Reporting of equipment changes needs a major reboot

Like we witnessed on Mohawk Million night, if a trainer is going shoes off, the betting public must know.

In the minutes before the Elegantimage final on Saturday (Sept. 21) at Woodbine Mohawk Park we scanned the past performances. The Pick 5 pool was going to be north of \$150,000 so it was a must play for die-hards.

The race appeared to go through the two chalk – Drawn Impression and R Melina. Two other contenders, French Champagne and Emoji Hanover, could be used, but they didn't seem near as quick as the top two based on their elimination performances.

A few minutes later, thousands of bettors who wagered \$500,000 plus into the race ripped up their tickets when the fourth choice, French Champagne, stormed home to take the chocolates.

That should be the end of the story, but we learned post-race that French Champagne received what many of us describe as the ultimate equipment change – she went barefoot. The problem, of course, was that no one knew because no one told anyone. The Svanstedt connections were fined \$500, for what was probably just an honest oversight.

However, for years and years when something like this happens the industry just says, "Oh well" and turns the page.

They shouldn't, because this story is much bigger than just an oversight.

The harness game has turned into a multi-leg wagering event where tens of millions are bet into Pick 4s, 5s and 6s. Why? High chalk hit-rates have value-seeking bettors looking for edges in these wagers; it reduces their takeout and offers them chances at a score. This has been going on for some time

A shoe change to barefoot is the ultimate change for bettors playing these sequences to know about. In my view, it's as predictive as a driver change from a hobby horse trainer with a 1987 Telstar to Yannick Gingras sitting in his brand new U.F.O. This change signals to a bettor that the horse is sound, coming into the race great, and the connections are going race their horse.

How effective is it? On Saturday, not only did French Champagne win the Elegantimage barefoot, but three races later – also in the same Pick 5 sequence, and also reported after the Pick 5 sequence started – Amazing Catch won without shoes and paid \$41.

Yes, two legs of the Pick 5 were won by horses with a huge equipment change, and bettors didn't know about it.

This isn't a Svanstedt barn or Woodbine Mohawk Park problem, nor is this about whiny customers complaining about losing a bet.

For instance, I, and others, currently spend half our time looking at the scroll of The Meadowlands changes on a stakes night waiting for this news, or turning up a John Rallis interview, wondering if he's going to ask a trainer the shoe question.

It should not be like this. And I believe it doesn't have to be.

Back around 2009 I was with the Horseplayers Association of North America, and changes were reported differently and at different times, track by track (in the thoroughbred game). On a Saturday with dozens and dozens of tracks

running, you never knew when your software would update posted changes. There was no rhyme or reason.

Our president, Jeff Platt, had a solution and contacted Equibase, the leader in data transmission for horse racing. Jeff suggested they contact tracks regarding the importance of the issue, and Equibase responded. Not long after there was not only better reporting so a customer could log into their ADW and get this information in real-time, but they added an RSS feed of changes, which could work automatically with all modern software. You could even get these changes via text on your mobile phone.

In my view, something like this has to happen for this phenomenon in harness racing.

My solution would look something like this:

An industry standard must be set where all equipment changes are disseminated to every ADW and across every track feed before race one. Many Pick 5s in this industry start on the first race of the night. Customers can not factor in an equipment or driver change *after* the sequence has already started.

In the case of going barefoot, we all know trainers have to warm up a horse before making that decision. But at the deadline for equipment changes, I'd propose they must declare they are thinking about going shoeless. This could be designated as "Possible No Shoes" on the equipment change list that's sent out before Race 1. The bettors will account for this possibility, and know to watch for it later on in the card.


When the shoeing change does happen, it must be reported on both the in-house feed and ADW feeds and relayed by the hosts and analysts.

Any horse that went barefoot last time and is going barefoot again needs to be reported, as well. We can't expect customers to know a horse went no shoes in his or her last race, because it's not noted on the program.

Horse racing's customers bet around \$2 billion each year on the harness races, and at 20 per cent blended takeout, that's works out to over \$400 million in revenue. Not only does that supply purse money, it also tells politicians and others who hold the slot purse strings that this is a viable, popular sport.

The way the industry reports equipment changes means something to customers; ergo it means something to the industry itself. And lucky for us, it's all fixable.

New Jersey appropriation approval is anything but Murphy's Law

On Thursday (Sept. 12), New Jersey Governor Phil Murphy signed **Assembly Bill 2610**, extending the annual purse appropriation through the state's fiscal year in 2029.

The annual \$20 million provided for in the bill is split evenly between thoroughbred and standardbred racing.

In a statement released upon signing the bill, Gov. Murphy said in part: "New Jersey's horse racing industry is a key economic engine, supporting thousands of jobs and attracting tourists and fans from around the world. The funding promised by this legislation will allow New Jersey to continue to offer one of the most exciting horse racing experiences in the nation, while also providing a boost to an industry that is integral to our economy.

"While I am pleased to sign this bipartisan legislation, it is important to recognize that one legislature cannot bind future legislatures with respect to prospective appropriations...





Given the critical importance of the horse racing industry to not only the State's economy, but to farmland and open space preservation, I am signing this legislation to signal my desire for the State to continue to make this investment each year at the level directed in the bill. However, the amount of the investment made each year must be evaluated and ultimately determined by the State's overall fiscal condition at that time. With these economic and legal realities in mind, I look forward to working with my partners in the Legislature to ensure that this key sector of the State's economy is supported going forward in a fiscally responsible manner that satisfies our shared constitutional obligations to enact a single appropriations law governing overall State spending needs for a single fiscal year."

Gov. Murphy has always been a staunch supporter of harness racing in the state of New Jersey and with his second term due to end in January of 2026, there could be concern about the future of the appropriation since as the Governor also said in his statement, "Consequently, the appropriations that this bill purports to require through State fiscal year 2029 are not binding and serve only as a strong expression of intent to provide funding in future fiscal years."

What the Governor was referring to in his statement are clauses in place in the State's constitution to protect it from going into debt, and therefore appropriations would not be made if they would put the State into the red financially.

Despite the fact that Gov. Murphy's term is coming to an end, and there is no way to know if the next governor would be on the side of horse racing in New Jersey, breeder Mike Gulotta feels very good about the future of the appropriation.

"When the legislature wants to do something politically, and especially to the extent that they've stood behind the industry in the last two votes on this issue, the governor is going to pay attention to that," Gulotta said. "It doesn't mean that he can't veto a piece of legislation or a part of a budget, but he did agree to do the five years."

To Gulotta's point, the legislation passed 76-0 in the Assembly and 40-0 in the Senate earlier this year.


"He has always been supportive of our industry. He came to The Meadowlands on Meadowlands Pace Night in 2021 and he articulated his support for continuing to help the industry.

"Now, your point about a subsequent governor is valid, but I still come back to the point of the legislature being so supportive and its leadership, including Craig Coughlin and Nick Scutari, being so supportive as evidenced by the fact that number one, they realize the economic impact of the industry on the state of New Jersey and the impact on open space so that's not going to change radically."

In addition to Gov. Murphy, Speaker of the Assembly Coughlin, Senate President Scutari, New Jersey State Senator Paul Sarlo and Assemblyman Erik Peterson, as well as many more, have all been very supportive of our industry.

