#### Dr. J is leaving Hanover Shoe Farms

Dr. Bridgette Jablonsky is leaving harness racing's leading breeding farm on good terms after 26 years there to start her own business as an equine consultant.

One of the key figures in the modern success of harness racing's most storied breeding farm is leaving at the end of the year to open her own equine consulting business. Dr. Bridgette Jablonsky, the executive vice-president and syndicate manager of Hanover Show Farms, told HRU on Saturday that she is leaving the famed Pennsylvania nursery on good terms, something farm president and CEO Russell Williams confirmed.

"Bridgette and I are good friends... We're parting on excellent terms. Once she's been away from the daily grind, then it's going to be even more fun when we meet up at a sale or a race or an event and compare notes," Williams said.

"Russell is very supportive of my decision and it's just a new phase in my life," Jablonsky added.

In her 26 years at Hanover, Jablonsky has developed an exceptional reputation for her equine expertise, passion for horses and tireless work ethic.

Since graduating from veterinary school in 1996, Hanover Shoe Farms has been Jablonsky's only employer.


Williams said Jablonsky will be tough to replace, but he wishes her the best in her new career.



with talent can hone their skills and expand them and then go out and move up into a better career," Williams said.

He said Hanover's partial loss is the entire harness industry's gain. Jablonsky will now be available to anyone who wants to hire her.

"I know we're going to be her first client and I've already talked to her about something I want her to help with. It's going to be good for the industry," Williams said. "I think the industry deserves a pat on the back because it's not a series of dead ends. Somebody relatively young can go out there after developing their skills and do well. I mean, she hasn't started yet, but I know she's going to do well."

As for what it means for Hanover, Williams said it won't change their long-held philosophy. Hanover has been the leading breeder in harness racing every single year since records have been kept and is on the verge of setting a new earnings record for a single year.

"For us, we're going to strive for the same... number one, that's integrity... We're not going to change our basic business model. When you buy from us, you pay what you want to pay," he said.

#### WHAT'S NEXT FOR DR. J

Jablonsky said she's already lined up two clients that she declined to mention for now.

"As far as yearling selection goes, which I'm really excited about doing, I've already made agreements with two major organizations to be exclusive to them – or, in this sense, exclusive to the both of them and nobody else," she said.

As to why now was the best time to leave Hanover, Jablonsky said there were multiple reasons.

"I feel like this was a good time to try it. My son goes to college in August and I'm going to have a lot more flexibility on the home front. I'm excited to branch out and see what's out there, outside of the tent of Hanover Shoe Farms," Jablonsky said.

She also mentioned that at age 52 it is something she wanted to try "before it's too late.

"It's just been something that I've been toying around with in my head for a while about using those skills to try something new, to work for myself and to have my own business to do consulting and advising work for people, yearling selection for people."

#### TOLL OF THE JOB ANOTHER FACTOR

The toll of the job was another factor in Jablonsky's decision.

The job requires long hours, a commitment to be on site six days a week and is physically demanding. She said she regrets missing many life events with her son.

"Now he's going to college and it's not like I can get any of that time back, but I can change things. I can go to his swim meets to come or I can move him into his dorm without worrying about whether I'm free that day. But, really, the hardest part has always been for me — because I'm wired this way — the mental stress of it.

"When you have 1,000 horses under your care, literally something bad happens almost every day. It has degrees of bad, but... you have your phone next to you all the time waiting for it to ring with a problem or with something that's bad. I get very, very emotionally attached to them, even after all this time. I think that's the hardest part. The year between when we diagnosed Somebeachsomewhere and knew he was sick until he died, that was the hardest year of my life. I couldn't go home and partake in any sort of normal life because his sickness just pervaded my whole life. All I could think about was him and how he was sick and what we could do – I was doing research and I was just constantly sad that whole year.

"He's the best example, but things like that happen at the farm... Bar Hopping's loss, that was tragic. There's a 9-year-old horse that's fine. You put him out in the morning and you feed him at 1 o'clock and you go to get him in at 2:30 and he's dead of an acute cardiac event. Those things, other people can roll with the punches a little better, but... I don't know how much more of that I can take, really."

#### **NOT GOING TO ANOTHER FARM**

Jablonsky said she currently has no interest in being tied to another farm.

"I would never go to another farm. There's only one farm I would work at and that's Hanover Shoe Farms," she said.

Not that she hasn't had offers.

"People have said, 'I'd like to buy a farm in Lexington, will you run in?' and I've respectfully declined. That's not what I want to do. I don't want to be tied to a farm anymore.

"I want to advise people on all of those things that those years at Hanover has truly made me an expert in — yearling selection, raising yearlings and weanlings. So, going to other people's farms and evaluating their weanlings and yearlings and advising them on what changes we can make or how we can help them to achieve the best possible success in the sales ring... mare mating, stallion syndication, adding broodmares to bands and which mares would be most beneficial to certain people's broodmare bands, valuating livestock, appraising them, looking at them."

She also wants the opportunity to get to the racetrack more.

"This whole thing really gives me the chance to get back more on the racing side of things," she said. "So, that's really where my heart is and I really love the racing. I love going to the racetracks and I love watching races. That's not to say that you can't when you're on a breeding farm, but being on a large breeding farm, like Hanover, it limits you a little bit in terms of what you can do... I love breeding and selling foals and all of that, but I would also love to be able to be more involved with the fruits of my labor."

Williams said Jablonsky's greatest contribution to Hanover was that, "the quality of all of our horses jumped dramatically. We started making breeding decisions based on conformation and commercial appeal. We bought fewer broodmares, but far better ones. We're pretty rigorous in the standards that we use, more so than ever before. So, it wasn't just a large broodmare band, it's really, I think, the greatest broodmare band ever assembled."

Jablonsky said she is very proud to leave when the farm's success is at unprecedented levels.

