Lexington Ends on a High Note

Buoyed by a strong session five yesterday at the Fasig-Tipton Sales Grounds, the 2011 Lexington Selected Yearling sale concluded on an up note, reporting solid increases in gross and average. Total receipts showed 761 horses finding new homes for a gross of \$25,650,000, up \$1,115,000 from 2010. The average rose 8.7%, from \$31,003 in 2010 to \$33,706 in 2011.

"Today was strong," said sales manager Randy Manges. "I was very pleased with today. It was a good day. Our numbers were up, so that always makes for a good day. The good horses sold well and the bidding

was strong today for the last day of the sale. That says something. We had a few bring \$50,000 and one bring \$80,000 and that just shows that people were still willing to pay for what they wanted. We sold a lot of horses from the 20-40 range and I was pleased."

Sales officials and consignors had anticipated a modest bump in this year's receipts based on the strength of Thoroughbred auctions at Saratoga in August and at Keeneland in September. They got that, and a bit more.

"I am very happy to be up," said Manges. "I have to be honest; I was apprehensive coming into the sale because of the economy and all the different variables throughout the industry right now, so when everything turned out the way it did, I was real pleased."

As anticipated, the first crop from Somebeachsomewhere was in demand. The sire's 43 yearlings sold for an average of \$76,465, tops among both gaits at this year's sale. Somebeachsomewhere was also responsible for the sales topper, hip 103, a son of Artistic Vision, who brought \$450,000 in the opening session. Consigned by Hunterton Sales Agency, he was purchased by Bruce Saunders, agent for Frank Bellino.

He was also the sire of the top-priced pacing filly, hip 105, who brought \$170,000. Consigned by Preferred Equine, she was purchased by John Cancelliere.

Among trotters, Donato Hanover finished on top with 22 selling for an average of \$64,773; and the top trotting colt, hip 202, out of Stroke Play, who brought \$210,000 in the second session. The top trotting filly was a daughter of Muscles Yankee, hip 52, out of Pure Ivory Marti, who brought \$170,000. Purchased by Ala-Seppala, Agent, she was consigned by Hunterton Sales Agency.

"I think our schedule had a little bit to do with the numbers; it was different this year," said Manges. "The racing and the sales seem to go hand in hand and the schedule was a little bit different this year, but I think it turned out okay. I think we lost some people that may have been able to be here on the weekend or when the racing is going, but the right people showed up and were willing to pay for what they wanted and that's all that matters sometimes. I was very pleased with the way everything turned out, with all things considered, we had a great sale, I am very happy." **Cont. p2**

Brittany Farm's Art Zubrod, who sold an American Ideal-Trim Hanover colt for \$280,000 in the first session, the second highest price overall, said, "It certainly had its ups and downs this year, I think the buyers are getting more discriminating all the time but that's their prerogative.

"I think this sale was very similar to last year; the top was about the same, the middle was about the same, everything was very similar to last year," Zubrod continued. "I don't really see much difference. I was happy with the way some of ours sold and unhappy with the way others sold, but that's very typical of a sale. That's the name of the game. I think they were willing to pay for the ones they wanted, so that's always a good thing and an encouraging part of business. I wish I could tell you it was something a little more earth shaking, but that's the way it goes sometimes."

The session topper in the final session was hip 733, Request for Parole, a Badlands Hanover filly consigned by Winbak Farm, who brought a bid of \$85,000 from John Como, Jr. of Towaco, NJ, who also won the bid on Real Illusion for \$80,000.

With Shift To Nights, Red Mile Handle Soars

Halfway through last night's card, Red Mile general manager Joe Costa was still sorting through the numbers, waiting for the final returns from the last few races to come in. He wouldn't know the final figures until after the races were over, but he knew they would be good.

Costa estimated that going into the final two days of the Grand Circuit portion of the Red Mile meet, on-track handle would be up 40 percent, in-state simulcasting handle would be up 10 to 15 percent and all other simulcasting numbers would have risen by about 40 percent. **Cont. p3**

When asked what was behind the surprisingly strong figures, he didn't hesitate for even a second. "Nights," he said.

Costa and the Red Mile owners took some heat this year when they decided to switch the majority of the Red Mile cards to the evenings. The only matinee programs left are on Sundays.



"This is a night time sport," Costa said. "We have great racing and great drivers, but our problem has always been shelf space. When we were in the day we were going against the Thoroughbred signals and even the harness bettors weren't able to find us. Now,

we're in the right spot."

Costa said he fielded many complaints about the shift to nights and also complaints about how the Red Mile had been having problems attracting the many college students in the area.

