# Dexter Dunn has a nose for money

The leading driver in North America in earnings is well positioned to win his third straight Driver of the Year title.

Just how much of a money driver is Dexter Dunn? He entered December #1 in North America with earnings exceeding \$15 million, but only ranked 31<sup>st</sup> in wins with 289.

Apart from being the favorite to win a third straight Driver of the Year award, Dunn is a locked to score a share of the Horse of the Year award as the pilot of Bulldog Hanover.



In the past three years, Dunn has been the driver of the HOY runner-up:

2021 – Niki Hill

2020 - Party Girl Hill

2019 - Bettors Wish

This would be the fourth straight year Dunn has been the driver of the horse that finished either first or second in the HOY race.

The record for consecutive years that a driver has finished 1-2 in the HOY race is six buy Stanley

He won the title in 1967, '68 and '69 with Nevele Pride and 1971 and '72 with Albatross. In between those two, he was second in 1970 with Most Happy Fella.

Dunn was born on Sept. 1 1989. That means John Campbell has been the all-time leading driver by earnings for every second Dunn has been alive. Campbell took over the top spot in 1987 and still leads with just shy of \$300 million in career purse earnings.

## DAN PATCH NOTES THROUGH THE **YEARS**

- Victory Song was HOY in 1947, year one of the award, with a 1:57.3 race mark. No horse, pacers included, lowered that mark until Adios Butler in 1960 at 1:54.3 TT.
- · Who was the first division winner for Hall Of Famer Ray Remmen? No, not Shiaway St Pat

- who was third in the 1981 3YOCT category. Remmen's first division winner was 1983 with Duchess Faye the outstanding trotting mare. She won it 207 votes to 43 over Tiffany Star.
- Bill O'Donnell drove back-to-back HOY winners - both sophomores and one of each gait. He won with trotter Fancy Crown in 1984 and Nihilator in 1985.
- Forgotten filly? It seems so. Areba Areba was actually the 1980 2YOFP award winner over Fan Hanover 144-78. She also remains the only filly to appear in a \$2 million race, finishing fourth in the 1980 Woodrow Wilson won by Land Grant for a purse of \$2,011,000 for Team Kopas.
- Rambling Willie holds the distinction for the most top 10 finishes in HOY balloting with six:

1975 6th with nine first-place votes

1976 6th again with eight first-place votes

1977 3rd this time with 28 backers – a personal best

1978 8th with three who voted yes

1979 7th with a pair of positive votes

1981 4th with 12 first-place votes at age 11



- In 1980, the year Niatross was HOY, there was a mad scramble for Trotter of the Year honors. A record 15 trotters got at least one vote for Trotter of the Year that season. Classical Way wound up winning it 146 to 23 over Final Score, with 22 votes for Burgomeister.
- Hambletonian winners 1-2 in HOY voting? Yes, it happened in 2007 when Donato Hanover far outdistanced the field, but the 2008 Hambletonian winner Deweycheatumnhowe was next. He also was next in 2008 to Somebeachsomewhere.
- Is there any award to be given to a horse who defeats two Horses of the Year? Lady B Fast did it with Nevele Pride and Fresh Yankee in 1969 and 1970, respectively. Armbro Dallas did it in the same race in 1985 \$770,000 Pilgrim upending both Forrest Skipper and Nihilator in the latter's next-to-last career start. But a special award has to be given to Jefs Eternity who defeated 1981 HOY Fan Hanover, but also Cam Fella in 1983 at Freehold. She was the only female to ever upend the "Pacing Machine."
- Three Horses of the Year on the same card? Yes, in 2002 at the Meadowlands, Gallo Blue Chip, Bunny Lake and Real Desire raced.
- In 1975, Savoir wound up the HOY in a year in which 16 horses received backing. Armbro Nesbit was second to Savoir 48-32.

• Jack Darling going into the Canadian Hall of Fame the same year as winning the Horse of the Year award? Is there a precedent for this? Yes there is.

1969 Stanley Dancer was inducted into the Hall Of Fame the same year Nevele Pride was HOY

1970 Joe O'Brien inducted, Fresh Yankee HOY

- She wasn't HOY and she never made it past her 2-year-old season, but her name lives on. We just passed now 64 years since the passing of Merrie Annabelle on Nov. 30, 1958. She was the 2YOFT award winner of that year and the freshman fillies have competed in a race named in her honor since. Merrie Annabelle the racehorse was the season's champ on a half-mile track at 2:05.2, with a 2:00 mark on the mile track. She won the American National, the Hanover Shoe Filly Stake and the Hoosier Futurity (Tie Silk second) as well as the Saul Camp Memorial at the Red Mile.
- Which horse had the fewest North American starts one year and still made the top three in HOY balloting? Varenne 2001 had two starts. Bunny Lake won the award that year 68-34 over Syrinx Hanover. Varenne got 28 votes in a solid showing.

# The Big Guy

Gargantuan gelding Wheels On Fire heating up winter racing at Mohawk

Standardbreds come in many shapes and sizes, but few stand out like Woodbine Mohawk Park regular Wheels On Fire (p, 4, 1:48.1m; \$810,816 US).

"He's the biggest horse I've ever seen, I would say," said Doug McNair, Wheels On Fire's current driver. "There's been a lot of big ones I drove in the past, but every time I go to race him, he just impresses me. When he comes over, he looks like one of those Clydesdale horses. He's that big, and he might be the fastest horse I've driven off the gate in some time."

Bred and owned by William J. Donovan of Delray Beach, FL and originally named Monsoon Surge, Wheels On Fire (Somebeachsomewhere–Ab Fab) only made four starts at age 2, when he began his career in Pennsylvania for trainer Ron Burke. The gelding's maiden victory came in April 2018 at The Meadowlands. He finished the season with 11 wins in 17 starts, including a five-race all-stakes win streak to conclude the year.

Wheels On Fire got his 4-year-old campaign rolling with his first sub-1:50 win (1:49.1m), March 30, 2019 at The Meadowlands. He worked his way up to the preferred at The Big M, but it was

Wheels On Fire won his first start for new trainer Richard Moreau on Feb. 15, 2020, rapidly moving up to the preferred and capturing two in a row for driver Louis-Philippe Roy.