Gulotta also mentioned that an economic impact study, put together by Econsult Solutions Inc. with data collected by the Standardbred Breeders and Owners Association of New Jersey (SBOA NJ), was done and showed that horse racing generated \$75 million for the state.

"So [\$75 million] obviously is in excess of [\$20 million]," Gulotta said. "So, you approve purse authorization for \$20 million and you

Gulotta pointed out that the way the breeding business in New Jersey has grown over the last few years by attracting new stallions shows the legislators that the appropriation is being put to good use.

In recent years, New Jersey has been strong with stallions on its trotting side — Ecurie D Dk, Muscle Hill, Tactical Landing, and Walner — but the fact that a stallion of the caliber of Perfect Sting — whose first crop will sell this year and from all accounts look impressive — has now joined Lazarus N to bolster the pacing ranks helps the business tremendously.

Gulotta also said that other forms of alternate gaming could benefit the industry.

"We've been talking with the legislators about historic race wagering," Gulotta said. "You know how wonderful the impact of historic race wagering has been on the industry in Kentucky. They went from \$600 million of handle in 2016 to \$8.2 billion of handle in 2023 with historic race wagering.

"If we got that or some other form of alternate gaming at the racetracks, the racetracks would be packed number one, and number two, we estimated it would generate over \$300 million to the state of revenue without a penny of investment. It makes perfect sense. So, the purse appropriation is a bridge to a better future. And the legislature understands that, the governor understands that, and in the interim, it's still a 75 to 20 deal."


Of the \$10 million designated for standardbred racing, the bill says that "60 per cent will be allocated to Meadowlands overnight purses; 16 per cent to Freehold overnight purses; 12 per cent to the New Jersey Sire Stakes purses; 6 per cent to purse bonuses for New Jersey sired horses; and 6 per cent for breeders awards purses."

If Freehold does indeed close on Dec. 28, as was announced on Thursday (Sept. 19), it is unclear at this point what would be done with their 16 per cent.



had to wait for some ducks to cross the road — but I stayed on point. By the time I made it to the track the rain had subsided into a slight drizzle.

My first stop Wednesday was in the "She Shed" by "The Deck" where I found Chris Tully and Nick Salvi. We chatted briefly before I decided to head out on my backstretch travels. Nick asked if he could join me and I said "sure," but I made sure to throw a leash over him since I know he loves to stray.

It was very quiet again Wednesday morning as we began our walk. That quickly changed when Tahnee Camilleri came walking by. "My panties are wet," Tahnee said with a laugh. Before anybody gets upset for me using that quote, I asked Tahnee for permission and she said to use it. We talked for a moment and Tahnee said she will likely be moving to Lexington, although she is unsure of the exact timing.

Wagering volume should be criteria in graded stakes conditions

It was announced in a press release this week that harness races that meet a set of standards and purse requirements will be characterized accordingly on graded stakes levels. This will bring North American harness racing up to par with both the international harness racing community as well as the thoroughbred industry which already utilizes a graded stakes system here in North America.

Designed to validate quality for breeding and create standardization in pedigrees, I think the idea is a nice one, but it doesn't naturally lend itself to North American harness racing.

What's most important in determining breeding value in North American harness racing is the clock, pure and simple. If a horse wins a race as a 3-year-old in a time of 1:46.2, regardless of who it's against and regardless of grading, that's going to define how that horse is promoted as a stallion. Conversely, if the same horse wins a race with a purse of a \$350,000 but it came on a half-mile track in a time of 1:50.4, it's not going to carry anything close to the appeal of the former.

Everyone already knows the races to win to have the most commercial appeal and not coincidentally, almost all of them are raced on the larger sized tracks. I understand that when a G1, G2 or G3 designation appears throughout pedigrees in a sales catalog that it could make a horse stand out more, but I'm not sure that's much different than the current sales pages today where due to lenient qualifications, most horses in the

pages already appear in bold face capitals.

What I find as better serving to the industry is the lesser emphasized part of the announcement, which was the grading system being used as "a marketing tool for racetracks to use to promote

their races...", as quoted from USTA director and vice president of Penn Entertainment, Chris McErlean. The quote is particularly notable coming from McErlean, whose Penn Gaming co-owns the soon to be shut down, historic Freehold Raceway.

In the wake of the Freehold news, every new measure proposed in the sport should be viewed from the question of: Will this help to ensure the racetrack survival? In this case, it doesn't seem there is a real issue in the horse sales business or having ways to accurately assess horses for sale. The racetracks on the other hand are a different story. Within a day of the news of Freehold closing, it was announced that Chicago harness racing was given just 40 dates of racing at Hawthorne for all of 2025.

If the graded stakes system is truly meant to be used as a marketing tool in the slightest way, then I would propose that there needs to be a wagering component tied to the graded status. It's completely counterproductive and does nothing for the promotion of a track where horses race for big money purses with non-existent crowds present to watch, and race handles that come nowhere close to matching the race purses offered. For a harness race to carry graded significance especially with a grade 1, then people actually have to care about it. There needs to be attendance and/or handle measures that also determine the prestige of the event.

For The Meadowlands and Woodbine Mohawk Park, there is already more than sufficient handle that contributes to the success of all their races, which would now be considered graded stakes. That's what makes nights like this past Saturday's Mohawk Million and Metro Pace card at Mohawk special. Many of the races that night would easily warrant graded stakes designation not only because of the quality of the fields, but also because there is a real public interest in those races, and it was reflected in the amount wagered.

As for most other tracks, how is it benefitting them to have a grade 1 race go for \$500,000 with \$50,000 wagered on it? What is that doing to ensure the future survival of that track?

Take the Dexter Cup at Freehold; traditionally the unofficial first stakes race each year on the road to the Hambletonian. Would it have made any difference for the viability of that track if the Dexter Cup carried a graded stake designation? Of

course not. But what if the track always had a sustained effort to maximize handle for at least their biggest days. That could have made it an event worth watching, worthy of carrying a special stakes designation.

This isn't meant to paint a broad brush over every track other than The Meadowlands and Woodbine Mohawk Park. There are other tracks that while smaller, do put on an enthusiastic show for their big races. The easiest example is the annual Gold Cup and Saucer at Red Shores Racetrack in Charlottetown, PEI, just won recently by Jordan Stratton and Covered Bridge.

For the crowds and electric environment that race brings out at Red Shores, I'd give that race graded status over a race of comparable horse quality at another track that feigns caring once a year.

The point is for the graded stakes schedule to be used as a track's marketing tool, it's no use if it's just for one day out of the year. Tracks with the privilege of playing host to the sport's stakes events should have to try to generate enough public interest to make them successful. If a horse wins a grade 1 event and gets his mark in the sales catalog, what does that do for the track that didn't produce any handle or attendance from the event and ends up becoming the next eventual track to shut down due to lack of interest?

On the other hand, if tracks are mandated to generate enough interest in the big races to carry a graded status, that could lead to promotion of not only those races but their entire product year-round. Maybe it's a dream, but it could be carried through to lead to increased attendance, handle, and ownership – things that could save those tracks from becoming the next line to suffer the fate of Freehold.

Seelster and Winbak hope Lexington spotlight shines back on Ontario

The two Ontario breeding farms are selling some of their Ontario-sired yearlings in Lexington partly in the hope that it helps grow business for their stallions.