"We blew the doors off at the yearling sales last year and we're on the verge of another earnings record. It seems like every year there's a new earnings record. We're doing all this with fewer horses. We smashed our record for yearling sales with fewer yearlings, so I really feel like I'm leaving the farm in a good place and everything is set. I feel like I'm not bailing out on them. I'm leaving them in a good place."

#### DIFFICULT DECISION

While Jablonsky sounds excited to start the next phase of her career, she said it has not been an easy decision to make. She

said she has been mulling it over seriously since the summer and only made the final decision a few weeks ago.

She said she told Williams on Thursday of this week.

"I was going to do it Friday and then on Thursday I said, 'I can't take this anymore and I just have to do it,' because I couldn't sleep, I couldn't think about anything else," she said.

Williams said he was surprised when Jablonsky told him the news, but when he thought about it more, it all made sense.

"A while back, Bridgette told me that her number one passion in the entire industry is the racing itself. She loves the races. She loves following it and she's got a mind that can follow hundreds of horses. So, that got me to thinking, 'If that's what she really loves, she's here doing a whole lot of other stuff that she seems to like, but we don't have racing at Shoe Farms – you have to watch that online or go.' So, I was kind of weighing in my mind what her level of satisfaction might be and then I just kind of got involved in some other things and didn't think about it anymore," Williams said.

Jablonsky said Williams was very understanding when she told him she was leaving.

"Basically, we spent [Friday] kind of strategizing with him asking me who I thought would be best in what areas of the farm. Although the anticipation of telling him was bad, the actually telling him... he took it very, very well. I'm relieved."

She hopes her last day as a full-time employee on Dec. 30 will go smoothly, but she's prepared for it to be an emotional one.

"I hope it's just a normal day and at the end of the day I park my farm vehicle and somebody picks me up and takes me home. It's not like I'm never going to be at Hanover Shoe Farms again. I'm going to keep up the relationships with the people there. I'm saying to myself, 'I'm leaving December 30 and I'm not going to be employed by them anymore,' but I'll be back during the summer to look at yearlings and I'm sure that some of the people that I'm advising will be breeding to Hanover Shoe Farms stallions, so I'll still be involved a little bit.'

"I hope it's not very emotional for me the last time I pull out of the drive. I just want to keep it in the back of my head that I'll be back in some capacity. Not back working, but back looking at yearlings."

# As we head into awards season, here's some interesting factoids

The 2022 harness racing season is winding down and the first order of business is driver updates.

Jason Bartlett has been flirting with becoming the first driver ever to post a \$10 million season and have a .400 UDRS. He began Dec. 15 at \$11,246,273 on the strength of 2,494 starts 620 wins 438 seconds and 341 thirds .392.

Lifetime, Bartlett is #13 all time at \$137,719,918 with Tony Morgan just above him.

Yannick Gingras began Dec. 15 just \$89,000 shy of the #4 spot held by Ron Pierce at over \$215 million.

If not for COVID-19 in 2020, Tim Tetrick would be looking at his 16th straight \$10 million season. In 2020, he finished at \$9,922,544.

Todd McCarthy will end 2022 with his best year at \$9.4 million. He is the lone driver to win in sub-1:47 in back-to-back years with the same horse: Allywag Hanover -1:46 and 1:46.4 this year and a 2021 leading 1:46.4.

#### MACH THREE'S BIG SEASON

He's gone now, but a look at the older pacers of 2022 and you see Mach Three's imprint everywhere. Consider his son Leonidas A (\$431,000, 11-for-22) grandson Funatthebeach (\$589,000, 10-for-33), great grandsons Allywag Hanover (\$475,000 and 1:46) and Rockyroad Hanover (a winner in 1:46.2)

#### **GOOD GUY AND HOY**

The Good Guy award winner has been connected to the Horse of the Year in the same season seven times before and it could be eight times if Jack Darling and Bulldog Hanover are so honored.

#### TROTTER OF THE YEAR TRAINERS

This will be the 53rd year that the Trotter of the Year Award will be given out. The first two decades it stayed in the U.S., but in the last three decades it seems to be sailing elsewhere. Take A Look:

1970 Canadian Joe O'Brien won the first ever TOY with Fresh Yankee. In the next 20 years all awards went to a U.S.-born trainer

Yet, from 1991 to 2021, 21 of 31 times, it has gone to a trainer born outside the country and could be 22 of 32 times this year if Nifty Norman-trainer Bella Bellini is so honored.

The TOY has gone to Sweden 11 times, Canada 6 times, New Zealand twice, Norway once and Australia once

#### **UNAMINITY**

Hopefully after the dinner in February this becomes more relevant. Just twice in thoroughbred history has a Horse of the Year been unanimous.

In 1981, all 191 writers/broadcasters voted for John Henry.

In 2015, all 261 writers/broadcasters voted for American Pharaoh.

For 2022, Bulldog Hanover could do the same.

2022 Bulldog Hanover will be just the second 4-year-old pacer of the 21st century to win the award and his \$1,649,906 is not only the 2022 high water mark, but the highest money total since 2016 for any horse.

#### Taking in the Rosecroft-Freehold driver challenge

Far from short on hyperbole, the driver challenge between the colonies from Rosecroft and Freehold Raceway was billed as a collision of the "harness racing worlds of New Jersey and Maryland." Credit the marketing department, because as it turned out with day one of the challenge occurring the same night with a Woodbine Mohawk weather cancellation and not much else going on, the publicized build up to the competition as a battle of the titans was enough to bring me in.

Starting with the four against four matchup, it almost didn't even seem like a fair fight, on paper. The Freehold group of Eric Abbatiello, Johnathan Ahle, Vinny Ginsburg and Tyler Miller have been tested. Even the younger guys like Ahle and Miller race and win at places outside of Freehold like Harrah's Philadelphia and the Meadowlands, and of course the success of Ginsburg and the elder statesmen, Abbatiello, is well known. For the Rosecroft group of Eric Davis, Declan Donoway, Russell Foster and Trae Porter, I'd be lying if I said I could tell you much of anything outside of Foster.

