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# Standardbred Horse Sales Company wraps yearling sessions with level returns

## 2025 SHSC YEARLING SALE AT HARRISBURG

STANDARD BRED HORSE SALE COMPANY



The closing session for the yearling portion of the Standardbred Horse Sales Company's auction in Harrisburg, PA on Wednesday (Nov. 5) followed consistent returns seen on Tuesday to leave the metrics for the 2025 sale in range of previous years' figures.

In 2025, the Black Book Sale sent 864 yearlings to the ring that grossed \$36,029,000 for an average of \$41,700. These numbers come short of 2024's sale, which grossed \$37,091,000 (a 2.9 per cent decrease year-over-year) for an average of \$42,830 (down

2.6 per cent) from 866 yearlings sold. However, the 2025 yearling sale rung slightly higher than 2023's figures with a near 0.4 per cent increase in gross, though with a 5.8 decrease in average with 54 fewer horses selling in 2023. The decreases also come on the tail of the record-breaking 2022 sale, which grossed \$44,356,000 from 904 yearlings sold, as well as the 2021 sale that set a record for average with a price of \$54,653.

Wednesday's session alone grossed \$5,435,000 from 323 yearlings for an average of \$16,827, on par with 2024's closing session that grossed \$5,560,000 from 337 yearlings for an average of \$16,499.

"The last two days, especially today, really surprised me," said Dale Welk, president/director of operations for the Standardbred Horse Sales Company. "I'm glad it surprised me. I was really a little worried about it, but we had a great day today. It's been a rollercoaster all week this week and I hope tomorrow that we're on top of the rollercoaster and we stay there."

"Overall, I think I'm very satisfied of where we came out. After Monday we were kind of wondering what was going to happen over the next two days, but these two days propped us right back. Monday we were down 14 per cent and we came right back. Like I said, I can't thank everyone enough for their patience and sticking with us."

## FASHION FARMS BIDS FAREWELL

Jules Siegel turned 98 years old on Wednesday. The Hall of Fame breeding magnate and founder of Fashion Farms out of New Hope, PA, will close a 41-year endeavor in harness racing after the Standardbred Horse Sales Company's Mixed Sale beginning today (Nov. 6). It also marks the end to one of harness racing's most lasting and impactful partnerships between the farm and Hall of Fame trainer Jim Campbell, who began training horses for the Siegels over 30 years ago.

"They've been tremendous for a lot of years," Campbell said. "Jules was buying top-bred horses and then that's how we got started breaking them. I was down on horses; I didn't have that many horses. It was in August of 1994 when Jules and [his late wife] Arlene approached me and asked me if I was interested in training their horses. They weren't having very much success on the racetrack. So, as it turned out, it was a blessing for both of us."

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“We were fortunate enough to end up with some really nice fillies, both on the trotting and on pacing side, and it just kind of all snowballed. We had a good collection in the racing stable and got the breeding farm going. He added sires, like Real Artist, who we bought as a yearling and Broadway Hall, who we bought as a yearling. Before them, it was Tagliabue. It all just kind of came together very nicely and they were great clients for the last 31 years.”

Campbell also fondly mentioned the pacing mare Galleria in the breadth of champions he campaigned with the Siegels. Galleria, like Real Artist and Broadway Hall, was developed as a yearling by Campbell after being purchased for just \$37,000. She earned \$1.8 million through four years of racing before retiring to the breeding shed. As a broodmare, she foaled 11 horses with only two that never reached the races. One of her offspring, Sandbetweenmytoes, won a Breeders Crown in such a monumental upset over Horse of the Year Tall Dark Stranger that it broke the series record for a win payoff at \$409.80. He still races to this day and narrows on millionaire status at the ripe age of 8.

After a decade of million-dollar seasons alongside Fashion Farms, Campbell grew weary of the racing business. His starts dwindled from 2004 to 2007, a stint when Campbell stepped away from harness racing. He opened a pizzeria on the Jersey Shore that he ran only for about a year before selling it and restarting his training career. Jules and Arlene Siegel stayed at Campbell’s side and he ramped back up in 2007 to then have another million-dollar season in 2008. And then Campbell returned to the top of the sport again by 2009 with the Siegels in one of the most memorable Hambletonian Oaks performances of the modern era to win with homebred Broadway Schooner in a blanket photo.

“That felt really good to leave and then get to come back and then two years later you get to go out and win the Oaks,” Campbell said. “That was pretty special.”