"People were telling me I was an idiot to race at nights because there is nothing more beautiful in the fall than sitting in the sunshine and watching these horses race," he said. "Then there were the people who called me an idiot because we operate in a college town and weren't getting college kids here. Well, on Thursday and Friday afternoons college kids are in class and on Saturday afternoons they're watching UK football. You can't have your cake and eat it too. The way we were doing it we was making sure we were excluding college kids."

Costa said the old way of thinking, racing during the day only, reminded him of a "country club" atmosphere.

"I understand why a lot of people wanted us to race during the day, but you can't grow this sport and be a country club," he said. "There was too much comfort here in the way we were doing things. You can't operate like a country club and hope things will take care of themselves."

Red Mile Recap: International Stallions Series

Two-year-old Trotters

First Division (Race 3) - \$75,750

Big Chocolate (Chocolatier) headlined the first division as the horse bringing both speed and class to the contest. He did not disappoint as the 3-5 betting favorite. Despite being such a heavy favorite, Big Chocolate was given an educational mile, as Dave Miller allowed the son of Chocolatier to relax in the pocket behind the early speed, before pouncing on Nagini late for the win. Big Chocolate kicked home powerfully to the tune of a 27.4 final quarter, completing the mile in 1:54.4,

just a fifth of a second off the national season's mark. Confident conditioner Homer Hochstetler referred to his colt as "one of the best ones out there." He added that he "felt that way all summer." Big Chocolate had been second in the New Jersey Sire Stakes Final and third in the Peter Haughton Final this summer at The Meadowlands. Hochstetler went on to say that Big Chocolate has "overcome a few physical issues this summer, and has become pretty handy off the gate." With the win, Big Chocolate's career earnings surpass \$200,000. The Breeders Crown is the next endeavor on the winner's calendar. **Lindy's Jersey Boy** (Cantab Hall) grabbed second money, while **Mr Chicago** (Cantab Hall) got up to be third.

Second Division (Race 4) - \$75,750

The second division of the I.S.S. appeared to be a battle between two impressive young trotters, **Possess The Will** (Donato Hanover) and **Money On My Mind** (Cantab Hall). But, when the latter faltered in the stretch, the race became Posses The Will's to lose.

In the end, it took a battle of wills to reach the winner's circle, as **Gym Tan Laundry** (Yankee Glide) gave Jersey Shore fans a real thrill through the stretch. He showed grit and gameness, fighting Possess The Will all the

way to the wire, but falling just a head short. Possess The Will parlayed a perfect second over trip to a national season's record of 1:54. Driver Tim Tetrick noted that Possess The Will "has been good all year except for a stint in Canada when he got sick." When asked how this colt stacked up against the best of the crop Tetrick feel's that Possess The Will is "right up there...every week he gets better and stronger." Gym Tan Laundry continues to improve, finishing a gritty second last night, and could be a force moving forward this season. **Muscolo** (Muscles Yankee) rebounded nicely from a dull performance last week. The Helen Dancer winner grabbed third place money. **Cont. p4**

Third Division (Race 6) - \$75,750

A wild stretch drive in the third division culminated with two horses locking wheels in deep stretch. Approaching the sixteenth pole, **Power Play** (Donato Hanover) and Pekoe Fashion (Broadway Hall) locked wheels, essentially costing both horses any chance.

well out in the middle of the track and away from any problems.

He was able to take full advantage of the confusion in the stretch, rolling past the entire field and coasting to what ended up being a rather easy victory in 1:54.4. From Above was a \$165,000 Lexington-Select yearling, and perhaps it was a return home that turned this colt around. After struggling around the turns at Chester in qualifiers this summer, From Above has now reeled off four consecutive victories at The Red Mile, including back-to-back stakes wins. Trainer Greg Peck confirmed that "as long as he comes out of the race in good order, we'll probably head to the Breeders Crown." Race favorite **Uncle Peter** (Cantab Hall) checked in second for Team Takter, while **Norway Hanover** (Glidemaster) completed the trifecta.

Fourth Division (Race 10) - \$75,750

It seems they have found the magic with the son of Andover Hall, **Magic Tonight**. Once again, he marched to an easy victory last night at The Red Mile with Ron Pierce.

Setting the softest pace of the night on the front end, there was never an anxious moment for Magic Tonight, who just took a paid tour of The Red Mile oval.

Ron Pierce summed up the race well, stating "nobody came, so we took advantage of it. I asked a little and he gave it to me. Turning for home, they started to come at us, I asked for a lot more and he just opened up." Whatever Noel Daley has done with Magic Tonight, it has worked, as he continues to get better with each and every start, and he could be a major factor in this division before the year ends. **Melt In Your Mouth** (Chocolatier) grabbed second place money, while **Scary Good** (Cantab Hall) completed the top three.

