Few harness racing comebacks have been on as high a level as that of Alrajah One IT (6,1:50.3f; \$1,512,122). With no starts this year, the 7-year-old stallion will make his seasonal debut in the \$530,000 Maple Leaf Trot final on Saturday night (Sept. 2). No eliminations were required, so the Åke Svanstedt trainee will go straight behind the Woodbine Mohawk Park starting gate alongside seven other top aged trotters. Dexter Dunn will drive.

The Italian-bred trotter will come to Campbellville, ON for the very race in which he was scratched as morning line favorite last year. He has qualified twice this summer with trainer Svanstedt in the sulky. On July 22 at The Meadowlands, Alrajah One IT followed Maple Leaf Trot rival Venerate around the track, finishing second in a personal 1:52.2 mile. On Aug. 9 at Pocono, he opened up on three other trotters to win in the same clocking, but by 21-and-a-half lengths.

On Wednesday (Aug. 30), Sarah Svanstedt told HRU Alrajah One IT would be traveling directly to Canada and back for the big race, rather than stabling at an Ontario training center.

"We are still home [at Legend Farm, Wrightstown, NJ]," she said. "It's [been] a long year since he raced. He actually got scratched out of the same race, when he got injured. He had a long time to heal, and then he was doing his breeding season up until the end of May... He's going up Friday and then he goes back home again, so it's just a quick visit to Canada and then back home to his bed."

Alrajah One IT is the 2-1 morning line favorite in the 2023 Maple Leaf Trot, with stablemate Asteroid (5, Q1:54.1f; \$240,588) a relative longshot at 10-1.

Sarah reported that the speedy son of Maharajah—Mariu (by Varenne) had recaptured the form he showed in his three sub-1:51 North American victories last season.

"Yes, he's back to where he was, and of course he's in great shape now, for the two qualifiers," Sarah said. "We're very pleased with the way he's looking and, bottom line, he's a champion, so it's not that hard to bring those horses back, as [compared to] maybe other horses. Everything looks good, and he's happy and sound, so we're very excited to have him back in the real racing again."

The 2023 Maple Leaf Trot final will be the stallion's first Canadian start. He will encounter 2020 Dan Patch 2-Year-Old Trotting Colt of the Year Venerate (5, 1:50.1m; \$1,113,245), winner of the inaugural Mohawk Million; and world champion It's Academic (5, 1:50.1m; \$1,826,096), who was fourth-placed-third in the 2022 Breeders Crown Open Trot at WMP.

"[Alrajah One IT is] ready to go, but he's facing two great horses," Sarah said. "Venerate and It's Academic are two great horses, so it's not an easy field to face for the first time in a real race after a year. Is he going to be a winner right away? I can't answer that one, but he's ready to race at least, so let's see how far that can take him."

She added that Alrajah One IT began his breeding career earlier this year under the supervision of Dr. Richard Meirs at Walnridge Farm in Cream Ridge, NJ.

"I think it was 21 [mares] here in the United States, but then he had a big number in Europe for the frozen semen... He was training when he was done with the breeding. He started back in May."

Beyond his record on the racetrack, the stallion brought a relatively-uncommon pedigree to the marketplace.

"They [breeders] looked for the outcross, and they found a perfect one right here," said Sarah.

Returning to racing was a gradual process.

"He was in the paddock only for over six months," she said. "He had a suspensory issue. So everything has been taken step by step to train him back, but he's pretty easygoing and a very athletic horse himself, so he's pretty easy to manage."

Sarah said she and husband Åke both sat behind the trotter to get him ready to race again.

"We kind of go 50/50 with him," Sarah said. "It's a hundred horses on the farm here, so it just depends... He's a very nice horse to drive, a very uncomplicated horse."

Ownership group Scuderia My Horse Inc. of Delray Beach, FL opted to keep Alrajah One IT in training, despite his impressive, if short, 2022 resume. He went undefeated in three U.S. starts: the Crawford Farms Trot at The Meadowlands; the Spirit of Massachusetts Trot at Plainridge Park, in which he set a 1:50.3 track record; and the John Cashman Memorial at The Meadowlands.

Trained by Claus Hollmann and later Alessandro Gocciadoro in Europe, Alrajah One IT had captured the Group I Italian Derby (2019), Gran Premio d'Europa (2020), Gran Premio Continentale (2020), and Gran Premio Freccia d'Europa (2021) prior to export.

"I think we have to start to see how he gets back this year, and go on from there, but I know that the owners love to race," Sarah said. "That was one of the reasons why they didn't retire him with the injury, so I'm happy for them that they took the chance to bring him back, because you never know when they have injuries if it's going to last or not. So let's just take one step at a time."

Looking ahead, she said hopes were high for a strong late season from the imported Italian stallion.

"We have Red Mile, and Breeders Crown, of course, is the main goal for him," she said. "So, we'll start with this race [Maple Leaf Trot] and see where the next one is. He still has a couple of races in Hoosier, Red Mile and Breeders Crown for sure."

Not the MGM Yonkers International Trot?

"Well, you know, if they call and they want him, I'm not the one who's saying 'no', you know what I mean?" she said with a laugh. "They still have one spot available, I think. I'm not sure. From what I calculated, I think there's still one available, so it's a great race to be part of, but you need to have the invitation, of course."

Preparations complete, the rest is up to Dunn and Alrajah One IT Saturday night at Mohawk.

"I'm very excited to see him again, up against great horses," said Sarah, adding that a 2023 Maple Leaf Trot win would be especially meaningful, under the circumstances. "He's facing a great field, but in the qualifiers, he did everything we asked for. It's a nightmare for everyone involved when a good horse gets injured. It's heartbreaking when you find those things. A year has gone fast. We talked about it the other day: It's a year since we had to do this [scratch] and now he's back."

Woodbine Mohawk Park will be unavailable for training on Saturdays during September. Training will be available on Tuesdays and Wednesdays, from 7 a.m. until noon. Qualifiers will remain on Fridays at 9:30 a.m.

Post time has been changed to 5:35 p.m. for Sept. 19 and 21, as the RCMP Musical Ride will perform at the track.





Electric fillies Geocentric and Lyons Legend to meet for first time

And driver Tim Tetrick has the good fortune to choose between them.

In a weekend loaded with marquee matchups across the board, perhaps the most highly anticipated of them all will come when something has to give between untouched and unbeaten 2-year-old filly pacers Geocentric and Lyons Legend in a \$252,000 PA Sire Stake at Pocono Downs on Saturday (Sept. 2).

With a mark of 1:49.4 taken three races ago at Red Mile, Geocentric (Sweet Lou) is currently the sport's fastest 2-year-old, including 2-year-old males. Between her most recent three wins coming in Kentucky Sire Stakes Championship Series competition and her wins in the first two preliminary PA Sire Stake legs in July to begin her career, she sports a perfect five-for-five record. Geocentric is trained by Brian Brown, and has been driven in all her career races by Hall of Famer Tim Tetrick.

