Racing at The Meadowlands matters.

You didn't need to race at The Meadowlands to garner divisional honors. But it sure helped those that did.

The Big M was the perfect venue for both the presumptive Pacer and Trotter of the Year, Bulldog Hanover and Bella Bellini, respectively, to showcase their talent.

Although Bulldog Hanover only competed at the East Rutherford, NJ mile oval a total of five times, winning them all, they were less than a third of his starts and only slightly over a third of his total wins for the season.


But it was the four-week stretch from June 25 to July 16, perhaps the most impressive ever in harness racing history, that pushed him to the top.

It all started in a \$50,000 leg of the Graduate Series when Bulldog went a lifetime-best 1:47. Next came the \$99,500 Roll With Joe, when he dropped his mark to 1:46. In the Graduate final, he paced in 1:46.1, setting the stage for the mile of a lifetime the following week in the \$500,000 William Haughton Memorial, when he went 1:45.4 and the entire world learned the name Bulldog Hanover.

Driver Dexter Dunn had never sat behind Bulldog prior to that magical streak, so he couldn't have anticipated what was to come or how hard it would be to pull his horse up after the wire.

"I had no idea he was going to be able to do that, four starts in a row, four weeks in a row and put up the times he did," said Dunn. "It was a surprise that he could do it, but when you sat behind him, he gave you the confidence that he could.

"With the times he was [posting], usually after a mile that fast it would be pretty easy to be pulled up because they're pretty tired, but not him. He was a character. He wanted to go around again. It's amazing how good the horse was and how big a set of lungs he obviously had."

As if being recognized as the fastest harness horse in history wasn't enough, Bulldog and his connections continue to rack up the accolades even before the Dan Patch divisional honors are announced.

Bulldog was recently named the Bergstein Proximity award winner, the highest honor bestowed by the U.S. Harness Writers Association (USHWA) solely voted on by them, while his owners, Jack Darling and Brad Grant, were chosen as recipients of the Haughton Good Guy award and Woolworth Owner of the Year award, respectively.

Dunn won USHWA's Driver of the Year award for a fourth straight year, something that has not been done since the award changed from being statistically based as the top dash-winning driver and money-winning driver into a singular winner chosen by popular vote, beginning in 2003. The best any driver has done prior to Dunn in the nearly two decades was win back-to-back honors.

Bulldog Hanover was not the only top horse that contributed to Dunn's impressive 2022, as the aforementioned Bella Bellini certainly played her part.

Most of Bella's starts, 13 of 19, took place at The Meadowlands, and included seven of her nine wins.

"She had such a good year last year [in 2021] and it was so great that they brought her back," said Dunn. "It's never easy for a 4-year-old mare to come and race against the open horses, but she was just amazing."

It's easy to say that without The Meadowlands, Bella would have retired and not raced in 2022, since it was Meadowlands'

president/chief executive officer Jeff Gural who helped convince Bella's owner Dave McDuffee, following the 2021 TVG Mares Trot, to bring her back.

In a **previous Meadowlands Matters column** that appeared in the Feb. 4 edition of HRU, McDuffee explained that encounter with Gural:

"Jeff Gural had spoken to me right after that race and said to me we're going to have a 4-year-old [Graduate] division for fillies next year with more money," said McDuffee. "I said, 'You know what Jeff? I'm probably going to change my mind and I think we'll probably race her."

That decision was a winning one for McDuffee, Bella, and most of all, the fans.

Bella's come-from-behind racing style captivated harness racing followers and garnered her quite a following.

"I was pretty lucky to get to drive horses like those two," said Dunn. "It was a really fun year with both of them start to finish really, so it was good."

The Dan Patch divisional champions will be announced next week and as is common practice, Pacer, Trotter and Horse of the Year will be announced live at the Dan Patch awards banquet on Sunday, Feb. 19, 2023.

Until that time, speculations will abound as to whether Bella will be Trotter of the Year and if Bulldog will become Horse of the Year by a unanimous vote.

While nothing is certain until the envelopes are opened and the winners are read, in the final edition of the Hambletonian Society/Breeders Crown poll, Bulldog Hanover and Bella Bellini were ranked Nos. 1 and 2, respectively.

Although final poll rankings do not determine Pacer, Trotter or Horse of the Year, in recent years, they have been a good indicator.

Not since 2016 has a horse been honored as Pacer or Trotter of the Year without leading that gait in the poll.

As for Dunn, you have to go back exactly a decade to find the last time that the Pacer and Trotter of the Year had the same pilot, which was Captaintreacherous and Chapter Seven with Tim Tetrick, who was the 2012 Driver of the Year.

"There's tough competition out there, so it's a real honor to receive that award," said Dunn.


HOLIDAY BREAK

The care and feeding of the Bulldog

Caretaker Johnny Mallia on his incredible ride with Bulldog Hanover.

When Bulldog Hanover (p, 4, 1:45.4m; \$2,419,000) stepped off the trailer at Seelster Farms to begin his new life as a full-time breeding stallion, it marked the end of his time with Johnny Mallia. The caretaker told HRU it was difficult to say goodbye to the world champion on Dec. 5, for more than emotional reasons.

"Yeah, it was [hard]. Very. That [last] morning was pretty much the same as normal. I turned him out like I usually do... As I had him out in the field, a skunk went into his stall, so I couldn't even put him back in there. I had to keep him out a little longer than I like, because we were supposed to leave [for Seelster] at a certain time."

It wasn't the first time Bulldog Hanover and Mallia had to deal with unexpected company this year, but this visitor was less welcome than the usual fans who showed up wherever Jack Darling and Brad Grant's horse was racing.

"We couldn't get the stupid skunk out of the stall," said Mallia. "Nobody wanted to get sprayed, so we had to wait... We brought [Bulldog Hanover] out of the field and tried him in a different stall, but he wouldn't go... so we just took him down there" to his new home at Seelster Farms, in Lucan, ON.

"He'd been there before, but when you unload him, even when you take him to the track, he gets worked up and puts on a big show," said Mallia, laughing. "You better watch him! That's the way he is sometimes."

The caretaker looked after Bulldog Hanover throughout the stallion's three years on the track.

"He definitely got better, as everyone can see, but it was funny how through the season he just got sounder and better as

> the year went on. Those four races that he raced at The Meadowlands, that would kill a normal horse. Thank God he had a month off before his next race."


> The only time Mallia was not with "Bulldog" this season was during a three-week span when the horse was with trainer Noel Daley to compete at The Meadowlands.

> "I wanted to, but we have horses here and we're kind of not set up for so much travel," said Mallia, who works for Darling at Classy Lane Training Centre in Puslinch, ON.

> Bulldog Hanover returned home a little tired after his remarkable record miles.

> "He had lots of big races coming up," recalled Mallia, who worked with Darling to bring the top pacer back to top form. "It wasn't overnight - it took a few weeks, and he just got better and better... to the end of the year. I was kind of proud of that.

> "Overall, now that he's gone, he was a little bit hard [to care for], but we got along. We knew each other's routine and we knew each other. He has moments where he can be really aggressive, strong, and drag you around - he's just so powerful. You try not to be too aggressive with him, to hurt him or anything like that. Basically, I just tried

spoiling him all the time, making him feel everything was his idea, and doing things he would like," such as feeding him sliced watermelon, apples, and bananas.

