Hambletonian location in limbo for 2027 and beyond as Gural and Society disagree

The owner of The Meadowlands and the Hambletonian Society are at odds over the latter's decision to accept bids to hold the race at another racetrack beginning in 2027.

Meadowlands racetrack owner Jeff Gural said he is “furious” and that it is a “disgrace” that the Hambletonian Society has decided to accept bids for the Hambletonian to possibly move to a different track as early as 2027. Hambletonian Society

president and CEO John Campbell said the decision by the Society's board has to do with uncertainty over the future of the New Jersey track and needing to ensure a home for the race that celebrated its 100th anniversary this year and has been held at The Big M for the last 44 years.

“Jeff has stated on many occasions that if he doesn't get a casino The Meadowlands will close,” Campbell said.

The issue of whether the Hambletonian will move away from The Meadowlands has been a hot topic for over a month, but Campbell reiterated many times that the Society is simply trying to ensure a stable future for the race.

He said Gural has said many times that the future of The Meadowlands depends on the track getting a casino, which requires authorization from the citizens of New Jersey via a referendum.

Gural said he fully expects the referendum to go on the ballot and be approved by the citizens, but even if that happens, the earliest it could do so is November of 2026. Campbell said that is too late to determine the site of the Hambletonian for 2027, especially since there are no guarantees Gural, specifically, would be awarded a casino even if the referendum vote is in his favor.

“If you look at it objectively, we’re not going to know the day after the referendum whether Jeff is going to get that casino,” Campbell said, adding even if the ballot initiative says the casino is to go at The Meadowlands, legislators could decide to award it to someone else on site, which is home to various other businesses. “How long will it take for the legislators to determine who gets awarded that casino if the referendum does pass? And so that just pushes everything out, and [increases] the uncertainty even more so from our standpoint.”

In a Sept. 12 press release, the Hambletonian Society said: “Under Society by-laws, the Hambletonian is opened annually to prospective host-track bids unless already secured under a multi-year contract. The Meadowlands is contracted to host through 2026; however, the track did not exercise its exclusive right of renewal, which expired Sept. 1, 2025.

“In the interest of ensuring the long-term health and prominence of America’s Trotting Classic, the Hambletonian Society will now open the event to host-track proposals beginning with the 2027

edition. All tracks, including the existing host track, are able to bid if Society by-law requirements are met.”

The Meadowlands will play host to the Hambletonian in 2026. Gural said he offered to extend the contract through 2027, but the Hambletonian Society rejected that offer.

Campbell said, “If [the referendum fails] in November of 2026 and he closes The Meadowlands in January of 2027 and we have a one-year contract, what do we do?”

Later, he added, “Our duty is to create the best plan long-term for the future of the Hambletonian. In fairness to the nominators and everyone who pays in, we’re trying to make sure we have a three-to-five year plan with the Hambletonian.”

In an open letter to the industry published in the **Oct 10 issue of HRU** (see page 18), Gural stated his frustration with pouring money into The Meadowlands and elsewhere to the benefit of the harness racing industry. In an interview with HRU in September, he expressed similar frustration with the Hambletonian Society’s board.

“I was furious and I think it’s a disgrace,” he said of the Society’s decision to open the hosting contract up for bids. “These guys have benefitted tremendously [from The Meadowlands] because they sell yearlings and for them to threaten to move the Hambletonian is a disgrace. I think everybody feels that way and I don’t understand what planet they are on, to be honest. I’d be surprised if anyone bids.”

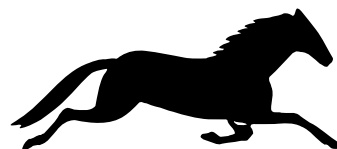

This week, Campbell reiterated the Society is simply trying to avoid the race ending up, "in a bad spot depending on what Jeff did with The Meadowlands if the referendum doesn't pass.

"As I said in our statement, that's our mandate - the long-term stature and success of the event."

Campbell also stressed that, "it cannot be overstated, what a great partnership it has been for both entities... The Meadowlands has been a tremendous home for the Hambletonian since 1981 and we have made no decisions to move the Hambletonian and we hope The Meadowlands bids and is part of the bidding process. I know [Gural] says right now that he won't be [bidding], but the bidding doesn't close until March 1 [2026] and a lot of things can happen between now and then."

Gural said in late September that, "the only reason that I'm not bidding is that I'm so angry. I don't think I should have to bid.

"I don't think the industry wants to see Hambletonian not at The Meadowlands. I just think, 'Why would you do something that pisses off everybody?' Their job is to help them promote the sport, not piss off people that buy yearlings."

Gural also accused the Hambletonian Society of not wanting to allow him to exercise his private property rights to exclude participants. Gural feels strongly about banning participants believed to be using performance enhancing drugs.

"I do want to point out that Jeff seems to think that his exclusionary list was something that we couldn't deal with,

but his exclusionary list is in play for 2026 with all three of our races [at The Meadowlands]," Campbell said. "So, that isn't as big a factor as he is portraying."

Campbell said the Hambletonian Society has also partnered with Gural on out-of-competition testing and, before that, the Society partnered with the New Jersey Racing Commission on the same.

As for the timing of the announcement that the Society was accepting host bids, Campbell said it was to, "give every entity the proper time to prepare their bids because there's a lot that has to go into this. Some of these entities are going to have to go to legislators or different tourism boards or whatever to try and get support to make the best bid they possibly can. So, the timing of it being March 1, we're hopeful that every entity would be able to line up the local support the best they can and make the best bid that they possibly can for it."

Society rules state the Hambletonian must be contested on a seven-eighths mile oval or larger, which essentially means it could only be held at The Meadowlands, Harrah's Hoosier Park, Woodbine Mohawk Park or The Red Mile.

Premier Bluebird's Super Final victory marks multiple firsts

Hoosier Champions night at Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino is known to produce memorable moments each season. Friday evening (Oct. 10) was no different. Freshman Premier Bluebird has visited the winner's circle five times this season, but had tasted victory in an Indiana Sires Stakes leg only once. Friday, he earned the biggest win of his young career for his connections, springing the upset at 5-1 and claiming the \$250,000 Indiana Sire Stakes Super Final in a time of 1:54.4. The Super Final victory was the first for Zach Miller as a conditioner. It was also the first for co-breeder Dennis Bontrager.

"We just had to have a little luck go our way," said Miller of the win. "It's great. It just kind of helps validate all the work we do all year long and lets you know that you're on the right track. It's very special."

Guided by regular pilot Kyle Wilfong, the colt lined up mid-pack in the 10-horse field, getting away in the same spot after the

gate folded. Sunday Swagger and Marcus Miller led the field through fractions of :27.4, :56.3, and 1:25.4 as an outer flow developed, led by favorite Dan D Man Can. Wilfong slipped into line third over, and as the field raced out of the final turn, he had a clear view of the wire. Premier Bluebird closed fastest of them all, kicking home in :28.1 to win by more than two lengths in a lifetime best effort. Dan D Man Can and Bravo Alpha rounded out the trifecta.

The victory is the sixth in 13 starts for the freshman, who now sports earnings of \$182,455. Zach and his wife, Dessa, share ownership of the colt with Marvin Schwartz and Ted Comerford. Comerford is a longtime partner with the Miller family, owning multiple Indiana Sire Stakes champions with Miller's father, Alvin, including Topville Cadillac (2015) and Miss Millie (2011).

“It's pretty exciting for Zach and Dessa, and I'm happy for them,” Comerford said.

Zach has experienced wins on Hoosier Champions night in the past, but never as a conditioner. Both he and Dessa shared ownership with Alvin Miller on 2011 sire stakes final winner Pacific Sun Rae.

“It was really great to finally put it all together,” Zach said. “It's been a little while, but I'm glad to finally get there.”

The victory also served as validation for Bontrager, proprietor of Premier Acres in northern Indiana. When Premier Bluebird passed through the sales ring at the Hoosier Classic sale last October, he brought only \$4,500. As the breeder explained, the

Pilot Discretion—Winery Hanover colt toed out in the front and was badly discounted as a result.

“He towed out pretty bad, but he went clean,” said Bontrager, who bred the mare with Bluebird Meadows’ Daryl Miller. “This colt, working with him as a yearling, his heart was always, he was always go, go. He didn’t have to push it. I said this horse is going to go because of the heart. I knew he was going to make it. He proved it tonight. You know, that heart still pays off.”

Looking at Premier Bluebird’s pedigree page from the Hoosier Classic, the colt checks all the boxes, which made it frustrating for Bontrager when the colt sold for less than \$5,000. Cataloged as Hip #345 in a sale that sold 350 lots, Premier Bluebird is the first foal from an Explosive Matter mare from a well-known family.

“The fourth dam is the dam of Muscle Hill,” Bontrager said. “It is the family of Gimpanzee and all those. The dam is a half-sister to Wine Rack Hanover. You see that kind of pedigree over and over day one in Lexington. It’s a big, big family. I was very frustrated. I knew he had that flaw, but I knew the heart was there, and I knew the family. I had to sit on my hands not to bid. I just felt he’s going to be the horse to have.”

As Premier Bluebird lined up behind the starting gate Friday night, Bontrager watched as a railbird. He had a front row view as the trotter sped home to claim the Super Final.

“It’s a first for me,” he said. “This was always the dream. You work so hard to get the mare in foal, get a live foal, make sure he doesn’t get hurt, and get him in the yearling sale. He brings \$4,500, but he’s in good hands. And once you get a reward like this, it just brings life back. My son is here with me. Every start, he wakes up in the morning, first question he has is, ‘Did Premier Bluebird win?’ We’ve been close followers on him, and it’s exciting.”

Although Bontrager missed out on a lucrative payoff when Premier Bluebird sold last fall, the win will help significantly when breeders awards are calculated at year’s end.

“It will be nice,” he said. “It will make up for the \$4,500.”

from post 5 as the 1-9 favorite, parked and pressing to the lead through an opening quarter of :25.4 to the outside of Avanti (Yannick Gingras). Once clear, Rock Shines Again tapped the brakes to a half of :54.1 before giving the field the slip on the far turn, opening up by 4½ lengths at three-quarters in 1:21.4. From there, Rock Shines Again coasted home a winner in the stretch, stopping the timer in 1:49.4, 2½ lengths clear of 71-1 shot Special Pete (Atlee Bender) and 73-1 bomber, The Family Man (Marcus Miller).

Trained by Tyler George for the T G Stable and Ricky Redder, Rock Shines Again has banked \$322,625 on his perfect season after going winless at age 2. Victory Hill Farms bred the Rockin Image—Bikini Star gelding who paid \$2.20 to win.

2-YEAR-OLD FILLY TROT

After tasting defeat a week ago to Help Cum Laude in the final leg of sire stakes, **For Dayze** turned the tables on that rival in a thrilling stretch duel to take the rookie filly trot. Leaving from post 8, driver John De Long floated For Dayze off the wings into sixth early while Help Cum Laude (Atlee Bender) cut a hot opening quarter of :27. Help Cum Laude rolled to the half in :56.1 before For Dayze marched first over, racing to the leader's wheel as the fillies went to three-quarters in 1:26.3. Somemore Blue (Marcus Miller) moved to the lead from the pocket on the backstretch, being tracked by Whoomp who asserted herself to the top at the half in :56. Whoomp powered to three-quarters in 1:24.1 before delivering a :26.3 knock-out blow in the final stanza, cruising by 3¾ lengths to win in a career best 1:50.4. Somemore Blue held for second, with Rock The Charm (John De Long) finishing third.

William and Patrick De Long bred and co-own the winning daughter of Rockin Image—Nightcap along with Jesse De Long. Whomp's record now stands at 13 8-1-1 with earnings of \$349,601 following the victory. She paid \$3.60 to win.

2-YEAR-OLD TROTTING COLTS AND GELDINGS

Premier Bluebird and driver Kyle Wilfong was towed into the race from third-over before delivering a stretch rally to score in the 2-year-old colt trot. Premier Bluebird got away mid-pack in fifth early while Sunday Swagger (Marcus Miller) grabbed early command through a quarter of :27.4. Sunday Swagger trotted to a half of :56.3 before Dan D Man Can (Atlee Beder) steamrolled first-over to move alongside the leader at three-quarters in 1:25.4 with Premier Bluebird in tow from fifth. Dan D Man Can put away Sunday Swagger turning for home before Premier Bluebird gathered up steam, trotting home in :28.1 to roll to the lead and win by 2¼ lengths in 1:54.4. Dan D Man Can held sway for second, with Bravo Alpha (Tim Tetrick) shaking loose late for third.

