Thomson said horse sales are his favorite part of the business. Here he is with owner Craig Henderson at this year's Lexington Selected Yearling Sale.

Does he own a breeding farm? Check. Not only one breeding farm, but together with his wife Joann, they own four of them in the states of Delaware, Maryland, New York and the province of Ontario.

Does he own a racing stable? Check. He and Joann have a significant number of horses in training and/or racing throughout the United States and Canada.

Let's speak of those areas in which you are involved in the sport. First, your ownership in The Red Mile.

"The Red Mile, of which I already owned a part, was in danger of going under. Bill Perretti organized a group of prominent people in the sport to buy it and salvage our most historical and beloved showplace. I was invited to participate with the new group and very gladly did so.

"At first glance it appeared to be a white elephant or as some people were wont to say, a rich man's toy. I didn't look upon it as such. Would there be an immediate return on our investment? Most likely not. But we were buying an asset, an extremely valuable entity, especially from a historical perspective. But it was also so, because of its long-term real estate value. The Red Mile property was composed of 137 acres right in the middle of downtown Lexington. The purchase also included the venerable Tattersalls Sale.

"Since then, several things have happened, almost all of them good, which made our venture extremely fortuitous. We entered into an agreement with Keeneland, the big dog in Lexington and perhaps the biggest dog in the Commonwealth of Kentucky. In the beginning, our partnership involved only simulcasting. Since then, we have acquired the right to have historical racing

machines at The Red Mile. This alone might have changed our enterprise from one bleeding money to one which puts us in the black.

"When we bought The Red Mile and Tattersalls, the sales company was at loggerheads with the rival Kentucky Standardbred Horse Sales Company. After a few years of fighting and feuding, sane heads prevailed and we jointly formed the Lexington Selected Yearling Sale, which almost immediately became the number one yearling sale in the world. Revenue from gaming, some might call it slots, has created the greatest impetus in breeding and racing in Kentucky, for both thoroughbreds and standardbreds that horse racing has ever seen. The status of Kentucky breeding and racing has

grown to the point where it is unquestionably number one in the entire world. New racetracks were born. People have been buying and developing breeding farms. More livestock is being raised here than ever before. Purses have grown. Perhaps we are approaching a point where if you do not have a Kentucky eligible yearling you may become significantly hurt at the sales.”

We touched upon the sales company aspect and your involvement in it. Is there anything further you'd like to comment on?

“It is a prime example that shows where working together is more beneficial to an entity than fighting within an industry is. Prior to the formation of Lexington Selected, Tattersalls and Kentucky Standardbred fought about just about everything – dates, horses and consignors being the most prominent. Since the evolution of Lexington Selected, we have become bar none, the number one standardbred yearling sale in the world. Everyone benefitted from the merger, perhaps chief among them were our customers who could enjoy the Lexington experience in one great week of racing and sales instead of often having to choose their dates by picking between the two sales companies.”

You and your wife Joann own breeding farms in Delaware, Maryland, New York and Ontario. Not only do you own these farms, but some might say that you are the number one breeder in all these areas, if you are not number one you are certainly among the best. How did this all begin?

“If I were picking a single instance, one might say it started with a horse owner by the name of Red Douds. Mr. Douds and I happened to be sitting next to each other on a flight. We got to talking about horse racing, specifically harness racing. In the

course of our conversation Red gave me some passes to the then flourishing Liberty Bell Park. I started going to the races and found that I really enjoyed them. I ended up buying a few horses and went to the sale at Harrisburg where I bought some more. At the time my partner in the financial services company in which I was involved was Ed Gold. Ed said that harness racing looked like great fun. He thought that he would like to also be a part of it. Together we started Whitehorse Farms. We went along with varying degrees of success for several years. Eventually the financial services company was sold to the great benefit of both Ed and I. Ed thought that Whitehorse had as large a presence in the business as he wanted. Perhaps he thought that we needed to “small down.” I felt differently.

“The decision was made to disperse all the Whitehorse holdings. The dispersal sale took place at Harrisburg. At about the same time the great thoroughbred farm Windfields came on the market. It was the home of the great, perhaps the greatest of all stallions Northern Dancer, who at one time stood at a fee of one million dollars. I might add, that with no live foal guarantee.

"Windfields, now Winbak Maryland became the hub of all our horse operations. Our Delaware Farm, which for all intents and purposes is a stallion station is close by. The mother farm covers around 2,500 acres and is the home to most of our mares (including about 75 retirees). It is also where we raise all of our yearlings under the supervision of Jimmy Ladwig, who has been with us for over 20 years.

"I would be remiss in not mentioning some of the other key members of our team which include, but are not limited to, our general manager Jack Burke, our racing manager and trainer Jeff Fout, the farm veterinarian Dr. Sarah Mackie, and her associate Becky Healey who look after all the horses and the managers of our Ontario farm Pat Woods and Noelle Duspriva in New York; our public relations and social media manager Elizabeth House and a young man named Jose Cantaro who started with us as a part-time employee from Mexico. Since then, he has risen through the ranks as Jimmy Ladwig's right hand man, to where he now is the foreman who oversees our farm employees. He is also our resident photographer.

"With regard to Mexico, I think that our farm would be nowhere without the government's H2A program through which we annually bring a group of Mexican nationals who work on the farms from January through November. They return to Mexico each November and come back in January often bringing relatives and friends with them. They are extremely hard-working individuals who are usually excellent around the horses. Getting quality help is a constant problem throughout the business. This program has been a huge benefit to us."

I have more than once said that of all the people I have known in the horse business, there is no one that enjoys a horse sale more than Joe Thomson. Would you agree with that assessment?

"Probably. I do love horse sales. I suppose most would say that I'm a people person. I'm also a horse person. I'm not sure which of the two I prefer. I guess it depends on the time and place. At a horse sale is where you get a confluence of people and horses. I love most everything about the sale. I love the anticipation leading up to them. I'm always proud of our offering. I love exposing our horses and I am extremely proud of the fruits of our labor and investment. In addition to selling yearlings, I also enjoy buying horses, most specifically broodmares and broodmares to be. At the mixed sale at Harrisburg, I station myself near the front where the bid spotters are always aware of my presence. I have no set formula when it comes to buying. I look for value. I want pedigree. I'm not opposed to buying an older mare of quality who may not have previously lived up to expectations."



How many horses do you own?

"The simple answer would probably be too many. At the end of the breeding season adding up mares, yearlings, babies, racehorses, stallions, retirees and some other breeds, it almost certainly exceeds a thousand. I guess I'm just a horse junkie who enjoys being around horses and the people who care for them."

Let's talk about racing. How many horses do you have in training and racing?

"Again, it's probably too many. I'm not sure of the exact number. They consist mostly of homebreds who I thought might not have brought what I believed to be a fair number at the sales. There are also those yearlings who may have been injured or were perhaps not in peak condition to have been offered in the sales. There are also those who a patron of the farm might have purchased and invited me in for a piece. I often will comply. We are fortunate in keeping the expenses down on the ones that we put into training by having our own training facility here on the farm and our own private trainer in Jeff Fout. What we usually do is we have Jeff break them and train them until they are ready to go to the races. We then send them to a few chosen trainers who race them."

"I see the lack of a viable middle market for yearlings as one of our greatest problems - at least from a breeder's perspective. I believe that the chief cause of this is that it is so expensive to train a horse nowadays. Everything from feed, to equipment, to shoeing - just about everything involved in training a horse has gone up in price, yet the purses have not or at least have not risen commensurate to what it costs to train one. Don't get me speaking about veterinarians and their bills! I've actually received invoices where the vet expenses exceed those of the rest of the training bill in its entirety. What's the answer? I cannot say as I know. One thing that has happened which I view as probably a good thing for owners and maybe not so good for breeders, is more and more fractional ownerships. It's good for the owners because it spreads the risk and the expense associated with training a horse. It probably hurts the breeder because it lessens the competition. Whereas before, you had multiple owners competing against each other in the sales ring. Now you have them pairing up, lessening the competition and subsequently the prices that the horses bring."

Horseman and restaurateur Sam Sergi remembered

*The owner of 2020 Mohawk Million starter
Tokyo Seelster died recently at the age of 81.*

When Saverio "Sam" Sergi died at Wilkes-Barre General Hospital in Pennsylvania on Oct. 29, 2024, the 81-year-old horseman left a double legacy. He founded Sergi's Italian Restaurant and Pizza, a family-owned and operated business that has been a Canton, NY landmark since 1966. Sergi also established a family farm and instilled a life-long love of harness racing in sons Mike and Pat. The younger generations also picked up Sam's love of the game: his grandson Antonio Vecchio drives at Rideau Carleton Raceway; Mike says his own kids "are not quite old enough yet" to do more than help around the barn, but "one of them definitely has horse fever."

Reached at Sergi's Restaurant Friday (Nov. 29), Pat told Harness Racing Update how his father initially became involved in racing.

"Honestly, he used to go to the races up there in Ottawa [Rideau Carleton]," Pat said. "I always heard him say when he had enough money, he was going to invest in one. Eventually. He would go to the races before he became an owner."

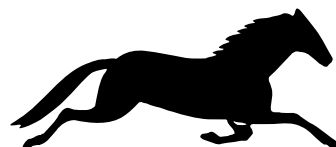

“He founded the restaurant, but he did not work too much there lately. My mother, Maria, was here most of the time. Sam spent most of the time with the horses lately, and for the last 25 years.”

Sergi’s Restaurant became popular, allowing Sam to pursue his true passion.

Mike is Sam’s youngest son.

“We didn’t work in the restaurants together, but we spent every day in the barn together,” Mike said of his father. “After college, I started coaching lacrosse and went on to a career outside of racing... Since I was little, I always loved the farm, so we were partners. We’ve had anywhere from one horse a year to a dozen at a time.”