July 4, 2020, Wheels On Fire first teamed up with Doug McNair for a nose-margin victory in the Mohawk preferred handicap. In 2021, they would come out on top of the Campbellville track's competitive top-class pacers, earning the gelding the O'Brien Award for Canada's Older Male Pacer of the Year. June 25, 2022, McNair went over the \$70 million mark for winnings as a driver, fittingly behind the biggest horse of his career, in their 17th win together.

"He can go an eighth in :12 flat, and then you can steal the next quarter in :31. He's just the nicest horse to drive, too," said McNair. The pair went undefeated through October and November 2022 at Mohawk's preferred-2 classification, which the driver considered identical to preferred on most occasions.

"It was the exact same horses. I don't know why they put a preferred-2; it should have been preferred [on Nov. 19], but they made it preferred-2 again, [even though] Warrawee Vital was in there."





"Usually, you can put a big trot bike on those horses and they don't even come close. I had a big trot bike on him and he was hitting the wheels, so they actually had to order one just for him. He even touches this one, once in a while. That's how big he is.

"But he's not like a typical big horse. Most horses that big, they take a while to get going, and you can't start and stop them. But he's like driving a little horse – you can step on the brake, and then you can press on the gas pedal two seconds later and he'll get going again. He's one of a kind, I think."

In the colder weather, Wheels On Fire really lives up to his name

"He maybe won't win a race all winter," said McNair, "But this is usually where he shines, from now [December] until next spring or next summer. He can go as fast in the winter as he can in the summer. He's that type of horse, which is handy to have in the wintertime. In the summertime, when they get going :47 and change... he's just a little bit behind... those top, top horses.

"Actually the last time he won, they didn't go too much – it was in :51 and change, but it was a real windy night. The little horses, they were struggling that night, and he was plowing through the wind like it was nothing. It didn't bother him."

Standing in the paddock alongside one of the smallest horses currently based at Mohawk, the contrast between Wheels On Fire and Woodmere Stealdeal looked like a photoshopped image.

"I think he's very unique," said McNair. "I think he's the biggest one racing there right now. Every time I look at him, I try to quess his weight. He might weigh 1,200 pounds."


Wheels On Fire tangled with heavy-hitters like Bulldog Hanover and Jimmy Freight earlier in the season, recording 10 victories in 36 races so far this year, all at Woodbine Mohawk Park, all with McNair in the sulky.

"I think he's got around \$300,000 made this year. He made \$280,000 last year, so he's got over half a million or \$600,000 in two years. He's been a pleasure," said his regular driver. "There's no horses around in Canada right now that are as nice as him, consistently, you know. He shows up every week."

# Cuatro De Julio is an interesting new boy

With a number of interesting trotting stallions entering the stud in '23, I'm starting with Cuatro De Julio since he was a proud product of Kentucky.

Cuatro is sired by Trixton, and out of Clarabelle, by Ready Cash. For those of us with long memories, Clarabelle was a famous cow in someone's advertising campaign in days of yore. He was foaled in 2018, has a record at 4 of 1:51, and earned \$879,061.

He was trained by Marie Ortolan Bar, a French trainer who relocated to Kentucky. For those who share my conviction that brilliance at 2 is the best signpost of future success in the stud, Cuatro comes with great creds.

He raced 14 times at 2, starting at the Kentucky fairs where the tracks are far from ideal for a young trotter. Obviously they didn't bother him, because he was close to invincible there. When he graduated to the Red Mile stables, he showed both his speed and his class when he won in 1:51.3 in his division of the International Stallion stakes.

With this kind of accomplishment, it is hard to understand why some smart breeder didn't pick up on this colt then, after his 2-year-old season, but they didn't. It's a given that the big outfits are somewhat conservative and wait till a horse has come back and raced well at 3.

But if you're smaller, and smarter, Cuatro is just the kind of future sire you should be looking for. Again, in the words of Augustus Caesar and Matt Damon, luck loves the bold.

Cuatro's pedigree is well worth a closer look. On the top, he is purely American-bred, for which this kid takes a little credit. His sire, Trixton, is by Muscle Hill, a great example of a horse with a superior Genotype.

To review quickly, every horse has two aspects, the Phenotype, or living horse, and the Genotype, the genetic profile. I envision every horse's Genotype as a deck of playing cards, running from a low card of 2 to a high card of Ace.

At the time of equine conception, each parent contributes 50 per cent of its genetic makeup, and they blend to establish the

Genotype of their offspring. Envisioning each parent's speed gene as a card in the genetic deck, Muscle Hill clearly has a genetic range that starts with a high card.

That means that even if the mare only has a speed gene range that has no high cards, Muscle Hill's high card speed gene means the foal they produce will, at worst, be a decent trotter who can hold his or her own at the raceways.

But if the mare in the hypothetical mating contributes a higherthan-average card, the result is a stakes horse who can win at a high level. Which is why Muscle Hill sires such a high percentage of stakes winners, and always will.

Grand Circuit winner Temporal Hanover arrives at Premier Acres for the 2023 breeding season after two successful seasons on the track. Conditioned by Marcus Melander, the near-millionaire hit the board in 19 of 25 starts, with nine wins. His pedigree is filled with champions and black type winners. From the first crop of World Champion and leading sire Walner, the stallion is out of Think Twice, half-sister to 2006 Horse of the Year Glidemaster. Temporal Hanover's grandam, Cressida Hanover, is a half-sister to Cynara Hanover, grandam of dual hemisphere champion and Elitloppet winner Nuncio.

Temporal Hanover is well-placed to take advantage of the growing and lucrative Indiana Sires Stakes program and has the race credentials, pedigree and perfectly packaged physique to immediately impact the studbook.

Temporal Hanover held his own against harness racing's best, regularly battling on the Grand Circuit and in New Jersey Sire Stakes. He finished first or second 17 times, and as a sophomore he registered miles of 1:53 or faster in 10 of 13 attempts, trotting in under 1:51 three times while repeatedly showing last quarters in under 27 seconds.

His top line, or Tail-Male side of his pedigree, is strictly French. On the bottom, however, or Tail-Mare, there's a heavy infusion of good American blood.

Clarabelle's second dam is sired by Defi D'Aunou, whose sire is the Hambo winner Armbro Goal, a blueblood by Speedy crown and out of the great mare Armbro Flight.

Armbro Flight was a daughter of Helicopter, who happened to be the first standardbred bought by Elgin Armstrong, of the Canadian Armstrong Bros. dynasty. Elgin had stopped at Ben White training center, in Orlando, FL. After watching all the horses training on what was then the "Winter Capitol of Harness Racing," he introduced himself to Delvin Miller.