Not to be outdone, bringing an equally-powerful resume is that of Lyons Legend (Stay Hungry). Trained by Jim King, she comes off an all-time track record at The Meadows with her 1:50.3 win taken just one week ago. In that race, she took her time working to the lead right by the finish line for the first time, continued on through honest fractions, and found another gear in the stretch to win impressively and in that process swept all four PA Sire Stake preliminary legs. With the exception of one PA All-Stars race, she too, has been driven in all other career starts by Tim Tetrick.

Depending on how you look at it, Tetrick had the enviable or unenviable task of having to pick between the unbeaten fillies for Saturday's Sire Stake final. He chose Geocentric.

With many things that could have been considered such as performances and ties to the respective trainers for each horse, for Tetrick, it really came down to mostly one factor.

"For the most part, I think they're very similar," Tetrick said. "They both have so much speed; they have the whole package. But mainly, it kind of comes down to the staking on both of them. One of them [Geocentric] is staked to many things the rest of the year and the other [Lyons Legend] isn't as much. For example, Jimmy's mare doesn't have the Breeders Crown and Geocentric does. Plus, Geocentric goes right back in a couple of weeks at Lexington for \$400,000 where it could be just a four-horse field."

While Tetrick's pick to Geocentric will solidify that horse's status as the race favorite over Lyons Legend, the race could completely go either way with either one capable of winning depending on how the race shakes out.

"That's a tremendous mare," said Tetrick, in regard to Lyons Legend. "She's made this decision harder and harder. It's just lucky for me that one was staked up and the other wasn't. And she'll still have some of the races in Pennsylvania and it's actually good for her also as a 2-year-old to not have to overdo it. She'll win many races this year, make good money and then hopefully come back strong at 3."

Another filly in the race that shouldn't be overlooked is My Girl EJ. She's not helped whatsoever by having drawn the

outside post 8, but she's another fast 2-year-old in here and you figure that trainer Ron Burke will have her ready.

She coasted last week as the heavy favorite in wrapping up her final PASS preliminary leg and perhaps even more telling than that was her race two back from Harrah's Philadelphia. In that race, she was motivated late to challenge the ultra-impressive Caviart Belle in a speedy 1:50.2 over the five-eighths mile surface. My Girl EJ was further flattered from that race when Caviart Belle came back to win next out earlier this week by nearly five lengths in 1:50.1 in the Eternal Camnation at Woodbine Mohawk.

Back to Tetrick, he's well positioned in the other PASS final races on Saturday. In addition to Geocentric in the PASS final for 2-year-old filly pacers, he also drives The Moment for 2-year-old filly trotters, as well as Security Protected for 2-year-old colt trotters where he'll seek to upend T C I.

In the 2-year-old final for colt pacers, he'll drive Booming Economy, another high quality 2-year-old out of former 2-year-old champion Economy Terror. They'll square off against Captain Albano (creative name by the way between

Captaintreacherous—Angelou) and Rose Run Zeke. In their race just days ago in what turned into a two-horse breakaway, Rose Run Zeke blazed the way through fast fractions and held together gamely as Captain Albano gradually pushed by in the stretch following the 2-hole trip in the second fastest 2-year-old mile of the year overall and fastest all year on a five-eighth's track, 1:50.

One final note related to Tetrick, I'd have been remiss if not asking his thoughts on the sport's nearly-unanimous number one horse, Confederate. Of particular interest, was the approach on strategy where generally he's elected to race Confederate from off the pace.

"It doesn't matter to me [where he races from]," Tetrick said. "That horse can do whatever I ask him to do. It's like, why pass up being second over. That one time in Canada I got a little too far back, but he loves to pass horses. And when you have horses like Christchurch and others out there that are really front runners, that don't want to sit a hole, and so you know there is going to be speed in front of you, then it makes my job that much easier when we're ending up second over in almost every race except for the Meadowlands Pace. And even then, he did all the work first over and jogged; he's very special."







PASS fields set for 3-yearold finals

North America Cup winner It's My Show and Hambletonian Oaks winner Heaven Hanover will be among this year's Grand Circuit victors looking to add Pennsylvania Sire Stakes crowns to their credits when Harrah's Philadelphia hosts the four series championships for 3-year-olds on Sunday.

Philly also will host four PASS consolations on the card, which begins at 12:40 p.m. (EDT). The \$252,000 championships are races 3, 6, 8, and 9.

It's My Show (Sweet Lou—Put On A Show) drew post 1 for driver Scott Zeron and trainer Linda Toscano in the \$252,000 final for 3-year-old male pacers. His stablemate Fulton (Heston Blue Chip—Bettor Be Steamin), the defending series champ, will leave from post 2 with driver Andrew McCarthy. Both horses were 2-for-2 in PASS prelims this season.

Milstein Memorial winner Seven Colors (Stay Hungry–Rainbowinthedark) and Ken Hanover (Captaintreacherous–KJ's

Justine), another Grand Circuit winner, will start from posts 4 and 3, respectively. Both won two of four starts in the prelims. Dexter Dunn will drive Seven Colors for trainer Andrew Harris while David Miller will drive Ken Hanover for trainer Roland Mallar.

Heaven Hanover (Father Patrick—Hillarmbro) will start from post 8 with Tim Tetrick driving for Marcus Melander in the final for female trotters. Two-time prelim winners Fashion Annie and Railee Something drew posts 4 and 6, respectively. Andy McCarthy will drive Fashion Annie (Donato Hanover—Fashion Athena) for Jim Campbell. Yannick Gingras is listed to drive Railee Something (International Moni—Railee Priti) for Ron Burke.

In the final for male trotters, defending champion Once In A Lifetime will start from post 8 with Tetrick in the bike for Campbell. Once In A Lifetime (Father Patrick—Sherrys Lady) posted three wins and a second in the four preliminary rounds. Saint Louie (Father Patrick—Emmylou Who) had two PASS victories and leaves from post 6 for trainer-driver Ake Svanstedt.

Odds On Hail Mary (Heston Blue Chip—Mach Some Noise) led the female pacers in points and will start their final from post 5 for the Zeron-Toscano tandem. Toscano also will send out two-time prelim winner C Is For Cookie (Betting Line—Sweet Future) from post 8 with Gingras driving. Returning champion Beach Cowgirl (Captaintreacherous—Stonebridge Sundae) drew post 7 for driver Joe Bongiorno and trainer Jennifer Bongiorno.

It's the strong vs. the quick in Saturday's \$2.1 million TAB Eureka

It is the fast against the strong at the heart of the world's richest harness race.

The "fast" is Catch A Wave and the strong is Leap To Fame in Saturday night's (Sept. 2) \$2.1 million TAB Eureka at Menangle.

Yes, that's a rather simplistic way of looking at the great race and there are certainly more than just the two chances, but that's the mental wrestle punters have going into it. Catch A Wave is bred to be brilliant, being a son of explosive speed sire Captaintreacherous and his rise to prominence so far has largely been off sprint races like the Miracle Mile and Chariots Of Fire over a mile at Menangle.

