A change of pace takes Snyder to the summit in the Mohawk Million

The prolific owner from New York City has now added a premier trotting race to his resume thanks to Apex's win at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Owner Jeffrey Snyder has an enviable resume in harness racing, having won a laundry list of pacing stakes, including a record four North America Cups, in addition to three Meadowlands Paces, three Little Brown Jugs, three Breeders Crowns, and multiple Horse of the Year trophies.

But Snyder's proficient pacing passel has become passe.

"We just switched over to trotters; we had luck with trotters in Europe, including Aetos Kronos [S], so we just got more interested in the trotters," Snyder said, adding with a laugh, "You know, sometimes you need a change of pace."

His most recent talented trotter to step into the stakes spotlight is the aptly named Apex, who won the Mohawk Million on Saturday (Sept. 20) at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Snyder co-owns the impeccably bred 2-year-old son of Walner out of Mission Brief, with Lennart Agren's S R F Stable, and Steve Stewart.

Marcus Melander-trained Apex was bred by Mission Brief Stable that is comprised of Stewart and partners Glencairn Racing

Apex (Dexter Dunn) winning the \$1 million Mohawk Million on Saturday at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Stb Inc, Martin Schmucker, Tom Schmucker, Black Creek Farm, Dublin Valley Farm, and Maumee River Stables, and sold at the 2024 Standardbred Horse Sale Company yearling sale in Harrisburg, PA, for \$525,000. To date, Mission Brief has sold five foals each for \$400,000 or more.

Snyder said he prefers Harrisburg, because he's "had a lot of luck in Harrisburg."

In addition to Apex having great parents, Snyder said he was impressed with his full sister, Jaya Bae, who sold at the 2020 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale for \$725,000.

"I think that was the second foal out of the dam, and she was very impressive in her baby races, maybe the first one or two races, and she looked tremendous, and then she got sore," Snyder said.

According to Snyder, he looked at Apex last year at Harrisburg with Melander and Dr. David Goodrow, who passed away this year. All three loved the colt.



"He looked great, but one big reason was that the full sister impressed me a lot early, and she just had some bad luck and got sore, that's why we decided to pull the trigger there on Apex," Snyder said. "The fact that it looked like Mission Brief worked well with Walner, kind of swung me over to bid on Apex. And I thought, actually, the \$525,000 number, which is high, but

I really thought he would go for higher at the sale, so we were happy to get him at five and a quarter. And Lennart Agren of S R F Stable is a partner, and Steve Stewart said, after we bought him, he'd like to stay in for a piece, and we said, 'Sure.'

'MILLION' CONNECTIONS

Stewart has an unprecedented record when it comes to the Mohawk Million with connections to five of the six winners either as a breeder, horse owner, or slot owner, and in some cases two or all three apply:

- 2020: Co-breeder of Venerate
- 2021: Co-breeder of Venerable
- 2022: Slot owner of Oh Well
- 2023: No connection to winner T C I, but co-bred third-place finisher Allegiant
- 2024: Co-breeder and co-owner of Maryland
- 2025: Co-breeder, co-owner, and slot owner of Apex

When you consider Hunterton Farm owners Stewart and his wife Cindy are predominantly breeders which own small pieces of only five or six horses, their Mohawk Million success is extraordinary.

"It's not like we have an army out there by any stretch of the imagination," Steve said. "So, we're very, very lucky. And that's kind of how we like it. We like the fact that we're sellers, and we just got lucky last year [at the sale] with Apex. We loved the horse. He was always a special horse growing up."

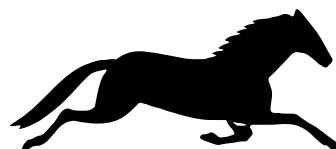

Steve said he remembers Snyder asking him what he thought of Apex before he sold and then speaking with him afterwards.

“He goes, ‘\$525,000 I thought I was going to have to go to \$700,000,’” Steve said. “And I’m like, ‘Well, I wish you would have [spent more] for my partners,’ but it would have had no effect on us if we were able to stay in and he said, ‘Sure.’”