Fashion Farms and Campbell persisted through the 2010s and into the 2020s. They remained a major player annually on the Grand Circuit with homebreds from the Siegels’ boutique broodmare band that eventually materialized in another Hambletonian Oaks win by none other than Broadway Schooner’s foal Fashion Schooner in 2022, the year Campbell also won the Hambletonian for Scott Farber’s Runthetable Stables with Cool Papa Bell – the longest-priced horse to ever win the race. To this day, the sport of harness racing has only seen one other instance where a mare and her offspring have both won in the Hambletonian Oaks when Nan’s Catch won in 1988 and later her daughter Moni Maker in 1996.

“When you look back on it, in the 31 years, there’s been a lot of great races and great horses and it’s something that I will never forget and I’m sure Jules feels the same way, too,” Campbell said.

Retirement for Siegel always seemed around the corner according to Campbell. Arlene passed away in 2010 and Jules continued with Fashion Farms, which came to be because Arlene told Jules that he “cannot do nothing” after leaving the pharmacy business. But Campbell said after Lexington this year that he felt the shouts of retirement may be “real this time.”

“Jules would get, when things weren’t going well, he’d get mad and say, ‘I’m getting out of the business’ and then he’d go out and have a horse race well and it was all forgotten,” Campbell



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said with a laugh. “I guess a lot of us are like that, too. You know, you have a bad day and you hate whatever you’re doing and the next day you have a good day and you love it again. It’s human nature, I guess.”

Fashion Farms will disperse its broodmare band in today’s session of the Mixed Sale and its horses in training in the Friday session.

“Fashion Green is selling; Practical Man... they are two really nice horses,” Campbell said. “I’m going to miss those two a lot. There are a couple of 2-year-old trotting fillies that showed some promise this year, too. There are some decent opportunities for somebody, if they are looking for some quality racehorses.”

The chapter closes with Fashion Farms for Campbell, but the New Jersey-based trainer plugs forward. With a stable of about 10 at Gaitway Farms in Manalapan Township, Campbell added one to his roster on Wednesday – **Hip #685 Wrong Sounds Right**. The Tactical Landing colt, out of the Broadway Hall mare Broadway Jo Ell, went to Campbell for \$35,000.

## ALL EYES ON MIXED SALE

The Standardbred Horse Sales Company has built mixed sales loaded with star power over the last few years. Last year’s mixed sale shattered all sales records with the auction of 3-year-old trotting colt Amazing Catch, who left the ring after a fierce bidding war between Andrew Harris and Greg Luther that slammed at a mark of \$1.85 million – the most ever spent on a standardbred in an auction.

Along with the Fashion Farms dispersal, the 2025 Mixed Sale also features the continued disbanding of the partnership between Marvin Katz and Al Libfeld with several of their mares going through the ring and the dispersal of Fair Winds Farms in-foal mares among other breeding offerings.

“I think there’s just anticipation, first of all,” said David Reid of Preferred Equine. “Second of all, the quality of the Fabulous Fillies in there [selling Friday], that are not included in the dispersal, are strong, and then the racehorses – the overall numbers are down, but the quality is the same. It’s a compact, tight-quality group of horses, so it’s exciting for sure.”

The Black Book Sale has seen several dispersals from farms over the last few years, providing buyers rare opportunities to grab regal pedigrees. Last year began the first of a two-year dispersal of Fred Hertrich III’s All American Harnessbreds and a few years prior saw the dispersal of White Birch Farms go through the ring, all at a time when generations crest and ready to turn over to the farms budding in the wings.

“I think each dispersal had its own circumstances – some age, some estates, some health,” Reid said. “Unfortunately, those operations are not going to be passed along. They are forced to disperse, so now it’s up to our fellow industry breeders to



step up and accumulate the stock and improve their broodmare bands, if they feel as such. It’s the nature of the business. We’d probably prefer not to have a couple of them have the dispersal, but it is what it is and we can’t change that. From Preferred’s point of view, we’ve just got to manage the market and handle it the best we can for the best outcome for the sellers.”

With the dispersals on offer, Welk said he’s noticed at least double the activity for online bidding on this year’s Mixed Sale. Reid also mentioned that the opportunity to buy some of these offerings has attracted global interest.

“I think you’re going to have exposure from around the world,” Reid said. “There’s probably Europeans that are going to be interested. I’m not sure about the Down Under interest, but between North America and the U.S. and Europe, there will be strong interest in the mares. It’s a very strong sample of pacers and trotters. You can make the case that it may be even stronger on trotters. The overall numbers of trotting broodmares are up a little bit, so we’ll see how that flows into the marketplace, but there’s lots of quality here. Lots of first-time opportunities to get into certain families. The thing with the dispersals is that it does offer a very unique opportunity, as those families have been protected for a long time, so it’s going to open up opportunities for a lot of breeders. I think they are paying attention and I think they recognize that.”

