Harness Racing Update

It will be four years ago in March that the FBI and the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York announced the first indictments for what is straight up cheating and horse abuse. The outrage was short-lived and has long since dissipated.

Since that time, little-to-nothing has changed to address the scourge of performance-enhancing drugs in a sport clearly in the cross-hairs of animal rights forces that haven't the slightest interest in appreciating the subtle differences between standardbred and thoroughbred racing. On that score, harness racing is just lucky few people know this particular brand of horse racing exists.

Worse, harness racing has done little to advance what should be its number one rule: Protect the welfare of the horses at all costs.

Even after one of the worst scandals imaginable — where the FBI had to be called in to nab people so unscrupulous they harmed horses they purported to love for personal gain — harness racing still can't even agree about what constitutes an effective drug testing program from state to state let alone figure out how to properly police itself.

God forbid an epic scandal involving animal welfare brings action and reason to the system.

First, the emphasis and funding must shift more to the only proven method of catching cheaters — surveillance. Second, despite the relative ineffectiveness of drug testing, regulators need to also sharply increase fines for the most performance-enhancing of the drugs — the ones that are Class 1 or 2 that should almost never be in a horse for any reason.

At the same time, regulators need to stop handing out fines and suspensions for positives triggered by nanogram levels of therapeutic medications designed to keep horses healthy, not cheat. At one billionth of a gram, how could an antihistamine possibly give a horse an advantage over others? Why should a trainer be punished for trying to help a horse breathe?

There's also the significant issue of contamination that needs sound reasoning from regulators that should know by now that a rash of positives for the same drug from the same paddock wasn't a group of trainers getting together to try to cheat.

But then, logic is not a quality often held by regulators that are, all too frequently, bureaucrats more focused on making few waves and keeping their sweet government gig than doing their jobs to protect horses and the betting public.

Little wonder John Campbell has, sadly, only made limited progress in his quest to bring much-needed universal rules to the sport despite a huge effort. I feel deeply for him. If he can't get it done, I can't think of anyone that can.

In March, it will be seven years since Campbell became president and CEO of the Hambletonian Society and began trying to bring reason to the madness. But since harness racing is largely a series of warlords and fiefdoms, there just isn't a compelling reason for, say, the Pennsylvania regulators to get on the same page with the ones in New York or New Jersey or Ohio

or anywhere else. They will just worry about their own states, thank you very much. The betterment of the sport be damned.

That was one of the promising parts about the Horseracing Integrity and Safety Authority (HISA) at least on paper — it was a step toward horse racing governing itself nationwide.

Yet, instead of working from the inside to soften the most egregious parts of HISA, what does harness racing do? Its own governing body tries to bring HISA down. You can't make this up.

What does the public see? That harness racing isn't interested in integrity nor the safety of its horses and participants. That's not true, of course, but try explaining that to someone that doesn't know a standardbred from a salamander.

And public perception does matter, especially for a sport that desperately needs *some* public to like it for it to have a future.

Speaking of warlords and fiefdoms, the racetracks don't do the sport any favors either by protecting their own turf at the expense of others. I guess, like the regulators, one can't expect the tracks to be concerned about how others are doing. Except, it is extremely short-sighted in the face of declining foal numbers, field sizes, participants, handle and attendance — all of which threaten to swamp the entire boat.

But then harness racing sees the big picture about as well as Mr. Magoo.

Post time drag is a clear example. While the sport in its individual two-minute action segments is as compelling as ever, an entire card of racing has become a bloated, completely unwatchable

falsehood that serves to aggravate customers and participants alike in the supposed aim of handle growth.

While other sports have actively worked to decrease the length of their events, harness racing is bucking that trend, extending its programs to five and six hours and expecting its paying customers — already a dying breed — to just shrug and go along with a perpetual bold-faced lie.

How does anyone think this is a sound business policy?

I'm all about driving handle which is good for bettors and participants and tracks alike. Trouble is, there's no actual science to back up the oft-heard contention that dragging leads to greater handle; no proof of a *direct correlation* between the number of minutes past zero minutes to post and the amount bet. Sure, sure some tracks tried not dragging, briefly, and handle dropped. But there are simply too many factors at play influencing handle to determine that was the sole reason for the decline, particularly when tracks have accustomed their customers to expect a drag.

My contention is that if all major tracks educated their bettors and committed long-term to start rolling the gate when the clock hits zero, in due course those that want to lay a bet would find a way to do so.

Otherwise, we'll see how much is bet in a few years when there are few betting customers left.

Dragging makes even less sense when most major tracks have fat purses not from handle, but either the legislated largesse of casinos or significant government handouts.

Which brings us to the warlords.

If The Meadowlands' owner Jeff Gural and the United States Trotting Association's chairperson Joe Faraldo and president Russell Williams truly had the best interest of the sport at heart, they would all put aside petty differences and figure out how to come together to lead.

As it stands, it certainly appears Faraldo and Williams advocate the status quo — which is baffling given the state the sport is in.

Meanwhile, Gural, while certainly well-intentioned to personally fund an attempt to eradicate cheaters, could be less reactionary and more thoughtful before acting. Case in point, I'm torn whether banning people from The Meadowlands that supposedly purchased performance-enhancing drugs will really help without proof said products were actually given to horses.

Where Gural had it right was helping to fund surveillance that led to the horse doping indictments. The wire taps were invaluable and telling and gutting.

Horsepeople — the vast majority of whom are the honest, decent folks that made me fall in love with harness racing nearly three decades ago — simply have to do more to stop other people from robbing both them and the sport.

Owners can do their part by giving horses to the most honest of trainers and insisting on the utmost integrity and well-being for their horses. That includes saving a percentage of purse winnings to provide decent after-care for all the horses they own.

Everyone should demand better from leadership that for far too long has done far too little to protect horses, level the playing field and advance the collective interests of harness racing. If leadership doesn't act, get new leaders.

Frankly, four years after the indictments, how harness racing hasn't found a way to do better is sickening and pathetic and troubling.

Surely, I can't be the only one tired of it.

Rallying to support former Woodbine broadcaster Chris Connor

"The Pride of Fredericton" now suffers from multiple sclerosis and needs help with costly care.