“To me, it’s the most fun when you have partners and Jeff is such a great guy, and I think they really like Cindy and I being partners with them as the breeders, so it’s just a lot of fun. Over and above the accolades and the success, it’s just a lot of fun to have them as partners, the same as it is with Anders Strom and Maryland. You know, to me, partners are what it’s all about in life.

“I would not want to be standing in the winner’s circle by myself. I just don’t think that would be nearly as much fun. It’s kind of like having a boat, and no one ever gets on the boat with you and enjoys the boat. I mean, the fun part is your friends and enjoying it together.”

THE NAME GAME

The Stewarts usually name their foals when they’re weanlings. When it came to naming the fifth foal out of Mission Brief and second by Walner, Cindy was, in a way, phoning it in.

Steve and Cindy read a lot of biographies about history and former presidents, including ones by Ron Chernow, who wrote the book that Hamilton the musical is based on.

“And I asked Cindy, ‘How did we come up with Apex? Was it from one of the books?’” Steve said. “And she said, ‘No.’”

Steve said that Cindy was checking a thesaurus on her phone for one-word synonyms for the best or the top, because the foal was by Walner out of Mission Brief.

“And she got all these words that mean the top, the best, and Apex was one of them,” he said. “That is how she used her phone to come up with the name.”

In December of last year, Steve was reading an article that he took to be a positive for the choosing of the name Apex.

“I had texted those guys, the two partners [Snyder and Agren], in I want to say December, way before we knew [Apex] was any good,” Steve said. “There was a dinosaur named Apex, and it was the most expensive dinosaur ever sold... This dinosaur was sold for \$44 million or something insane... and I said look here, maybe this is a good omen.”

LATE DECISION PAYS OFF

According to both Snyder and Steve, the choice to drop Apex into the Mohawk Million was not made until the Sunday afternoon (Sept. 14) prior to the race.

“Steve was waiting for us to decide,” Snyder said. “We weren’t exactly sure that we wanted to race in the Mohawk Million, because he had three starts in a row. So, we weren’t sure whether we wanted to race him four weeks in a row. So, he came out of the last race well, the Peter Haughton, and Dexter Dunn said he just did it easily down in Indiana, so we decided to go forward and it turned out good. It turned out great, I should say.”

Waiting on that Sunday decision was a little stressful for Steve, because it was his slot that Apex used for the Million and they had to enter on Monday morning.

“So, it’s 26 hours away from having to declare what horse we’re going to put in, so I texted them, and I said, ‘Well, whenever you all know something, let me know.’” Steve said. “So, 11 o’clock comes, nothing; 12 o’clock comes, nothing; 1 o’clock comes, nothing; 2 o’clock comes, nothing; 3 o’clock comes, nothing. Finally, at like, 3:30 in the afternoon, I’m thinking, they’re not going to do it. But luckily, Marcus called me, like, at 4:30 and said, ‘Yeah, I talked to Dexter, everything’s fine.’”

“If they said no, now I’ve got 15 hours to come up with a horse, and that ain’t easy... So, I always tell people, it’s not for the faint of heart, because a lot of those people sold their slots, like a couple of weeks before to get out from under to having to worry about finding a horse.”

No one can blame the connections of Apex for wanting to make good decisions regarding their talented colt who sports a record of 6-1-1 in eight starts and earnings of \$821,575.

“Well, from day one, Marcus was raving about this horse,” Snyder said. “And he said all along, he’s in a class by himself. Even the first few days after we bought him at Harrisburg, he was ecstatic about him. And he stayed that way right through the year and he’s proven to be right. He just is a very special horse. To me, I think he’s the best 2-year-old I’ve seen, 2-year-old trotting colt.

“We’ll probably just go straight to the Breeders Crown. He’s not going to race in Kentucky the next two weeks, the Bluegrass and the International Stallion. And he gets a bye for the Breeders Crown; he doesn’t have to go to the eliminations for the Breeders Crown [because he won the Peter Haughton].

“The good thing is he’s guaranteed to get an inside post, between 1 and 6. He’s probably going to qualify maybe once or twice before and go right into the Breeders Crown.”

