North America's fastest 2- and 3-year-old pacing colt of his respective freshman & sophomore seasons, LOU'S PEARLMAN retired as the second richest, and third fastest, stallion sired by SWEET LOU.

At age 2, LOU'S PEARLMAN started his career with a 4-race winning streak, along with a 1:49.1 victory in the \$119,100 Bluegrass S. in Lexington.

The following season LOU'S PEARLMAN captured eight races, including an elimination heat and the final of the \$661,800 Little Brown Jug; \$235,000 Pennsylvania Sire Stakes Final; \$100,000 Max C. Hempt Memorial (Cons.), etc. He earned \$593,519 during his 2021 sophomore campaign, defeating such top horses as Perfect Sting, Charlie May, Hellabalou and Southwind Gendry.

Royally-bred, LOU'S PEARLMAN is from the same maternal family as World Champion and top sire WESTERN IDEAL p,2,1:54.3f; 1:48 (\$1,455,422), and his full sister, MY GIRL EJ p,2,1:49.1-'23 (\$698,397) won the 2023 Breeders Crown for 2-year-old pacing fillies.

This year at 5, he earned \$332,250 highlighted by a second place finish behind stablemate Bythemissal in the \$600,000 Breeders Crown Open Pace, defeating the likes of Tattoo Artist, Allywag Hanover and Abuckabett Hanover.

"I grew up showing and doing 4-H," said Scran, who hails from Toms River, NJ. "Once I aged out of 4-H, I wanted to be involved with horses still. I was running a riding horse farm, doing lessons, and taking care of horses, and a friend said to me, 'If you ever want to get into horse racing, I know someone, Trond Smedshammer, who is hiring.' I knew that I was never going to be away from horses, so I figured I'd give it a shot. And the rest is history."

A happy history, which also includes working for veteran horseman Rick Zeron, that still has much to be written.

Scran's training career began in 2017 with just three starts. The next year, she won seven races, including her milestone victory, which came on June 26, 2018, at Monticello.

Driven by her boyfriend Scott Zeron, Foolish Virgin, a bay daughter of Always A Virgin, was sent to the front in the \$5,000 pace and led every step of the way on her way to an authoritative 3 ¾-length victory in 1:56.3 as the 2-5 choice.

Scran, who won 35 total races from 2019-2022, has had a breakthrough season in 2023, a campaign that she did not see coming.

Along with new standards in wins, she is also zeroing in on \$1 million in purse earnings on the year. She was at \$986,295 as of Saturday afternoon.

"It definitely has been a surprising year I would say," Scran said. "I didn't go into this year expecting the year that I've had. I knew when I got Looks Like Moni that he would be a fun horse to have, a contender in the Graduate."


The 4-year-old son of Muscle Hill has been a trotting titan for Scran, going 3-4-2 from 12 starts with over \$180,000 on the campaign.

Then there is Tactical Mounds.

The well-travelled daughter of Tactical Landing has had a stellar season, which includes victories in the \$275,000 New Jersey Classic at The Meadowlands and the \$60,000 Pegasus at Hoosier Park in late October.

"I had her last year at 2, but she didn't show nearly the talent she has this year," Scran said. "Her second start this year, she trotted 1:53, and then she had a couple of races after that where we had to work through a couple of issues. Ever since she got through those, she's been spectacular."

In 19 engagements, the filly, owned by Thestable.ca, is 7-3-4, accompanied by over \$310,000 in seasonal purse earnings.

"I am just so proud of her," Scran said. "She has been the highlight of my career. Her and I have a great bond. She started her year pretty hot and became this sweet, mellow filly as the year went on. Every day when she jogs, she could get fired up, but in the barn, she is a very sweet horse, who has learned to win and to do that in a variety of ways. She's won on the front, first up, from off the pace – she is an absolute pleasure."

With 13 horses currently under her tutelage, Scran, who also notes Five Fish Species as one of her top performers, maintains a busy schedule throughout the week.

But the long hours are hardly a detriment.

"Every horse is different, and you learn to treat everyone as an individual," she said. "They can't all be the same program. You learn the highs are very high and the lows are very low. That's why you keep doing it... when you get to those highs."

When those moments come, Scran isn't the exuberant type; at least not externally.

Like her horses, she maintains a calm and collective demeanor in victory.

"I'm definitely not a person who outwardly celebrates," Scran said. "Internally, I am super excited and might even shed a tear, but no one else is going to see me."

So, if she does reach that magic seven-figure mark in purse earnings, don't expect to see a wild celebration to mark the moment.

For Scran, training is always about carrying the momentum forward.

"I'm hopeful that we can reach that by the end of the year, and it should be doable, but you never know in this sport," she said. "It's horse racing, so you never know. I like to keep building off any success we have. It's been an awesome year. I'm grateful to TheStable.ca and each and every one of my owners, who have all played a major role in my success.

"At this point, reaching \$1 million is the main goal. I don't see a similar goal on the horizon at this point in the year. Next year, it will be about doing better than in 2023. It's very satisfying, but at the same time, you are always driven to build on it."

Once looking for a change of pace in her work with horses, Scran has found her calling as a rising star horsewoman.

Did she ever envision this journey?

"Definitely not," she said. "I don't come from a family who is involved in horse racing, so to find this was unexpected. But I am so glad I did."

One thing that has remained unchanged, however, is an unwavering commitment to horses.

Even when she isn't at the barn or watching the races, her band of pacers and trotters are never far removed from her thoughts.