Chris Connor conducted his final Woodbine harness racing broadcast on Nov. 15, 2008. The New Brunswick native came home soon afterward, becoming track announcer at Fredericton Raceway, a landmark half-mile oval in the provincial capital. He had started his harness racing career at the 153-year-old track, helping horseman Eric Lakes in the 1980s.

Broadcasting would come a little later.

With encouragement from raceway manager Brian Embleton, Connor created a weekly segment called "Racing Roundup," which aired on local radio station CFNB while he was still a student at Fredericton's St. Thomas University. It helped launch his career as a radio broadcaster and on-air hockey analyst with the Fredericton Canadiens, former American Hockey League (AHL) farm team for the Montreal Canadiens.

In 1998, Connor returned to racing, assisting the Atlantic Lottery Corporation (ALC) in a short-lived deal to grow the sport across the three Maritime provinces (NS, NB, PEI). His friend Greg Blanchard, now director of equine programming at The Raceway at Western Fair in London, ON, was working for Woodbine Entertainment Group (WEG) at the time and suggested Connor apply.

Hired in 1999, Connor worked as a host for WEG standardbred and thoroughbred simulcast shows and on The Racing Network (TRN), the subscription-based precursor to Woodbine's HPItv. When "Race Night on The Score" launched on Canada's The Score Television Network in March 2000, he was recruited to join the nationwide Monday night broadcast.

Woodbine Mohawk Park racing analyst Elissa Blowe frequently worked alongside Connor before his 2008 departure from the company.

"Obviously I love [current co-hosts] Randy [Waples] and Jeff [Bratt], but [Chris] is just a pretty awesome guy," Blowe said. "He's a tough act to follow. Chris was one of my favorite co-hosts. Chris and I hosted the Woodbine thoroughbred broadcasts for a number of years together."

Blowe said that Connor's future wife Erica Parker was a member of the broadcast team.

"Erica used to work with us at Woodbine too," Blowe said. "She was assistant director, I think... She worked her way up."

Not wanting to speak exclusively in the past tense about her former colleague, Blowe recalled what set him apart as a racing commentator during his career, and still sets him apart as a person.

"[Connor was] always positive, and he loved, loved, racing, whether it was thoroughbred or standardbred," Blowe said. "His passion was immense. It didn't matter what show he was on or who he worked with, everybody loved working with Chris. When trainers and drivers would win races, they enjoyed being interviewed by him, because he would ask really good questions. He was such a good listener."

Blowe said Connor was diagnosed with multiple sclerosis (MS) when he was still in Ontario, but kept quiet about his diagnosis.

"You wouldn't have known it," she said.

She recalled one of her best memories with Connor.

"[Woodbine producers] never finished it, but they sent us to go and drive standardbreds together for a feature that was going to be played," Blowe said. "The mission was for us to go training miles with these two 2-year-olds, and I think we went to Pat Hudon's farm. Both of us had jogged horses for a number of years, so we kind of knew what we were doing...

"Of course, we did it, but I wasn't as close as I thought. In my mind, I was on his helmet... We were laughing at each other when we finished it, and were pulling the horses up. We were kind of relieved, and then they told us to go and do it again!"

Now, Blowe is one of many helping to spread the word about Connor's situation.

"I worked the [Woodbine simulcast] thoroughbred show [Thursday] and we did it there," she said.

Last Friday (Nov. 17), Lindsay Williams set up a **GoFundMe campaign** to help gather donations for Connor, who now requires a motorized wheelchair, a motorized lift and personal care workers due to the neurological condition.

Williams is the best friend of Connor's wife, Erica.

"We met in kindergarten and we've been inseparable since," Williams said. "I met [Chris] as soon as they started dating.

They actually met at Woodbine, as colleagues, and a romantic relationship didn't start for a while... They have always had a beautiful chemistry."

Erica is now a postal delivery worker.

"She's walking 17,18,20 kilometers a day with a very heavy bag on her, and then she rushes home, gets out of her work clothes, puts on her day clothes, and then she's taking care of Chris," Williams told HRU. "He doesn't have enough strength to move his own body, so the lift is necessary."

Williams said she started crowdfunding out of necessity, both financial and personal. She encouraged friends who may have lost touch with Connor to reach out.

"Chris is a very private person..." Williams said. "Part of what happens with a chronic disease like this is it really chips away at your ability to be social. We need to ask for help to be able to pay for his care. There's this perception, people think that if you have Parkinson's or MS or other things, the care is paid for, but it's not."

She said that Connor is awaiting placement in a care home.

"He's grieving, but at the same time he's trying to enjoy the time he has," said Williams. "He still likes to stay connected to his friends. He still goes out to the [off-track] every Friday night with his friends when he can do it, and he stays up to date on all the sports that he loves; he's a huge sports fan. He speaks very fondly of his time at Woodbine."

WMP announcer Ken Middleton is still sidelined by an injury from a training accident, and not expecting to be back in the booth before the new year. He remembered getting to know Connor. They were initially "passing ships in the night because there were so many components of the broadcasting department back then.

"When we expanded to more broadcast shows on The Score and Sportsnet, and even some simulcast gigs, I got to know more about Chris. At every level, he's a likable guy... He's a fellow Boston Bruins fan, so we have that in common."

Middleton said he was heartbroken for Chris and Erica.

"It just goes to show how delicate life is..." he said. "You spend so much of your early life working hard to establish things for yourself when you grow older, and then [MS] happens."

Middleton said stepping back from a career in racing is always hard.

"It's a funny business," he said. "We get so wrapped up in it because it's our job, but it's also our passion and our interest, our love. It's not like a lot of other industries, where you punch your clock from 9 to 5 and then you go home and forget about work. In harness racing we don't do that, because we're fans."

He identified Connor's attentive interviewing style as perhaps his greatest strength.

"It's just one of those things, you either have it or you don't," Middleton said. "If you ask me what Chris was best at it is interviewing, because he made people feel comfortable... He just had that presence about him."

The race caller remembered he and Connor calling each other a nickname from Austin Powers in Goldmember.