For Steve and the staff at Hunterton Farm, Apex getting some time off means he’ll be at Melander’s farm in Kentucky, where they can go visit him.

“We always thought that he was special, and it is nice when that happens, and it doesn’t always happen, obviously,” Steve said. “I always tell people, the greatest thing in our business is two plus two doesn’t equal four, and if it does all the time, then the feeling goes away a little bit, you know, I mean, you kind of bought the winner’s circle.

“He was one of the favorites at the farm... all the guys are all going to go see him, the people that prepped him, all are going to get to go see him, maybe this week, and that’s fun, you know?”

Snyder said he currently only has seven or eight horses in training, all of which are with Melander, and include the aforementioned Aetos Kronos S, Super Chapter, and Date Night Hanover.

“We’ve had a lot of luck with Marcus Melander, and we hope it continues,” Snyder said, adding with a laugh, “I remember Bill Peretti used to say, ‘It’s like playing poker, you’ve got to keep on playing.’ I put money in the pot and sooner or later, you get a winning hand.”

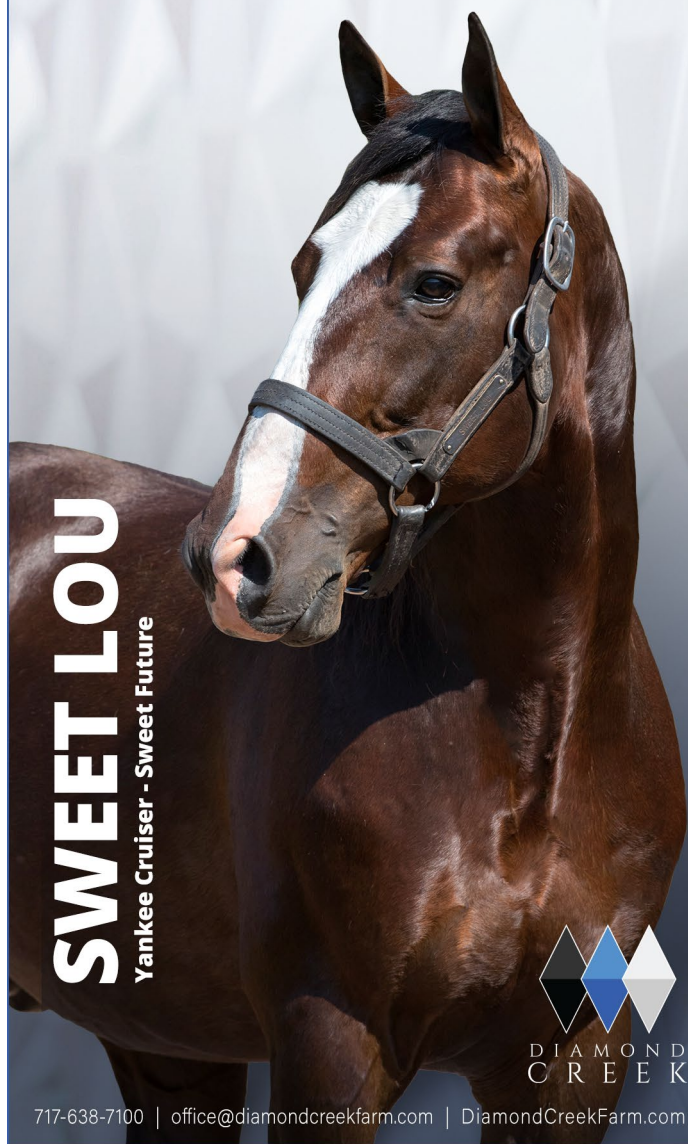

Although the sun was shining Thursday morning, I believed I had plenty to write about from Wednesday morning and what I would find during the races. So, I waited and made my way to the racetrack around noon. Traffic as usual in Lexington was heavy, but I couldn't figure out why it was extremely slow near the UK campus on Nicholasville Road. I finally got up near some clearance and saw what the hold-up had been: There was an older gentleman in a wheelchair just buzzing down the middle of the busy road and backing things up.