But this race is 2,400m.

Catch A Wave hasn't won beyond 2,240m. His only try was the worst finish of his career when seventh in a qualifying heat of the Victoria Derby at Melton about a year ago.

Trainer Andy Gath cautioned punters not to read too much into that.

"Kate [Gath, driver] would admit it certainly wasn't one of her best drives and he still smashed the clock for his last mile," he said. "Given how well he finished it off and what time he ran for the last mile, we actually take it as a positive that he will run a staying trip.

"It's also a year ago and he's not just more mature and experienced now, he is physically much bigger and stronger. Don't get me wrong, speed is and always will be his greatest weapon, but I think suggesting he won't run a strong 2,400m is premature. The 2,400m isn't my biggest concern, put it that way."

In contrast, Leap To Fame is the "strong." He's by siring sensation Bettor's Delight, who is renowned for producing strong, tough, resilient horses as well as fast ones.

And Leap To Fame's had plenty of practice in races 2,400m or beyond. His six tries have netted four wins and two fantastic

second placings. He's two-from-two over 2,400m at Menangle in a heat and final of last year's NSW Derby.

"I'm very happy the race is 2,400m, not a mile," Leap To Fame's trainer/driver Grant Dixon said. "He's fast and strong, but the further they go, the more he seems to assert himself. He goes the same over a mile or 2,400m, while some others find it harder in the staying races.

"I've always had a huge opinion of him, but it went to another level in the Queensland Derby last year. It was the first time I really had to ask him to dig deep. It was that moment where you just hope he's as good as you think and he was. He found plenty for me and I knew he was really special then."

So, does Dixon need to ensure the TAB Eureka is a truly run 2,400m?

"Yes and no," Dixon said. "I mean I do need to try and make sure a really fast horse like Catch A Wave doesn't get the chance to beat me with his speed, but I've also got to be mindful there are some other really nice horses in the race who can take advantage if I go over the top. It'll be a balancing act," he said.

Leap To Fame will start second from the outside on the front line in the 10-horse field.

"The draw isn't ideal, but he wouldn't have been in the early burn anyway," Dixon said. "He never seems to have much luck with draws, so we're sort of used to it now.

"I'll just let him balance up, hope a few of them on the inside have a bit of a burn to find their spots and then decide if I make an early move or wait and come later. If they back off, I'll get moving."

Importantly, Dixon said Leap To Fame was "right where I want him" going into the biggest race of his stellar career so far.

"He had that busy July at home [Queensland] through the three big races, but he's thrived from it," he said. "I think he's as good as I've ever had him.

"He got down here [Menangle] last Sunday and he's settled in really well. I wouldn't swap him for anything else, put it that way."

Dixon was quick to label Catch A Wave and outstanding Victorian 3-year-old The Lost Storm as the hardest to beat.

"Catch A Wave is fast and very good," he said. "He's looked the main danger ever since he won the Chariots Of Fire and Miracle Mile here earlier in the year and I've got huge respect for Andy Gath's ability to peak him when it matters.

"The Lost Storm couldn't have done much more. His Queensland Derby win was terrific and it's really a question of whether a top 3-year-old is good enough and mature enough to beat these 4-year-olds. He's got the big advantage under the preferential [barrier] draw. I'd love to have barrier 2. I've got a lot of respect for him and his trainers [Emma Stewart and Clayton Tonkin]."

The Lost Storm has won 11 of his 13 starts and Tonkin believes he should be unbeaten.

"He had some issues and just wasn't himself in the two defeats," Tonkin said. "He ran well, but he wasn't right, we probably shouldn't have run him. He's had a really good build-up for this and we're only running because he had to get a good draw.

"Don't get me wrong, we know how high the bar is set with horses like Leap To Fame and Catch A Wave, but we've also got a big opinion of our horse. We wouldn't be running him against them at this stage of his career unless we thought he was ready for it and good enough to make a real race of it with them."

Tonkin and Stewart also have the lone mare in the race, the outstanding Encipher.

"I'm thrilled she got a slot in it," Tonkin said. "She certainly deserves it. If there's to be an upset, she is the one who can cause it if she gets the right run.

"She's so tough. She'll love the 2,400m and run it right out. We've thought for a long time she could match it with the boys and she proved it by beating some serious open class boys at Melton last start."

The wildcard of the TAB Eureka is the long-time favorite Captain Ravishing, who has fallen from favor after defeats in the Chariots Of Fire and Miracle Mile earlier this year.

In a daring move, trainer Ahmed Taiba opted to take Captain Ravishing first-up into the race having not raced since that seventh in the Miracle Mile back on March 4.

"Someone said I'd get legend status if I could win the race on the preparation he's had, so hopefully that's the case," Taiba said. "His strength is his speed. I've said all along, if he's going to win the race it'll be with his speed so we've wanted to keep him fresh and sharp."





Menangle matters

Saturday morning, The Meadowlands' Down Under contingent will be up early to watch the \$2.1 million TAB Eureka.

Bloodshot eyes in the Garden State will be watching the world's richest harness race, the \$2.1 million TAB Eureka, on Saturday (Sept. 2) from Australia's Club Menangle, which is about an hour from Sydney.

With a 14-hour time difference and nearly 10,000 miles between the states of New Jersey and New South Wales, the TAB Eureka will go off at 8:45 p.m. on Australia's east coast, which will be 6:45 a.m. on the east coast of the U.S.

After spending over a decade in Australia, trainer Brett Pelling moved back to the States — specifically New Jersey — six years ago, but just like his fellow expats, he keeps up to date with

the Down Under racing scene, including the TAB Eureka, a race for Australian-bred 3- and 4-year-old pacers.

"These people down there are professionals," Pelling said of those that came up with the idea for the Eureka. "They think outside the box. They're young. They are promoting like you wouldn't believe.

"You'll find when you go to the track, I mean, the signage, the sponsorships, the people that they bring on board, the events that they have. Everything they do is unbelievably well done. Highly, highly professional and they reach out and they make themselves part of the community, which is what we don't do. We just don't do that."

Pelling thinks American tracks could learn something from their Down Under counterparts when it comes to marketing and promotions.

"I will guarantee you that if people from here, especially The Meadowlands, went Down Under, they would just turn around and say to themselves, 'What have we been doing? We have this product right here at the center of the universe and we've been wasting it,' because that's what they'll see.

"They have major companies on board, promoting racing events but they make it part of the community in a good way. It's a place to go. People go there, they dress up and go. There are always things going on and they promote. They just do a fabulous job. And the signage when you go there, I mean, you go there and see the signs of major corporations. You'll go to some of these tracks and you'll be looking at signs the equivalent of Apple and Shell and all this type of stuff."

Trainer Noel Daley was born in Australia and moved back home from the U.S. several years ago but after less than a year, moved back to New Jersey in 2019.