"We'd always laugh about certain parts of the movie when we saw each other," Middleton told HRU. "We all had a great camaraderie: Greg Blanchard, Chris Hickey, Chris Connor, and Mike Hamilton. There was a strong roster of horses in that stable. All great broadcasters, but we were all great friends on the side." Obviously I love [current co-hosts] Randy [Waples] and Jeff [Bratt], but [Chris] is just a pretty awesome guy. He's a tough act to follow. Chris was one of my favorite co-hosts. Chris and I hosted the Woodbine thoroughbred broadcasts for a number of years together.

Ebbinge celebrates big day in Jägersro

Rick Ebbinge experienced one of his greatest moments as a Swedish trainer when he claimed the \$305,000 Uppfödningslöpningen for 2-year-olds at Jägersro on Saturday (Nov. 25) afternoon.

Ebbinge's **L'AmourPourBlanca** (Face Time Bourbon) impressed a lot when he left the opponents in the stretch after a tough trip, to say the least. L'AmourPourBlanca was involved in a furious

opening where the inexperienced 2-year-olds hit the first quarter in :26.3 and Ebbinge opted a first over position on the back stretch, when leader Duncan Cowan began to relax in front.

L'AmourPourBlanca disarmed the leader in the last turn and held attacking challengers behind him at the finish. The 2-year-old Face Time Bourbon colt won in a Swedish record time of 1:56.2.

Romulus Tooma finished quickly as runner up ahead of Oriana Boko.

Jägersro also played host to two divisions of the \$76,000 Breeders Course Super Bonus for 3-year-olds, where last year's winner of the Uppfödningslöpningen, **Fiftyfour** (Fourth Dimension) played with his opponents in the colts and geldings division. Tomas Malmqvist trains the E3 winner from this year and Ken Ecce sat in the bike.

Adrian Kolgjini won with **Countess Face** (Muscle Hill) in the mare's division after an impressive start from post 8 behind the gate. To the front directly from the problematic post was the winning formula.







For Rebecca Kanak winning isn't everything

Rebecca Kanak's first win as a trainer was twice as nice.

At the end of October, at Century Mile in Edmonton, AB, Run And Buck, a 3-year-old daughter of Domitian Hanover—Toomuchfunwithu, just missed breaking her maiden, falling a head shy of the victory.

One week later, the bay filly that Kanak trains and co-owns with fellow conditioner Trevor Williams, finished sixth as the 2-1 choice at the same venue.

The third time, however, would be the charm for both horse and trainer.

On Nov. 10, once again at Century Mile, Run And Buck, with Michael Hennessy in the race bike, lined up behind the starter in the first race, this time as the 7-2 second choice in the field of seven.

After tracking in second for most of the trip, Run And Buck came calling down the lane and went on to record a 2-length score in a time of 1:57.4.

"We had just bought her at the end of September," said Kanak. "So, for this race, we both broke our maiden. You could see her grinding it out. I kept it all inside. With the horses I own, train, or look after, I tend to be pretty quiet if I am watching in the paddock. I am quite reserved, even if it's obvious that they won, my nerves don't truly settle until the results come up."

Kanak's biggest takeaway from her milestone victory was that it happened to be a shared achievement.

"She was two seconds faster in her win from her previous race, so I was happy for her and happy to see how we were able to prepare her," she said. "I don't get caught up in getting the win or not. But that was a win for the horse and for me. It is always about moving forward."

Which has long been a staple in Kanak's life, on and off the racetrack.

Her initial interactions with racehorses came in the form of thoroughbreds.

And then she discovered the standardbreds.

"We had harness racing in Saskatoon before my time," she said. "I was grooming for a thoroughbred trainer for a couple of years when we still had a racetrack here. My first introduction to harness racing was working as a vet assistant. Manitoba had extended their summer fair meet to 10 race days in Saskatoon following their summer meet and we went there to do some vet work, so that's how I first met standardbreds. I also knew some off-track standardbreds who were retired from racing, so it didn't take me long to get hooked. I like their quiet disposition. I like the craziness of thoroughbreds, but I was really taken with the standardbreds."

So much, in fact, that Kanak mapped out the opportunity to get more familiar with the breed.

Her travels would take her west, north and then southwest.

"I tagged along for the odd racing day after they were competing in Saskatoon and then went on to race in Calgary and Edmonton," Kanak said. "It wasn't that far, so I would drive up to those spots on the weekend. I got attached to a couple of horses and the following spring, there was another fiveweek, 10 race-day meet in Saskatoon, and I took care of a couple of my own horses there. Those horses went on to race in Manitoba that summer and after that, the stable was going to California to race at Cal-Expo. I had finished my Bachelor of Science in Agriculture at that point, so I had no commitments from December 2022 on, so I went down to California with Travis [Ellis] and his horses."

Those adventures would play a key role in her eventual pursuit of a trainer's license.

"It was a little bit of stubbornness on my part to want my license," Kanak said. "I had no problems with being a caretaker, but I was starting to do more things around the barn, including helping with the training, so I wanted to have something. I wasn't sure how long I would be in racing or go back to the real world, as I often say, but this was the best time and opportunity to go for my trainer's license, so that's what I did."

Currently, Kanak has two horses in her barn, along with her caretaker duties.

Based out of Century Mile right now (Century Downs come February), she isn't looking down the road when it comes to the training side of her career.

Instead, her top priority is in the development of her horses, the ones she owns and trains, and the others she tends to in the barn.

"I don't have any long-term goals," she said. "The only goal is that any horse who comes into my care, I want to do right by the horse, and I want to help them improve. I have a small barn and I am able to devote more time to them. I want to see them do the best that they can. I think it's about pushing my boundaries a little bit, but always taking care of the horses. I'm new to the game, but I try to provide my horses with whatever they need to be able to be their best. This starts with a carefully developed and extensive nutrition program. We take care of the horses, and they take care of us."

For Kanak, it is always about doing right by her horses.

Which is why she doesn't use wins as the ultimate barometer for personal success.

"I have no specific targets that I chase," Kanak said. "I want to work with each horse, to bring out the best in them, and whatever that happens to be, we can share that success together."

'Fame' and 'Believe' look to dominate Inter Dominion

The superstars are holding this Inter Dominion together.

Down Under harness racing's most historic and iconic event is looking decidedly thin and debate rages over the time of

year it is held and the disappointingly low prize money levels compared to both years gone by and other major races.

But one that can elevate any racing event is star power and the upcoming Brisbane Inter Dominion certainly has its share of that – in both the pacing and trotting divisions.

