by design. The pacer managed to add another \$645,000 to his card, winning seven times and hitting the board in 21 of 25 attempts while registering a beaten time of 1:47.4. In the Borgata Series at Yonkers, he managed a leg win and several runner-up finishes, including the \$457,000 final.

“Last year he wasn’t staked to anything, because we obviously thought he was a nice horse, and we thought we’ll do the Borgata,” Fought said. “You can pay into that pretty late. Beyond that, we just weren’t thinking that he would fit into the major stakes. Also, that’s really a hard ask for a 4-year-old anyway. It really worked out well. He won all of his money in invites. Other than the Borgata money, everything he won was invitationals. He just kept doing well in those, and he’d get invited to the next one, and that ended up working out really well.”

Earlier this year, Fought and Carsey mapped out a stakes schedule for Coaches Corner, making him eligible to several events including the Canadian Pacing Derby.

“Brian and I talked on it quite a little bit and then we honestly relied pretty heavily on what Per wanted to do with him,” Fought said. “He’s got a good feel for where he’ll fit and where he wanted to race. We made him eligible to almost all the aged races. Doing that, then you kind of pick your spots from there, which ones you actually want to go to. We’ve gone to most of the things that we staked to this year so far.”

Coaches Corner enters Saturday’s final with three straight runner-up performances to his credit. He cut the mile in the Sam McKee Memorial and clocked a 1:47.4 mile, finishing three-parts-of-a-length behind Captain Luke. Two weeks later, he finished a half-length short to Captain Albano in the Always B Miki invitational at Pocono Downs. Despite missing the winner’s circle, Coaches Corner became a millionaire in defeat. Last weekend, he again cut the mile from post 8, setting the table for Bythemissal’s record 1:46.4 performance.

“They tied the track record, and he raced super,” Fought said. “So, we’re all right. But it’s going to be a lot bigger ask this time, going for all the money. We’re thrilled. We’re just not thrilled with the post, but you can’t control that. And we’ll just see if Jason can work some magic. That’s a tough spot.”

Louis-Philippe Roy piloted Coaches Corner in the elimination, but regular driver Jason Bartlett will steer the gelding in Saturday’s final. Engblom’s charge has again drawn post 8 and is 10-1 on the morning line. A victory tomorrow night might be a tall order for Coaches Corner, but the same could have been said two years ago when projecting the Indiana fair champion had the talent to stand toe-to-toe with the best in the open class.

“To think he was going to be what he is, to be a million-dollar earner, I don’t think anybody really predicted that,” Fought said.

MANE ATTRACTION

A cherished friend lost

Every second we are alive is a second closer to when we will capture our last breath.

For newborns, it may be a century or more away, but for many of us in our (g)olden years, it could be any day, or minute, or second.

I – make that we – lost a treasure a few days ago when my – our – great friend, Tom Merriman, lost his battle with cancer at the age of 85.

Merriman was one of Michigan's proudest – having been foaled in Dearborn in that great state on April 20, 1940 and raised there, as well, leaving a budding past in his wake where he took his footprints to greatness in harness racing with every long stride of life.

His father and two brothers were involved in harness racing, as well, and his legacy in our grand sport began humbly in 1957 at the Marshall County Fair.

His four drives that year netted \$131, but, as he later said, "It was a start" in a sport that he had an unencumbered love for, that only ended with that last breath, a few minutes after one-in-the-morning on Aug. 24.

The year, 1957, was even a year before he had graduated high school – Romulus High, where his athletic prowess was no less than amazing.

In his senior year at Romulus, he was a star quarterback on the football team, guiding his team to a near perfect season.

He was also noted on another type of track as Tom "lettered" in track and field events, specializing in quarter mile events.

Spending summers gathering a "degree" in stable management with his family, years ago, he lamented, "Hey, people go to Harvard and get degrees in law and medicine and stuff like that, and this was my Harvard, learning the trade from the ground up with my family and other horsemen... same Harvard education, just a different vocation.

"I really learned from the day-to-day stuff, but I got lucky when the great trainer Dick Buxton hired me as second trainer for his stable. To me, he was the consummate horseman."

Prominent at Pompano when that track opened in 1964, Tom Merriman was among the top horsemen in South Florida.

"I was rubbing shoulders with [George] Sholty, Chappie [John Chapman], Bruce [Nickells], Loosh [Lucien Fontaine], and so

many others," Merriman said. "It was a great experience down there at Pompano."

In that same year, 1964, Merriman won 63 races – a new high for him – and over \$70,000 in purses, also a record up to that time.

That was the beginning of the greatest era for our sport and 63 wins was enough in earning one's way to the top 100 in driver wins – Merriman being well implanted in the list at 72nd in a tie, ironically with another Pompano early combatant, Billy Pocza, and a couple of others.

"Not many guys got over 100 wins in a season," he said of the accomplishment that only 31 did. "So, I was pretty proud to be on that top 100 list, even with 63 wins."

Over the many subsequent seasons, his circuit was from Florida, in the late fall and winter months, to Michigan, when the chill of the winter finally left its grip up north, where he always had a Ty Cobb batting average in the sulky and as a trainer.

Merriman made a strategic move to move his base to the Yonkers-Rosevelt circuit in the mid-'70s, with his purse earnings soaring to new heights with the move.