Trained by Zach Miller who also co-owns along with Dessa Miller, Marvin Schwartz, and Ted Comerford, Premier Bluebird brought his seasonal record to 13 6-3-0. The effort was a lifetime best for the Pilot Discretion—Winery Hanover colt that was a \$4,500 bargain buy at last fall's Hoosier Classic who has now banked \$182,455. Premier Bluebird was bred by Daryl Miller and Dennis Bontrager and paid \$12.20 to win.

3-YEAR-OLD TROTTING FILLIES

Miracle Maven delivered a dominant performance in the sophomore filly trot, rewarding the bettors who backed her as the even-money favorite. Miracle Maven and driver John De Long tucked in the pocket early, racing behind stablemate Better Tak'em who swept to the top from post 9 through a quarter of :27.3. Swan Jewel (Atlee Bender) was unable to find a seat on the first turn before driving to the lead on the backstretch just prior to the half when Miracle Maven went on the offensive at that point in :56.1. Miracle Maven stormed to the top when De Long kicked-out the plugs and opened up her lead to four lengths at three-quarters in 1:24.3. The lead only grew from there as Miracle Maven romped by five lengths on the wire in 1:53.3 over Martz Seven (Kyle Wilfong) and A Million Dances (Mike Oosting).

Henry Graber, Jr. trains the winning daughter of Don't Let'em—Bad Babysitter for owners Hillside Stables, Indiana Stables, Frank Baldachino, and Beasty LLC. Bred by Noah Wickey, Miracle Maven's record stands at 10 6-1-2 at age

3, earning \$292,545 on the year and surpassing \$440,000 in career earnings. Miracle Maven paid \$4.20 to win.

2-YEAR-OLD PACING COLTS AND GELDINGS


World champion **Odds On Mr Mamba** put an exclamation point on his 2-year-old campaign, following up his world record performance with a devastating effort as the 1-20 favorite. Dexter Dunn was once again in the bike, putting Odds On Mr Mamba on the point through an opening quarter of :27.1 before tapping the brakes to the halfway point in :56.2. Dancing Dreamer (David Miller) moved first-over to engage the leader on the far turn, pacing into second 1½ lengths back at three-quarters in 1:24.2. Accelerating quickly on the lead, Odds On Mr Mamba uncorked a :26 final quarter with a motionless Dunn in the bike along for the ride as the favorite moved away from the field by 4¼ lengths on the wire in 1:50.2. Pocket-sitter What Nooo Waaay (John De Long) edged out Dancingdreamer for the second position.

After a fourth-place effort in his debut, Odds On Mr Mamba has reeled off seven straight to conclude his 2-year-old season, racking up \$314,405 for owner Odds On Racing who also bred the Odds On Equuleus—Honky Tonk Woman gelding. Odds On Mr Mamba is trained by Melanie Wrenn and returned \$2.10 to win at the betting windows.

Leaving from post 2, On To Norway got away third with Eugene The Genius (Dexter Dunn) clearing to the top at the quarter in :27.2. De Long moved On To Norway at the quarter, trotting to the lead on the backstretch before reaching the half in :55.4. The 1-9 bettors' choice opened up by 2½ on the way to three-quarters in 1:24.1 with Operator (Kyle Wilfong) racing to the outside of Eugene The Genius in second. Trace Tetrick and Tyler George would bookend the Super Finals on the night, taking the 3-year-old filly pace with **Miss Fancy Nancy**. Miss Fancy Nancy got away in sixth with CC Rockin Rosie (Yannick Gingras) rocketing to the lead with a :25.3 opening quarter. Tarshish (Marcus Miller) popped the pocket and assumed the lead prior to the half of :55.4 before she opened up by five on the far turn, reaching three-quarters in 1:23.4 while Miss Fancy Nancy had 6¼ to make up from second-over in fifth. The strides of Tarshish began to shorten in the stretch while Miss Fancy Nancy picked up steam, motoring home in :27.1 to win by 2½ lengths in 1:52.1. Wunderkindbluechip (Atlee Bender) rallied for second at 25-1, with Vel Cinderella (Kyle Wilfong) finishing third.

Tonya Nichols, Joe Sbrocco, VIP Internet Stable, and Jaf Racing own the winning daughter of JK Endofanera—Singit Like Aretha. Miss Fancy Nancy has won eight of 14 at 3 after going winless at 2, banking \$264,275 this season. Duane Miller and Gene Borkholder bred the winner who paid \$6.20 to win.

AGED FINALS

Tetrick and George also tacked on an aged final, winning the Mare Pace in front end fashion with **Rollin Rosie** (\$4.20) over Kobe's Gigi (Yannick Gingras) and Teelatini (John De Long) in 1:50.2. It was the first Sire Stakes title for the 5-year-old daughter of JK Endofanera—Rock N Roll Baby who has earned \$700,080 in her career for owners SCP Stables, Tyler George, and Greg Samples.

The night got underway with **Ponda Jet** (\$3.00) picking up his first Sire Stakes title with a wire-to-wire 3¾ length romp over Flagman (Luke Plano) and Helpfirstedition (David Miller) in 1:51.3 to take the \$70,000 Aged Male Trot. Jay Hochstetler trains the 5-year-old gelded son of Dover Dan—Ponda's Lucky Lady who has banked \$746,132 for owners Connie Hochstetler, Robert Buddig, and Allen Schwartz.

Yo Beth D (\$7.60) overcame the second tier and spotting M-M's Dream (Yannick Gingras) 5½ lengths at three-quarters to take the \$50,000 Mare Trot in 1:53.2 for trainer Ken Rucker. M-M's Dream held for second with Country Mamma (David Miller) finishing third. Yo Beth D earned the second Sire Stakes crown of her career, and the 5-year-old daughter of Helpisontheway—Scented Roses boasts lifetime earnings of \$594,050 for owner Twoforone Stable.

Buzzsaw Russ (4.40) and Dexter Dunn followed suit with a 1:48.4 pocket-rocket score in the \$50,000 Aged Male Pace over Coach Stefanos (Marcus Miller) and M-M-s Bud (Jay Cross) for his second Sire Stakes title. Trained by Missy Essig for owners Russ Beeman and Charles Weaver, the winning 5-year-old gelded son of Rockin Image—Up Front Cruiser has banked \$829,754 lifetime.

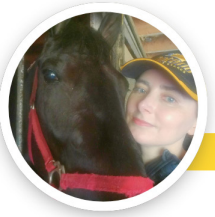

Appeal filed in Elegantimage placing

While R Dutchess (3, 1:52s; \$455,416) finished second to Delaney Hanover in the Oct. 5 Kentucky Filly Futurity at The Red Mile, the final outcome of another recent race again hangs in the balance.

As previously reported in HRU, the 3-year-old daughter of Father Patrick—The Ice Dutchess won the \$273,750 (U.S.) Grade 1 Elegantimage final at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Sept. 20, only to be placed last for allegedly causing interference on the first turn.

Shortly after the story appeared in this column, Douglas Paul reached out via email to state that R Dutchess' lessees M and L DE and Armitage Farm of Wilmington, DE did not agree with the Alcohol and Gaming Commission of Ontario (AGCO) judges' decision. Paul's message noted that the filly's connections were "in the process of filing an appeal" as of Sept. 24.

Paul's message underscored the view expressed in this column, i.e., that R Dutchess and driver Tim Tetrick were not unequivocally and solely at fault in the video evidence that appeared, from certain angles, to show them bearing in on Global Heritage, who went off-stride approaching the opening quarter. From other angles, it looked as if Lasting Dream and driver Louis-Philippe Roy caused the interference.

Lasting Dream finished second to R Dutchess. She was placed first when judges set back Tetrick's filly to last for causing interference to Global Heritage, who had finished last after the break.

It was a serious disappointment for R Dutchess' racing-breeding lessees and her owner Armitage Farm of Midway, KY. She and Tetrick had previously won her \$55,620 (U.S.) Casual Breeze division Aug. 22 at Mohawk; the other division was won by Global Heritage and driver Dexter Dunn, over place finisher Lasting Dream and Roy. On Aug. 30, R Dutchess had drawn away from Lasting Dream late in their \$116,599 (U.S.) Grade 3 Simcoe Stake division at Mohawk.

Before the appeal was submitted, Paul wrote that "In the meantime, we were able to produce a slow-motion video... that clearly shows Mr. Roy [put a] wheel under R Dutchess which caused the chain reaction incident. We so far have only been able to grab a video off the internet and are waiting for Mohawk to provide others." (A video clip was attached to the message, displaying what Paul described.)

This week, the Ontario Horse Racing Appeal Panel (HRAP) appeals coordinator Bianca D'Souza reached out to confirm that the connections of R Dutchess had filed their appeal about the placing. No date has yet been scheduled for the hearing.

R Dutchess, Lasting Dream, and Global Heritage are all eligible to the Grade 1 Breeders Crown 3-year-old filly trot, scheduled for Saturday (Oct. 25) at Mohawk, with eliminations on Saturday (Oct. 18) if required. The results of their \$600,000 Breeders Crown final will all but certainly be known before the Elegantimage appeal is resolved.

Breaking down the London Classic Yearling Sale

by Murray Brown

In relative terms, the upcoming London Classic Yearling sale, to this observer, is loaded. There is strength in both trotting and pacing pedigrees.

Fully 95 of the 128 trotting-bred yearlings presently up for sale are by four of the most prominent trotting sires to ever stand in the province – Green Manalishi S (20), King Of The North (25), Muscle Mass (35) and Trixton (15). There are also 10 by Archangel, the sire of certain Older Trotter of the Year winner Lexus Kody, with reasonably good representation by Alarm Detector (seven), Lookslkachippendale (four) and My MVP (eight).

Although the percentage of “Star” sires of pacers is perhaps not as strong as with trotters, the numbers are right up there. They are led by arguably the three most formidable sires to ever stand in the province, the sensational youngsters Bulldog Hanover (22) and Cattlewash (32) and the world’s leading money winning sire of any breed, Bettors Delight (13). These three world class stallions are augmented in representation by All Bets Off (18), Betterthancheddar (seven), Betting Line (seven), Big Jim (nine), Dancin Lou (five), McWicked (12), Sportswriter (12) and Sunshine Beach (seven).

I am only referencing stallions with five or more yearlings in the sale.

Thanks in no part, to the Canadian Postal Service going on strike, this author was handicapped by not receiving a catalog from which to diligently research the information necessary to adequately present a complete picture. Nevertheless, here are my thoughts on the offering based on the sires represented in it. But first...

REASONS WHY A CANADIAN SHOULD MAKE THIS SALE HIS PRIMARY PLACE TO DO BUSINESS.

1. There are more Ontario eligible yearlings to be found here than any other sale. Canadians race mostly in Ontario. This sale has more than double the number of those eligibles than

any other sale. That is certainly not to negate the importance of Harrisburg where 140 Ontario-sired yearlings will be sold in a few weeks. The wisest shoppers will make it their business to attend and peruse both.

2. Price. With all things being equal, which they rarely are, the buyer conducting commerce in Canadian funds will be paying roughly 40 per cent less for the same horse than he would if he were buying it an American sale. Added to the actual cost of the horse would be secondary expenses such as shipping (for both horses and people), board (the same) and any ancillary expenses related to leaving home or close by. I would caution that saving on these secondary expenses could be construed as being penny wise and pound foolish if doing so prevents the buyer from doing his due diligence in exploring all, or close to all Ontario-sired yearlings being offered for sale.
3. Many Canadians have expressed a desire to spend their money in Canada, with Canadians. This seems to have become a significant factor in the travel and tourism industries. If you do not believe this to be the case, check out the numbers in such popular tourist destinations such as Las Vegas, Orlando, Arizona and Southern California. The numbers are all down, especially so with Canadians.

TROTTING SIRES WITH FIVE OR MORE YEARLINGS IN LONDON

ALARM DETECTOR (SEVEN, FOUR COLTS, THREE FILLIES)

One of the first sons of Chapter Seven to enter the stud. He really hasn’t had much of a chance serving small books of average mares. However his Strobe Light defeated all the Green Manalishis and Muscle Masses in winning Friday’s (Oct. 10) OSS Gold Super Final.

ARCHANGEL (10, FIVE COLTS, FIVE FILLIES)

To these eyes, a very underrated stallion. A rare chance to acquire a possible home run horse without breaking the vault to get there. He has been more than a decent stallion, already siring three millionaires including the almost certain Dan Patch winner Lexus Kody and the Canadian champion Logan Park.