The first of two sessions for the Black Book Mixed Sale opens today (Nov. 6), at 11 a.m. (EST). Hips number 951 through 1471 will sell.

# Recent scandals and playing favorites

The unearthed NBA scandal has shaken the sports world – the *entire* sports world.

But scandal is nothing new to sports.

From the 1919 Black Sox scandal with several players from the Chicago White Sox conspiring with gamblers to throw the World Series to the 1961 college basketball point-shaving scandal to a referee admitting to betting on games he officiated and providing that info to gamblers.

Then there are performance enhancing drugs and doping in sports – both human and equine – and the importance of those in trust-making decisions that reach and affect all participants, whether they be at a specific game, on their phones, watching television, or at their favorite track or simulcasting facility.

Chances are that they have a bob-or-two bet on it.

In our sport, the importance of a competent trainer – and caretaker – along with a top-notch driver is just a small component to success.

But, in the dark shadows of buildings, out of public viewing, are those persons whose decisions can make or break the most important component of our sport.

Those persons are judges and state officials, along with racing secretaries, who have the near impossible task of keeping everyone happy, change that to *impossible*.

Their competence, knowledge and, most of all, fairness to all is absolutely imperative for our sport's survival and future success, and I am not sure that is a sure thing.

It used to be that our sport's most important participants were the bettors but, as time has gone by, and with those fortunate enough to race at a facility still supported by casinos and legislatures, we regularly witness races where the *purses* are higher than the betting *handle*.

Oh, there are still a few bright spots, Harrah's Hoosier Park, The Meadowlands, some Ohio tracks, but the trend is drifting lower with every scandal rusting away at our aging punters with not many replacements in the bullpen with fresh, ionized young blood.

As mentioned, our sport needs many components for success – caretakers, trainers, drivers, trotters, and pacers – even us journalists that write about the heroics on the racetracks of the world and brag about their durability, speed and grace with no speed limits in sight. But the most important component in our sport is *the owner*!

The owner might buy the yearling, pay the bills, and, actually, an owner's monthly contribution helps employ just about every person that participates in our sport on the racetracks of the world.

As for all of the overnight events, where would harness racing be without the owner?

Yes, the caretakers and farriers get things rolling in darkness at 5 a.m. and, many times, don't hit the hay themselves until the night is at its darkest.

But, when it comes down to the brass tacks, without owners, we'd have a DNF on our lines.

Indeed, the performance of those who handle the horses day-in and day-out are key components to keeping the owners in the business.

But, behind the scenes, mostly out of site of the public's view are the keys to keeping our current owners and attracting new ones.

Those keys are the aforementioned racing secretaries that attempt to put competitive programs together and the judges high above keeping a watchful eye on the races, and, further down the line, those that work for the State Racing Commissions that are supposed to be unbiased and protect the pulse of the public and their wagered dollars, and, going a stride further, the ones who have to protect the largest investors in this business, the owners.

Every single decision that a race secretary makes in building a competitive racing program, and every single decision the judges make through their binocs from far above the racetrack, and those *final* decisions from Racing Commission personnel upon any appeal – sometimes protected far away from public scrutiny – have an effect on a bettor, a trainer, a driver, and, most importantly, the owner.

Yes, the bettors are allowed to play favorites – there's one in every race – but when the favoritism spreads down the line in a race office, judges stand, or, most importantly, the office of the Racing Commission, playing favorites should never be allowed.

Yes, we have some great ones, no doubt about it, but there have been some instances of question, affecting, most importantly, owners.

In any type of pari-mutuel racing – or any event involving the evil of money – it's impossible to dig deep enough to unearth everything that may happen to influence the outcome of a race, whether it be on or off the racetrack.

To get started in this conversation on a very raw subject, those who did volunteer their thoughts requested anonymity, and who can blame them.

"I'm a little guy from Kentucky," said one. "I have lived there all my life and horses is all I know and I scraped out a living – well, sometimes I did, sometimes I didn't – when the purses were bare minimum \$2,000, \$3,000, \$4,000, you know, I had some 2:02-2:04 horses back then.

"When the legislature, finally, took some action and we had some casino action, too, come into play, all-of-a-sudden – BOOM – everyone was moving to Kentucky and buying land and farms and Kentucky-breds [horses] and where were we left?

"At the starting gate with not much protection, and we didn't have the money to spend to keep up with the Joneses, so to speak. We are getting the leftover scraps, and that's OK.