When I got to the track, I stopped first to pick up a program in the office from Bessie. Robert LeBlanc was there picking up some forms so we chatted for a moment. I stopped in the Lexington Yearling Sale office to say hello to Sherry and Cindy, and then walked outside to find a seat. The first race was approaching so I decided to walk upstairs to say hello to announcer Gabe Prewitt, but when I opened the door, I found Steve Cross. Steve said Gabe's real job at Harrah's Hoosier Park was keeping him away this week, so he will continue to be in the booth today and Saturday. In my ears, Steve is a great announcer and it's been great having him in Lexington this summer as he shared duties with Gabe.

I stopped in the judges' booth to see Jeff James, Dave Magee and Casey Larson (I've known the first two forever but didn't know the latter). Assistant Beverly was in there, as was Trackman Dan. As the first race was getting underway it was noticed that the timer didn't start rolling until a few seconds after the start. I asked Dan if he sabotaged the timer, and did he have any knowledge about escalators at the United Nations.

I made my way back down to the apron and as I did, I said hello to Bob Heyden and Jessica Otten, who are serving as TV analysts. I gave them what I believe is a winner this afternoon, so hopefully they will give me and my Backstretch column some credit over the air.

I saw Mark Weaver trackside so we sat on a bench for a few minutes and tried to solve the world's problems. We gave that up after a few minutes so I got up and as I walked the apron I saw Wally Mann, Leonard and Norine Hammond (parents of my longtime friend Trish Hammond) and then Joanna Ricci. After a spell with the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission, Joanna now works for MyRacehorse.com, the conglomerate that offers micro shares of thoroughbreds. When I went to Las Vegas back in early June, I made a promise that if I won any money I would jump in, and when I actually came back ahead a few dollars, I spent \$77 to invest in the 2-year-old filly. And... the Saffie Joseph, Jr.-trained Love Like Lucky won her debut at Gulfstream Park and then came back a couple weeks later to finish third in a \$100,000 stake. So, I've gotten back about \$4.50 of my investment.

Joanna told me that she, boyfriend Marvin Luna, trainer Tony Alagna, and grandmother Dorothy Hock share ownership of the 2-year-old filly pacer Interstellar, who was getting ready to compete in an \$82,000 Bluegrass division (race 3). I wished Joanna luck and then watched as the filly finished a good fourth.

Harness racing is good for Taylor Doyle's mental health

Despite the pressures of his full-time profession, Taylor Doyle turns to his work with pacers and trotters as a treasured source of tranquility.

As a youth worker for the Government of Prince Edward Island, Doyle, who grew up in the Canadian province known for its red-sand beaches, lighthouses, fertile farmland, and world-renowned seafood, is accustomed to stressful situations and testing times.

There is, however, an outlet to decompress from the exigent demands of his job.

"I work in an industry where therapy and mental health are very important," said Doyle, who has been at his current role for the past 11 years. "I have no problem saying it – not every day is tough, but when they are and you need to unwind, to get to the barn around seven or eight at night, it is peaceful and quiet."

Doyle first became familiar with those feelings as a kid growing up in Charlottetown, the capital of Prince Edward Island found on the southern coast of the province.

He was given an early introduction to the harness racing scene in the Canadian Maritimes, a sport with a long history on the east coast of the country.

"Most of the Maritimers come into the industry through family," Doyle said. "For me, it started with a girl, Audrey Walsh, who babysat me when I was in Grade 1. So, the boys from Charlottetown – Todd Walsh and his father, Leonard – are the horsepeople who took me to the racetrack when I was a kid. I was probably around 6 or 7 at the time. Todd's mom and Leonard's wife is Audra, so that's how it all began for me, through the Walsh family."

While it was far from odds-on that he would one day get involved in racing himself, the more Doyle went to the races and the more people he met in the sport, his connection to it deepened.

It was around his mid-20s when Doyle took a leap of faith.

"I worked for a few different people and places in Charlottetown when I was going to school," Doyle said. "I started working with the Walsh boys. For about four or five years before that, I was

one of [trainer] Tommy Weatherbie's right-hand guys, so I had a pretty good run with him. I was able to do a lot of different things and learn a lot from that experience and that really helped push me forward.”