"Right from day one, the very first time he went in to qualify at Mohawk, he was like that – he was quiet," said his caretaker, who stood by watchfully as large groups of admirers paid homage to the likely Dan Patch and O'Brien Horse of the Year, who was named the third equine winner in the history of USHWA's Stan Bergstein/Proximity Award on Monday (Dec. 19).

"I didn't know how he would handle all the people, but he was almost human, that horse. He was so intelligent," said Mallia. With the exception of one boisterous group seeking souvenirs at the Breeders Crown — "They were keeping me from doing my job... They wanted a piece of his harness, his halter... It was just too much" — he found Bulldog Hanover's admirers to be a respectful crowd.

"All the other people around all the tracks, everybody was so courteous and they would ask first – 'Take my picture."

Two overly-enthusiastic fans, kids in tow, even photobombed Bulldog Hanover's retirement ceremony at Woodbine Mohawk Park.

"When I looked at the pictures in the winner's circle, they barged in and they were there."

Many owners and trainers historically took strong measures to prevent close encounters, Mallia told HRU.

"They wouldn't allow any of that. They would hire security guards for their horses, so people couldn't come close, and they had barriers set up to keep people away... We never did any of that" for the sport's latest rock star.

On Dec. 3, Bulldog Hanover's home track Woodbine Mohawk Park sent him out in style with a special retirement lap and winner's circle presentation.

"It was a little bit sad, too – the last time he's at the track, doing what he does," said his caretaker. "Normally when he comes to the winner's circle, he's in the infield and he stands like a perfect gentleman, but that's after a race. So Jack [Darling] just kind of went around the track once with him, and he was kind of worked up... I was kind of obsessed with just keeping him safe, one more night. Basically a big part of my job was keeping him safe – it wasn't easy."

With the horse of a lifetime now moving on to a second season at stud, Mallia is currently caring for three young pacers trained by Darling.

"Three or four, that's what we usually do," he said. "We have a 2-year-old who's just made his first qualifier – his name is Sky Low Low [Bettors Delight–Fancy Filly]. He just qualified Monday. He did good. He was third [individually timed in 2:00.1s at WMP]. He's going to make his first appearance here soon, in a maiden. He's kind of a small horse," renamed by Darling for a famous wrestler of small stature.

"We have two babies: Freight Air [Jimmy Freight – Walk On Air] and Tea Party Hanover [Stay Hungry – Thisorthat Hanover], a filly Brad Grant bought in Harrisburg... He paid \$150,000 for her. So the pressure starts again!" he said with a laugh.

Mallia thrives on the pressure of helping young standardbreds reach their potential.

"I've been in it since I was 18, so over 40 years," he said, adding that 15 of those years were spent working for Darling.

"I've worked for lots of different people. Trevor Ritchie: I was there for a while and we were partners on horses; we owned a couple of horses together. Terry Kerr: I worked for him for four years. He was really good to work for. Good guy. That's where I started, and then I went to work for Trevor.

"I worked for Jack one winter down at Pompano. It was the very first winter that he went there. I was there for six months, then

If 13 or more declare to start in any preliminary leg, The Meadowlands may adopt any of the methods of dividing the race then current in the rules and regulations. The horses eligible for the Finals in these events shall be the ten (10) highest total point earners that enter, using the system listed below. In the event of a tie for the final position, that horse will be drawn by lot. If horses eligible for the final are not declared for the final, declared horses from the preliminary legs will be selected by taking the horse(s) placing highest in the order of the point system to complete the field for the final. The next two properly declared horses placing highest in the order of the point system may be listed as also eligible for the finals and may draw in before scratch time. Each consolation may be required to have at least eight entries.

I left and came back to Mohawk and started my own stable. I had my own for a few years; probably 10 or 15 years I had a horse on the side, and then I started working for people [like] Tom Durand, also a good guy. I was hooked up with Cal Campbell for a while; we claimed some horses together and I worked there... Blair Burgess: I went to Florida one year and actually had two of my own yearlings, and just helped Blair drive. We went to the same farm when we came home from Florida.

"The original idea was that Trevor and I were going there to look for horses to buy or claim and race in Florida. We'd never been there before. This was 1986 or something. It was just an opportunity that I thought would be fun. It turned out Trevor never went, so I just worked for Jack... [Years later], when

the opportunity came up again where he needed somebody, I was down the shedrow and out of a job, I think, and I just asked him for a job, and boom, he hired me right away."

Mallia said his father, Stan, first got him into harness racing, then "tried to talk [him] out of it."

"We always had one or two, and we had a broodmare," he said. We started that way. It was more of a hobby for him. He raced at Flamboro, Western Fair, a little bit at Mohawk... I was horse-crazy, probably when I was 6 years old. He got his first horse and I think I had my groom's license when I was 8 or 10 because I needed to get in the paddock at London... I've had it ever since."

Being a caretaker takes talent, the ability to make every horse feel like a potential winner when they step onto the track.

"I try to look after them like they're that horse, and look after all the horses as if they're Bulldog [even if] they're obviously not... That's a huge part of the job: making them feel good and like they're better than everybody else. Sometimes it works; sometimes they're just not as good – most times it's like that."

Mallia also took care of Beaumond Hanover (p,3, 1:49.1s; \$442,057), another top Darling protege who trained down as well as, maybe better than, Bulldog. He said the latter "just possessed something the other horses didn't have."

The successful caretaker won't be slowing down in the new year, aside from playing golf when he finds a spare moment in the summer.

He loves his job, even though it has a demanding schedule.

"It's the racing that takes the toll," he said. 'It's way too long at night. Breeders Crown night, I got home probably 2:30 in the

morning... The longest night was when we went to Dayton, Ohio. They do it a little bit different there: Once you do a urine [test], after you get tested, you have to wait around another hour where they draw the blood. We were in the very last race and I think we got out of there around 1 o'clock. Then it was a three-hour drive to Lexington with him, and I got home at 3:30-4 o'clock."

Another groom arrived, surprising Mallia as he was finally getting Bulldog Hanover settled in: "What's this guy doing? Oh, he's here to feed breakfast."

Despite the long hours and pressure, the lifelong horseman stays devoted to the racing game.

"I just like doing well," he said. "It's satisfying for me, knowing that the horse raced to its full potential. I like to feel that I was a part of it. That helps you keep going. Horses get beat and whatnot, but you know when you've got a good one."

He was reassured by what he was told on Bulldog Hanover's arrival at Seelster Farms: "Feel free to come by any time, because he is your horse.' It kind of made me feel good," said Mallia.

It was hard letting him go, but I'm going to go see him at Christmas. My family lives in London, so I'm going to go there for Christmas. We took everybody to see him [at Seelster] last year, so I think we'll do it again."

Breeding sales 2022 wrap up

Twenty notes of interest from the year that was.

- 1. The top three broodmare sires of all time are: Artsplace (\$494,710,137), Albatross (\$451,057,353) and Abercrombie (\$372,481,156).
- 2. Did Bulldog Hanover give his sire Shadow Play a boost in 2022? It doesn't appear so. He sold 30 in total 15 colts and 15 fillies for an average of \$16,583 with Alpine Seelster at \$42,000 the topper.