"The story you did recently on [Jerry] Glantz proves the point that, for the majority, there is no level playing field.

"One guy gets picked on randomly and risks that he'll get a positive.

"What's good for one should be good for all but, and let me emphasize this, there's not nearly enough money to have a fair testing program anywhere!"

I am not sure whether Mr. Anonymous meant "fair" as being unjust or County "fair" tracks, where this Mane Attraction in headed a bit further down the road.

Mr. Anonymous continued, "I don't really think our sport is important enough in the world of sports to get this going."

Valid point.

The Jerry Glantz situation reported in a [recent Mane Attraction](#) was life changing for a gentleman that has devoted his life to harness racing in many arenas, when his trainer filled out the proper notice of appeal to state official Casey Larson explaining that he had no idea how this happened and requested a DNA sample for confirmation of the result.

Refreshing memory, Glantz's trainer got a positive at a fair track on a Class IV medication, among the very bottom of classes for medications or drugs or whatever.

Glantz didn't own the horse in question but had two eligibles for the lucrative Kentucky Stakes finals and his entries *were accepted* only to be scratched by Kentucky commissioner Jamie Eads after the trainer properly filed a notice of appeal on July 27, 2025 to Casey Eugene Larson, explaining what must have been a testing error with a request for a DNA test.

Some six weeks later – 47 days – the trainer received a letter saying his request for a stay was denied.

Class IV – at a fair track – stay denied.

We are at the start of November now, and still no results.

For those who are not familiar with drug/medication classifications, there are five of which I have some familiarity.

- Class I: "Highest potential of enhancing performance and said to be no accepted medical use in horse racing."
- Class II: "High potential of affecting performance (and "often no therapeutic use in horses)."
- Class III: "Moderate potential and may have therapeutic uses but can impact performance."
- Class IV: "Therapeutic medications with limited impact on performance."
- Class V: "Medications with established concentration limits; minimal performance impact."

Class I and II are strictly prohibited, Class III are regulated buy may be used under specific conditions, Class IV and V are medications with established concentration with minimal performance impact.

Upon further inquiry, Equine DNA test results typically return within 10 working days after the lab received the sample. However, total time can vary, with some labs estimating up to two weeks. It can take longer if issues arise, such as a poor-quality sample.

This Glantz decision has destroyed an artery of most importance in our sport – the owner – or, in this case, owners, as another unnamed owner was involved, as well.

As we all know, there have been far more egregious situations, some going on for months, or, even, years, with appeals and stays granted and the question now becomes, how many more owners have been victims of blatantly inconsistent rulings and shouldn't officials be held to a single industry-wide standard?

It also has come to the Mane Attraction's attention that, in another instance, a trainer entered seven horses at a track up in the North East but the race secretary used only two, with the remaining two entered in a class above where they were entered. The trainer scratched those other two.

One owner noted that three of his horses had preference being state sired but that seemed to make no difference to the race secretary.

Again, multiple owners were hurt, something we cannot afford to have happen.

So, here we are at the crossroads, less fans, less handle, less owners.

Obviously, we're on the *wrong track*.

# Jessica Greene's life is all about horses, just like her mom

Mom is the word when it comes to Jessica Greene's love for all things standardbred.

She can still vividly recall the days she'd tag along with her mother, long-time harness racing groom Sheila Napier, always eager to spend time around the barn and the horses.

"It was so much fun," Greene said. "I got to see the horses up-close when I was just a young kid. I would travel with my mom to different racetracks, which was a lot of fun, too."

One of Greene's earliest memories from those days involves a bay pacer who would go on to win 19 of 27 races and earn nearly \$1 million in purses.

Big Bad John, a son of Western Hanover out of the Artsplace mare Trulywork Of Art, caught her attention from the moment he stepped into the shedrow.

"When my mom was first working for [trainer] Ron Potter, she had Big Bad John – that's one of the first big memories that comes to mind," Greene said. "He was a great horse, and I remember watching him race."

It was another 19-race winner, this one a trotter, who would be an eye-opener for Greene, the horse who inspired her to join the groom ranks.

"When my mom was working for [trainer] Chris Beaver and she had the horse Custom Cantab, I knew at some point I would follow in her footsteps," Greene said. "I would go around to different racetracks with her and the horse – that was a lot of fun. Ever since then, I have been hooked. And I love it."

Last summer, Greene started working for husband-and-wife team, trainer Teesha Symes and trainer/driver Beau Brown.

Along with tending to the horses in her care, Greene also has a front-row seat for a welcome equine education.