Before the day was done, Miller sold Elgin a promising trotting folly just turned 3 for \$8,500. That was Helicopter, who won the 1953 Hambletonian and started Elgin Armstrong on his way to becoming one of the foundation pillars of our sport.


Helicopter's daughter, Armbro Flight, lost the Hambletonian to Egyptian Candor in an epic race-off. Egyptian Candor was trained by Stanley Dancer but driven by his close friend, Del Cameron, because Dancer had the big favorite, Noble Victory, who couldn't handle the heavy going after a day of rain before Hambletonian Day.

To which, let me say, Thank the Lord, because if Noble Victory had won the big race, I would never have gotten the chance to syndicate him a year later for a million dollars. He was the first horse to sell for a million, and he got me started as a respectable player in The Big Time.

Back to Cuatro, there's one more notable aspect. Clarabelle, Cuatro's dam, is out of Rebelle, whose dam is out of Island Dream, by the great Coktail Jet, one of many masterpieces created by J.P. DuBois. DuBois is unquestionably the greatest French standardbred breeder of all time, and one of the most influential in the overall history of our breed. His hand was felt in the breeding of Cuatro De Julio, and, I believe, also in his training.

So now, a prediction; Cuatro De Julio will be a success as a sire. His name in translation, is Fourth of July. When the first foals of his hit the tracks in 2026, I predict it will be Christmas in July.

# **Factoids from Facebook**

As some of you may know, this scribe wastes a considerable amount of time on Facebook. After all, what else does an 81-year-old retired gent have to do with a surplus amount of spare time. I read — and perhaps too often — initiate some of the numerous topics discussed on that website. Most of which I write about there relates to harness racing. I thinki some of my best and most significant writing appears there. I would be remiss if I didn't also mention that my writings sometimes are not the best and can get me in trouble. That's part of the reason why I am called The Curmudgeon.

This week, I thought I would impose on my readership to rehash what I believe to be some of my most interesting Facebook posts and comments.

Last Sunday Dr Nena Winand posted a lovely picture of Bettors Delight romping in his paddock. The back story on this is Nena owns Lady Mattgalane(\$378,257). She rescued the mare in foal to an unknown percheron. She raised her foal, now a yearling, that she calls Cantore to become a pleasure horse. Given that Lady Mattgalane is in the best of health, she decided to breed her to So Surreal. As sometimes happens, she did not catch. She is now booked to Bettors Delight in 2023. Nena posted a picture of her consort to be.

# Me on Bettors Delight:

"I remember evaluating him as a yearling 23 years ago. Back then we had what we called a Diamond Session on the Sunday night to start off the sale. It was part of my job to pick the 70 or so most appealing yearlings to be sold that evening. I chose him as one of them. He was just a little fella, small, but correct. I thought to myself, 'It's early, he'll grow by sale time.' He might have grown, but not much. I remember receiving a couple of comments on sale day as to why there was a runt in an ultra-select session. I don't remember exactly what he brought, but it was a more than a decent price. He was bought by John Grant, Brad's father. I think he might have bought the

colt mostly because Mr. Grant had owned his dam Classic Wish who was a good race filly for him. Bettors Delight was her first foal. A decent number of good horses came from that session, but that 'runt' was the best of them all — both on the racetrack and in the breeding shed.

"Here's something about Bettors Delight and Western Hanover: Their respective first crops were generally not liked when receiving their first training lessons. The feedback we received was not positive, They were thought of as sulky and disinterested in their work. I recall Charley Karp returning from the Florida training centers telling me: 'The Artsplaces (who also had his first crop out that year) look fantastic. But the smartest thing that Hanover could do with Western Hanover is to make a gelding out of him. The trainers don't like them at all.' Well, Charley, you were right on the money with Artsplace."

## **On Monday:**

"Alcohol Free, a multiple Grade 1 winning filly sells today at Tattersalls (Great Britain). Some think she may become the highest-priced female ever sold at public auction. She is sired by harness racing's Ice Wine Stable's former star No Nay Never. No Nay Never stands at Coolmore in Ireland for a stud fee of 175,000 pounds sterling. Hall of Famer to be Frank Antonacci is still involved in his ownership."

# After watching the Valley Victory and the Kindergarten final:

"If Volume Eight had a bad week (as quoted of trainer Noel Daley), I would pay admission to see him when he has a good one. A simply breathtaking colt!"

#### On the same horse:

"If I'm Diamond Creek or Hanover — or anybody else looking to stand a great trotter in Pennsylvania — I'm trying to get him locked up right now for his stud career after he's done racing — whatever it takes. Maybe I'm wrong, but I think he could be easily syndicated — even at a crazy price right now. Some might say he hasn't raced enough and they might be right. But he has raced enough to get my vote for Two Year Old Trotter of the Year. I'm not quite crazy enough to do it myself, but if someone else did, I wouldn't be the slightest bit critical of them."

# More on Volume Eight and beyond. In response to a query about the colt's maternal family:

"His maternal family means nothing relative to his becoming a successful stallion or not. Of course, I would much sooner have a maternal family considered superior than one that is not.

Back then we had what we called a Diamond Session on the Sunday night to start off the sale. It was part of my job to pick the 70 or so most appealing yearlings to be sold that evening. I chose him as one of them. He was just a little fella, small, but correct. I thought to myself, 'It's early, he'll grow by sale time.' He might have grown, but not much. I remember receiving a couple of comments on sale day as to why there was a runt in an ultra-select session... A decent number of good horses came from that session, but that 'runt' was the best of them all — both on the racetrack and in the breeding shed.

However, in the game of studs, lots more stallions of superior lineage have failed than those that have made it. That applies to all stallions — good or bad maternal families.

"After more than 60 years of studying pedigrees I've found that the one trait that most successful stallions possess is performance. That doesn't mean that all well performed horses will make great stallions — far from it. Even most of those racing on a top level won't make it. But there are very, very few ordinary racehorses that become successful sires. Some might argue that an ordinary horse won't get the opportunity. They would be right of course, but only to a degree. I'm of the belief that the horse destined to become great will do so even with only a modicum of opportunity. However my definition of greatness might not agree with that of others.

"Back to Volume Eight's maternal family. Actually his family is pretty decent — not really all that current or commercial, but pretty acceptable nonetheless. The main reason for that is because the horse's breeder, Bob Key, retained and raced almost the entire family, through successive generations, One of the great trotters that trace to that family is Greyhound.