Noted horses like Civil Action, Monte Hall, and Energy Burner were just a trio of great horses he handled during his grand career but he always gave credit to the other ones that put him on the roadmap to success, whether it be at Hazel Park, Northville Downs, Wolverine or, outside of Michigan, The Meadows.

Years ago, when Merriman was inducted into the Florida U.S. Harness Writers Association's Hall of Fame, when asked about his key in his enshrinement, he said, "It takes great horses, great luck and great people to help you through the thick and thin of this business.

"Personally, in my case, one person, in particular, has blessed me with the strength to get through it all.

" [In 1964 when Pompano Park opened] I was rubbing shoulders with [George] Sholty, Chappie [John Chapman], Bruce [Nickells], Loosh [Lucien Fontaine], and so many others. It was a great experience down there at Pompano. "

“Hey, people go to Harvard and get degrees in law and medicine and stuff like that, and [the barn] was my Harvard, learning the trade from the ground up with my family and other horsemen... same Harvard education, just a different vocation.”

“That is my life partner, Anne [Schlichtig]. For well over 40 years, she has been *the* reason for any success I may have achieved in this business.

“Through all of my horses – the champions and the overnight stock – she’s been with me every step of the way.”

One of those steps was over 4,000 miles across the ocean – to Italy – with fate playing the role in a move to that great country.

Noted designer Robert Cavalli, the iconic fashion designer and inventor – noted, by the way, for creating the sand-blasted look in jeans – owned horses with Howard Beissinger.

As Beissinger began lessening his rigorous routine, both he and Doug Ackerman recommended these “life partners” to train for Cavalli Stable, known as la Scuderia Degli Dei.

Landing in Montecatini, the most famous of Tuscany’s spa towns, Merriman and Schlichtig, spent 1991 and 1992 racing at 14 different venues with two of their most notable Cavalli pupils being Orata Dei, a winner of the prestigious Coppa d’Allevamento, and Nottare Dei, who was a success in many Grand Premio events.

The pair left Italy with the final days of Merriman’s father approaching, agreeing that this time with his father was more important than any time on the racetrack.

Before he hung up his colors, Merriman helped other trainers develop their future champions, as well.

In recent years, Merriman incurred some serious health situations, and, though we had been close friends over the last 40 years, when both he and I faced our individual health issues a few years back, we really leaned on each other’s shoulders for encouragement and solace.

While his body was weakened and ravaged, his mind was like steel and he remembered his horses like nobody else.

Just last fall at Sunshine Meadows, where he and I had our binoculars and stop-watches always ready to help put on the FSBOA Stakes show, Merriman said, “Great horses are one in a thousand. They are the icing on the cake. The other 999 are the racehorses that keep you and your owners in the business and I tried to take great care of every one of those, as well.

“A couple of examples of that were Patch Patrol, Doberman, and

Tarport Abbey. And it’s horses like that that keep your owners in the business.”

Of course, those were the days when the 2:00 mile was relatively rare.

For Merriman, there were plenty more as time went by.

I asked Merriman about the true highlights of his career and his answer was, “I absolutely loved this business but, in truth, like I said before, the highlight was about 45 years ago – 1977 – when I met what was to be my life partner, Anne. Everything else is a furlong behind.

“That was the luckiest day of my life and really put me on a track to complete success in life.”

As you Mane Attraction readers know, I usually close out with May The Horse Be With You.

But this “Mane” is different.

Since my first writing appeared in the *Horseman and Fair World* on Feb. 4, 1964 – the day Pompano Park opened – I have been very fortunate to have made an incalculable number of friends and have grieved as many have been claimed by their years.

With Merriman’s passing, a few have said, “He’s in a better place!”

I look at it another way: They took away a gentleman that made *our* world a better place.

And how do they know that he is in a better place? Has anyone ever received a postcard, letter, text or phone call from someone now gone? Anyone saying, “Yeah, it’s really great up here.”

It doesn’t matter if it’s the Pope, rabbi, lamas, priest, pastor, minister, bishop, ayatollah, sheik, or swami, they are all beliefs, and we are fortunate enough to live in freedom to believe in this arena.

I – and so many others – are grieving today because *we* have lost one of the great horsemen of our ages – Tom Merriman.

But, as great of a horseman as he was, he was even a greater MAN.

When it came to harness racing, Zach Carroll had no plan B

Zach Carroll will be the first to admit he's not a big believer in fate or destiny, but a life in standardbred racing is exactly where the 25-year-old horseman is meant to be.

"Going through school and high school, you play a lot of sports, and you have other interests, but as far as a career, I never found anything that piqued my interest like the horses did," Carroll said. "I looked at colleges, universities, and stuff like that in and after high school, but I never found anything that was like, 'Yeah, this is what I want to do.' The horses were always number one. I guess I never had a backup plan."

Understanding why a career in harness racing was plan A, B, and C for Carroll is quite simple.

The oldest of four kids grew up in a horse racing family, led by mom Karen – a do-it-all horsewoman who won the 1999 Women's Driver Challenge in PEI representing Ontario – his veterinarian father Dr. Wayne Carroll, and maternal grandfather, trainer Blake Bennett.