Whether it's asking questions, listening to advice, or learning more about the industry, the young horsewoman from Ohio appreciates the position she is in.

"It has been great," she said. "Teesha and Beau teach me a lot. They are always happy to share what they know about horses and I get to learn something new every day."

Greene has also been handed the lines on occasion.

When she does jog a horse, there is one caveat in place before she takes a seat in the race bike.

"It is a lot of fun, but I will only sit behind the slow ones," she said with a laugh. "When I get to jog, I feel so calm and any stress you may have in your life just goes away. It's nice to be out there without any care in the world and have that connection to the horses."

Despite the hard work, Greene said being a groom never loses its charm.

"I never get tired of jogging or being at the barn, just hearing how happy the horses are," she said. "It can take a toll on your

body. It's demanding, but I push through for the horses. I never get tired of it."

Over the years, Greene has formed deep bonds with several standardbreds, both trotters and pacers. One of her current favorites is Love That Smile, a 6-year-old daughter of Sportswriter who joined the Symes stable in June 2024.

"She is in my heart, for sure," Greene said. "I just connected with her so fast. She tries hard every race."

And then there is Never Say Uncle.

The son of Uncle Peter raced 123 times and won 19 races, to go along with 51 top-three finishes.

"I helped take care of him when he was at Chris Beaver's barn," Greene said. "He was a nice little colt and I liked spending as much time as I could with him."

But one horse stands above all the rest for Greene: Carols Comet.

A bay son of Yankee Cruiser, Carols Comet spent most of his racing career in the Ron Potter stable — and made a lasting impression on a young Greene.

The two connected almost instantaneously.

"He is my riding horse now," she said. "When I was little — my mom was at Ron Potter's — there was just something about this horse that made me take notice. We were joined at the hip when he came to Ron's barn. I was around 5 and Carols Comet was just a baby."

They have been together ever since — and not just on trail rides.

The pair has, on occasion, put on a show for an approving audience.

Their connection has only deepened over the years. Together, they've earned multiple championships at the National Standardbred Show in New Jersey, an annual event showcasing the versatility of the breed.

Held in late summer in New Jersey since 1995, the show is presented jointly by the Standardbred Pleasure Horse Organization of New Jersey (SPHO-NJ), the Standardbred Breeders and Owners Association of New Jersey (SBOA-NJ) and the USTA.

Standardbreds from across the country travel to compete in over 40 classes, open only to the breed.

"It has been amazing to do this with him," Greene said. "It is nice to see how much appreciation there is out there for standardbreds. They deserve all that love."

That affection shines through every time one of her horses hits the track.

"I'm just like my mom — I get rowdy, and I get loud," Greene said. "People notice me and they can hear me."

As for what could come next for Greene, the plan, as of now, is to stay in the horse world, albeit in the pursuit of a different role.

"At the end of the day, I will probably go to school to be an equine vet," she said. "This summer, I got to talk more often to the vets here in Delaware and it really got me thinking about what career path I wanted to take. I learned more about the horses and having the chance to be around the vets gave me more insight into that world."

That horses will play an integral part in every aspect of her life is a certainty.

"One hundred per cent," Green said. "They have been in my life ever since I can remember and I know that won't ever change. I have always loved them and I always will."

Just like mom.

# Radio waves and the art of abatement for a diehard gambler, Part 2

My hiatus from intense gambling on harness and thoroughbred racing was a well-needed rest. It afforded me time and money from the successful Del Mar meet and gave me plenty of time for freelance writing and my playful but serious relationship with Natasha. I had a novel under my belt and it was becoming popular with ragtag horseplayers across the country. I was also writing for *American Turf Monthly* and *Gambling Times* and a few fiction/poetry underground magazines; and I still had time to kill.

I made no plans for a future. I was living day by day and night by night without a care. Then when Los Alamitos harness opened again, I showed up at Del Mar simulcasting for a casual visit. I was not prepared to take on the meet. I could afford not to dive into heavy handicapping and betting again for a while. Whenever.

That night I wandered around the simulcast theater and watched some Los Alamitos races. No betting. Until there was betting. I saw a race coming up with a horse I recalled and remembered it was in the hands of another trainer last season while this season it was in the training and driving hands of Joe Anderson. I looked at the tote board. The horse was 26-1. Impossible, I thought. Then my pro-betting-self kicked in and my brain did a quick measuring of odds — true handicapping — and I knew Anderson's horse should not be 26-1. It was worth 6-1 and that made it a monstrous overlay.

I did not second guess myself. I placed a \$20 to win bet. In the two-minute race I collected more than \$200. I left the simulcast theater after collecting the win and walked around the grounds in the moonlight. Then I went back to my apartment and started to think about the future.