Local hero Leap To Fame, who has shown signs of being the sport's next big thing, is almost a dream headline act in the pacing series.

On the trotting side of things, it's all about Just Believe, who is back home and firing after a mid-year trip to Sweden which gained him serious international credibility.

The great thing about the Inter Dominion is how often we get to see the stars race. It consists of a compulsory three rounds of qualifying heats into a Grand Final for the top points earners.

This year the whole series is at Albion Park, affectionally known as "The Creek." It starts on Friday (Dec. 1). The other heats are Tuesday (Dec. 5) and Saturday (Dec. 9) ahead of the Grand Finals on Saturday (Dec. 16).

Leap To Fame and Just Believe are the "poster boys" of it all so let's delve into them a little more.



LEAP TO FAME

This 4-year-old is the rock star of the sport.

Sure, he's hit a few hurdles with recent defeats in races like the TAB Eureka, Blacks A Fake and Victoria, but it's only served to underline how hard it is — especially Down Under — to step from racing your own age into the open-aged big league.

In each of those high-profile defeats, Leap To Fame has endured the hardest race (outside the leader), been without a doubt the run of the race and gone down fighting.

He's still banked almost \$1 million this season from 12 starts for eight wins, two seconds and a third.

This is the perfect stage for him to farewell his first season in the big league.

It's his own backyard at Albion Park in Brisbane and his trainer/driver Grant Dixon gets his well-deserved and overdue opportunity to add one of Down Under's marquee races to his impressively, but largely Queensland-based CV.

Dixon, 51, has driven almost 5,200 winners, including 20 at the Group 1 level.

"Obviously it's something I'd love to do," he said. "I haven't won one of those really big Group 1 races you dream of achieving in the game. In some ways it's part of being in Queensland, rather than the biggest traditional states like NSW and Victoria, and while I've had some nice horses that have taken me into some of those races, Leap To Fame is that next level up.

"He's the horse any trainer would dream of getting and I'm just so fortunate he's coming along, especially at this stage of my career."

Dixon has driven in four Inter Dominion pacing finals, but not finished better than seventh with Atomic Ark in 2010. The others were: I Am Sam (10th in 2009); Devil Dodger (10th in 2013) and Majestic Mach (12th in 2015).

"I guess it adds a bit to it, having a chance of winning an Inter Dominion at home, but I'd be happy to win one anywhere," Dixon said. "My dream was always to win at Moonee Valley [Melbourne] or Harold Park [Sydney] back in the day. I just thought the best Inter Dominion at those tracks and the atmosphere of them was something else."

Dixon can't fault Leap To Fame's preparation for the series.

"I know he's had a few tough runs recently, but we deliberately gave him a quiet start to the year and missed a race like the Miracle Mile [in March] with a view to this busy last five months or so of the year," he said. "He's come through his win a couple of weeks ago well. I could've run him again this week but didn't think he needed it after running such a quick time [track record] in that latest run.

JUST BELIEVE

When trainers Jess Tubbs and Greg Sugars dared to take Just Believe across to the famed Elitloppet earlier this year, he was considered a bit of a "token Aussie invite" by many Europeans.

That's fair given Aussie and Kiwi trotters at the Elitloppet had barely caused a ripple in years gone by.

But Just Believe silenced the doubters.

After being checked and breaking then losing all chance in his Elitloppet heat, the 7-year-old then produced fantastic placings in his other two Group 1 Swedish races.

The last of them being when he did all the work and sat parked, but dared to push local pin-up trotter Francesco Zet to the wire with an outstanding race for second.

The Swedes had gone from scoffing at Just Believe, to pleading with Sugars and Tubbs to keep him in the country longer.

But home he went.

After quarantine stints in Germany and back home in Australia, Just Believe had a spell and Tubbs and Sugars set their sights on one thing, defending his Inter Dominion crown in Brisbane.

"We thought it could be a challenge to get him back up, but it's been quite the opposite," Sugars said. "He came to hand quickly and really strongly. Everything at home told us he was at least as good, maybe a touch better, than he was before he went to Sweden."

And that's just how Just Believe looked winning his first and only lead-up race for the Inter Dominion at Bendigo last Friday week. He smashed the track record and seemed to win with plenty in the tank, despite not having raced since June 17 in Sweden.

Champion Aussie trotting trainer Chris Lang, who took Sundons Gift across for the 2009 Elitlopp, wasn't surprised with Just Believe's sparkling return.

"This could be history repeating itself," Lang said. "When I took Sundons Gift across he was a lovely horse, but when he came home, he just went to another level and was almost unbeatable for the next 18 months.

"Like Just Believe, Sundons Gift won the Inter Dominion before he left and came back to win it again, albeit much easier than the first one. I came back a better trainer and he came back a better horse. He was just bigger, better and stronger."

Lang has a big opinion of his 5-year-old trotter Ollivici, but concedes he is probably running for minor money in Brisbane.


"All of Just Believe's opposition, not just me, got a bit of a reality check watching him win and really just jog-in last week," he


said. "I think Ollivici will struggle to beat him, but I'm hoping this trip could be the making of him and we could bridge the gap over the next 12 months."

The other big player in the trotting series is 5-year-old mare Queen Elida, who has won 12 of her previous 13 starts before having to settle for second behind Just Believe last Friday week.

"She's an awesome [mare] Queen Elida, but she hasn't had Just Believe to contend with and he just looks superior to everything at the moment," Lang said.

To say that my guesses were way off the mark would be a gross understatement. Whereas the totals for my Day 1 predictions were way over the amounts actually realized, my predictions for both Days 2 and 3 were both under the amounts bid and closer to those of the amounts received on Day 1.

I thought it would be rather incomplete if I did not follow through on my guesses for Days 2 and 3. Speaking in general terms I was far more accurate, both in my guesses for individuals and in the total for each session. I must admit the bar I was facing was extremely easy as in all the many years I have been doing this, I have never been so far off in my guesses. Not that it's an adequate excuse, but it's important to recognize that the guesses are based upon each of the yearlings being considered as having acceptable to good conformation.