Ontario-sired horses routinely appear and perform on the biggest stages in North American harness racing, so it only makes sense to have them on full display at the major U.S. sales.

That was the shared sentiment from Seelster Farms reproduction manager Ann Straatman and Winbak Canada farm manager Pat Woods ahead of the 2024 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale (Sept. 30 – Oct. 4).

In their respective positions, Straatman and Woods represent two of Ontario racing's biggest and most successful standardbred breeding operations.

As such, the pair is well-schooled on how important it is to feature a selection of premier Ontario-sired horses in their yearling sale catalogs.

"I think we've seen a direct correlation in racing, where Ontariosired horses have arrived on the world stage and have shown to be competitive and dominant," said Straatman. "I truly believe there is a place for Ontario-sired horses in the entire North American market, not just Ontario.

"There are some exceptional individuals out there that deserve the spotlight."

Woods specifically pointed to the stoutness of the Ontario Sires Stakes program as a key indicator of the province's breeding prowess.

"I might be a little biased, but I definitely think if it's not the best, it's one of the best sire stakes programs out there," Woods said. "And I think we prove on a regular basis that Ontario-bred horses contend well at the Grand Circuit level."

Woods singled out Nijinsky (11 9-1-0, \$1.097 million banked in 2024), and Chantilly, who remained a perfect seven-for-seven to begin her career with a She's A Great Lady score on Sept. 21, as prime examples of Ontario-sired superstars dominating on the Big Wheel.

While not all horses are Grand Circuit caliber, Woods said the Ontario program is far more than a fallback option.

"It is a great place to race your horses and make good money," he said.

Of the 946 yearlings included in this year's Lexington Sale catalog, 80 are Ontario-sired.

Winbak's consignment accounts for 28 of the Ontario-sired crop, and Seelster's for three.


Despite the latter's modest quantity, there is an overwhelming buzz surrounding the quality of the Lucan, ON, farm's trio of first crop Bulldog Hanover yearlings.

Known as the fastest standardbred of all time, the unanimous 2022 Dan Patch Horse of the Year and 2023 Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame inductee's first progeny has been the driving force behind Seelster's first Lexington appearance in quite some time.

So, why now?

As Straatman put it, the premier sale is a superb opportunity for buyers from all around the world, including Ontario, to lay eyes on top-shelf yearlings.

"There are a lot of Ontario buyers at the Lexington sale, so it may very well be that they're making a trip only to bring home an Ontario-sired yearling," said Straatman.



"Our entire industry is small in the grand scheme of things. I consider North America to be very closely knit in that most of the Ontario buyers, trainers, and owners do travel to the Lexington Sale, and it was our intention to focus on these yearlings, to bring more of a worldwide recognition to them."

Bikini Seelster is one Bulldog Hanover youngster that Straatman is particularly bullish on leading into the sale.

She believes that featuring the bay filly — whose brother Boxer Seelster is performing quite well on the Grand Circuit — in Lexington will afford the Seelster yearling greater exposure than usual.

"There's only nine Bulldog Hanovers consigned in the Lexington sale, eight colts and one filly [Bikini Seelster], and I think she would bring some appeal to buyers that normally wouldn't have the opportunity to have a look at what Seelster has to offer," she said.

Visibility is an important aspect of selling at major U.S. sales for Woods and Winbak, as well.

Over one-third of the Inglewood, ON, facility's Lexington catalog is composed of Ontario-sired yearlings.

Ontario-bred horse to bring back and race, they will, but they'll also look at other sires as well.

"We give them a chance to see everything we have, and it also helps with our breeding programs as well."

As Woods alluded to, having a strong presence at top U.S. sales has also opened the door for additional networking opportunities between breeders.

"Down there, the other farms will come around and look to see what a McWicked looks like or a Betterthancheddar to decide if they like them, then they'll breed some of their mares to it," he said.

"Lots of times, we have other farms come over and talk to us about the stallions that we stand here in Ontario and want to get involved in the program up here, because they understand the quality that we're showcasing."

Landing impressive stallions has long been part of the Winbak tradition according to Woods.

Recent acquisitions include a pair of accomplished racehorses in Beach Glass and Lawless Shadow, who together will look to fill the large void left by the most effective and reliable sire in the history of the sport.

"Unfortunately, Bettors Delight won't be breeding in Ontario anymore, only the southern hemisphere, as he's down there to retire and live out his days," Woods said.

"There's a bit of a hole left for him that some of these other stallions will be able to step up and take on some more mares, or hopefully even some better mares, because Bettors Delight used to get an outstanding book."

Woods directly praised Ontario-sired mares, crediting them for continually producing leading stallions.

"We're seeing quality horses come out of Ontario-sired mares as well," he said. "It really emphasizes the overall strength of our breeding program."

For Straatman and Seelster, that signature Ontario imprint is evident at yearling sales both at home and stateside.

Whether at the Western Fair District's thriving London Classic Yearling Sale, where the farm plans to sell most of its renowned Bulldog Hanover assortment, or some 460 miles southwest in Lexington, Straatman knows that the prominent players don't miss a beat.

"This is an opportunity for Seelster, owning eight and selling 10 Bulldog Hanover yearlings from his first crop that we wanted to get as many eyes on them as we could," Straatman said.

"There's plenty of Ontario buyers going to all the major sales and those are astute buyers that are looking at as many horses as they can in order to create the best stable for themselves next year."

As for the trio of Seelster yearlings heading to Lexington, Straatman is confident they will stand out amongst an already deep sales roster.

"We're excited about these three," she said. "They're impeccable individuals, and just so lucky that we were able to get them into the Lexington sale. I think people will be impressed with what they see.

"It's an outstanding catalog that we're really pleased to be part of."

Woods said he is hopeful that Give Me A Shot, a Cattlewash pacing filly out of one of the farm's most reliable mares in Doctor Terror, will return the same enthusiasm for Winbak's Lexington consignment.

"She was a mare that I had up here in Ontario," he said. "She's since moved down to the U.S. farm, just because we wanted her to go to a U.S. stallion. But she was always a favorite of ours up here at the farm. She was a little grumpy, but she was always predictable, and I always liked her because she was a nice racehorse."

Riding in the wave of Ontario-sired horses, Woods is keen on another successful stint in Lexington for Winbak.

"We always have a strong response down at the sales," said Woods. "We have a lot of people that come over to look at our crops. We get a lot of compliments on how good our yearlings look. And that all goes to Jim Ladwig and the people that work for us. They take pride in making our yearlings look great and I think it shows on the racetrack.

"We have lots of winners every year across the different programs, and we're just going to keep trying to make good racehorses."





Papi Grad grand in Bluegrass victory

Steve Carter trainee **Papi Grad**, in the face of a far-turn blitz, remained resolute and rebuffed first-over challenger Looksgoodinloulou to coast to a 1:51 victory in the second of four divisions of the \$387,500 Bluegrass 2-year-old filly pace on Thursday afternoon (Sept. 26) at The Red Mile.