"I don't really do a lot without horses," she said with a laugh. "I enjoy going to dinner with my friends and unwinding. In the summer, I like to go out on a lake, on a boat."

Most of the year, Scran is focused on navigating a career that is on the fast track, and eager to sail forward to uncharted territories.

She will continue to chase those goals with a winning formula.

"It's easy to want to look beyond what is in front of you, but I keep things in a day-to-day approach," she said. "I find that works best for me."

Tough to split freshman divisions for year-end honors

Voters will have difficult choices to make in all four Dan Patch divisions for rookies.

In contrast to last year's easy-to-predict 2-year-old Dan Patch winners, this year could go different directions in four frosh divisions. And even with the subjective nature of the selection process, there likely won't be any 'wrong' winner as legitimate points can be made for all those in most serious contention. Here are my thoughts, as well as a prediction who the most likely winners will be.

TWO-YEAR-OLD MALE TROTTER

Beginning with the 2-year-old division with the highest profile horses, it's solely between Karl and T C I, who have proven to be superior to any other 2-year-old trotters.

What's remarkable is that prior to this year, no 2-year-old male trotter had ever earned over \$1 million. This year, both T C I and Karl have accomplished that; while being in the same crop. It speaks to just how dominant the two have been, and how impeccably managed they've been by their trainers, Ron Burke with T C I and Nancy Takter with Karl.

To come right out with it, I'd say that T C I has earned the divisional honor. That said, it seems there's a perception — maybe a correct one — that Karl is the more freakish of the two, and his string of impressionable late-season wins may propel him over the top in the eyes of voters.

The path taken by T C I was a well-traveled one. In a six-week span between the end of August and the beginning of October, T C I's schedule and resume looks like this: He won the Wellwood final at Woodbine Mohawk Park, the Pennsylvania Sire Stake final at Pocono, the Peter Haughton at Hoosier, the Mohawk

Million when returning north of the border once again, and then won his International Stallion Stake at Lexington.

T C I's two wins alone — in the Mohawk Million when he broke at the start and spotted the field maybe 20 lengths, followed up two weeks later when he bested Karl by the slimmest of margins in their first showdown — warrant the strongest of divisional consideration.

On the flip side, there's no denying the brilliance of Karl. He won three times this year in a time of sub-1:52, the best of which came in 1:51.2. Whatever it was that team Karl took away from that narrow defeat at Lexington's Red Mile, was on full display in the Breeders Crown final where Karl's win over T C I in their rematch was resounding. If Karl does go on to win the 2-year-old honor, it will be that Breeders Crown win that did it. From there, he went on to toy with rivals in the \$267,500 Kindergarten final despite post 10, and then closed out the year by dominating again in the \$423,000 Valley Victory.

Reading the tea leaves, Karl has a couple of first-place votes in the final Hambletonian Society/Breeders Crown poll, so there could even be momentum growing for Trotter of the Year consideration as well.

TWO-YEAR-OLD FEMALE PACER

This division will likely end up going to Geocentric, though that's not to say consideration shouldn't be given to other fillies.

At 3, won 13 of 15 starts to date, including victories in the Matron Pace, Bluegrass, Cane Pace, Hempt Memorial, Meadowlands Pace, North American Cup Elim, and Tattersalls.

TCI's two wins alone — in the Mohawk Million when he broke at the start and spotted the field maybe 20 lengths, followed up two weeks later when he bested Karl by the slimmest of margins in their first showdown — warrant the strongest of divisional consideration.

For most of the season, Geocentric garnered the headlines through her series of fast wins against overwhelmed competition in Kentucky Sire Stake races. Perhaps her most notable win, though, came in the Pennsylvania Sire Stake final race when she lasted by a neck over My Girl EJ. Following a win back at Lexington in an International Stallion Stake and a largely uncontested win in a Breeders Crown elimination race, she had the race taken to her in the Breeders Crown final and faded, in what would be her lone loss in 10 starts this year. It's not to take anything away from how great of a 2-year-old season she had, but it does warrant a mention that her only wins outside of sire-stake competition was in the ISS and in a BC elimination.

But if not Geocentric, then who? In an uncharacteristic less-than-stellar drive from Dexter Dunn in last week's Three Diamonds final, My Girl EJ finished second at odds of 1-9 to Caviart Belle. If she had won that race, I believe she would have won the division. With earnings just shy of \$700,000 and a mark of 1:49.1 taken in that record Breeders Crown final win, My Girl EJ is both the highest earning and fastest 2-year-old pacer, period. How will voters see her 13 5-6-1 record to Geocentric's record of 10 9-0-0?

For that matter, Caviart Belle may not be far off either. She owns a win over My Girl EJ in a PA-Sire Stake, won the Eternal Camnation, and closed out the year with big money wins in the Kindergarten final as well as in the Three Diamonds. Pass Line, second in the Breeders Crown Final, has had a notable season too.

TWO-YEAR-OLD MALE PACER

This is the most wide-open of the 2-year-old divisions and I'm sure a lot of names will be out there under consideration. Captain Albano is probably in the driver's seat for the divisional award, and his record closely mirrors that of the 2-year-old filly just discussed, of Geocentric.

For Captain Albano, he has seven wins through nine starts, and was never worse than second. Outside of his impressive sire-stakes wins, he has victories in both Grand Circuit races at Lexington, the Bluegrass, and International Stallion stakes. He, too, won his Breeders Crown elimination. He lost in an upset as the heavy favorite in the Crown final to Gem Quality, though he's still likely regarded as best in the division.