When racehorse ownership became a reality, Sam was able to fulfill a boyhood dream.

“He came here from Italy when he was 17, and everybody there had a rural hobby, a couple goats, a couple cows,” Pat said. “He purchased his first horse, Clever Garland [10, 2:09.4h; \$12,999] from Garland Garnsey at the farm we own now. Garland Garnsey owned the farm in Canton, NY, at the time. His son was [1982 Goshen Hall of Fame inductee, trainer/driver] Glen Garnsey. We used to train there and when Garland’s kids wanted to sell the farm after he passed away, at least 35 years ago, my dad bought it.”

Mike recalled that another restaurant owner in Potsdam, NY, Angelo “Jalop” Fiacco, was Sam’s harness racing friend in the early days.

Rather than outsource breaking and training duties, Sam took care of them himself.

“Oh no, no, he liked to go [to the farm every day],” Pat said. “Anything local that he trained here, he loved to go, and that’s what he got up for in the morning. He never really did retire.”

Sam had wide-ranging involvement as a horse owner.

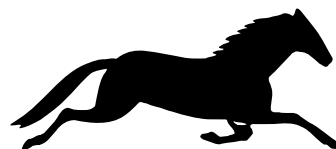

"We've done the racehorses; we like to try the yearlings, especially," Mike said. "He loved the horses. That was his only pastime. He didn't golf or anything. Dad never trained horses in Italy, but he grew up on a farm over there, raising his own beef cattle. He always wanted to be on a farm. He also liked raising his own beef cattle here."

The USTA records show that since 1992, horses trained by Sam recorded 332 wins from 2,545 starts. His last was with trotting mare Msfrannie (3, 1:56.4s; \$55,366) Sept. 5, 2024 at Rideau Carleton. Another Sergi-owned and trained trotter completed the exactor: Hatikvah (3, 1:53.2m; \$296,232).

Pat said his father owned, trained, and drove horses for a much longer time than shown in the online stats.

"Oh, for sure, since the '70s, because I can recall we've always had a bunch of them around," Pat said. "We would get them ready here and then send them to Toronto, if they were good enough."

Sam's horses raced at tracks throughout New York and Ontario. He drove at fairs from 1980–93 and in 1995, making 173 career starts as a driver and winning 24 of them at New York tracks like Plattsburgh, Sandy Creek, Gouverneur, Malone, Trumansburg, Fonda, and Dundee, as well as at Essex Junction, VT. "We have the local county fair circuit here in New York," said Mike, who still drives at the fairs. "My dad and I actually won our first races as drivers at Sandy Creek."

Developing racehorses, especially young trotters, was a welcome sideline to the restaurant business for Sam.

"We spent a lot of years at the farm," Pat said. "I enjoyed it. We had to get away from the restaurant for rest and relaxation. I would do that in the morning and then come here [to the restaurant] in the evening."

Sam enjoyed success over several decades with horses he owned, trained, and occasionally drove. Here Comes Mike (4, 1:55.4s; \$219,462) was an early high-achiever.

"Way back when, we had a horse called Here Comes Mike, named after Mike [Sergi], that we bred, broke, trained and raced," Pat said. "He trotted around :54 around 25 years ago, racing at Mohawk, Woodbine, Montreal, Rideau, Vernon... We even raced him at the county fairs to get him ready. He raced all over."

"Recently, we had Tokyo Seelster (5, 1:51.4s; \$376,939). Sam broke and trained him himself and got the miles on him. It was right around COVID time and our farm track isn't the best, so we sent him to Robbie Robinson at Rideau Carleton to get him ready to race."

Normally Sam and his sons would have continued working with the Kadabra–Tymal Timeout colt, but weather conditions were not on their side.

"In the winter here, it's icy," Pat said. "You have to put big caulks on them. We paid a lot of money for him, so we wanted to train him on a good surface."

Tokyo Seelster broke his maiden at first asking in a June 30, 2020 2-year-old conditioned race at Mohawk, with Robbie Robinson

in the sulky. The \$52,000 yearling won going away in his next two starts there, Ontario Sires Stakes Gold legs on July 9 and 30.

“We raced Tokyo Seelster in the Mohawk Million,” Pat said. “We didn’t do very good, but we were in it the first year it was offered.”

The Sergis’ colt found his way into the \$100,000 slot race because of an ongoing relationship with prominent owner Jeffrey Snyder.

“I met Jeff when I bought a mare out of Saratoga probably 15 years ago,” Mike said. “We stayed in touch a little bit. I saw that he had a slot, so I reached back out to him and we made some kind of deal.”

Tokyo Seelster finished eighth. The Sergis still found ways to celebrate.

“We couldn’t get across the border because it was COVID,” Mike said. “I bought a huge screen and we had a huge party in my backyard. As a family, we’ve had a lot of fun with the horses.”

Tokyo Seelster went back to Mohawk and trainer Richard Moreau in early 2023, coming into his own as he climbed the class ladder to the preferred 2 level. On June 26, 2023, he took his 1:51.4s lifetime mark. He hit the board in 17 of 35 starts that season, all at the track where he would spend the remainder of his career.

In Tokyo Seelster’s eighth start back at age 5, tragedy struck. Going off-stride in an early first-over bid June 10 at Mohawk, he was pulled up by driver James MacDonald. He did not finish.

“He broke a bone and he had to be put down,” Pat said.

Tokyo Seelster may have been the best, but he was not the first or last good horse to emerge from the Sergi Stable to race at Mohawk.

“Grammian [4, 1:55.3f; \$425,218] is one of them,” Pat said. “Lukes Vidalia [p, 3, 1:53.2s; \$192,982] –Vidalia, like the onion

– she was a good pacing mare. We raced her at Vernon, Rideau, and eventually she went to Mohawk.”

Mike said their “breakout horse” was a \$5,000 yearling from the 2007 Harrisburg sale: Bay Of Sharks (p, 7, 1:49.3s; \$528,093).

“I liked that he had a lot of things that other people didn’t like,” Mike said. “He had four white feet; a white eye; he was a ridgling. We had lots of fun with him. He took us to some different places that we hadn’t been before: the [2009] Confederation Cup, [2009] North America Cup, and even the [2009] Breeders Crown, when he finished fourth, parked the entire mile.”

As with other Sergi horses, Bay Of Sharks was a team effort.

“We picked him up at the sale, and we all broke him at the farm – me, my dad, Mike,” Pat said. “We bred a lot of mares to him, mostly our own, and raised a few colts.”

They also bought Bay Of Sharks’ Royal Mattjesty half-sister, Bay Girl (p, 3, 1:50s; \$576,130), for \$7,000 at the 2008 Forest City yearling sale. She went back-to-back in the 2010 Canadian Breeders Stake elimination and final at Mohawk.

“That was her biggest win, and she was probably the best that we had for earnings,” Mike said.

Winning at Woodbine Mohawk Park was always special to Sam. In the month since his passing, two of his horses have stepped up with victories there, Nov. 18 and 25 for trainer Robert Kyle Fellows.

“Oh yeah, we’ve still got a few racing,” Pat said. “Recently we have wins with Bella Cavalla [5, 1:53s; \$241,000] and Sounds Good [p, 3, 1:50.4s; \$193,168] at Mohawk. Sounds Good won the [2022] Battle of Waterloo for my dad, that was probably the biggest win, for both of them.”

Friday (Nov. 29) was a significant date for the Sergi family.

“We had a 30-Day Mass for my dad,” Mike said. “That was tonight.”

Active in racing to the end, Sam will be remembered that way by those who knew and loved him.

“He jogged and trained the horses every day and did barn chores right until he went in the hospital,” Mike told HRU. “I’m going to keep the farm going. I still have four horses there that I’m training, a couple at Mohawk, and a couple at Saratoga. I sent Msfrannie to Toronto.”

Mike added that a familiar song took on new meaning for him lately.

“I got listening to a country song one day about a guy and his dad,” he said. “I’d heard it before, but I happened to listen to it this time, and then I bought a mare, Make It Blue Chip, in foal to New York sire Back Of The Neck. The song is by John Michael Montgomery, ‘I Miss You A Little.’”

Mike said he plans to keep the foal and name it after the song’s title.