Leaving from post 6, driver Dexter Dunn floated Papi Grad forward to grab the helm from Faze (driven by Tim Tetrick) passing a :27.4 first quarter. She strolled up the backside to a :56.1 half while her tracking peers plotted their move against the 1-2 favorite. Looksgoodinloulou (Yannick Gingras) flirted with a move off the cones until nobody flushed, so Gingras launched her forward and quickly advanced to look Papi Grad in the eyes through the final turn. The pair spun off three-quarters in 1:24.1 in tandem and remained toe-to-toe until Looksgoodinloulou began to waver nearing the final eighth. Papi Grad held her ground to the inside and easily thwarted her rival's push, crossing the line $1\frac{3}{4}$ lengths

better than Looksgoodinloulou in a lifetime-best effort. Faze gave chase for third and Au Jus Hanover (Andy McCarthy) saved ground for fourth.

"We've been very, very lucky to have a filly like this," co-owner Jay Mossbarger said after the race. "She's been good from the start – one of those kinds that always did everything right. We've got one more start left here and we're probably going to shut her down. We've had enough starts for her this year."

Never missing the board from nine starts and now a six-time winner, Papi Grad added to a bankroll now worth \$262,778 for owners Brent Hopper, Jay Mossbarger, TKO Racing Stable LLC and SCP Stable & Friedland Racing. The filly by Papi Rob Hanover returned \$3.18 to win.

Rodeo Drive Deo (David Miller) delivered as the 6-5 chalk in the first division of the Bluegrass 2-year-old filly pace with a golden tow to a 1:51 win.

Miller settled Rodeo Drive Deo into fifth as Accede (Gingras) slid from post 6 to the top through a :28.1 first quarter. She soon settled for a pocket trip when Bytheliteofthemoon (Dunn) circled from second to take the lead and up the tempo as the field moved for a :55.4 half. Rodeo Drive Deo tipped from the pylons and caught cover to follow from 12-1 Simply Perfect (Todd McCarthy), but lost ground on her cover rounding the final turn.

Simply Perfect zoomed forward, disposed of Bytheliteofthemoon after three-quarters in 1:23.3 and spun for home on a wide lead as Rodeo Drive Deo began shifting gears to the center of the track. With each stride, Rodeo Drive Deo shifted gears and vaulted forward to zip by Simply Perfect in the last sixteenth and win by two lengths. Simply Perfect held second as Beckoning Yankee (A. McCarthy) closed ground but just missed in third. Accede circumvented the tiring Bytheliteofthemoon and finished a level fourth.

A daughter of Captaintreacherous, Rodeo Drive Deo has now won two times from six starts and banked \$109,957 for owners Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Bruscemi, Beasty LLC and J & T Silva—Purnel & Libby. She paid \$4.54 to win.

Miki And Minnie (Dunn) methodically pounced from a secondover ride to a 1:51 win as the 1-5 favorite in the third division of the Bluegrass filly pace.

Away fourth to a :28 first quarter, Miki And Minnie stayed in position as Sweet Ballad (Gingras) soon traded the lead for a pocket ride to Champagne Room (A. McCarthy) moving for



a :55.2 half. Dunn looked to tip cover for Miki And Minnie, flushed a ride from Sammy Jo Hanover (Tim Tetrick) heading for the final turn and perched into a striking position heading to three-quarters in 1:23.2. Dunn sprung Miki And Minnie off the helmet turning for home and spurted away as Duration (T. McCarthy) made inroads from a third-over trip to snag second, beaten a length. Champagne Room held third another five lengths behind and Sammy Jo Hanover settled for fourth.

"She's getting plenty of wins and is just a good girl," trainer Chris Ryder said after the race. He then said he's undecided on whether Miki And Minnie will race next week in the International Stallion Stakes at The Red Mile, but confirmed she is bound for the Breeders Crown.

Winning her fourth race from eight starts, Miki And Minnie has earned \$318,750 for owner/breeders Craig Henderson, Robert Mondillo and Lawrence Minowitz. The daughter of Always B Miki paid \$2.52 to win.

Odds-on choice **Unreasonable** (Scott Zeron) ripped home in the final Bluegrass division to notch a 1:51 victory.

Unreasonable raced fourth as Shes A Streaker (Gingras) carved an early clip of :28 and :55.2, but she received reminders around the final turn as Ronstadt (T. McCarthy) waited anxiously from a tightening pocket. Ronstadt slipped from the pylons to the outside heading to three-quarters in 1:23.2, giving Unreasonable a helmet to track rounding for home. Zeron then sent the Huntsville filly down the center of the track and seized the lead from a stubborn Shes A Streaker

to then hold off a late ground-saving bid by Calamity Hour (Dunn) by three-quarters-of-a-length. Shes A Streaker lost the photo in the last stride and settled for third while Ronstadt finished an even fourth.

"She's a really nice filly [and] has a great attitude for a Huntsville," trainer Erv Miller said after the race. "Most of them get a little carried away with wanting to go too much at the wrong time. We've worked on her hard from the start but she's really manageable and does whatever we want."

Miller trains Unreasonable for his Ervin Miller Stable Inc. and David J. Miller. She won her third race from seven starts, has now earned \$138,550 and paid \$2.54 to win.

The first two divisions of the \$310,000 Bluegrass 2-year-old filly pace were named "The Beach Glass" and sponsored by the Beach Glass Syndicate and Winbak Farm. The last two divisions were named "The Perfect Sting" and sponsored by Brittany Farms.

MAXIMUS MEARAS S STAYS UNBEATEN WITH BLUEGRASS WIN

Lucas Wallin trainee **Maximus Mearas S** made a successful leap into Grand Circuit company with a come-from-behind score in 1:54 to take the second of five divisions of the \$387,500 Bluegrass 2-year-old colt trot at The Red Mile on Thursday afternoon (Sept. 26).

Maximus Mearas S (driven by Scott Zeron) landed in fourth as Themoneyisback S (Jim Oscarsson) scampered forward from the pylon post to carry the field by the first quarter in :28.2 and to the half in :56.2. Themoneyisback S started to tire into the final turn, prompting Blue Cartier (David Miller) to pop pocket as a contingent of closers narrowed in to three-quarters, timed in 1:25.4. Maximus Mearas S fanned four wide for the stretch drive and swooped from the pack with the most momentum to grab a half-length win over late-leader Elan Hanover (Todd McCarthy), who settled for second. Blue Cartier finished third another 3½ lengths back and Verse Nine (Andy McCarthy) took fourth.

Undefeated from three starts, Maximus Mearas S has banked \$52,295 for owner Kjell Magne Andersen. The colt by Chapter Seven, out of stakes-winning mare Darling Mearas S, paid \$4.46 to win.

Ron Burke pupil **Tactical Dynasty** returned to the winner's circle following back-to-back breaks in stride with a 1:54.3 effort in the first Bluegrass division for 2-year-old trotting colts.


Leaving from post 8, Tactical Dynasty (driven by Yannick Gingras) inched forward through an early shuffle and planted onto the point after a :29.3 first quarter, pocketing 1-2 favorite The Rogue Prince (Tim Tetrick). Tactical Dynasty continued on a comfortable lead through a :57.3 and by three-quarters in 1:26.4 as The Rogue Prince waited to make his attack on the leader.