It wasn't only Weatherbie who provided the young horseman with an equine education.

A bay mare with a few white hairs on her forehead, one who has gone on to win multiple stakes races, three O'Brien Awards, and boasts a bankroll of over \$1.7 in career purse earnings.

“I actually got to break So Much More before she went big,” said Doyle, of the daughter of Big Jim out of the Real Artist mare Ladysai. “We didn't know what she would become back then, but you could tell she had some talent.”

Doyle, who decided to run a small stable of his own, launched his training career in 2019. One year later, he added driver to his resume.

“I moved to Kensington (PEI) in 2019 to be close to work,” he said. “I had eight starts in my first training year and won my first race the following year.”

He also notched his milestone driving victory in 2020.

“Chris Mackay, who is very hot right now, gave me the chance to drive one of his fillies,” Doyle said.

The filly was Scotlynn Seelster, also a daughter of Big Jim. She raced for Isabelle Darveau and Robert Sheperd in Toronto, before Chris Mackay bought her through onGait, the first online selling and auction website dedicated to the standardbred industry, providing both harness racing sellers and buyers an online venue to sell and purchase racehorses.

On July 5, 2020, Doyle and the bay mare lined up behind the wings as the 7-5 choice in the opening dash at Summerside Raceway in PEI.

“The Walshs let me qualify her twice and then gave me a spin on her,” Doyle said. “I think it was opening day at Summerside – Lobster Carnival Week, anyway.

“I knew I had the horse and I showed a couple :28 final quarters with her in qualifying, so I knew I had a good one.”

Driver and pacer got away third and were nearly four lengths behind the leader at the half. Around the five-eighths mark, they were ahead by nearly two lengths.

“When I showed her a bit of daylight, I got away on them pretty good and we won in 1:59.4,” he said. “Going 1:59 at Summerside

is a good time and she came home in :28 and change. It was a great feeling, for sure.

“I wasn't able to let it sink in at the time, but I was very grateful to Chris for giving me that chance. Chris and his son Jordan have become great friends and have given me a lot of great opportunities to work horses and help them out.”

Doyle, who once marveled at the close-knit Maritimes racing community as a wide-eyed kid, is now grateful to be a part of that scene.

He is reminded, often, of the support horsepeople have for one another throughout the towns and cities that dot the East Coast.

“If you land anywhere at any track out here, people will empty out a stall in two minutes, neat as can be, for you to use,” he said. “These people make you feel like family. That's how the Maritimers are.”

Doyle has no plans to increase the size and scope of his stable, now or in the future.

And that suits him just fine.

“Racing is my side career,” said Doyle, who is married to Brooke, daughter of longtime Maritimes voice of harness racing, Vance Cameron. “It's the same thing with Todd and Lenny Walsh. They would talk about having a small stable but getting the most enjoyment out of the racing experience. That's how I look at it, too.

“I have two nice older horses for a couple of guys I work with, and I picked up a new owner in Hailee Currie – I have two with her. It's busy enough for sure.”

Not just in the barn or office, either.

“I have a 3½-year-old, so that keeps me busy in the best way possible,” Taylor said. “He doesn't miss too many hay runs or water runs. His favorite horse right now is one I have called Sharky, so he loves to get out of the car and wants to say hello to him.

“It's nice to see when they start wanting to go see the horses more – it reminds you of when you were young. The horses just have a special way about them – they can always lift you up when you need it the most.”

Something that Taylor knows all about.

Western Fair not grandstanding when it comes to their guest experience

When live harness racing returns to The Raceway at Western Fair on Friday (Oct. 3), 126 days will have passed since the close of its 2024 campaign (May 30).

In that time, the London, ON, oval worked fervently to introduce a host of impactful upgrades, all anchored by a common vision, in advance of its upcoming 125-day meet.

“We want to enhance the guest experience,” said Greg Blanchard, director of equine programming at Western Fair. “Our facility’s been in kind of a state of flux with some ongoing work here, some expansion to the neighboring casino and other

construction on site, which we’re finally seeing the finish line on a lot of.