How Black Beauty transformed world opinion about horses

Anna Sewell was dying. Born in 1820 in Norfolk, England, she suffered a lifelong disability because of a childhood ankle injury and various illnesses. At age 52, the doctor pronounced Anna a "troublesome case." He told his patient and her mother that Anna would not live another two years.

Another factor exacerbated Anna's prognosis of more pain and suffering: she would not be able to drive her pony chaise nor easily visit her beloved horses. In these dark hours, she turned to writing to give the remainder of her life purpose. Writing was an integral part of life for several members of her family. Anna would now pick up her pen and, "From time to time, as I was able, I have been writing what I think will turn out to be a little book, its special aim to induce kindness, sympathy and an understanding treatment of horses."

And she did. Toward the end of the book and her life, Anna could only jot down a few notes on paper and dictate directions to her mother. Once upon a time, Anna had read and helped edit for her mother, Mary Sewell, a fine writer. Now, they reversed roles. Mary edited and transcribed Anna's story and shepherded the book to publication.

Anna's little book, the only book she would write, was unique. Her perspective was straight from the horse's mouth, likely based on Bess, a spunky family horse. While other novels attributed human qualities to animals, Anna pushed the genre. Instead of merely attributing human characteristics to the horse, Anna created a horse who walked and talked like a horse, allowing the reader to slip into the horse's mind. The unmistakable message for the reader is empathy, which leads to kindness toward horses and all animals.

Today, kindness to horses is ordinary, and cruelty is abnormal. Two centuries ago, cruelty toward animals was a different story.

Reading about various cruelties from the point of view of a temperamental chestnut mare named Ginger makes the story come to life. For example, a common practice of using Bering reins to hold up a horse's head and make it appear more majestic feels different and more robust when it is personal.

"You have two bits instead of one, and mine was sharp. It hurt my tongue and my jaw, and the blood from my tongue colored the froth from my lips as I chaffed and fretted. Besides the soreness in my mouth and the pain in my neck, the bearing reins always made my windpipe feel bad, and if I had stopped there for long, I know it would have spoiled my breathing."

Five months before Anna died in April of 1878, her mother, Mary, a noted author, showed the manuscript to one of her publishers, Mr. Tillyard, and asked for his opinion on "This little thing of my daughter's." The publisher was not overly impressed, but Mary was a well-regarded author. So, perhaps to be polite and sensitive to her terminally ill daughter, he offered a minimum of 20 pounds and arranged a small first printing.

Little did he know, this book, almost a vanity project, reached the publishing pantheon and remains a classic. More than 50 million copies have been sold in 50 languages, making the book one of the most popular in history. Black Beauty, His Grooms & Companions – the Autobiography of a Horse Translated from the Original Equine (yes, that is the full title) has charmed untold millions of readers, but the book also had a purpose. The book's publication changed attitudes about the treatment of animals and led to the enactment of laws, such as outlawing the Bering rein, that improved the treatment of animals. The story remains a touchstone for anti-animal cruelty crusaders.

A recently released book with another long title, *Writing Black Beauty (Anna Sewell, the Creation of a Novel, and the Story of Animal Rights)* by Celia Brayfield, is much more than a standard biography. In addition to telling a little-known story of an extraordinary woman who authored a heartwarming tale, Brayfield walks readers through many fields of interest: writing, publishing, business, Quakers, life in England during the 1800s, horses, horsemanship, and social conditions.

Many people believe that *Black Beauty* is a children's book. Of course, it "could" be a children's book, but Anna aimed to write an adult book about preventing unjust animal and social conditions. As the holidays approach, perhaps you could try a daily double, read or reread *Black Beauty*, and find a copy of this new book that tells the story behind the origin of the equine classic.





Twin B Joe Fresh blasts by older rivals to win FanDuel Championship

In the compact combat of a five-horse field, driver Dexter Dunn coasted mid-stretch with **Twin B Joe Fresh** to make the filly the first 3-year-old to win the \$175,000 FanDuel Championship Open Mares Pace on Saturday (Nov. 25) at The Meadowlands in 1:50.2.

Racine Bell, Twin B Joe Fresh and Mikala left quickly to dispute the early lead. Mikala (driven by George Brennan) pushed hard to take the lead with Racine Bell and favorite Twin B Joe Fresh settling on the pylons in third. Max Contact and Boudoir Hanover marched fourth and fifth, respectively.

Mikala was all-out to keep the lead, clocking the first half in :56.1 without movement from the others. She cut three-quarters in 1:25 as Twin B Joe Fresh eased off the pylons in a move to catch her older opponent. Mikala was caught easily as Twin B Joe Fresh rolled freely and broke the beam in 1:50.2, winning by 2-1/4 lengths.

Shooting well off the pace five-wide, 26-1 shot Boudoir Hanover (Todd McCarthy) had much left to eclipse Max Contract's late appearance. Boudoir Hanover finished second by a neck over Max Contract (Andy Miller). Racine Belle took fourth and Mikala finished last after rating the early pace.

Trainer Chris Ryder said he was "impressed at the list of past winners," considering Twin B Joe Fresh beat elders in the event.

"I was a bit concerned at the half when she was still in third," he said, "but I knew she's got speed and she's got a good brush and is so good up the straight."

"She's pretty sharp," Dunn said about the victory over older mares. "[But it was] tough work against a strong field."

Ryder and Dunn own Twin B Joe Fresh, a daughter of Roll With Joe—Fresh Breeze, with Peter Trebotica and Barry Spak. This was the 11th win in 16 starts at 3 for Twin B Joe Fresh, who has now earned \$1,440,203.

Twin B Joe Fresh paid \$3.80 to win.

Karl crushes in Valley Victory, becomes millionaire

Karl completed his 2-year-old season in high style on Saturday night (Nov. 25), capturing the \$432,000 Valley Victory final at The Meadowlands in handy fashion. With Yannick Gingras in the bike, the Nancy Takter-trained son of Tactical Landing—Avalicious completed the mile in 1:52.1 and scored his ninth win in 10 career starts.

Daiquiri Hanover and Åke Svanstedt blasted from the gate to take control into the first turn as Gingras and Karl were more measured — leaving but not advancing hard — on the opening bend. Karl had a chance to drop in third on the first turn, but Gingras wanted no part and effortlessly secured the front just past the :27.4 opening fraction.