The Rogue Prince pulled outside into the stretch and pressed into Tactical Dynasty, but lost stride through his challenge in the final eighth. Tactical Dynasty continued unfettered and registered a 1% length win over The Rogue Prince, whose break in the stretch forced his disqualification to fourth. Hey Porter (Dexter Dunn) rallied from last for second through the disqualification and Memento Mori also closed, taking third from the placing.

A colt by Tactical Landing, Tactical Dynasty won his third race from eight starts and has now earned \$103,805 for owners Burke Racing Stable LLC, Phillip Collura, Lawrence Karr and J & T Silva—Purnel & Libby. He paid \$18.70 to win.

Gap Kronos S towered over the field in the final eighth of the third Bluegrass 2-year-old colt trot to stop the clock in 1:54.3 drawing away.

Trainer/driver Ake Svanstedt settled Gap Kronos S into fourth as 7-5 favorite Portobarosso As NL (Andy Miller) attempted to lead from pillar to post, clocking a :27.4 first quarter and a :57.4 half before the backfield came calling. Gimpanzee Dancer (Tim Tetrick) marched first over to the final turn with Gap Kronos S on his back and pressured Portobarosso As NL to three-quarters in 1:26.4. Portobarosso As NL had no answer to the challenge and Gimpanzee Dancer forged forward in





the stretch, but couldn't clench the lead as Svanstedt sent his charge to the center of the course and glided over the ground to a widening 2¾ length win. Gimpanzee Dancer settled for second, Civilian Drone (Scott Zeron) snagged third from a pylon trip and Portobarosso As NL faded to fourth.

"He's really big, but he can trot," Svanstedt said after the race. Svanstedt also noted, after the colt warmed up clumsy, that he pulled the back shoes ahead of the colt's lifetime-best win.

A colt by Face Time Bourbon, Gap Kronos S collected his second win from five starts and pushed his bankroll to \$51,395 for owner Bruni Racing Team Inc. He paid \$17.72 to win.

Blank (Dexter Dunn) took the win in the fourth Bluegrass colt trot division via disqualification of first-place finisher Go Dog Go (Todd McCarthy), who broke stride and stayed on a gallop crossing the line in the 1:54.3 mile.

Dunn took command with Blank out of post 4 to a :29.2 first quarter and trotted on a comfortable lead to a :58.1 half. Go Dog Go, racing in third, bided his time until hitting the far turn when McCarthy gave him the cue to roll. Go Dog Go pushed past Blank after three-quarters in 1:26.4, and the pair kicked for home by a widening margin from the rest of the field. Go Dog Go tried to stay smooth inside the final eighth but wobbled into a gallop within the last sixteenth and could not return to a trot. He finished three-quarters of a length in front of Blank at the finish, but was disqualified to fifth for violation of the breaking rule. Monserrate (David Miller) closed and was elevated to second with Channing (Yannick Gingras) third and Onemore Volo (Andy McCarthy) fourth.

Marcus Melander trains Blank, a colt by Gimpanzee, for owners S R F Stable and Holly Land Stud East Ltd. He won his second race from six starts, has now banked \$102,650 and paid \$13.74 to win.

Trainer/driver Ake Svanstedt collected another Bluegrass win with a pillar-to-post job by 4-5 favorite **Happy Jack B** in the closing split, timed in 1:54.1.

Svanstedt had little problem getting Happy Jack B to the top and was left to cut a sensible tempo of :29, :57.2 and 1:26.3. Durante Hanover (Dexter Dunn) tried to make inroads first over but flattened rounding the bottom corner as Happy Jack B hit the accelerator. The Chapter Seven colt scurried clear of the competition and kept chugging over the line to post a three-length win over Hidalgo (Yannick Gingras), who rallied from second over for second. Pocket-chaser Mountcastle (Scott Zeron) faded to third and Ketel One Up (Andy McCarthy) came from third over for fourth.

"He has been hustling a little bit in New York on the smaller tracks, but it was nice to see him back on the big track and open him up," Sarah Svanstedt said after the race. "He was very nice today."

Happy Jack B won his second race from six starts and has now earned \$140,996 for owners B. Nasstrom Holding Inc.,

Wolfgang A. Stable Inc. and Joe Sbrocco & JAF Racing. He paid \$3.94 to win.

The first two divisions of the \$387,500 Bluegrass 2-year-old colt trot were named "The Captain Corey" and sponsored by the Captain Corey Syndicate and Hanover Shoe Farms and the remaining three divisions went under different monikers. Division three was named "The Father Patrick" and sponsored by Al Libfeld Equine, division four went as "The Muscle Mass" sponsored by Kentuckiana Farms and the closing division was named "The What The Hill" sponsored by Harness Racing Update.

Live racing at The Red Mile resumes today (Sept. 27) with six divisions of the \$413,900 Bluegrass 2-year-old filly trot and three divisions of the \$350,000 Bluegrass 2-year-old colt pace. First-race post time at The Red Mile is 1 p.m. (EDT)





Champagne Problems leads today's nine Bluegrass divisions

Fresh from her 1:54 win in the \$305,000 Jim Doherty Memorial, Champagne Problems treks southward to The Red Mile to compete in the first of six Bluegrass divisions for 2-year-old trotting fillies this afternoon (Sept. 27), a card which includes three Bluegrass dashes for 2-year-old pacing colts and geldings.

Champagne Problems, a four-time winner from seven outings with \$327,504 in the bank, starts from post 2 in the opening trotting filly split as the 6-5 morning-line chalk. Dexter Dunn stays in the bike of the Nancy Takter-trained daughter of Tactical Landing who took her 1:52.3 lifetime mark in winning the \$240,000 New Jersey Sire Stakes final on Hambletonian Day.

The second division of the filly trot, going as the race following, sees Royal Mission make her first start since finishing third to Champagne Problems in the Jim Doherty Memorial. Scott Zeron steers the Marcus Melander-trained Chapter Seven filly who won the \$225,000 New York Sire Stakes final two starts ago and, before that, an elimination of the Peaceful Way Stakes. A full sister to Canadian Trotting Classic winners Ahundreddollarbill (2021) and Slay (2022), Royal Mission races from post 4; to the left flank of evenmoney morning-line favorite Country Victory, who enters off a second-place finish in the Standardbred Stakes at the Delaware County Fair and picks up Yannick Gingras in the bike for trainer Melvin Schmucker.

A stacked octet aligns for the third Bluegrass filly trot in race 4. Aperfect Annie, off her 29-1 upset in the \$400,000 Kentucky Championship Series final, lands post 2 in her Grand Circuit debut against a group that includes R Dutchess, third-place finisher in the \$288,600 Peaceful Way Stakes, and Deja Blu, winner of the \$100,000 Kentucky Commonwealth final and a daughter of 2018 Hambletonian winner Atlanta. Todd McCarthy pilots Aperfect Annie for trainer Carter Pinske

while Canadian Jody Jamieson will again come south to drive R Dutchess from post 4 for John Butenschoen. Deja Blu, a Nancy Takter trainee, races from post 8 in rein to Gingras.

Division 4 features the Grand Circuit debut of Kadena, a filly from the first crop of Gimpanzee out of world champion mare Mission Brief; herself still the record holder for the fastest mile by a 2-year-old trotting filly from her 1:50.3 scorcher over The Red Mile in 2014. Kadena has finished no worse than second in her five starts with two visits to the winner's circle. Dunn drives the Kentucky Commonwealth runner-up and \$800,000 yearling purchase from post 5 for conditioner Marcus Melander.