Horse racing in Illinois "dying" while waiting for Hawthorne racino to be built

A **front page story** in Tuesday's *Chicago Tribune* dramatized the precarious position in which Illinois harness and thoroughbred horsemen find themselves.

"Horse racing is dying in Illinois, while in other states that have racinos it's flourishing," Dave McCaffrey, executive director of the Illinois Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association and former president of the Illinois Harness Horsemen's Association, told the *Tribune's* Robert McCoppin.

The Illinois legislature legalized casino gambling at racetracks in 2019 and the following year Hawthorne Race Course began preliminary demolition work to set the stage for construction of a \$400 million racino that was scheduled to open in 2021.

Instead, Hawthorne has been conducting racing while parts of the grandstand and clubhouse are demolished and the project has been stalled because of a combination of the COVID-19 pandemic, inflation, high interest rates and supply chain issues.

Complicating the situation for horsemen, the corporate owner of Arlington International Racecourse, Churchill Downs Inc. (CDI), permanently closed the palatial thoroughbred track following its 2021 meeting.

That has left Hawthorne as the lone survivor among the seven tracks that operated in the Chicago metropolitan area in the early 1970s.

As a consequence, harness and thoroughbred horsemen have had to work out a time-share arrangement.

This year was divided into four segments—a Jan. 7-March 20 harness meeting, an April 2-June 25 thoroughbred meeting, a July 2-Sept. 11 harness meeting and a Sept. 23-Dec. 31 thoroughbred meeting.

In 2023 the format will be significantly different—the thoroughbreds will race from March 4-Sept 4 and the standardbreds from Sept. 9-Dec. 31.

To minimize the major impact of the long layoff on harness horsemen, the horsemen's purse account at Hawthorne will foot the bill for non-betting races twice weekly from June 12-Aug. 31 at the Springfield State Fairgrounds, 175 miles to the south. According to Hawthorne President Tim Carey, purses

will total approximately \$780,000 and Hawthorne will spend an additional \$100,000 to cover operating expenses.

Using McCaffrey's analogy to describe the situation, the Springfield meeting will keep Illinois harness racing on life support.

According to Illinois Harness Horsemen's Association executive director Tony Somone, "The entire schedule for harness horsemen falls apart without these races. We've got to hold on until a casino gets up and running at Hawthorne."

When it does, Hawthorne will allocate a share of the casino's adjusted gross revenue to harness and thoroughbred purses, and Somone projects an infusion of as much as \$12 million in the harness purse account that currently is in the neighborhood of \$7 million.

At the 2023 dates hearings in September, Carey told the Illinois Racing Board that he expected construction would begin "later this year while we are racing."

But that hasn't happened so horsepeople are crossing their fingers in hopes that it will get underway during January and February when there is no racing and continue during the thoroughbred and harness meetings.

The *Tribune* story pointed out that while construction is yet to begin other ventures have gotten the go-ahead for new stand-alone Illinois casinos in downtown Chicago, Waukegan, East Hazel Crest and Danville. Temporary casinos have been established in Waukegan and Rockford and the downtown Chicago casino—which will be about a half-hour drive from Hawthorne, depending on traffic—is scheduled to begin operating at a temporary location in the Medinah Temple in June prior to moving to its \$1.74 billion permanent site in 2026.

Horsepeople fear that by the time Hawthorne's racino opens the other casinos will have established a foothold in the betting marketplace, leaving it dependent on customers living in close proximity to the track.

McCoppin cited a significant impediment to progress. He wrote: "Where Hawthorne is limited to income from its track, sportsbook, off-track and on-line betting competitors typically have the revenue from other casinos, or have used creative partnerships. Bally's, for one, sold its land and leased it back to raise \$500 million for its \$1.74 billion casino complex in Chicago.

"As a family-owned business with 160-some shareholders, Hawthorne had to restructure to make the [Illinois] Gaming Board vetting process easier."

Despite all of the obstacles he has encountered, Carey said he is optimistic.

"Hawthorne casino is coming, and it's going to transform Illinois horse racing for generations," he said. "We believe that we can rebuild this industry."

One need no further than Illinois' next door neighbor, Indiana, to see the major impact casino components have on racing. Pari-mutuel betting didn't begin there until 1994, but today

harness racing at Harrah's Hoosier Park Racing and Casino and thoroughbred racing at Horseshoe Indianapolis are thriving.

Meanwhile, in Illinois, the quality of racing, the number of people employed in racing and the foal crops have fallen dramatically.

The role that Churchill Downs, Inc. has played in Illinois racing's demise has been enormous. Arlington had been conspiring for years to put Hawthorne out of business but after sister harness tracks Balmoral Park and Maywood Park were forced into bankruptcy the CDI subsidiary joined with Hawthorne to prompt the Illinois Racing Board to deny them dates in 2016, thereby wiping them off the racing map.

For years Arlington lobbied for a racino but when it became possible because of the 2019 legislation the track suddenly did an about-face and said it wasn't interested.

The obvious reason was because in 2018 CDI acquired a 62 per cent interest in nearby Rivers Casino, by far the biggest moneymaker of the 10 Illinois casinos operating at the time.

Then, came the decision to sell the Arlington property to the Chicago Bears (a deal that is expected to be finalized next year)

with a string attached — the new owner would have to tear down what Architectural Digest once described as "the world's most beautiful racetrack."

The cessation of racing at Arlington has had several ramifications for CDI's bottom line.



Both thoroughbred and harness racing in Illinois have been crippled because they are forced into a time-share arrangement at Hawthorne, prompting many bettors who live in the vicinity of Arlington to either bet by phone or on-line on Churchill Downs races during the spring, summer and fall or spend their gambling dollars at Rivers rather than make the long drive to Hawthorne.







A conversation with "The Buckeye" David Miller

I challenge the readers of this column to guess how many David Millers are or have been members of the United States Trotting Association? Would you believe 60 of them? Almost seven full pages on the USTA website. But I digress. This story is about one David Miller, sometimes known as The Buckeye or Purple Jesus.


When David Miller was growing up in Ohio's capitol, Columbus, he dreamed of maybe someday being able to drive horses at Delaware, OH. In his wildest dreams, he imagined himself one

day being a good enough driver to secure a mount in the Little Brown Jug. He never dreamt that someday he would be tied with such luminaries as Billy Haughton and Michel Lachance as the leading driver of Jug winners with five — 2003 No Pan Intended; 2008 Shadow Play; 2011 Big Bad John; 2016 Betting Line and 2018 Courtly Choice. That's not all that The Buckeye has to crow about. He is also the all-time leading driver at the home of the Little Brown Jug. He has had 1,093 starts, 242 wins, 200 places, 173 shows, a UDRS of .369 and his drives have garnered \$7,203,503 for their owners at Delaware. In the Jug only, his stats read 65 18-11-11 with earnings of \$2,597,326. If that were all his achievements that likely would have been enough to get him enshrined in the Living Hall of Fame in Goshen. But they are more — much more.

In his lifetime in the sport, Purple Jesus has piloted 13,886 winners and numerous others to winnings of \$270,988,702 and has won just about every race that counts except The Hambletonian. More about that later.

This year you will not be spending your winters in Florida as you have done in the most recent years. Will you miss it?