“We really want to put a focus on getting more people on site this year for racing. We’re confident we’ve got a really good product, we’ve got a good betting product, but we also have a real good on track experience that we can offer customers... We’re excited to be able to get our facility back up to full capacity.”

With assistance from the Ontario Racing Capital Improvement Program, Western Fair was able to complete several meaningful projects both on and off the track.

The Raceway’s off-track headliner sets the stage for its on-track drama.

“We’ve got 1,500 new stadium seats in our grandstand and it looks great,” said Blanchard. “We had a small section of repurposed seating that we used for a number of years but felt it was time.

“We have a nice big grandstand and wanted to make it a better experience for guests on track. We’re looking forward to filling it throughout the season.”

In addition to the improvements within the grandstand, the tarmac in front of the sizable viewing center was paved to make the area more accessible for patrons hoping to get closer to the action.

Whether seated, against the rail, or watching from afar, Western Fair’s leading on-track upgrade is bound to drive fans’ attention.

Working in collaboration with engineering students from the University of Western and local sulky builder Dave Woods, Western Fair will introduce a new starting gate vehicle for the 2025 program and beyond.

“That project is one that we were really pleased to be able to collaborate with the Western students, supporting our local community and our post-secondary education system in London that’s second to none,” Blanchard said. “To be able to partner with that team and support these future engineers, and at the same time, fill a need that we had was a really cool collaboration.”

Woods, who has owned Advantage Sulky, a race bike-building business in Essex, ON, since 1993, consulted with the students and Western Fair to bring their ideas to life.

“Dave Woods built the vehicle for us,” Blanchard said. “He had built a starting gate vehicle for the Leamington [Raceway], and from all accounts they’ve been quite pleased.

“There aren’t many people that build starting gate vehicles, so to be able to find a guy fairly local to us and work with him is something we’re very happy about.”

The new starter car, which “looks great,” according to Blanchard, is on site and ready to undergo testing with the hope being that it will be ready for opening night.

Western Fair’s emphasis on supporting local has also extended into its culinary offerings, namely the Top of the Fair restaurant, located on the third floor of the grandstand.

“Our food and beverage team have really done a nice job the last couple of years and we’re proud of the food we’re putting out,” Blanchard said. “When it comes to food and beverage, we’re always trying to source locally as much as possible and work with local suppliers, and even folks that are on site here at Western Fair as part of The Grove and our farmers market. We’ve got a real strong partnership with a lot of the people who are already here selling their produce and producing food on a regular basis.”

The renowned dining space will host a number of exciting promotions this season, starting on opening night with a special event put on in conjunction with Gateway Casinos London.

“We’re looking to start things off with a bang,” Blanchard said. “We’re partnering with Gateway, our casino partners here at the Western Fair District, and this will be a night where we offer a really attractive dining, gaming, and racing package for guests.

“They’ll also have interactive games, contests and other giveaways throughout the night to go along with it. The dining room is filling up quick – it looks like it’s going to be a sellout.”

A pair of fan favorites in the Trifecta Tuesday promotion, which will now run twice monthly instead of once, and the Homestretch Grill concession on the main floor, are also returning this season.

October is slated to be an especially busy month with the arrival of several special events, including the first Trifecta Tuesday and start of the London Classic Yearling Sale (Oct. 14), as well as the 20th Anniversary edition of Harness The Hope (Oct. 17).

Other fall highlights include Caretaker Appreciation Night, the Driver’s Holiday Challenge (Dec. 9), and festive race dates on Boxing Day and New Year’s Eve.

On opening night eve, Thursday (Oct. 2), Western Fair will host qualifying races for horsepeople interested in activating their horses for the season ahead.

The baby races will also, as Blanchard added, provide one more opportunity to test out the starting gate before the real deal on Friday.

With so much to look forward to over a long, but productive offseason, the folks at Western Fair are eager to see fans fill the stands once again.

“It’s just nice for us to get back into the swing of things,” Blanchard said. “We hear from customers and it’s nice to hear that a lot of them miss our racing during the off-season, and they look forward to having us back. We’re very excited to kick things off on that Friday night.”

