### Gene Riegler: A Tribute

It's been almost 30 years since I visited Gene Riegler at his winter base in Greenville, Ohio. He trained his stock over the Darke Co. Fairgrounds oval and I arrived early on a bitterly cold morning.

He pointed to a thermometer which registered 14 degrees below zero.

"I don't take 'em out when it's below zero," he told me. That gave him the morning to answer my questions about how he developed so many great horses in frigid climate. Late in the morning, we had lunch at the Fairlawn Restaurant across from the fairgrounds. Gene recommended the cornbread and beans; we both ate heartily.

After lunch Gene noticed that the mercury was now at zero, so he walked into his stable and told the grooms, "Throw the harness on 'em and get 'em ready to go."

The grooms complained loud enough to be heard all the way to the Indiana state line, but the card games broke up and they went to work. Soon the Riegler stock was rolling around the half-mile track. The horses included the legendary Three Diamonds, the \$350,000 yearling filly Obedient, and many others with mouth-watering pedigrees.

I seize upon this incident as one reason why Gene Riegler accomplished so much in his career and earned his way into the Hall of Fame. Many ordinary trainers would've been content to stay warm and take the day off, but Gene Riegler was no ordinary trainer.

Riegler died Monday at age 83 after being in declining health in recent years. When we lost Gene Riegler, we lost a legend, a trainer whose expertise was universally respected. He accomplished greatness with hard work and horsemanship, not veterinary voodoo.

He will always be associated with a trio of pacers foaled in consecutive years: Artsplace (1988), Western Hanover (1989), and Life Sign (1990). The first two became sires of enduring influence while the third provided Gene with his long-awaited Jug winner.

Gene would readily tell you, however, how important a pacer named Don Parker was in his career. That colt was a

standout juvenile with Riegler training and driving in 1963. Gene owned him and sold him for a long price; 20 years later in Greenville, Gene told me, "Don Parker bought this house for us."

A decade later he brought out another superstar colt with a plebian pedigree in Jay Time, an Ohio champ that dead-heated with Strike Out in the '72 Adios. Those two hooked up again in the Jug, but Jay Time was not at his best and Riegler raced him only at the insistence of ailing owner Carl Baas. Strike Out won the sprint to the first turn and Jay Time got cooked by the fractions and was never the same again.

That year Gene developed Arnie Almahurst, a clone of his sire Speedy Scot. He could trot fast, but wasn't always reliable. Gene put Joe O'Brien behind Arnie in the '73 Kentucky Futurity; the brawny bay won in a three heat battle after galloping the entire mile in the second.

Gene earned the trust of Chicago commodities trader George Segal and the "Segal/Riegler" team achieved extraordinary success with stakes winners too numerous to list in their entirety. Among them were standout fillies such as Three Diamonds and Leah Almahurst and colts such as Troublemaker. (Cont. P. 2)

In 1990 Gene brought out Artsplace who capped his freshman season with a 1:51.1f score in the Breeders Crown at Pompano, a record that stood for many years. Artsplace was sick and missed the '91 Jug, the race Gene most wanted to win. The pacer won \$1.9 million in this first two seasons at the races and became Horse of the Year at age 4 when Bob McIntosh took over the training. When Artsplace was a sophomore, Gene had a talented 2-year-old in Western Hanover. In 1992, Western won the first two legs of the Triple Crown and loomed as the likely winner in the coveted Jug. But he was nosed out by the upstart Fake Left.

In 1993, Gene finally got his Jug victory with Life Sign's lionhearted victory for driver John Campbell. It's still considered one of the most remarkable races of the modern era and Gene was one happy horseman that night. Thousands more were happy for him.

Gene's health declined rapidly in recent years and his passing is not a surprise.

Gene Riegler is dead: Peace to the spirit of a great horseman. But as long as pacers race, Gene Riegler's influence and legacy will live on.

**Buck I St Pat Appeal Denied; Taylor Fine \$1,500**

The Ontario Racing Commission denied an appeal yesterday from the ownership group of **Buck I St Pat** (Jailhouse Jesse), which was seeking to gain entry into the Breeders Crown race for older female trotters.

According to Howard Taylor, a lawyer and a co-owner of Buck I St Pat, the appeal hearing turned contentious and ended with Taylor being fined \$1,500 for filing a "frivolous appeal."

"This thing was a joke and I am very, very disappointed," Taylor said.

Harness Racing Update requested comment from the Ontario Racing Commission yesterday, but the commission failed to follow up on the request.

Buck I St Pat, a two-time defending champion in this Breeders Crown event, has had problems breaking stride this year. Taylor said he was told her entry into the Breeders Crown was denied because she had broke stride on successive occasions, in the Oct. 2 Allerage at the Red Mile and in a subsequent qualifier. **(Cont.)**

But he said trainer Ron Burke was told by the Ontario Racing Commission that as long as the mare had a race line without a break within the last 45 days she would be allowed into the race. Taylor added that had Burke been given the proper information the connections would have had Buck I St Pat qualify last week at Freehold in an attempt to make her eligible for the race.

Taylor was particularly upset with Ontario Racing Commission Chair Rod Seiling, saying he was rude and difficult.