New Jersey Classic runner-up Delaney Hanover holds high expectations as the 4-5 morning-line favorite in the fifth Bluegrass split for trotting fillies. Todd McCarthy sticks with the Lucas Wallin-trained Muscle Hill filly off her fourth-place finish as the 4-5 choice in the Jim Doherty Memorial on Sept. 13. She'll start from post 2 alongside Melander pupil Margareta Hanover, a daughter of Maharajah and a half-sister to current leading trotter in North America Jiggy Jog S, in the field of seven.

Luna Lovegood will attempt to course correct from her fourth-place finish in the \$400,000 Kentucky Championship Series final as the even-money favorite when she starts from post 7 in the sixth and final Bluegrass division for trotting fillies. The Gimpanzee filly, who pocket popped to a 1:51.4 lifetime mark earlier this year at The Red Mile, retains Dunn against a group that features Spicy Nice, a Takter-trained daughter of Tactical Landing out of champion mare Maven. Spicy Nice, with one win on her card from seven starts, races from post 3 with Andy McCarthy between the wheels.

Two Bluegrass divisions for 2-year-old trotting fillies go as "The Norman Woolworth Memorial" and three as

the "Margareta Wallenius-Kleberg Memorial." Both are sponsored by Arden Homestead Stable, E.T. Gerry, Jr. and Peter Gerry, Stoner Manor Inc., Menhammer Stuteri AB, Jorgen Jahre, Jr., LST Stables, Lawrence DeVan and William DeVan. The last Bluegrass 2-Year-Old Filly Trot goes as the Arlene Siegel Memorial and is sponsored by Jules Siegel and Fashion Farms.

Freshman pacing colts and geldings also compete in three divisions of the \$350,000 Stay Hungry Bluegrass Stakes, sponsored by the Stay Hungry Syndicate and Hanover Shoe Farms, this afternoon.

Today's card opens with the first division of the Stay Hungry, which gathers nine behind the starting gate including Caviart Act Two, a Takter-trained Captain Crunch filly out of champion pacing mare Caviart Ally, from post 3. A. McCarthy pilots Caviart Act Two following her steady rally from post 10 to finish fifth in the \$50,000 Kentucky Golden Rod final on Sept. 17. She is listed at 10-1 on the morning line in a race where Travis Alexander trainee Lochlan Hanover earns morning-line favoritism at 5-2 from post 9 following a third-place effort in a 1:51.4 mile in a \$38,500 Reynolds Memorial division at Tioga Downs.

Ayeaye Captain Deo, who missed the Metro Pace final with a sixth-place effort in his elimination, also competes in the first division from post 8 just to the outside of Wavemaker,

a Tony Alagna trainee who finished third in the \$100,000 Kentucky Commonwealth final.

Pacing colts and geldings return to action in race 7 for the second division of the Stay Hungry. Banderas, who dodged the Kentucky Golden Rod final to try his hand in Canada and finished fifth in the \$740,000 Metro Pace, returns to The Red Mile and starts as the 2-1 morning-line chalk. James MacDonald will travel down to drive the Alagna-trained Tall Dark Stranger colt, out of Breeders Crown winner Reflect With Me, from post 6.

Delray Beach, winner of the \$50,000 Kentucky Golden Rod final, also races in the second division. Gingras sticks with the Takter trainee, a colt by Tall Dark Stranger out of stakesplaced mare Idyllic Beach, and competes from post 3.

The final division of the Stay Hungry pins Thirsty Thursday and American Son against six other foes. Thirsty Thursday, an Alexander-trained colt by Huntsville, competes from post 3 off a third-place finish as the 4-5 favorite in the \$225,000 New York Sires Stakes final back on Sept. 7. He's drawn alongside Chris Ryder trainee American Son, an American Ideal colt who faded to third in the \$400,000 Kentucky Championship Series final back on Sept. 15. Dunn sticks with American Son from post 4.

Today's card features 15 races on the program. First-race post time is 1 p.m. (EDT).





Twin B Joe Fresh and Jiggy Jog S lead big Grand Circuit night in Dayton

Harness racing's two highest ranked horses in the Hambletonian Society/Breeders Crown poll, No. 1 Twin B Joe Fresh and No. 2 Jiggy Jog S, will be in action Saturday (Sept. 28) at Hollywood Dayton Raceway and, as usual, Dexter Dunn will have a great seat to watch them go.

Dunn drives and co-owns Twin B Joe Fresh, a 4-year-old mare who brings an eight-race win streak to the \$250,000 Dayton Distaff Derby for older female pacers. He also drives Jiggy Jog S, a 5-year-old mare who brings a nine-race victory streak to the \$250,000 Dayton Oaks for older female trotters.

The Distaff and Oaks are part of a stakes-loaded 14-race card that also includes the \$250,000 Dayton Pacing Derby and \$250,000 Dayton Trotting Derby, as well as eight Ohio Sire Stakes events for 2-year-olds. Racing begins at 6:30 p.m. (EDT).

Twin B Joe Fresh, trained by Chris Ryder, heads to the Dayton Distaff off a one-length win over Sylvia Hanover in 1:49.1 in the Milton Stakes on Sept. 14 at Woodbine Mohawk Park. The daughter of Roll With Joe—Fresh Breeze has started nine times this year, with her only loss a second-place finish in a conditioned race against male rivals in her season debut.

In her start prior to the Milton, Twin B Joe Fresh won the Cleopatra Invitational at Eldorado Scioto Downs in a track-record 1:48.2. She also captured the Betsy Ross Invitational earlier this year at Harrah's Philadelphia with a stakes- and track-record 1:48.2 effort.

"She's been great," said Dunn, who owns Twin B Joe Fresh with Ryder, Peter Trebotica, and Barry Spak. "She hasn't done much wrong this year. She's gotten a lot stronger finishing her races off. I'm really happy with her."

Twin B Joe Fresh will leave from post 3 in the nine-horse Dayton Distaff field, which also includes millionaires Sylvia Hanover and Strong Poison (plus Prohibition Legal, who has topped \$1 million in Canadian earnings).

For her career, Twin B Joe Fresh has hit the board in 34 of 36 career races, winning 27 and earning \$1.93 million. She has been ranked No. 1 in the Hambletonian Society/Breeders Crown poll for 11-consecutive weeks.

Jiggy Jog S, who is 5-for-5 this season, has been ranked no lower than No. 6 in the 15 weeks of this year's poll. She has been No.

2 for three-consecutive weeks. She enters the Dayton Oaks off a Sept. 7 win in the million-dollar MGM Yonkers International Trot, where she defeated Periculum by 3½ lengths at the distance of 1¼ miles.

"She was awesome," Dunn said. "She couldn't have done it much easier. I know we got pretty good fractions, but she just felt awesome."

A three-week layoff since the International Trot should not pose a problem for Jiggy Jog S, who is trained by Ake Svanstedt and accustomed to such a schedule. On Aug. 3, she won the John Cashman Memorial in a rainstorm at The Meadowlands in a stakes- and track-record 1:49.2 off a five-week respite. Only two female trotters in history, Manchego and Atlanta, have gone faster.