"Throughout the history of the breed the few truly great stallions do so based entirely on their genetic makeup. A multitude of beautifully bred and well performed horses have been abject failures in the stud, while there have been a few considered lacking in pedigree that have been superb.

"One such horse was Albatross. When he went to stud, I forget how many family generations in his maternal family were blanks, but there were several. The family was considered to be so bad that Hanover, which had several members of it, emptied their broodmare band of them. Nevertheless, Albatross stood alone

— maternal family be damned. Before him the best performer from the family had been Dudley Hanover. Since him there have been very few if any notables. For a period of about 10 years Albatross was the greatest pacing stallion in the world."



## Another little vignette on Albatross:

I often was the proverbial fly on the wall when Mr Simpson happened to be having his almost daily conversations with his friends and business associates. Before I go any further I need to make one thing abundantly clear. In my opinion Delvin G. Miller was the greatest all around horseman that the breed has ever known - trainer, driver, owner, breeder, even racetrack builder and owner. As a breeder he had more knowledge and greater instinct than anybody I've ever known or known of. Back to being the fly on the wall. Delvin and Mr Simpson are having a conversation about Albatross around the time that the horse had arrived at Hanover. Delvin says "Johnny let me tell you something Albatross will be a great sire of colts, but I don't think he will sire any good fillies. I've trained fillies from every generation in his pedigree. There was not a single one of them that was worth a bucket of warm piss". Of course Albatross became the greatest filly sire of his generation and one of the greatest ever. Which goes to prove that even the best of us can make errors when it comes to the eternally challenging puzzle of horse breeding

Facebook periodically sends its contributors reminders of posts which were sent previously. This is one which I received last Tuesday. The original post appeared six years ago:

"Congratulations to everybody associated with Easy Lover Hanover on his win in last night's Progress Pace.

"He was an absolutely gorgeous yearling, as Dottie Haughton would sometimes say 'a real mouth waterer.' But his dam at the time had been oh for three at even getting her first three foals to race.

"Nevertheless, he was so beautiful that I could still see him bringing a decent price - maybe something in the \$40-\$60 thousand price range.

"I recall Tony Alagna coming to the fairgrounds and me telling him that we had a gorgeous Somebeachsomewhere yearling that I thought he might be able to 'steal.' Tony ended up buying him for \$100,000.

"Right after he sold, Tony came up to me and said, 'You're the reason I bought him, you better come in for a piece.' I answered that I thought he'd bring half of what he did. Nevertheless, I did come in for a piece, but a small piece.


"He raced at 2 and took a record. Never in my wildest dreams did I see him as a stakes colt. He raced fairly well at The Meadowlands (at 3) last winter and was entered in Tattersalls Winter sale at The Meadowlands. I thought of him as a nice raceway prospect. I would have been more than satisfied if he brought \$40,000 to \$50,000. Instead he brought an astonishing \$70,000. I looked upon him as being well sold. That was the second time he brought a price that surprised me.

"In retrospect he turned out to be a great bargain. I couldn't be happier for his connections — owner Brad Grant, trainer Ben Wallace and driver Doug McNair.

Here's an update on the now retired Easy Lover Hanover. He went to Canada where he turned into a top Saturday night special in dominating the upper classes on his way to earning over a million dollars in Canadian funds.

# **Bronwyn Watts - Owner of Cold Spring Nurse Mares**

This week's article is about someone you probably have never heard of. Her wonderful business is a godsend to harness racing and horses.

It's a subject that most of us luckily will never have to deal with, but if it does, it's heartbreaking.

Hopefully, you've never needed to find a mare to surrogate an orphan foal that was either rejected by his/her mother or the mare died leaving a poor tiny foal without his mom. If you should find yourself in this unfortunate circumstance, Bronwyn Watts is the one to call.

Watts is a guardian angel to horses. She's a wonderful, compassionate lady who pairs orphaned foals with loving, four-legged mares.

When a foal is born it not only needs his mother's milk and nourishment to survive, but also constant companionship in order to thrive, which is psychologically beneficial.

And that is exactly what Watt's Cold Spring Nurse Mares LLC in Ocala, FL and Lexington, KY provides.

Watts was born and raised on a working horse farm in rural southwest Virginia, and the love and passion for horses was instilled in her from the very beginning.

When she got older Watts was involved in the event world. She groomed at the Land Rover Kentucky Three-Day Event seven times, and worked for upper-level rides such as Laine Ashker and Jonathan Holling.

After ending a toxic relationship and not knowing which direction to go in her young life, Watts did something that most of us would never have the courage to do. She sold all of her belongings and booked a one-way ticket to Belize, embarking on eight months of travel throughout Central and South America.

It was while she was in Chile that she came across an article on the topic of nurse mares. It touched her deeply seeing the crucial need of a nurse mare due to the death or rejection of a mother to her foal.

Watts couldn't stop reading the article and began searching for more articles on the topic and knew this is what she wanted to do with her life. So, she began extensively researching



hormone-induced lactation and was determined to start her own hormone induced nurse mare program.

That was the birth of Cold Spring Nurse Mares, an organization that provides a service for orphan foals up and down the East Coast of the United States.

"The need for a nurse mare is an extremely busy one and the search for a nurse mare is often a desperate one fraught with emotion," Watts said. "It's also an expensive and emotionally taxing process.

"Much of my business comes from thoroughbred breeding operations; although we see all types: thoroughbreds, standardbreds, warmbloods, quarter horses and mules."

Yes, even mules. And this is where my personal experience came in to play.

Anyone that knows me knows I fall in love with every one of my horses. I am not a millionaire or have the land to give my four-legged kids happy forever homes when they are done racing, so this year when I was told that one of my standardbred mares, Babyitscoldoutside, who has given me three foals, could no longer have babies. I was frantic at where I could place her. She is a sweet 7-year-old mare who loved being a mother. My heart broke and I couldn't rest until I found her a home where she could feel wanted and fulfilled. A friend of mine, Laurie Poulin, suggested I call Watts and I did.

At the time Babyitscoldoutside had just been weaned from her Green Manalishi colt and she was still lactating. I immediately called Watts and told her the story. Luckily, Baby was accepted and I had her shipped to Cold Spring Nurse Mares.

Only three days after Baby arrived, a mule gave birth and rejected her gorgeous, long-eared mule colt. Babyits coldouts ide is called a "maiden nurse mare" and Watts was cautious, yet hopeful, she would accept the adorable little guy. Thankfully my mare was perfect with him and took the little colt in as her own.