"I'm guessing that I probably will. Those sunny days in Florida were enjoyable. My daughter Devan was working for the Burke



operation. She had a group of horses that she would winter and race at Pompano Park. I'd spend some time driving for her and picking up some catch drives.

"Sadly, Pompano Park is no more. I'll miss that sunshine, but I would miss not having horses to drive even more. I'm going to stay up north and drive at The Meadowlands. If I would get some drives at Yonkers and Dover Downs I would certainly make my way over there. Driving horses is what I do.

"It appears that most of the regulars will be back racing at The Meadowlands this winter — Yannick [Gingras] and Timmy [Tetrick], of course will be regulars. I understand that the Down Under guys are going home for a short while, but they will be back well before spring."

Let's talk about some of the best horses with which you've been involved.

"Some of my answers might surprise and I'm sure that I will leave out some that deserve to be mentioned. To the connections of those, I apologize. My memory is not my strongest suit."

Two-Year-Old Pacers

Colts: "The first top one was Falcons Future. He did something that no other 2-year-old, with the exception of Albatross, has ever been able to do. His connections were unable to get a race for him. So they put him. into a race with the open horses at Scioto Downs and he whipped them soundly. In recent years I would say Papi Rob Hanover. With the exception of Always B Miki, he is probably the greatest horse I've ever sat behind."

Fillies: "There have been so many really good ones. The first was probably Isabella Blue Chip that I drove for George Teague."

Two-Year-Old Trotters:

Colts: "Ken Warkentin. He was an absolutely exceptional 2-yearold. He was undoubtedly the very best one out of his year. He was just a little fella that came to his speed early. Unfortunately, like some other little horses, he didn't improve much between 2 and 3."

Fillies: "Broadway Donna was the first outstanding one. Jimmy Campbell did an outstanding job with her. She was not only the best as a 2-yer-old for me, she also came back at 3 to do the same, even though her competition both years was against Check Me out. Venerable, more recently, was just great. She managed to beat all the boys in the million dollar race at Mohawk."

Three-Year-Old Pacers

Colts: "Always B Miki was an exceptional horse. He was undoubtedly the best I've been privileged to drive. His race in The Meadowlands Pace, even though he finished second, might have been the greatest performance that I've been a part of. Papi Rob Hanover's race at The Meadows when he set a world's record might have been close."

Without a doubt winning the 2003 Jug with No Pan Intended [was my greatest thrill in racing]. I was on a high for at least a week. For years my ambition had been to one day be able to drive a horse in the Little Brown Jug. Here I was actually driving a winner of what I consider Ohio's greatest sporting event. For this young Buckeye there has never been anything comparable.

Fillies: "Test of Faith. What more can you say about a 3-year-old filly that was the Horse of the Year."

Three-Year-Old Trotters

Colts: "It is kind of a dead heat between What The Hill and Kadabra. They were both absolutely terrific trotters. If pressed, I might give the nod to Kadabra probably because he became a dominating free-for-aller at 4."

Fillies: "Broadway Donna again. Once again a big bravo to Jimmy Campbell. I was so happy to see him voted as Trainer of the Year for 2022. Nobody deserves it more. I've also driven several really good fillies for Jimmy Takter."

Older Pacers

Males: "Always B Miki. The greatest horse that I've ever sat behind."

Females: "Test of Faith. One of the greatest female pacers ever."

Older Trotters

Males: "Kadabra, a dominating free-for-aller at only four years of age."

Females: "When Dovescry. One of only a very small number, maybe the only one, who could occasionally beat Bella Bellini and Atlanta."

How about your competition? Who are the best drivers you've competed against?

"Number one would certainly be John Campbell. Look at the record book. He holds far more records than anybody else. Actually nobody else is even close.


"There are and have been so many great drivers that I've raced against — Ron Pierce, Brian Sears, Yannick Gingras, Tim Tetrick, Dave Palone and now the Down Under contingent of Dexter Dunn and the McCarthy Brothers, Andy and Todd. The young drivers in Canada, James MacDonald, Doug McNair and Lous Philippe Roy do not take a back seat to anybody. All they need, as all of us do, is the right horses. There are undoubtedly others that belong on the list. I believe that there are more talented young drivers than there have ever been in my time in the sport. All some of them need is a break and some first-hand experience."

Please give us a quick resume of your driving career.

"I started driving on the Ohio Fair Circuit, mostly for my dad and a man named Ed Pell who taught me how to read a program properly and how to study other drivers — hopefully I'd adapt the positives and eliminate the negatives of how they drove. I then went to the Ohio pari-mutuel tracks, primarily Northfield where I did quite well. From Northfield I went to The Meadows for a short period, where I was quite satisfied playing third fiddle behind two guys named Palone and Sears. I hoped that I had gained enough experience to give the big time, meaning The Meadowlands a go. I got very lucky. I hadn't been there very long when I got the drive behind Magician, one of the most wonderful trotters I've been connected with. He gave me good publicity, a lot of confidence and taught me a whole lot about driving."

How would you describe yourself as a driver?

"I suppose when you are driving horses your first obligation is to the betting public. But almost as important, if not equally important, is your obligation to the horse itself, especially a young green one and that horse's connections — its trainer and owner(s). I've sometimes been accused of under driving some horses, especially young ones. That might be a valid criticism. I believe there to be a thin line between your obligation to the public and to the horse itself. I think that a great part of my role as a driver is to teach the young horse. I like the horses that I drive to be versatile. You can eliminate versatility by sending a young horse down the road a few times - maybe even just once. I think that being, for lack of a better word "kind" to a horse will result in it becoming a better and more versatile horse for the rest of its career."

Are there any significant disappointments?

"There are three. Two of them involve horses being taken down after legitimately winning major races. The first was with What The Hill in the 2017 Hambletonian. That one really hurt everyone connected with the colt. To this day I believe it to have been an unfair decision. The second involved Papi Rob Hanover winning the 2019 Breeders Crown. He was taken down and the win was given to Tall Dark Stranger. Yannick made an objection against me. I don't blame him. If I were in his place, I might have done the same thing. What happened that night happens at racetracks all over all the time with no consequences. The third also involved Papi Rob Hanover. We had won the elimination of The Adios in a world record time of 1.47.1f. He was absolutely awesome that day. Unfortunately, he came out of the race with a broken bone resulting in his retirement from racing. I truly believe what we saw that day was just the beginning of great things to come. We will never know what might have been."

What does the future hold for David S. Miller?

"I suppose I'll just keep on keeping on. Driving horses has been my life's greatest pleasure. It's all I know how to do well. There will be a time when I'm not as capable as I once was. That time might soon arrive, but as for now I consider myself to be very competitive with my peers. I suppose that when the day comes when I'm not, I'll know it and hang up my whip and colors."

Skylar Tabron on his quiet success in his first year of training

Skylar Tabron may be a man of few words, but he's also a man of many talents.

If the Pennsylvania horseman opted to let his horses do the talking, he would no doubt be happy with what he saw on their respective stat lines.

In his first season as a standardbred trainer, Tabron has exceeded his own expectations, producing a record of 7-6-3 from 28 starts.

"I'm very happy with how things have gone. You don't know quite what to expect in your first year, but I feel extremely fortunate to have had a pretty good start to my career."

Tabron points to a quartet of horsemen, namely, Jimmy Daumit, Jeff Indof, John Porter, and Dirk Simpson, for helping further his interest in the sport, and to feel comfortable in making the jump to the standardbred training ranks.