"This guy was about as rude as they come," he said. "He could not have been ruder. He was about as

ignorant as they get."

He said he will vigorously fight the fine, saying "I don't care if I have to spend \$10,000 to fight a \$1,500 fine."

"How do you consider this frivolous?" he added. "Not only did I have a legitimate argument but there is a rule that says this is within the discretionary powers of the commission; they have the ability to use broad discretion. I told them this is two-time defending champion. This isn't an overnight race or a minor race. This is the Breeder Crown, the year-end championship race and what probably would have been the last race of her career. If you're ever going to use discretion, here is the case you should use it. It was frivolous but only because they made it that way. They gave no consideration to the issues."

Taylor said the owners are undecided concerning whether or not Buck I St Pat will race again, adding that she may be retired or may race in the American Nationals.

## Illinois Governor Shoots Down Racetrack Slots.

### What Now?

Stunned Illinois standardbred and thoroughbred horsemen, breeders and track operators are regrouping in the wake of Gov. Pat Quinn's demand that slot machines at the racetracks be purged from the gaming expansion bill that passed the House of Representatives and Senate in late May.

After the bill was passed Senate President John Cullerton (D-Chicago) filed a motion to reconsider, a parliamentary maneuver putting the legislation on hold, giving proponents more time to make their case to the skeptical governor who called the bill "top heavy."

A trailer bill addressing the concerns of the governor was expected to be introduced when the General Assembly reconvenes for its fall veto session Oct. 25-27 and Nov. 8-10 in Springfield.

But on Monday, the governor held a news conference and said he had no objection to the five new riverboat casinos (bringing the total in the state to 15) that the bill called for but was steadfastly against slots at the tracks and the State Fairgrounds in Springfield and at O'Hare and Midway Airports.

"I would certainly veto this bill if it ever arrives (intact)," Quinn insisted. "It's better to go back and start over. We're talking about casinos at racetracks. Don't kid yourself. This is an over saturation of casino gambling."

He said that proximity of racetracks to other casinos also was an important consideration in his opposition.

But the governor's fellow Democrats who sponsored the bill in the House and Senate, Rep. Lou Lang (D-Skokie) and Senator Terry Link (D-Lake Bluff), were equally adamant in arguing that slots at the tracks are an essential component of the bill.

"We're not going to do something that's dead on arrival in the House, so if we're going to do something it has to have slots at the tracks," Lang told the Chicago Tribune.

Link agreed. "I think you have to do something for the racetrack industry to have a bill pass," he told the Chicago Sun-Times. "Maybe we can come to compromise (with the governor) on things. Maybe we're a half-mile apart but not a mile apart."

Several legislators from downstate Illinois, who backed the bill because of its agricultural benefits, and those from the communities in which the tracks are located said they will withdraw their support if the slots at the tracks aren't part of the package that ultimately is sent to the governor.

Former Republican Gov. Jim Edgar, a standardbred and thoroughbred owner before and after leaving office, criticized Gov. Quinn, telling the Chicago Tribune: "You've got an industry that's hanging on by a thread and he turned his back to it."

Horsemen and the hierarchy at the tracks are hoping that either the governor can be persuaded to change his mind or enough votes can be mustered to avoid the veto he is threatening.

In an interview with the Chicago public radio station WBEZ, Illinois Harness Horsemen's Association president Dave McCaffrey used a baseball analogy to put the governor's announcement in perspective: "It's the first pitch of the seventh game and the game will play out during the next month."

"If history has taught us anything in Springfield it's that it's not over till it's over," agreed IHHA executive director Anthony Somone. "So much hinges on Senate President Cullerton's trailer bill. We will look to his guidance to see how we progress."

"This bill is the only savior for horse racing in Illinois; we are at a competitive disadvantage because other states that have slots at their racetracks have the advantage of being able to offer higher purses. This is a bill that fixes the ills of horse racing past and present and ensures our longevity. The bill takes care of the breeding industry and the county fairs, which are the lifeblood of our sport."

Like McCaffrey and Somone, Phil Langley, the U.S. Trotting Association president who is the director of racing and a member of the board of directors at both Balmoral Park and Maywood Park, is taking a wait-and-see position.

"We're in the formative stages of strategy," Langley said. "Give the process (in Springfield) a chance to work and see what happens. We'll see what the trailer bill comes up with and what the governor says after that. We have absolutely no problem with oversight (a major concern for Quinn) on either the casinos or the racing part of it."

Meanwhile, horsemen and the tracks have been able to buy some time, thanks to the release of riverboat casino impact fee escrow money in early August. The money had accumulated since 2005 when the legislature levied a temporary 3% surcharge on the adjusted gross revenue of each of the state's four most profitable casinos and in 2009 the surcharge was extended until mid-July, 2011. The four casinos challenged the legality of both bills and the money stayed in escrow until they exhausted their appeals.

This infusion has enabled Balmoral, which races three nights per week, and Maywood, which races two, to increase nightly purses (from \$40,000) to \$60,000 through 2013.

"That money has enabled us to stay on life support for another two years," Somone said. "Without that money coming in we probably would have cut our dates by 50% next year. The impact fee money allows us to keep the doors open. It does not allow us to prosper."