People were amazed that a standardbred mare accepted, nursed and loved a little mule colt, but that's exactly what she did.

I always wanted to own a mule so I guess you could say I am now a proud "grandma" to this little unnamed mule.

Cold Spring Nurse Mares covers the South, Southeast, Mid-Atlantic and parts of the mid-west: as far north as PA, west to TX, ARK, L.A. and everywhere in between. How does it work?

"Typically we lease the mare out for four-to-six months. Once the mare is weaned she is sent back home to our farm in Ocala, Florida, where she will have a four-to-six months vacation 'time out' frolicking in green pastures with the other mares, until the following seasons roll around."

As far as success in matching the surrogate mare to the foal, Watts has an incredible success rate.

"We have been lucky – no, we have been blessed – in not having an issue of rejection and having an incredible 100 per cent pairing acceptance rate which is simply unheard of.

"In 2018, I got my first two nurse mares from a farm in West Virginia. They were thoroughbreds named Tiya and Dixie.

"In 2019, I started the program with six mares: Tiya, Dixie, Granite, Sooey, Gracie and Bizzy. We finished the season in June 2019 with 27 mares paired.

"In 2020 we had a total of 35 mares; in 2021 that number grew to 57, and this year in 2022 we have 82 wonderful willing and loving nurse mares that we lease out every single year.

"Our girls are simply the best and they all love their job.

"If for some reason the nurse mare does not work out, we will bring a different nurse mare but as I said before that is extremely rare."

Why does a mare reject her foal?

"There are several reasons a mare will reject her biological foal. The first is due to the fact the mare can't handle the pain and associates pain with their foal.

"Also, in some cases a human will interfere with the birthing and bonding process when there is no need to.

"Of course, there are situations when intervention of humans is a must to save a foal's life, but if everything is going well, stay back and let Mother Nature do her job."

Watts said there are plans in the making for a second location to open in Texas to better help clients, mares, and foals in need in that area.

# Your Christmas gifting problem is solved

Last December, an Internet banner led me to an epiphany that solved a problem for me and might solve a problem for you. I bought a share of fractional ownership in a harness horse yearling, one of my better decisions in harness racing.

Exchanging Christmas gifts is time-consuming and expensive, but we feel pressured into the tradition. For me, receiving gifts is uncomfortable. My friends and family are well-intentioned, but I chafe at doing a kabuki dance of glee about how my new garlic press will bookend last year's Christmas gift of a basket with 17 varieties of hot taco sauces.

My sloth-like tendencies found me approaching last Christmas without gifts. The fractional ownership program that I recently purchased gave me an idea. Why not split my share into five micro-shares and pass them out as Christmas gifts?

These gifts would eliminate shopping. The unusual gifts would have legs and be better than juicers and sweater vests. Better still, I would not need to leave my couch or crawl around the netherworld of my junk closet searching for wrapping paper tubes. No returns. No festive crowds. Just five beautiful Christmas cards with an explanatory note, "Merry Christmas - you now own a tiny fraction of a harness racehorse."

None of the recipients I selected for this unorthodox gifting were harness racing fans. Despite some confusion upon opening the cards, they appeared happy to receive the tiny slice of equine ownership. They were (are) a mixed bag of sexes and ages. I am sure a few giftees first thought this was a gag gift (my specialty) or a regift (another of my specialties). Others believed there would be strings attached to the ownership gift.

The only string attached to this gift was my subtle effort to recruit new members to our ranks. I waited for a few months before following up on the unusual gift, hoping that eliminating the long winter would be a plus. I decided to bring them up to speed closer to the stakes racing season.

In early spring, I sent them this:

Hello, Katie (Sean), JD (Katie Ann), Bobby (Allie), Mindy (Tony), Terri (Jim) This email is to clarify the gift card you received at Christmas, a card that said you now own a small percentage of a racehorse, \$100 worth. The gift was legit and not just a ruse for me to get out of shopping.

You will also find photographs of the horse that we will follow this year, information about the family history of our steed, and some interesting additional information. Soon I will send you a video of your horse preparing for the season, and a few videos show what it is like to sit on the bike behind the horse.

The idea is straightforward.

You have a small fractional interest in this racehorse. At the end of the year, the earnings will be totaled and returned to you. For example, if this is a "break-even horse," you will get your original \$120 back. If the horse loses money, you get less back. If it turns a profit, so will you.

Your ownership is off the books. Your ownership is a freebie, a gift. You do not need to bother with tax forms, licenses, or anything else. You will not need to pay a dime. All you need to do is watch the races and hopefully earn money (BTW, in a horse race, the top FIVE finishers earn money).

I am working on a plan to let you know how to log onto my gambling site account, where you can watch the races live or watch replays. I will also scribble a few notes to teach you about the races you are watching, a mini tutorial.

The off-season for racehorses is almost over. In April, the yearling (one-year-old horse) purchased at a fall auction is now two years old and training in hopes of \*qualifying to compete for money in June.

\*Qualifying is a race in front of racing officials where each horse must complete the mile in a prescribed time to prove it is worthy of racing for money. Once they complete this task, it's off to the races.

I realize most of you use text messages, while I prefer email. Let's try this. I will send each member a group text letting you know that you have an email in your box (just like today).

For now, please send me back an email to show me that you are in the loop.

Soon you will be racing.

So, to recap, I hooked on to a fractional ownership group. Then I carefully selected potential prospects to join at zero cost, hoping this free, guided tour of the world of harness racehorse ownership and gambling would find some return visitors.

The experiment was super easy and engaging for all concerned. It was much better than my usual choice of gifts. Should your Christmas shopping list be long and your idea list short, rounding up a posse of prospects for partial and free participation in harness horse racing is an option to consider.





# Heinikin Bythebay brews up another winning effort in DSBF

#### from the Delaware Standardbred Breeders' Fund

Already a two-time Delaware Standardbred Breeders' Fund series champion in his young career, KDK Standardbreds' homebred **Heinikin Bythebay** began his quest for a third such title with a sharp 1:52.1 victory in his \$20,000 first-round division of the DSBF series for 3-year-old male pacers at Bally's Dover, held Thursday (Dec. 1). Ds Heartland won the other division.