Daley is a native of Queensland, where Eureka presumptive favorite Leap To Fame is from.

"The young fellow who trains [Leap To Fame], I'm saying young fella because he's younger than me," Daley said with a laugh, "Grant Dixon, I can remember him as a kid starting out. He's a very good trainer/driver over there, but he sticks usually to Queensland. He doesn't travel many horses. He always runs a big team and mainly stays right there in his home state.

"The guy who owns that horse has been sort of his main patron and he has supported the industry in Queensland for the last 40 years. Kevin Seymour's the guy's name. If he hadn't been around, things wouldn't have been as good. They focus on staying at home usually, but this horse is obviously a good one."

Daley is also familiar with the team of Emma Stewart and Clayton Tonkin, who send out The Lost Storm — one of two 3-year-olds currently in the field — and Encipher, the lone 4-year-old mare.

"They're ridiculously unbeatable in 2- and 3-year-old races," Daley said.

There's a familiar name connected to Encipher, that of Luke McCarthy, older brother of The Meadowlands regulars Andy and Todd. Luke is best known in the U.S. for driving Muscle Hill to victory in the \$540,000 World Trotting Derby in 2009.

"Luke's one of the best big-race drivers there is, especially when it comes to distance," Todd said. "He knows speed so well and he's so tactically minded. He knows the best place to put his horse to try to have the most finish in the end.

"I'm sure that Luke will be giving [Encipher] the best trip possible and she could be a sneaky one to keep an eye on."

The McCarthys lived about 30 minutes from Menangle, which they consider their home track.

Before moving to the States to race at The Meadowlands in 2020, Todd was the "King of Menangle," winning several driving titles.

"I remember talking to Todd's father John, one of the greatest guys, and I've hung out with John because he's my era," Pelling said. "And we're talking one day and he said, 'I said to Todd one day, 'Todd, How do you get them out of the gate like that?" Because he can get them out of the gate. He can time that first step and that's what it's all about down there, timing that first step and getting it right because you got a horse having a neck in front, a half-length in front [at the start of the race] is a big deciding factor."

Todd said that Menangle is 1,400 meters, or seven-eighths of a mile, and is most similar to Woodbine Mohawk Park.

At 2,400 meters, the TAB Eureka is longer than the average race contested at Menangle and the horses will start at the top of the backstretch.

"So, with the 2,400 meter starts, the outside horses tend to get a little bit of an advantage just because of the way that the gate

is coming off the turn," Todd said. "The outside sort of tends to be at a little bit of a higher speed than the inside horses. So, if you can kind of feed your horse into the gate at the right time, there, you can be already going a little bit quicker than the inside ones are. It tends to help those horses leave out of the gate and slot across and get a forward position.

"In a race like this, I would think that there will probably be some moves pretty early-on out of the gate."

Without having seen a draw for the race, Todd was speaking in generalities about how distance races tend to go at Menangle.

"Without knowing this field too well, it's hard to predict what horses will land where and then, obviously, that kind of dictates the rest of the race," Todd said. "But, usually, over the longer distance races at Menangle, there's a little bit of action early. Everyone likes to kind of sort themselves out by the first turn there, which is inevitably now on the backstretch coming into the homestretch. And then often you'll see some more moves in the home stretch with horses trying to reposition themselves when the tempo seems to back off there. It's a good opportunity if you want to try and make a move and get in a forward spot that seems to be where the slowest part of the race is.

"And then after that, we don't see too many more moves other than horses sort of beginning their run at whichever point they decide to. I think that the distance side of it definitely is going to play into some hands more than others. And, yeah, it's going to make for an exciting race."

Pelling, Daley and Todd all plan to watch the TAB Eureka prior to heading to The Meadowlands for 9 a.m. qualifiers.

"I mean, this Eureka thing was basically created to stop the world, that's why they're doing it," Pelling said. "You know, they're trying to bring attention to the game. That's what they're thinking.

"This Eureka thing is good. These guys have done their job by having you looking to have something in print about it. They've done their job."







The colorful history of the Canadian Pacing Derby

Let's take a look at some fun facts/oddities/notes about the Canadian Pacing Derby.

- 1. Western Ideal won the Canadian Pacing Derby in 2000. His first crop appeared in a big way at 2, but more so at 3 as he had a huge Labor Day weekend in 2004. A world record with Cabrini Hanover in 1:51. Then at 3, Cabrini, Rocknroll Hanover and American Ideal all sophs by Western Ideal were the three biggest money makers of the entire season, topped by Horse of the Year (HOY) honors to Rocknroll and a 1:47 Red Mile scorcher by American Ideal.
- 2. Owner Bob Hamather apparently wasn't satisfied in 1982 with Willow Wiper winning the CPD. He did it again, in style in 1993 with Staying Together, the HOY and fastest horse ever in 1:48.2 in a race.
- 3. Foiled Again, 11 years after Gallo Blue Chip, became the No. 1 pacing earner of all-time in 2001, took over the lead winning his richest ever race, the \$787G 2012 Canadian Pacing Derby. Eleven years ago, also, he hit \$7,635,588 lifetime with nobody in telescopic sight to unseat him any decade soon.
- 4. Albatross won the 1972 Canadian Pacing Derby en route to his second straight HOY title. Twenty-four and 26 years later, two of his sons won it, the second doing so 37 days after he Albatross away on 8/5/98. In 1996 Ball And Chain won it when Albatross was 28. He was, by the way, the first sub 1:50 winner on Canadian soil. Then in 1998 Noble Ability took it the year his dominant dad passed at age 30 as the No.1 money-winning stallion of all time.
- 5. George Segal and Brittany Farms have, shall we say, more than held their own in this race. They won it in 1991 with Odds Against and then came right back in 1992 with undefeated HOY Artsplace, then with Western Ideal in 2000 and in 2002 HOY Real Desire.
- 6. Lis Mara won the richest edition in 2006 for Erv Miller (\$933,000). He liked it so much he came back for some more in 2007. Brian Sears drove Lis Mara in both, and in 2008 made it a three-peat with Mister Big.

- 7. The CPD is basically a must for any horse, 4 and older, to be named Horse of the Year. Ten HOY have won the CPD and eight out of 10 did it the same year they won the CPD. Gallo Blue Chip won it the year after 2000-2001 as did Wiggle It Jiggleit 2015-2016. The other HOYs were Albatross (1972), Sir Dalrae (1973), Cam Fella (1983), Artsplace (1992), Staying Together (1993) Real Desire (2002), McWicked (2018) and Bulldog Hanover setting the stakes mark of 1:46.4 in 2022.
- 8. It's been 19 years since the last trainer/driver won the CPD. It was Pat Lachance and he did it via the supplemental route with Casimir Camotion. The first 12 editions of the Canadian Pacing Derby were all won by trainer/drivers.
- 9. Clifford Chapman won the CPD in 1944, 1945 and 1947, his brother John Chapman won it in 1948.
- 10. Seven times a driver has won this race consecutively.
- 11. Going into 2023, the last 10 CPDs were under \$700G. In the previous dozen, 11 of 12 were worth more.
- 12. Can Hanover Shoe Farms win this race for the fourth straight year? Prior to the recent hot streak Dorsoduro Hanover (2020), Allywag Hanover (2021) and Bulldog Hanover (2022) Hanover won it in 1974 with Otaro Hanover, 1970 with Horton Hanover and in 1951 with Malcolm Hanover.
- 13. A trotter finished last in the 1949 Canadian Pacing Derby. The one and only time this happened.
- 14. On 28 occasions the winning driver of the CPD was a U.S. Hall of Famer.