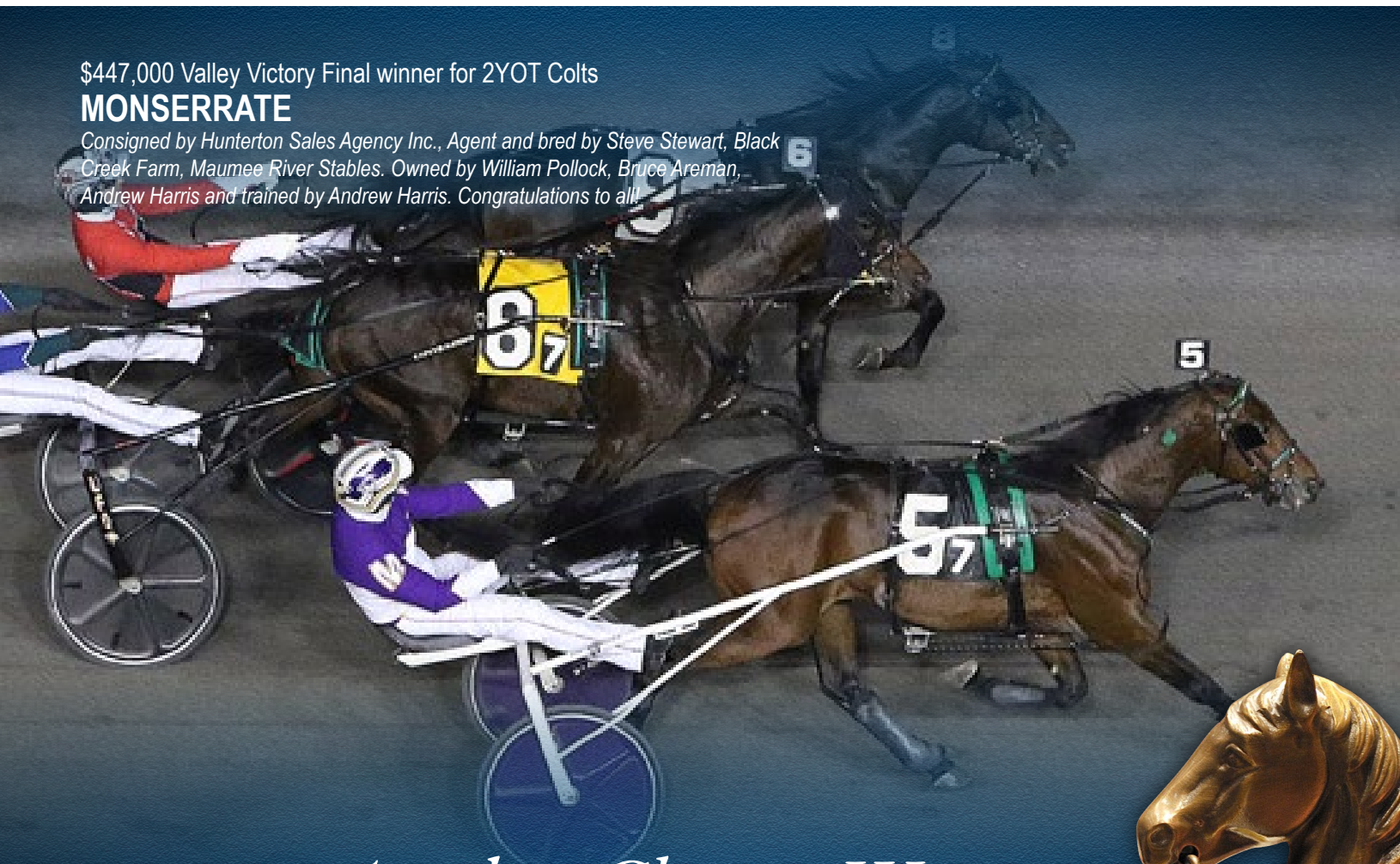

Driver Chris Alford turned back time on Inter Dominion opening night

by Adam Hamilton

Australia's most successful driver Chris Alford turned back the clock on opening night of the Inter Dominion at Newcastle last Friday (Nov. 29).

Alford, 56, is the only Down Under driver to top 8,000 careers wins and is poised to add to the two Inter Dominion titles he has won after partnering two dominant heat winners to launch the New South Wales series.

It was Alford's drive on the rejuvenated former Kiwi pacer **Cantfindabettorman** who had everyone talking.

When the pace slowed momentarily up front, Alford launched his horse like a rocket and blasted around the field to take the lead and effectively control the race.

Cantfindabettorman coasted home from there to win by almost five meters in a slick 1:53.9 mile rate for 2,030 meters.

"That was fun," Alford said with a laugh. "He's got a tremendous turn of speed and you often find in the early heats [of the Inter Dominion], drivers will try to get away with going as slowly as they can because the horses have the three races in that first week.

"They slowed-up quite noticeably, so I pulled the ripcord and he really picked up quickly. I was around them in no time and then, importantly, he relaxed beautifully again when I found the front.

"He's a real credit to Isabel and Pete [Walsh] this horse. He's really thrived in the few months since they took over training him. He's so versatile and that gave me the chance... He can win, he can win the final this horse. It's not a strong series with Leap To Fame and Swayzee missing. He's right up there with the rest of them."

An hour later, Alford was at it again.

This time in more traditional style by buzzing classy mare **Queen Elida** straight to the lead and dictating terms to his liking in front.

It was a real glimpse of the best Queen Elida, who has been mixing her form a little in recent months,

“Lil [trainer Brent Lilley] said she was primed and that’s how she felt,” Alford said. “She’s awesome when right and it’s great to have her back to her best.

“Like the pacers, with Just Believe out, this is a winnable final.”

Queen Elida has finished third to Just Believe in the past two Inter Dominion trotting finals, but the connections of Just Believe

opted to bypass a potential three-peat to focus on some big races in New Zealand in coming weeks.

If Alford’s Cantfindabettorman drive was the standout of the night, then Brad Hewitt was a close second aboard his classy 4-year-old **Captains Knock** to win the second pacing heat.

Like Alford, Hewitt dared to make a lightning midrace move, but he was unable to find the lead. The quicker thinker was able to angle into a one-out, one-back trail and despite spending that midrace petrol, Captains Knock still overpowered his rivals late to stamp himself as a major hope for the final.

The one they all have to beat in the pacing final is veteran WA star **Minstrel**, who gave [young driver Deni Roberts](#) an easy win at her first drive in an Inter Dominion series.

“He felt fantastic and did that so easily,” Roberts said. “The most exciting part was the speed he showed. He doesn’t get the chance to show that much back home around the small track at Gloucester Park, but I can’t wait for him to get to the big Menangle track [1,400 meters] come final time.

“He will thrive on the racing the old fella and should just keep improving as the series goes on. He’s never been better.”

While Queen Elida is a deserving favorite for the trotting final, things could change as the series goes on and depending on barrier draws.

Rejuvenated former top youngster **The Locomotive** won his heat well and capped a great night for Hewitt, who also trained and drove Captains Knock.

The run of injury-plagued Victorian Plymouth Chubb to finish a close second after sitting parked outside The Locomotive was one of the best performances of the night.

Keayang Chucky, who finished third in that race, and Parisian Artiste, who was a solid second to Queen Elisa, also look right on target.

The Inter Dominion evolves quickly.

The second round of heats are at Bathurst on Wednesday night (Dec. 4), then it's over to Menangle for the third and final round of heats next Saturday.

The pacing and trotting finals are also at Menangle on Dec. 14.

While the Inter Dominion is playing out, the most exciting trotter Down Under, **Keayang Zahara**, continues to stretch her unbeaten streak.

The Victorian filly posted her 13th win, and a sixth at Group 1 level, in last Friday night's \$140,000 New Zealand Trotting Oaks in Christchurch.

She will be a commanding favorite to repeat the dose in next Friday night's \$200,000 New Zealand Trotting Derby.

Victory would take her close to \$700,000 in earnings and she only had her first start on April 3.

She's so dominant with horses her own age, trotting fans cannot wait to see her take on older ones, including the lofty benchmark that Just Believe is.

The earliest that could happen would be the \$600,000 TAB Trot slot race at Cambridge next April.

But trainer Marg Lee said that remained a big "if" with Keayang Zahara returning home for a lengthy spell after the Derby.

"It's a chance, but we're not even thinking about plans until we get her home and check her over," she said. "We're mindful she's come a very long way in her first racing campaign and a really good break now could be what's best for her."

Lee and son, Jason, will mix time in NZ with three runners in the Inter Dominion series, all trotters, in Keayang Chucky, Aldebaran Vera and Keayang Stuka.

"It's the busiest we've ever been with about 50 in work at home [Ecklin South in country Victoria], a team up in NSW for the Inter Dominion and 'Strawberry' [Keayang Zahara's stable name] in New Zealand," Jason said.

ALL OVER ONTARIO

Otis Hall enjoying farm-to-stable success

For trainer Otis Hall, the recipe to a career-best campaign doesn't require a convoluted combination of fancy tricks and techniques — all it takes is a handful of homegrown, high-quality ingredients.

"I don't set goals," said Hall. "Every horse in my barn right now is a homebred. As we're developing them and training them down, I get a read on what caliber I believe they are. Early in the season, I try to map out a path for them that I think will best suit them, and then I try to stick to that plan as best as possible. But obviously things change.

"So no, I don't have a goal for wins or numbers or anything like that. I just want the horses to be as competitive and consistent as they can be."

Consider it Hall's version of farm-to-stable success.

Couple that with an open mind, an emphasis on hard work, and a commitment to his craft, and the Ayr, ON-based conditioner is well positioned to uphold the standard set by his parents, Larry and Marilyn Hall, some 40-plus years ago.

In the late 1970s, when Otis was still a youngster, the elder Halls established a breeding outfit known as Sauble Hill Farms.

Having been involved with the operation from an early age, the junior Hall learned first-hand what matters most when running a successful barn.

Otis' chance to branch out and apply that knowledge came in 2002, when he and his wife Susan formed Nasussito Racing Inc. — a moniker that derives from their first names spelled backwards.

That upward ascent continued in 2005 when the duo purchased a farm of their own, in the Kitchener-Waterloo area, to raise and develop their horses.

Fast forward another 19 years to 2024, where Otis' expertise has been on full display in what's tracking to be one of his most prosperous seasons yet.

Headlined by a career-high wins total, Otis has led his charges to a 23-9-3 line to go along with nearly \$205,000 in purse earnings across 61 starts (as of Nov. 26).

All in an ode to his parents and the brand they built from the ground up.

"My parents, they're retiring now, so they're winding down," said Otis. "They are out of the breeding business, but I'm continuing to use the Sauble name with all of our homebreds."

Nasussito has more than managed to carry on the Sauble legacy with a modest barn that, as of now, features a half-dozen horses, all of which are pacers.

Included in the roster of six is 2-year-old colt Sauble Wilson, 3-year-old filly Sauble Lila, and 4-year-old Sauble Ace.

As Otis detailed, Sauble Wilson's journey started as a small, well-mannered neophyte with room to grow.

After qualifying well and catching the attention of his driver Bob McClure, Sauble Wilson entered and won his first start on June 25.

"I had a path for him at that point to stick with the [Ontario Sires Stakes] Grassroots program, and if he progressed well, we'd take a shot at the last Gold after the Grassroots final," Otis said.