Apparently, there was little thinking to do. That week I got a phone call with a lucrative offer to return to radio and TV. It meant reuniting with Wolfman Jack in a radical multi-medium project. The Nashville TV Network — the hub for all that represents the country music community nationwide — wanted

to hire The Wolfman to be the top celebrity figure for a music radio network headquartered in Nashville, TN.

"Are you going to take the deal?" Natasha said.

"I have to fly to Nashville and meet with some people."

"So, you want to do it?"

"Maybe."

The challenges of major changes were piled before me. I sought none of them but they arrived and demanded my attention. How should I gamble on any or all of it? What about my relationship with Natasha? Would Wolfman and I click again with my professional return to producing and writing for the media? It was time to handicap the scenarios. First, I researched the back story of the job.

The Nashville music business was basically owned and run by the Oklahoma Publishing Company, a multimillion-dollar mini-conglomerate comprising radio and television and newspaper companies. It was privately owned by the Gaylord family. The radio project was to be another outlet: T N N Radio. It aimed for a younger audience since cosmopolitan country was a fresh genre; a spinoff format blending country music classics with a current generation of stylized country sounds by younger artists.

Sounded like a cinch for Wolfman to handle. I knew this from writing for him as he performed on multi-cultural platforms; he was an entertaining host for any genre of music. Besides, cosmopolitan country was deeply akin to rock and pop music. And Wolfman loved 10-gallon hats and jeweled cowboy boots. The expensive ones.

But what did I know about Tennessee? Nothing aside from lyrics of a song that told me Davy Crockett was born on a mountain top there. I knew a lot of classic country music from my professional musician days. Hank Williams and Buck Owens and Johnny Cash made it north and into the catering halls for wedding receptions with hit songs. But the essence of Tennessee was as foreign to a kid from Brooklyn as a stork farm in Bensonhurst.

The real concern was about living in Tennessee. To be more specific it was about living in a state prohibiting pari-mutuel racing. That stark reality hit me like a punch in the solar plexus. In my opinion its proximity to the historic equine, breeding, and racing state of Kentucky alone should have supported lawful wagering of any kind. There was another concern. A more personal situation. Natasha. It would have to wait. A seat was waiting for me on a plane from San Diego to Nashville.

Eight \$100,000 Kentucky Sires Stakes (KYSS) finals for 2- and 3-year-old colts and fillies on the pace and the trot were held on Tuesday (Nov. 4) at Cumberland Run. Also on the 12-race card were four \$50,000 KYSS leg 3 races for 4-year-old male and female pacers and trotters.

Todd McCarthy was a KYSS ladies' man at Cumberland, scoring a hat trick on the card by winning both finals for 2-year-old fillies as well as leg 3 for the 4-year-old trotting mares.

McCarthy won the first \$100,000 final on the card, race 2, with freshman trotting female **Naked And Famous** for trainer Noel Daley. The daughter of Six Pack—Sleep Tight My Luv, bred by Carter Duer, won by a nose in 1:54.2 for owner CTC Stable.

McCarthy came right back in race 3 winning with **Pizzelle** by a half-length in 1:52.4 in leg 3 of the KYSS for 4-year-old trotting mares. Trained by Carter Pinsky and owned by Donald Robinson, Michael Robinson, Harold Bauder, and Steve Stewart the daughter of Walner—Biscotti was bred by Brittany Farms.

McCarthy's final trip to the winner's circle on the day came in race 10 with the Andrew Harris trained **Gala** in the KYSS final for 2-year-old filly pacers. The daughter of Downbytheseaside—Sweetest Emotion, bred by Diamond Creek Farm and owned by Bill Pollock, Bruce Areman, and Harris, won by 8¾ lengths in 1:50.1.

Dexter Dunn drove the winner of the first race on the card, **Women Layer** to victory by 5½ lengths in 1:49 in KYSS leg 3 for 4-year-old male pacers. Virgil Morgan, Jr. trains the gelded son of Sweet Lou—Loreenas Ruffian, bred by Carl Howard and owned by Let It Rides Stables, Jeff Fought Racing, Larry Wills, and Jesmeral Stable.

Dunn also won the last race on the card, race 12, the KYSS final for 3-year-old male pacers with **Captain Arturovico** in 1:50 by 1½ lengths for trainer Ron Burke. The gelded son of Captaintreacherous—Tilikum was bred by Randy Zane and owned by Burke Racing Stable, Weaver Brussemi, Lawrence Karr, and Philip Collura.