GREEN MANALISHI S (20, 11 COLTS, NINE FILLIES)

Right now the top trotting stallion in Ontario and it isn’t that close. He burst on the scene last year like the veritable colossus. He did it all – numbers, percentages, colts, fillies and money earnings. This year with that first crop now 3, he has cemented his stature with those, as well as once again having the top group of 2-year-olds

KING OF THE NORTH (25, 12 COLTS, 13 FILLIES)

The aspiring pretender to the throne of Green Manalishi S. KOTN made his debut in Lexington and it was quite promising. Assuming that my arithmetic is accurate, his nine colts averaged \$115,777 and his six fillies \$64,500. That is, of course, in U.S. dollars, which is likely quite a bit more than you will have to pay in London. From all reports his yearlings looked and moved in a manner that you would like a successful sire to look and perform.

MY MVP (EIGHT, SIX COLTS, TWO FILLIES)

This much-traveled son of Cantab Hall began his stud career in Ohio, moved to Ontario and is now back in Ohio. He is what I would describe as a middler. His horses generally show up and race. His top performer is the excellent mare Herculisa (\$684,275).

MUSCLE MASS (35, 13 COLTS, 22 FILLIES)

One of the greatest trotting sires to ever call Ontario home. Until Green Manalishi S came on the scene, MM dominated the Ontario trotting stakes. Now with GM here, Muscle Mass is still an important player. One wonders how well this regional market will be able to absorb 35 yearlings at a single venue, especially considering the difficult opposition they face from strong groups by GM and KOTH. On the other hand, those numbers allow for excellent value for the wise shopper. It allows for, in the words of the great Bill Wellwood to “buy where people are not buying.”

TRIXTON (15, 11 COLTS, FOUR FILLIES)

To this observer, this appears to be the largest number this extremely well-bred and well-performed son of Muscle Hill has had on offer at this sale since locating to Ontario from New Jersey. I would assess his success thus far to have been what I would call solid. Although, thus far, he lacks the home run horse that all breeders look for. His best horse to date is the flashy Cuatro De Julio (\$879,061) who's first crop of yearlings acquitted themselves well in the sales ring in Lexington.

PACING SIRES WITH FIVE OR MORE YEARLINGS IN LONDON**ALL BETS OFF (18, FIVE COLTS, 13 FILLIES)**

To these eyes, together with Bettors Wish and Betterthancheddar, the three best siring sons of Bettors Delight. All three have done reasonably well, but none has yet to come through with the home run horse that both breeders and buyers look for.

BETTERTHANCHEDDAR (SEVEN, FOUR COLTS, THREE FILLIES)

From relatively limited opportunity, he has done all right, but just that. Generally looked upon as being a decent Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) and overnight horse. Price wise, they will not be able to compete with Cattlewashes, Bulldog Hanovers, and, to a lesser degree, the Bettors Delights. For someone with limited means, there should be some opportunity here.

BETTING LINE (SEVEN, FOUR COLTS, THREE FILLIES)

The expectations were extremely high, but unfortunately they just were not reached. Of all the horses I have been involved with, Betting Line ranked as number one on my all-time “cannot miss” list of becoming a great stallion – yet, he missed! I wouldn't consider him to have been an abject failure. He has sired some very good horses led by the \$2 million+ winner Abuckabett Hanover.

BETTORS DELIGHT (13, NINE COLTS, FOUR FILLIES)

The leading money winning sire of all breeds. He is the sire of winners of hundreds of millions of dollars in both North America and Down Under. This will be his second to last yearling crop here in North America. It appears, that the competition, namely Bulldog Hanover and Cattlewash, have caught up to and surpassed him. Would I be willing to guess that there is not one more great horse or more in these last two crops? Not on your life.

BIG JIM (NINE, SIX COLTS, THREE FILLIES)

In this guy's opinion, a much underrated sire who has done far better than the credit for which he is given. There will undoubtedly be some value to be found here. The human Big Jim would be very proud of what he has done.

BULLDOG HANOVER (22, EIGHT COLTS, 14 FILLIES)

This is his second and first full crop. His first group was conceived while he was still in training. It consisted of 54 foals coming from decent, but just decent mares. They are now 2-year-olds and have raced exceptionally well being second only to the incredible Cattlewash, but surpassing perennial leader Bettors Delight among OSS sires. His second crop of 132 foals, now yearlings are out of a stellar collection of blue blooded mares. In Lexington, his 24 colts averaged \$81,543 and his 21 fillies \$75,429 in U.S. funds. They would both have to average in excess of \$100,000 in Canadian dollars to come close to meeting those numbers in London.

CATTLEWASH (32, 17 COLTS, 15 FILLIES)

The hottest pacing sire in Canada and perhaps everywhere. After a small first crop while standing in New Jersey, Cattlewash was sent to Ontario where he has overwhelmed his opposition. He swept the OSS Super Finals on Friday with his superstar undefeated colt Beau Jangles winning the colt division and his filly A Clean Deal being the best of the fairer sex. The very large number of yearlings, by far the most by any pacer in the sale, might allow for their prices not being too high. It's almost certain that there will be many who fetch large numbered bids. There will also likely be some that are affordable.

DANCIN LOU (FIVE, THREE COLTS, TWO FILLIES)

This is the third crop by this son of Sweet Lou. His oldest foals from his first two groups have raced well enough for the wise shopper to look these over. However, with almost all pacing sires, the trio of Cattlewash, Bulldog Hanover, and Bettors Delight make for very steep competition.

MCWICKED (12, SEVEN COLTS, FIVE FILLIES)

As with all pacing sires, the competition is inordinately high. However, McWicked has shown he is capable of producing some very good raceway performers.

SPORTSWRITER (12, FOUR COLTS, EIGHT FILLIES)

There was a time when Sportswriter stood near the top of the line when it came to siring the best OSS performers. However, as with most sires to varying degrees, his time appears to have come and gone. That's not to say that he is no longer capable of possibly producing a top one. There are likely to be a bargain or more among this group.

SUNSHINE BEACH (SEVEN, TWO COLTS, FIVE FILLIES)

The expectations were very high for this son of the mighty Somebeachsomewhere. As with most sires, they were not quite reached. He has done okay, but just okay. He has proven capable of siring the occasional OSS star, but as with all pacers not by Bettors Delight, Bulldog Hanover, and Cattlewash, the air is rather thin in the areas in which they play.

The London Classic Yearling Sale will be held Oct. 14 and 15 at Western Fair District.



London Classic Yearling Sale primed for big numbers thanks to strong catalog of Ontario-sired horses

Greg Blanchard can point to several reasons why he thinks the [London Classic Yearling Sale](#) (LCYS) may be a record-breaking auction. Chief among them, said the sale manager, is U.S. tariff and border concerns that led more consignors to sell more of their horses in London. This year, some 290 standardbred yearlings will go through the sales ring between Oct. 14 and 15 at the J-AAR Expo Centre (formerly the Agriplex) at Western Fair District.

“With the political climate the way it was when we opened for entries [in the spring] – and so much uncertainty around the potential of tariffs and how they were going to impact things – we had consignors reach out and tell us that they were going to enter everything [in the London sale], and then kind of see how it played out,” Blanchard said. “They are still taking their American-breds south to Lexington and Harrisburg. But some consignors have brought better quality yearlings here this year than maybe normal.

“When the entries were coming in, and we started to go through them, I could tell that the quality was at a different level this year than we had seen. Since then, I’ve had several people give me an unsolicited opinion that, if not the strongest, it’s one of the strongest catalogs ever offered in Canada.”

Jenna McNiven, the farm manager of Twinbrook Farms in Embro, ON that will sell 15 horses in London, said that’s exactly how it worked out for her family’s yearlings. Normally, Twinbrook sells the bulk of its yearlings at the Standardbred Horse Sale Company’s auction in Harrisburg, PA. This year, more of their yearlings will be sold in London.

“Part of it was the unpredictability with the tariffs,” McNiven said. “We weren’t sure what was going to happen come fall, and we just thought that we’d leave them up here. We didn’t really have a choice with our American-breds [that we’re still

selling in Harrisburg], but with our Ontario-breds, we left them up here.”

Jesse Belore’s Princeton Farms will sell 22 yearlings in London this year. He said there seems to be more of a buzz around the London sale this year, which follows the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale held Sept. 29 through Oct. 3 in Kentucky.

“I think the buyers are excited,” Belore said. “I know a lot of [Canadian] buyers did not go to Lexington. A lot of Ontario buyers traditionally don’t buy in Lexington, but they go for a holiday. Many didn’t even go this year. So, I think there is a little more buzz behind [the London sale].”

“We’ve had a lot of people out to the farm this year and some new people that haven’t come out in a while. So, that’s a positive. I do think people are going into it a little more excited than in previous years.”

LOW CANADIAN DOLLAR INCREASES LIKELIHOOD ONTARIANS BUYING IN LONDON

McNiven said the low conversion rate of Canadian to U.S. dollars is also a reason she is optimistic London will be a strong sale. As of Friday, the Bank of Canada had the Canadian dollar trading at 71 cents U.S.

“With the dollar difference, it’s better for Ontario people to buy right here at home,” McNiven said. “So, we thought that that would also benefit the buyers and us.”

It also means U.S. buyers are able to purchase top Ontario-sired horses at a premium.

“For Americans, their dollar goes so much further here. They’ve got a chance of that home run horse out of this sale and, also, the [Ontario-sired horses] are eligible to one of the most lucrative programs in North America,” Blanchard said of the Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS). “And, as we’ve seen, a lot of the Ontario-breds are competing on the Grand Circuit and are some of the best horses in harness racing.”

Also, the sale is positioned right after **this weekend’s lucrative OSS Gold Super Finals** at Woodbine Mohawk Park, giving some buying customers extra money to spend at the auction.

Now in its fourth year since being acquired by the Western Fair Association and rebranded as the London Classic Yearling Sale, Blanchard said the sale has been a proven venue for selling champions.

“We’ve had a number that have really shown up on the racetrack in a big way this year,” Blanchard said. “For example, Flowing Tribute, arguably the best rookie trotting filly in Canada this year, she sold here last year. We’ve got a sibling to her selling this year. That’s just an example of some of the quality that we have.”

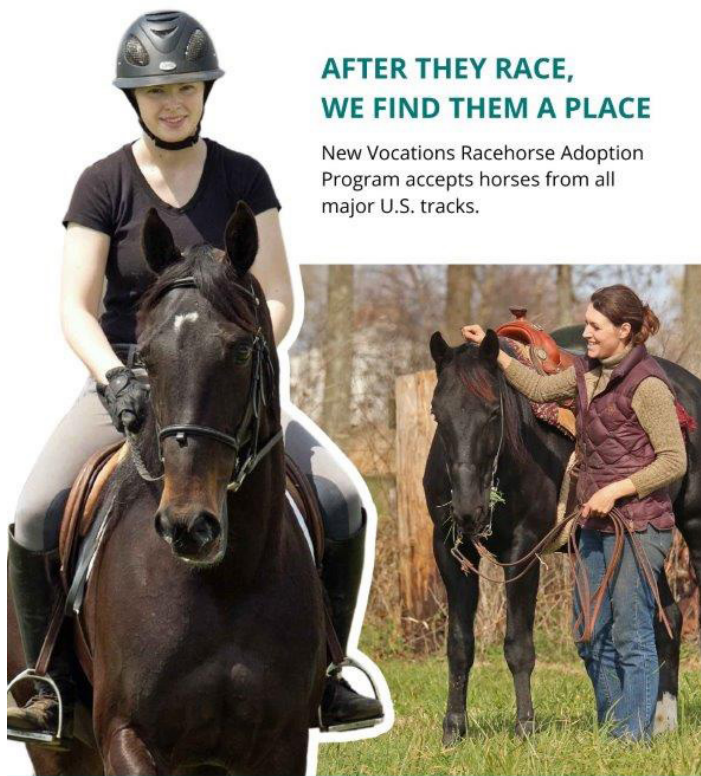
EXCITING GROUP OF NEW ONTARIO STALLIONS

Blanchard said a **new class of stallions standing in the province** is also reason for optimism.

“Look at the stallions in Ontario and how excited people were for Bulldog [Hanover’s] first crop and how they’ve shown up,” he said. “We expect even better in that second crop where he had a better group of mares. Then, the Cattlewashes. He’s just sending ripples through the harness racing world this year with what he’s doing. When you look at our catalog, we’ve got some 30 Cattlewashes in the sale.”