"That's exactly what we ended up doing."

Although he tackled Crack Shot, who became the first horse ever to win a Grassroots and Gold championship in the same season, the son of Betterthancheddar — Performing Art delivered an exemplary rookie campaign for Nasussito (10 5-3-1 record with \$91,360 banked).

"Overall, we're really happy with him," said Otis. "He finished his year up strong, was never hurt, and he's put away healthy. In my mind that's a really good thing."

The bay's barn mate and half-sister, Sauble Lila, was a late foal that needed a little more seasoning before debuting as a 3-year-old.

"I don't chase accolades or awards. Sure, I'd love to be in the North America Cup or something like that someday, but it's a hard thing to do, right? I don't really strive for that. I just try to do the best with whatever we have at any given time, and I think hard work, good decisions, and doing what's right for the horse will carry you a long way."

Early in the season, I try to map out a path for them that I think will best suit them, and then I try to stick to that plan as best as possible. But obviously things change. ”

“Their mother [Performing Art] won the Super Final in 2013, she was a great Sires Stakes horse,” said Otis. “These two both have the potential to do some damage, and they’ve had a good year.”

Sauble Lila certainly benefited from the extra year, recording 12 wins from 24 starts for \$66,761 in purse earnings across her maiden voyage.

“She loves to race, and she’s just full of confidence right now,” he said. “I think there’s something to be said for that. When they’re doing well and they’re winning, the horses get confident and she’s an example of that right now.”

“She tries really hard.”

Sauble Ace, the elder statesman of the trio at 4 years old, has dealt with his fair share of minor issues but has shown a tenacious spirit en route to an 11-4-3 mark through 38 starts (\$131,492).

“We always thought he was going to be somewhat special,” Otis said. “He didn’t get started until late into his 2-year-old year, but he was flashing :26 last quarters and was one of the favorites in the 2022 Harvest final.”

“He sometimes has little breaks from racing, but he’s another one that likes his job, and he’s just a happy horse, and the family loves having him in the barn.”

Rounding out the Nasussito roster is Sauble Amelia, Sauble Ellie, and a yearling in Sauble Ambush.

Over the years, Otis and Susan have worked tirelessly to cultivate the family-oriented atmosphere that Larry and Marilyn instituted more than four decades ago.

And now it remains alive and well through their two children Melanie and Scott.

When they are not at university — Melanie at Dalhousie studying a Bachelor of Management program and Scott working on a Nuclear Engineering degree at Ontario Tech — both Hall kids remain actively involved in their parents’ Nasussito barn.

“[Melanie’s] home at least once a month, and then over the summer and Christmas break,” said Otis. “When she comes home, she jumps straight into the barn and gets things in order and looks after details that need to be looked after.”

“My son, Scott, he’s in a very demanding program right now, so he’s busy, but he’s usually home on weekends to assist in the barn.”

Also in the mix is the Halls’ neighbor, Sean Dunnett, an agronomist and partner in some of Nasussito’s broodmares.

“Between the five of us, there’s always two or three of us in the barn to get the work done every day,” said Otis. “Everybody understands the expectations of what needs to be done. Everybody knows what we need to do to accomplish our goals.”

“We all just collectively work together and try to have success.”

Making their story, and pledge, to harness racing even more noble, is that the game is simply a hobby for both Otis and Susan.

The former has been a supervisor at Siemens Canada since 1997 when he first joined the technology powerhouse as a co-op student.

The latter, meanwhile, is an accountant working as a controller in Cambridge.

Despite their main vocations taking them elsewhere, the Hall family always relishes their time in the barn.

“It means a lot; it really does,” said Otis. “It’s something that we can all look forward to and all participate in, and we can all reflect on over the years.”

“It’s very important to everybody.”

As for what a banner 2024 term has taught Otis: don’t mess with old family recipes.

“Continue to work hard, don’t be outworked, always do what’s right for the horse, and always try to make the right decision, that’s something we go by in the barn,” he said. “We’re always trying to make the right decision for each horse.”

“I don’t chase accolades or awards. Sure, I’d love to be in the North America Cup or something like that someday, but it’s a hard thing to do, right? I don’t really strive for that. I just try to do the best with whatever we have at any given time, and I think hard work, good decisions, and doing what’s right for the horse will carry you a long way.”

Whether in Bermuda, Canada or the U.S., Kiwon Waldron is dedicated to the horses

His travels have already taken him to places he never envisioned, but there are many more miles and destinations to come for Kiwon Waldron.

Dreaming big and chasing those dreams has been part of the young horseman's life for as long as he can remember.

Growing up in Bermuda, a British island territory that is home to just under 64,000 inhabitants, Waldron became fascinated with horses at a young age.

It was no longshot that he took an immediate liking to them considering his grandfather had horses and was a carriage driver, and his brother and an uncle both raced trotting ponies.

"I loved being around the horses," Waldron said. "I would ride ponies and that was always fun. I knew I would end up working with horses one day. I wasn't sure at one point what that would be, but as time went on, I found that becoming a driver was my goal."

Devonshire Parish, one of nine parishes found in Bermuda, is home to the only standardbred racetrack in the North Atlantic Ocean nation.

As noted on the Driving Horse and Pony Club of Bermuda website, "Harness racing is a worldwide sport but in Bermuda, the challenge of racing has higher demands due to the size and shape of our racetrack. Competitors and spectators feel the power of the ponies as they strive to do what they do best, which is go fast and win. This sport requires dedication, determination, and commitment from its competitors..."

Waldron is the very definition of dedication, determination and commitment.

Knowing he would have to leave Bermuda to advance his career, Waldron, as a young teenager, got his first experience with the U.S. harness racing scene when he competed on the Indiana fair circuit.

Then, six years ago, upon graduating from high school in his homeland, Waldron, with a little help from the racing gods,

met high-profile Canadian trainer Rene Allard when the latter was in Bermuda with a friend to take in the biggest day on the racing calendar.

It led to an invitation from Allard for Waldron to compete in Quebec.

Racing at the fairs, while navigating a completely different culture, Waldron quickly impressed those he met, his down-to-earth nature and skills in the sulky endearing him to horse people wherever he found himself competing.

On July 13, 2019, he made his first pari-mutuel start on North American soil, specifically, Hippodrome 3R in Trois-Rivières.

Waldron was hoping to make it as memorable as possible.

In rein to Shemaksmefelunreal, a daughter of Sunshine Beach—Dreamfair Orchid, the pair set the early tone and led by a length after a quarter in :30.4, pushing their advantage to 1½ lengths through a half in 1:03.3.

At the three-quarter mark, Shemaksmefelunreal, the 4-5 choice, was only a neck in front.

Waldron called upon the Michel Allard trainee for her best and she responded, pacing the final quarter in :29.3 to secure a one-length score in 2:05.4.

"The greatest feeling you can have," said Waldron. "I was so happy and to see how happy everyone else was made it even more special. I will always remember that day."

The final four months of 2019 were spent traversing the Circuit Regional des Courses de Chevaux du Quebec.

Waldron produced gaudy numbers, fashioning a remarkable 14-7-1 record from 26 starts.

Putting up head-turning stats was not the biggest takeaway for the young horseman.

“Just learning and improving was so big for me,” he said. “The more chances you get, the more education you get. That was huge for me.”

Nearly three years ago, Waldron was in the sulky for Pompano Park qualifiers – he obtained his ‘P’ license in the Sunshine State – before he headed back north to Allard Stable in Quebec a couple months later.

The result of his hard work yielded a 17-12-13 mark from 131 races, accompanied by \$59,436 in purse earnings.

Waldron was also feted as 2022 Rookie of the Year at Hippodrome 3R.

The news spread quickly, in this instance, over 1,050 miles away.

Bermuda’s only daily newspaper, *The Royal Gazette*, founded in 1828, heralded Waldron’s success.

But it hasn’t always been headlines and hurrahs for the personable 24-year-old.

In 2023, Waldron endured no shortage of tumult in trying to secure paperwork to stay in North American on a permanent basis.

Despite the delays, challenges, and other hurdles, he remained resolute throughout the process.

This May, the visa request was approved.

“I am so grateful to the Macomers [Indiana horsepeople Jamie and Ricky Macomber],” Waldron said. “I wouldn’t be here racing without them. From their hard work helping me with paperwork and giving me a shot to accompany them here – they have been great to me in so many ways.”

Competing at Hoosier Park, Waldron is very much feeling right at home in his U.S. Midwest surroundings.

He posted his first victory on the campaign on July 27 when he teamed with Airbus to earn a dead-heat win in 1:54.4.

“My friends owned the horse and that was their first win at Hoosier,” he said. “It was a full-circle moment, to be able to win that for them. It was awesome.”

Waldron has kept things rolling since then.

As of Nov. 26, he has 13 wins, 16 seconds and 13 thirds from 171 starts, along with \$174,989 in purse earnings, on the year.

“I had a lot of fun driving the colt Spirit And Heart this year,” said Waldron of the 2-year-old son of Luck Be Withyou – So Long my Love. “I have had some other very nice horses too. I am very lucky to get those opportunities, and I want to make the most of them.”

The pride of Warwick, Bermuda, is grateful for the success, but eager to chase more.

“I am seeing how I can finish the year in a positive way, hoping the horses race well and get the results we are looking for,” he said. “After that, I don’t have anything set in stone. I might go to Hawthorne and see if I can get some drives there.”

“Wherever I go and whatever I do, I just want to keep building and learning.”

Waldron, an avid golfer, has continued to heed the advice imparted to him back home and when he first came to North America.

“I was told, ‘Don’t ever give up,’” he said. “If I have a bad drive, I need to put that behind me and focus on the next race. My goal is to give the horse I drive the best chance to win.”

Support, in the U.S. and Bermuda, remains a constant.