"She's very athletic," Dunn said. "It's not like she needs a lot of racing to become fit. She's pretty naturally fit, I think. That's the way they train her."

Jiggy Jog S, the 2023 Dan Patch Award winner for best older female trotter, has hit the board in 35 of 40 career races, winning 23 and earning \$2.97 million. The daughter of Walner—Hot Mess Hanover is owned by Ake Svanstedt Inc., Steve Stewart, John Lengacher, and Hickory Hollow Stables.

Dunn and Jiggy Jog S will leave from post 6 in the nine-horse field, which also includes millionaires M-M's Dream and Refined. Jiggy Jog S won last year's edition of the Dayton Oaks, a victory that launched her current win streak.

In the Dayton Pacing Derby, Dunn will drive millionaire Abuckabett Hanover for trainer Andrew Harris. The 6-year-old stallion is coming off back-to-back second-place finishes, in the Hoosier Park Pacing Derby and Canadian Pacing Derby, by the total of a nose more than a quarter-length. His four victories in nine starts this year include the William R. Haughton Memorial and Dave Brower Memorial, both at The Meadowlands.

Dunn won the Pacing Derby in 2022 with Bulldog Hanover and in 2020 with Bettor's Wish.

This year's field includes Hoosier Park Pacing Derby winner Little Rocket Man, Canadian Pacing Derby winner It's My Show, Dan Patch Stakes winner Dunkin', and Sam McKee Memorial winner Rocknroll Runa A.

The field for the Dayton Trotting Derby includes returning champion Hillexotic, from the stable of trainer Todd Luther. Dunn will drive millionaire Logan Park for trainer Robert Fellows, marking his first time behind the 6-year-old gelding. Logan Park finished fourth in the International Trot and bounced back with a win in the open at Mohawk on Sept. 21.

Svanstedt-trained Southwind Tyrion, who won the Crawford Farms Open in 1:49.2 on June 29 at The Meadowlands, also is part of the nine-horse group, as is Ron Burke-trained It's Academic, who captured the 2023 Dan Patch Award for best older male trotter.

Jon I Love Dat Iowers mark in Massachusetts Breeders Stake

There was \$315,000 in purses available for state-bred 2-year-old trotters and pacers of both sexes in the first leg of the Massachusetts Breeders Stake for first-year participants at Plainridge Park on Tuesday (Sept. 24) afternoon. Three of the divisions went in two \$40,000 splits with trotting colts and geldings going a lone heat for \$75,000.

The pacing colts and geldings went in two groups and they were highlighted by the performance of **Jon I Love Dat** (Downbytheseaside—Franney Love Dat) who set a new Massachusetts Breeders Stake record.

Mitchell Cushing put Jon I Love Dat on the point and paced unchallenged through quarters of :27.1, :56.4 and 1:24.3. When he reached the stretch, Jon I Love Dat continued his dominance and paced to the wire without any urging and won by two lengths in 1:52.4, setting the new stakes record.

Jon I Love Dat (\$6.20) was bred by his owner Robert Lovett and is trained by Chuck Connor, Jr.

The other group of pacing males was bested by **Digging** For Gold (Huntsville—Gold Orchid N) who got his first Mass stakes victory.

Silent Weapon (Marcus Miller) was leading at the quarter, but Scott Zeron had Digging For Gold out and rolling from third and grabbed the lead past that station. Digging For Gold continued to lead through three-quarters where Seafood Star (Matty Athearn) made an outside bid towards the leader from third. Digging For Gold and Seafood Star battled through the turn and into the lane where Digging For Gold stayed strong and won by 1¾ lengths in 1:53.4.

It was the fifth win in the last six starts for Digging For Gold (\$3.20) who is owned by his trainer George Ducharme, in partnership with Jim Winske and Dr. Megan Moschgat.

Bamq was the breeder of Digging For Gold.

The trotting fillies also went behind the gate and **Corner Store** (Six Pack—Seven Eleven) made quick work of her rivals in the lone non-betting event.

Yannick Gingras had Corner Store on the point and ahead by two lengths while tripping the timer in :30.4, 1:01.4 and

1:31.2. Corner Store then turned for home and stretched out to a 3¼-length victory in 1:59.4.

Corner Store is owned by her trainer Paul Kelley, in partnership with Matthew Lamont, Ellen Palillo and Leo Bauer.

William Johnson was the breeder for Corner Store.

In the second division of trotting fillies, **Bridgeoverbroadway** (Six Pack—Black Broadway) opened up a huge advantage early and stayed tough to close it out late.

Troy Beyer unleashed Bridgeoverbroadway and she opened up a six-length gap at the :27.2 quarter. Bridgeoverbroadway maintained her growing and seemingly insurmountable lead to eight lengths at the half and continued onto the backstretch. It was there that Riviera Princess (Gingras) started picking up the slack and was reeling in Bridgeoverbroadway with every stride. When they got to the head of the stretch, Bridgeoverbroadway's lead was down to two lengths and Riviera Princess was still closing in. But at the wire, Bridgeoverbroadway hung on to a half-length lead and won in 1:56.2.

The time was a new lifetime mark for the winner and was only one-fifth-of-a-second off the stakes record.

Bridgeoverbroadway (\$5.60) is owned by her trainer Mike Eaton, in partnership with Bob McHugh. Eaton/McHugh also bred their winner.

In the first of two races for pacing fillies, **Beantown Deuce** (Huntsville—Don't Think Twice) settled in second behind American Lilly (Steven Rybka) who took the field to three-quarters in 1:28.4. It was there that Brett Beckwith pulled Beantown Deuce from the pocket and put her in play. Beantown Deuce was in full flight as she collared American Lilly and paced home on top by a length in 1:56.4, which was a new lifetime mark.

Beantown Deuce (\$9.80) is owned by Michael Goldberg Racing and trained by George Ducharme.

Beantown Deuce was bred by Michael Goldberg and Andrew Harris.

Harness Racing Update

The second group of pacing fillies saw **It's Crunch Time** (Captain Crunch—Meghan Lynn) pace away and hide in a lifetime best effort.

Gingras put It's Crunch Time on the lead and extended their advantage at every station after that. After stopping the clock in :29, :57.4 and 1:25.3, It's Crunch Time hit the line ahead by 16 lengths in 1:54, which was a new lifetime mark.

It's Crunch Time (\$2.10) is owned by Thomas and Scott Dillon and trained by Ron Burke.

Crawford Farms bred It's Crunch Time.

Finally, the trotting colts and gelding went to post with **Castel Lindy** (Walner—Love N Lindy) going gate-to-wire while tying the stake record.

Gingras took an easy lead with Castel Lindy and set solid fractions of :28.3 and :58.2. As the race moved to the backstretch, Zeron tipped Belmondo from third and Drew alongside Castel Lindy in the final turn. Belmondo continued to pressure Castel Lindy into the stretch and down to the wire, but never got the advantage as Castel Lindy hung on by a neck in 1:55.4, which was a new lifetime mark.

Castel Lindy (\$2.40) is owned and bred by K. R. Breeding and trained by Domenico Cecere.

The Massachusetts Breeders Stake reconvene at Plainridge Park on Monday (Sept. 30).