But the first day of the challenge proved to be a surprise, and a pleasant one at that in how the challenge races were run. Perhaps with more knowledge of the local horses and maybe slight deference from the Freehold group, team Rosecroft swept the four races on Thursday. Twenty-one-year-old Trae Porter starred as driving home three of those four winners.

In the first driver challenge of the race of the night, team Rosecroft delivered as expected with Trae Porter on the 4-year-old Rockin Image gelding, Select Friday. Sent off at odds of 50 cents on the dollar, Select Friday was trained by Katie Callahan, who sported a 10 for 68 win record at Rosecroft this year heading into the Thursday card. No other trainer in the race was better than 2 for 26, and the 3-1 second choice in the program was a 14-year-old gelding from post 8. In what was probably a tactical error, one Freehold horse parked another one out past the opening quarter of :27 in the off-going for

bottom-conditioned horses. Predictably, the pace fell apart and it was the three horses from far back, including Porter and Select Friday who were second over, who ended up 1-2-3 in the race. Can't say that there wasn't any action in the race!

The results in the next race were even more interesting. Team Rosecroft was down one driver in the race as Eric Davis' horse was scratched sick, and it didn't even matter in the slightest. With just three drivers in the race, Rosecroft swept the top three spots. And it was Porter again, but this time in opposite fashion from his win in the race prior. While he stormed from off the pace once again, this time he guided home a near-\$20 longshot winner, Homestretch Wes from an outside post for a barn that was 3 for 61. The only possible angle was the driver change from Rick Still to first-time Porter. A \$1 trifecta for the Rosecroft trio of Porter, Russel and Donoway in the shorter field came back to pay \$401.60.

Porter didn't figure in the third driver challenge race with a hopeless longshot, but he was picked up by Foster who went wire to wire, and fellow Rosecroft driver Donoway took second to nail down another Team Rosecroft exacta. This one looked evenly matched between the driving colonies, but Foster took control right from the start with While Rolls, who won wire to wire while making his second start in the Amanda Malone barn. The Freehold favorite in the race Redding Hanover (Ginsburg) was never in position while being last at the half; likewise Authentic Hanover (Ahle) who also rated a chance on paper, closed spectacularly for fourth but it was way too late.

In the final challenge race of the night, it was fittingly Porter who closed it out with another off-the-pace, going-away win with Son Of A Lynx for trainer Jeff Stafford of Darlins Delight fame. To put an exclamation point on the night, Rosecroft drivers Donoway and Davis once again completed the exacta and trifecta for the Maryland-based group.

For these four races, the racing was impressively more competitive than you would see at most other tracks in overnight races. A good show was put on for sure, and it gave some people such as myself a reason to pay attention who otherwise wouldn't have been.

With this being written before day two of the challenge at Freehold on Saturday, the team from New Jersey will suddenly have their work cut out for them in defending their home turf. Porter is just 6 for 75 at Freehold this year but will enter with the hot hand. It'll be worth watching.



### The case for higher minimum bet denominations

In modern harness racing, some 20 cent and 50 cent bets have a long-term negative effects.

On Monday evening at Woodbine Mohawk Park, the 5<sup>th</sup> race Pick 3 payoff was \$3.46, and in race 7 the Pick 4 payout was \$20.36. Over at the other extreme, we see serial bet payoffs with longer shots at little more than the parlay price.

In my view, it has become a problem.

The lowering of minimum bets was implemented a dozen or so years ago, and the thinking behind the change was probably sound. In fact, presenting at wagering conferences at the time, I initially supported them. Allowing customers more coverage on their serial bets, or on harder to hit verticals like superfectas meant a better user experience and would allow customers to cash more tickets. It should have, in theory, raised short-term handles (and this was the case).

However, when it comes to betting markets, it's not what you see on the top line, but what's bubbling beneath the surface that matters.

Harness racing has changed quite bit in 20 years. The days of deep fields where six or seven horses could win a race are not seen nearly as much. Fields at the highest handle tracks can be watered down because a slot track (regardless of how much handle it draws) lies just next door. 'Waiting next week for a better post or class drop' has been around forever in the sport, but seems to be especially prevalent now, making field size even shorter.

In this environment, what are we selling to the general public? We're giving them a low minimum which invites them to spread. This results in 4 by 4 by 4 pick 3 tickets for \$12.80, sitting down for over an hour to watch the races, and when they hit, they cash \$3.46.

Horse racing's edge against sports betting is "bet a little to win a lot." With low minimums this has pivoted to "bet a little and maybe you'll break even" in far too many cases. We're competing not with gambling skill games, but penny slots.

For our other important demographic — the seasoned customer — it's arguably worse.

These bettors, as many of you are, try each night to sniff out horses others won't be on, allowing them a worthwhile betting edge. At old minimums, like \$1 for a pick 4, or even 50 cents for a pick 5, the crowd could not spread the sequence as much, which inflated the value of these horses, resulting in some good payoffs – the six or eight times parlay value that kept us coming back each day.

Unfortunately, these longer shot horses are on spread tickets, depressing payoffs; again, making the betting game less attractive.

Additionally, one of the major reasons our sport gets at least some play from outside of it (e.g., thoroughbred players or some sports bettors), is due to the carryover. As we all know, carryovers are often a large takeout reduction that drives handle. When you are offering out \$250,000 that can attract \$150,000 in new money, you don't have to be a math major to figure out it's worth a bet. You also don't need to be Descartes to know that lower bet minimums have decreased the prevalence of the carryover. Friday's \$47,000 carryover at the Meadowlands in the Pick 5 was the exception not the rule.