Two-year-old Filly Pacers

First Division (Race 5) - \$84,200

A race that many considered to be nothing more than a formality turned out to be anything but. In the biggest upset since See You At Peelers' defeat this summer, **American Jewel** (American Ideal) was nailed on the wire by **Big Mcdeal** (Mcardle). It became apparent on the final turn when Tetrick tried to get separation from the field that he had a race on his hands, as Big Mcdeal and Jody Jamieson were able to stay right with the previously undefeated filly. Jamieson stated, "the only way I thought we could beat [American Jewel] was If we were able to track her the whole way." Even though he got the trip he wanted, Jamieson still seemed a bit surprised by the outcome. "Going in, I thought we were racing for second," said Jamieson. "Timmy's filly looked so great going into the turn, I thought we were still racing for second." In regards to Big McDeal's campaign, Jamieson felt that "she had been awesome all year" and noted that he "made a mistake opting off her in Canada two back." He also seemed certain the Breeders Crown is in the cards for the winner. After a soft opening quarter, American Jewel followed the eventual winner to the lead, and perhaps that :54.3 middle half was a bit taxing for her. But it took the race of her life by Big Mcdeal to grab the victory from the previously unbeaten American Jewel at the wire. In the process, Big McDeal became a world champion, equaling the 1:50.2 mark of American Jewel. Big McDeal is a half sister to the talented Galimony, and was the most expensive offspring of McArdle at auction, for the price of \$70,000. As for American Jewel's first defeat, Tim Tetrick simply said that American Jewel "raced great, she just got beat."

Second Division (Race 9) - \$85,200

Entering last night's action, **Economy Terror** (Western Terror) had only been defeated three times in her eight-race career, twice at the hands of American Jewel. No American Jewel tonight, no problem. Economy Terror worked out a second over trip for Brian Sears, following **Destiny's Chance** (Four Starzzz Shark) into the stretch, kicking home in a sub-26 second final quarter to wear down

Shelliscape (Artiscape) for the win in 1:50.4. Economy Terror had a lot against her last week. Trainer Chris Oakes noted that she "warmed up real good tonight, where last week she seemed a bit hot." Furthermore, he confirmed equipment trouble in the stretch of that race, stating that Economy Terror "got a flat tire somewhere in the stretch of her last start." When asked how Economy Terror stacks up against the best of this crop, Oakes admitted that "this is a really, really strong group of two year old fillies this year," before stating that she is Breeders Crown bound. Shelliscape raced very well on the lead tonight, shrugging off a challenge from Destiny's Chance and holding on well to be second. Podges Lady finished third, but was disqualified for interference on the far turn with Red Shadow, and was placed eighth. Marty Party was awarded third place money.

Third Division (Race 11) - \$85,200

In another wild stretch drive, it was **Rockaround Sue** (Rocknroll Hanover), who trailed the field early, but came into the breach and earned the victory. Rockaround Sue appeared hopelessly beaten at the top of the stretch, but Brian Sears made all the right moves to earn his third victory of the night. The daughter of Rocknroll Hanover had seemed overmatched against the best of her generation so far this season, but she put it all together tonight to earn her third lifetime victory. Trainer Tony Alagna, who himself is having a career year, had

good things to say about his filly. "She has been knocking on the door all season, giving a big effort every time," he explained. When asked about future plans, Alagna was unsure about the Breeders Crown. "We'll see what the other fillies do," said Alagna. "Then we'll make a decision." **Miss Mojo** (Rocknroll Hanover) appeared primed to grab the victory in deep stretch, only to be nailed on the wire by the winner. **I'm Fondue Of You** (Western Terror) rallied well to finish third in her first start outside of Pennsylvania.

Confident Drop The Ball Heads Garnsey Memorial

When **Drop The Ball** (Western Terror) broke stride in the Meadowlands Pace consolation and then again in a prep for the Mistletoe Shalee it appeared that her 3-year-old season had unraveled. But the Ross Croghan-trained filly has since won three of her last four and looks ready to take control of the 3-year-old filly pacing division. She'll put her status on the line tonight the Red Mile in a division of the Glen Garnsey Memorial.

The Garnsey is one of just many high-lights on another terrific Red Mile card stocked with big names and big races.

Drop The Ball won the Mistletoe Shalee, finished fourth in the Valley Forge and then reeled off back-to-back wins in the Shady Daisy and the Bluegrass for regular driver Yannick Gingras. She won the Bluegrass by four lengths in a stakes-record 1:49.1.

"I think she's the horse to beat," Gingras said of Saturday's assignment. "Her last race was impressive. She won as easy as horse can win in (1):49.1. We always knew she had that power to put out those kinds of miles, but now she's showing she can do it. It's fun, that's for sure."