“I was excited last year when Cattlewash sold his first crop here in Canada. I was excited to see what he could do. I had a good feeling. And I’ve got that same feeling about King Of The North on the trotting side.”

“I remember the way he won the Breeders Crown here to end his 3-year-old season. That sticks in my mind. He’s got a tremendous pedigree. The videos we’ve seen of his offspring look fantastic. So, you know, you add him into the mix with Green Manalishi [S], Muscle Mass and Archangel, those are trotting stallions that can compete anywhere. And I think that’s what we’ve seen is horses bred in Ontario can compete with any anyone on the planet. And we’ve got a tremendous offering this year.”

Belore agreed that there is excitement in the Ontario standardbred community about the new stallions.

"I know we've had Betters Delight, I know we've had Muscle Mass, but I think people are actually like, 'Wow, we have some really amazing stallions.' I think there's a big buzz behind that," Belore said.

"Cattlewashes and Bulldogs and Green Manalishis and King Of The Norths, they all look good. They all look the part. They look like you should be selling nice yearlings from them.

"And then the best part about all these stallions is they all, generally, cross against each other. Now we have a son of Shadow Play [Bulldog Hanover] and a son of The Beach [Cattlewash] on the pacing side."

Belore said he is selling yearlings this year from all of those top sires.

"We've got a lot of what everybody wants," he said. "We have King Of The Norths, Green Mans, Bulldogs, Cattlewashes and then we're lucky because we still have Archangels and Bettors Delights and Muscle Mass... I feel like, across the board, we have the stallions that everybody wants."

McNiven said three of Twinbrook's better Ontario-bred horses selling this year in London likely would have been sold in Harrisburg in previous years.

"I think they'll stand out nicely here," McNiven said of **Hip #51 Twin B Kingsley**, a filly out of Affair Hall that is from the first crop of trotting sire King Of The North, **Hip #150 Twin B Sheila**, a Bulldog Hanover filly out of In The Pink and **Hip #281 Twin B Smokeshow**, a Muscle Mass filly out of Showstopper.

"[Twin B Kingsley] is a sibling to Twin B Archie, who was an O'Brien award winner. Deeper down in the pedigree it's more of an Angus Hall family, just a really great family. If you take the paper away, we just love her as an individual, too. She's very full of herself, and she stands great, has great confirmation."

As for Twin B Sheila, McNiven touted the fact the yearling is a daughter of Bulldog Hanover.

"Bulldog is very exciting for Ontario," McNiven said. "I think from his limited first crop [racing this year as 2-year-olds], he's surprised a number of us. So, we're pretty excited about Bulldog. And then the dam has been a really good mare for us. Two of her colts have raced in the Metro Pace and then her 2-year-old filly was in the She's A Great Lady this year.

"Both those fillies, Kingsley and Sheila, they're residual value after racing is pretty nice also. In today's game, I think people do look at that to see what kind of value they would have after [racing] as well."

Twin B Sheila may also have some powerful karma on her side.

"With that In The Pink mare, we've done a bunch of breast cancer awareness events," McNiven said. "Sheila is named after probably my parents' best friend, who is a cancer survivor. She's been bugging us for years to name a horse after her, just jokingly... She had breast cancer last year, and she kicked it in the butt and

then we had Twin B Sheila come along out of In The Pink, so [Sheila] got the namesake that she was looking for."

McNiven said Twin B Smokeshow, "is just a powerhouse of a filly. We think she's pretty nice... She's always been good looking."

In the end, Blanchard said the strength of the London catalog should win out.

"In recent years, you might see the very best-bred [Ontario-sired yearlings] selling at Lexington or Harrisburg," he said. "I think we've got a larger share of those top-bred Ontario horses here [this year]. So, the big hitters that love to go for Ontario-breds that typically shop at those other sales, I think this year they have to have a look at our catalog, because there's going to be some future champions there."

Both the Oct. 14 and Oct. 15 sale sessions begin at noon.





MEADOWLANDS MATTERS

The Meadowlands is back with a bang and a bark on Saturday

The Meadowlands gets back on track Saturday (Oct. 18) when they kick off the remainder of their 2025 schedule that runs through Dec. 27.

Standardbreds last raced at The Big M on Saturday (Sept. 13) before the track played host to the annual “Monmouth at The Meadowlands” thoroughbred turf meet that wraps up on Friday (Oct. 17).

The first of five straight weekends of stakes action begins next week and culminates on Saturday (Nov. 22) with finals for the New Jersey Standardbred Development Fund (NJSDF).

Stakes school starts its session on Friday (Oct. 24) with the fifth and final leg of the Kindergarten Classic Series, giving both male and female 2-year-old trotters and pacers one last opportunity to accrue points.

Having the most points is an advantage in the Kindergarten finals, since, according to the race conditions, the point leader, or leaders in case of a tie, draw for post positions 1-6.

Even though there is no stakes action to kick off their fall return, the East Rutherford, NJ mile oval is expecting a large crowd to cheer on their favorites in the inaugural Corgi Cup, which was rescheduled from Sept. 6 due to severe weather conditions.

The family-fun canine contest is at capacity with 80 participants and a long waiting list, should anyone drop out.

In addition to their typical Friday-Saturday racing schedule that will continue through the end of the year, to partly compensate for the loss of live New Jersey harness dates when Freehold Raceway closed its doors in December of last year, The Meadowlands has added six Thursdays to their lineup: Nov. 6, 13, 20 and Dec. 4, 11, 18. Prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, the occasional Thursday in November and December were not uncommon as many companies liked to hold holiday parties at the track.

The Meadowlands will further feature fabulous freshmen with the Kindergarten finals on Saturday (Nov. 1), followed by legs 1 and 2 of the NJSDF on Nov. 7-8 and 14-15, respectively, with trotters on Fridays and pacers on Saturdays, leading up to the four aforementioned NJSDF finals on Nov. 22.

Also on Nov. 15 is the Freshman Fall Final Four – Governor’s Cup (2YOCP), Three Diamonds (2YOFP), Valley Victory (2YOCT), and Goldsmith Maid (2YOFT) – and FanDuel Championships (Mare and Open Pace and Trot).

The Meadowlands will team with the New York Racing Association (NYRA) for their final FOX Sports shows of the season as part of NYRA’s “America’s Day at the Races” telecasts on Nov. 1 for the Kindergarten finals (8-11 p.m.) and Nov. 15 for the Fall Final Four (8-11 p.m.).

Even though the saying has always been, “It all comes down to the Breeders Crown,” the Fall Final Four and FanDuel Championships have played a part in determining divisional honors on more than one occasion.

At the end of the Championship Meet, Brett Beckwith and Jeff Cullipher were the top driver and trainer, respectively, at The Big M.

With two and a half months to go until the end of the year, it seems unlikely that anyone will catch Beckwith, who enters Saturday night’s card with 100 wins, 22 more than David Miller in second and 30 more than Jason Bartlett in third.

The trainer title appears to be a different story where Cullipher has 49 wins and is four up on Noel Daley (45) and five up on Ron Burke (44), but once stakes season is over in late November, Cullipher may have the upper hand with more overnight stock competing at The Meadowlands in December.

MANE ATTRACTION

A passing glance with Jerry Glantz

In combing over some of my favorite fillies of the past, the name of Passing Glance came to mind – Passing Glance just one, mind you, of a thousand or more since the days of Impish and Countess Adios, Armbr Flight, Glad Rags, Cheer Honey, Rockette Forbes, Timely Beauty, Heather Mom, Jan Kaye, some famous, some not so famous, but, still, fillies and mares that I admired greatly back in those great days.

Those were the days, for example, that if Heather Mom trotted an opening half in 1:00 on the lead, she'd be nowhere at the wire, but if (Dave) Bartlett looked down at his stopwatch and saw it at 1:03, Heather Mon was “just, a minute” away from the winner's circle at Washington Park, as the late, great Phil Georgeff would say.

But back to Passing Glance, she was a daughter of Albatross and she was a handy sort that didn't matter the size of the track, winning 31 of 55 starts and over \$340,000 during her three-year career on the track in the late 1970s.

She was a rare gal by taking her mark of 1:56.2 on a five-eighths oval and had a half-mile mark of 1:57.2, a fifth of a second faster than her mark at The Meadowlands.

Anyhow, by coincidence, I happened to call an old compadre, Jerry Glantz, and this Passing Glance-Jerry Glantz detail was just too good to pass up for this Mane Attraction.

I corralled Glantz upon his return to Florida for what turned out to be a riveting interview.

It's so good to be with you, after all, you have played just about every instrument in harness racing's orchestra. Tell us about the beginnings.

“My dad, Irving, bought his first horse in 1959 in Goshen, NY, and I was right behind him when he did it. I was just a young whipper-snapper at the time and the bug bit me right then and there.”

You have quite a resume, from announcer to bloodstock agent to working in the race secretary's office.

“Yes, I announced at Monticello Raceway, Roosevelt and, of course, Pompano Park, probably more than 35,000 races. I have been fortunate to have had many clients over the past 50 years that have trusted my judgment in the selection of yearlings. I was also time trial director at The Red Mile for a couple of years, in fact, around the time that Passing Glance raced.”

I wish they'd bring those time trials back. I think that many a horse could fess-up a record of 1:48 or, even, faster, which, I think, would be a lot more meaningful than showing a horse's best time on the track in a race, where they were drafted along in seventh timed in 1:49.

“Just take a look at the Sunday program from The Red Mile. I think you'll see entire fields or close to entire fields under 1:50.”

Yeah, in fact, the whole 12 horse field was clocked in 1:49 or faster and some were well back just drafting along, and look at where the standardbred breed has come. Heck, I said in my column 45 years ago that a 1:50 mile would never be accomplished because a :29 breather would be needed along the way. Louprint, after being hung out past a :27.1 opener, brushed three straight quarters in :26.1, :26.3, and :26.2. Sugar Man paced his last three-quarters in 1:18.4 in the same race and just squeaked by to get fourth place. I mean, we're speed crazy today. On that same subject, do you think the speed rage of today hurts ownership potential in this sport?

“I really think so. While it's really nice to own a 1:48 performer, when a horse paces in [1]:48 and a piece and finished eighth or ninth, well, that kind of throws a damper in spending serious money these days in buying a yearling. There's only so many spots that get checks and if 1:48 isn't enough to win and 1:49 isn't enough to have earned your way out, well, I think that spells trouble.”

Perfect example of that is the 3-year-old Wavemaker, who has five wins in 16 starts with a mark of 1:49.3 – kind of ho-hum these days – and has banked only \$40,000 and change this year, probably a losing proposition for the owner in today’s marketplace.

“Yes, and there’s fierce competition out there. And it’s not only the speed, it’s the strength of the powerful owners that have been smart enough to figure out the system and absolutely annihilate the purses in these days.

“We’re no different than other speed sports. In the first Indy-500, the average speed for the winner was 74 miles-per hour. By 1932, it was over 100 mph. In the 1960s, it went over 150 mph. If you own one of those cars these days, your return will be Z-E-R-O, with the same investment, or more.

“I don’t know if you realize that the top 10 trainers in harness racing, and I don’t want to take away from their expertise and *how* they do it, but there are at last a couple of thousand trainers in harness racing and the top two have won \$31-\$32 million and the top 10 have won way over 15 per cent of those purses, and they are the big purses, the Stakes purses. So, what’s the future for the other 85 per cent of the trainers in harness racing. They are left with the scraps.”

Well, in actuality, this is nothing new. When Lou Guida invaded harness racing with his investors, they kind of monopolized the sport 40-45 years ago. He had 1-1A-1B-1C and I-D in the Meadowlands Pace one year – 1985 – and took four of the top five checks.

“Yes, that’s true but it’s a bit different today with what the leader of the pack is doing. Again, he’s beaten the system and I take nothing away from his success, *but* he has invaded just about every overnight track and I would think it would be quite difficult to track all of those horses at every track, every day, every night.”

I understand.

“Let me finish! Don’t look at who *is* buying horses, look at the ones that *are no longer buying horses*. Then you’ll see why the industry is having a problem luring new owners into harness racing.”

Do you think there are different standards for different people in harness racing?

“I’m involved in one right now.”

What’s the story?

“My trainer – a very excellent horseman, by the way – Tony Dinges, got a positive test result on a horse at a fair track and got a suspension, on a horse, by the way, that I do not own.