If carryovers are a way forward for our sport in attracting new money in this super-competitive gambling landscape, low minimums, I strongly believe, are self-sabotage.

I understand the reticence to go back to the way it was. Short-term handle increases through allowing people to spread more for less money are real, and if the sport changed it would likely see a short-term handle decline. And, of course, some people love the ability to spread, because even if they're losing each night they can hit an extra ticket or two. They probably won't be happy.

But the longer-term aggregate view should always be paramount, and under that criteria, the choice to me is clear: Higher minimums make the sport a better betting game. They're needed more than ever in the maturing, competitive wagering landscape.



You are not the first Down Under superstar who has landed on these shores. Among the first were Ross Croghan and Brian Pelling, then others such as Brett Pelling, Nifty Norman., Mark Harder, yourself and now the driving superstars Dexter Dunn and the McCarthy brothers Andrew and Todd. To what do you accredit such incredible success, one might say dominance by the boys from Down Under?

"I would guess that the common answer might be hard work and I suppose that is a part of it. This is the place where The Hambletonian, the Little Brown Jug, the North America Cup and other classic races are found. This is where they dream about maybe becoming a part of those races. #### Tell us the Noel Daley story

"In 1989, I landed in sunny California. I worked there for six months with Pete Foley. I quickly realized that if I wanted to make a living in harness racing, the East Coast, specifically New Jersey is where I needed to be. In August of 1990, I landed a job with Brett Pelling. At the time Brett had arguably the most successful stable in the world. I stayed with Brett for eight years after which we had a disagreement so inconsequential that I don't remember what it was about. I guess I just decided the time was here when I needed to go on my own. I started out with two head and it grew into a decent sized stable which was doing alright. Then Adam Victor came into my life."

#### Can you tell us about your history with Adam Victor?

"I was in The Meadowlands paddock when this man dressed in brown overalls came over and introduced himself. He said his name was Adam Victor and that he was interested in getting into the horse business, could he come to my stable and see my operation. I said, 'Sure', thinking at the time that he was a working bloke who might buy a claimer or two for the stable. He came to the stable and I guess we hit it off from the beginning. Little did I know that the man who I thought might buy one or two horses for me to train might grow to having as many as 90 head at one time. We did extremely well from the get qo.

"Adam's son, Adam Jr., had taken an interest in harness racing and became quite knowledgeable about horses' pedigrees. Because

of Jr.'s affinity for young horses, the shift in the stable switched from being an overnight operation, which Adam Sr. preferred, to being one where developing young horses to hopefully become champions became our goal.

"We did pretty well. Among our best horses were Mr Muscleman and Explosive Matter. As happens in this game of life, Adam graduated from the Wharton School of Economics at the University of Pennsylvania and secured a job at Goldman Sachs. That firm shipped young Adam to London to work in their London office. Over a period of time, Jr.'s interest in the horses waned and consequently so did his father's. After awhile, they were out of the business. We still are great friends, though. When we were together it was almost like we were family. We'd have Sunday dinner each week at Smith & Wollensky in the city and meet for pizza each Tuesday at Arturo's. We did this every week for eight years. I'm still friends with both of them and we speak several times a year. Unfortunately, they no longer have any horse interests.

"Another horse that I had fairly good success with was Broad Bahn. I won the 2011 Hambletonian with him, but he wasn't near that kind of horse. The stars were shining bright in perfect alignment that day. That's not to say he wasn't the best horse that day. He very well could have been. I had great confidence in his doing well. The story of how I got him shows me that I've often been more lucky than smart. Olle Bach came to me with this big colt that he wanted me to train. To say that he was big is an understatement. I generally prefer a good sized horse, but this boy was too big. I would never have picked him to train on my own volition. That didn't stop him from winning the only Hambletonian that I've ever won."

#### So, here you are without your largest client. That must have been difficult.

"It wasn't all that bad. They just didn't decide to get out and do it immediately. This was a gradual exit over a period of time. Besides which, when we had as many as 90 of their horses in the stable, we had a total of 125. We just went on and managed to be fairly successful. In the interim, my son Max, my pride and joy was born. After a little while, I suppose one might say that I grew homesick.

"In 2018, Max was nearing school age and I realized that he didn't even know his relatives, all of whom were in Australia. I thought that it might be interesting to move back to Oz, start over and have him go to school there. That thought was daunting. At about the same time, Emilio Rossati the most prominent owner in Australia, was looking for a private trainer to handle his stable. We had met before on several of Emilio's trips to this country. Ultimately I accepted his offer and went to work for him."

#### How did that work out?

"Not near as well as we both hoped it would. I suppose I had probably gone too long being my own boss. I wasn't used to being told how things should be run. Emilio is a self-made man who has always made his own decisions. I felt I should have some say in which horses should be acquired and how they should be trained and raced. The bottom line was it just didn't work out.

"After a year, I realized the words of Thomas Wolfe 'You can't go home again' rang true. Home now was the U.S. of A. Max and I packed our bags and came home. I was going to start all over again. I had one horse of which I had owned part of. Gradually I started to build up a small stable. I owe a lot, maybe most of my success, to a dear Finnish friend of mine Martti Ala-Sepalla who is the greatest student of trotters I

have known, both in terms of pedigree and the ability to see talent in a young trotter by watching a video of it in action. I didn't have a whole lot of money to spend on yearlings in 2019. Martti mentioned a trotting filly who was extremely well bred, but who's dam had been a disappointment thus far. For various and unknown reasons she had failed to produce a good horse. Her filly this year was a Donato Hanover out of Aunt Mel. Martti really liked this filly and thought that she might fit my budget. Her name was Anoka Hanover. We bought her for \$35,000 and she became the Two Year Old Trotting Filly of 2020. I was lucky enough to own a good piece of her. Things went well from there."