There's a variety of others out there who are interesting such as Legendary Hanover, Gem Quality, late season bloomer Captain Luke, and a few others, but I'm not sure the overall record is there to support overtaking Captain Albano.

TWO-YEAR-OLD FEMALE TROTTER

Like the male side of the 2-year-old trotters, this has the feel of coming down to just two. Those being Soiree Hanover and Warrawee Michelle.

As with T C I, I'd be inclined to give the nod to Soiree Hanover for the overall body of work. Warrawee Michelle did beat her fast-closing rival by a neck in the Breeders Crown, but Soiree Hanover bested her by an almost identical margin in their race prior in an International Stallion Stake. With six wins in 10 starts and earnings of over \$600,000, she's easily the highest earning female trotter in the division.

Warrawee Michelle turned it on in the latter part of her season and she could still easily gain the divisional honor with just four wins, especially if more weight is given to her Breeders Crown win over Soiree Hanover. Mentions should go out also to Indiana-sire champion Ponda Title who also was second to Soiree Hanover in the Jim Doherty, as well as Kentuckiana and Matron champion R Melina, who would have had an even stronger case had she delivered in last week's Goldsmith Maid, a race that was won by Pizzelle.



Don't call it a comeback, Doug Brown's been here for years

The Canadian Hall of Famer is having fun training and driving Hesohot Hanover.

On Friday (Nov. 24), a familiar name returned to the Woodbine Mohawk Park winner's circle. Trainer/driver Doug Brown disregarded the 30-1 odds on 5-year-old Hesohot Hanover (4, 1:55.1s; \$88,079), instead delivering a last-to-first 1:57 victory from post 10.

"I thought he'd be good, but I didn't think he'd be that good," said the winning driver.

Hesohot Hanover is a Bar Hopping—Hotentrot Hanover gelding owned by Todd Coleman, Paris, ON; Jackson Wittup, Calgary, AB; and James Gillam, Gilmour, ON, and has made the most of his 77 lifetime starts for the same horseman he started out with, Canadian Hall of Fame trainer/driver Brown. It was the trotter's 12th career victory, and first pari-mutuel win at Mohawk since Oct. 31, 2022, when he got the job done for catch driver Paul MacDonell.

Brown told HRU he has been bringing the horse to the Campbellville, ON track himself.

"I'm a one-man show now," Brown said.

Brown was inducted into its Canadian Horse Racing Hall of Fame in 2006. He was an obvious choice, having captured the Ontario Jockey Club's dash-winning title every year between 1988-1997, when the OJC (now Woodbine Entertainment) harness tracks included Greenwood Raceway, Woodbine Racetrack, and Mohawk Raceway. Now 68, Brown has training stats reflecting 416 wins from 2,265 starts, and an even stronger resume as a driver: 8,547 wins from 50,771 drives.

He has three horses at the moment.

"I've got a 2-year-old I'm going to bring back in now, another Bar Hopping [colt], and then we bought a third, a Bar Hopping filly," Brown said. "They're very smart horses. They're smarter than me. The colt is Sushi Bar and the filly is Daffy Hanover. She's good on the track, but she's a little rambunctious in the stall. But that's okay, we can put up with that."

He recently relocated to be a little closer to Woodbine Mohawk Park.

"I'm at Mike Wade's farm, everything's good," he said. "We actually moved in right next door a year ago, so everything worked out

1 think when me and Steve Condren and guys like that broke in, it was way tougher to break in back then... You know, you had the Ronnie Waples and Ronnie Fagan and Bill Wellwood and Ross Curran and Allan Waddell, all those guys, they were mainstays for years and years, and to break in with them, it was tough, it was really tough. really good. I was driving 45 minutes back and forth. Holy crap."

Since Sept. 29, Brown has driven just one horse, Hesohot Hanover, at one track, Woodbine Mohawk Park. Friday night (Dec. 1), he added Angostura Hanover to his WMP schedule alongside last week's upset winner, finishing eighth. He spent most of the year at Kawartha Downs, where he finished ninth in the 2023 driving standings. Brown began his driving career with a winning debut there at age 17, driving a pacer named Out Ahead.

Hesohot Hanover also began his racing career at Kawartha Downs, located on the outskirts of Peterborough, ON. Brown has been his only trainer. He said the trotter got off to a slow start, through no fault of his own.

"I just loved him after about his fourth or fifth start at [age] 2, and then had him all ready and qualified him at Mohawk, I think it was April as a 3-year-old, and that's when the COVID [-19] hit," Brown said. "So, I sent him down to The Meadows with Tim Twaddle and he did pretty good down there, he won three or four races, and he came home with a big knee, so he missed the whole winter that year, just trying to get his knee down. I always said he was probably a better horse in the winter, because his breathing's a little funky. So, this is the first winter I've had a chance to really race him."

Brown said Hesohot Hanover had just 21 starts this season, because of medical issues.



"The reason he was off so much this year is he had three throat surgeries done," he said. "I always said he's a good horse, but he wants to be a great horse. He's just got that attitude. There's nothing about him you don't like; he just wants to go out there and please you every time he's out there, but he's just had so many issues. After the last surgery, he shows bleeding two starts in a row, so I ended up putting on Lasix, and it seems to have really helped him."