In line to Tim Tetrick, the Southwind Lynx—Sally Pansen gelding strode to the lead from post five and cleared Bad And Boujee (driven by Tony Morgan) through a :28 first quarter before maintaining a steady pace through :56.3 and 1:25 middle splits. Heinikin Bythebay remained unchallenged turning for home, switching into high gear and capping his mile with a :27.1 final quarter to evade Bad And Boujee by 1-3/4 lengths. Johnny Badlands (Corey Callahan) maintained third after a failed first-over bid up the backstretch.

Kevin Switzer trains 13-time winner Heinikin Bythebay, who lifted his career earnings to \$223,775 and paid \$2.20 to win as the overwhelming 1-10 favorite.

In the other division, **Ds Heartland** and Art Stafford Jr. employed similar tactics, controlling the pace en route to a 1:54 score. The Badlands Hanover—Armbro Cashmere colt protected inside position to seat Hiro Knockout (Tetrick) through a :28.2 quarter, rated a :57.4 half, and picked up the pace on the backstretch to keep the first-over Cntnobdytelmenothn (Morgan) at bay

through the final three-eighths of a 1:54 mile, winning by a diminishing 1-1/4 lengths. Runner-up Cntnobdytelmenothn was five lengths ahead of Step On Over (Michael Cole), who finished third.

Les Givens trains seven-time winner Ds Heartland, who has now made \$146,047 for his owners and breeders, Nanticoke Racing Inc. and Donna Messick. He paid \$4.20 to win as the even-money favorite.

The second preliminary round of all four DSBF series for 3-year-olds will take place next week (Dec. 5-8), and the eight highest point earners from each series will vie for their share of \$100,000 in their respective finals the following week (Dec. 12-15).

# FAVORED FILLIES FINISH FIRST IN DSBF PRELIMS

True to their expected form, odds-on favorites **Gaitway Gal** and **Shabby Chic** was as they pleased in their respective \$20,000 first-round Delaware Standardbred Breeders' Fund preliminary events for 3-year-old pacing fillies, conducted Wednesday (Nov. 30) at Bally's Dover.

Gaitway Gal and driver Pat Berry earned top honors with a 1:55.2 mile in the first division. The GTY Stable's homebred Delmarvalous—Brussels Hanover filly bypassed the three-hole on the first turn and pushed clear of 5-2 second choice Bank The Win (driven by Victor Kirby) before completing a :27.2 first quarter. Bank The Win, who left aggressively to clear from the outside post seven before yielding, retook the lead at the bell and relegated Gaitway Gal to the pocket through middle splits of :56.4 and 1:25.2. Finding herself boxed on the far turn by the first-over Mistatude (Jason Thompson), Gaitway Gal found a lane up the open stretch and surged to the lead with 70 yards to go, drawing clear at will to win by 2-1/4 lengths while in hand. Bank The Win narrowly preserved second from Mistatude, who stayed on respectably after her uncovered bid through the far turn.

Jeff Smith trainee Gaitway Gal, a nine-time winner with \$167,304 in career earnings, paid \$2.60 to win. Her full brother, the 2-year-old gelding Gaitway Guy, swept both the Harrington and Dover

DSBF series this season.

The second division saw Harrington series champion Shabby Chic and driver Tim Tetrick strike the front in the final 300 yards of a 1:56 mile and sprint clear by 6-1/2 lengths while under wraps. Tim Tetrick was unhurried with the Badlands Hanover—Stylish Artist filly from the start, settling her in fourth behind 16-1 pacesetter Prime

Power (Ross Wolfenden) through early sectionals of :28.1 and :57.1. Shabby Chic moved second-over behind Ky-Ky (Art Stafford Jr.) up the backstretch but made her biggest gains after Ky-Ky ducked into the pocket with five-sixteenths to go. Prime Power reached three-quarters in 1:26, but was eclipsed by Shabby Chic's sweeping push to the fore shortly thereafter. Prime Power had enough left to preserve second over Ky-Ky, who ducked to the open stretch to miss the runner-up spot by a half-length.

Shabby Chic, a winner of 12 starts and \$208,650, is a Let It Ride Stables homebred trained by Michael Hall. She paid \$2.20 to win.

Sophomore pacing fillies square off in the second preliminary round of their series next Wednesday (Dec. 7).

#### NAVY BLUE SHARP IN DOVER DSBF OPENER

**Navy Blue** continued his tear through the First State on Tuesday (Nov. 29), recording a 1:56.3 win — his eighth victory from nine starts this season — in his \$20,000 first-round preliminary division of the Delaware Standardbred Breeders' Fund series for 3-year-old trotting colts and geldings at Bally's Dover. **JAs Bluestone** rallied from off the pace to nab odds-on choice LG's Reed O Wen in the other division.

Prohibitive 1-20 favorite Navy Blue, in line to trainer-driver Art Stafford Jr., wasted no time establishing control of the terms, forcing Big Daddy D (driven by Cody Poliseno) to retreat to the pocket at the end of a :28.2 first-quarter duel. The pair raced one-two through middle splits of :58.3 and 1:27.3 while steadily separating themselves from their four rivals. Off the home turn, Navy Blue edged two lengths clear of his nearest rival, and, despite drifting a bit wide in mid-stretch, maintained that margin to the end of his 1:56.3 victory. Sunset Sail (Tony Morgan) rallied to take third, another 14-1/4 lengths behind.

Stafford, who also bred Navy Blue, shares ownership with Wyatt Starkey. The Anders Bluestone—Overnight Hit gelding has now won 10 of his 14 career starts including the Harrington DSBF series final earlier in the season, amassed \$157,986 in career earnings, and paid \$2.10 to win.

In the other division, JAs Bluestone took advantage of a pressured pace and a patient steer from trainer/driver Victor Kirby to win in 1:59. Away sixth early in the field of seven, JAs Bluestone angled third-over up the backstretch after LG's Reed O Wen (Jim Morand) took threeeighths of a mile to clear for the lead. Despite being able to pull the half back to :58.3, LG's Reed O Wen faced a second challenge heading into the far turn, when the first-over Tua (Montrell Teague) briefly seized command from LG's Reed O Wen. When Tua began to stall in the breeze, Kirby spun JAs Bluestone three-wide, and the Anders Bluestone-JA's Commando

gelding rallied to collar LG's Reed O Wen by a neck in 1:59. Embrace The Stone (Tim Tetrick) finished third.

JAs Bluestone, a Pamela Wagner homebred, paid \$6.20 to win. He has now won five times in 22 career starts and has banked \$124,381.