The BDHC members speak up

While making a return visit to my favorite venue, the BDHC (Broken Down Horseplayers Club), located in the heart of our simulcasting arena, I found some of my favorite punters willing to contribute their worthy two cents on their thoughts on the “State of the Sport.”

Smitty, now retired to Florida after a long career in the field of education, is especially well-read and well-spoken, and articulates thoughts that are worthy of notice.

Billy The Drummer has been betting on anything and everything for over 40 years and has survived to a point that he can still contribute to the pari-mutuel system to this very day – quite an accomplishment in itself.

Major Huey has shifted somewhat from the pari-mutuels to the quicker action of sports betting, especially now that football season is upon us.

And, finally, the main man, R. Phil, has joined in with some thoughts on how harness racing can gain a bit more steam at the windows.

Smitty is up first:

“I have followed our sport since the old Sportsman’s Park days; the ‘glory days,’ you might say.

“I read a lot of stuff on all the sites that carry harness racing and, since you, J.B., have joined the Update site, I read the contributions of just about all. You have come up with some great ideas, as do many HRU personnel that have really uncovered the good, the bad, and the ugly in the sport.

“[Looking at the Harness Racing Update website], you have [Garnet] Barnsdale, [Dave] Briggs, [Frank] Coto, Bill Finley, [the late Ron] Gurfein, Thomas [Hedlund] from Europe. Hollywood [Heyden], quite amazing, Debbie [Little] is always entertaining, and the Grassroots guy [Chris Lomon]. I even catch great stuff by Derrick Gwerner at the *Racing Form*, and I am sure that there are many others, too.

“I read all their columns – I do have a lot of free time in retirement – and, to tell you the truth, while their words and wisdom ring *loud and clear*, they fall on *deaf ears*, if and when it reaches the top of their ladder. That is the problem with

harness racing, NO dedicated TV station, NO lottery style lure, too much modern competition while we have been stagnant over the past 40 years.

“I still bet. The challenge still intrigues me, but the majority of guys on the phone betting are not betting harness racing. They are betting football. Look what’s happened, college football Saturday, NFL Sunday, even some as early as 9 in the morning, until late night, they have an audience of 13, 14, 15 hours with constant action.

“We have a sport that moves quickly for two minutes and then has a drag of 20-25 minutes until the next ‘snap,’ so to speak. I do *not* bet football or other sports, but I am in the vast minority as we speak.

“I’ll say this to close it up, the words in a book are useless if the book is not read; the words in a speech are useless if nobody listens; the brilliant columns on *Update* are useless if the personnel that guide the future of our sport do not act upon the ideas set forth.

Next, Billy The Drummer:

“I think we need to take some really novel ideas to use to bring back and produce new fans. We have totally forgotten about this being a spectator sport and, through attrition and death, we’re losing fans as fast as we can swat a fly.

“We have now made races Grade I and Grade II, so now it’s time to take another page from the thoroughbreds to see if that will work – *different distances!*”

“I say, on mile tracks or seven-eighths, card some seven-eighths, six furlongs, 5½ and five and 4½ furlongs. Maybe even 1 1/8, 1¼ and even 1½ mile marathons on occasion with lofty purses.

“On half-milers, how about quarter-of-a-mile sprints, maybe five-sixteenths. On five-eighths mile ovals, maybe some half-mile sprints and some marathons.

“That might spice things up a little and trainers can pick and choose as the race secretary writes good purses for these odd distance events. We have nothing to lose and the novelty might prove to be worth it.

“With some guaranteed purses on these events, we might draw a little interest and, maybe, a special incentive could be thought about to draw people to the track, dollar hot dogs and soft drinks, drawings for cash or casino free play, if a casino is in charge at the specified track. Anything!”

Major Huey then said:

“To tell you the truth, I think it’s too late to make a difference. Sports betting and the lottery just have too big a grip on things now. And with the lottery machines draining the pockets of the mass, pari-mutuel racing, especially with its 17, 18, 19 per cent rake on the tote board [win, place, show] bets is much too steep to be competition to all this other stuff.