#### What came next?

"A long-time owner of mine, Harvey Fried, mentioned that he had seen the video of a pacing colt that caught his eye. Just about the last thing I was looking for was an Ohio-sired pacing colt. But I went to look at him, it was love at first sight. I and seven of my owners bought him. His name was Pebble Beach. He has turned out really well and has earned over \$1.7 million.

"Last year, my friend Martti once again came to the rescue. He told me, 'If you are going shopping in Harrisburg, I think there is one colt I think you need to buy. He's a Chapter Seven colt, the first foal of an Encore, Encore mare named Lass A Rope who was a very good race filly and comes from a family that I believe is much better than most people would think it is. He might go into six figures, but I think, within reason that you need to buy him, even if he brings that much.' That colt was Volume Eight. I was able to buy him for \$70,000, at least \$50,000 less than I had him budgeted for. To be truthful, if not for Martti, I doubt that I even would have looked at him. I didn't know, Encore Encore. I didn't know the family. Of course, I looked at his video and I thought very well of him in action. As an individual I thought he wasn't as big as most yearlings that I prefer, but he was a terrific individual."

# Tell us more about Volume Eight. There are some including myself, who think that he might be destined for greatness.

"He trained well and I certainly thought well of him. Our game plan was to start him in a few New York Sires Stakes and then if we thought he was good enough, we might aim for the rich races towards the end of the year.

"But then we had some hard luck. In the spring, he was turned out in a paddock. We found him with a torn up tendon in the front of a hind leg. There went our plans for the New York Sires Stakes. At that point we were concerned about his chances of survival, let alone his racing career. We took him to a prominent vet clinic and they sewed him up.

"The prognosis for his 2 year old season was anything but positive. Thankfully, the leg healed up and we were able start him back training. He trained well. His first stakes start was in the Standardbred at Delaware, Ohio. He won that and he looked good in doing it. We then went to Lexington. The first week I was somewhat disappointed in the way he raced. In the second week, he raced like the colt I hoped he would be. We then took him to The Meadowlands where he raced okay in a leg of the Kindergarten finishing fifth. In the final of the Kindergarten he was just sensational. Andy McCarthy who isn't

much for raving said to me after that race, 'That was the first time I've ever spent the last quarter of a race yelling whoa to a horse.' The next week was the Valley Victory which he also won by open lengths although he wasn't quite as good as he had been in the Kindergarten final. We are on to the big 3-year-old year next year. If all goes according to plan, which it rarely does, we will probably race him a few times before the Hambletonian, then race him there and then go on and finish the year.

"We will see what happens."

#### A look at siblings Gaitway Girl and Gaitway Guy

The Delaware Standardbred Breeders Fund Series for 2 and 3 year old pacers has been dominated by siblings Gaitway Girl and Gaitway Guy.

The elder of the two, the filly Gaitway Gal, has a record this year at 3 of 1:54.2 and earnings of \$227,304. Her one year younger brother, Gaitway Guy, has a 2-year-old record of 1:54.4f with earnings of \$142,200.

Both of them are homebreds for the GTY Stable, obviously a successful breeding and racing operation. Their success is a tribute to the value of state sponsored breeding funds.

Both of the Gaitways are by Delmarvalous, and out of Brussels Hanover, by Bettor's Delight.

Brussels Hanover was no slouch on the racetrack, with a 3-year-old record of 1:53.3f and earnings of \$326,912. Here again, we see the significance of the first two foals of the dam. Brussels Hanover is the first foal of Barcelona Hanover and she won \$326,912. Barcelona's second foal won \$133,362. None of her next seven foals won as much as \$30,000, and there was only one who did that, and six of them earned next to nothing.

I know I'm shouting into the wind when I say that the odds are top-heavy in favor of any mare's first two foals. Sure, there are later foals who go on to win stakes races, but if you're picking yearlings, you've got a much better chance of hitting a jackpot with one of the dam's first two foals, especially the first one.

It's also important not to confuse a mare's phenotype with her genotype. Phenotype means the living horse, which includes her racing performance. The Genotype is her genetic profile, and within it is her speed gene, and her ability to pass it on.

I like to think of every horse's genetic makeup as a deck of playing cards, running from the lowest card of Two to the highest card of Ace.

When a foal is conceived, each parent contributes exactly half of the foal's genetic makeup. In the case of a great producing broodmare, she always contributes a high speed card. If she's mated to a stud with his own loaded speed deck, the result will be a top racehorse.

Even if such a mare is bred to a mediocre sire, you'll still wind up with a good enough racehorse to make money at the raceways.

The point of all this is to disabuse someone, or everyone, of the notion that a fast, stakes-winning mare will reproduce those qualities in her foals. I just read that When Dovescry has been retired to the stud and will be bred next spring. She brings back pleasant memories of watching her race, and especially of the time I spent visiting with Besim, trainer Brett Pelling's right and left hand man, when she was laying up at the Red Mile.

But her future success, which she may well enjoy, will depend on her Genotype, meaning how high a speed card she's blessed with, not her Phenotype, which is her great racing career.

# Callie Davies-Gooch one of harness racing's greatest humanitarians and supporters

Born in Tulare, CA, Callie Davies-Gooch's father, Neal Hillman, was a farmer and her mother Jackie Hillman was a housewife whose passion, besides her family, was horses.

It was not surprising since Jackie's father once owned over 300 horses: a combination of thoroughbred and riding horses.

Jackie and Neal Hillman had three children— two boys that didn't care much for the four-legged animals they had to tend to— and one daughter, Callie, who followed her mother's passion and love for horses.

At that time, Jackie rode 3-gaited and 5-gaited horses and taught equitation (an equestrian discipline and art of riding on horseback).

When Callie was 5, Jackie was approached by California horseman Emmett Tassi to take a standardbred to break and train. That was the beginning of the family's involvement in the sport of harness racing.

A few years later, Jackie was given a horse named Champ Tass, in partnership with Don Moretti, who was the Tassi's nephew. That collaboration would forever change their paths.