Driver David Miller also hit a double on the card, winning race 6 with **Three Times Bettor** and race 9 with **Silverstein**.

Brett Pelling trained Three Times Bettor won the KYSS final for 3-year-old filly pacers by a head in 1:50. The daughter of Bettors Delight—Three Times A Lady, bred by Steve Stewart, Conquest Acres Lp, and Michael Robinson is owned by Thaddeus Wier.

Matthew Burkholder trained Silverstein won the KYSS final for freshman male trotters by four lengths in 1:52.4. Bred by Brittany Farms, the gelded son of Chapter Seven—Shining Brightly, is owned by Dark Horse Farm.

Burke was the only trainer to score multiple races on the card as in addition to his win with Captain Arturovico, he also won race 4, the KYSS final for 3-year-old filly trotters with **Winnpanzee**. Yannick Gingras drove the Ola Yoder bred son of Gimpanzee—Winndevie to a three-quarter length victory in 1:53 for owners Burke Racing Stable, Bradley Grant, and Weaver Brussemi.

The KYSS final for freshman male pacers was won by Tony Dinges trained **Downbythelakeside** driven to a 1½ length victory in 1:50.4 by Tim Tetrick. Joe Sbrocco bred the son of Downbytheseaside—Pure Paradise owned by Rick Berks.

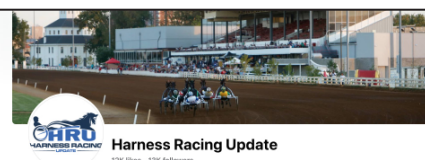
**Precise Landing** trained and driven by Joe Bongiorno won the KYSS final for sophomore male trotters by two lengths in 1:52.3. The son of Tactical Landing—Southwind Tesla bred by R Greenfield, Michael Creps, and R Frank is owned by Glenn Goller and Stephen Demeter.

Per Engblom trained **Bath Bomb** won leg 3 of the KYSS for 4-year-old pacing mares by 3½ lengths in 1:50.1. Driven to victory by Andrew McCarthy, the Mark Smith bred daughter of Lather Up—Sangaal is owned by Morrison Racing Stables.

Marvin Luna drove the Bob Stewart trained **Hung Over** to victory in leg 3 of the KYSS for 4-year-old male trotters by 2½ lengths in 1:53.4. The son of Creatine—Drunkard's Dream was bred by Bluestone Farms who shares ownership with Lynda Stewart.

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## Thai Hanover ready for another test in Matron

Mitchell York is not someone who typically races horses this late in the season, especially a 2-year-old, but Thai Hanover will be a rare exception when he goes behind the starting gate in today's \$122,600 Grade 3 Matron Stakes for freshman male pacers at Bally's Dover.

Thai Hanover, a two-time Grand Circuit winner, will get his opportunity thanks to a consistent campaign that has seen him hit the board in nine of 13 races while facing some of the sport's top 2-year-old male pacers along the way. That trend will continue tonight, when he leaves from post 1 with Jeremy

Indof driving for co-owner/trainer York in the Matron. He is 8-1 on the morning line.

"He drew well, I just wish he could have drawn in with another group of horses," York said with a laugh. "But I'm excited about the race. I hope they know he's there. That's just a tough group of colts, but he's raced with them on and off all year, and he's always been competitive. Hopefully, he's competitive again."

Thai Hanover's competition in the eight-horse Matron field includes Pennsylvania Sire Stakes champion and Metro Pace runner-up Frantic Hanover (the 5-2 morning-line favorite with Tim Tetrick driving for trainer Ron Burke), multiple graded-stakes winner and Breeders Crown third-place finisher Melillo (7-2, Ronnie Wrenn, Jr., Burke) and New York Sire Stakes champion and Big Apple Pace winner Fragment (9-2, Jason Bartlett, Per Engblom).

Frantic Hanover and Fragment rank second and third, respectively, in seasonal earnings among freshman male pacers, with more than \$500,000 each.

"Some years are a little weaker, but this year was just an amazing group," said York, who has watched Thai Hanover at some point

this season face six of the eight 2-year-old male pacers to win in 1:49.4 or faster. “They’re all phenomenal.”

Thai Hanover, a \$14,000 yearling purchase from the 2024 Standardbred Horse Sale, has earned \$116,891 this season for York and his wife, Erin. The son of Stay Hungry–Tempest Blue Chip is the ninth six-figure-earner out of his dam and his family also includes millionaire Kenneth J and O’Brien Award-winner Percy Bluechip, the mother of this year’s Grade 1 Adios champ Prince Hal Hanover.