"It started out when I met John and he was the one who got me started in the sport, along with his buddy Jimmy. Eventually, I worked my way up to working with Jeff, and then, after that, I began working with Dirk, who has given me a lot of opportunity."

On June 23, Tabron notched his first training victory, the milestone coming on the hooves of Irish Daydream.

Owned by Frank Indof and Howard Balis, the 4-year-old daughter of Vintage Master—Irish Day was driven to victory by Jeremy Indof.

Bred by Winbak Farm, the bay mare has been a consistent money-earner for Tabron, sporting a mark of 8-9-6 from 31 starts on the campaign.

"That win, it was one of biggest highlights of my life," he said of the one-length score in 1:53.3 at The Meadows. "It wasn't a close one, so that makes it a little easier on your nerves. I just couldn't believe it when it was happening right in front of me. About half the track reached out to congratulate me. By the time I woke up, my cellphone and my Facebook page was flooded with over 100 messages."

Not surprisingly, Tabron has no shortage of superlatives when talk turns to Irish Daydream.

In her past 10 starts, the mare has posted six wins, three seconds and a third, all of them coming at The Meadows.

"She's just so easy and fun to work with. She always wants to do her job, is so easy train, and doesn't give you any attitude.

She's a pleasure to be around and she shows up every race. I'm very lucky to be able to train her. Getting her to the Open was a huge highlight for me."

Tabron has also established a bond with the broodmare Dontstepontheflowers.

"We all call her 'Flower.' She's very sassy. But I enjoy it though. All the horses have different personalities, but to me, that's a good thing. Some are tougher to work with, others are easier, but they all help you learn and get better at what you do."

With the 2022 season soon coming to a close, Tabron will soon turn his thoughts to 2023 and what he would like to accomplish in his sophomore campaign.

Overall, the 27-year-old said he is happy with what he was able to achieve this year, including the chance to sit in the sulky.

"Dirk Simpson, he's been letting me drive a couple for him in qualifiers, which is one thing I was able to knock off my bucket list. It's awesome. When you get off the bike the first time, you're nerves a little jumpy, but after that, I got used to it. It's a big rush to be able to do that."

Surpassing his year-one numbers is at the top of Tabron's short-term goals. Starting his own stable and taking in some of the industry's highest profile events are some of his longer-term objectives.

There's also one major racing event Tabron hopes to see in person sooner rather than later.

"I have five horses right now, and I think about eight would be the ideal number for me. I want to do better than I did this year and just keep that momentum going. That's important, to build on what you able to do, and then improve going forward. I'd also like to own my own horse one day. Hopefully, I can do that next year, but if not, there is always down the line. I'd also like to go to the Little Brown Jug one time. I had some buddies go and they loved it. I've never been because I've always been busy with the horses, which I've been doing since middle school. So, here I am."

When he isn't tending to his band of horses, Tabron appreciates any chance to take in the great outdoors.

He also doesn't mind getting a good night's sleep.

"I usually go hunting or fishing each year for a few days. That's always something I look forward to. It's a nice way to unwind, even if it's not for a long time. Racing requires a lot of work and dedication, so when you do get those moments to come up for air, you take them. I don't really watch sports. I find it boring, to be honest. For me, I like the outdoors. But I also don't mind coming home from a long day and just jumping into bed. And that's okay too."

Whether he's reeling in a pike or resting up for the next morning's tasks, racing is never far removed from Tabron's thoughts.

And although he isn't a big talker when it comes to his early successes, the trainer's numbers speak volumes about his dedication to the craft.

He's hopeful even bigger and better days are ahead.

"It's a sport of ups and downs where you lose more than you win, but there is always something to look forward to, something to chase after and hope for. Every day, I feel very fortunate to be able to do what I do. I love the sport and I love the horses. I'm going to keep pushing to get better and hopefully, the results will come. That's what I'm working for."

Idao de Tillard has belonged in the top of the French "I-crop" and he got post 2 behind the gate in Saturday's race.

UPSET IN BIG MONTÉ RACE

The \$250,000 Prix de Vincennes for 3-year-old trotters racing under saddle was held at Vincennes on Sunday (Dec. 18) and the exciting race ended with an upset winner from Christophe Clin's stable.

Florian Desmigneux rode 3-year-old **Jessy de Banville** (Boccador de Simm) and waited far back in the field as the pace was set high in front, where Joyeuse controlled the field in the lead. When the field was midway into the race, Jessy de Banville was still last and her finish was really strong. Shortly before the wire, Jessy de Banville got advantage and the big prize check landed at her bank account. The mile rate over 1.6 miles was 1:58. Replay **here**.

The newly established group 1-race \$210,000 Prix Jag de Bellouet for 4-year-olds racing under saddle was held on the same day at Vincennes and Julien le Mer-trained **Ideale du Chene** (Bird Parker) was pushed to the lead with some half mile to go. Ideale du Chene won the Prix de Vincennes in 2021 and collected another big win under saddle in Sunday's race in a mile rate of 1:57.2 over 1.6 miles.

One more big monté race was held during Vincennes' Sunday card and the \$210,000 Prix Bilibili for 5-year-olds ended with victory for Laurent-Claude Abrivard's **Hanna des Molles** (Village Mystic). Hanna des Molles was placed as third horse, covered by Happy And Lucky and when Alexandre Abrivard pushed on the gas pedal at the top of the stretch, Hanna des Molles flew on the inside as new leader Happy And Lucky had problem holding a straight line on the stretch.

The mile rate for the winner was 1:55.4 over 1.6 miles.

Tomas Malmqvist trained **Kamehameha** (Uniclove) hit the lead after 600 meters in the \$1250,000 Prix Emmanuel Margouty for 2-year-old colts at Vincennes on Saturday (Dec. 17) afternoon.

Driver Eric Raffin seemed pretty confident in the lead behind the talented 2-year-old trotter and the victory became safe in a mile rate of 2:002 over 1.6 miles.

The 2-year-old fillies battled in Sunday's (Dec. 18) \$125,000 Prix Une de Mai over 2,700 meters and a strong winner was Fabrice Souloy-trained **Kalamity d'Heripre** (Un Mec d'Heripre). Franck Nivard opted a position outside of leading favorite Katchina de Simm when a kilometer remained off the race and Kalamity d'Heripre fought bravely for the win in a mile rate of 2:03 over 1.6 miles.

Lochinvar Art getting close to making his U.S. debut

Trainer Shane Tritton thinks former superstar Aussie pacer Lochinvar Art is the best-credentialled modern day Down Under pacer to try his luck in the U.S.

While Kiwi champ Lazarus' CV read even better, his greatness came as a stayer over distances much longer than a mile in New Zealand and Australia.

"Sure, Lochinvar Art had good form in staying races too, but I watched him closely and he was a brilliant sprint horse. Go through his record and it stands out," Tritton said.

"He smashed the Melton track record when he ran 1:48.6 over 1720m in January, 2020. Nobody thought you'd ever see that time run at Melton and nothing has come close since.

"Soon after that he beat a terrific field in the Chariots Of Fire over a mile and then he sat parked in the Miracle Mile two weeks after that and beat all bar King Of Swing, who was the ultimate Menangle mile horse.