While mom and dad suggested he follow his siblings and pursue interests beyond racing, Zach had already inherited a deep bond with the sport.

"I was always interested in horses," Zach said. "I was always around the horses growing up. My grandpa had his own farm with a half-mile track and pretty big barn. My uncle and mom always had a couple horses over there, too; she was still training and driving a few.

"Grandpa's farm is where we'd spend most of our summers. Every morning we'd get in the car, make the trek over, and spend the mornings there while they were jogging and training horses."

Despite their initial reluctance, Zach added that no two people have been more influential in his harness career than mom and dad.

An accomplished horsewoman in the driving, training, breeding, and owning disciplines, Karen's passion for the game was ignited as a youngster, much like her son's, by her father (Blake) and grandfather George Bennett, who bred and raced standardbreds.

Wayne, on the other hand, was the direct opposite.

He didn't grow up in racing, or ever had any involvement for that matter, but went to the University of Guelph to specialize in Equine Medicine.

Yet it was the horses, as Zach recalled, that brought Karen and Wayne together.

"They met when he was the vet at one of the tracks and she was racing," Zach said. "They got married, started their own farm, and have definitely been the biggest influence for me.

"Obviously, mom's worn a lot of hats in this industry from trainer, driver, owner, breeder, and dad as a vet – I don't think he's ever had an owner's license – but I certainly learned most of what I know from those two."

Karen and Wayne established Talbot Creek Farm, a 128-acre property in Shedden, ON, in 1998 – two years before Zach was born.

Those countless hours spent between his family's farms honing his craft and strengthening his connection with the game began materializing into something tangible during his high school years.

"I already had my owner's license and owned a few horses, but around then is when I thought I might like to be a trainer," Zach said.

The wheels on a conditioning career started turning rather quickly for Zach after he acquired his first training pupil, a chestnut trotter named El Diablo Rojo, or "The Red Devil," in English.

Seelster. She was listed for like \$8,000 Canadian. She had just qualified. She was 5 years old up at Rideau [Carleton]. She had raced at 2, 3, and 4 – not a lot – but she had a pretty good pedigree."

Using his breeding knowledge – another invaluable lesson from the Karen and Wayne school of racing – Zach pitched Karen the idea to purchase Amulet Seelster, breed her, and sell her in the 2019 Harrisburg Mixed Sale.

Karen agreed and opted to follow the same route with another mare she co-owned with her son, Glancewithme.

Plans, however, famously change.

"By the time the sale came around, I had grown to like this Amulet Seelster mare, especially her breeding and what her family was doing at the time; mom liked the other mare," Zach

Bought by Karen for \$7,500 at the 2011 Standardbred Canada Yearling Sale at Flamboro, El Diablo Rojo performed admirably for the Carrolls, making nearly \$120,000 across 154 starts (11-12-15).

When the son of Striking Sahbra—Armbro Rosalind's heyday passed, Karen saw a prime learning opportunity for Zach.

"Once he turned 4 and 5, he wasn't quite as great as he was as a 2- and 3-year-old," Zach said. "Mom brought him back and let me train him a little bit. We didn't have a track or anything at mom's farm, but we lived on a gravel road.

"I'd jog him up and down that road and we'd go race him at London [Western Fair], Sarnia [Hiawatha], wherever. That was kind of the start of my training."

The young trainer's time with El Diablo Rojo set the foundation for a full boar charge into the next stage of his career.

"Things really took off after high school," Zach said. "I had found this mare for sale on Standardbred Canada named Amulet

said, adding with a laugh, "They both shipped to Harrisburg, went through the ring and I bought Amulet Seelster and mom bought Glancewithme. It ended up being an expensive trip to Harrisburg for something that probably could have been solved over the kitchen table."

With an effective, albeit admittedly expensive, solution in place, Zach now had a mare in foal to Control The Moment.

"I thought, 'You know what, I'd like to see this one out, break him, train him, and see where it goes,'" said Zach after the birth of his new Control The Moment—Amulet Seelster colt.

That decision, and the exacting process of it all coming together, instantly proved worthwhile.

The colt, a brown pacer by the name of Reign Supreme, became the horse Zach credits as the catalyst for getting his career in the air.

"I still have him today," Zach said. "He's 5 years old now and he was the start of it. He's been so rewarding. He's not the easiest

horse to handle, maybe that's my fault for spoiling him a little bit when he was young.

"He's definitely not a people horse – we get along pretty well – but he's been so gratifying to work with."

Reign Supreme has been a stalwart for Zach, rattling off a 10-12-9 line, including four OSS victories, across 59 starts for north of \$180,000 in prize money.

"To see him from when he was a baby, I was there when he was born, and then seeing the first time we put a halter on him, the first time we put a harness on him – it's just been such a rewarding experience," Zach said. "He had so much success, especially as a 2- and 3-year-old in the Grassroots program, and he's given me the ability to acquire more horses and grow my stable and my name too."

The reliable gelding was at his best yet again in the \$11,000 preferred 2 pace on Monday (Aug. 18) at Grand River Raceway – a time when Zach needed someone to step up.

"We had been having a rough go the last couple of weeks and I raced a couple Friday night at Mohawk that I thought should have won or had a chance to win," he said. "One ended up being third at 3-5 and the other was no good at all.