## Forest City Sale Up 5.2 Percent

Following an industry-wide trend, the recently concluded Forest City Sale in Ontario ended with a 5.2 percent increase over 2010 numbers.

A total of 263 yearlings went through the ring this year, selling for an average price of \$18,311. That's up \$912 from 2010 when 267 horses sold for an average price of \$17,399.

"The horses sold very well and once again and, with the top end, if they want them they will pay for them," said Forest City General Manager Randy Manges. "It was much the same way in Lexington. In any sale, there will always be disappointments, but this sale went very well overall. I was pleased with the results and I think most of the consignors were as well. Most everybody had a decent sale."

At the 2011 sale, pacing colts led the way, with the 92 that sold going for an average of \$20,703.

Among sires represented by 10 offspring or more, the Camlucks sold best. Sixteen were sold, averaging \$39,938. Mach Three was next. Sixteen of his sons or daughters were sold, averaging \$32,438.

The sale topper was Hip 71, a Camluck colt named Nitro Seelster. He was consigned by Seelster Farms and sold for \$150,000 to Fiddlers Creek Stable of West Bloomfield, Michigan.

The Forest City sale followed the same pattern set earlier in the month at Lexington, where the sale was up 8.7 overall and horses with good conformation and solid pedigrees sold well.

"I knew we had some good horses in this sale because I see a large percentage of the horses that we have going through," Manges. "I thought both books (in Lexington and at Forest City) were stronger this year, so, yes, I was optimistic that everything would hold up and we would have good sales."

## Zeron On The Mend; Hopes To Be Back On Track In Early November

TORONTO, October 20 - After being involved in a race accident on October 8 at Woodbine Racetrack that saw him briefly hospitalized, trainer/driver Rick Zeron is well on the road to recovery.

The veteran horseman was ejected from the bike following a spill at the Rexdale oval. Zeron, guiding Blended Whiskey on the outside past the half, couldn't sidestep Whippet Good and driver Jason Brewer who fell to the track, causing a chain reaction which involved the veteran reinsman, along with his son, Scott, and Mike Saftic.

All horses and drivers walked off the track under their own power, with the exception of Rick. Now, 12 days after the spill, Zeron's healing process is coming along smoothly.

"My shoulder is healing faster than expected," Zeron explained. "Su Lalsingh, who is a homeopathic doctor, and Karen McGregor, who is my sports therapist, each have been working with me on a regular basis and I owe them much of the credit for my shoulder healing so quickly. They are both doing a terrific job in getting me back to the track."

Zeron also noted fellow driver Mark MacDonald as being instrumental in helping him draw closer to returning to his driving duties sooner than originally anticipated.

"Mark gave me a rotator cup brace that has really helped," he said. "It's a long brace that starts at my elbow and goes around my shoulder and helps keep it in place. It's been a big help."

Zeron, who has entered three horses for this year's Breeders Crown eliminations this Saturday at Woodbine, was hoping to be in the bike, but instead will call on his son, Scott, to do the driving duties.

"I'm not 20-years-old anymore," Zeron said. "Anytime you're in an accident, you can't come back 50 per cent and expect to be fine. I want to make sure that when I come back, I'll be ready to go."

Zeron will send out Lady Rainbow, Miss Dangles and Windsong Hercules for this year's Breeders Crown.

"All three horses are ready to go," he added. "Scott has sat behind all three horses and I know he will get along with each of them. He qualified Lady Rainbow and Windsong Hercules the other day and both qualified well."

After a pair of breaks in the Kentucky Filly Futurity in Lexington, Ky., Lady Rainbow qualified Monday morning as the younger Zeron scored the qualifying victory in a comfortable 2:00.3.

The daughter of Muscles Yankee has banked \$520,157 this season and \$733,146 lifetime for Zeron Stables, The Camel Club Stable, Rojan Stables and Estate of Herbert Chambers.

"We have a check ligament issue to deal with, but we are doctoring that up for the weekend," noted Zeron. "I'm confident that Scott will get her positioned well and give her a good trip."

Zeron also confirmed that he plans to return Lady Rainbow to the races next season as a four-year-old.

Although he's been away from the track for the past few weeks, the veteran horseman has yet to see the race footage of his accident.

"It's something I'm not interested in watching right now," he offered. "All I remember was being thrown into the air and waking up in the hospital. The rest is a blur."

Zeron is pointing to early November as the date of his return to the sulky.

## Rosecroft Is Back

Closed for live racing since May, 2008, Maryland's Rosecroft Raceway will spring back into action tonight with a 10-race card that will begin at 6:45 pm.

With the potential of slots coming to the track, Rosecroft was purchased out of bankruptcy for \$11 million earlier this year by Penn National Gaming Inc., which spent an additional \$1.5 million to get the facility up and running.

"We're really excited," said Sharon Roberts, the executive director of the Cloverleaf Standardbred Owners' Association. "Fans can't wait to see live racing again at Rosecroft. When I walk through the clubhouse, people just cannot wait. It's nice to see that. Penn National has been great. We couldn't ask for better partners in racing than Penn National."