With 74 drives this year alone, mostly at Kawartha, Brown has never really retired. The Hall of Famer's one 2022 victory at Woodbine Mohawk Park was Aug. 19, capturing a Pop-Up Series consolation with Hesohot Hanover.

Statistics show that he's driven in pari-mutuel races every season since 1977, but Brown corrected the year to 1972 ("maybe it's carved in stone," he said with a laugh about the older statistics.)

He became the 12th driver in history to reach 8,000 wins on Oct. 5, 2004, reaching the milestone with pacer Solar Jasper at Kawartha. His seven O'Brien Awards speak to the consistent level of his talent on Canada's top circuit.

Dec. 1, Hesohot Hanover and his driver were unable to repeat the previous Friday night's success. Going first-over late, the gelding edged past leader Shes Beer League at threequarters, but fell prey to fast-closing rivals in the stretch, finishing fifth.

"He raced okay [Friday] night, but he wears flip-flops up front and that [sloppy] track certainly didn't suit him," Brown said. "He was just working so hard with those flip-flops; it didn't work out very good for him. He had a tough trip too: He raced first-over. He's a tryer. He wants to be a really good horse, he's just not there, that's all."

Don't expect to see Brown slip away quietly into retirement. He's too keen on Hesohot Hanover and his two young horses.

"I just like doing it," Brown said. "We had been going to Florida, but since the COVID hit, we haven't been back since. We've been going down every winter, and that's actually where [Hesohot Hanover] was broke, Vero Beach in Florida... Hopefully next year we'll head down for the winter."

He said he does think about listing catch drivers more often than he used to.

"I don't know," Brown said. "It's been up in the air the last little while. I think maybe what I will do is just drive my own pretty much; like this guy [Hesohot Hanover], I may start using somebody else on him shortly. I don't know; we'll see what happens... When you only race once a week, it's tough, because you're not getting any breaks: It's not like you're in the next race so you can do the favor back. I just like the training part and the babies."

Never count out "Brownie" at Canada's biggest track. He told HRU it was a more challenging sport to get into back when he first began driving on the OJC circuit.


"No question," he said. "I think when me and Steve Condren and guys like that broke in, it was way tougher to break in back then... You know, you had the Ronnie Waples and Ronnie Fagan and Bill Wellwood and Ross Curran and Allan Waddell, all those guys, they were mainstays for years and years, and to break in with them, it was tough, it was really tough. Now to me it seems much easier for guys to go there and break in... Maybe I'm just biased, but... there was eight or 10 of them who I don't want to say, 'owned the track,' but it was tough to break in back then. If you did, you were doing some good."

Watch for Hesohot Hanover and Brown again, probably as soon as next Friday (Dec. 8). The veteran horseman holds the trotter in high enough esteem to continue racing him at WMP.

"I just think he's good enough for there, plus he goes his best races when you don't use him [early] and he comes from way back," Brown said. "He's been that way his whole life... He's just better at Mohawk because he likes the long stretch there."

Indiana Breed Development program tweaked for 2024

The Indiana Horse Racing Commission approved modifications to the state's breed development program in a meeting held Thursday (Nov. 30). The 2024 program will feature tweaks aimed at strengthening aspects of racing at the fairs and Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing & Casino.

"I think they are all program enhancements that we have made," Jessica Barnes, director racing and breed development for the Indiana Horse Racing Commission, said of the adopted changes. "Each year we look at the program, we look for horsemen's input, and we try to decide how to better the program. Everything that we have done is to take steps to respond to the input that we have received from horsemen and to better the program."

The breed development program will offer just over \$14.6 million budgeted for racing in 2024, up slightly from the \$14.38 million allocated for this season. Most line items are unchanged from this year with the exception of the Indiana Sires Stakes program and Indiana Sired late closers. The most significant change in sires stakes is doubling the purses in the October consolations.

"We have increased the Indiana Sires Stakes consolation purses to \$50,000," Barnes said of the change. "Horses have to have a start in a leg in order to be eligible to those consolations. In the past, the consolations have been first preference given to horses that have started in sires stakes legs, so your point earners that don't make it into the Super Finals. Second preference is to horses that have started in the ISS eligible races written by the race secretary at the pari-mutuel track."

The Indiana Sires Stakes program budget is set at \$8.15 million for next season. Events for sophomores will feature eight legs leading into a \$250,000 Super Final. Freshman will contest six legs. Another change for 2024 is that legs offering

purses of \$75,000 or more will race out of detention. This season, 18 legs did not split into divisions producing purses in excess of \$75,000, three of which were in freshman contests.

Indiana Sired late closers, spring series for horses with limited earnings, will see slight increases. This year \$400,000 was budgeted for the late closers, with \$355,800 spent. The line item is increased to \$425,000 for 2024. The Jerry Landess, Miss Windfall, Cardinal and Mya Tri, which traditionally offer a pair of \$9,000 legs and \$18,000 final, will increase to \$10,000 legs and \$20,000 final. The Hal Dale, Go On BB, Expression and Msnaughtybynature will feature two \$12,000 legs and a \$25,000 final. Previously, the legs were contested for \$11,000 with \$22,000 finals.

"It's been a few years since we've touched those," Barnes said. "We didn't make significant changes, but we gave each of those legs and finals a little boost."

This season the Indiana Sired fair circuit made a stop at Harrah's Hoosier Park, a first for the series. In 2024, the fair will once again make a stop at Hoosier Park, but will feature increased purses.