"Sure enough, he [Reign Supreme] goes out two days later and wins a preferred at Grand River when I really wasn't expecting him to. He always seems to pick us up when we're down."

Brought together by Amulet Seelster, in what some might call a stroke of luck, or even fate, Zach and Reign Supreme are exactly where they belong.

A fitting first chapter for Zach in what is sure to be a long and prosperous career.

"Everyone who is successful in this business are hard workers," Zach said. "You've got to work hard, pay attention to detail, and the biggest one for me is stay out of the horse's way as much as you can."

"Let the horses be horses, help them where you can, but at the end of the day, if you're putting in your work, looking after your horses, they're going to do the rest for you."

Derby time in Denmark

Derby Day in Copenhagen, Denmark is one of the country's most well-attended harness racing events. On Sunday (Aug. 31), 12 trotters will gather behind the car as the \$270,000 Danish Derby for 4-year-olds is scheduled.

Four elimination heats were held at Charlottenlund racetrack on Aug. 13, the distance of those races was 2,500 meters.

In Sunday's final, the distance is 500 meters longer, as usual and it's a really tough test for the relatively fresh trotters racing over 3,000 meters.

The day before, Saturday (Aug. 30), will be highlighted by the 4-year-old females racing in the \$160,000 Derby for mares and probable favorite Kilimanjaro Face (Googoo Gaagaa) has a great chance of capturing her second big win this year.

Adrian Kolgjini's horse was outstanding in the \$160,000 Stosprintern in July and from a perfect 3 post, she can be hard to beat.

Endurance cruises home to make it five in a row at The Red Mile

On Wednesday (Aug. 27) **Endurance** made it look effortless as he stopped the clock in a lifetime best 1:52.3 in the \$80,000 fourth round leg of the Kentucky Championship Series at The Red Mile for his fifth consecutive victory. The 13-race card also included two \$30,000 divisions of the Kentucky Commonwealth Series, and three \$15,000 divisions of the Kentucky Golden Rod Series for freshman male trotters.

Assigned post position 6, Andrew McCarthy and Endurance left the gate in second position in the field of seven and that is where they remained for the majority of the mile. It Could Be Worse (Scott Zeron) took command at the outset and set splits of :28.4, :56.4, and 1:25.3 with the favored Endurance content to follow.

By the three-quarter pole, Endurance was only behind the leader by a nose and from there on it was really about witnessing a talented colt come home in :27. Silverstein (David Miller) closed from fourth with a last quarter panel in :26.4, but Endurance refused to be denied. Neighver Punt (Dexter Dunn) was overtaken by Silverstein in the lane but held for third.

Trained by Chris Beaver, Endurance is a son of Captain Corey—Love Session. He has banked \$193,200 with his only loss in six starts a fourth-place finish in his debut at Oak Grove Racing, Gaming and Hotel in June.

Amanda Stephens

The colt was bred by Steve Stewart and Marti S Ala Seppala. He is the third foal out of his dam, a half sibling to world champions Triumphant Caviar and Centurion ATM, and by far her most prolific, which is ironic considering his price tag.

Super Endurance Stable, Bill Manes, Leo Fleming and Mark Moger signed the check at last year's Standardbred Horse Sale for \$14,000 and sent him to Beaver, who also trained Triumphant Caviar.

Endurance paid \$4.15 to those that wagered on him as the public's top selection.

LETHAL LEGACY UPSETS, ZEPHYR KEMP WINS TWO STRAIGHT

Lethal Legacy and Todd McCarthy captured the first division in 1:54.3 with Be Green (Andy Miller) in second and Gorilla Sighting (Atlee Bender) third across the finish line.

Trained by Carter Pinske, the son of Muscle Hill—Lakewood Lady broke his maiden in his sixth attempt. His record includes two seconds and a third.

The gelding was bred by James Wilhite, Jr. and is a full brother to Kentucky champion Selfie Queen (\$479,882).

He was purchased for \$140,000 by his trainer's stable and Hazy Holdings LLC at last year's Lexington Selected Yearling Sale.

Lethal Legacy has now earned \$39,700 and paid \$25.26 at odds of 11-1.

Favored **Zephyr Kemp** (Dunn) won his second consecutive race in a lifetime best 1:53.4 by a nose over second choice Requiem (David Miller). Express Train (Todd McCarthy) got up for third.

Trained by Marcus Melander, the son of Calgary Games—Southwind Adele improves to 7 3-0-0 and placed \$65,200 in his bank account.

The colt was bred by Kemppi Stables Oy and Suojalampi Stable. All five of Southwind Adele's foals of racing age are winners with three of them breaking the \$100,000 barrier in purse money.

Zephyr Kemp's breeders retained ownership of the horse arranged a new partnership for \$80,000 at last year's Lexington Selected Yearling Sale with PCW Racing, and Sjoblom Racing Inc.

The colt's price at the windows was \$4.44.

DUNN TAKES TWO OF THE GOLDEN ROD DIVISIONS

Caraxes (David Miller, \$6.96) had his picture taken in the first Golden Rod division. Dunn guided **Never Say Die** (\$15.62) and **Jeffrey Neil** (\$7.66) to the wire the following legs.