“My family has never stopped believing in me, especially my mom, who is my number one fan,” Waldron said. “She came here to Indiana not too long ago and she got to see me drive in person. She always keeps me going. We talk every day. She sends me good luck messages and keeps me grounded. Everyone back home, it is nothing but love.”

“I have had so many great people provide me with opportunities and believe in me. All the credit goes to everybody who put my name down to drive their horses. They gave me a shot. Without them, I wouldn’t be anywhere. But I am so happy to be where I am.”

And just as happy for where it all might lead.

“I know everybody who drives says the dream is the Grand Circuit, but for my long-term goal, I want to go as far as I can for as long as I can in this industry and sit behind champions,” Waldron said.

In reality the nastiest of racetrack bettors were not the tropes depicted in *Guys And Dolls* or with other Damon Runyon creations.

And so, it was an unusual day being with tight-wound Ralph. He was comfortable; my Lao Tzu playbook was going well enough. As a skillful leader I subdued "the enemy without any fighting."

And then...

"Go play this one," he said while pointing to a number on the program. "Two bucks. To win."

I went to it. Things were feeling all right and they were getting better. When the race went off, he struggled to follow the horse he bet. I reported the action for him. My voice became louder as his horse dueled in the stretch between two others and appeared from our angle to nail the win.

"What happened? Where is he?"

"I think he won."

Ralph's face glowed. No such things like this could ever have happened to him. When the numbers lighted the tote board he slapped the program against the empty seat in front of him and laughed until he coughed. I told him to go cash the ticket. Get the rest of the thrill a win delivers by watching the cashier flip dollars down one by one and sprinkle the profit with some change.

"You go," he said.

I went. I enjoyed the rest of the thrill for him. When I returned to our seats, I imitated the cashier and dealt him a fiver and three singles. Then I showed him two quarters and a dime.

"That's a good amount, right?" he said.

"Three to one."

"Look," he said as he shoved all but two of the bills into his pocket. "I want to bet this horse to win in the next race."

"Why did you pick this one?"

"I dunno. Good name. I dunno. Just popped out at me."

I was elated to see him happy and I was happy to be elated about the joy we suddenly shared. But I was no fool. This battle was far from over. Sun Tzu taught me not to be ignorant of changing conditions before a victory. Beginner's luck is for beginners. Ralph wanted to bet again; he wanted to defy "distances great and small; open ground and narrow passes."

The time between races crawled. I bought us more coffees and dad told me to watch the clock because he wanted to bet this race. I told him not to worry; he would not get shut out.

"Shut what?"

"Shut out. You know, run out of time to bet."

"How am I supposed to know what 'shut out' means?"

"Sorry. I'm used to being here with people who know the jargon."

"Jar what?"

"Jargon. The language of a certain trade. Like all the special words and terms you use to describe plumbing work."

"Oh. But 'shut out' is a baseball term too, you know."

I was unprepared for what was to happen the rest of the racing program. It was enough to make me want to put a frog down Sun Tzu's battle armor. As I write these some 50 years later, I am still dumbstruck.

Ralph won his second race in a row. His horse beat mine in lengths and in dollars. He was almost excited enough to cash the ticket himself.

"That's great, dad," I said.

"Here's my next bet," he said, pointing to the program.

I loved a horse in the next race but the horse gods were still on Ralph's side. He won his third in a row; my horse may as well have pulled up or run amok out of the gate.

"Dad," I said, patting him on the back for the first time in my adult life, "this is amazing. How are you picking these winners? You have a system you want to share?"

"I just liked those ones. I got no reason. What a crazy thing, eh?"

Indeed. His two-dollar investments already earned him 19-and-change profit; all of which included only a single loss before three-straight wins. I dared not explain parlay wagers to him. But I did the ROI (return on investment) math after his third win and almost fell out of the grandstand. The simple calculations produced a parlay-player's dream profit.

"I'm going to go with this one," he said, pointing to a horse in the program without offering any reasons for the choice, "however you say the name. Some crazy names on these things."

Challenging propositions

A fledgling business startup named The Vapes of Wrath recently opened in a desolate strip mall less than a mile from my house, the sixth business to occupy these premises in the last 15 years.

Each previous business, a tanning salon (Tantastic), a baseball card shop (Cardofile Collectibles), a tattoo parlor (Inkfinity Studio), a used clothing boutique (The Retro Rack), and a pizza restaurant (Crusties), began with high hopes.

Each time I noticed a new sign above the doorway, I imagined a new occupant with a new dream setting up shop in the building and smiled at the enterprising nature of the new owners. Then, my thoughts were a sobering wish for good luck on your difficult road ahead. Let us salute them all. These new owners may have temporarily failed but are in the game, not on the sidelines. We should always salute folks chasing dreams.

Participants in harness racing, gamblers, drivers, owners, or breeders have much in common with those now defunct businesses, a group of people who come wired with a need to try something against the odds, striving to find a way to reach a distant goal.

A short definition of an entrepreneurial personality is a dreamer who acts. They are people who put vision into practice, who tend to be action-oriented, believe they can deftly navigate obstacles, and love opportunities and challenges. I would add another adjective to entrepreneurs and potential racing converts – rebellion. Don't we all buy, claim, or raise a young horse with a little chip on our shoulders? We silently say to ourselves, watch me do the impossible, or, this horse didn't work out, but I will do better with the next one.

When we imagine the future of our sport, folks with this entrepreneurial gene and confidence may be valuable assets and our most likely targets for recruitment. The flip side of this theory is that we should not use time or resources to appeal to risk-averse people.

Suggesting that a novice observes a few races and falls in love with our sport will rarely get traction. Framing our sport as a unique business challenge has possibilities. Can you take X amount of money to do Y and, within Z years, turn a profit, is a siren song that calls to millions of people in thousands of fields. In gambling, ownership, or the breeding business in our sport,

the personality of the potential player is of utmost importance.

Ask yourself why you play this game. It does not matter if this is your first dance around the racetrack or if you have participated for 50 years. For many of us, the answer that spurred us into action and keeps us in the game is a burning need to prove we can do it. We all have a bit of "hold my beer and watch me" when we hear statements like these:

"Very few shrewd gamblers can turn a profit gambling on harness horse racing. Turning a profit may be impossible."

"Not many people could purchase a stable of five yearlings, recruit owners and trainers, race the horses, and turn a profit."

"Unless you are a commercial breeding farm and know people in the business, no backyard breeder can raise and consign a yearling sales topper."

"The chances of a Hambletonian winner purchased for under \$20,000 is science fiction."

Introducing our sport using clear, measurable challenges might get traction because the words "You can't do that" will set a specific type of person on fire. Money is not the end goal. It is merely a measurement. Satisfaction is doing something nobody believes can be done.

Nelsonbriteagle NO destroys FanDuel Mares in stakes record

With a strong start against five other trotters, Dexter Dunn guided **Nelsonbriteagle NO** to the front and wafted through four quarters atop the field to win the \$150,000 FanDuel Open Mares Trot Championship in a stakes-record 1:49.4 on a frigid Saturday night (Nov. 30) at The Meadowlands.

Just behind Nelsonbriteagle NO the compact field presented the hot 3-year-old Allegiant, who was well backed by the crowd as the 5-2 third choice off a Breeders Crown win and a Matron victory. M-M's Dream chased comfortably in third as the other sophomore, R Melina, galloped and eliminated herself from competition. Warrawee Xenia rolled along next while 9-5 favorite Call Me Goo took back to last.

Nelsonbriteagle NO tapped the first panel in :27.2 as Call Me Goo, the stunning Breeders Crown Mare Trot victor over a month ago, took steps out of last with a first-over bid after her stablemate. Nelsonbriteagle NO travelled strongly to the half in :55 and continued on the muscle through the turn. Allegiant made a gallant challenge out of the pocket moving to three-quarters in 1:22.2, but Nelsonbriteagle NO easily thwarted the sophomore's challenge turning for home. Nelsonbriteagle NO

stormed to the line in a league of her own, piercing the beam 2½ lengths in front of Allegiant in second. Warrawee Xenia split rivals for third and Call Me Goo levelled off for fourth.

"She was good behind the gate," Dunn said, hoping Nelsonbriteagle NO on the engine would avoid some of the trouble that cost her the last two races at The Meadowlands and The Red Mile. "She was so good that last quarter. She liked the front, and [finishing] in [1]:49.4 is not easy in any kind of weather for a trotter."

The 1:49.4 mile by Nelsonbriteagle NO eclipses the previous stakes record of 1:51.4 matched four times since Hannelore Hanover set the mark in 2016.

Nelsonbriteagle NO is a 6-year-old daughter of Bold Eagle, out of the Dream Vacation mare Lindy's Holiday, and is trained by Ake Svanstedt, who co-owns her with breeder Nils Johan Munkhaugen. She has now earned \$368,959 after winning for the 14th time in her career.

Sent off as the second choice in the betting, Nelsonbriteagle NO paid \$5.60 to win.

Miki And Minnie motors to equal Three Diamonds stakes record

Breeders Crown champ **Miki And Minnie** sat poised off tumultuous speed and thrust forward from a helmet in the stretch to win the \$338,200 Three Diamonds final, for 2-year-old pacing fillies, at The Meadowlands on Saturday night (Nov. 30).

Leaving from post 2, Miki And Minnie settled into fifth off a :26.3 scorcher uncorked by Chakra charging out of post 8 for the lead. Chakra refused to relinquish control up the backstretch, parking Faze until that challenger regressed through the field by a :54 half. All the while driver Dexter Dunn fished cover from Rodeo Drive Deo going to three-quarters in 1:21.4 and swung back outside for a stretch-drive assault. Miki And Minnie vaulted by Rodeo Drive Deo entering the final eighth and scooted away to a 1½-length win in 1:49.2, equaling the stakes record established

in 2019 by JK First Lady. Rodeo Drive Deo settled for second with Shes A Streaker chasing in third and Lyons Benz snagging fourth.