"The biggest change to the fairs is that we continued the fair stop at Hoosier Park, but we increased those purses from \$3,800 to \$4,200," Barnes said. "We recognize that people have some more expenses when they race at Hoosier Park. We wanted to make that a little more attractive for those horses to come there, but still in line with what the fairs should be."

For many years the Indiana fair circuit has consisted of races leading up to the Governor's Cup Championships in August at the Indiana State Fair. Following the championships, a second series consisting of five stops and a lesser championship were offered. In 2024, the second series championship is replaced with a sixth fair stop, with \$3,300 purses for each race.

"We kept the second series, but we eliminated the second series final and replaced it with another opportunity for those horses," Barnes said.

The budget for Indiana's fair program is set at \$1.45 million, unchanged from this season.









Easy win in Paris for Idao de Tillard

Thierry Duvaldestin trained **Idao de Tillard** (Severino) was the big favorite when the \$125,000 Prix Dynel de Saint-Quentin was included in Vincennes' Saturday (Dec. 2) race card and the talented 5-year-old played with his opponents.

Driver Clement Duvaldestin took a safe start behind horses and eventually found a position fourth over, while Inmarosa controlled the field in front.

At the uphill part of the Vincennes' track, Idao de Tillard got cover three wide and when the last turn ended, the favorite landed outside of Inmarosa, who was beaten at that point.

Clement seemed confident and calm in the bike at the top of the stretch but with 100 meters to go, Francois Lagadeuc found an inside space with Ideal Ligneries. Ideal Ligneries approached the new leader Idao de Tillard, but Clement had the race in his hands and Idao de Tillard won in a mile rate of 1:58.1 over 1.7 miles.

Idao de Tillard's big objective during the winter meeting in Paris is obviously the Prix d'Amérique and the Duvaldestin family choose not to enter the first two B-races, but instead race Idao de Tillard among other 5-year-old trotters.

CALLELA NELSON IN BREEDERS CROWN

Four divisions in the \$72,000 Breeders Crown finals were held in Seinäjoki, Finland on Saturday (Dec. 2) afternoon and in the 4-year-olds division, Hannu Torvinen was successful with **Callela Nelson** (Beer Summit), who also claimed the title in the Breeders Crown as a 3-year-old.

Callela Nelson won in a mile rate of 1:57.1 over 1.3 miles.

Antti Teivanen sat behind **Dorea Frido** (Muscle Hill) in the 4-year-old mares division and the duo won in a moderate mile rate of 1:59 over 1.3 miles.

In the 3-year-olds races, filly **Viens Ici** (Quite Easy) proved best for driver Santtu Raitala in a mile rate of 2:01.2 over 1.3 miles,


while **Fly By Me** (Muscle Mass) claimed the title for 3-year-old colts and geldings in a mile rate of 2:01.2.

Time is our foe, embrace the slow

"Sign me up for your sport. You know how it thrills me to move at glacial speed," said nobody.

We aren't fast. And the next four months are the slowest part of our harness racing cycle. For an owner/breeder with a new broodmare, a positive pregnancy report for a mare is followed by an 11-month wait for the birth of a foal. Another year-and-a-half to get the resulting foal to market.

After purchasing a yearling, owners face month after month of training with hefty bills and occasional news bulletins, sometimes bad news. If you are lucky, your 2-year-old races sporadically, with weeks between races. For a successful 2-year-old, that is 15 minutes of action. For an unsuccessful 2-year-old, the owner does not get any action. Sure, the pace sometimes picks up in the racing season as a 3-year-old, but in the best circumstances, the action is not fast and furious.

Years ago, when the entertainment and wagering universes were primitive, long before a new species of humans roamed the earth with cell phones glued to their faces, these chasms of nothingness were tolerable. However, a vacuum of action is deadly for harvesting new participants in 2024.

Today, a computer page loading slowly can cause tremors of anxiety. Our attention is scattered. We simultaneously watch a streamed movie while wagering online on horse races and ordering Door Dash. Our addictions to phones and digital sites are real. Breathtaking technological innovations leave us gasping and make us nervous wrecks trying to keep up.

Except for those members indoctrinated and afflicted with the harness racing virus in days of yore, our game will never be fast enough. As thrilling as owning part of a racehorse on race day is, efforts to compete in non-stop engagement are between futile and useless. Doing nothing is worse than futile.

Allow a strange little thought for members of our racing tribe and new visitors; lean into the slow. Go counterculture and embrace our leisurely pace.

Horses can be part of a prescription for more mindfulness. When you work in the barn or visit a farm with horses, leave your phone at home or in the car. Try to carve out a few hours away from your devices. The total disconnection ship has sailed, but islands of calm around animals are a simple starting point.

Most of us ache to make our lives richer by living with less and slower. Some folks may seek passions that allow them to slow down and savor simpler pleasures; this may be an opening for our sport. Changing a lifestyle is not easy, but our horses seem to have a soothing effect.

Horses can be part of a prescription for more mindfulness. When you work in the barn or visit a farm with horses, leave your phone at home or in the car. Try to carve out a few hours away from your devices. The total disconnection ship has sailed, but islands of calm around animals are a simple starting point.

Another benefit of including horses in a quest for a slightly slower pace is that our sport, in all its facets, can take us out of the house and into nature. The sights, smells, and sounds of a barn or a nature trail make life move slower. Nature and animals help us think deeper.

While our sport is not fast, our community is welcoming. With a little effort, harness-raising members can make friends, open dialogues, and join a group that occasionally offers face-to-face conversations and interactions.