Sent off as the 1-20 favorite, Karl got the respect one would expect once in front and easily carved out fractions of :56 and

1:24.3 during the middle half with no pressure and even less urging from the pilot. There were no anxious moments at all for Gingras, although Svanstedt looked to tip Daiquiri Hanover out of the pocket in mid-stretch but found that effort futile in short order. With a :27.3 final quarter and Gingras motionless, Karl crossed the wire a dominant winner. Daiquiri Hanover was easily second, 3 lengths behind, with Winter Soldier rallying along the pylons for the third spot.

Owned by Christina and Nancy Takter, Black Horse Racing, Crawford Farms Racing and Bender Sweden, Karl became the second 2-year-old trotter to go over the \$1 million mark this season, reaching seven figures along with T C I with Saturday's victory. As the heaviest possible favorite, Karl paid \$2.10 to win and keyed an \$5.20 exacta with Daiquiri Hanover second and a \$12.80 trifecta with Winter Soldier on the ticket.

"He's got the kind of gears that not many horses have," said Gingras about the enormous ability Karl possesses.

Trainer Takter's dad, Hall of Famer Jimmy Takter, trained Karl's sire, Tactical Landing, and Nancy trained a pair by that stallion this season.

"I only have two, but they're very nice ones," Nancy said, referring to both Karl and Hambletonian champion Tactical Approach. "He does his work easily. He's very smart, a brilliant horse."

The 1:52.1 effort shaved a fifth of a second off the previous Valley Victory mark, set a year ago by Volume Eight.

Odds-on choice **Jiggy Jog S** reaffirmed her spot atop the divisional throne with a facile victory in a final-quarter sprint to take the \$175,000 FanDuel Championship for trotting mares on Saturday night (Nov. 25) at The Meadowlands.

Driver Dexter Dunn floated Jiggy Jog S off the wings while her stablemate Bond bolted for the front into the first turn. M-M's Dream pushed to sit the pocket from the pylon post and angled off the pegs through a :27.4 first quarter before opting to tuck back behind Bond into the backstretch. Through the

skirmish, Dunn landed Jiggy Jog S in third and stayed steady while Bond slowed to a :57.2 half.

Bond maintained a tepid tempo through the final turn, which prompted M-M's Dream to pull outside and start digging into the leader. Jiggy Jog S perched onto her cover and swelled through three-quarters in 1:27 until Dunn released her in the straightaway. Bond accelerated into the stretch, but Jiggy Jog S came barreling after her and collared her stablemate within the final eighth before drawing clear to a two-length win in 1:53.1. M-M's Dream settled for third with Raised By Lindy taking fourth.

"The pace wasn't fast," Dunn said, "but we were close enough to the speed and I don't think there are as many trotters that have got a turn of foot like she does. We got a good helmet around the last turn, and once I moved her off, she showed speed.

"I've been so lucky to drive some top trotting mares. A couple got retired, and then she came along and she's a pleasure to drive. She's versatile, quick, and makes my job easy."

Jiggy Jog S has now won 18 times from 35 starts and banked \$2,166,279 for owner Jorgen Sparredal Inc. Åke Svanstedt trains the 4-year-old daughter of Walner—Hot Mess Hanover who paid \$2.60 to win.

Caviart Belle staves off Crown champ, wins Three Diamonds

Caviart Belle took the lead on the backstretch and held off 1-9 favorite My Girl EJ in the lane to win Saturday's (Nov. 25) \$376,000 Three Diamonds, for 2-year-old female pacers, by a neck in 1:50.3 at The Meadowlands. Miraculous Deo finished third.

Sarasota Hanover and Miraculous Deo left quickly at the start, from posts 8 and 9, respectively, while Caviart Belle and driver Yannick Gingras were third on the first turn from post 3. Sarasota Hanover led to the opening quarter in :27.1, but Caviart Belle already was on the move to the front and took the field to the half in :55.4 and three-quarters in 1:23.

Breeders Crown champion My Girl EJ had started a first-over move from fourth prior to the halfway point and was second entering the stretch, but she was unable to overtake Caviart Belle, who was racing for the first time since winning the Kindergarten Classic Series final on Nov. 4 at The Meadowlands.

"She didn't feel quite as sharp in the post parade; three weeks ago, in the Kindergarten final, she was kind of dragging me around in the post parade and felt so sharp," Gingras said. "Tonight, she wasn't quite like that. But she's a really tough filly and it seemed like the move to make at the time [to go to the front], but she needed the wire. All those fillies needed the wire.

"The last place I wanted to be was on the front. She can get it done on the front — she's a good filly — but I don't think it's her best game. If she can have live cover like she did in the Kindergarten final, she can just smoke for a quarter; she is just so fast. But that's just the way it worked out."

Nancy Takter trains Caviart Belle for owner Caviart Farms. The daughter of Captaintreacherous—Eloquent Grace was bred by Hanover Shoe Farms. She has won seven of 13 races this year and earned more than \$450,000.

Sent off as the 7-2 second choice, Caviart Belle paid \$9.60 to win.



Pizzelle shuts down division foes in Goldsmith Maid

Ten top 2-year-old filly trotters crowded the two-turn battle of the \$428,000 Goldsmith Maid on Saturday night (Nov. 25) at The Meadowlands, with **Pizzelle** delivering a mild upset. Andrew McCarthy drove the daughter of Walner—Biscotti to victory in 1:54.

Pizzelle did not get a call most of the race, racing toward the back of the pack while Sambuca Hanover (David Miller) revved to the early lead over co-favorite R Melina (Dexter Dunn). Also in the forefront were French Champagne and co-favorite Soiree Hanover (Tim Tetrick) followed by Honey Sweet and Glamorous Hanover. The field trotted unhurried through a soft first quarter of :28 before R Melina opened the second panel with a rush to the top over Sambuca

Hanover. The top three remained in those spots hitting the half in :57.2.

Sitting in third, Tetrick held tight as Sambuca Hanover took three gallops approaching three-quarters and was able to get her back on stride by three-quarters in 1:25.2. Sambuca Hanover's recovery created a duel with her co-favorite as inside trotters stalled. Down the stretch, however, the farthest path to the wire proved to be the fastest lane as McCarthy flew freely with Pizzelle to pass the dueling duo and hit the wire in 1:54, winning by 1-1/4 lengths.