“Yes, the lottery has a *huge* rake, but the multi-million-dollar lure for a buck or two is just too strong for the millions of people

who spend a fin [\$5] or a sawbuck [\$10] to play, especially with an outlet on just about every street corner.

“I used to play the ponies big time but it’s all about sports betting and props for me these days.”

Finally, R. Phil:

“I would like to see much shorter space between races – maybe 12 minutes or so – with no drag. I think the tracks should really listen to their remaining folks who still play and take some advice from them. If they aren’t going to do that and just cater to the horsepeople, then it’s the horsepeople that have to support the betting at the windows.

“Look at what’s happened in Illinois. It was once one of the most important states for harness racing [thoroughbred racing, too] and, now, Hawthorne was only 46 days, barns are rotting away at Balmoral, which has been closed for years. Maywood is gone, Sportsman’s is history, Washington Park is long dead and buried; in fact, they just opened a casino near where it was, and we’re on life support in Chicago.

“This whole thing is tragic for us who loved harness racing, and *nobody* is doing anything. They are just letting it die. We still do have a heartbeat, and it’s in the heart of America: Indiana, Ohio, Kentucky.”

But that’s really it.

Streak continues for Little Louis in Atlantic Sires Stakes

The Atlantic Sires Stakes trotters shared the spotlight Tuesday evening (Sept. 23) as **Little Louis** won his seventh straight at Red Shores at the Summerside Raceway.

The streaking Little Louis (\$2.20) won his \$13,380 Atlantic Sires Stakes 2-year-old trotting tilt as he went to the front and eased through a mile in 2:03.3 for a seven-length victory over Hoponrocket (driven by Mike McGuigan) and Dusty Lane Margo (Jason Hughes). Corey MacPherson drove the winning son of EL Rocket for trainer Kuri White and owners East Coast Captains of Cornwall.

The other \$13,380 rookie trot division went to **Roseys El Girl** (\$4.10) who prevailed in 2:03.2 for driver Ken Murphy and owner/trainer Bill Lanigan of Montague. Bonmati (MacPherson) held second with Emberlees Rocket (Marc Campbell) third.

The 3-year-old trotters also contested a pair of \$13,000 divisions with the first bout becoming a wide-open affair with the scratch of Atlantic Sires Stakes points leader Oceanview Nikki. **Marcus Down Ridge** (\$11.20) made the most of the opportunity, trotting home in 2:02.4 to nab gold ahead of Dusty Lane Kahlua (Adam Merner) and Majian Mystery (Jim Ripley). Clare MacDonald trains and drives the winning son of Mile Hill Willie for owner Wade Silliker.

The other \$13,000 sophomore division was another MacDonald family victory as Ken MacDonald was in the race bike for trainer Clare behind the red-hot **West River Jet** (\$2.10), who controlled every step in 1:58.4 to keep a flawless top-three résumé intact this season. Supreme Rockette (McGuigan) chased throughout for the deuce with Dusty Lane Gus (Merner) third.

Corey MacPherson authored a five-win masterpiece on the evening as he won four overnight dashes to go with his stakes triumph. The Cornwall driver hit the wire first with **Princess Halo** (\$13.10) in 1:57.2 from the Garth Cole barn,

Sharky (\$4.90) in 1:57 for trainer Taylor Doyle, **Chromed Up** (\$6.90) for Chris MacKay in a swift 1:56.4, and in race 13 when **Howmac Exclusive** (\$15.90) knifed through late in 1:56.2 for trainer Les Waite.

Driver Paul Langille was a three-time winner on the night scoring with **Starship Beauty** (\$5) in 1:58 for trainer Kyle Williams, **Brookdale Johnny** (\$4.30) in the night's \$4,300 featured pace for Phil Sizer in 1:55.4 and the race 15 finale with **Brokeandoutofgas** (\$3.50) in 1:55.4 for trainer Tammy Collings.

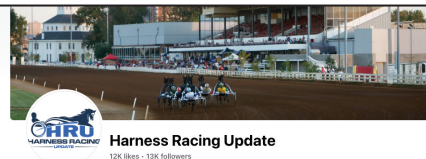