When Callie was 14, she accompanied her mother to Phoenix Trotting Park. The enthusiastic teen was so excited and enthralled with the sport she began going to the horse races at night after school. It was there that Callie would secure a babysitting job for a family named Pierce.

Ironically, one of the Pierce boys would grow up to be one of harness racing's top drivers — the all-time great Ron Pierce.

"After the meet ended in Phoenix, my family and I returned to California to race at Hollywood Park, Santa Anita, and Bay Meadows. The following year we went back to Arizona to race where Champ Tass won the Invitational," said Davies-Gooch.

"Champ Tass was invited to participate in the prestigious Provincial Cup in Windsor, Ontario, at Windsor Raceway, so we loaded all the horses we had and away we went on a 2,000-mile trip to Canada with six horses, a goat, and all our worldly possessions at that time.

"I eventually married horseman Brent Davies, who drove the horses and my mother trained. We did very well and had a leading stable on the Ontario Jockey Club (Greenwood, Mohawk and Garden City) circuit for many years.

"After the marriage ended, I married Al Gooch, the assistant race secretary at the OJC. Sadly, in 1989, Al passed away at age 40.

"People have asked me why 'Davies-Gooch.' Well, at that time it was very difficult to revert to Hillman and I was already established as Davies-Gooch.

"My career in administration/management started in 1972 — about a year after my daughter, November, was born. I started working for the (CTA) Canadian Trotting Association as a field representative inputting race results and doing paperwork for the judges at each track in Canada. One of our duties was working with a flex writer, which would create a pink paper tape of the race results.

"I've had three jobs in racing: the Canadian Trotting Association before it became Standardbred Canada: Times In Harness, as the marketing manager and the Hambletonian Society/Breeders Crown as stakes manager.

"After 32 years of living in Canada I returned to the United States to work at TIMES: IN HARNESS. In 2002, I joined the Hambletonian Society/Breeders Crown and worked with and befriended two terrific people: Tom Charters and Moira Fanning.

"I experienced many exciting times, but one of my all-time highlights in the sport was when I was at the CTA and organized the farewell tour for one of harness racings all-time greatest horses – Cam Fella.

"We traveled to 27 tracks and racked up 47,000 miles across the U.S. and Canada. One hundred per cent of the proceeds from the souvenir sales went to several charities: Norm Clements' Jennifer Ashleigh Children's Charity, The Harness Horse Youth Foundation and The Cancer Society.

"I've also done many events raising funds for harness horse charities. In my 20s and 30s I catered parties for my friends in

harness racing, such as the opening of the new Armbro Farms (now Winbak Farms) on Highway 10 in Brampton in 1978. It was a huge success with 2,600 people attending.

"We set up buffet tables down the length of the new stallion barn before any horses were in there. I had several refrigeration trucks and set up kitchen in the two-car garage where I had numerous ovens to work with."

Now living in the United States, Callie still has roots in Canada as her daughter, November, and granddaughter live in Mississauga, ON.

Callie had three children: November, a blind paralegal, and twins January and Beau, who are both deceased.

"January was involved in the sport as a videographer who worked at Woodbine before coming to the United States. My brother Jeff did go to Canada for a while to work in the business and met and married his wife, Pat, before they returned to California to farm and raise their children.

"I was president of the Harness Horse Youth Foundation for 14 years before stepping down in 2014 and was a board member in 1992. Along with Ellen Taylor, I developed the Harness Horse Youth League of Trotting-bred horses. It is a wonderful organization for our younger generation.

"I'm also an active member of the New Jersey chapter and national of the U.S. Harness Writers Association and have served in many capacities with that association."

But Callie is not done supporting and working for our great sport, as today she works event support for John Campbell and Moira Fanning of the Hambletonian Society/Breeders Crown — organizing the winner's circle and helping out in an any capacity that she can.

All work and no play? Not this lady.

On her 'downtime' Callie and her husband Greg Krauth live six months in Dover, DE and six months in Manteca, CA at the family farm.

Callie and Greg met in 2008 and were married at The Meadowlands Racetrack by Dave Little in 2016. A special place for a very special event.

"My husband and I bought an R.V. and drive it across the country in the fall and spring. We live in it while we are in California where I have all of my woodworking equipment on the carrier on the back.

"We take our time driving and it usually takes about 10 days cross country to reach our destination — depending on how many horse tracks, horse friends or zoos we stop to visit," Davies-Gooch said, laughing.

"We've seen the Grand Canyon, Yosemite, Yellowstone, the Petrified Forest and Painted Desert on our travels, to name a few.

"I devote all my spare time to woodworking products to donate to my charities for auctions. All my work is wood with a horse-theme, of course. I take old things and reduce, recycle and up cycle.

"I take orders for wood products with donations to any horse charity: the Harness Horse Youth Foundation, Harness Museum and the Standardbred Retirement Foundation, or any other horse rescue."

The blinking-colored lights wrapped around the green Christmas wreaths cast a warm spell. Beef and I decided not to waste the last pitcher of Bud on our table. We were past mellow, turning into muddled. I had Uber locked and loaded on my phone. At times like these, eyes get red, and filters get removed.

Beef slurred, "Trey, I know you ain't got serious money. You're a working mook like me. The guys always wonder why you sign up with another baby horse each year. What's it been, 10 years?" "Fifteen."

"And how many of them horses made your money back?"

"One might have squeaked into the black."

Forgetting the glass in his hand, he threw his hands apart, sloshing beer. The bartender smiled and tossed a towel over the bar. I caught the towel, did a quick mop-up, and said, "Beef, not having serious money and trying to stay in the harness racing game, well... that creates a game within a game for me. I gotta be fiscally creative to pay those horse bills."

"Fiscally creative? What the hell does that mean? You do a smash and grab at the Dollar General?"