“But for the first time in my life, I had two horses that, after training and prepping and racing, qualified for various finals in the Kentucky Sire Stakes finals – my filly for the Commonwealth and my colt for the Golden Rod – very exciting for this man in his, what do they say, Golden Years.”

You own them with others?

“I own 100 per cent of both, the first time in my life this is happening for me.”

That’s still big money there.

“\$100,000 for the filly and \$50,000 for the colt in those finals.

“We put them in the box two days earlier and the entries were accepted. Later, Tony [Dinges] called me with the news that the Commission was scratching both of my horses. They had denied him a hearing and a stay!”

That seems a bit prejudicial since there are trainers that get hearings and stays all over the place, some for years, and on situations that seemingly are much worse on pari-mutuel tracks that have betting.

“Not only that, the medication in question *on the horse I do not own*, is a Class 4 substance, Banamine.”

I’m no vet but isn’t the particular medication simply therapeutic in nature?

“Yes, and it’s ‘withdrawal’ period is 48 hours and there was hardly a trace in that horse *I did not own*, which, probably would have been gone in a very short time.”

Devastating!

“Devastating? This has been devastating for me both financially and personally. Financially, this entire episode has forced me to sell my colt to continue to pay the bills on the filly!

“Personally, this has been heartbreaking to realize that the sport to which I have devoted my life has done something like this to me. It shouldn’t happen to anybody.”

Who was responsible for the ruling? Are you at liberty to name names?

“The president and CEO of the Kentucky Horse Racing Commission is Jami Eads. This was, clearly, a misuse of power and has damaged me to no end.

“First, they accepted the entries and then scratched the horses. This has hurt others, as well, in the Dinges Stable and, for a fact, Tony Dinges does *not* use Banamine and the sample taken should have been revisited for contamination. This has hurt others besides myself and they were denied to the \$400,000 finals.”

So, is this a chance for you to be the “Rose Parks” of harness racing by starting a crusade to get universal rules on medication in place?

“I don’t know about Rosa Parks but, at least, we should be speaking up on bringing the industry up to today with *universal rules and laws* that puts everyone on an even track!

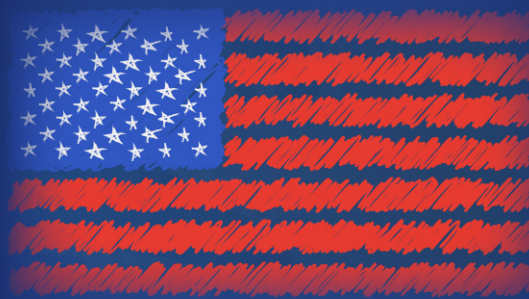

Del Mar: luck with silver linings and caballos de carreras in the afternoon, Part 2

Nowhere in my library of popular or underground horse racing academics is Biff Warden or his book *Power Plays* mentioned. The question raised by myself and my Del Mar thoroughbred gambling partner Rick Silver was: "Is it possible there exists a person under any given or made-up name who has discovered the fantastic how-to-beat-the-races method?"

Warden's chapbook was self-published and as hard to find anywhere as was its author's profile. I asked many of the prominent and successful authors and professional pari-mutuel players if they ever heard of Warden. Every one of them shrugged and laughed when I told them Warden created a handicapping method for thoroughbred racing, one that works.

"And I have two wishes left from a leprechaun I caught under a bridge in Ireland," said one.

Another said, "By the way, Frank, I have a unique offer for you to invest in some oil-rich land in Oklahoma."

"Just asking," I said.

I then recalled the old and wise horse racing handicapper I mentioned in this series who said, "Most any winning system could work only for a spell before it collapsed and then it remained a mystery how it ever produced success." As well, I remembered this: "There is no such thing as good or bad luck. There is only luck and the lack of it."

The 1988 Del Mar thoroughbred meet and the unexplained brilliance of Warden's *Power Plays* method kicked in when we applied his calculation-based method to races that included random race entries shipping in from the Mexican racetrack Agua Caliente. Once we made ourselves aware of the fact that there was a generous stream of these immigrant runners entered here and there (mostly in sprints) on the programs we were, as they say, off to the races.

No Agua Caliente entries recorded impressive numbers. Except for their speed. The Mexican track was a slick haven for sprinters. Winning or losing they all ran competitively with fiery fractions, no matter the weather. These were no blue-blooded specimens

of the equine species. These were overnighters. Pedestrian-breds (and some looked like mules). For everyday bettors at Del Mar these 'caballos de carreras' (racehorses) were to be ignored in competition with the superior California-breds handled by world-wide successful trainers. The average Del Mar bettor drew thick lines through their names and stats on the racing programs.

For Rick and I they were 'deliverers of dollars.' We set up our parameters defining the system and determining or limiting its performances. This left us available to handicap and wager on other races using our home-grown talents.

"We are on a binge," I told Natasha. "For these special race figures Rick and I found we are wagering with immoderate indulgence."

"And you are winning? Is that it?" she said.

"Profits are up. Way up."

"You still do all the percentage-odds work?"

"Only for races that do not include the Mexican shippers. And we are doing all right with the few of those races we play."

Indeed. Hitting a decent exacta (sometimes the crowd-favoring combination) produced handsome double-digit payoffs considering Del Mar's exacta base price was five dollars.

Sometimes Natasha and Rick and I went to breakfast at a local restaurant before post time. Then Rick would go to the track early and work on some *Power Plays* figures while Natasha and I went to a local Italian pastry shop to load up on classy expensive snacks for the length of the race program.

Of course, not every shipper won (many were second and third but we only played to win considering our data was based on horses winning). But every shipper had a strong 'Biff' score and the greatest number of them fit our "5-2 and up bet" standard.

One night after the races Natasha and I were drinking beer on my bare, but beautiful, living room space in Leucadia and she said, "Are there Mexican harness racehorses?"

"Nope. This playing ends with the thoroughbreds."

It made me wonder about my gambling profession at the ending of the Del Mar meet. There would be simulcasting from Santa Anita and Hollywood Park and the bullrings' racing on the fair circuit but no more *Power Plays* that worked. Every attempt we made to use them on races void of the magic Mexican sprinters was miserable (fortunately we only proved that without betting). The particulars we used for serious success would disappear.

"Magic comes and goes," Natasha said.

She was as right as the old and wise gambler who told me about the luck that is magic. We took advantage of the *Power Plays* numbers and the strange character known as Biff Warden. The sane reality was that it would never happen again because, "Most any winning system could work only for a spell before it collapsed and then it remained a mystery how it ever produced success."

Almost two decades ago, Trey got invited to a harness racing ceremony at the Bellagio Hotel in Atlantic City, NJ. I was nervous because I did not know much about harness racing. I knew a little about the history of Atlantic City because I was engrossed in the TV series Boardwalk Empire and the gangland exploits of Enoch “Nucky” Thompson. All went well. The people were friendly. I did not get wacked or even mugged.

At the event, a man introduced as Gural took the stage, talked briefly, and said, “When the casinos ask us why we need them, we’d better have an answer.” I was not sure what he meant at the time.

We are a long way down the road from that night on the boardwalk, and, amazingly, his question remains unanswered. The casino issue is like a rabid wolverine locked in our basement. We soldier on with our sport and tiptoe past the basement door, hoping the padlock does not fail. Perhaps we should consider a little preemptive planning. I checked in with Artie (AI) for some thoughts.

Trey asked: “Hey Artie, we are in the yearling sales season. The yearling marketplace remains strong. A solid pool of people enjoys this quirky game. But for the long-range survival of harness racing, the people who grow the product – the owners

of our horse breeding farms – should create new structures for racing. They should break the glass in case of an emergency scenario. Let me send you some thoughts from an archived column that suggests a private, not-for-profit club structure requiring culling older horses and eliminating the winter racing season. I am curious to see if you find this concept viable.”

Artie replied: “Short answer: parts of your concept are viable and attractive; others would backfire.

Viable

- The farm-led structure (a cooperative league): Breeding farms fund and co-govern a compact race product that aligns incentives. Farms create a healthy downstream racing stage to sustain yearling values.
- A seasonal, scarcity-driven schedule (spring-fall focus): Scarcity helps media and hospitality, lowering northern-winter operating costs, improving horse welfare, and leading to socialization.
- Young-horse emphasis: A calendar that spotlights 2- and 3-year-olds (with selective 4- and 5-year-old features) matches buyer demand and sales-ring storytelling.

Not viable

- The blanket elimination of winter racing is not a good idea. Some regions can and should pause, but a complete shutdown kills year-round wagering habits and simulcast cash flow for partner tracks. Consider a shorter “winter siesta” (six-eight weeks).
- Concerning the concept of “Culling” horses over age 4 is the third rail! Beyond ethics and optics, you’d lose stars just as they acquire names and rivalries. Older divisions provide story continuity, and barns rely on them for cash flow.”

Trey asked: “Yeah, my bad; I should get slapped with a feed bucket for using the term cull (in my mind, this would be humanely and gradually). And chopping off the winter season would be a shock to the system. Can you be a bit more specific?”

Artie replied: “Blueprint (a pilot project for two-three years). Form the Farms’ Racing Cooperative (FRC): A non-profit league with member farms, consignors, and participating tracks.

Funding mix: 2 per cent yearling-sale assessment, enhanced stallion/foal nominations, owner subscriptions, media/sponsorship, and hospitality.

Purses: Concentrate on marquee weekends + fair-circuit finals; fewer dates, higher purses.

Calendar and product: Primary season: April-October (regional festival meets; county-fair anchors). Micro-winter window: Late January-February or none in cold regions; keep a slim ‘training-center meet’ where it’s humane and economical.

“The breeding farms have the most to lose if subsidies collapse. Without racing, their yearlings lose market value overnight. That means farms must also carry a bigger share of the burden if we want a new, independent harness racing future: Farm-Led Cooperative Model, with the mission of building an economic engine for harness racing that does not depend on casino subsidies.”

Media and monetization: Yearling-to-debut storytelling, owner-experience subscriptions, fair-meet ‘Americana’ packages, and shoulder-programming around big weekends. Sell context, not just races.

Here is the bottom line: a farm-led, scarcity-based, youth-centric league can be viable and reduce dependence on casino subsidies.”

Trey said: “Your plan is a bit of a jumble, but considering you are not human, your heart is in the right place. It irks me that a track has nothing to fall back on when the revenue dries up. Recently, a track I had never heard of, Fraser Downs, was here one day and was gone the next. This harness racing outpost sank like a stone without a ripple. Fallback tracks should be at least in the experimental stage, and some money should be in the bank for that stormy day. The farm operators should be the driving force.”

Artie replied: “The breeding farms have the most to lose if subsidies collapse. Without racing, their yearlings lose market value overnight. That means farms must also carry a bigger share of the burden if we want a new, independent harness racing future: Farm-Led Cooperative Model, with the mission of building an economic engine for harness racing that does not depend on casino subsidies.

“Anchor funding in the farms in state-based programs that already organize owners, breeders, and tracks around a shared identity. The key pillars are: Scarcity and focus, fewer dates, stronger fields, better betting product. State identity that ties programs to pride (Ohio, Indiana, PA, NJ, KY, ON). Heritage and storytelling with county fair and regional roots presented as Americana. Technology for welfare, where biometrics/3D scans protect horses first, not replacing horsepeople.

“Why this works - Demand is proven: Lexington, Harrisburg is consistently strong, and Ohio and Indiana sales are surging. Farms benefit twice: yearling values hold/grow, and racing stays viable for buyers. States already have infrastructure: sire stakes programs, sale companies, and fairs form a ready-made backbone. Would you like more details and specific data?”

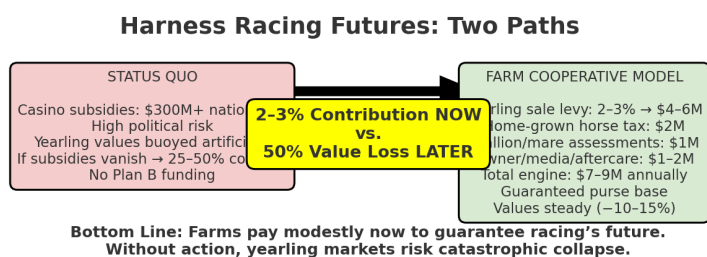
Trey said: “No, my head is already spinning. If a group of farm owners is interested, they can get their own artificial intelligence guru. Let’s assume a concept of this ilk has a kernel of a good idea, and let’s assume I find myself in a room full of breeding farm owners. Put some words in my mouth.”