And here is an odd thought. After a day in the country with nature and horses, try extending your mindfulness by journaling when you get home. Journaling is not for everyone but is a private, personal activity that might surprise you. Sit down with a pen and let your mind ramble.

Every year, every device, artificial intelligence, and media push us faster and faster. Perhaps our sport and the ever-magical horses we rely on can help us slow down. In recruiting a new person to join you in a harness horse adventure, use our slowness, community, and mindfulness as benefits, not obstacles.





Harness racing is all Kelly Case Ingraham dreamed of doing

Born and raised in Lewiston, ME, Kelly Case Ingraham is no stranger to the sport of harness racing. She is a second generation horseperson who comes from a renowned harness racing family.

Daughter of trainer/driver Walter Case, Sr., Kelly decided to follow her father's path early on.

Harness racing and standardbred horses became a part of Kelly's life when she was a small child and remains so today as she works alongside her husband, horseman David Ingraham.

After Kelly married David and gave birth to two children — Dustin Tyler, 35, and Kelsie, 27 — her family became her No. 1 priority. When the kids were old enough Kelly began taking them to the barn with her and they grew up around the horses as she had.

Kelly's dad got her started in the business.

"My brothers and I grew up at Lewiston Raceway in Maine for my father had a stable there," Kelly said. "We looked up to and wanted to be just like him; a trainer and a driver. I started going to the barn at age 15 and it wasn't long after that I knew this was what I wanted to do for the rest of my life.

"I began working for horseman, Harold Ralph, and I started driving with my father after my brother went to Monticello. Soon thereafter I started my own stable and began getting catch drives."

At 16, Kelly met her future husband.

"We have been together now for 37 years and work every day side by side," she said.

"I want to think we make a great team, both on the track and off."

Kelly has driven at various racetracks in Canada and the United States. In 2012 she won the Mildred Williams International Ladies Driving Championship at Pocono Down, driving Sleigh Belle to a tight victory in the first race of the Williams series.

"That same year I also won the Sweetheart Pace at Pompano Park with 9-year-old mare, Indianridge Sophia, going wire-to-wire," she said. "It was an upset at 6-1."

Kelly may not be as renowned as some of the other female drivers in the sport, but she has certainly made an impact.

During her career she's had 6,120 wins, 633 seconds, 942 thirds, and earned \$3,883,827.

An accomplishment to be proud of indeed.

Through the decades Kelly has driven for a lot of trainers. Who do you most respect and why?

"I look up to a lot of trainers, but I am forever thankful to the ones who had faith in me and gave me drives, such as: Jerry Smith, Elmer Ballard, Greg Libby and Evert Radcliff, all who have sadly passed, but will never be forgotten," Kelly said. "As far as who I think has made an impact on the sport, there are so many great horsemen and each and every one needs a shout of thanks and respect."

The team of David and Kelly made Pompano Park in South Florida their second home up until the devastation and heartache of the tracks demise.

"Some of my best memories and lifelong friends were made at Pompano Park," Kelly said. "I will miss racing there so much, like so many other people who called Pompano Park their winter home. Sadly, the land was more valuable than the horsemen were. So many horsemen and their families lost their livelihood and pretty much their life when Pompano closed."

Today David and Kelly stable in Greene, ME, in the summer, and Sunshine Meadows in Florida, in the winter.

"Presently we have 6 horses in our stable and a broodmare and colt we keep in Massachusetts," she said.

When it comes to her fastest and favorite horse, Kelly has multiples that fit the bill.

'The fastest horse(s) was Camachine and Rocks A Patriot," she said. "My favorites are Nifty Christy, Trusty Star and How Now Dow."

Kelly said she doesn't worry when her husband is driving horses, because he is good at what he does.

"David has over 53,000 drives so he knows how to be as safe as you can out there," Kelly said. "You never know what is going to happen in a race and sometimes you have a split second to make a decision.

"There have been a few drivers that have lost their life while driving in a race, but it's what we do and know the possible danger."

The apples didn't fall far from the tree, as both of Kelly's children followed her and David into the business.

"Our son, Dustin, owns and ships horses, and our daughter, Kelsie, who grooms and owns harness horses, have both been in the

business their entire lives," she said.

Although our sport has changed much over the years, there's nothing else that Kelly would want to be doing.

"I am afraid that our sport is not getting the positive coverage it should," Kelly said. "There are so many hard-working dedicated horsemen who unfortunately have lost their livelihood due to so many of our harness tracks closing.

"Although our sport has declined since my father was in it years ago, harness racing is still one of the most exciting sports today. I am proud of what I have accomplished in my lifetime and career and proud to have grown up in Lewistown, ME."

Note: With the unthinkable and heartbreaking news about the fire at Tioga, our harness family has really stepped up to help those who were the victims. I'm so touched that there are so many horsepeople who have helped (in any way they could) to get these people back on their feet. There is nothing worse than losing one of your 'kids' that horrific way.

Tim Twaddle notches career training win 1,000 at The Meadows

Tim Twaddle collected career training win 1,000 Friday (Dec. 1) at Hollywood Casino at The Meadows when **Spitfire Oversees** won the seventh race.

One-thousand wins is an impressive milestone for any trainer, yet it may be even more meaningful for Twaddle, 61, who was forced by injury to abandon his career as one of harness racing's elite drivers.

"I made the comment once after winning the Metro Pace [with Shipps Saint in 1991] that 'I will never train horses. When it's time for me to give up driving, I'll just say good night." Twaddle said. "I was quoted as saying that. It just goes to show that the best way for us to make God laugh is to make plans."