"Nothing illegal... yet. I economize. In year one, I quit smoking and toking for my yearling money. When you think of it, those changes might have been lifesavers."

"Well, you no doubt noticed that I keep my cars for 12,15 years. I drive beaters till they are beyond repair, go years without a car payment, and each non-car payment covers a nice chunk of the horse tab."

I worked at the barn on weekends for a couple of years, and the trainer waived my monthly bill. Oh, and I never own the horses myself. The year I tried sole ownership was a nightmare. Ever since digging out from that hole, I have had at least one partner to share the pain."

He grabbed a few peanuts from the basket. "And you got that side job with the Rambling River Rats baseball team."

"Yep, that money goes into my horse kitty. The thing is... if you got the harness racing bug bad enough, you could get in the game. That's the beauty of this sport. Anyone can buy a yearling and play. Tell me one other sport where I could own my little franchise?"

"Trey, do the math. You are hustling your tail off for a pipe dream of owning a champion racehorse."

The beer was kicking in now. "Beef, dreams are good. I wouldn't have it any other way. It wouldn't make much difference if I could stroll into a bank and withdraw a quarter of a million dollars to blow on yearlings and training. Plus, it will be spectacular when my magical harness horse hits the big time because I paid my dues."

We clinked glasses on that, leading to another slight spill. Beef said, "Trey, there is a fine line between brilliance and stupidity. You could go either way."

"I like buying a yearling and racing. It's not easy to explain my attraction, but the sport challenges me, and it makes me happy. Doing something the hard way adds to the fun. I bet I'm happier in my little corner of the racing world than those moguls sitting on a million in assets. I fly by the seat of my pants. It's more fun than a private jet."

He nodded. We sat without talking.

As I reached for my phone to get an Uber, *Have a Holly Jolly Christmas* played faintly in the distance.

The Yonkers native saw her first harness race – not surprisingly – at Yonkers Raceway, when her parents took her to the Westchester County Fair.

Her first job in the industry was in the publicity department at Yonkers in 1987, sending out entries and results. She would later do the same job at The Meadowlands. In 1993, Little was hired as a handicapper, harness writer and racing clerk at the *New York Post*, where she spent almost 27 years.

She currently writes a weekly column for *Harness Racing Update* called "Meadowlands Matters," which deals with the happenings at the New Jersey oval. She is also a regular contributor to *TROT Magazine* and the *Standardbred Journal*. This past January, Little was named the winner of the 2020/2021 John Hervey Award for feature writing for her story, "The Legend of Walter Case Jr.," which appeared in *TROT*.

non-profit based in Tennessee but servicing most of North America, brings quality healthcare to those in need, the uninsured and underinsured – services from general medicine to vision, dental and even pet animal care. They have improved the lives of over 900,000 individuals since being established in 1985.

Harvey, also a former USHWAn and the former head of Harness Racing Communications, was noted for her concern for racehorses after their racing careers, and continues in that role to this day.

"I am so glad Ellen and Bob have been named this year's January Davies Humanitarian Award winners," said Callie Davies-Gooch, January's mother and the award's originator and administrator. "They do so much for people who otherwise would not attend clinics by bringing the clinics to them, and they never ask to be recognized for their generosity of spirit." In fact, Ellen specified that any money to be spent for a trophy be donated to RAM.

The connection between Ellen and Callie, reflecting Ellen's generosity of spirit, dates back even further, in a very deep way: "After January's death in 2007, Ellen went with me every other week to grief counseling meetings."

Harvey and Murphy will be recognized at the 2023 Dan Patch Awards Banquet, presented by Caesars Entertainment, which will honor the best of the best of harness racing, both human and equine The evening culminates with the announcement of the E. Roland Harriman Harness Horse of the Year, and will take place on Sunday, Feb. 19 at the Rosen Shingle Creek Resort in Orlando, FL.

#### Woodbine surpasses \$1 billion in all-sources handle for 2022

"She's the best horse I've owned," said Lengacher who already has a few mares with Hunterton. "They do a really good job with their horses and I knew when she retired that's where she would go. They have a wonderful reputation and do a first class job selling their yearlings. I also think the bluegrass is perfect for raising the babies. It's a good partnership."

"One of the best parts of our job is looking after these really great mares," Steve said. "When Dovescry is an absolute sweetheart. When I spoke to her trainer Brett Pelling about her he said she was 'total class'. I've been a supporter of Muscle Hill from the start of his stallion career and a trait I've noticed with a lot of his offspring is they are extra intelligent horses. And that certainly applies to her."

When Dovescry will be allowed to decompress from her impressive racing career before transitioning to her new role as a broodmare. She'll be bred to Walner early in the new year.

#### Hagemeyer Farms welcomes Heart Of Chewbacca

Hagemeyer Farms is pleased to announce that Heart Of Chewbacca, p, 3, 1:48.4f (\$409,690) will join their stallion roster at their Clarksville, OH breeding facility for the 2023 breeding season. The son of Bring On The Beach—JT's Chewbacca—Four Starzzz Shark still holds a pair of track records for colt pacers—a 2-year-old mark of 1:51.2 at Northfield and a 3-year-old record of 1:48.4 at Scioto Downs. Heart Of Chewbacca was an outstanding freshman, garnering victories in the Buckeye Stallion Series (BSS) and Ohio Sires Stakes (OHSS), including a 1:51.1. score at Scioto Downs on Aug. 8, 2020, in a \$50,000 OHSS leg, which equaled the track record and set a national season's record at the time for a 2-year-old pacing colt on a five-eighths-mile oval. One week later, on Aug. 17, he lowered the Northfield Park track record by two ticks by pacing in 1:51.2, a record he still holds today. He was second in the \$300,000 OHSS 2-Year-Old Championship, clocked in 1:50.3, and wrapped up his 2-year-old campaign with \$195,598 from five wins and two seconds in seven starts.