Gingras believes that a change to a flip-down bridle and a renewed sense of confidence have been behind the turn-around for Drop The Ball.

"Early in the year, the minute she would clear the other horses her mind would be wandering and that's when she would make breaks," Gingras said. "Now she's got her confidence back. Last week I was able to come first up and clear fairly early, at the top of the stretch, and she never tried to do anything. A lot of it has to do with confidence. She's definitely better than she was."

"She's scary fast. Maturity may be part of it. We changed her bridle a little bit and I think that helped. Speed-wise she was ready, but race-wise maybe she wasn't. I'm very pleased with the way she's come along, that's for sure."

The field also includes Jugette winner **Idyllic** (American Ideal), who was a tiring third behind Drop The Ball last time out.

There are six stakes on the card and dozens of interesting stories.

Simply Business (Rocknroll Hanover), the overall sale topper at the 2010 Lexington sale, will continue to try to prove that he represents many well spent when he faces six other 2-year-old pacers in an \$82,850 division of the International Stallion Stakes. Ron Pierce will drive the colt whose richest win this year came in the Metro.

Bolt The Duer (Ponder), a winner of six of seven, looks like the one to beat in the eighth, another ISS division.

"We've known for a long time that he is a good horse and I think he can go with the best of them," trainer Peter Foley said. "I know he's not going to win every week, but he'll make some money. When he won the other night (in the Bluegrass division), he showed how good he was. One of the best aspects about him is he paces likes an Artsplace. He puts his head down and he keeps on giving. He's also a very laid back horse and sleeps in his stall a lot."

Another highlight of the night will be the tenth race, which will pit **Krispy Apple** (Western Ideal), **Myluvmylife** (Rocknroll Hanover) and five others in a division of the Garnsey Memorial

With names like **Royal Shyster** (RC Royalty), **Kyle Major** (Art Major) and 139 classy Perretti Farms broodmares part of the inventory, Standardbred Horse Sales Company has released the list of horses that will go into the ring during the Mixed Sale portion of the annual Harrisburg sale.

Hard copy volumes of the catalog are expected to be available on October 12. The mixed portion of the Harrisburg sale begins on Friday, November 11 and ends on Saturday, November 12. It follows the conclusion of the select yearling sale which takes place from Monday, November 7 through Thursday, November 10. The mixed sale features the Complete Dispersal of the Perretti Farms Broodmare Band of 139 in foal mares. The sale will begin with 105 yearlings previously consigned to the cancelled Classic sale and also includes 1,123 entries consisting of yearlings, weanlings, broodmares, stallion shares, stallion, racehorses and racing prospects.

The 139 Perretti broodmares include some of the finest dams in the sport and several should sell for big dollars. Another broodmare that should draw a lot of interest is **Crysta's Image**, the dam of **Crys Dream** and **Daylon Mistress**, a half-sister to Daylon Magician.

Buyers will be sure to take a liking to **Kyle Major**, an earner of more than \$400,000 in his career, **Whats New Pussycat** (Art Major), who has made over \$220,000 this year, and **Go Go Solano** (Bettor's Delight), an earner of nearly \$600,000. Royal Shyster is 9 for 11 in his career and is coming off a win in the New York Sires Stakes Night of Champions program. **Celebrity Katie** (SJ's Cav-iar), a Hambletonian Oaks starter and a PASS winner this year, is another notable name that will be sold.

Odds-on **Western Silk** (George Brennan) rallied from second-over Friday night, winning Yonkers Raceway's co-featured, \$52,000 Filly and Mare Open Handicap Pace.

Assigned outside of her seven rivals, the razor-sharp Western Silk was beating just one of them early. Meanwhile, **Breakheart Pass** (Jim Pantaleano) fronted the fray through early intervals of :27.1 of :56.1. **Hula's Z Tam** (Pat Lachance) was pocketed, with **Ramona Disomma** (Eric Goodell) first-up.

However, with "Ramona" pacing in place by the 1:24.2 three-quarters, Western Silk swung wide...and into action. She swooped by the leader right before the 1:53.2 mile marker, then kept her two remaining rivals at bay. Western Silk edged away by a half-length, getting the mile-and-one-sixteenth in 2:00.1.

Fox Valley Sage schnozzed second over Hula's Z Tam, with Breakheart Pass and **Panagler** (Jason Bartlett) completing the cashers.

Western Silk, a millionairess 4-year-old daughter of Western Terror co-owned by trainer Casie Coleman and Tom Hill, returned \$2.90 for her fourth win (third consecutive) in a dozen seasonal starts.

Friday night's co-featured, \$52,000 Open Handicap Trot saw the formful **Second Hand News** (Brent Holland) just last on the lead in his marquee trot debut.