Dunn had four consecutive wins on the day in races 6, 7, 8, and 9.

UBRUTE RELEGATES BRANDON BLVD TO SECOND

On a sunny Tuesday (Aug. 26) **Ubrute** put an end to Brandon Blvd's undefeated record while breaking his maiden in 1:50.1 in the \$80,000 fourth round leg of the Kentucky Championship Series at The Red Mile. The 14-race card offered two \$30,000 fourth round legs of the Kentucky Commonwealth Series, and three \$15,000 fourth round legs of the Kentucky Golden Rod Series for 2-year-old male pacers.

UBRUTE HANDS BRANDON BLVD HIS FIRST LOSS IN CHAMPIONSHIP SERIES

In Ubrute's case the fourth time was the charm. Steered by Yannick Gingras, the son of Tall Dark Stranger—Warrawee Ubeaut kept to the task and defeated the favored Brandon Blvd (Tim Tetrick) for the first occasion in their brief careers. Funky Buddha (Todd McCarthy) was third.

Away from post position 4 in the field of seven, Ubrute snatched the pocket spot right off the gate as Brandon Blvd went straight to the top from post position 5. Brandon Blvd led the juvenile pacers through splits of :28.1, :56.3 and 1:24.2 before Gingras simply moved his horse in the drive to the wire to go by with a last panel in :25.3 to Brandon Blvd's :26.1. Funky Buddha closed from fourth but was no match for the top two.

Trained by Ron Burke, Ubrute has been steadily improving since breaking stride in his first pari-mutuel start in this series last month. The colt sports of a resume of 4 1-1-1 and has earned \$69,600.

Owned by his trainer, Weaver Brussemi, Hatfield Stables, and Phillip Collura, Ubrute is the first foal from a Dan Patch Award winner that still holds shares the world record over the Lexington oval (1:48.3) with Looksgoodinloulou for a 2-year-old pacing filly.

The colt fetched \$150,000 at last year's Lexington Selected Yearling Sale and was bred by Burke Racing Stable, Crawford

Farms Racing, J&T Silva—Purnel & Libby, and Phillip Collura. Those that wagered on Ubrute collected \$8.28 at the windows on the second selection.

THIAGO HANOVER, DRINK TO THAT TRIUMPH

Gingras guided **Thiago Hanover** gate-to-wire in the first division in 1:50.4 for Burke. Downbythelakeside (Todd McCarthy) was second, and favorite Captain Apple (Dexter Dunn) was third.

It was Thiago Hanover's third consecutive win, and he stopped the clock in a lifetime best. The son of Tall Dark Stranger—Trillions Hanover was bred by Hanover Shoe Farms.

The gelding is the mare's first foal and went through the ring for \$115,000 at the 2024 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale to his trainer, Larry Karr, Knox Services Inc. and Beasty LLC.

Thiago Hanover is now 7 3-1-2 and has banked \$46,600.

He paid \$5.52 to win.

Scott Zeron and **Drink To That** won by a neck in 1:51.2 over Kountry Blue (David Miller). Dunn and Show Me Your Ace were third.

It was the first win in five starts for the son of Tall Dark Stranger—Tall Drink Hanover. His bankroll now sits at \$26,100.

Trained by Tony Alagna, Drink To That is the second foal out of a world champion and O'Brien Award winner, conditioned by the same individual.

Bred by his trainer's racing stable, Marvin Katz and Riverview Racing, the colt left last year's Lexington Selected Yearling Sale with owners Riverview Racing, Steven Head, Pryde & Alagna Stable and Caviart Farm after they signed the check for \$47,000.

A win ticket on the fifth choice in the field of seven paid \$13.16.

BENNY B HILL KICKS OFF GOLDEN ROD WINNERS

Out of Breeders Crown winner Peaky Sneaky, **Benny B Hill** and David Miller won by a nose in 1:53.2 in the first division of the Golden Rod as the favorite (\$4.30). **Sea Bistro Hanover** (Todd McCarthy, \$25.12) and **Down The Line** (Tetrick, \$18.52) were best in the other two divisions.

Racing will continue through Sunday (Oct. 5), following a Sunday through Wednesday schedule. Fans and horsemen can look forward to 5:05 p.m. post times on Sundays, and 1 p.m. post times on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Wednesdays throughout the meet.

Sippinonsearoc (Yannick Gingras), a \$77,000 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale purchase, showed his class in the \$100,000 Sires Stakes, and won impressively.

Downbythewater (Chris Lems) was aggressively driven and defended the pylon position when the field entered the first turn.

As the field paced through the backstretch, Downbythewater held the lead, but pressure mounted in the form of a parked-out Swingtown (Ronnie Wrenn, Jr.) and a second-over Sippinonsearoc.

Swingtown powered to the lead, but Sippinonsearoc drove on and made the front entering the far turn for the first time. They hit the opening quarter in :27.3.

Gingras smartly rated the second quarter and Sippinonsearoc reached the half in a leisurely :56.

Entering the backstretch, Ohohoh Im On Fire (Austin Hanners) tipped outside first-over, with Rick Wink in tow, but he began to back pedal as they approached the three-quarters.

Sippinonsearoc led his rivals to the three-quarters in a demanding 1:23.4. With an eighth-of-a-mile to race, Swingtown took a swing at the leader and vacated the pocket.