Artie replied: “We all know harness racing as we know it is standing on a fragile foundation. The casino subsidies we’ve leaned on for years are not guaranteed, and when they falter, your businesses – your farms, our yearling markets, your livelihoods – will feel the shock.

“I’m not here to talk about doom and gloom. I’m here to talk about control. A chance to create a funding engine of your own – modest, fair, and sustainable – that protects the value of the horses we breed and the future of the sport we love. Not a tax; this is self-insurance. It is stewardship. It is our opportunity to secure harness racing’s tomorrow, together, before someone else decides our fate for us.”

Trey said: “Not bad. Now create one of those spiffy charts for a deck pitch.”

McClure has karma to thank for landing Super Final champ Beau Jangles

Minutes after keeping **Beau Jangles** perfect both through 10 career starts and all six of his Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) events, driver Bob McClure stood in the paddock dripping mud and contemplating the karma of how he arrived here with this superstar 2-year-old pacing colt, who dominated his \$300,000 OSS Gold Super Final on Friday (Oct. 10) in a downpour at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Just when he decided to stop traveling to be home more for his kids, Beau Jangles landed in his lap precisely because another driver, Louis-Philippe Roy, was away racing horses at The Meadowlands. Roy was originally trainer Dr. Ian Moore's choice to drive the son of Cattlewash out of Mrs Major Hill.

"I spent the last six, seven years doing a lot of traveling, probably more than anybody in this drivers' colony, with Determination and Sylvia Hanover," McClure said. "It was difficult because you do lose a lot of the local horses and the provincial horses. People understandably want a driver they know is going to be here.

"I made a commitment at the start of this year that I didn't want to travel anymore. I wanted to be home more with my kids. And, you know, the time at home was definitely worth the decision, but Beau Jangles was really worth the decision.

"Maybe it's karma. Maybe it's not, I don't know. You take the good fortune, and you do the best you can with it. But I think anybody, anybody in the top 100 drivers in North America could have sat behind this guy and done exactly the same thing."

That might be a stretch. McClure has driven Beau Jangles perfectly. But, there's no denying the pacer is another-worldly talent.

On Friday, McClure put the colt on the lead from the rail and led the field through easy fractions of :26.1, :55.3, and 1:24, coming home in :26.4 to win 2½ lengths over Windor (Doug McNair) in 1:50.4 on a track rated good.

Sent off at 1-9, Beau Jangles paid \$2.10 to win.

The victory pushed Beau Jangles earnings to \$1,192,125 for the colt's U.S. owners:

- Adam Ainspan and Mary Beth Roberts under the Graham Grace Stables LLC of Clifton, VA
- Anne Hooper and Jonathan Roberts under the Kiwi Stables LLC of La Plata, MD
- Ed, Garth and Philip Bolton, plus John Draper of the Bolton Stables of Clermont, FL

Bred by Tara Hill Stud in Port Perry, ON where Cattlewash also stands, Beau Jangles was purchased for \$65,000 at last year's Standardbred Horse Sales Company yearling auction in Harrisburg, PA.

The winner of the \$1 million Grade 1 Metro Pace at Mohawk in September, Beau Jangles is now scheduled to take on Grand Circuit horses again in the Breeders Crown at Woodbine Mohawk Park. Eliminations are next weekend and Beau Jangles is raring to go.

"We had to put a mini bit in him tonight," Moore said of the colt, who was a handful in the winner's circle. "When I trained him on Tuesday, he was a handful for me then too. So, we're probably going to try earplugs next week."

Moore said it was the first time he's had a horse sweep all five OSS Gold legs and the Super Final.

Before Beau Jangles came into his life, the trainer had planned to retire at the end of this season, proving the colt had gifted him with some serious karma, as well.

A Clean Deal wipes away competition in OSS Gold Super Final for freshmen filly pacers

A Clean Deal did not pace the most pristine path, but overcame obstacles to win the \$300,000 Ontario Sires Stakes Gold Super Final for 2-year-old filly pacers on Friday night (Oct. 10) at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

In a race that saw Th Check Me Out (post 3), Daya (post 5), and Jen Tilly (post 7) all leave, driver Doug McNair was content to protect pylon position with A Clean Deal (1-5 favorite) and let things settle before making his move to the lead.

Jen Tilly (driven by Louis-Philippe Roy, 29-1) got the first call leading the field of eight past the quarter in :27.

The action was then fast and furious, for no sooner had Jen Tilly settled in on the point, she was then challenged by Daya (Jody Jamieson, 2-1) who cleared to the lead approaching the three-eighths.

McNair followed Jamieson's move, but was met with some hardball, resulting in A Clean Deal being stretched out before making the top just past the half in :55.2.

"I figured there'd be a couple pointing right out of there," McNair said of the start of the race. "And I figured Jody would want to follow us as soon as the dust settled, but we went a long ways,

you know, she went a big trip there... so for a 2-year-old pacing filly to do that, it's fabulous."

As A Clean Deal led the field into the far turn, Roy moved Jen Tilly out of the 3-hole and applied pressure to the leader. Although the two fillies were side-by-side for a couple of strides as they passed three-quarters in 1:23, A Clean Deal rebuffed that challenge, and then, when McNair kicked out the plugs, his filly took off.

A Clean Deal held off a fast-closing Shes a Bulldog (Bob McClure, 12-1) by three-quarters-of-a-length in 1:50.2. Daya was third with Jen Tilly fourth.

When asked by Woodbine Mohawk Park's John Rallis if he was worried at any point as he turned for home, McNair said, "Yeah, you never know for sure, but I let Louis kind of get almost side by side with us. I figured he used his filly up a little bit early... first up again, so I wasn't a whole lot worried about her, but I was worried about the one behind me and Burke's filly [Shes A Bulldog]. They've been high on her since the wintertime, so she went a big trip tonight, too.

"It's everything [to win a Gold Super Final]. We work all year for nights like this, tonight and tomorrow. To get a win, just get one or just to get into the race, is a big deal. And to get a win is just a bonus."

The win improved the daughter of Cattlewash—Ideal Talker to 6-0-1 in seven career starts and upped her bankroll to \$454,464 for owners Yolanda Fellows of Rockwood, ON, Blair Corbeil of Leduc, AB, Windermere Stable LLC of New York, NY, and James Ross of Wing ham, ON.

Because of her four wins in five OSS Gold legs prior to tonight's victory, A Clean Deal had trouble getting starts with overnight competition and had to qualify instead.

"Well, she made money and then she had too much money and too many wins, you can't race against aged horses because they just beat you up, so, we'd rather win a qualifier, keep her sharp, keep her brave... and it worked," said A Clean Deal's trainer Rob Fellows. "There was two months where she had no racing and that's hard to do for a filly, because they don't like training as much as geldings and studs do."

A Clean Deal, who paid \$2.70 to her backers, was bred by Winbak Farm and was purchased for \$20,000 U.S. at the 2024 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale.

Bingo Night storms to Super Final victory for 2-year-old trotting fillies

Bingo Night overcame post position 10 and her driver Tyler Jones withstood a seven-minute inquiry as the pair powered to a 1¾ length victory in the \$300,000 Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Gold Super Final for 2-year-old trotting fillies on Friday (Oct. 10) at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

Meeting four-time Gold event winner Flowing Tribute, who was hammered down to 1-5 on Friday, Bingo Night had handed the favorite her only loss in an Aug. 4 Gold event, but the Dustin Jones-trained filly had been plagued by tough trips through most of the summer.

Bingo Night came into the Gold Final off solid efforts finishing second in the Peaceful Way and Champlain Stakes and a third in a Sept. 29 Gold event.

Trainer Jones made a couple of adjustments in Bingo Night's equipment before the Gold Final.

"About two weeks ago, I trained her in the bike at the farm and I didn't really like the way she trained – she was sort of watching me," Dustin said. "I didn't really want to make a change but after

last week's race I thought she was hanging a bit, so I put side rolls on her and took the cones out of her hood so she would be a bit more on the bit."

After brisk pre-race scoring, Bingo Night, sent off at 6-1, was sharp off the gate, tracking Barbara May and driver Trevor Henry from the two path before grabbing the lead into the backstretch. But after an opening quarter in :27, driver Bob McClure let Flowing Tribute roll to the lead so Bingo Night and Jones sat snugly in second. Flowing Tribute reached the half mile mark in :55.2 and three quarters in 1:24.3 but into the stretch, Bingo Night tipped out and reeled in the favorite.

The winner stopped the teletimer in 1:53.4, equaling her lifetime best and the fastest for the division in OSS history, both of which she set in her Gold win in August.

Bingo Night is by the hot, young stallion Green Manalishi S and is the first foal from the mare Cant Stop Tommi.

Longshots Cupid Hall, at 17-1, and Very Sassy, a 53-1 chance, finished second and third respectively while Flowing Tribute faded to ninth.

This was the first Gold Super Final victory for Tyler Jones who was full of praise for Bingo Night.

"She took me out of a pickle again, leaving from the 10-hole, that's unbelievable," Tyler said. "The trip worked out great. Trevor cleared Bob... I just got the edge like that and let Bob come around and it was just a picture-perfect drive like the last time I beat Flowing Tribute. That's what I needed to beat her tonight."

There was a judges' inquiry following the race into a possible urging violation when Tyler put the reins in one hand and swung the whip, but the result stood.

"Going by Bob he said, 'Nice win' and I thought I had it wrapped up so I gave it a little celly and that was a terrible idea," Tyler said.

Dustin Jones co-owns and co-bred Bingo Night with partners Jocelyn and Marie Hebert's Hebert Horses of Montreal, QC, and Matts Sjoblom of Finland.

"This filly is very good gaited," said the trainer. "She's not very big but she looks big on the track."

Dustin suggested that Bingo Night, who has a record of 10 5-3-2 and earnings of \$410,769, could be given a chance to compete in the Breeders Crown at Woodbine Mohawk Park. Eliminations are next weekend, with the 2-year-old finals on Oct. 24.

"She's eligible and seeing that she won and it's in our backyard, we might give her a go," he said.

Strobe Lite shines bright in OSS Gold Super Final for freshman trotting colts

Strobe Lite entered Friday's (Oct. 10) \$300,000 Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Gold Super Final for freshman trotting colts as the divisional points leader. He finished the eighth race at Woodbine Mohawk Park as divisional champion after storming down the center of the lane to win by 1¼ lengths in a time of 1:55.2. James MacDonald steered the winner for trainer and co-owner Benoit Baillargeon.

"It's amazing," MacDonald told Woodbine's John Rallis after the race. "This is the best program in the world, I think. This is the goal, right here, from the time we're qualifying in June. All those mornings are to end up here in the winner's circle on Super Final night."

Sent off as the favorite, MacDonald and Strobe Lite floated out from post 7 and settled in fifth early as Another Great Mass and Trevor Henry moved to the lead early with Crunchintheodds, Mike Me Up, and Touchedbyanangel in tow. On the way to a 28 second opening panel, Doug McNair moved Touchedbyanangel from fourth and brushed to the point, clicking off a :58 half.

"I liked where I got away and then when Trevor made front, I thought it could set up good for me, but Doug was able to re-move and get things his own way and my horse had to earn it tonight," MacDonald said.

Mike Me Up was the next to move on the backside, bringing Strobe Lite with him. Unfortunately, MacDonald's cover stalled midway through the second turn, forcing the driver to flip three-wide as the field reached three quarters in 1:26.2.

"Honestly, I was thinking that Doug drove a perfect race and then he kind of had me in a bad spot, but I was really confident in my horse," the driver said. "I thought I had the best horse in the race, as long as I didn't get him beat. I just tried to take what the race gave me."

On the front, Another Great Mass pulled from the pocket and forged to the lead. But Strobe Lite hit another gear and began his charge to the wire through heavy showers, kicking clear in deep stretch to secure his third seasonal win. Another Great Mass

held on for second followed by Crunchintheodds and Trouble With Names, who broke stride at the start before recovering for fourth.

Strobe Lite returned to the winner's circle after a disappointing break in the Mohawk Million followed by a head defeat in the final leg of the OSS Gold. He has hit the board in nine of 11 seasonal starts, banking \$479,921 with the night's victory. He returned \$3.20, \$2.40, \$2.10 in victory.

Sired by Alarm Detector out of the Father Patrick mare Shine Bright, Strobe Light sold for \$16,000 at the London Classic Yearling Sale. He is owned by Baillargeon in partnership with Claude Hamel, Nunzio Vena, and Glengate Farms, who bred the gelding. Baillargeon conditioned Alarm Detector during his career.