EVERY MAN'S DREAM SETS MASS STAKE RECORD AT PLAINRIDGE

The 2024 Massachusetts Breeders Stake kicked off at Plainridge Park on Monday (Sept. 23) afternoon with 3-year-olds of both sexes and gaits lining up for their share of the \$305,000 in available purses.

All four 2-year-old Mass-champions were on hand to defend their titles with **Every Man's Dream**, **Keep Asking** and **Rocknroll Lou** all getting a jump on a second-straight title.

Stars of the day included drivers Yannick Gingras and Scott Zeron and trainers Ron Burke and George Ducharme who all had two wins in stake action on Monday.

In the first of two \$40,000 split pacing filly divisions, Every Man's Dream (Always B Miki—Lindy's Nightmare) set a new stake record after she registered a statement win in her non-betting event.

Yannick Gingras got away third with Every Man's Dream as Beantown Ace (Nick Graffam) set the tempo to the half in :57.3. Every Man's Dream was out and rolling past that station and took the lead at three-quarters. From there, Every Man's Dream was in a race of her own as she opened up by 11-lengths and broke the beam in 1:52.1, setting the new stakes record.

It was the second-consecutive win for Every Man's Dream who is owned by Thomas and Scott Dillon and trained by Burke. Lindy Farms of Connecticut bred the winner.

The second 3-year-old pacing filly split went to the 1-9 favorite **Color Me Sweet** (So Surreal—Letherriptaterchip) who led the whole race by an open length for driver Shawn Gray before turning for home and stretching out to a 2½-length victory over Going My Way (Bruce Ranger) in 1:56.1 to claim her fourth consecutive win.

Color Me Sweet (\$2.10) is owned by her breeder/trainer Alicia Gray, in partnership with Sarah Brown.

A single \$75,000 division for 3-year-old trotting colts and geldings was next and Keep Asking (Chapter Seven—Sensibility) picked up where he left off in this series last year.

Zeron pushed Keep Asking off the gate and took the lead before they entered the turn. They then set fractions of :27.2,:57.1 and 1:25.3 before the pocket sitting Intl Blockade (Ranger) pulled to advance towards the leader. Keep Asking and Intl Blockade then matched strides around the last turn and entered the stretch dead even. But three pylons in, Intl Blockade made a break leaving Keep Asking by himself to cross the wire on top by 1¼ lengths over International Law (Marcus Miller) in 1:54.2.

The win pushed Keep Asking (\$2.40) over the half-million-dollar mark in lifetime earnings, as the colt has now earned \$502,699 for owners WJ Donovan, Joe Sbrocco, Jim Winske and George Ducharme, who also trains the winner. Donovan, Sbrocco and Winske bred Keep Asking.

The trotting fillies were up next in their \$75,000 event and International Gift (International Moni—Box Of Gifts) got her second straight win at Plainridge.

Zeron left with International Gift and led the single-file field through quarters of :28.4, :58.2 and 1:27.2. At that last station, Gingras tipped Dawn Of Lindy from third and blasted towards the leader. International Gift and Dawn Of Lindy trotted side-by-side around the last turn and into the stretch where International Gift got a slight advantage to beat Dawn Of Lindy and a fast-closing Sassy Zaza (Brett Beckwith) in 1:55.4.

International Gift (\$3.40) is owned by her trainer George Ducharme, in partnership with Winter's Racing and Nicola Oliva. Ducharme and Oliva also bred the filly.

The last \$75,000 dash for the day was for pacing colts and geldings and Rocknroll Lou (Sweet Lou—Beautiful Lady) flexed his muscle in his first win of the year.

Gingras took a gradual overland route to the front but eventually took control at the :27.3 quarter. With Bang Ah Uey (Jim Hardy) sitting right in the pocket, Rocknroll Lou got to the half in :56.1 before being challenged by Poverty Sucks (Graffam) to three-quarters. Rocknroll Lou paced clear after Poverty Sucks broke off the turn before Bang Ah Uey tipped at the top of the lane to take his shot. But Rocknroll Lou was not to be beaten as he coasted home by two lengths in a new lifetime best 1:52.4.

Rocknroll Lou (\$2.80) is owned by Thomas and Scott Dillon and is trained by Burke. Lester Gelardi and Anthony Passafaro bred the winner.



Melvin G, Callahan shine Wednesday at Harrington

Melvin G (\$2.10, Jim Morand) was the fastest of four Delaware Standardbred Breeders Fund (DSBF) \$20,000 2-year-old trotting divisional winners Wednesday (Sept. 25) at Harrington Raceway with a 1:59.2 triumph, while driver Corey Callahan had six wins on the track's 56th card of 2024.

Melvin G, an EL Platinum—Jersey Punk gelding was an easy open-length winner over Wolfpack Cheddar and Epicenter for trainer Les Givens and owners Legacy Racing of Delaware and Nanticoke Racing. It was the first win in four career starts for Melvin G.

The same stable was back at it again as Nanticoke Racing and Delbert Cain's **Marino Bluestone** (Givens) took the early non-wagering event in the first filly trotting division in 2:04, via a first-over grind en route to her first career win. Peggys Girl was second with Buttoncandy third. The Anders Bluestone—Private Marino filly was making her first career start.

James Craparotta and Pat Berry Racing's **Daburg** (\$2.10) remained unbeaten in two starts with a 2:02.1 win in the second filly division. The EL Platinum—Comical Dream filly led from start to finish over Take It Easy, who overcame an early miscue to be a game second, over Royal Toni.

The final DSBF division on the card, saw Breakaway Racing's **Legend Of Rock** (\$33.80, Corey Callahan) fortuitously prevail as favorite Chex Check broke while on the lead in the stretch and Legend Of Rock picked up the pieces for his first win for trainer Nick Callahan in 2:04.1 over Perfect Suprise and Royalty Star. The EL Platinum—Rock The Game gelding was making his first start after a pair of qualifiers as one of four wins on the card for trainer Nick Callahan.

DSBF FILLIES HEADLINE TUESDAY HARRINGTON CARD

A trio of \$20,000 Delaware Standardbred Breeders Fund (DSBF) 1st leg stakes for 2-year-old filly pacers headlined the Tuesday (Sept. 24) Harrington Raceway program.

Steve Leblanc-trained **Tilted Crown** (\$4, Russell Foster) won the first division in 1:58.2. The Royal Mattjesty filly was a wire-to-wire winner over Im Won Last Wiser and Krockpot Kate. It was the first career win for Tilted Crown, who is owned by Leblanc Stable, William Lutz, Count De Money Stable, and Douglas Johnson.

The second division went to Jo Ann Looney-King's **Mimosa On The Key** (\$8.80, Ross Wolfenden) in 1:58.2. The Roddys Bags Again filly charged to the lead immediately when the gates closed and never had an anxious moment in her frontend triumph over Odds Beater and Mornin Merle. The winner was trained by Jim King, Jr.

Donna Messick's **Little Miss Peyton** (\$2.60, Corey Callahan) was the fastest divisional winner with a 1:57.2 score in the final DSBF split for trainer Les Givens. The Papa Ray filly recorded her second career win as the heavy favorite over Infinite Wonders and Banana Cabana.

The \$110,000 DSBF finals will be contested after another round of eliminations next week (Sept. 30-Oct. 2) on the week of Oct. 7-9.