“He’s what we could afford, which is how we always buy,” York said. “We were lucky enough to buy his full sister [Tempt Me Hanover for \$24,000 in a September Preferred Equine Online auction], so we’ll see how she is next year.”

Thai Hanover heads to the Matron off an Oct. 20 win in a \$45,950 division of the Simpson Memorial Stakes at Pocono Downs at Mohegan Pennsylvania, covering the mile in 1:55.2 over a sloppy track. He also captured the \$48,000 Standardbred Stakes for 2-year-old male pacers on Sept. 17 at the Delaware County Fair in Ohio, stopping the timer in 1:52.1.

For the year, Thai Hanover has posted four wins, four seconds, and a third in 13 races. Two of his seconds came against Frantic Hanover and another came against Melillo. His third came in a division of the Bluegrass Stakes (G3) at Lexington’s Red Mile, where he set the tempo before finishing a length behind Signal Caller in a 1:48.4 mile. He nearly held for second but was nosed out by Ubrute.

“I never thought I’d have a 2-year-old go in 1:49, and we got 1:49 and finished third,” York said. “But he’s been consistent all year. He can leave really well, and he still finishes OK. I think he’s matured a lot throughout the year. He’s nice in the barn, but he was a little bit hard to handle in the paddock on race day. He’s getting calmer. The more he races, the more he learns.”

The Matron will be Thai Hanover’s final start of the campaign.

“We’ve never raced this far into the year with a 2-year-old,” York said. “Hopefully, he continues to mature and grows during the winter and comes back as a nice 3-year-old. That’s what we’re looking forward to. I feel blessed with him, that’s for sure.”

Racing begins at 4:30 p.m. at Bally’s Dover. In addition to the Matron for 2-year-old male pacers, there will be a \$110,300 Matron for 2-year-old female trotters and \$104,900 Matron for 2-year-old female pacers.

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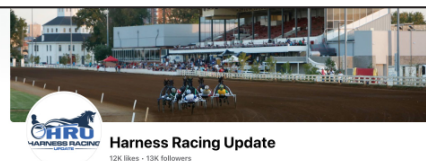

## Speed stands up in Pocono's Winter Is Coming Series

The Winter Is Coming Series for trotters had its first preliminary Tuesday afternoon (Nov. 4) at Pocono Downs at Mohegan Pennsylvania, and if the times of the winners of the three \$12,500 divisions mean anything – 1:55.3, 1:55.4, 1:55.4 – there should be some excellent competitive trotting on tap right up through the \$20,000 championship on Nov. 18, the penultimate card of the year at the northeast Pennsylvania track.

The fastest mile of the opening leg of the series (by the slimmest margin possible, as above) went to the Andover Hall mare **Tuis Angel**, who like many Tuesday (Tuis-day?) winners went out to early command and never surrendered the lead in the 1:55.3 victory. Braxten Boyd guided Tuis Angel to victory for trainer David Wiest, who is a co-owner with Pamela Kimmel and James Rappold.

Boyd posted another Winter Is Coming victory with the Muscle Mass gelding **Jacked**, who was parked past the quarter for the front end and then maintained that position to the finish, winning by a length over determined first-over challenger and favorite Sainthood. Tee Wine conditions the winner, who took a new mark with the 1:55.4 victory for Wine Stable and Michael Holland.

Also a 1:55.4 winner, and also controlling the pace en route to Victory Lane, was the Andover Hall gelding **One After Nine**, who won by over five lengths. Jim Pantaleano drove the winner, who eclipsed the quarter million dollar total with the win, for trainer Bucky Angle and owners Howard and Joshua Kauffman.

The richest race of the day, a \$15,500 trot for developing horses, also went in 1:55.4, and emerging victorious was the Green Manalishi S sophomore gelding **Wendell Blue Chip**, winning for trainer Jared Bako and the partnership of Blue Chip Bloodstock Inc. and Daniel Zucker. Atypically for the day, driver Colin Kelly was successful with off-the-pace tactics, beating out favored Rothko by three-quarters-of-a-length.

Kelly, who began campaigning semi-regularly at Pocono mid-season, was the only winning driver Tuesday who isn't among the track's eight winningest drivers, and the only one who had a single win. Braxten Boyd and Anthony Napolitano had three wins, and meet leader Tyler Buter, George Napolitano, Jr., and Jim Pantaleano each won twice on the 13-race card.

Racing at Pocono resumes on Saturday at 1 p.m., the seventh-to-last card of the 2025 season, with strong groupings of many divisions of top overnight horses; there will also be a carryover into the last race High 5 wager.