A FEW FACTS ABOUT THE MAPLE LEAF TROT

It debuted at Thorncliffe Park on Aug. 3, 1950.

In 1954, it moved to the Old Woodbine.

From 1963-93 it was hosted by Greenwood until they closed their doors.

Back-to-back HOYs won this. In 1975, Savoir and Delmonica Hanover both won it. It was the only time the race was ever split and two HOYs won it.

Who was the last 3-year-old to win the Maple Leaf Trot? It was Supergrit in 1997 with Mark Jordan.

In 2018 Crazy Wow posted the upset for Marcus Melander.

Mares Bee A Magician and Hannelore Hanover won it in 2015 and 2017, respectively and both were name HOY.

Tie Silk won three (1961, 1963 and 1964). Grandpa Jim won three straight (1969-71). No Sex Please also scored a hat trick (1989, 1990 and 1992). And San Pail had a natural hattrick (2009-11) the last of which was a lynchpin to his HOY season.

In 2004-05 Mr. Muscleman turned this into his own personal playground at 4-5 posting Canada's fastest trotting mile in the process.





Korpi and Nieminen to square off in Finnish Derby

Saturday (Sept. 2) is the day for the best Finnish bred 4-year-old trotters to do battle in the prestigious \$250,000 Derby at Vermo racetrack in Helsinki. It looks like the crop born in 2019 has produced some nice trotters that now will try to take the next step into glory.

Pekka Korpi, who consistently produces great trotters in his home country, won his first Derby in 1977 with Viking Way and continued on the victorious path in 1978 when he won with Leo Frosty.

Since then, the maestro of Finnish harness racing has claimed the Derby on four occasions as a trainer, the latest with Magical Princess in 2021.

Markku Nieminen has as many Derby wins (six) as Korpi.

Nieminen and Korpi are both participating in Saturday's Derby where Nieminen has the advantage with two horses in the field.

The mile rate of 1:57.4 over 1.6 miles is the stakes record to beat.

The 4-year-olds race for the same purse and it's the same story with the French J-horses. Just A Gigolo, Juninho Dry and not least

of all Joshua Tree are some of the contenders in Saturday's race for colts. The latter has been the king of the crop lately.

Jean-Michel Bazire's horses possess all the properties to become a star trotter, chasing Just A Gigolo as the most merited horse born in 2019.

Jazzy Perrine is used to competing against the best horses in her category, colts included, and this time she will face her same-age sisters.

Two races for the 3-year-olds are also on Vincennes' Saturday menu. William Bigeon-trained Kana de Beylev has been in the top of the crop all the year and she claimed the \$125,000 Prix Reine du Corta on Aug. 19 at Vincennes. Among the 3-year-old colts, Philippe Allaire's Koctel du Dain has impressed and just like Kana de Beylev, he won his last start, a Criterium qualification race at Vincennes.

It's set for a top day in Paris on Saturday.

'Soiree' leads way for Wallin's New Jersey Classic hopefuls

Lucas Wallin will hope it's party time with Soiree Hanover, as well as several other horses from his stable, when the two-week New Jersey Classic begins tonight (Sept. 1) at The Meadowlands.

Soiree Hanover, whose family includes Dan Patch Award-winners Father Patrick, Pastor Stephen and Chocolatier, has two wins and a third in three lifetime starts as she heads to the first of three \$25,000 NJC eliminations for 2-year-old female trotters at the Big M. The top-three finishers from each division plus a fourth-place finisher chosen by lot will advance to the final on Sept. 8.

The Meadowlands also will host NJC elims for 2- and 3-year-old male trotters, 2-year-old male and female pacers, and 3-year-old female trotters on tonight's card. Eliminations for 3-year-old male and female pacers are Saturday. The NJC, sponsored by The Meadowlands and Standardbred Breeders & Owners Association of New Jersey, is for NJ.-sired horses and horses eligible to the New Jersey Standardbred Development Fund stakes.

Soiree Hanover is the 3-1 morning-line second choice in her elim, leaving from post 2 with Tim Tetrick driving for trainer Wallin. The daughter of Walner—Spring Gala won two preliminary rounds of the New Jersey Sire Stakes and was third from post 8 in the final, when she made a three-wide move from sixth on the last turn to finish three-guarters of a length behind winner

Buy A Round and a nose from second-place Sunkist Beauty.

Sunkist Beauty is the 2-1 favorite in the first NJC elimination, starting from post 7 with trainer/driver Ake Svanstedt.

"She's been good," Wallin said about Soiree Hanover, a \$110,000 Standardbred Horse Sale purchase owned by Snogarps Gard Inc. "She didn't do her best race in the final, but she wasn't bad, either. Maybe our expectations were too high for that start. Right away, I was a little disappointed, but she raced well.

"We gave her an easy week after the final [which was Aug. 5] and then have been training her normally. She's a big filly and I think she needed to recover from those three races. I expect her to race good right away here."

Soiree Hanover is one of four Wallin Stable horses in the NJC. The 2022 U.S. Rising Star Award winner also will send out Devilish Hill in the second of two eliminations for 3-year-old male trotters, Mosquito in the second of two elims for 2-year-old male trotters, and Southwind Desi in the single elim for 3-year-old female trotters.

Devilish Hill starts his elim from post 2 with driver Andy McCarthy and is 8-1 on the morning line. The son of Muscle Hill—Devilish Delight has a win in a conditioned race and heads to the NJC off a third-place finish in a consolation division of the Beal Memorial. The elim's even-money favorite is Up Your Deo, who counts the Beal Memorial's main event and MGM Yonkers Trot among his four wins this season.

"He's had a solid year," Wallin said about Devilish Hill, who has earned \$76,343 this year for owners Wallin and Kjell Magne Andersen. "He's not really racing with the best colts out there, but I don't think he's too far away. He drew well. Hopefully, he makes the final. Then, anything can happen."

The top-five finishers from each elim advance to the final. Grand Circuit winners Celebrity Bambino (7-5) and Oh Well (9-5) are the top morning-line choices in the first division for 3-year-old male trotters.

Mosquito has raced only once so far, winning a conditioned

event Aug. 14 at Mohegan Pennsylvania's Pocono Downs. He qualified on Aug. 24 at The Meadowlands and was third, beaten by a head, behind Seven Reps and Sig Sauer.