Sippinonsearoc's lead was never in doubt and the Downbytheseaside colt needed no urging through the stretch to win by two lengths in 1:50.4.

The Ron Burke trainee now has career earnings of \$770,900 with 10 victories in 21 starts. He is owned by Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Bruscelli, R A S Racing and Knox Services.

Sharp Seven was on point in NYSS at Batavia

The New York Sire Stakes visited Batavia Downs on Wednesday (Aug. 27) night with nine 2-year-old trotting fillies competing for a \$112,100 purse and the heavily favored **Sharp Seven** (Chapter Seven—Lookin’ Sharp) cut to the chase for her victory in the featured event.

Jeff Gregory settled Sharp Seven in fourth as Storybook Love (Todd Ratchford) set early fractions of :28.4 and :59.2. As the race passed the stands, Gregory tipped Sharp Seven and incrementally made their way towards the leader, eventually drawing to within a length at three-quarters. Storybook Love maintained her advantage around the final turn but when they straightened for home, Sharp Seven found open ground in the

middle of the race track and trotted home under a line drive to win by 1½ lengths in 1:59.

On the strength of her third win of the year, Sharp Seven (\$2.30) went over \$200,000 lifetime, now showing \$205,250 on her card for owner Purple Haze Stable and trainer George Ducharme.

There were also two \$20,000 Excelsior Series races on the program.

The first was won by **Makeittohell** (Chapter Seven—Alana’s Brilliance, 2:02, \$2.60) for driver Tyler Buter, trainer Ducharme and owner FTM Racing Stable.

The second went to **R Ro** (Chapter Seven—Barn Girl, 2:02.2, \$14) for Buter, John Butenschoen and owner M And L De/Armitage Farm.

This was the final stop for preliminary legs of the NYSS at Batavia Downs. However, the best of the best from all eight divisions will be back at The Downs on Saturday (Sept. 6) for the \$2.4 million Night of Champions finals.

Live racing resumes at Batavia Downs tonight (Aug. 29) with post time at 6 p.m.

Freshman fillies on display at Ocean Downs

The spotlight was on Maryland's promising 2-year-old fillies Wednesday (Aug. 27) evening at Ocean Downs, as pacers and trotters competed in the second leg of the Maryland Sire Stakes Preliminary Series. With purses of \$10,000 per division, the action-packed card produced decisive winners who stamped their names as major contenders heading into next week's \$95,000 finals.

In the opening division for pacing fillies, **More Than Better** (Tony Morgan, driving for trainer Herman Hagerman) lived up to her billing as the heavy favorite. The daughter of More The Better N—Aristobrat Hanover controlled the tempo after making the lead past the quarter and never looked back, crossing the wire in 2:00.1. Owned by Hagerman Racing of Ohio, More Than Better finished three lengths clear of Areta (Russell Foster/Clifton Green), with Pamfin (Roger Plante, Jr./Steve Le Blanc) rounding out the trifecta.

The evening's trotting division was nothing short of dominant, as **And Just Like That** (Johnathan Ahle up for trainer/owner/breeder Richard Hans) obliterated her rivals with a 20-length score in 2:02. The filly by Betting Gangster S—Gooreatness sat patiently before making her move past the three-quarter pole, then drew off with authority. Casino Star (Plante, Jr./Le Blanc) finished a distant second, with Sister Mago (Jared Moyer/Ronald Millman) collecting the show spot.

The second division for pacing fillies saw a thrilling stretch duel, ultimately captured by **That'sloveto** (Corey Callahan/Dominik Miga). The daughter of Dapper Dude—I Cant Stoplovinu fought off the late bid of longshot I'm Feeling Spicy (Eric Davis/Kasey Bendix) to prevail in 1:59.2, with I Say That Too (Braden/McLenaghan) finishing a close third. The Maryland sired filly is both bred and owned by Miga.

With two preliminary legs complete, all eyes now turn to the Maryland Sire Stakes finals, to be contested next week (Sept. 3) at Ocean Downs. The top eight point earners in each division will line up behind the starting gate, with lucrative purses and state bragging rights on the line.

Michigan Sire Stakes finals held at Northville Downs at Barry Expo Center

Northville Downs at Barry Expo Center in Hastings, MI, held the Michigan Sire Stakes finals on Wednesday afternoon (Aug. 27) and they did not disappoint.

Eight races of the 11 programmed featured the Sire Stakes finals with purses of all 11 races totaling \$731,240 (\$30,000 of which was from the first three undercard races).

In the \$87,450 2-year-old filly trot final, the Samuel Eicher owned **Westwinds Yahtzee** (Celebrity Pegasus—Keep the Cash) got the victory and lowered the track record for 2-year-old filly trotters by two and two-fifths seconds, trotting the mile in 2:01.4 and winning by seven lengths for trainer/driver Lewayne Miller. Westwinds Yahtzee is now five-for-six lifetime.

The \$86,730 2-year-old colt trot was won easily by 15 lengths by **Powerful Ending** (Musical Rhythm—Powerful Mission) who is owned by ECS Racing, LLC, trained by Kevin St. Charles and driven to victory by John Moody. Powerful Ending lowered his previous track record by three seconds to 2:03 and is now four-for-nine lifetime.