"I'm very happy that Alarm Detector finally got one that got the job done," the trainer said. "There were a few close calls with a few of them. He's out of a good mare, Father Patrick mare and we've always had lots of faith in that colt. He's big, he's strong. He can do it."

Glengate Farms' Jim Bullock was on hand for Strobe Lite's triumph, complimenting the efforts of the freshman's conditioner.

"He's a very nice colt and Ben has done a wonderful job with him, right from Day 1," Bullock said. "Ben was telling me last spring that this is a good colt. This is a really good colt and he's proved it again tonight. We've had our ups and downs a little bit. He ran on us in the Mohawk Million, but that's horse racing. If you don't want horses to run, don't buy trotters."

He also spoke of the strength of the provincial program.

"I think the OSS program is second to none and I think we've just sold a lot of Alarm Detectors next week at the London sale. Unfortunately, I don't have any," said Bullock.

Monalishi masterful in her OSS Gold Super Final for 3-year-old trotting fillies

Monalishi brushed off a break in her previous start with a platinum performance in the \$300,000 Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Gold Super Final for 3-year-old filly trotters on Saturday night (Oct. 11) at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

The bay daughter of Green Manalishi S out of the RC Royalty mare Pretty Phylly G came into her championship appointment off an early miscue that resulted in a disappointing distanced finish as the 3-5 choice in her OSS Gold Leg engagement on Sept. 30.

On Saturday night, she was simply flawless.

Exquisite Taste blasted off the wings from post 6 and swept to the front as Foxy A mee and Bright Green settled into second and third, respectively, into the first turn. James MacDonald, at the controls of Monalishi, crossed over from post 9 and eventually found a seat in fifth through an opening panel in :26.2.

It was Exquisite Taste still controlling the tempo after a half in :55.2, as MacDonald played a patient hand, content to keep his charge in fifth, while 1-2 tote board choice Stormont Beautiful, who had been eighth, stepped to the outer flow and looked to gain ground on the leaders heading into the turn for home.

Exquisite Taste, on top by 1¾ lengths through three quarters in 1:24, looked to fend off her pursuers as the pace picked up. Fifth in the early stretch, Monalishi began to pick off her rivals, but a revved-up Stormont Beautiful was roused by Bob McClure and loomed a major threat for all the spoils.

With 50 yards to go, Monalishi finally wore down a game Exquisite Taste and then fended off a final surge from Stormont Beautiful to best that rival by three-quarters-of-a-length. Exquisite Taste held for third, while Sprite Seelster took fourth.

The final time of 1:52.1 was just a fifth-of-a-second off the OSS record and produced a new speed badge for the brown filly.

“Last week in post parade, I didn’t love how she felt,” said MacDonald. “She tried to back herself off the gate, which wasn’t

like her and when I asked her then she made a miscue. Tonight, I was jogging her around and she felt like a million bucks. [Trainer] Blake [MacIntosh] and his team and [caretaker] Mike [Rivet] did an amazing job on her because she was a different horse tonight. She felt great and I was able to do whatever I wanted and, luckily, it worked out.

“Honestly, I loved where I was. I know they had raced hard up front, so I figured they would be getting a little tired and my horse usually kicks off cover like a freight train.”

Tim Klemencic, who co-owns the sophomore trotter with MacIntosh, was thrilled to see Monalishi stay flat after a flat performance last time out.

“We had big hopes for this year, but we’ve had horses for a long time and you take the good with the bad and when we’re racing good, everything is good,” said Klemencic. “It was a tough summer knowing that we had a good filly, but she was stuck in a stall for a while. Even a couple of times we thought we had her good, then she made uncharacteristic breaks, but right now we think she’s good. The time off hopefully helped her and we’ll see what will happen the next few weeks.”

A \$28,000 purchase out of the 2023 Standardbred Horse Sales Company’s yearling sale in Harrisburg, PA, Monalishi went 6-2-0 from 10 starts in her rookie campaign with purse earnings of \$562,811.

Her first two starts were in qualifying sessions at Woodbine Mohawk Park, the second a 2:00 mile punctuated by a 10-length, head-turning effort. Monalishi made a miscue in her first career start after hitting the gate and finished distanced but then reeled off three straight scores.

Her top triumph, by purse, was a half-length win in the \$390,000 Peaceful Way last August at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

With Saturday’s win, Monalishi now sports a 10-4-0 mark from 18 starts, along with over \$880,000 in career purse earnings.

Bred by Shmuel Farhi, of London, ON, Monalishi paid \$14.10 for the victory.

Crack Shot repeats in Super Finals, furthers Ontario Sires Stakes legacy

Last year, **Crack Shot** became the first horse in history to win both the Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Grassroots final and the Gold Super Final. This year, the son of Bettors Delight out of Beautyonthebeach joined a select group of Ontario stars that have won Super Finals in back-to-back years.

Crack Shot and driver Doug McNair won the \$300,000 Super Final for 3-year-old pacing colts on Saturday (Oct. 11) at Woodbine Mohawk Park in dominating fashion, exploding away in the stretch to post a 5½-length win in a career best 1:49.2.

Starting from post 5 in the field of 10, Crack Shot sat third in the early going as 99-1 shot Control Rocks (Tyler Borth) led the field

through a :25.4 opening quarter and a :54.2 half. McNair had Crack Shot out and rolling before the 1:22 three-quarter station and then pulled away in the stretch to defeat Fifth And Five (Jody Jamieson). Boxer Seelster (Trevor Henry) was third, followed by Control Rocks and Allstar Maniac (James MacDonald).

“I didn’t know how the race was going to shape up,” McNair told Woodbine broadcaster John Rallis. “There was a couple on the outside that I thought might take a shot getting out of there, but we were speeding pretty good up front. I thought I had the best horse and, you know, he’s been getting better and better towards the end of the year, so I just didn’t want to get him in any trouble.”

Sent off as the 1-2 favorite, Crack Shot paid \$3.10 for the win.

It was the third Gold triumph of the year for the Gregg McNair trainee, who also finished a close second in two other Gold outings in 2025. Gregg, who collected his sixth Johnston Cup victory as the top trainer in the OSS program said it’s been a challenge to keep Crack Shot fit this year.

“He had some problems there on his left side and we were working on the wrong thing to start with, then we just learned what it was towards the end of the year,” Gregg said. “He had a knee bothering him a bit and once we got doing the maintenance work on that, it sure helped him a lot.”

Crack Shot improved to 6-4-1 in 14 starts on the year and 11-5-1 in 22 lifetime outings. The colt has seasonal earnings of \$495,335 and a lifetime bankroll of \$734,160.

Gregg owns Crack Shot with London Knights coach and former NHLer Dale Hunter, Frank Brundle, and George Kerr.

Brundle said he was happy Crack Shot won the Grassroots and Super Final last year and repeated in the latter this year.

“We did it again,” Brundle said. “I was very happy with how he progressed and how well he’s doing.”

Hunter, who has coached the Knights to back-to-back Memorial Cup championships, said he **fulfilled his father, Dick Hunter’s dying wish to own a top horse.** Crack Shot was purchased for \$205,000 at the 2023 Lexington Selected Yearling Sale.

P L Spencer cruises to OSS Gold Super Final score in sophomore trotting colts' division

Heavy favorite **P L Spencer** and driver Bob McClure turned in a dominating effort Saturday evening (Oct. 11) at Woodbine Mohawk Park, comfortably winning the \$300,000 Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Gold Super Final for sophomore trotting colts.

Leading gate-to-wire the sophomore trotter picked up his 10th seasonal win with a 1:52.4 performance.

"There were a lot of nice colts in there," McClure told Woodbine broadcaster John Rallis. "We got lucky and got there fairly easy and he's pretty chill once he gets to the front and there was no pressure put on us... you know, he's a tough colt to out-sprint when he gets fractions."

Drawing post 8 in the night's eighth race, McClure and P L Spencer fired off the gate along with Galen Erso and Doug McNair to their inside. The 3-5 favorite reached the pylons shortly before the quarter station (:27.2) and proceeded to set the tempo with fractions of :57.2 and 1:26. LMC Wagon Wheel, steered by Tyler Borth, pulled from fifth on the backside and advanced to challenge pocket sitter Galen Erso. The result, however, was never in doubt for the Stephen Bossence trainee. P L Spencer sprinted away from the field on the strength of a :26.4 final panel and handily trotted to the wire 2½ lengths in front. Galen Erso held on for second while Day out-finished LMC Wagon Wheel for third.

"This colt, coming in, he was just so sharp," McClure said. "I said to Steve, 'I've never seen a transition in colt maturity, like mental maturity, in a season like this guy was.' After his first

start, he wasn't that nice to drive – he was hot and he towed you around and put you in some spots where you didn't want to be, but as the year progressed, he's just been an absolute pro and one that I'm actually really looking forward to racing as an open horse."

The Resolve gelding out of Majestic Son mare P L Indyanaca is owned by the partnership of Bossence, Richard Thompson, Derek Reid, and E C S Racing LLC. Bred by Prince Lee Acres, the trotter sold for \$40,000 at the 2023 London Classic Yearling Sale. A winner in one of four starts as a freshman, P L Spencer has returned at 3 to produce a sensational sophomore campaign. Over 16 attempts the gelding finished first or second on 14 occasions. Saturday's victory was the fourth straight and pushed his seasonal earnings to \$528,081.

"Last year, we had to quit with him," Bossence said. "He had a quarter crack and it was bothering him so I finally just pulled the plug and we sent him to Kentucky. He came back and he was always kind of racey, like on his toes a bit, but [McClure] made a horse out of him. He said, 'I'm going to make a horse out of you.' And he did. Without him, we probably wouldn't be standing here. He really did a good, good job. He does that... if you watch him close with these young horses, he's like watching Steve Condren from back in my day."

Bossence revealed after the Gold Final win that P L Spencer had been sold, only to have the deal nixed this week. Now the connections will bring him back to campaign as a 4-year-old in 2026.

"We'll bring him back as an aged horse," he said. "Not to jinx him, but [he] was sold last week after the race, but they didn't like the way his x-rays looked, so they passed on him and I guess he's ours for next year now."

Chantilly defends Super Final crown in 3-year-old pacing fillies' division

While her 2025 has not lived up to the hype created from a blemish-free Canadian Horse of the Year-winning freshman season a year ago, **Chantilly** proved once again that there's no place like home, taking the \$300,000 Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS) Gold Super Final for 3-year-old pacing fillies at Woodbine Mohawk Park Saturday night (Oct. 11). In the process, she upped her lifetime stats at the seven-eighths-mile oval to 15 wins in just 16 tries.

The race played out predictably, as driver James MacDonald was in no hurry with Chantilly, who had drawn the rail in the eight-horse field. Simply The Best (driven by Jean Rene Plante, post 5) and Perfectly Chic (Bob McClure, post 7) were away from the gate alertly, and that duo raced 1-2 around the first turn while Chantilly was in the 3-hole before Simply The Best hit the quarter in :26.1.

MacDonald gave Chantilly the go-ahead after the field straightened up, and Chantilly responded with a quick brush to command just after the three-eighths. The Nick Gallucci trainee reached the half in :55.1 after a leisurely second fraction of :29.

The action heading to the far turn was limited to Wicked N Single (Louis-Philippe Roy, post 3) moving first-over toward the front of the pack, but she never got all that close to the tandem of Chantilly and Simply The Best, who were 1-2 at three-quarters in 1:23.

It was then coronation time for the Queen of the Ontario Sires Stakes (OSS), who would reign supreme for a second straight year on the circuit.

The winner of 10 of 11 lifetime starts in the OSS program opened up some real estate in mid-stretch before polishing off another impressive win with a final quarter of :27. The final time of 1:50 on a chilly evening was just one-fifth-of-a-second off her lifetime best.

It was one-length back to second-place finisher Simply The Best with Perfectly Chic third.

"Oh, it's a dream come true when you get to sit behind horses like her," MacDonald said. "She's just a Cadillac. She's given me

so many thrills the last couple of years and it's just a real honor to get to do it with [owner] George [Millar] and Nick; we've been doing this a while together and it's been a good partnership and I can't wait to see what the future holds.

"She's always good. Her off nights, she's still good. She's just a pro and she just knows how to win. She's done a lot of it in her career and it's just great to see her win the Super Final. Not too many horses go back-to-back, so that's another feather in her cap."

Chantilly, as the 1-9 favorite, paid \$2.10 to win.