"The racing in Australia didn't give Sal (former trainer David Moran) the chance to keep him to sprint racing, you have to race over all different distances when you're a Grand Circuit horse in Australia.

"As great as Lazarus was, he hadn't done much sprint racing when he came here, whereas Lochinvar Art has. I think that's a really important factor."

Lochinvar Art was sent to the U.S. by owner Kevin Gordon to join Tritton and wife, Lauren, soon after he had a "small bleed" when sixth at Melton on Sept. 17.

Only now is he starting to get the hopples on and get a "little bit more serious" in training.

"I said at the time, it was actually perfect timing when he came across. It basically gave us five months to get him exactly where he needs to be for his first major target, which will be the Borgata series," Tritton said.

"It's been so important just to be able to take our time. He had four weeks jogging, stepped-up a tad for the next four weeks and has had the hopples on three or four times now.

"We'll spend the next four weeks getting him fitter and look to qualify him in late January or early February. He'll have a couple of runs in February or early March before the Borgata starts.

"We haven't decided yet, but he may qualify at The Meadowlands and have a run or two there before going to Yonkers for the Borgata, which is a bit like the Inter Dominion is Down Under. It's five weeks of heats with the top eight qualifiers going through to the final which will be worth \$US700-800,000.

"Yonkers is basically our home track, it's where we race most, and we think the style of racing will really suit him there. It's a bit more like Aussie racing than The Meadowlands. It's a tough style of racing and he's a tough horse.

"We had Nandolo win three heats of the Borgata last year so we know the sort of horse it takes."

Tritton said the Borgata would also be a great "testing ground" to shape targets for Lochinvar Art through the rest of 2023.

"Our plan is to aim at the biggest races because that's where he belongs at his best, but he's got to earn some good money and show he's up to it through the Borgata to chase those top races afterwards," he said.





So, how does the former Down Under champ feel and look so far?

"He's great. He looks terrific and the fact he tries to kick Lauren out of the cart when he goes out to work says he's a happy horse and feeling good," he said.

"But it's too early to say how good he's going because we deliberately haven't asked him to let rip yet.

"It's a bit like having a Ferrari in the garage and not being able to drive it, but we've got a plan to take our time and we're sticking to it.

"What I'll say is that I hopped the cart behind him the other day and you can feel why he was such a great horse. It just feels like there's a stack of acceleration there if you asked for it."

Most importantly, Lochinvar Art is healthy.

"Yes, the vet went right over him when we got him and gave him a great report. We've had a bit of work to do on his feet, but they're good now. He's being treated with Lasix, too, for the issues he had back home," Tritton said.

"We're stoked with him on every level so far."

Team Tritton is going through something of a rebuild, but Lochinvar Art isn't the only horse they have high hopes for in 2023.

"He's the headline act if we can get him back to his best, for sure. But we've got a mare called Maybelline and a three-year-old for next year, It's A Me Mario should be in the good races, too," he said.

"Even though we won almost \$US1 million for the stable in 2022, with Nandolo leading the way, it was a year of rebuilding in many ways. We've got seven yearlings about to turn 2 and four about to turn 3, as well."

Another "import" also has Team Tritton excited.

"This one is a bit different," Shane said. "We've been sent the two-time champion Irish trotter to train.

"His name is Harry Knows. He's a French-bred, who was born in Ireland. He's won something like 22 of his 29 starts.

"Obviously, it's going to be very different over here, but he feels like he's got a big motor. We're hoping for big things."


Four-year-old pacer Bulldog Hanover, who posted the fastest time ever for a mile this summer when he won in 1:45.4 while capturing the imagination of all both within and outside the harness sport, has been selected as the winner of the 2022 Stan Bergstein Proximity Award, the highest honor voted on solely by the members of the United States Harness Writers Association (USHWA), the leading organization for harness racing communicators.

Bulldog Hanover becomes only the third horse to win the award, following Rambling Willie in 1984 and Foiled Again in 2018. Both of those veterans etched their names into history with a decade or more of record-setting racetrack achievement; while a very good horse at two and three, Bulldog Hanover and his record 2022 campaign provided the incandescence that enabled the horse to receive this highest accolade.

Bred and consigned as a yearling by Hanover Shoe Farms, Bulldog Hanover was raced by trainer Jack Darling's Jack Darling Stables LTD until midway through his 3-year-old season, when prominent owner Brad Grant bought a share of the horse. Bulldog Hanover won 14 of 21 starts at age 2 and 3, earning \$769,064, but his 4-year-old campaign in 2022 secured his legendary status.

streaked home in a supersonic :25.1 to complete the unprecedented 1:45.4 mile, a fifth faster than nearest rivals Always B Miki, Lather Up, and Allywag Hanover.

As Bulldog Hanover consistently showed himself to be a superior horse, appreciative fans – and horsemen – wanted to see the star "up close," and the media peppered trainer Darling with questions, all of which he handled with aplomb. Bulldog Hanover even had visitors back at his barn, seeing the superstar in his familiar, comfortable surroundings. The sport's profile was raised considerably by the exploits of Bulldog Hanover and his connections – actually, a very good year for harness racing was made even better by the charismatic horse.

This is the 75th anniversary of the founding of USHWA, and the Proximity Award is almost as old – it dates back to 1952, when starting gate inventor Steve Phillips was first presented the award named after the 1950 Harness Horse of the Year Proximity. Proximity was a trotting mare who took a time-trial mark of 1:59.3 and earned \$252,924 (a lofty sum in those days), and won Horse of the Year in her eight-year-old campaign. Upon the 2011 passing of the legendary Stan Bergstein, the only inductee into both the Hall Of Fame and Communicators Hall Of Fame, it was decided the best way to honor his memory was to jointly put his name with Proximity's on the most prestigious award voted on solely by USHWAns.

Bulldog Hanover will be recognized at the 2023 Dan Patch Awards Banquet, presented by Caesars Entertainment, which will honor the best of the best of harness racing, both human and equine. Ontario-based **Jack Darling** completed the last – for now – of the award gathering done by the "Bulldog Hanover Express," being voted the W.R. Haughton Good Guy Award by members of the U.S. Harness Writers Association (USHWA).


Joining Darling to be feted at the Dan Patch Awards Banquet, presented by Caesars Entertainment, in Orlando FL on Sunday, Feb. 19 will be veteran starter **Mike Woebkenberg**, who won the LeeAnne Pooler Unsung Hero Award. Two of the sport's brightest young stars – trainer **Lucas Wallin**, who won the Rising Star Award, and New Jersey polymath **Edison Hatter**, who captured the Lew Barasch Breakthrough Award – will join them in the spotlight.


Darling, an Ontario-based horseman elected to the Canadian Hall of Fame this year, saw his lifetime earnings grow over \$20 million with his handling of the superstar 1:45.4 Bulldog Hanover, who electrified the sport with his raw ability and consistency against the very best freefor-all horses.

With a great horse comes demands on a trainer's time, as everybody from the media to the casual fan to fellow horsemen want to know everything about what makes the great horse tick. Darling was unstinting in his cooperation telling the Bulldog Hanover story, even as far as letting visitors into the barn with the champion and Darling's other charges, to meet Bulldog "up close and personal." In this respect, operating with intelligence and candor, Darling emulates the late, great Billy Haughton, after whom the award is named. It is Darling's second Good Guy Award, joining 2014 when he was recognized for his fundraising efforts on two fronts.