The second preliminary round of the DSBF series for 3-year-old male trotters is slated for next Tuesday (Dec. 6).

# SHES ALL WOMAN A GUTSY DSBF PRELIM WINNER

Pamela Wagner's homebred **Shes All Woman** sustained a long, uncovered bid into contention and then survived a stretch-long duel with pacesetter Just Pump It to emerge victorious in the lone \$20,000 first-round preliminary event of the Delaware Standardbred Breeders' Fund series for 3-year-old trotting fillies at Bally's Dover, held Monday (Nov. 28).

Victor Kirby kept the 2-5 favorite reserved early, stalking from fourth while Miss Timber Wolf (driven by Kim Vincent) and Just Pump It (Art Stafford Jr.) disputed a :30 first quarter. Just as Miss Timber Wolf cleared, Stafford retook from the pocket with Just Pump It and tried to bottom out the field, controlling a 1:00.1 half and opening up a six-length advantage on the backstretch. Meanwhile, Kirby set Shes All Woman into motion just before the half-mile pole, and she closed steadily to within a length of Just Pump It past three-quarters in 1:29.4.

Shes All Woman ground into a short lead coming off the home turn, but Just Pump It battled gamely to her inside the entirety of the stretch. Despite Just Pump It's valiant effort, Shes All Woman proved a neck the better, winning in 1:58.4. Miss Timber Wolf finished third, beaten 10 lengths.

John Wagner trains Shes All Woman, a 12-time winner with \$234,780 in career earnings. The daughter of Anders Bluestone—Wark Woman paid \$2.80 to win.

# Gabe Prewitt to receive Monticello-Goshen's Good Guy Award

It's been said that if one were to pick an unbeatable gift for Gabe Prewitt, the odds-on favorite would be a hat rack. Known for his sharp handicapping acumen and race calling skills, as well as his lengthy résumé, the 39-year-old harness racing aficionado has so many positions with so many different tracks that it is indeed hard to keep track of them all.

The Brigadier General of the 'Send It In' Army, Prewitt rattles off exotic wagers like a kid in a candy store. With a deep knowledge of the gambling product, and a mutual admiration and enthusiasm for the punter-preferred 'carry-over,' Prewitt is quick to tweet his marching orders to the faithful. Adept at locating the most attractive pools and gimmicks anywhere they may be found, he has been sought after for bringing his own brand of pari-mutuel magic to locations near and far.

Well-rounded in all facets of the sport, Prewitt is a graduate of the University of Kentucky, and got his first job in the industry as a teller at the Red Mile in 2005. Prewitt also owns and breeds standardbreds, many of which have raced on the Kentucky and Ohio circuits.

Perhaps first 'discovered' in 2006 as the voice of the Red Mile during the early meet, Prewitt caught the ear of the late, great Sam McKee who was quick to bring him on board for the Grand Circuit. Later, stints in Buffalo and as a fill-in at other tracks landed him the full-time announcer gig at Pompano Park in 2013.

#### **Harness Racing Update**

Shortly thereafter, the year 2015 was a 'breakthrough' season for Prewitt, as he received the award of the same name from the U. S. Harness Writers Association at their Dan Patch Awards Banquet. Within months he was promoted to Director of Racing Operations at the South Florida plant in 2016. The following year Prewitt joined his pal, the late Dave Brower, on the awardwinning Meadowlands Racetrack television broadcast, once his Florida duties were completed for the season.

Prewitt managed his myriad of duties with ease, while logging many miles traveling up and down the I-95 and I-75 corridors. Gabe Prewitt worked just about every day in some capacity or another. That is until some of the country, and the relative work, just 'stopped.' While few people care to be reminded of the recent pandemic, ask Prewitt about his experience and one may be surprised at the answer.

"Scioto Downs was the first track to re-open following the shutdown in 2020. All eyes were upon us, and the betting public had no other horse racing outlets," noted Prewitt. "As a result, we had four consecutive million-dollar handles and broke several wagering records around Memorial Day that year."

Almost immediately, Prewitt was promoted to director of racing for Caesar's Entertainment.

"Gabe will wear many hats and he's a great asset to our team," said Joe Morris, vice president of racing for Caesar's Entertainment-Racing, upon announcing the move. This put Prewitt in the daily double driver's seat for Pompano Park, Hoosier Park, Scioto Downs and Harrah's Philadelphia.

This past spring, when Pompano Park closed its doors, it was a tough time for many owners, trainers, drivers and caretakers involved in the industry and at the track. Despite the disappointment amid the loss of the venue, Prewitt kept the gambling product strong and gave the horsemen and the fans ample time to say goodbye to that Broward County treasure. With video tributes, special races, and a steady hand, Prewitt provided all the stakeholders the opportunity to be remembered and live in the moment.

In two short weeks Prewitt will re-unite with many of his friends and colleagues from around the country. When the Monticello-Goshen Chapter of the United States Harness Writers Association holds their 63rd annual Awards Banquet on Sunday, Dec. 11, 2022, Gabe Prewitt will receive the chapter's John Gilmour Good Guy Award.

This year, in addition to the year-end awards for horses and horsepeople from the local tracks, the Monticello-Goshen chapter will also honor Wally Hennessey (Lifetime Achievement Award); Anthony Bruno (John Manzi Leadership Award); Lance Ditewig (Excelsior Award); Dr. Stephen P. Dey III (Cradle of the Trotter Breeders Award); Auxiliary of Goshen Historic Track (Amy Bull Crist Distinguished Service Award); Ted Waddell (Phil Pines Award); Braxten Boyd (Rising Star); Scott Keppler (Amateur Driver); and Tracy and Dr. Gary Smith (Mighty M Award of Appreciation).

# Dr. Stephen Dey III to receive Cradle of the Trotter Breeders Award

Dr. Stephen P. Dey III has been chosen as this year's recipient of the Cradle of the Trotter Breeders Award by the Monticello-Goshen Chapter of the United States Harness Writers Association. The honor, which is bestowed annually, recognizes smaller breeders that have enjoyed success on the big stage, and in New York State.

Dr. Dey (pronounced dye) a prominent standardbred veterinarian by trade, checks both those boxes as his slate of recent stars have not only won sire stakes events in the Empire State, but have also captured prestigious Grand Circuit races across North America.