"It's been a frustrating year, but she really pieced it together the last couple of weeks," Gallucci said of his prized pupil, who has dealt with some illness issues. "I'm really happy with the last couple of weeks that she's had. Last week [in an eight-length romp in 1:50.2], she was deadly and I just can't thank the horse enough for the ride that she's taken us on.

"[She's] an absolute pleasure to have and a pleasure to train."

When Mohawk's John Rallis asked about the possibility of Chantilly entering the Breeders Crown, Gallucci was quick to respond.

"Absolutely," he said. "We'll see how she comes out of the race, but that's definitely the plan; to enter Tuesday morning for the Breeders Crown elimination Saturday."

Millar Farms owns and bred Chantilly, a brown daughter of Big Jim—Shiraz Seelster. Millar was predictably pleased in the winner's circle.

"She's a great filly and, hopefully, we'll get another couple of weeks out of her and then she can have a nice winter off," he said.

Millar made it clear where he stands on the province's program.

"I think I've said this quite a few times," he said. "To me, this is the best program around. We saw what Beau Jangles can do and he hasn't left the province. We breed some good horses and you don't have to go that far to make money, so I think it's the best program dollar-for-dollar around. We'll always breed up here."

Chantilly has now amassed 15 wins from 18 lifetime starts, good for earnings of \$1,293,462.



Game Changers: Big Jim

Once a week, throughout the Mohawk racing season, Woodbine will profile a horse who has had a life-changing impact on one of their closest connections.

This week, decorated driver Phil Hudon, who sports more than 4,800 wins and \$63 million in prizes on his sterling resume, and retired champion pacer Big Jim.

The Burlington, ON-based reinsman piloted the powerful bay to all 10 career victories, each a testament to their formidable partnership.

What were your first impressions of Big Jim?

“The first time I drove him was in a series called the Dream Maker at Mohawk. He finished second but felt like a green horse with lots of power. Once he put it together, he’d be a nice horse.

“It felt like he felt a bit lost that first start, but I thought he had lots of potential. He ended up winning the next Dream Maker race – I got a good trip. He had lots of power under the hood.”

What race of his was meaningful to you and why?

“Probably the [2010] Breeders Crown. Everything just worked out perfectly for that race, but he’s had lots of good races, sometimes I just drove badly, but he was an excellent horse.

“The second in the [2011] Meadowlands Pace was pretty cool, too. Betterthancheddar had his worst race ever, and I was following him, and it took me out of the race a bit, but that was a big race.

“That’s when I realized, if you get the opportunity to drive a good horse, they definitely get you where you got to be. Everybody’s looking to follow them, or they respect them once they’re legit.”

Can you liken him to a particular athlete? If so, who and why?

“His personality was that he just wanted to do it. He was just so powerful, like a Bo Jackson. Just overpowering at 2. Then, at 3, they kind of caught up to him, but if I would have not used him early and stuff, he might have been a little bit [better].

“He had some issues, and he had a big heart. If I had a couple bad drives, he’d finish up a bit tired, but he was pinchy too.

“The horses that want to do it, they’re going to get a little lame because they try. Big Jim did it easy, he wanted to do his work, and he always rested during the day to conserve his energy. He was smart.”

Three words to describe him?

“Brilliant. Powerful. Athletic.”

How has he changed your life?

“He definitely made me realize that you can drive with anybody with the right horse. If you have the horsepower, you can drive with the best of the best. That’s when I realized, if you get a Big Jim once or twice a year, you’re doing pretty good.

“You just realize that a good horse can make you look good, and a bad horse can make you look bad. That’s when I learned that.

“There are great drivers out there, don’t get me wrong, but if you have something to work with, you can look a lot better, that’s for sure. If you have one that wants to do it and has some class, you’re going to do well.”

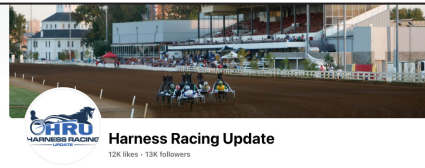

Thebaddog shared the spotlight in a tie for sale topper with a \$72,000 purchase price for the son of Bulldog Hanover—Peaceful Deo, as Victor Puddy snagged the colt from the Faith Gavin consignment of Sea Cow Pond, PEI.

The top priced trotter in the history of the Atlantic Classic Sale went through the ring as **Hip #134 Earl Speed** was purchased for \$59,000. Donald MacRae signed the slip on the son of Muscle Through It out of \$417,000 winner Scottish Cross from consigner Danielle Henri of Quebec.

The day started off with a new record opener as **Hip #1 Woodmere Sinner** was the highest priced opener in the history of the Atlantic Classic Sale selling for \$25,000. The son of Malicious—Sinspirational was purchased by Wayne McGean and Dave Mercer from the Woodmere Farms consignment from Marshfield, PEI.

Sheeowtime Speed was another top seller for consignor Henri with a \$46,000 price tag for the daughter of Somewhere Fancy—Betty Hill as Windemere Farms was the purchaser.

Debbie Francis and Debra Downing purchased **Brouhaha Speed** for \$46,000 during the sale with the son of Somewhere Fancy—Eyre Hostess N consigned by Henri.

Another top seller from the Woodmere Farms consignment was **Woodmere Eras** selling to Mike Pollard for \$41,000. The Somewhere Fancy gelding is out of the Rock N Roll Heaven mare Northern Fiesta.

Dancin Lady Lou held the mantle for Ontario bred fillies with the daughter of Dancin Lou—Abes Lady going to Josh MacDonald for \$39,000 from the Tulach Ard Farm consignment of Nova Scotia.

“The day showcased the demand for Atlantic-bred horses on the eve of a fantastic week of Atlantic Breeder’s Crown finals,” said sale chair Nicholas Oakes. “Records were the theme of the day in Crapaud as buyers showed up in force to select their next chance at a champion as the future shines bright for the East Coast breeding business.”

The day had 147 yearlings pass through the ring for an average of \$13,119.

DSBF finals, Pink Pace headline Oct. 13-15 Harrington racing week

Delaware Standardbred Breeders Fund (DSBF) 2-year-old \$110,000 finals and a “Pink Pace” featuring all female drivers will headline the Oct. 13-15 week of racing at Harrington Raceway as the 2025 meet winds down.

With six nights remaining in Harrington’s 79th season of live harness racing, Delaware-sired 2-year-olds will start the week on Oct. 13 as the final for pacing colts and geldings is slated sixth on the 15-race program. Burke Racing, Phillip Collura, and Weaver Brusceci’s Watch Em Win (9-5, Tim Tetrick) won his eliminations comfortably and figures to be an overwhelming favorite in pursuit of his sixth victory in nine lifetime starts.

The filly pacing final is the co-feature Tuesday (Oct. 14). Odds On Racing’s Odds On Put Option (8-5, Tim Tetrick) and Let It Ride Stable and Carl Howard’s Just Applause (2-1, Montrell Teague) who both won their eliminations in convincing fashion will square off in the fifth race on the program.

In addition, the “Pink Pace” will be contested as the eighth race as all female drivers will compete in a \$9,000 overnight race where they will donate their drivers’ percentage to a local breast cancer awareness charity. The female drivers are competing at multiple tracks over the course of several days, including Shenandoah Downs (Virginia), Northfield Park (Ohio) and The Meadows (Pennsylvania), raising money for various local non-profits. The drivers are Stacey McLenaghan, Leslie Joyce, Alex Goldin, Lauren Harmon, Stacy Chiodo, Doreen Dailey, Veronica Merton, and Sierra Seidner.

Trotters will complete the DSBF final action on Wednesday (Oct. 15), with the finals occurring fifth and seventh on the 15-race program. Les Givens-trained Thiskissformaryell (Jim Morand, morning line TBA) heads the colt and gelding division after a pair of elimination wins for Nanticoke Racing, Jim Magno, and Joseph Fonte. Live racing will continue on a Monday through Wednesday schedule (post time 4:30 p.m.) through Oct. 22.

Faraldo: Gural just has to keep it going

Jeff Gural has no filter and cannot get over his obsession with me for standing in the way of his taking advantage of horsemen in New York. Once again, Mr. Gural, in the [HRU edition 10-10-25](#) (see pg. 18), rants as the poor person people don't do enough for.

First, he starts with lamenting that he cannot race his horses in overnight events at the two New York tracks he owns. The fact is that effective Sept. 5, 1974 – that's right, 1974 – NYS Rule 4116.3 was enacted because a track operator at a NYS track – specifically, Saratoga – was racing his own horses in overnights and was found to be using his race office to write favorable conditions or to open classes to accommodate the boss's horses. That prompted the rule, 52 years ago that still reads as follows;

Section 4116.3 Officials may not drive or enter horses.

a. No officer, director, or executive, or spouse thereof, of a track shall drive a horse at such track, except that limited pari-mutuel meetings or in non-betting races; nor may a horse be entered in which he has any beneficial interest in any overnight event that said track.

The rule was enacted to prevent track owners or executives from taking advantage of horsemen by the power that the track owner has to structure overnight races in such a way as to gain an advantage over the very horsemen competing at his track.

Mr. Gural purchased Vernon apparently unaware of this rule that effected the likes of Tim Rooney the owner of Yonkers and others. I brought this rule to Gural's attention. The SOA of New York, other New York horsemen's organizations and at least one, if not more, OTBs, fought against the repeal of the rule and its repeal was defeated.

Second, and out of the blue, Mr. Gural asserts that the SOA of NY refused to pay for a portion of the cost of relighting

Vernon Downs. Such a request was never made to SOA of NY, and if it were no horsemen's money would ever be diverted from Yonkers into Mr. Gural's pocket in order for him to comply with the NYS Gaming Commission's order to improve the track lighting conditions at Vernon.

I counseled Mr. Gural against the purchase at Vernon, since there were a number of other suitors who wanted to buy the racetrack. Gural would have none of it and wanted to have a place for his own horses to train and make money on the VLT option. The horsemen did ask something and it was not, 'Please buy Vernon,' it was a plea to the bankruptcy judge, in a "contempt proceeding," to order Gural to turn over purse money due those Vernon horsemen. Monies that he had not turned over.

Forgetting his obsession with me, no one in harness racing should disregard his quote widely circulated, "the tracks – including me, if I'm just wearing my 'track hat' – all want harness racing to disappear as quickly as possible" and "so they are going to do whatever to make that happen."

Nuff said. Count me out as your helping hand.

More thoughts on Gural

Let's get this out of the way first. I love The Meadowlands and hope it doesn't join Freehold, Garden State, etc. The track still has the best racing and best handle by a long shot. However, it was tough to read the HRU "Letter to the Industry" from Big M head honcho, Jeff Gural. For over a decade now, Mr. Gural has harped on the same issues over and over again that it's actually become tiring. I'm all for cleaning the sport up and he's absolutely right to try and excluded cheaters.

However, complaining about Vernon Downs losing money was absurd because it was obvious that track couldn't turn a profit. It had failed under several different owners and as Mr. Gural mentioned was five minutes away from a full-fledged Indian

casino. That's not the industry's fault. If Mr. Gural saved Vernon to help the horsemen upstate and preserve a large oval for the breeding industry that was his choice. Given the caliber of horses and remote location, I'm not sure what he could've expected from that investment. As for help from Joe Faraldo, Mr. Gural should have known that wouldn't happen as the two hate each other.

As for The Big M, the issues about the lack of support, cheaters, the grandstand cost, losing money has been well chronicled. I appreciate all the work Mr. Gural did in saving the track years ago. However, rehashing the same complaints over and over is fruitless.

Although I agree whole heartily that the Hambletonian should run at The Big M in 2027, I can see the Society's point, unfortunately, in relocating. Let's just say the obvious: Mr. Gural has pegged the future of the track solely on a November 2027 casino referendum. Mr. Gural has stated that he can't commit past 2027. Thus, he should announce the obvious: The Big M will join Freehold and Garden State should the referendum fail. Otherwise, Mr. Gural would've exercised his exclusive right to keep the most important race in the industry.

Personally, I will be floored if the referendum succeeds. The amount of money that will be thrown at stopping the casino along with who-knows-what local opposition (see all the failed New York City casino bids) seems insurmountable.

Finally, a Google search pegs Mr. Gural's net worth at a mere \$320 to \$340 million. At 83 years old, not to sound callous, but losing a few million a year doesn't sound too horrible at this point in his life, especially if you enjoy watching your horses grow, run and win. He may not be rewarded financially, but his legacy for helping keep the sport going is a positive one that should give him pause to keep harping on the financial issues.

May we all enjoy the final years of The Big M if the worst happens.