Mike Woebkenberg is a starter at both pari-mutuel and fair tracks, mostly in Ohio, but extending his expertise to Indiana and West Virginia (where he once announced a race from his starting gate when the sound system went down at a fair).

Woebkenberg is a tireless promoter for the sport, and he literally has the exact vehicle needed to attract people to develop a greater interest in the sport – his starting gate. Mike never turns down a request to give people the unique perspective of seeing a harness race as

the horses assemble and then follow the gate to the start – a thrilling experience that has a "domino effect" as riders share their excitement with prospective fans, and on down the line.

Over the last couple of years Lucas Wallin, who will be celebrating his 30th birthday next week, has shown himself to be a master handler of stakes trotting stock, and he comes off of by far his best year – with only 135 starters, his stable earned almost \$1.7M at press time. Among the talent he has developed is Rebuff, one of his division's top trotting males both last year and this. He also trained the two winners of their \$253,000 Pennsylvania Sire Stakes Championships for three-year-old trotters, with Pour Mea Double conquering the males and Manon the females.

Edison Hatter is literally a "rocket scientist" – he works for NASA – and he has ascended in racing operational positions faster than a rocket in recent years. He announced and did several other jobs at Rosecroft, took over (and still holds) the announcing position at Freehold, and has been given progressively more responsibilities at the mighty Meadowlands, including morning line maker, handicapping commentator for the program, and broadcasting assignments. Somehow Hatter also finds time to host a wide-ranging harness podcast, First Over with Edison Hatter. (We'd say "the sky's the limit" for Hatter but we don't want to belabor the metaphor.)

Grant, Dunn and Campbell win top owner, driver and trainer awards, respectively

Owner **Brad Grant** and driver **Dexter Dunn**, both important components in the success of Bergstein Proximity Award-winning pacer Bulldog Hanover, garnered individual honors in their respective categories through voting for the Dan Patch Awards, presented by Caesars Entertainment. At the same time, **Jim Campbell** was the choice as Trainer of the Year in the balloting conducted by the U.S. Harness Writers Association (USHWA), the sport's leading communications organization.

Brad Grant, who won the Woolworth Owner of the Year Award, became a partner in Bulldog Hanover in June of 2021 as the pacer's season started, one of an innumerable string of good purchases and good horses raced by the owner of 100 or so horses. He is a third-generation horseman, with his father John a member of the Canadian Hall of Fame after campaigning the likes of Bettor's Delight.


In addition to the Bulldog, in 2022, Grant was in the ownership of Atlanta, the \$3.5M-winning trotting mare who is retiring after a half-decade in the uppermost ranks of her group; Dr J Hanover, who set the Canadian speed record of 1:46.4; and the \$1M-winning mare Sandbetweenmytoes.


The affable Grant is cognizant of his good fortune and is a vital part of the Breeders Crown Charity Challenge among other philanthropic efforts.

Dexter Dunn relocated to North America from his native New Zealand after dominating the Down Under competition. After his fourth year of fulltime driving here, he has four Driver of the Year awards. And this year was the best of them all in terms

of the major money earned by the horses he drives, as he won over \$15 million during 2022.









He gained the high-profile seat behind Proximity Award winner Bulldog Hanover and made the most of that plum situation, winning 11 of 12 starts behind the supersonic pacer, and, of course, setting the all-time speed standard for harness racing with his 1:45.4 victory in the W.R. Haughton Memorial on Meadowlands Pace night.

"The Bulldog" was one of four Breeders Crown winners that Dunn guided, joining Bella Bellini, Ecurie D DK, and Jiggy Jog S, becoming only the fifth driver to twice win four Breeders Crowns in the

same year. In all, Dunn won a staggering 59 races with a purse of \$100,000 or more. No one could match those credentials during the past season.

Jim Campbell, the winner of the Garnsey Trainer of the Year Award, had a fine UTR for 2022 of .428, and put up his third-best seasonal earnings figure, nearing \$2.9M, after starting far few horses than he did in his two best years for earnings.

Jim earned \$750,000 of that lofty earnings figure in the space of two hours on Aug. 6 at The Meadowlands, where he became only the third trainer to send out the winners of the Hambletonian (Cool Papa Bell) and the Hambletonian Oaks (Fashion Schooner) in one year. Fashion Schooner overcame the outside post ten in the Oaks, while in the Hambletonian, Cool Papa Bell overcame 52-1 odds with a big late burst to win the prestigious sophomore trot.

Campbell also campaigned Next Level Stuff, a trotting mare who defeated Trotter of the Year favorite Bella Bellini twice in the Miss Versatility Series, and his Once In A Lifetime was victorious in the Pennsylvania Sire Stakes Championship for two-year-old trotting colts. And his "Big Two" also won their Sire Stakes Championships (Cool Papa Bell in New York, Fashion Schooner in New Jersey).

Lost in the new gambling world

Once upon a time, racing horses were the only legal gamble in town. Those days are over. The twisted, complex legislation regarding Internet gambling has been bubbling in the background for over a decade. The backstories and side stories of entities trying to get their hands on the golden goose of gambling dollars could fill hard drives. In statehouses and federal courtrooms, a stream of proponents, opponents, opponents who are now ardent proponents, including major sports leagues, have dipped their fingers in the gambling pie.

Less than five years ago, except for Las Vegas and a few outliers, betting on sports in the United States was prohibited under federal law. The earth shifted and the barn door opened in 2018 when the Supreme Court decided this gambling prohibition was against the constitution.

Following the stories of how online gambling went from zero to warp speed in a decade has become a frustrating hobby for a few of us. State after state has hopped onto the gambling wave. We are at thirty and counting, and the trail of each state's sports gambling legislation is a complex saga, often a somewhat secretive saga. Your loyal correspondent wasted an abnormally large amount of time poring over state sports gambling legislation in search of answers, but my Sherlock Holmes cap is off. The Rubik's cube of all this legislation is too much for a mortal.

The floodgates are open, the claws are out, the pipers are about to be paid, and the future is unwritten. The ability to wager on virtually every sport means a great deal to many prominent players who see a market worth billions in a new world. Ergo, hordes of minions went to work on regulators and politicos in state capitals far and wide. States legislators faced a difficult task with many outstretched hands for the new gambling money. Lobbyists with cash, perks, questionable statistics, and inflated promises blanketed each state resulting in legislation that may not be advantageous in the long run.

I rarely found much information about horse racing while searching the coverage of legislation on the Internet. Exactly how much influence, if any, individual horse racing programs have in the resulting state legislation is concerning. Perhaps racing linkage to casinos gives some racing folks comfort, but it does not take a Rhodes Scholar to forecast that online gambling has designs on brick-and-mortar casinos.

For an excellent overview of these often-ugly machinations, allow me to refer you to a November 20, 2022, article in the New York Times by Eric Lipton and Kenneth Vogel with the title - Cigars, Booze, Money: How a Lobbying Blitz Made Sports Betting Ubiquitous. The lengthy article shows how the Kansas state legislature was swamped and outgunned. Ironically, the report came to my attention because of a footnote about a new racetrack in Kansas. Quickly the hope that horse racing was in play faded when on further review, it is a car racetrack, part of a vague real estate deal tied to the passage of the legislation. Reading the article about the sports gambling rollout in Kansas brought some uncomfortable legislative sausage-making into play.