The son of Muscle Hill—Amour Heiress was purchased for \$250,000 at the Standardbred Horse Sale and his four siblings — Spy Booth, Periculum, King Alphonso, and Crown — are all stakes-winners with more than \$298,000 in purses apiece. The family also includes Hambletonian champ Trixton and Dan Patch Award-winners Andover Hall and Conway Hall.

Mosquito starts Friday from post 2 with driver Brian Sears and is 8-1.

"He was a late-bloomer, and we took our time with him," said Wallin, who trains Mosquito for owners Morrison Racing Stables and John Fielding. "This race might be a couple weeks too early for him. He won at Pocono in a very good way, and we tried to get him in again, but he didn't get in. We qualified him at The Meadowlands, and he looked good over the track and Brian was happy.

"He's a really nice colt and I think he's going to have a good late summer and good fall. He has a great pedigree. I expect big things from him, especially next year; he's been growing a lot. We decided to give him a chance here."

Sig Sauer, the New Jersey Sire Stakes champion, is the 5-2 morning-line favorite in Mosquito's elimination. New Jersey Sire Stakes runner-up My Way is the 3-1 pick in the other division.

In the elimination for 3-year-old female trotters, the top-nine finishers from the 10-horse field will join bye recipient Secret Volo in the final. Grand Circuit winner and 2022 New Jersey Classic champ Quick Stop is the 3-1 morning-line favorite in the elim. Wallin's Southwind Desi, another starter from post 2 for the trainer, is 15-1 with Yannick Gingras.

"We're going to see what she can do, but we have no expectations," Wallin said about the Harbor Racing Stableowned daughter of Muscle Hill—Drinking Class. "We're going to make a couple changes with her. She didn't race bad her last start [second in a conditioned trot at Harrah's Philadelphia] but it's a different race this time. We'll give her a chance and see what happens."

Millers connected by 10,000-win milestone

Andy Miller and Brett Miller are not related, but they were in a way connected last week when each driver got the 10,000th win of his career.

First was Andy, who notched his milestone triumph with Samwise The Brave on Aug. 20 at Lexington's Red Mile. Five days later, Brett joined him in the 10,000-win club when he guided Flyin Bullets to victory at Eldorado Scioto Downs.

Andy ranks 21st among all drivers in North American history. Brett is No. 22.

"That's pretty neat," Andy said about the two Millers reaching 10,000 within days of each other. "It's quite an accomplishment for anybody to get there. It's kind of an elite group.

"Starting out, it's not even a number you would think about. You're looking to get a hundred wins. Then a thousand. To think you can get to 10,000 is amazing."

Brett agreed.

"A lot of times you take things for granted," Brett said. "But when I saw I was getting close to it, it meant a lot. When I first started driving horses, I remember living in a tack room above the barn at Raceway Park, at 21 years old, saying to myself that if I could win 2,000 races in my career it would be so awesome. That's what I would think about. So, [10,000] definitely means a lot."

Andy, who will turn 55 next month, got his first win in 1986. He was one of the top drivers in Illinois, winning titles at Balmoral and Maywood, before moving with his wife, trainer Julie Miller, to New Jersey in 2006. That same year, Andy got his 5,000th win.

"It all started at the Illinois fairs and just kept going," Andy said. "When you have a passion for the business and you work hard, good things happen."

Andy got his most lucrative win two years after moving to the East Coast, guiding Creamy Mimi to victory for trainer Trond Smedshammer in the \$750,000 Hambletonian Oaks.

He has captured five Breeders Crown trophies in his career, getting his first in 2004 with his brother, trainer Erv Miller, and filly pacer Restive Hanover. His other Crowns include one with Julie, in 2009 with trotter Lucky Jim. The gelding won 17 of 18 races that season and banked \$1 million on his way to the Dan Patch Award for best older male trotter.

According to the U.S. Trotting Association's research department, Andy and Julie have teamed up for 1,634 victories in their careers. In addition to Lucky Jim, some of the stable's notable horses have included Dan Patch Award and Mohawk Million winner Venerate, millionaires Devious Man and Met's Hall, Kentucky Filly Futurity champ Love A Good Story, and John Cashman Memorial winner Sevruga.

Victory No. 10,000 for Andy also came with a horse trained by Julie. "That made it even more special," Andy said. "We've had a lot of

wins together with horses we've owned and trained, so it was pretty neat that it happened with a horse we train."

As for his career to date, Andy added, "When you look back over the years and you think of all the horses and all the trainers and owners and drivers you've raced with, it's a lot of good memories. It's been a great ride and I hope it continues. I'm still passionate about it."

Brett Miller, who turned 50 earlier this month, got his first win in 1992. He averaged 520 victories a year from 2000 through 2006 while capturing titles at Scioto Downs and Northfield Park. In 2007, he equaled the record for most wins on a single pari-mutuel track card, collecting 10 at Northfield.

After moving to the East Coast, Brett enjoyed success at The Meadowlands, where he equaled the track record with eight wins on a single card in 2016 and was the leading driver in 2017. At the end of 2018, he returned to Ohio and continued his winning ways. Since the start of 2019, only Aaron Merriman has more victories in the Buckeye State than Brett, who has totaled more than 2,000 during that time.

"I think one of the things I'm proud of is being able to go pretty much anywhere and compete and do well," Brett said. "When I went out East, I didn't know if I could make it out there, and things went pretty good. Things went really good, actually. But the lifestyle wasn't for me, living out there, the hustle and bustle and running around everywhere. I never really got to enjoy life. Being back here in Ohio, I can do that more."

Brett has won three Breeders Crown trophies, including one with multiple Dan Patch Award-winner Pure Country. In 2016, he won the Ewart Memorial with Always B Miki (subbing in the sulky for cousin David Miller) in a world-record-equaling 1:47 mile at Scioto Downs. Always B Miki outdueled defending Horse of the Year Wiggle It Jiggleit on his way to his own Horse of the Year honor at season's end.

"One of my favorite drives ever was getting to drive Always B Miki at Scioto Downs, the night he and Wiggle It Jiggleit went toe-to-toe," Brett said. "That stands out. But I've had the chance to drive a lot of great horses. I've been lucky; very, very lucky."

Some other top horses for Brett have included millionaires Racing Hill and Charlie May, who happened to give Brett victory 9,998 the day prior to him reaching his milestone.

Interestingly, Brett went behind the gate with a chance to get his 10,000th win with a trotter trained by his wife, Stacey Van Huizen, which would have offered another parallel to Andy's accomplishment. Alas, the horse made a break.

"That's the way it goes," Brett said with a laugh.

Two races later, Clair Umholtz-trained Flyin Bullets and Brett got the job done in a leg of the Ohio Sire Stakes for 2-year-old filly pacers. It was their third OSS win together, putting Flyin Bullets at the top of her division's standings.