Race 6 was the 2-year-old filly pace for a purse of \$88,890. It was captured by Rockylanés owned **Lady Victorious** (Captain Victorious—Arts Meme) who won by 19¾ lengths while dropping her track record from 2:03 to 1:56.4. Lady Victorious is trained and driven by Lewayne Miller and the filly is now six-for-seven lifetime.

The \$91,050 2-year-old colt pace was taken by **Believeincaptain** (Captain Victorious—Believeincarré), who is now a perfect eight-for-eight in his young career. Believeincaptain won by two lengths in a time of 1:58 which lowered his previous track record by one second. The undefeated colt is owned by Oldford

Racing, LLC and Allen Sisco Stable, LLC and is trained by Allen Sisco and driven to victory by Kody Massey.

In race 8, the \$81,760 3-year-old filly trot was won by **Westwinds Pegasus** (Celebrity Pegasus—Keep the Cash), who is a full older sister to the earlier winner Westwinds Yahtzee, and is owned by Lewayne Miller and Platinum Stables. Westwinds Pegasus won by 9½ lengths in a time of 1:59.2 which lowered her previous track record from 2:02.4 which she set on Aug. 19. Westwinds Pegasus is now eight-for-11 lifetime with five of those eight wins coming in 2025. She is trained and driven by the aforementioned Lewayne Miller.

The 3-year-old colt trot, for a purse of \$82,480, was captured by **Chip Of The South** (Bourbon Chip—Belle of the South) for owners Teresa Marotta, Rick Dobson and Melissa Kesler, trainer Monica Krist and driver Rick Dobson. This was one race where the top two horses battled from the half all the way to the finish as early leader New Plan Stan (Greg Bateson) was eventually grinded down by Chip Of The South in the stretch. Last week in the elimination, the pair of trotters finished in a dead heat for the win and until they got to the finish line, it appeared they may be headed for a second dead heat. Chip Of The South won by a length in a time of 2:01.2 which lowered the previous track record from 2:08.2 set by Chip of the South, New Plan Stan and JM Rigs the previous week.

The richest division was the 3-year-old filly pace with a purse of \$100,400 and was scratched down to a field of six. **Taylor Dawn** (Bondi Hanover—I'll Deal A Queen) went coast-to-coast for driver Brad Kramer, trainer Paul Cloer, Jr., and owner Gregory Gardner to win by a length-and-a-half in a time of 2:01.2. It was Taylor Dawn's sixth with on the year in her sixth start of her '25 campaign. Lifetime, she is now nine-for-14 and her winning time established the new track record for a 3-year-old pacing filly.

Finally, the 3-year-old colt pace with a purse of \$82,480 was won by a 4½-length margin by **Hardt Of A King** (Manhardt—Earhart Hanover) in a new track record time of 1:59.4 which lowered his previous record by a full second. Hardt Of A King is owned and trained by Kelly Goodwin and driven by Brad Kramer. The win was the seventh on the year out of eight starts and Hardt Of A King is now 11-for-19 lifetime.

Driver Lewayne Miller led all others with three wins on the afternoon while Kody Massey, John Moody, and Brad Kramer each had two. Lewayne Miller also led all trainers on the day with three wins, while Allen Sisco was next best with two.

Racing at Northville Downs at Barry Expo Center in Hastings, MI, returns next Tuesday (Sept. 2) and Wednesday (Sept. 3) with a first race post time of 1 p.m. each day.



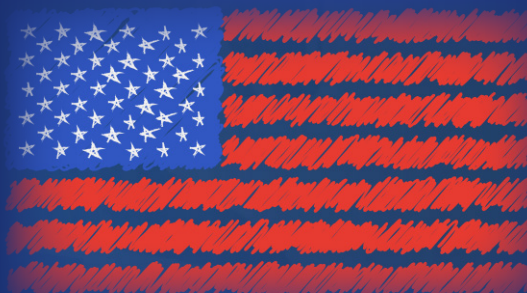

MGM Yonkers International Trot field swells to eight

The field for the \$1,000,000 MGM Yonkers International Trot is almost complete after a handful of invitations were accepted this week for the Sept. 13 event at MGM Yonkers Raceway. Six nations are now represented in the international affair that will bring together drivers, trainers and horses from all over Europe and North America.

Already announced for the MGM Yonkers International Trot were Hohneck (France), Gio Cash (Germany), and Double Deceiver (United States but racing in Sweden). They will be joined by Aetos Kronos S (Sweden but racing in the U.S.), Diva EK (Italy), Gamin Jaba (France), Ideal Lignerries (France) and Powwow (Norway).

Despite competing mostly in Europe, Aetos Kronos S is very familiar to those in North America who have watched him excel here as a 9-year-old this year for owners Jeffrey and Michael Snyder. The son of Bold Eagle has won six of nine starts in 2025 and recently recorded a 1:49.4 victory in the elimination round for the Maple Leaf Trot, establishing a new mark as the fastest trotter ever on Canadian soil.