The past few years have been dizzying in state legislatures, but the results are that sports gambling will become omnipresent and abundant. Sports like ours are in for the fight of our lives.

In harness horse racing, the state of Ohio is on the upswing, but a new chapter will begin. Governor Mike DeWine signed HB 29 into law, and on Jan. 1, 2023, online sports betting goes live in Buckeye Land. Ohio is a tad late to the dance, but we will be dancing. Predictions are that Ohio may quickly rank number two in the flood of state sports gambling. What this legislation



means for the future of our beloved sport of harness racing in Ohio is an open question.

Many of us involved in the sport are confused about what this glut of gambling means. How will harness horse racing be affected?

It seems like yesterday we were adjusting our digital devices to magically watch harness racing from our homes and learning how to wager on ADW accounts (I never understood why racetracks did not cut out these middlemen). Now it looks as if additional intermediaries could handle our wagers. Today, equine owners and gamblers are wrestling with fundamental questions in this world going faster and faster. Now that gambling has changed in Ohio, what does this all mean for my favorite sport?

- We get bombarded every five minutes with advertising for Fan Duel, Caesars, Draft Kings, etc.
- Can and should we use these for wagering on horse racing?
- What kind of horse racing wagers? Futures wagering?
- Besides racetracks, where can we physically place a horse race wager in Ohio's new world of sports gambling?
- Advertisements scream about "free bets." Can these bets be used on horse racing?
- There are dozens, yes dozens, of sportsbook apps advertising in Ohio. Does it help our racetracks if we choose one of the specific apps available for wagering?
- Are any of these new apps designed for horse racing?
- Will these apps replace the ADW we use? What is the better value?
- Where is horseracing in the mix of gambling madness?
- Who are the members of our tribe sitting at the table with these sharks?
- What is our leverage?
- How will the tsunami of gambling affect our racing purses, sales, and programs?
- Is there a possibility that online sports wagering will make us stronger?
- Is there a plan?
- What can we do as individuals to strengthen harness racing in this environment?

Confusion makes people uncomfortable. Allow one more question that is more of a suggestion. Every horse racing state could offer an informational primer with directions showing racing participants where we stand and what we can do to navigate this new world of virtually unlimited gambling.








Angus Hall dies at 26

Angus Hall was inducted into the Canadian Racing Hall of Fame in 2019. Both of his parents, Garland Lobell and Amour Angus, are members of both the Canadian Racing and Harness Racing Hall of Fame.



"Angus Hall was the complete package," said Joe Thomson, Winbak Farm owner. "His success as a stallion helped make Winbak Farm a leading breeder in Canada and enabled the Winbak Farm team to establish strong connections with many North American breeders."

Angus Hall is a full-brother to Andover Hall, 2, 1:56.2s; 3, 1:51.3 (\$875,047), and Conway Hall, 2, 1:57.2; 3, 1:53.4 (\$818,884), who both had successful stallion careers of their own.

Angus Hall was the leading stallion in the Ontario Sire Stakes from 2003 to 2007 and he was the second leading trotting stallion from 2008 to 2012.

"He will always hold a special place in our hearts," said the Stewarts. "We would like to thank Larry and Jackie Drysdale, Pat Woods and all at Winbak Farm Canada for providing a wonderful home for Angus Hall for many years."

Angus Hall is the grand-sire of Millionaires, Pinkman, 3, 1:51 (\$3,009,653), What The Hill, 3, 1:51.4 (\$1,345,999), Bridge To Jesses, 1:51.1s (\$1,1160,220), and Captain Corey, 3, 1:51f -'21 (\$1,090,333). He is also the grand-sire of World Champion, Impinktoo, 3, 1:49.4 (\$423,860).

"Angus Hall will continue to have an impact at Winbak Farm as the sire of 15 of our leading broodmares," said Thomson. "His full-sister, Emilie Cas El, is the dam of Trixton, who we are excited to be standing at Winbak Farm of Canada."

Angus Hall will be remembered fondly by the Winbak Farm team.

Ron Burke tops 1,000 wins again

Hall of Fame trainer Ron Burke has surpassed 1,000 wins in a calendar year for the fourth time in his career, picking up victories 1,001 and 1,002 on Monday (Dec. 19) at Northfield Park. One day earlier, he reached 1,000 thanks to The Wild Card's triumph at Harrah's Philadelphia.

Burke previously exceeded 1,000 wins in 2018, 2014, and 2013. He is the only trainer in history to win at least 1,000 races in a year, and his total of 1,093 in 2014 stands as the sport's record for a trainer.

The 53-year-old Burke also is on the verge of surpassing \$22 million in purses in a year for the fourth time and is within \$5 million of reaching \$300 million in career purses. He has exceeded \$20 million in a year on nine occasions. Again, he is the only conditioner to ever reach that level.

Burke is wrapping up his 14th consecutive year as harness racing's leading trainer for both wins and purses. Lifetime, he has won 13,315 races and just over \$295 million in purses, both records for a trainer.

Second in career wins among trainers is Virgil Morgan Jr., with a total approaching 7,200. Second in lifetime purses is Jimmy Takter, who retired with \$130 million to his credit.

Shenandoah Downs to usher in its first spring meet beginning April 1

Dates for the first ever spring harness racing season at Shenandoah Downs were approved by the Virginia Racing Commission last week at its fall meeting. A seven-week meet will start April 1 and continue through May 14 with racing every Saturday and Sunday at 1 p.m.. Holiday racing will take place on Easter Sunday and on Mother's Day.

Racing/stall applications can be accessed beginning Feb. 1 at www.vhha.net and will be due by Feb. 28. A pair of spring late closers — the Blue Ridge Pacing Series and Alleghany Trotting Series — will be announced in the racing applications. The barn area will open on Wednesday March 29 with approximately 250 stalls available. Qualifiers will be held on March 25, the Saturday before opening day.

The only other time spring racing has been held in the Commonwealth was in 1998 when Colonial Downs ushered in pari-mutuel standardbred racing at its one-turn mile facility in New Kent.

Moving forward in 2023, a four-day non-wagering meet will again be held during the 106th Shenandoah County Fair, from Aug. 30 – Sept. 2. Racing will take place at noon Wednesday through Saturday of fair week.

The eighth annual Shenandoah Downs fall pari-mutuel meet will follow and run seven weeks, from Sept. 16 – Oct. 29, pending Virginia Racing Commission approval. That meet will mirror the spring schedule, with racing on Saturdays and Sundays at 1 p.m.

Dates for the 26th Virginia Breeders' Championships for 2 and 3-year-old pacers and trotters of both sexes will be announced in January.

Meadowlands and SRF join in series of races

All of the revenue will go directly to SRF, none will go to the purse for these races or be retained by the track.

"We've had many requests for something like this. I wanted to have races that can be counted on for young horses in April before the stakes season starts and at the same time show our commitment to helping find a home for retired horses and came up with this idea," said Meadowlands president Jeff Gural. "Hopefully the horsemen will support our efforts to provide these races and at the same time help the Standardbred Retirement Foundation's cause by racing their young horses."