Twaddle grew up in St. Catharines, ON, a stone's throw from the now defunct Garden City Raceway. As a treat, his mother would drive young Tim to an access road that overlooked the track. From there, they'd watch a few races before Tim's bedtime.

"Most kids were getting stories read to them," he said. "I was getting the Daily Double."

Twaddle's sister Cindy, who worked as a messenger bettor at the track, introduced him to trainer Bill Carroll, who hired him to clean stalls and buckets and, eventually, as a driver. That launched a career studded with highlights.

He won the 1993 Jugette with Towner's Image and took the 1994 Breeders Crown 3-Year-Old Filly Pace with Hardie Hanover, who would be named Canada's divisional champion that year. Twaddle amassed 1,946 driving wins; his combined training/driving purses exceed \$23 million.

But it was in 1985 that the chain of misfortune began. On Dec. 5, he went down in a Flamboro Downs race mishap that shattered his hip. If ever a cloud had a silver lining, it was that one.

"In surgery, they discovered I had a leaky aorta valve that

they had to replace years later," Twaddle said. "That accident saved my life."

Recovered from that setback, Twaddle found it hard to get enough quality assignments despite his stellar record.

"It was tough to get catch drives," he said. "I don't think anybody thought I was healthy enough or would ever be the same."

After a few stops elsewhere, Twaddle moved his tack to The Meadows, where a 2006 spill administered the coup de grace to his driving career.

"I broke my hand and suffered nerve damage that never really healed properly," he said. "I never know when my hand will go numb. I needed to break into the game again."

From the start, Twaddle enjoyed training success at The Meadows, yet his numbers have skyrocketed in recent years. That outstanding performance has been fueled in part by two factors. The first is the heavy involvement of Twaddle's wife Sophia, a former caretaker and trainer who is both whirlwind and a model of efficiency.

"We have a great staff, and she keeps everybody moving," Twaddle said of his wife. "Thanks to her, I've learned to delegate more."

The other factor is Twaddle's association with Anthony MacDonald, who has sent many horses from his **TheStable.ca** fractional ownership groups to Twaddle. Fittingly, MacDonald piloted Spitfire Oversees to Friday's milestone victory.

"It's been a wonderful relationship." Twaddle said. "He's brought us an influx of power. I was always struggling to get into the Top 10, but now I'm able to post those numbers. I used to have nine or 10 horses. Now I have 30 at the track all the time."

Among those horses is the star of the stable, Fourever Boy (Sweet Lou—Macharoundtheclock, 1:48.2f), whom Twaddle owns with Micki Rae Stables. The 4-year-old marked himself as a national-caliber pacer last year by finishing second in the Little Brown Jug and winning Pennsylvania's championship. He's banked \$935,588 in his career.

All in all, Twaddle says, training horses may be more demanding than driving them.

"It's tough to get one win, so getting 1,000 wins is a horse of a different color," he said. "That's why I'm so impressed with the numbers Ronnie Burke puts up. I'm also very careful not to open my mouth and criticize my drivers because I know how tough it is out there."

Even more strenuous is the emotional ride on the training roller coaster.

"I'm a lot more nervous watching my horses race than I was driving them," Twaddle said. "It's nerve wracking. It's like watching someone dance with my wife."

Skoglund's Christmas wish: Relocate to The Big M

Rikard Skoglund's name isn't one that's familiar to The Meadowlands' fans, but if the 34-year-old native of Sweden has his way, it will be in the not-too-distant future.

Skoglund, who has dreams of relocating to The Big M dancing in his head, guided **Bonanza** to an authoritative, first-over 1¼-length score Friday night (Dec. 1), and in the process, Bonanza lifted his lifetime stats to seven wins from 10 lifetime starts for Skoglund's friend, trainer Per Engblom.

The 4-year-old horse by Muscle Hill—Designed To Be stopped the clock in the low-end conditioned trot in 1:55.4 and returned \$10 to win as the 4-1 second choice in the wagering.

"The racing is a little bit different in Sweden than here," said Skoglund. "The plan was to leave, [but after having to go first-over] I kept him going without pushing him."

Skoglund is a full-time driver in Sweden who has close to 1,500 career wins and has been in the top-10 in the standings there for the last five years. He's hoping things fall into place for the 4,000-mile move to East Rutherford from Stockholm.

"I am here because I have been watching the races from the U.S. my entire life," said Skoglund. "I wanted to try coming here because I like the way you race here.

"I will be here for three weeks this time, and then go back home before Christmas. I have a baby boy and need to speak with my fiancé. If I make some progress, I'm going to try and move here. I would like to relocate, that's my dream. Per has told me that the market is big enough for me to not only drive his horses, but others as well."

A LITTLE MORE: Marcus Miller's second of two winners on the night was **Pull Me Through**, who paid \$106.20 to win in the 13th race, keying the giant Late 50-cent Pick-4 return of \$42,763. Joining Miller with two driving wins were Patrick Ryder, Yogi Sheridan, Brett Beckwith and Tyler Miller. All-source wagering on the 14-race card totaled \$2,639,108.

Gaitway Guy strong in DSBF pacing prelim

Gaitway Guy (\$2.10) maintained the top spot among Delaware-sired 3-year-old male pacers with a 1:55 win in his \$20,000 first-round division of the Delaware Standardbred Breeders' Fund (DSBF) series on Thursday (Nov. 30) at Bally's Dover. **Marshal Dillon** (\$11.00) captured the other split in 1:56.