“She’s terrific,” trainer Chris Ryder said after the race. “She’s done everything we’ve asked of her and [this is] a great way to finish off the year. Looks like the [Dan Patch] 2-Year-Old of the Year, eh? You can’t be the best unless you beat the best – they’ve thrown a lot at her and she’s come out on top in the three big races. I’m just honored to have her; she’s a lovely filly.”

Miki And Minnie, a homebred daughter of Always B Miki from the Roll With Joe mare That’s The Ticket, has now won six races from 11 starts and banked \$834,086 for owners Craig Henderson, Robert Mondillo and Lawrence Minowitz.

Sent off as the 4-5 favorite, Miki And Minnie paid \$3.60 to win.

Monserate stalks, surges in Valley Victory

Three weeks after his runner-up finish to Breeders Crown champion Maryland in the Kindergarten Series final, **Monserate** pounced late and recorded a lifetime-best 1:52.1 win in the \$447,000 Valley Victory, for 2-year-old male trotters, on Saturday (Nov. 30) at The Meadowlands.

Monserate was one of five horses vying for early control on approach to the first turn, but David Miller took him just off the pace as Go Dog Go (driven by Todd McCarthy) forged to the front at the end of a :28 first quarter, only to yield to Super Chapter (Dexter Dunn) on the backstretch. As 7-5 favorite Super Chapter accelerated to a :55.4 half, Monserate stalked from fourth before angling first-over to begin his six-length ascent on the far turn.

Nearing the top of the stretch, Go Dog Go pulled the pocket and took aim at Super Chapter past three-quarters in 1:24.1, and

their protracted duel in the lane forced Miller to swing three-wide with Monserate, who worked into a clear third off the home turn. The Chapter Seven—Guinevere Hall colt continued to lift late and surged in the final yards to collar Super Chapter by a widening half-length. Go Dog Go finished third.

“When he started battling Maryland [in the Nov. 9 Kindergarten final], I couldn’t believe that he was hanging with this amazing animal,” said Bruce Areman, who shares ownership of Monserate with William Pollock and trainer Andrew Harris, of the colt’s tenacity. “Dave [Miller] said to me tonight that he’s a really game animal, he really wants to win. It’s hard to teach that. He likes a target and he wants to come after you, and that’s what he did.”

Monserate, whose 1:52.1 clocking also equaled the stakes record, is now a four-time winner with \$332,693 in the bank from 13 starts. As the 3-1 third choice, he paid \$8.40 to win.

Twin B Joe Fresh repeats in FanDuel distaff

Chris Ryder entered the 2024 season with high expectations for **Twin B Joe Fresh**. After watching his 4-year-old mare close out her campaign Saturday (Nov. 30) with a win in the \$150,000 FanDuel Championship for female pacers at The Meadowlands, the trainer acknowledged that harness racing's No. 1-ranked horse had met them all.

Twin B Joe Fresh, who last year became the first 3-year-old filly to beat the mares in the FanDuel Championship, on Saturday became the event's first two-time winner when she defeated My Girl EJ by 2¾ lengths in 1:49.1 at the Big M. Valar Dohaeris was third.

The victory was Twin B Joe Fresh's 11th in 13 starts this year, with her setbacks both being second-place finishes, in a conditioned race against male rivals to open her campaign and in her elimination of the Breeders Crown last month at The Meadowlands. She came back a week later to win the Breeders Crown final, one of 10 Grand Circuit victories for the daughter of Roll With Joe—Fresh Breeze this season.

When asked what kind of year he expected for Twin B Joe Fresh, Ryder responded, "Just like this, to be honest.

"She had a great year last year, she finished off last year winning this race as a 3-year-old against the aged horses, so the expectations were high. She's filled them out."

In the FanDuel Championship, My Girl EJ, one of two 3-year-olds in the race, led the field to the opening quarter in :27 and remained in front through a half in :54.2 and three-quarters in 1:21.4.

Twin B Joe Fresh and driver Dexter Dunn were fourth at that point but had picked

up cover from the first-over Grace Hill while pacing around the final turn. Dunn angled Twin B Joe Fresh three-wide entering the stretch and came home with a :27 final quarter to secure the win.

"Grace Hill and My Girl EJ deserved a lot of respect, they've done a lot, but we got there," Ryder said. "[Twin B Joe Fresh] has just got a good set of lungs, she's got high speed, and she's gotten stronger as she got older. She can pace home strong. That's her forte."

Twin B Joe Fresh is owned by Ryder, Dunn, Peter Trebotica and Barry Spak. She was bred by Brittany Farms.

For her career, Twin B Joe Fresh has won 30 of 40 races, hit the board eight additional times, and earned \$2.33 million (with nearly \$900,000 this year).

Ryder said Twin B Joe Fresh would return to race in 2025.

"We expect to race her next year, absolutely," said Ryder, who was elected to the Harness Racing Hall of Fame earlier this year. "We're sure we will, as long as she's healthy.

"What can I say? We've got to try to do the same again [next year]. That's a big task, but we're going to give it a shot."

Twin B Joe Fresh has been the No. 1-ranked horse in the Hambletonian Society/Breeders Crown poll for 20 consecutive weeks.

"It's been a real thrill," Ryder said about the mare's season. "Thank you so much to the media and all the fans. Everyone has had nothing but great things to say about her and, believe me, it's definitely appreciated."

As the overwhelming 1-20 favorite, Twin B Joe Fresh paid \$2.10 to win.



What A Bid Hanover clinches win in Goldsmith Maid

What A Bid Hanover stormed home mid-stretch and down the center of the track to win the \$455,000 Goldsmith Maid, for 2-year-old trotting fillies, at The Meadowlands on Saturday (Nov. 30).

Trainer/driver Ake Svanstedt was in no rush off the gate with What A Bid Hanover while longshots Spicy Nice, Panacea Hanover and R Dutchess shuffled through the first turn for the top spots. R Dutchess broke stride into a :27.3 first quarter, leaving Spicy Nice to lead until she was overtaken from a first-over charge by Luna Lovegood. Spicy Nice then jumped to a gallop from the pocket before a :56.1 half while Luna Lovegood coasted for the far turn.

Luna Lovegood held a healthy lead passing three-quarters in 1:24.3 but drifted wide off the final turn and started to feel the pressure looming. Voguish mounted a serious charge down the center of the track with Sound Judgement weaving through traffic to the inside, all while Svanstedt came soaring from the back with What A Bid Hanover. Svanstedt urged What A Bid

Hanover to take advantage of the erratic field with a cannonball close and nailed the win by a nose in 1:53.3. Voguish settled for second, Luna Lovegood took third in the three-way photo and Sound Judgement finished fourth.

What A Bid Hanover survived a judge's inquiry (for contact with Voguish's wheel in the stretch) and carved a fifth of a second off her personal-best mile to notch her third win in seven starts.

"She started good training in Florida," said Sarah Svanstedt after the race, "then she got sore and had some muscle problems. She's a nice horse but we had to take our time with her."

Still, Sarah insisted, "She is 100 per cent racehorse."

Ake owns What A Bid Hanover, through his Ake Svanstedt Inc., with S R F Stable. She is a daughter of champion Muscle Hill out of the Donato Hanover mare What A Knockout and has now earned \$297,863.

Sent off as the slight favorite at 7-5, What A Bid Hanover returned \$4.80 to win.

Logan Park goes pillar to post in FanDuel Open Trot

Pylon-starter **Logan Park** hustled to the lead and, at odds of 11-1, rejected 1-9 favorite and retiree Winner's Bet to claim the crown in the \$325,000 FanDuel Open Trot Championship at The Meadowlands on Saturday night (Nov. 30).

Driver Doug McNair scurried Logan Park to the front entering the first turn and carried the field by the quarter in :27.2. Logan Park coasted up the backside to sneak a breather into a :56.2 half, while challengers promptly encroached through the slowed tempo heading to the final turn.

Winner's Bet, positioned fourth before lunging to a first-over push, attacked Logan Park into the final turn. The two came head-to-head by three-quarters in 1:24.3 and stayed in lockstep spinning for home as Logan Park refused to cave to Winner's Bet's bid. Logan Park swelled from the challenge and Winner's Bet wavered into the final eighth, losing ground to his foe who

steamed over the line to a 2¼-length win in 1:51.2. Periculum zipped through a seam at the pylons off a ground-saving trip to snag second from a weary Winner's Bet while Oh Well sat a pocket trip for fourth.

"He's been a great horse for the last couple of years," McNair said. "[Trainer] Rob [Fellows] took his hobbles off three-parts of the way through the year and I think that really stepped him up another notch. Other than the 10 hole in the Breeders Crown, he was great tonight. He rates himself so easy – he puts his ears up when he makes the front and just waits for them to come and does exactly what he has to do."

A 6-year-old gelding by Archangel out of the Muscle Mass mare Rite Outa The Park, Logan Park has now won 36 times from 83 starts and earned \$1,527,589 for owners Outofthepark Stable, Reg Higgs and Arpad Szabo. Fellows trains Logan Park, who paid \$24 to win.

Captain Optimistic makes it happen in Governor's Cup

Following a third-place finish in the Metro Pace and a fourth-place effort in the Breeders Crown, **Captain Optimistic** put it all together with a powerful two-move mile to win the \$382,200 Governor's Cup, for 2-year-old male pacers, on Saturday (Nov. 30) at The Meadowlands.