Sambuca Hanover, at 12-1, survived an inquiry for the missteps and held for second. R Melina captured the show spot.

"She's been good all year," McCarthy said when asked how he felt approaching the stretch while second to last in the big field. "I was going to try to catch cover because the middle half was good and I still wasn't sure at the head of the stretch."

"She was sick for a bit and took a few weeks off," said Noel Daley, who trains Pizzelle for Christopher Beaver and Donald Robinson. "We didn't do anything with her."

Was Daley worried she was second to last into the stretch?

"I saw we were in a bit of trouble there, but I know she can sprint," as she did when it counted most.

It was Pizzelle's third victory in 13 starts at 2. She raised her earnings to \$315,850 while setting a lifetime mark, and she paid \$14.40 to win.





Captain Luke stalks, soars to Governor's Cup score

Captain Luke and driver Todd McCarthy found room along the pylons at the top of the stretch and finished powerfully to capture the \$454,000 Governor's Cup, for 2-year-old pacing colts and geldings, Saturday night (Nov. 25) at The Meadowlands. The son of Captaintreacherous—Bodacious Hanover completed the mile in 1:51, giving trainer Tony Alagna back-to-back Cup's, following El Rey's victory in 2022.

McCarthy got away quickly from post 2 and forced Newsroom into a hole in the first turn. Second choice Lou Vuitton and driver Tim Tetrick marched up and took control past the :27.3 opening quarter, leaving Captain Luke in the pocket.

The pace slowed in the second quarter as Newsroom headed to the outside but kept position as Tetrick and Lou Vuitton hit the half in a comfortable :56. The pace picked up as Newsroom and David Miller marched up strongly in the third quarter, followed by Maxim Hanover and Its Saturday Night in the second- and third-over positions.

Lou Vuitton was still on the lead through three-quarters in 1:24.1, but turning into the homestretch, he bore off the pylons, allowing McCarthy and Captain Luke full clearance. That opening was all Captain Luke needed as he quickly took advantage and opened significant ground on the closers, winning by 2-1/2 lengths. Its Saturday Night and Marcus Miller finished with the most pace, coming wide to secure the second spot, while Maxim Hanover was outkicked but settled for third.

"He's a little green," said McCarthy of Captain Luke. "He's got a great attitude and he's starting to put it all together."

Owned by Robert LeBlanc, Pryde Stables Inc., Bradley Grant and Steven Head, Captain Luke was a winner for just the second time in 12 career starts with both coming after the addition of Lasix. He has earned \$332,109 to date.

As the 7-5 betting favorite, Captain Luke returned \$4.80 to win; the exacta, including Its Saturday Night, returned \$73.20; and the trifecta, with Maxim Hanover, was worth \$303.20.

"He was an immature colt that we had a lot of expectations for," said Alagna of Captain Luke. "I'm expecting big things from this horse next year."

Captain Luke was bred by Vieux Carré Farms.

Southwind Tyrion storms clear in FanDuel Championship Open Trot

On the heels of his Breeders Crown victory, Åke Svanstedt trainee **Southwind Tyrion** showed only dirt and dust to his pursuers with a blowout win in the \$350,000 FanDuel Championship Open Trot at The Meadowlands on Saturday night (Nov. 25).

Trainer/driver Svanstedt sped to the lead with Southwind Tyrion to a :27 first quarter while It's Academic settled into the pocket ahead of Rattle My Cage in third. Svanstedt snuck a slight breather as the field stayed stagnant up the backside and clicked past the half in :55.3 before a two-wide charge got underway.

Tactical Approach pulled first to the final turn and rushed along the rim. It's Academic soon pulled the pocket and supplied cover while upping pressure on Southwind Tyrion marching towards three-quarters. Once past three-quarters in 1:23.4, with Rattle My Cage jumping stride at the inside and Alrajah One IT making a break from fourth-over, Southwind Tyrion fled the scene. He widened his advantage from stride to stride in the closing eighth to clock a 1:51 win by 3-1/2 lengths. Tactical Approach, in his final race, finished second. It's Academic took third and Take All Comers finished fourth.

"He raced good last time in the Breeders Crown also, but he's been becoming better and better the last two or three months," Svanstedt said. "I am a little surprised he can beat the best horses. He did good."

A 5-year-old stallion by Muscle Hill—Taylor Jean, Southwind Tyrion has now won 13 races from 25 starts and earned \$984,623 for owners S R F Stable, Åke Svanstedt, Knutsson Trotting, Brittany Farms & Riverview Racing. He paid \$7.60, and Svanstedt said the stallion will likely return to race next year.

Meanwhile, Tactical Approach will make his way from the racetrack to the breeding shed following his runner-up performance against older foes. Nancy Takter trained the millionaire son of Tactical Landing, who retires with 12 victories from 24 starts, including his surprise win in the \$1-million Hambletonian earlier this year.

"I'm honestly proud of the way he finished off the year, even tonight's race," Tactical Approach's driver, Scott Zeron, said. "He's done it every which way. I learned the hard way putting him on front one too many times with such a great group of 3-year-old trotters to race against. After I stopped doing all the dirty work, he started respecting it and it paid off.

Tactical Approach's trainer, Nancy Takter, said during his retirement ceremony, "Once he finally learned how to race, he was really starting to grow into his own. He's about at 85 per cent of his development still, so it would've been nice to see him next year. I don't think we got to see the best of him. He has an amazing stride and covers so much ground, and then he just has the determination to win. He's been in a lot of spots where horses shouldn't win from... to be able to sprint with such a big stride in such a short amount of track and get it done is just amazing."

Tactical Approach will stand stud at Diamond Creek Farm of Pennsylvania in 2024.

Allywag Hanover upsets in FanDuel; Confederate eighth

Allywag Hanover used a pocket trip to spring a 17-1 upset in Saturday's (Nov. 25) \$350,000 FanDuel Open Pace Championship, overtaking 4-5 favorite Bythemissal in deep stretch to win by a neck in 1:49.1 at The Meadowlands. Abuckabett Hanover finished third.

Confederate, the lone 3-year-old in the race and 6-5 second choice in the betting, finished eighth after a first-over charge from the half-mile point. The colt, who was retired in a ceremony following the race, was within a length of pace-setting Bythemissal at three-quarters but could get no closer.