At #, Heart Of Chewbacca continued his winning ways, with triumphs in the \$40,000 Hackett (in 1:51.1), the \$50,000 Scarlet & Gray (in 1:51), and a \$50,000 OHSS leg (in 1:51.2) at Miami Valley. The sturdy black stallion also competed at Yonkers, Lexington, The Meadowlands, and Hoosier Park, racing against some of the season's top sophomore colt pacers, with his best effort coming at Scioto when he paced to a 1:48.4 triumph on June 12, 2021, as he lowered the track record for his age and gait, a record which stands today. Heart Of Chewbacca then tied the national season's record for 3-year-old pacers on a half-mile track on July 31, 2021, at Northfield Park, by capturing a \$50,000 OHSS leg in 1:50.4. At the end of 2021, the gutsy stallion had added another \$177,232 to his earnings coffers from five wins and five seconds in 18 starts.

Heart Of Chewbacca was retired after his 4-year-old campaign that saw him add another trio of wins, along with a second and a third to his resume in 11 starts, along with \$36,860. He paced to a winning 1:49.4f triumph at Scioto Downs on Aug. 6, 2022, besting some of the finest pacers in the Buckeye State. Throughout his career, Heart Of Chewbacca battled many tough miles against his main rival, Charlie May, besting that Ohio Horse of the Year champion on three occasions.

From a pedigree standpoint, Heart Of Chewbacca is top notch, as his sire Bring On The Beach, p, 3, 1:53s (\$12,001) is a full brother

to the mighty Somebeachsomewhere, p, 3, 1:46.4 (\$3,221,299). His dam, JT's Chewbacca p, 3, 1:153.1f (\$32,220) hails from The Panderosa broodmare Santinio's Rosa, p, 5, 1:50.3 (\$166,827), making her a half-sister to Lady Neigh (by Bettor's Delight p, 1:52.4 (\$149,943) and Atta Boy Bones (by McCardle) p, 4, 1:51.1f (\$75,338), among others.

Ds Heartland and driver Art Stafford Jr. pushed to the fore early from post six, but Heinikin Bythebay and Tim Tetrick made their way to the lead just after the :26.4 first quarter after sitting patiently in the two-path through the first turn. Once the Southwind Lynx—Sally Pansen gelding controlled the terms, it was lights out for his seven rivals. Heinikin Bythebay traveled uncontested through middle splits of :56.1 and 1:24.2 before using a :29 final quarter to gain 3-3/4 lengths of separation on eventual runner-up Bad And Boujee (driven by Tony Morgan), who escaped traffic to save second over the first-over Business Director (Pat Berry).

Kevin Switzer trains 15-time winner Heinikin Bythebay, who has earned \$283,775 in his career.

Tetrick won the \$20,000 DSBF consolation as well, putting I Roddy into play first-over up the backstretch and collaring pacesetter It'spronounced Jif by a half length in 1:56.1. Jason Skinner trains the Roddy's Bags Again-I Turtle gelding, a four-time winner who returned \$7.00 to win, for owners and breeders Susan Camac and Susan Skinner.

## Meadowlands 2023 stakes program outlined

The 2023 Meadowlands stakes schedule will again feature many of the sport's most highly prized Grand Circuit stakes during the "Championship Meet."

The 26th Arthur Cutler Memorial FFA trot will retain its customary position kicking off the Big M stakes season on Saturday, May 20. Things will heat up when the calendar turns to July with the Roll With Joe, Perfect Sting, Crawford Farms and Six Pack stakes for older horses setting the table for six great weeks of Grand Circuit racing.

The 2-year-olds will have five \$20,000 Kindergarten Series preliminary legs with the Nov. 4 finals estimated at \$1 million. The Freshman Fall Final Four eliminations are on Nov. 18 and the \$1.6 million finals go the next week.

For the first time, Kindergarten final winners will be awarded a "Win & You're In" bonus into the Freshman Fall Final Four. Those winners will move directly to the final and draw for posts with any elimination winners toward the rich finals. (See stakes conditions. Horses must be eligible to the Freshman Fall Final Four)

The New Jersey Sires Stakes (NJSS) will compete for purses at the same level as 2022 with the 2-year-olds starting in mid-July. The New Jersey Classic Series (NJCS) is back in early September with a new format of eliminations and finals with consolations.

The sophomore set is led by the track's signature race, The Meadowlands Pace on Saturday, July 15. The "Biggest Party in Harness Racing" offers \$2.5 million in purses and includes an imposing slate of supporting Grand Circuit stakes including the Mistletoe Shalee, Hambletonian Maturity, WR Haughton and Dorothy Haughton FFA pacing memorials and coveted Hambletonian preps the Del Miller and Stanley Dancer Memorials.

The NJSS for 3-year-olds gets underway in May and the NJCS will grow to include pacing races for the sophomore colts and fillies during its September run.

The \$3.5 million Hambletonian Day card on Saturday, Aug. 5 will include the Hambletonian Oaks, Cane Pace and Shady Daisy, the John Cashman and Dr. John Steele Memorials for older trotters, Sam McKee and Lady Liberty for pacers and with the later start in '23, the NJSS for freshman trotters will take the place of the Haughton and Doherty 2-year-old trots that will be contested at Harrah's Hoosier Park in 2023.

The Graduate Series open division for 4-year-olds returns with the first leg at Woodbine Mohawk Park on Saturday, June 3 followed by two more legs at The Meadowlands leading into the July 8 \$250,000e finals. The Graduate Series for mares has been discontinued. Older trotting mares may count on the popular Miss Versatility for six legs before the \$100,000e final on Jug Day in Delaware, OH.

Fall racing resumes with Kindergarten legs the last two weekends of October while November is filled with features as mentioned above for 2-year-olds and finally, the re-christened FanDuel Championships (formerly known as the TVG) will bring the curtain down on stakes season.