After being looped on the first turn by 50-1 long shot Papi's Rocket (driven by George Brennan), Captain Optimistic and driver Dexter Dunn forged to the front at the end of a :27.2 first quarter before stringing out Papis Pistol (Andy Miller) to the :54.3 half-mile juncture. Only a few strides after releasing Papis Pistol, Captain Optimistic angled out of the pocket to ensure clear sailing for the final three-eighths of the mile. The Captaintreacherous—Cinamony colt ground forward at the flank of Papis Pistol to three-quarters in 1:22.2 and asserted to reclaim the lead off the turn for home.

"Dex had to use him hard two times in the race," said trainer Nancy Takter, adding that the colt "covers a lot of ground."

Off the corner, Captain Optimistic sprinted clear while driven out by Dunn before being taken in hand for the final 100 yards of his four-length, 1:49.3 win. Swingtown (Yannick Gingras) sustained a two-wide advance from midfield to take second; Papi's Rocket finished third.

"He's had a really good season; he won the New Jersey Classic here," Takter said. "He's continued to improve. We had some trouble getting him to steer properly, but today was the best he's steered. Hopefully that carries over to 2025."

Captain Optimistic, a seven-time winner from 11 starts, has earned \$454,830 this season for 3 Brothers Stables, Marvin Katz and Caviart Farms. As the 4-5 favorite, he paid \$3.80 to win.

Abuckabett Hanover reels in Ruthless Hanover again, wins FanDuel Open Pace

Abuckabett Hanover and driver Dexter Dunn got a pocket trip behind pacesetter Ruthless Hanover before moving to the outside off the last turn and surging through the stretch to win the \$325,000 FanDuel Open Pace Championship by 3½ lengths in 1:48.1 on Saturday (Nov. 30) at The Meadowlands. Ruthless Hanover held for second and Seven Colors was third.

Ruthless Hanover and driver George Napolitano, Jr. left quickly from post 10 to get the lead midway around the first turn. From there, Ruthless Hanover reached the quarter in :26.2, half in :54.2, and three-quarters in 1:21.2. He was unable to fend off Abuckabett Hanover, though, who came home in :26.3 as the 4-5 favorite for trainer Andrew Harris.

"It was perfect," said Dunn, who won five of Saturday's eight major stakes at The Big M. "[Abuckabett Hanover] got out of the gate super, and once I saw 'Ruthless' coming across, I thought that was the perfect helmet to follow. He took us right into the lane and he put up a good fight, but 'Bucky' was just so sharp tonight.

"Once you pull him off a helmet, he really explodes. Andrew has done a great job to keep him up all year. There are no easy miles for these open pacers, so they've got to be good to sustain a good effort all year."

Abuckabett Hanover has won seven of 15 races this season and earned \$833,022, pushing his lifetime purses to more than \$2 million.

"He's grown up a lot, I think, from his earlier days," Dunn said. "I wasn't driving him, but I raced against him, and he had some quirks. But he's really grown up and he's just so fast."

A 6-year-old stallion, Abuckabett Hanover is owned by Bill Pollock, Bruce Areman and Harris. That trio also won the \$447,000 Valley Victory Stakes for 2-year-old male trotters with Monserrate earlier in the night.

"For my career, this is the greatest night I've ever had," said Harris, who also saw My Girl EJ finish second in the FanDuel Mare Pace Championship; Voguish finish second in the Goldsmith Maid for 2-year-old female trotters; and Seven Colors finish third in the FanDuel Open Pace.

The partnership of Pollock, Areman and Harris began in June 2023 with the purchase of Abuckabett Hanover. The group has built a sizeable stakes stable since then.

"He was the first one," Harris said. "I'm so thrilled with this horse; he's closed out the year awesome. I can't thank them enough for the opportunity. It's just been a dream ride.

"I can't thank these guys enough for supporting me. I love them, they're amazing, and I just couldn't be happier."

Abuckabett Hanover, a son of Betting Line—All Tucked Up who has won 22 of 74 lifetime starts and earned \$2.04 million, was bred by Hanover Shoe Farms. He paid \$3.80 to win.

A LITTLE MORE: If it wasn't already locked up, Dunn's five-winner night will no doubt give the 35-year-old New Zealand native a fifth Dan Patch Driver of the Year trophy in the last six years... Jeff Cullipher, Ake Svanstedt, Chris Ryder and Andrew Harris tied atop the trainer leaderboard with two victories apiece... A carryover of \$4,810 motivated players to pump just over \$42,000 of "new money" into the 20-cent Pick-6 pool. Those with winning tickets divided up the total pot of \$47,210 by collecting \$837.36... All-source handle totaled \$3,324,178 on the 14-race program, the biggest night of action since Oct. 26 when over \$4.3 million was put in play on Breeders Crown Finals Night II... The racing schedule will be a tad different for the next two weeks, as live action will be conducted on a Thursday-Saturday basis with the usual first-race post time of 6:20 p.m.

January Davies Humanitarian Award to Leigh Raymer

Leigh Nichol Raymer will receive the 2024 January Davies Humanitarian Award from the United States Harness Writers Association (USHWA).

The award was created in 2008 by U.S. Harness Writers Association member Callie Davies-Gooch in memory of her daughter to recognize contributions beyond harness racing, and it is given annually at the Dan Patch Awards Banquet.

At the end of September, Hurricane Helene, a category 4 hurricane, devastated the southeast across 10 states. North Carolina took heavy damage as Hurricane Helene made impact as the deadliest storm in its history. Complete towns were washed away from flooding, destruction swept across the state, and many lives were lost.

Raymer, a current resident of Columbus, NC, and a member of the harness racing community, was instrumental in the relief after the hurricane.

"Our farm, Thermal Ridge, is based just 10 minutes from Lake Lure and 15 minutes from Chimney Rock," Raymer said. "Chimney Rock was completely washed away; so was the neighboring town Bat Cave. We are 15 minutes from Hendersonville and 35 from Asheville. We watched our neighbor's house across the street get flooded out. We personally know several people displaced, working hard to save their businesses and have come to know tens of dozens who have lost their homes. We spent a lot of time during the week without power, reaching out to people we hadn't heard from hoping they were okay.

"We were surrounded by destruction. It's all personal. The good from this bad is, our community has come together so strongly. We have met so many in the community and had so many people from other states reach out to help. Unfortunately, we are far from normal and we wonder if some will have to be a new normal."

Raymer was born into the harness racing business. She moved to North Carolina in 2020, bought a farm, and created her own business through a farm stand.

"My mother's father drove and trained horses in Delaware, my father trained and bred horses, and my step-mother is an equine veterinarian," Raymer said. "I grew up in Delaware at the racetrack, worked for my dad and then others as I got older during the summers while home from college. After receiving my master's in public relations from the University of Georgia, I worked for Winbak Farm for four years in marketing and communications. A year later, I met my husband Tyler at the Harrisburg horse sale. We trained horses for about nine years, mostly based out of Delaware and did New York Sire Stakes.

"When COVID hit, we decided to move to North Carolina on a whim. We were able to buy a farm for what we sold our house for in Delaware. We brought Tirade Hanover and Master Builder with us. Tyler got the job as the official farrier at Tryon International Equestrian Center, and I have been able to stay home, work on the farm and homeschool our son Rory. Rory had been struggling with word problems, and I decided to get a small farm stand to sell eggs and produce from our farm. Tyler laughed at me, as we brought it home, thinking it was another harebrained idea I had. It worked helping Rory learn word problems, counting money and adding decimals, plus we started bringing in a small weekly passive income."

Leigh used her farm stand to make an impact in the hurricane relief efforts.

"When the hurricane hit, I had planned to sell produce and pumpkins that weekend," she said. "I put everything out, but noticed we weren't selling much. No one had cash and then, an older farmer mentioned it would be nice if we had bread [as] he did not have any. I ran up to the house, grabbed him half a loaf of bread. I then told Tyler that we had a problem, no one had cash or enough food.

"The electricity was out and everything was shut down. To get gas we had to drive over an hour towards Charlotte and

had to drive into town for internet service. We got in contact with friends from Charlotte for food and then had other friends bring in baby supplies from Charlotte. Our original thought was to donate the items at the local spots, but noticed things were in disarray. We decided we could be more accessible at our own produce stand so we did.”

With the help from others, more donations piled in to supply the farm stand.

“Bigger places were turning away supplies and volunteers, but our goal was to not say no,” Leigh said. “First, we filled our carport with supplies, then we had a church from Virginia join with a couple from Minnesota to buy us a storage container. It was amazing to see. I had started with days asking God where we were going to get supplies, and ended asking God where we were going to put supplies. Each time I asked, he responded. It has been mind-blowing.

“The couple from Minnesota also made us shelves to put down by the road. For the first month we were open every day. Each day we were going through \$2,000-\$3,000 worth of food and supplies. We have had people come up and tell us they lost everything. We have given them tents, inflatable mattresses, sleeping bags, heaters, propane, grills, food, clothing, toiletries, pet food, bedding, cleaning supplies, whatever we can possibly fit in their car. In one instance, we had a couple living in a lean-to that we first supplied them with their tent. Then they were given a trailer but it needed repair. We have made them an account at the local hardware store to fix up the trailer, we got them a new dryer and some flooring. We also had a family that had their house completely immersed in water, and we were able to get them sponsors to help rebuild.

“We are now open Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday. It is now more self-serve with shelves filled with food and supplies. I work just keeping the shelves full, giving hugs and asking if there are any specific needs. Tomorrow we are handing out 100 Thanksgiving Boxes with canned vegetables, stuffing, macaroni and cheese, canned ham, fresh produce, toiletries, and a turkey breast. We hope to do the same for Christmas and we are also doing a toy drive for the local kids.”

Leigh will be recognized at the 2024 Dan Patch Awards Banquet, presented by Caesars Entertainment, which will honor the best of the best of harness racing, both human and equine. The Banquet will be held on Sunday (Feb. 23, 2025) at the Rosen Centre in Orlando, FL. Marino, Giesbrecht sweep sophomore stakes at Fraser

Trainer Jim Marino and driver Phil Giesbrecht teamed up to sweep the \$100,000 finals of the Mary Murphy Breeders Stakes and Robert Murphy Memorial Breeders Stakes for 3-year-olds on Thursday (Nov. 28) at Fraser Downs.