World champion Bythemissal p,3,1:48.3f-'22 (\$1,168,492) won the Little Brown Jug, The Adios, Carl Millstein Memorial (in a world record equaling time of 1:48.4h), the Ohio Sires Stakes Championship and the Monument Circle. A gelding from the first crop of Downbytheseaside and bred by Dey, Bythemissal finished the season as the second leading money-winning sophomore pacer in North America.

Dan Patch 2-year-old pacing filly of 2021 Niki Hill p,3,1:48.4-'22 (\$1,317,643), was also produced by Dey at his family's Heritage Hill Farm, along with sport's fastest 3-year-old pacing filly Shebestingin p,3,1:47 (\$759,522). This year, Dey ranks eleventh among all breeders in North America with \$3.3 million, yet has half the amount of starters as his peers.

Among this season's talented New York-breds are Earthwindfire p,2,1:51.3-'22 (\$321,484) and Gotthegreenlight p,3,1:51f-'22 (\$513,997), placing Dey's operation in third place among the leading NY breeders earnings statistics.

A nursery with a history that goes deep into the infancy of the Garden State program, the farm was established in the early 1960's by Dey's father, Dr. Stephen Perrine Dey II and his wife, Elizabeth S. [Liz] Dey. Spanning 500 acres in Monmouth County, many of the farm's offspring carried the 'HH' prefix through the latter part of the 20th century.

Dr. Dey III's maternal grandfather, Charles I. Smith, was the founder of the New Jersey Sire Stakes program, which led their farm to become the first breeding operation to nominate

yearlings to that program. Some one thousand horses later and Heritage Hill Farm is still going strong with the help and commitment of a talented and dedicated staff.

"We have about 30 mares and my cousin David Hayes is the farm manager," said Dey. "Our farm is blessed to have a hardworking staff that allows us to raise quality foals and continue supporting the industry in the Northeast."

At one time Heritage Hill Farm stood such stallions as Isle Of Wight and Distant Thunder, with Jaguar Spur being the last stallion to stand at the Dey's. "Over the last few decades we have invested in stallion shares," said Dey. "This way we can concentrate our efforts on the broodmares themselves and have greater diversity in our crops. We have always supported the New York program with shares in Credit Winner, Huntsville, American Ideal and Bettor's Delight."

Not only does Dr. Dey III and his extended family operate the commercial breeding farm, but 'Steve' Dey III and his brother Dr. Greg Dey operate Dey Equine Veterinarians, a busy practice based around the abundant standardbred training centers of central New Jersey.

"While there may be some cross-over, my brother Greg frequents stables at Gaitway, Magical Acres and Congress Hill, while I go to Winner's International, Hot Lead (formerly White Birch), and Ridge Training Center," Dey said. "We stay busy and I am fortunate to also have my daughter, Rachel, working with me."

A graduate of the University of Pennsylvania's Vet school, Dey also attended Rutgers, and Purdue. Truly a family affair, his brother Greg also has his son Mitchel working in the practice with him. While his knowledgeable farm staff allows Dey to concentrate on his day job, the breeding business is always on his mind. Dey recognizes the myriad of challenges facing the industry in general, and breeders specifically.

"Having a big track like the Meadowlands is a big asset to our program. The genetics of our breed have created such speed that it is advantageous to have a racecourse with fewer obstacles like the smaller tracks in other jurisdictions," Dey observed.

"Nonetheless, we, as an industry, must continue to provide positive growth and opportunities for young horses," Dey continued. "We must give yearling buyers greater purse structures for maidens and non-winners of two type-horses, so that these owners can recoup some of their investment.

"No one forces these owners to buy yearlings, so the industry must continue to create attractive incentives."

In recognition of Dr. Dey III's current successes, as well as over 50 years in the breeding business, when the Monticello-Goshen Harness Writers hold their 63rd annual Awards Banquet on Sunday, Dec. 11, Dey will receive the chapter's Cradle of the Trotter Breeders Award.

# Gural explains why the Meadowlands will not hold the Haughton and Doherty stakes in 2023

Several people have asked why the Meadowlands would give up two major, prestigious 2-year old races (click here) and the answer is very simple. Unlike all of our competitors who receive massive subsidies from slots, the standardbred industry in New Jersey only receives \$10 million which we share with the breeders and Freehold. Because I am a horsemen I also give \$3 million to \$4 million per year from our sports betting profits for purses, even though this year I expect we will lose over \$5 million on racing.

Next year is the last year of the subsidy and without it we will be doomed because I am obligated under a law that the horsemen advocated to race a minimum of 90 days at the Meadowlands in order to have sports betting. Without the subsidy, we would have to drop all of the stakes races and use the money from sports betting and the handle to cover the cost of our overnight races since they would have to be competitive with the purses offered at Yonkers, Pocono and Chester. Now that Kentucky has more money than they know what to do with and breeders are either sending mares to Kentucky so that they are duel eligible or breeding to Kentucky stallions because of the lucrative purses available I have to do everything possible to protect the Jersey breeding industry. By making this change we are able to start the NJ Sire Stakes two weeks later which everyone has asked for and have the finals on Hambletonian weekend followed three weeks later with the NJ Championship Series for 2- and 3-year-olds. I have no choice but to utilize the funds we have to support the Jersey breeding program so that we have a fighting chance to get the subsidy extended.

One other factor is the fact that so few horses entered this year because of the competition, but that was not the main reason. The other question that comes up involves The Gural Rule where people tell me why don't I drop it because it is not working and I agree it's not working. Having said that, we saw with Bulldog Hanover that it would have worked if the breeders had not forced WEG and the Hambletonian Society to drop their support. Most of the breeders, like myself, are older and have no one in the next generation interested in taking over. As a result,

they are more interested in short term gains than the long term future of the sport. As the owner of the Meadowlands I feel a moral obligation to try to create interest in our sport like we saw in Dayton when Bulldog raced around midnight and the place was packed. I have no intention of changing the rule and hopefully the young people in the sport remember that at least I tried. I hope that answers the questions that have been raised.

Compare the stats to Sportswriter who has bred more mares and only has one millionaire in Jimmy Freight and a much lower average per eligible starter.

Other Ontario stallions are far behind and Shadow Play never books like Somebeachsomewhere or what you might perceive as fashionable stallions, he did it all the hard way and we (RG McGroup, Serge Savard and myself) are very proud of him and his accomplishments on the track.

How many Canadian-based 3-year-olds have made \$1.5 million racing in the past 20 years?

And I am not sure what the Canadian Harness Racing Hall of Fame did by nominating such an unfashionable sire to the HOF.