"She's a nice filly," Brett said. "I've got a few pretty good stakes horses and that definitely makes things more fun. But I look forward to going to race every night. That feeling is still there. I just want to keep doing what I'm doing."





Strong Poison stings at Red Mile

Strong Poison delivered a powerful punch with her return to the winner's circle on Tuesday (Aug. 29) at Red Mile in 1:50 in the sole division of \$80,000 Kentucky Sire Stakes action for sophomore trotting fillies. The 12-race card also featured one \$30,000 Kentucky Commonwealth Series for 3-year-old pacing females and one \$15,000 Goldenrod Series event.

Strong Poison, in line to Yannick Gingras, sat in the garden spot leaving the gate as Cultured (Scott Zeron) set the first fraction of :27.4. Gingras gave the filly her head and allowed her to control the tempo. She clicked off fractions of :56.3 and 1:24.2 and threw down the bid of Charleston (Tim Tetrick) to hit the line in front. Cultured was third.

The daughter of Always B Miki—Geometry was bred by Diamond Creek Farms.


Horizontal paid \$9.10 to win.

The Tuesday night (Aug. 29) harness racing program at Running Aces featured two divisions of the \$36,500 Minnesota-sired freshman trot and **DP Freedoms Chrome** stole the show with his second straight local winning performance.

Starting from the outside 9 post, driver James Gould floated the star square-gaiter away from the gate in fifth position as Banker's Quest (Mooney Svendsen) and stablemate Insurrectionist (Luke Plano) both left fast from the inside posts. Banker's Grace put up the fractions of :29.2, 1:00.1 and 1:29.4 while Scoot Scoot (Gerald Longo) came first-up and DP Freedoms Chrome followed cover.

Heading into the final turn Gould sent DP Freedoms Chrome three-wide and they quickly drew alongside the leader as the field rounded for home. In the lane Insurrectionist shook free from the pocket but DP Freedoms Chrome (\$5.00) was gone, he had taken a clear lead as they straightened away and he opened up with every stride through deep stretch to post an 8-1/4 length score over Insurrectionist in 2:00, with Banker's Quest holding for third money.

The impressive son of For You Almostfree is now a perfect 8-for-8 in his career for owner Aimes Racing and trainer Elvin Zimmerman. David Bontrager is the winning breeder.

Baby Flash posted her 12th career win from 13 starts with a sharp 2-3/4 length score in the sophomore filly division in 2:01.4.

Driver Chad Svendsen was content to float away in fourth and waited patiently while Banker's Grace (Rick Magee) made the fractions and Wisco On A Mission (Jacob Cutting) rode in the pocket.

On the far turn Svendsen made his move with Baby Flash and they quickly swept by the leaders while Banker's Grace made a miscue at the top of the field.

Baby Flash (\$4.40) trotted strong through the lane and kicked clear late while Magnolia Moonlight (Chip Lackey) picked up

the pieces for second and Al-Mar Puredelight (Todd Warren) rallied from the back for third.

The winner is a daughter of Southwind Flash and is owned and trained by Rick Huffman and also owned by Brenda Lovetinsky and Penny Lundell.

American Dreamer (Todd Warren, \$5.60) made his way back to the Gulf Shores winner's circle at Running Aces after a sharp effort in the \$17,600 open handicap pace for his seventh win of the season.

Warren sent the 9-year-old son of American Ideal to the front from post 9 and then yielded briefly as PD The Big Easy (Kevin Wallis) went past near the half mile marker. American Dreamer moved right back to the front as they headed down the backside and led comfortably all the way into deep-stretch before Mac's Marvel came charging after the leader late.

American Dreamer dug in gamely and held on to win by a head over mac's Marvel in 1:52 while Bizy's Beatle rallied for third money.

The winner is owned by Wilson Racing, Ann Calvert and Mark Eichberger and is trained by Tim Wilson, Jr. along with assistant Jenni De Menge.

Drivers Dean Magee, Rick Magee and Todd Warren all posted doubles on the Tuesday program.





Colt Bennett upsets Luke McGook at Windsor

"All good things must come to an end." English poet Geoffrey Chaucer is credited with the original use of this idiom in the 1300's, which is commonly used as a proverb to remind us that nothing great will last forever. This aptly describes the 2023 winning streak of Marc Tardif's Luke McGook, which was snapped at seven in Tuesday's (Aug. 29) \$14,692 Maine Sire Stakes for 3-year-old colts and geldings at Windsor Fair.

Held before the regular program, the five pacers lined up behind the starting gate with this season's 'chosen one', Luke McGook, scoring from the pylon position. When the wings folded regular pilot Kevin Switzer Jr. scooted out for control of the tempo, and enjoyed setting relatively soft opening fractions of :30.1 and 1:02.1.

But Maine county fair racing is not for the faint of heart as the drivers are always on the move in the tight turns and rapid rhythm of half-mile track harness racing. Walter Case Jr. had started his ascent for the lead instantly, as he was first over from the 'get-go' with stable mate Anithingforyoudear. Matucci (Heath Campbell, Valerie Grondin) sat comfortably in the 2-hole, with Colt Bennett (Dave Ingraham, David Crochere) moving second over with Casey's cover at the half.

Around the five-eighths paddock turn Switzer felt the pressure mounting, yet kept the pack bunched up behind him. Anithingforyoudear was now within a half-length of the leader at the 1:32.3 (:30.2) third panel, where Luke McGook was finally given the cue to increase the cadence.

Around the final turn 'Double-Digit' Dave Ingraham smelled blood in the water and swooped Colt Bennett three-wide around the thundering herd. Gaining ground with every stride, while unleashing an uncompromising :28.3 final quarter, the prey became the predator and got up by a nose to win in 2:01.3

Trained by David Crochere for owner Nancy Longobardi, it was the third seasonal victory for the son of Rock N' Roll World. Having finished second to Luke McGook on five previous occasions, the win put Colt Bennett's 2023 earnings to \$46,483. He was bred by Stephen K. O'Toole.

The Leighton Property-owned, Marc Tardif-trained Luke McGook has nothing to be ashamed of in being beaten by a nose. He is still the leading money-winning horse in the Maine Sire Stakes program this season, as well as having the most victories. Certainly, the Tardif Taskforce will have Luke McGook back in

harness and ready to redeem himself when the glamour boys meet again at Bangor on Sept. 6.

Anithingforyoudear finished third.

The second \$14,917 glamour boys' division was raced on the Windsor Fair pari-mutuel card and observed **So Rock N' Roll** take one for Team Tardif and score in 1:57.2, just a tick off of his career best.

When the wings folded three horses made a mad-dash for the top with Two Points (Ingraham, Eric Bickmore) on the inside, Rockaroundsam (Switzer Jr., Tardif) in the middle, and Two Towns Over (Aaron Hall, Valerie Grondin) forced three wide through the first turn.