Marcus Melander trains Aetos Kronos S, a career winner of \$1.5 million who will seek to increase that total dramatically in Saturday's \$630,000 Maple Leaf Trot final at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Diva EK is a daughter of North American-based stallion Trixton and comes to the MGM Yonkers International Trot by way of Italy for trainer Alessandro Gocciadoro and owners Antonio Nucera and Effebi Srl. The 6-year-old owns a stellar record of 20 wins in 40 career starts and was a G1 winner back on May 12 in the Menhammar Copenhagen Cup.

Gamin Jaba is the second of the entrants from the barn of trainer Daniel Reden, joining the previously announced Double Deceiver in the field. A 9-year-old with \$661,745 in earnings, he has 21 career wins in 81 starts despite scoring just one victory in seven tries this year.

Another French entrant is Ideal Lignerries. Winless in eight starts this year, the 7-year-old has finished second three times, including in the G II Criterium De Vitesse De Basse-Normandie on Aug. 9 (Hohneck won) and G II Grand Prix Du Department Des Alpes on Aug. 23 (Hohneck was sixth) for trainer/driver Jean-Phillippe Monclin. For his career Ideal Lignerries has won eight times in 59 starts and earned \$879,455.

Bringing youth to the field is Powwow for trainer Jan Kristian Whaalder. The 5-year-old from Norway is a son of 2015 MGM

Yonkers International Trot winner Papagayo E. He recently was a fast-closing third after a ground-saving trip in the \$300,000 Margareta Wallenius-Klebergs Pokal exclusively for his age group at Solvalla at 2,140 meters. Owned by Tom Andersen, Powwow sports a 15 2-5-3 career record.

The eight horses above will be joined by two more trotters originating from either the U.S. or Canada and that announcement will occur prior to the draw on Monday (Sept. 8).

The \$1,000,000 MGM Yonkers International Trot will be part of a huge card on Sept. 13 that also includes the \$200,000 MGM Aria Invitational Pace and \$200,000 Robert Miecuna Invitational Trot. Post time is set for noon (EDT) and the Empire Terrace dining room will be open for a buffet lunch.

MGM Yonkers Raceway is currently operating on a Monday-Tuesday and Thursday through Saturday live racing schedule with post time each night at 6:45 p.m. (EDT). Exceptions to that schedule include the addition of live racing on Wednesdays, Sept. 3 and 10. There will be no live racing on Friday (Sept. 12).

Lauren Tritton first female driver to win three at Big M

The Meadowlands has been around for a half-century, so one would think that just about everything that can happen at a racetrack already has.

But last Saturday (Aug. 23), something special took place when Lauren Tritton became the first female driver in the history of the mile oval to win three races on a Big M card.

"That's pretty cool," said Tritton, whose husband Shane trained all of the horses that Lauren piloted to victory. "It's actually mind-blowing that a woman, in all of those years, hasn't done that. I'm pretty proud of myself, to be honest."

To Lauren, having a big night in the sulky isn't something new. When she and Shane were back home in Australia, they, at one point, had 93 horses in their stable, and Lauren was the driver in the family.

"I drove on the Grand Circuit when I was 17," said Lauren, 31. "I've been doing it since I was young."

Before coming to the States just as COVID-19 was shutting down the world, Lauren had much on her resume to brag about. She once won seven races on a card at Australia's Newcastle Harness Racing Club track and on 28 occasions had won four or more races on a single program.

But that part of her career – despite her sensational Saturday – is behind her now.

"Back home, I just drove," said Lauren. "I came over here with the mindset that I was going to hang the boots up and focus on training. With two kids [Levi, 8, and Emily, 4], I made a deal that I would be more present for them, that I would pack that career away and focus more on training and I was happy to do that.

"I committed myself fully 100 per cent back home to driving and I'm the sort of person that I have to commit myself to something 100 per cent or else I won't do it, and I feel like I wouldn't be able to do my best work here without committing myself, and if I commit myself, I'd be pulling myself away from my family, and my family is very important to me."

All three of Lauren's winners went off at odds of 4-1 or greater. These were her impressions:

• **Rydingtothewire** (1st race, mile time 1:52, paid \$15.80 to win) – "I was told he had a really quick turn of foot. We made a couple of equipment changes and I was pretty confident, actually. I thought he was the best bet of the night, but no one asked me about him."

• **Springsteen** (6th, 1:51.2, \$10.40) – "We call him Bruce. I think he wins once a year just to make himself known in the stable so he can stay for another year. He's a pet of mine. He shocked us the other night with the way he won. He will not pass a horse on the outside but will go up the inside every week."

• **Hypebeast** (12th, 1:51.2, \$16.60) – "He was a sneaky one. He had a perfect run. He didn't have to pull out until halfway down the stretch."

Lauren came close to winning four for a 29th time, but Nandolo N came up just short at odds of 11-1 in the fourth race.

"It was cool to crack the million-dollar earnings mark with him," said Lauren. "He's getting older now and he's not as sharp as what he was but I really enjoy driving him. I think if he had gotten out earlier, he would have won on Saturday."

So, after that big night, we're talking about Lauren Tritton returning to catch-driving, right?

"No, we are not!" said Lauren, both emphatically and playfully. "And there's no convincing me otherwise. I have devoted myself to my family and my business. I just feel like I've already done the things I wanted to do as a driver."

Well, she did manage to do one more thing last week.

Make history.