Driver Corey Callahan eased Gaitway Guy off the gate and settled him fourth behind 21-1 shot Delightinhisglory (driven by Tim Tetrick) on the first turn before brushing to control just past a :27.4 first quarter. The Delmarvalous—Brussels Hanover gelding coasted unchallenged through middle splits of :57.2 and 1:26.1 before keeping Delightinhisglory, who pulled the pocket in upper stretch, a length at bay at the winning post. Notte's Mist (Allan Davis) was a ground-saving third after stalking the top pair throughout.

Jeffrey Smith trains Gaitway Guy, an 11-time winner from 15 starts with \$239,400 in career earnings, for owner/breeder GTY Stable.

In the other division, Marshal Dillon rode the pocket to victory in his debut for trainer Kevin Lare. Tony Morgan landed the Badlands Hanover—Eagle Molly gelding behind early pacesetter Night Terror (Davis) through a :27.4 first split, and the pair sat chilly while Night Terror contended with a first-over challenge from Georgy T (Montrell Teague) up the backstretch. Marshal Dillon wedged out of the pocket at the eighth pole and burst to the lead, downing Night Terror by a widening length. Cards A Flyin (Corey Callahan) swung three-wide off stalling cover turning for home and finished third.

Briskey Stables LLC owns Marshal Dillon, who has won six times and earned \$58,423 in his career.

The second round of the Dover DSBF series for 3-year-olds will take place Dec. 4-7, with trotting fillies meeting Monday, male trotters Tuesday, pacing fillies Wednesday, and male pacers Thursday. The top eight point earners in each division after the second preliminary round will qualify for their respective \$110,000 finals the following week.

NJSS adds third leg for freshmen in 2024

The New Jersey Sires Stakes (NJSS) will add a third preliminary leg to the program's premier division for 2-year-olds pacers and trotters in 2024.

This expansion serves the considerable increase in both the quantity and quality of NJ. breds over the past several years.

This growth is a direct result of the New Jersey legislators' vision to support and nurture the growth of NJ's regional breeding program with an annual grant beginning in 2019.

Mike Gulotta, chairman of the board of trustees of the New Jersey Sire Stakes said, "Adding a third leg to the 2-year-old sire stakes represents yet another step forward for the NJSS program which only recently raised its purses by 20 per cent."

Tentatively, the 2-year-old NJSS will be raced at The Meadowlands throughout the month of July with all leg purses set at \$25,000 and the finals for each division on Hambletonian weekend at \$240,000.

"Adding a third leg gives the trainer the option of giving the horse a week off if they choose. It also provides another chance for those who need it for one reason or another," said Meadowlands president Jeff Gural.

Gural on doping and more

I read what I assume was an **editorial in last Sunday's HRU** and you hit the nail on the head. Unfortunately, the reality is that nobody cares as the vast majority of tracks are owned by casino owners and almost all of the purse money is generated by slot machines. As a result, doing anything to increase handle at a track with slot machines makes little or no sense.

I do agree that my dispute with Faraldo hurts the sport and a few years ago I was on a panel with Joe in Saratoga and I went up to him afterwards and asked him if he wanted to bury the hatchet for the good of the sport and he made it clear that he had no interest. At least you should know I tried.

As far as performance enhancing drugs, all one has to do is read the transcripts of the trial of Lisa Gianelli formerly Lisa Ranger and Seth Fishman and you would see exactly how bad it is. Lisa was a [salesperson] for Fishman selling both therapeutic and performance enhancing drugs and receiving a commission of 17 per cent of sales. It is illegal for anyone to be buying any drugs from a veterinarian who has not examined your horse before they prescribe the medication. She would visit the training centers every two weeks and drop off the medications that were ordered by her customers. Since she was getting a commission, it was in her best interest to encourage the sale of these medications and to the best of my knowledge no one called the USTA hotline to report this illegal activity.

So far, we have only been able to view the customers that Gianelli was selling to and have not been able to obtain the records of who was buying drugs directly from Fishman. I was told there are an additional 200 names on that list, but so far we have not been able to obtain the information.

I do actually agree with Faraldo on his complaint about handing out suspensions for positives triggered by nanogram levels of therapeutic medications designed to keep horses healthy. In Ohio, four trainers including Ake (Svanstedt) received positives for overages of DEX which everyone knew including the Commission were inaccurate. Rather than try to actually get to the truth they have done everything possible to avoid determining what actually happened and instead are relying on the results from their lab which they know are flawed. We even asked to have the urine tested and we would agree to whatever the results of the urine sample and they refused to test the urine since they knew it would show that the lab mishandled the four samples. One good thing about HISA is they seem to be reasonable when it comes to this issue and are willing to listen and adjust their own rules and correct mistakes unlike state regulators.

Your comments about why we don't reduce the length of drag is totally correct and makes no sense except for the fact that we would all have to agree together, and no one is willing to do that. A few years ago, we reached out to the other major tracks to ask if they would be willing to experiment and reduce the drag, and other than ourselves no one had any interest. If you would like to reach out to the track owners and see if they would be interested, that would be much appreciated as we are absolutely ready and willing to reduce the drag as it makes it almost impossible to make the experience of coming to the races as enjoyable as it once was.

Thanks for at least trying but the USTA is a democratic members organization, and they seem happy with the leadership in place.