Hall, recognizing a speed duel in the making, opted to duck into third, with Ingraham ultimately allowing Switzer Jr. to take command before the :29 second first quarter. Leaving from the outermost post 6, driver Case Jr. was content to take the overland route and let some of the early tussling expire as So Rock N' Roll took a trailing position in the outer flow, hoping to flush some cover.

Almost like he planned it that way, Casey followed Hall and Two Towns Over when that duo pulled the right line around the three-eighths pole. As the field approached the half in :59, the pack was tightening around the leader, Rockaroundsam. While reaching the third panel in a swift 1:27.4 (:28.4), Two Towns Over had collared the pacesetter and poked a nose in front by the head of the stretch.

But, as those two were busy battling on the front end, Case Jr. thrust So Rock N' Roll three-wide around the final turn and fed him racetrack. Matching and then surpassing the front-end skirmishers, So Rock N' Roll emerged as the fresh and fastidious victor by 1-1/4 lengths. The wagering favorite used a :29.2 final quarter to find that elusive Windsor Fair winner's circle.

Trained by Marc Tardif for breeder/owner Lesley Leighton/ Property, the son of Western Maverick paid \$4.20 to win his fourth race of the year, boosting his seasonal kitty to \$43,475.

Two Towns Over finished second; Rockaroundsam was third.

Drivers Hall and Switzer Jr. each enjoyed three wins apiece on the afternoon Windsor Fair program. In the opener, Aaron Hall driving Ira Cheif nipped pacesetter Zampara and driver Valerie Grondin at the wire, denying the latter of her 499th career victory. The Grondin 500-win watch continues.

Maine's freshman pacers return to start the four-day weekend with the fillies enjoying two \$14,000-plus divisions today (Sept. 1). Distaffs go with an early post time of 2:15 pm, and the 2-year-old colts and gelding race the following day, Saturday (Sept. 2). All the Maine-bred trotters return on Sunday (Sept. 3) with the aforementioned sophomore filly pacers closing out the meet on Labor Day Monday (Sept. 4).



Joe McLead elected director of the Hambletonian Society, Inc.

At the annual August meeting of the board of directors of the Hambletonian Society, Joe McLead, co-owner of Sugar Valley Farm in Delaware, OH was elected to the Society board.

McLead, 51, comes by his harness racing heritage as a thirdgeneration horseman born and raised in the hotbed of the sport, Delaware, OH, home to the classic Little Brown Jug. Sugar Valley Farm was founded in 1968 by McLead's grandfather, Dr. Dale Walters, DVM, who stood the stallion Sugar Tree for many years.

Though McLead initially gained valuable horsemanship skills under the auspices of his uncle, Billy Walters, and toyed with a future as a trainer/driver, he knew as a young man he wanted something more. McLead met his future wife, Patty, on a blind date, and soon after the couple attended the Little Brown Jug, which was won by No Pan Intended. Coincidentally Patty had a familial connection to the breeder of the eventual Triple Crown winner, who was her cousin, Joe Thomson of Winbak Farm. Shortly after they were married, Thomson asked McLead to come help manage Winbak, one of the most prolific standardbred nurseries in North America.

The time spent at Winbak was invaluable experience and also honed McLead's desire for the stability and long-term investment and planning involved in the breeding side of the industry. McLead, Patty and their son William (now a junior in

high school) returned to Sugar Valley Farms in 2012, becoming a co-owner with his uncle in the farm that stood four stallions.

Ten years later Sugar Valley boasts seven of the top sires in the Buckeye State, including Downbytheseaside, Creatine, 1:46 pacer Lather Up, and Catch The Fire. They own 20 of the 40 mares that reside at the farm, and McLead, who spent 12 years on the Delaware Fair board is proud of the advancements made in Ohio in the last decade. He is currently a director of the Ohio Harness Horsemen's Association, a member of the executive committee, and head of the Breeders Committee.

"Thanks to the efforts of a lot of people, we are pretty solid in Ohio right now," McLead said. "We have a great group of board members that think alike and who see that the overall purpose of OHHA is to boost and grow the industry throughout every aspect of the industry, right down to free health insurance for the caretakers, who are an important asset."

McLead was co-owner of Impinktoo, (\$423,860) still the fastest 3-year-old filly trotter, with a record of 1:49.4 that she shares with Plunge Blue Chip, and co-breeder/owner of many other champions, including Herculisa (\$647,525), Harambe Deo (\$409,854), Gulf Shores (\$653,270), and Ants Marching (\$124,543).

"The Society's executive committee is tasked with recommending directors when there is opportunity on the board," said John Campbell, president/chief executive officer of the Society. "The board chose an excellent candidate in Joe McLead, whose experience and dedication to growing the sport of harness racing is a welcome addition."

Big M 'mini meet' a \$2-million Classic

Still basking in the glow of a highly successful Hambletonian Day, The Meadowlands returns from a three-week hiatus with a power-packed two-week "mini meet" that kicks off tonight (Sept. 1) and features the New Jersey Classic, with estimated purses totaling \$2 million.

In addition to tonight, racing will be conducted on Sept. 2, 8 and 9 with a first-race post time of 6:20 p.m.

"The 'mini meet' provides us an opportunity to showcase the state of racing in New Jersey," said The Meadowlands chief operating officer/general manager Jason Settlemoir. "The New Jersey Classic series is another way — in addition to the resurgent New Jersey Sire Stakes program — for owners and horsemen to thrive while keeping their operations in the Garden State."

The NJC — for 2- and 3-year-olds of each sex and gait — will have 11 eliminations tonight and two more on Saturday before all eight divisions contest their respective finals next week.

A great example of how racing — and breeding — in New Jersey continues to flourish is the great mare trotter Fashion Schooner. During 2022, the daughter of Walner—Broadway Schooner, in addition to the Hambletonian Oaks, also won the \$275,000 New Jersey Classic final and \$240,000 New Jersey Sire Stakes final. Thus, the Garden State races accounted for 40 per cent of her total earnings that season of \$684,937.

"The proof is there," said Settlemoir. "The breeding industry in the State of New Jersey is back, and all of us at The Meadowlands couldn't be happier about it."

BOOMING BUSINESS: The Meadowlands has been knocking it out of the park all year long from a business perspective.

This season, a total of \$203,794,252 has been wagered on The Meadowlands' races, good for an average per card of \$3,234,829, a little more than \$200,000 better than 2021, when average wagering topped \$3 million for the first time during the "Jeff Gural era," which had its first full year in 2012.

The biggest day in harness racing was exactly that. Hambletonian Day handle established a new record in the 10-year history of the new grandstand at The Big M, as a total of \$7,805,779 was pushed through the windows on the 16-race program, by far the biggest number on any North American harness program during 2023.

After betting from international outlets was added to the North American total, wagering on the Hambletonian Day card exceeded the \$8-million mark.

Betting on The Hambletonian itself was up considerably from a year ago, as \$1,099,034 was put in play on "America's Classic Trotting Race", a 12 per cent increase over 2022.