Over Ice (\$2.70) delivered as expected in the final of the Mary Murphy for 3-year-old pacing fillies. The 1-5 public choice found the front end for Giesbrecht heading into the opening turn and controlled the tempo for a dominant victory. After fractions of :28, :58 and 1:25.4, Over Ice poured it on with a :28.2 final stanza to hit the wire more than three lengths to the good in a time of 1:54.1. Vintage Lass (Kelly Hoerd) closed well over Senorita Draco (Scott Knight) to nab the place spot.

“I had a pretty good feeling that I was going to be able to just get out of there and not have to worry about anything else,” said Giesbrecht after the victory. “She’s so handy. She’s just that good of a filly right now. She’s had a tough summer, she had some rugged trips out there in Alberta, luckily enough the competition’s a little softer here, but she’s still a very, very nice filly. Her record shows.”

Owned by her breeder J J J Stables of Prince George, BC, Over Ice (Custard The Dragon—Arm In Arm) picked up her 10th career tally in 21 starts to boast a record of 10-4-5 overall with eight of those victories coming at Fraser Downs. Her career bankroll ballooned to \$232,813 with the Murphy score.

By sweeping the Murphy legs, Over Ice completed her career stakes assignments in BC with an unblemished record.

In the 2023 Robert Millbank Memorial for 2-year-old pacing colts, **Wannabeabigstar** and Outlawstaythcourse were involved in an accident that took both horses out of the race. This year, those two horses returned to stakes action as sophomores and were once again making headlines in the \$100,000 Robert Murphy Memorial for 3-year-old male pacers.

Leaving from the outside post 8, Wannabeabigstar couldn’t find a spot on the pylons after the wings of the gate folded. Up front, Buddy Knocks (Knight) worked hard to clear rail starter Outlawstaythcourse (John Abbott). Buddy Knocks performed the heavy lifting through a :27.2 first station and :57.2 half.

Nothing Bugs Me (Rod Therres) pulled just before the half from fourth, providing some cover to the stalking favorite, Wannabeabigstar and Giesbrecht. After the 1:26 third quarter, Wannabeabigstar received a three-wide request from his pilot and started to cut into the pacesetter’s lead.

But when those horses reached the top of the stretch, Outlawstaythcourse edged to the passing lane as a fresh threat. Wannabeabigstar found that stretch to his liking, and collared Buddy Knocks while Outlawstaythcourse closed up the pylons.

At the wire, Wannabeabigstar shone brightest, winning by a head over Outlawstaythcourse in a time of 1:55. Buddy Knocks completed the top trio.

“For him to be where he is today, I just have to give kudos to Jimmy and everyone that worked with the horse, because after last year, I didn’t think he’d ever race again,” said Giesbrecht. “For him to be here like this, it’s amazing.

“He’s just a fantastic horse. I want to send a big shoutout to all my family at home for letting me do this. I really appreciate everyone back home. It’s a huge day.”

Wannabeabigstar (Shadow Play—Greek Beach) is trained by Marino, who co-owns the gelding with J J J Stables and Paul Sanders of Surrey, BC. In 14 career starts, Wannabeabigstar sports a 6-2-2 summary with \$89,505 in earnings. As the 3-4 public choice, he returned \$3.50 to win.

With the win of **Hotpieceoface** (1:55.1; \$3.20) in the fourth race, Marino totaled three wins on the evening with Giesbrecht engineering each of the visits to the winner’s circle.

During the stakes action, Kelly Hoerdts reached another career milestone, with his runner-up finish aboard the Cody Easton-trained filly Vintage Lass in the Mary Murphy putting his driving earnings over the \$20 million mark. The two-time O’Brien Award of Horsemanship winner, who just under three weeks ago hit the 3,000-career win mark, is in the midst of his fourth million-dollar season as driver in his career spanning nearly four decades. The 58-year-old Beaumont, AB, horseman has also trained winners of 2,560 races and \$19.2 million.

2024 season comes to a close at Pocono

The final card of the 2024 harness racing season at Pocono Downs at Mohegan Pennsylvania was held Saturday afternoon (Nov. 23), with an off track, temperatures barely above 40, and snow in the infield.

Closing day features were a trio of \$17,000 contests, all of them contested after the track was upgraded from “sloppy +1” to “good +1.”

The pacing division, restricted to males, saw the American Ideal 3-year-old pacing gelding **Seen Here** run his record to two wins and a second since entering the Jeff Cullipher stable with a 1:52.2 score. Tyler Buter, who along with Matt Kakaley had four victories on Closing Day, brushed the favored sophomore to command in front of the stands and kept piling on the speed, finishing 1½ lengths to the good of second choice Solid Character for Pollack Racing LLC.

The faster of the trotting headliners went to the international gelding **Dark Mind**, winning for the third straight time for trainer Noel Daley and owner Sonja Katrina Booth, here in 1:55.3. Dark

Mind was third-over in a good cover flow for driver Anthony Napolitano, went wide and was along late to beat out pacesetter Green Pastures by 1¼ lengths, with Sapphinerainstar shaking free to get beaten in the photo for the deuce and ending a five-race win string.

In the other diamondgaited split, another altered son of International Moni, **Dejerate Hanover**, followed solid cover, tipped wide, got the lead, and then held off the horse on his back, Kovu AS, by a half-length in 1:56.1. Buter drove the winner, a ten-time winner for the campaign, for trainer Ron Burke and the ownership of Burke Racing Stable LLC and Weaver Bruscelli LLC, FAC Racing LLC, and Yannick Gingras.

The top horsemen of the meet were honored on Closing Day. Kakaley won his third-straight dash title and fourth local win title overall (along with two UDR crowns), finishing the Pocono year with 280 visits to Victory Lane. David Miller, with occasional appearances for rich competition, got in enough drives (one per racing day) to qualify for UDR honors and won his first local title of any kind with a .361 batting average. And all-conquering trainer Burke had never won a Pocono training crown before 2020, but now he’s won three straight and four of the last five after sending out 79 winners. (UTR records have not been historically kept at Pocono.)

There was a retirement ceremony for a starting gate-load of distinguished 14-year-olds, and not since Foiled Again’s retirement fete has perhaps an assembled collective bankroll taken its bow. The eight horses honored — Bilbo Hanover, Blow A Cloud N, Bye Bye Michelle, Frac, Iammrbrightside N, Lachie Maguire N, Scott Rocks, and The Real One — have total lifetime earnings of \$5,101,000, with a millionaire, five other \$600G+ winners, and all having earned over \$318,000 as they head off into their sunsets.

PHHA / Pocono

Marquis Lafayette, Swedish Starlet N take Plainridge closers

Friday (Nov. 29) was the final day of live racing at Plainridge Park for 2024 and a pair of \$25,000 features headlined the getaway card of a very successful and record-breaking season.

The top trot went to **Marquis Lafayette** (Domenico Cecere), who true to style, came from behind to claim victory.

Marquis Lafayette got away sixth as his stablemate Sforza (Bruce Ranger) led the field to the quarter in :27 flat. Sforza then passed in front of the stands but then made a break before the half, leaving the pocket-sitting Snowpiercer (Brett Beckwith) to take control of the race. Snowpiercer quickly buzzed a :28.3 third panel under duress from Sea Can (Nick Graffam) and Big Box Hanover (Matty Athearn), and also Marquis Lafayette, who

was moving second-over in the breeze before tipping three-wide at three-quarters.

After coming off the turn, Snowpiercer took a length advantage into the lane, but Big Box Hanover was bearing down and Marquis Lafayette was marching smartly in the middle of the track. As they drew near the wire, Snowpiercer faded just a bit and Marquis Lafayette edged out Big Box Hanover at the line to win by a neck in 1:55.3.

It was the fifth win of the year for Marquis Lafayette (\$10.40) who pushed his earnings to \$93,625 for owner Greathorse. Cecere, who also trains the winner, had a natural training hat trick in races 7, 8 and 9.

Later in the distaff pacing feature, **Swedish Starlet N** (Athearn) made every post a winning one to capture the meet's final event of the year.

Swedish Starlet N left strong, took the lead ahead of Seaside Tina (Kevin Switzer, Jr.) and then set early fractions of :27.1 and :57. At the half, Quarrel (Ranger) made a first-over move and closed to within a length of the leader at three-quarters, where Side Piece (Aaron Byron) was now second-over and Arizona (Beckwith) had swung three-deep. With the field well bunched around the final bend, Swedish Starlet N continued to dig and held her length advantage as they entered the stretch. Quarrel continued to drive outside and Seaside Tina was closing in along the pegs. But Swedish Starlet N was not to be denied as she won by a half-length in 1:53.3.

It was the ninth win of the meet and 13th win overall for Swedish Starlet N (\$4.80) who ran her 2024 earnings up to \$197,530 for owners Tim Bojarski and Tony Gruppo.

Racing will resume at Plainridge Park in April of 2024. All the track management, staff, horsemen and horsewomen would like to wish everyone a very happy and healthy holiday season.

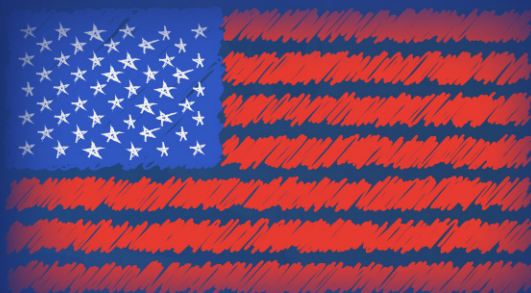