Allywag Hanover, trained by Brett Pelling and driven by Todd McCarthy, won the event for the second time in his career. He captured his first title in 2021, when the race was known as the TVG Championship.

"He's just a great horse; he really is," Pelling said. "He's great-gaited, he follows speed really well, and he's honest. When he's on his game, he's as honest as they come."

Allywag Hanover took the lead from post 6 and guided the field to a :27.1 opening quarter. Bythemissal gained control from there and reached the half in :55.2 and three-quarters in 1:23. Confederate, who brought an 11-race win streak to the FanDuel and is the sport's No. 1-ranked horse, started from post 9 and was fourth through the first half of the race before making his move against Bythemissal.

"He did a lot of work early," said Pelling, who also trains Confederate. "The third quarter was strong; he tried to bowl into it. It's a 3-year-old racing against big boys."

Allywag Hanover, a son of Captaintreacherous—Anderosa Hanover bred by Hanover Shoe Farms, is owned by the Allywag Stable. The 6-year-old gelding won for the fourth time in 17 races this year and 28th time in 71 career starts. He has earned \$2.25 million lifetime.

He paid \$36.60 to win.

"He is the ultimate warhorse and he showed it tonight," said Adam Bowden, of the Allywag Stable ownership group. "He's great.

"That was the perfect trip for him: leave hard, find a spot, and then finish strong at the end."

Bowden's Diamond Creek Racing also owns the homebred Confederate, who won 13 of 15 races this season and earned \$1.63 million. His victories this year included the Meadowlands Pace and Breeders Crown, and his best win time of 1:46.1 is history's fastest for a 3-year-old pacer.

For his career, the son of Sweet Lou—Geothermal captured 18 of 22 starts and banked more than \$2 million.

"Confederate had the magic season, and we took a chance here [in the FanDuel] and it didn't work out," Bowden said. "But he's still great in our book."

Confederate's driver, Tim Tetrick, added, "He's a cool dude. It's hard to find that kind, and it's very hard to replace them. He's been very special.

"He's been great all year. Today, he had a little hiccup, but it's tough against those 5-, 6-, 7-year-old warhorses. He got beat, but he raced good, he raced hard. Bad drive, 26 [seconds] in the third quarter trying to get into the race, and I had to go wide to get into the race on the first turn. Nine-holes are tough. Sometimes they're daggers."

Also retired during a ceremony following the FanDuel Open Pace Championship was 6-year-old stallion Tattoo Artist, who finished fourth. Tattoo Artist won 40 of 95 career races and \$2.8 million. He was trained by Dr. Ian Moore in Canada and Chris Ryder in the U.S. for owners Let It Ride Stables, Bottom Line Racing and Frank Cannon.

"What can you say, he's been a beast," Cannon said. "He's raced for five years now, on all-sized tracks, taken on all comers. I want to do a shout-out to my partners, Eric Cherry and Dana Parham. We've had a great ride with Tattoo, and we think he's going to be quite a showcase in the stallion barn."

The 2023 Indiana Sires Stakes 3-year-old trotting colt champion, **Helpfirstedition** was also back in the winner's circle capturing his split of the Thanksgiving Classic action.

The 3-year-old trotting fillies kicked-off the stakes action for the evening and it was **Believe U Me** and driver John DeLong who converted a pocket trip into a 1:54.2 score. Using a :27.1 closing kick, Believe U Me tracked down the pace-setting Helpoftheseason and driver Peter Wrenn to get the win by nearly 2 lengths. Helpoftheseason settled for second while Foolish Games and Marvin Luna rallied well late for third. Sent off as the heavy betting favorite, Believe U Me returned \$4.60 for the victory.

Trained by Ron Burke, the daughter of Muscle Mass—I Believe captured her seventh win of the season and second straight Hoosier Park victory. Owned by W J Donovan, Believe U Me pushed her career earnings to \$319,228.

Helpfirstedition utilized similar tactics in the very next division, turning a pocket trip into a 1:53.4 score. French Wine and driver Andy Miller dictated fractions of :27.1.:58.1 and 1:27.2 without ever feeling a threat from the rest of the field. Turning for home, French Wine looked strong on the front but Helpfirstedition was winding up in the pocket. Using a :26 closing quarter, Helpfirstedition was able to track down a game French Wine and put a nose in front at the wire.

Helpfirstedition notched his ninth win from 23 starts this season. With the second-place finish, French Wine became the sport's newest millionaire and will now be retired to stand stud at Winterwood Farms in Ohio.

Helpfirstedition is trained by Missy Essig and owned in partnership by E. Wickey, J. Graber, Running Wild Stables and J. Schmucker. The gelded son of Helpisontheway—She Knows Swagger pushed his lifetime bankroll to \$446,595.

In the next division, it was Coach Stefanos who continued his winning ways with another impressive victory. With regular pilot Trace Tetrick in the bike, Coach Stefanos utilized his customary late rally, a :25.3 closing quarter to be exact, to get the victory by nearly 2 lengths and stop the timer in 1:50.1. It was the third-straight victory and fourth win in the last five starts for the Erv Miller trainee. The victory was also one of six victories on the evening for Harrah's Hoosier Park's leading driver, Trace Tetrick.

The gelded son of Tellitlikeitis—Watch N Be Watched has now won nine of 17 starts this season while bankrolling \$565,365 in purse earnings. Coach Stefanos is owned in partnership by K.W. Duffy, D&M Trading II LLC and Mr.J. Chris Stefanos and now sports a lifetime bankroll of \$841,420.

The biggest upset of the evening came in the final division of the Thanksgiving Classic action as **Racin Hungry** and Peter Wrenn pulled the slight 6-1 upset in the 3-year-old pacing filly division. Rallying from off the pace, Racin Hungry put together a :26.3 closing quarter and held off a late surge from Let's Misbehave and Marvin Luna to get the win by a head in 1:52.3.

Trained by Jennifer Bongiorno, the daughter of Stay Hungry—Four Stars Meliss scored her seventh win from 17 seasonal starts. Owned in partnership by Glenn Goller and Stephen Demeter, Racin Hungry pushed her lifetime bankroll to \$212,051.
